In Truancy

Judge Orders Woman Jailed

RAEFORD (AP) — In a rare action, a judge has jailed a woman after she was found guilty of two counts of failing to make her children go to school. The judge also said he regretted he could no longer send truant children to training schools.

District Court Judge Joseph Dupree on Friday ordered Elaree Locklear of Raeford to jail until Thursday, when he plans to make a final judgment in her

Mrs. Locklear faces a maximum 60-day jail sentence for failing to require two of her daughters to attend Upchurch Junior High School

Dupree said from the bench that he did not believe Mrs. Locklear had made sufficient attempts to force her children to attend school.

The girls, Stella, 14, and Patrica, 15, had missed 32 and 38 school days when a court summons was issued Nov. 20. Both are in the seventh grade.

Allen Edwards, principal of the junior high, testified Patrica had missed 52 of the 64 school days this year without an excuse.

Dupree commented after hearing the case, "Our juvenile correctional law is in a state of damned if you do and damned if you don't."

Dupree said he wanted Mrs. Locklear to spend the time in jail to think about how she is going to get her daughters to go to school while he takes time to decide a disposition.

Mrs. Locklear was one of five parents called to face child truancy charges Friday. One parent was found not guilty, one case was dismissed, a prayer for judgment continued was entered in another and a failure to appear arrest warrant issued in the last.

Dupree made frequent criticisms of the juvenile laws during the school attendance cases, asking in one of the cases what choices a parent of an undisciplined child has. "What type of judgment can I enter that will be binding upon the child?" he asked.

Dupree said he regrets that truant youngsters can no longer be sent to training school. "A couple of years ago we had a good law... the challenge is there for the Legislature to give us the proper tools to work with," he said.

Decisions over the past several years by the U.S. Supreme Court and the N. C. Supreme Court have struck down laws providing prosecution for truant-juvenile offenses on the basis that such actions would not be grounds for criminal prosecution of an adult.

T. B. Upchurch, Jr., of Raeford, was again named president and a di-rector of the N. C. Cotton Growers Cooperative Association at the annual meeting held in Raleigh Tuesday.

M. G. Mann, general manager of the association, gave his annual report to the membership and short talks were made by Mr. Upchurch, W. W. Eagles, president of the FCX, Harry Caldwell, master of the State Grange and W. A. White, state agent for the Farm Bureau insurance companies.

Mr. Upchurch discussed the problems cotton farmers will face in the postwar period from the standpoint of competition with ever increasing cotton production in foreign countries, and the competition of synthetic products which have been developed

He told the cotton growers that the best way to meet the competition of foreign cotton and synthetic products. "is to produce higher quality cotton and to market it more orderly and more intelligently." He continued, "If the average of all 600,000 bales of cotton raised in North Carolina last year had been only one grade higher, it would have meant \$30,000,-000 additional dollars in the pockets of North Carolina farmers."

Mr. Upchurch also reported on the progress that has been made on cotton picking machines. "While those machines, which are not adapted to our cotton farms, will greatly lower the cost of production in other cotton producing areas, it is a known fact that they lower the quality of cotton, and therefore, we can offset this loss through higher grades."





By HERBERT O'KEEF. The two men had been riding for some time through the farming land of Hoke County.

The driver would stop every now and then to point out some feature of some crop as they drove on a winding, sandy road through the field. They looked at fields of tobacco, cotton, small grains, at a field which soon-weather permitting-would begin to fill up with watermelons.

At last, the car stopped beside a bit of worn, eroded land. The driver got out once again, called to his visitor to come over and take a look at the crop growing on that poor land. To the visitor, the "crop" was just some mighty small pine trees.

Part of Future.

To Thomas Benton Upchurch Jr., those little pine trees were really a big part of the future.

Upchurch is a big farmer, for he and his five brothers and sisters farm several thousand acres of land in the Raeford section. He has grown up with cotton, and is a nationally recognized expert on that necessary but at times troublesome crop.

But, his first love in all farming are the trees he and his brothers and sisters are planting now. Their goal is the planting of a million trees-and in two more years, they hope to reach that goal. "I feel I can contribute more to the future by planting trees than any other crop I know of," he ex-

plains.

Upchurch is a native of Raeford, having been born there on May 19, 1902, son of Thomas Benton Upchurch and Mollie Johnson Upchurch. He has three sisters and two brothers living: Mrs. N. A. Cameron of Raeford, C. E. Upchurch of Raeford, Mrs. R. B. Lewis of Raeford, Mrs. A. M. Mc-Gee of Fort Lauderdale, Fla., and L. M. Upchurch of Raeford.

The elder Upchurch, a native of the Holly Springs section of Wake County, first went to Raeford about 1900. He was in the lumber business and went into that business in Raeford. Later he organized the Raeford Power Company and went into the textile business. He later formed the Upchurch Milling and Storage Company, then the Hoke Oil and Fertilizer Company, of which the Hoke Concrete works is now a subsidiary, and in 1937 formed T. B. Upchurch, Inc.

All those companies still are going strong, and ownership and management is in the hands of the family.

About 1905, the elder Upchurch started in farming.

Worked On Farm.

Although young Tom Upchurch was born in town, he has spent practically all his working life on the farm. As a boy, he went out to the farm every day and did farm work. Even as a boy, he liked to grow things, a liking which still characterizes him to-

Even today he spends up to 12 hours a day on the farms. And, if necessary, he could do the actual farming himself.



