drinker. He always had a job though and there  
were "no crimes against him". He died in the TB

△ Clara Beach Thompson, daughter of my gf's  
youngest sister Emma (Emily) T. Upchurch (Mrs.  
Underwood Beach) corresponded with him for  
many years. She was one of his favorites. He  
would visit and bring her "paper dolls". Clara  
still lives in Greenville, Al (b. ). I fell  
in love with her when I met her a few years back.

- △ I know Edward Grey Upchurch and Guy Hanson

- △ She was 5 yrs. old when her mother died. Her  
sister "Aunt Minnie" (Julia Minnett Upchurch) was 16 yrs old. We think there was a Hanson  
-aunt who came and stayed with them until  
Minnie was old enough to take over. Minnie  
married Conrad Johnson from Birmingham, Al.
- △ I met both Aunt Hattie and Aunt Minnie.
- Recently we had the pleasure of having lunch  
in Gainesville, Fl. with Aunt Hattie's sons  
James and Everett Gable and their wives  
Ruth and Barbara in James' lovely home near

- My grandfather John Burton Upchurch also had  
a brother William Howard Upchurch b. 7-4-1876

Al. He was married to Aunt Daisy Wilson  
b. 4-2-1878 d. 1950. They lived in Montg. on  
Holcomb St. and I remember them well. Their  
sons were Lawrence and Joe, both deceased.  
They had no daughters.
- My records show (copied from Kendrick Upchurch's  
file) that Bartley and Penelope Williams Upchurch  
had a son William Howard Upchurch b. 8-2-1824  
-d. 6-25-1852 who is buried in Bethesda Cemetery,  
Benevela, Pickens Ct., Al. He married Rebecca  
Latham (?) but in studying his family sheet  
I see her date of birth could not possibly be

I also notice on Bartley's family sheet that a number of his children were born before he and Penelope were married. I don't think this is correct!! Maybe you have correct birth dates for Harriet Upchurch, Calvin Upchurch and Olson (Alvin?) Upchurch. If they are in the Upchurch Bulletin perhaps you would steer me to the number. <sup>(1869)</sup>

I have Dr. Harvey Burton Upchurch b. 11-5-<sup>1865</sup> d. 2-15-1924 bur. Carrollton Cem. & I found his gravesite. According to one of my Hanson cousins Dr Harvey made his money in buying and selling real estate". Cousin Nina <sup>Hanson</sup> Mullins lives on land that was Hanson land but originally Upchurch land belonging to Dr. Harvey. It's located just a short distance from Carrollton.

Dr. Harvey was married 3 times.

The children were Ray Owings and Marie Owings. □ James E. is listed as a merchant in Carrollton Al., Pickens CP. We found the graves of J. E. Upchurch b. Oct. 11, 1880 d. Aug. 19, 1921 and Eugenia Owings Upchurch b. Sept 22, 1872 d. May 10, 1963 in Carrollton Cem. Carrollton, Al.
- Nina Hanson Mullins told me a few years ago when we visited her in Carrollton (I think she was 87 yrs old then) that Guy was a pharmacist and went to Tenn. I know Edie Upchurch was a pharmacist who lived in Clanton, Al. - (Upchurch Drugstore).

H. Upchurch - Center Springs Cemetery, Pickens Co.,  
I've misplaced my Pickens Co. Cemetery book so I  
can't check on Center Springs Cemetery. I know  
I've never heard of it but that doesn't mean anything.  
There are many, many cemeteries in Pickens Co.  
some very private. I do believe I would have seen  
it the when I was going through the book looking  
for ancestors.

I hope these bits of history will be helpful to you. Your questions make me eager to get back to Pickens Co. and try to turn up a few more facts.

We are now getting closer about the AL  
Wheeler. Several unanswered requests from cooperation  
in AL, GA, and NC have been awaiting your kind help. Mr.  
John Chapman census records for AL 1800-1850 are  
not back from GA. This will probably enlighten another  
of our missing members. In the meantime  
there are a few puzzles to be solved. Here  
are just a couple you can help with.

Can you place the wills of W. H. in 1853 if he  
includes a Beaufort street no enclosed. My guess is  
that it was a man of William Howard H. in 1806-1824  
d 25 Jun 1852 & a yr of Beaufort of the Unionist H. (P)  
Abel H. in Beaufort. If so, he was born after his  
father died. William Howard H. I was not the son  
of her father in this 1850 census in Pinhook Co., AL  
and must have married Rebecca Johnson shortly  
thereafter. I have no children for William Howard  
H. at this point so if this speculation gets it  
would be an early bird I guess.

The second concern concerns Gray H. for  
whom a Beaufort street no also enclosed. He was

as the name of Harvey Burden II, Sr. on the ②<sup>2</sup>  
1900 census and listed as a bachelor. A recent  
correspondent lists Gary II as a son of John  
II & a son of Bartley II. This would make Gary II  
a daughter of Harvey Burden II, Sr. The problem  
arises this is that John II had a son  
James E. II "fam" in 1850 & 1850 censuses mean  
that Gary II b. 1850 (per 1900 census) could  
not have been born a year. I don't find  
Gary II on the 1870 census and he was probably  
born too late to get on the 1880 census  
and no one has told me on Gary II as the son of Capt  
Burden II (who was a son of Harvey Burden II, Sr.).  
As another lead I show that Capt Burden II  
had a son Edward Grey II (Bar-Crosswood farm,  
Montgomery, AL) and 1st Eds - ; 1st 2nd 2nd children - .  
I think the names GREY and GUY are the same  
but I don't know which is correct. Capt Burden  
II d. in 1875 and on the 1900 census I found her  
daug. Emily Theresa II age 15 as the name of wife and  
son John - male (nee Emily Theresa II). I am speculating  
that Edward Grey (Guy) II being also young (1st birth)

had to find a mate and married with her first  
cousin in this tiny city (Montgomery City, 14).

Any advice or information on the above  
will be appreciated.

Determination, commitment, persistence, dedication, leadership, integrity, compassion . . . these are the words that describe a woman who has touched so many lives. Those who are hungry, those who find themselves homeless, the elderly, the disabled, the disadvantaged, abused women and children, and those who support alleviating such needs have all been influenced by Mrs. Eleanor Upchurch Kennedy.

As a result of facing homelessness herself, Eleanor has always identified with helping those less fortunate. In the past 20 years, Eleanor has been busy helping others. Her philosophy is based on a conviction that every citizen needs basic food, clothing, shelter, and job training in order to help themselves, and as a result, make a positive contribution back into the community.

An invaluable instigator, Eleanor was among the incorporators of Route One Corridor Housing, Inc. in 1977; each representing a local church. She was involved with the conception of Mondloch House, Fairfax County's first emergency shelter, which opened in 1978. In 1983, Eleanor's involvement was strategic in the establishment of an addition to Mondloch House, adding 24 more beds for families. This exemplary shelter offers various counseling services as well as food and shelter.

Eleanor also encouraged local churches through Ventures In Community to provide temporary winter shelter in their own facilities. Eventually, these local churches enabled Route One Corridor Housing, Inc. to successfully operate South County Community Shelter upon its awarded contract with Fairfax County in 1986.

In 1988, Eleanor was again involved in the application process for Mondloch House to expand, increasing to a 52 bed shelter. Route One Corridor Housing, Inc. has been awarded a Virginia State Grant with matching county funds with the expansion beginning this Fall.

Eleanor's involvement as a Board Member and Advisory Committee Member in helping the homeless served by Route One Corridor Housing, Inc. is only one organization of a myriad.

An active member of St. Aidan's Episcopal Church, Eleanor is continually advocating for affordable housing. She has been on the Board of directors for South County Housing Coalition since its inception. Eleanor was involved with the establishment of Shelter House, modeled after Mondloch House. She served as Executive Director of United Community Ministries for 10 years, providing emergency assistance, as well as employment, financial counseling, elderly and youth activities.

In addition, Eleanor has served as a Commissioner of the Fairfax County Redevelopment Housing Authority, participated with the Route One Task Force for Human Services and the Subcommittee on Housing for Deinstitutionalized Mental Health Clients, Board of Directors of Northern Virginia Literacy Council, Ventures In Community, the Fairfax County Team for Child Protection, been an active member of the Social Needs Planning Committee since 1982, and the Ad Hoc Advocacy Committee for the Fairfax/Falls Church United Way, involved with the Department of Social Services Work Plan Advisory Committee, the Mt. Vernon Medical Services Task Force; Project Selection Committee for Community Development Block Grant Funds, Good Shepherd Housing, Inc., and the President of the Woodley Hills Estates Board of Directors representing Redevelopment Housing Authority.

Eleanor Kennedy's contributions have not gone unnoticed. In addition to today's well deserved honor, she was named Fairfax County Citizen of the Year receiving the Washington Post Cup in 1984. Eleanor was also the 1984 Mt. Vernon District nominee to be Lady Fairfax. In 1982, Eleanor was named Woman of the Year by the Fairfax County Commission For Women.

It is with great pride and admiration that the South County Community Shelter operated by Route One Corridor Housing, Inc. be renamed to The Eleanor U. Kennedy Shelter For The Homeless.