Upchurch finished Raeford High School in 1920 and that fall entered N. C. State College to study agriculture. He was at State for two years, then dropped out to take over management of his father's farms. At that time, his father's health was not too good, which accounted for the action.

The young man reasoned to himself then that he planned to make a career out of farming, so he might as well begin it then without finishing college. In the years since then, that decision to drop out of college has been one of his chief regrets. He does, however, look on education as being a continuing thing, and defines it as the ability to find the information you want when you need it.

Since he took over management of the farms in 1922, his job in the family enterprises has been that of farming and handling the real estate. The whole business is a family enterprise, however. There are six children and they have four corporations. All the children are directors in each corporation, and the brothers-in-law are directors.

Hundred Per Cent Accord.

"We work on the principle that we have to be in 100 per cent accord before we make any major move," Upchurch explains. "We've always done that way, and we've never had the slightest disagreement in the family."

In discussing the family businesses, Upchurch always comes back to his father. "Father really made it mighty easy for us," he says. He deserves no credit for anything the businesses may have done, he adds, explaining that "It's been made mighty easy for me by what my parents did before me."

Thomas Upchurch is president and general manager of T. B. Upchurch, Inc., and his share of the family responsibility is chiefly the farming, real estate and a seed business.

The farming is general farming, "about as well diversified as we could be." They have cotton, corn, soy beans, lespedeza, tobacco, all kinds of small grains, beef cattle and hogs. All crops are grown as certified seed, except tobacco.

The clder Upchurch always was forestry conscious, and the family is carrying on in that tradition. They try to plant 100 trees for every one they cut, and they cut only the trees that are ready to be harvested.

Any eroded land or any land they can buy at a reasonable figure, they purchase and put it in trees. They plant mostly loblolly pine and slash pine.

Upchurch figures he works about 70 hours a week—and spends as much of that time as possible out on the farms. He tries to be at the farm by 6 a.m. each day.

Expert on Cotton.

Next to forestry, cotton is Upchurch's chief love. He grew up with cotton, and feels strongly that it is a balancing factor in farming in North Carolina, and that it must be kept in the economy of the State.

A constant acreage in cotton, he feels, keeps acreages planted in other crops from getting out of balance.

Upchurch has taken a leading part, both in the State and the nation, in movements affecting cotton. He was active in the organization of the National Cotton Council, an agency which promotes the interests of cotton. He is a director and is now president of the North Carolina Cotton Growers Cooperative Association. That group promotes the use of cotton, and takes steps to protect cotton acreage allotments to this State. There is a big tendency to underplant the allotments in North Carolina, he says.

He was a member of the National Cotton Seed Advisory Committee of the U. S. Department of Agriculture in 1954, and is now a member of the Department's National Cotton Advisory Committee. For three years, he was chairman of the N. C. and Virginia unit of the National Cotton Council.

Upchurch is a former president of the North Carolina Cotton Pro-

motion Committee, and is now chairman of the legislative committee on the committee.

His work with the various cotton agencies and boards means considerable travel, and he estimates he travels 50,000 miles a year.

State College Leader.

Upchurch has been and is active in work for State College, too. He is past vice president of the State College Alumni Association, and is now a member of the advisory council to the Dean of Agriculture. He is a director of the State College Foundation, and is active and a formen director in the Agricultural Foundation there.

He has written many articles for farm publications on the question of the shrinking income of farmers, in the hopes of helping the farmers get a little nearer their "rightful share of the national income."

"We worry about losing our export markets," he says. "Well, we've got markets for everything right here if we increase the farmers' income. There is a demand for everything. If we could get the farm laborer the same wage the industrial workers gets, he'd be in here buying something from every merchant in town."

Upchurch is a member of the North Carolina Farm Bureau.

He is active in the civic life of Raeford, is a past president of the Raeford Kiwanis Club and past lieutenant governor of the Kiwanis Fourth Division. He is a steward of Raeford Methodist Church, and is district steward of the Fayetteville District, and is a trustee of Louisburg College.

His business interests are confined chiefly to the family corporations, but he is a director and member of the executive committee of the Bank of Raeford. In the family businesses, he is president and general manager of T. B. Upchurch, Inc., vice-president of Hoke Oil & Fertilizer Company and of Raeford Power & Manufacturing Company, director of Upchurch Milling & Storage Company, and is vice-president of Cooper's Food Store.

Upchurch is married to Miss Ann Hoyle of Fort Lauderdale, Fla., whom he met when she was a school teacher in Raeford. They were married February 15, 1930, and have two daughters, Betty Anne who is a senior at Wesleyan in Macon, Ga., and Eloise, who is in Hoke High School.

Likes. To Travel.

One of Upchurch's hobbies is travel, especially travel which allows him to study the agriculture of the sections he is seeing. He has gone to California twice to study mechanization of cotton out there. Another hobby is inventing, and he has several patents. "My inventions have never been very practical," he says. "I work on them until convinced they'll work, then get a patent and forget them."

In discussing the farming and other interests of the Upchurch family, he always comes back to what his parents had left to him and his brothers and sisters.

"It's been made mighty easy for me because of what my parents did

before me," he says.

"We don't own a foot of land that my daddy didn't buy in the open market. He never foreclosed a mortgage on anybody. He never bought any land at a tax sale. He bought every foot of it from the man who owned it. We don't have a mortgage on anything we finance for our tenants now. It may not be very businesslike, but we never lost any money."