The South County Community Shelter which will be renamed to the Eleanor U. Kennedy Shelter for the Homeless, is a full-service facility which offers emergency housing to those in need. It has approximately 60 beds to accommodate both male and female single individuals. Financed by County funds and private donations, the shelter is operated by Route One Corridor Housing, Inc., through a contract with the County. This joint venture between the public and private sector utilizes staff from the Department of Human Development, Mt. Vernon Mental Health Center and the Public Health Department, as well as volunteers from 21 local churches and the Episcopal Diocese of Virginia. The shelter has been operating near capacity, and serves citizens Countywide, as do the Baileys Crossroads and Embry C. Rucker Shelter for the Homeless.

## County to honor housing advocate

Eleanor Upchurch Kennedy will be honored by the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors Sept. 16 by having the South County Community Shelter renamed the Eleanor U. Kennedy Shelter for the Homeless.

Kennedy first became aware of the need for more affordable housing in the early 1970s when she worked as a volunteer at United Community Ministries (UCM), trying to find emergency housing for people in need.

Kennedy, who is originally from Alabama, came to the Washington, D.C., area when her husband retired from the Air Force in 1964. Until then, she said, she had reared three children, and had "done the typical Air Force-wife things," she said. Over the years, she said, she taught music, was a Girl Scout leader, and, for a time, served as assistant church organist at St. Aidan's Episcopal Church.

She became what she called "a professional volunteer" until she was hired as executive director at UCM in 1974. She held that job until her retirement in 1984. She said she retired for two reasons: she was tired and wanted time to rest, and she wanted more time to work on housing.

By then she had helped incorporate Route 1 Corridor Housing Inc. (RICH) in 1977 and was instrumental in establishing Fairfax County's first emergency shelter, Mondloch House, which opened in 1978.

RICH had found an old farm house suitable for a family emergency shelter, and had applied for a \$10,000 block grant from the federal Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), Kennedy recalled recently.

The problem was, she said, that they needed \$8,000 of the money right away, to offer 18 months of rent and obtain an option to buy — "the smartest thing we ever did," she said.

Kennedy went to church that Sunday with the problem on her mind, she said. At some point in the service, she recalled, "I got up and said we

needed \$8,000 right away, and I asked people to open up their pocketbooks."

As she was leaving the service, Kennedy said, a young woman came up and told her she had just come into some money, and would like to lend it to RICH, provided she could do so anonymously. She had a check for \$8,000 in her hand.

"I have never to this day revealed her name. And yes, we did pay her back when the HUD money came," said Kennedy. She added that she has never asked for money in church without receiving what she needed. "It's a kind of miracle," she remarked.

"I could easily have been a missionary," said Kennedy. "In fact, I probably am a missionary at heart," she added, saying she always has been concerned "when people are not getting a fair shake." She said she remembers being a "crusader" as early as junior high school in Montgomery, Ala., when she fought to get



a poor substitute teacher removed. "I think I got a D in deportment for that," she mused. "so I bear some scars."

Kennedy said she still fights when she thinks things are unfair. "That's my motivation," she said. But she fights by patience and persistence, and marshaling of facts, she pointed out.

Kennedy's perseverance also contributed to the establishment of the South County Housing Coalition, which is involved in purchasing housing units to be rented to low-income families.

Her concern continues, exemplified by the many community organizations she still serves.

Said Mount Vernon District Supervisor Gerry Hyland, who proposed that the shelter be named for Kennedy, "When I think of helping the needy, housing the homeless, and caring about other people in the most unselfish of ways, I think of Eleanor Kennedy."

# Fairfax Woman Brought Housing Issue Home

*Activist Leads Effort to Make  
County More Responsive to Poor*

The year was 1976, and Eleanor Upchurch Kennedy had already embarked on her first campaign to convince affluent Fairfax County that it needed a shelter for the homeless. Two years later, Mondloch House was born.

The year is 1989. Another shelter, a converted water treatment plant in Fort Belvoir offering mental health, housing, employment and substance abuse counseling to its 48 occupants, has just been renamed. The immaculate model facility is now called the Eleanor U. Kennedy shelter.

Kennedy, now 69, spent the past nine months helping to organize a vigil for affordable housing that brought more than 500 people to lobby the Board of Supervisors on a rainy night Sept. 25. "They already know we've got to have housing," she said. "I think the vigil put the point on it."

Who is this modest, bespectacled woman who, so long before it was fashionable, made the cause of the homeless her own? Now stuck on her couch recovering from a severe bout of arthritis, she defines herself simply as a housing junkie. But those who have worked with her see it differently.

"Eleanor is one of a handful of people who raised the consciousness of Fairfax County to homelessness," said Supervisor Gerald Hyland (D-Mount Vernon), a long-time ally. "She was a pioneer, persistent, dogged, and she has galvanized and mobilized county government."

"There's a very egoless quality to her adherence to a cause," said Robert Weigl, a psychologist who has worked with Kennedy on low-income housing issues. "She can be like a bulldog, but there has never been a tinge of arrogance. That's what makes her lobbying so effective."

In the best sense of the word, she's a Christian," Weigl said.

Kennedy, sitting in her cluttered living room in South Fairfax, said that little in her background prepared her to become a latter-day rebel.

An Alabamian by birth and a military wife, she describes herself as a typical housewife who raised three children, taught music and led scouts—"all the things women do"—until her husband was transferred to Northern Virginia in 1962.

The family joined St. Aidan's Episcopal Church, which was studying poverty at the time. They viewed movies about hunger, lived on poverty rations for a week, then joined

Thus began what Kennedy calls her "Johnny-come-lately" career as a housing advocate: testifying in favor of affordable housing, lobbying for federal and county grants, serving on citizen task forces—and then, establishing shelters and recruiting friends and neighbors to staff them.

She remembers the battle for Mondloch House, which later became the county's first emergency shelter, in Hybla Valley. "We took it to the Hybla Valley Civic Association. And I've never seen such a hostile crowd," she said. "The agenda said 'Shelter for Transients,' and they thought it meant 'bums.'

"Then one man stood up and said he was ashamed, that he wouldn't want to live in a community that would not hold out its hand to those in need," she said. "The whole room just changed. I felt like I was looking at a miracle."

"They unanimously supported us. We realized we are our brothers' keeper."

Later Kennedy introduced Jana Graves, an early director of Mondloch House, to the homeless issue. Once, Graves recalls, there was no money to pay for electricity and the two of them simply dug into their own pockets and covered the bill.

"The county didn't know what was going on. She just quietly did it," said Graves, who now runs the Embry Rucker Community Shelter in Reston.

In 1973 Kennedy called Super-

visor Hyland, then a lawyer in private practice, to ask his help in halting the eviction of a mobile home resident who couldn't pay his rent. Together, Hyland said, they persuaded the landlord to relent.

And three years ago she helped organize the South County Housing Coalition, a nonprofit group that has begun acquiring apartment units and renting them to low- and moderate-income tenants. That's a logical step, she said, beyond the "Band-Aid" of emergency shelters toward permanent housing solutions.


Now in retirement, Kennedy is almost apologetic about her persistence. "It had become a crusade for me, to see if an affluent county like this couldn't provide affordable housing," she said. "I just got into it. It's hard for me to turn it loose."

So hard, in fact, that she's relentlessly plotting new battles as soon as she is back on her feet.

Along with other housing advocates, she is pushing the county for a commitment to add 1,500 low- and moderate-income units each year. She pressed for a law, passed late last month by the Board of Supervisors, that would require builders to incorporate a set percentage of such units in each new development.

She proposes setting aside land for group homes in new neighborhoods "right from the beginning so we don't have to fight for them later."

Kennedy says she's not really concerned about failing in any of her crusades. "I learned a long time ago you can't give up," she said. "You can't get anywhere without persistence."

# The Gospel Calls Us Beyond Formal Rituals

When Jesus wanted to instruct His disciples about the need to pray continually and not lose heart He told a story.

There was a judge who feared neither God nor man. A widow kept on coming to him looking for justice. He resisted her appeals for a long time. At last he relented. "Maybe I have neither fear of God nor

man, but since this woman keeps pestering me I must give her her just rights, or she will persist in coming and worry me to death."

There are many contemporary women who continue this tradition of persistent advocacy. There are the widows of the disappeared from El Salvador. Dorothy Day comes to mind. Mother Teresa's life embodies her motto: We are called not to be successful but to be faithful. There are

many others. However the Jeanne D'Arc that springs to my mind is a woman from a neighboring church in Mt. Vernon. Her name, Eleanor Kennedy, was recently given to the South County Community Shelter. She has been a fearless, relentless advocate for the homeless, the poor, the abused children and the single mothers of Fairfax County. She not only reached out in service to others but strikes out against the barriers of injustice and public inaction that cause the problems she attacks.

Her pursuit of justice is sustained by a deep prayerful faith and hearty good humor. While her friendship is a gift, I would shudder like the judge of old if she were my enemy. She would worry me to death.

The Gospel and the witnesses of faith that surround us call us beyond a sugar-coated piety of formalistic ritual. Authentic prayer fans the fire of justice. Send forth your Spirit O Lord and renew the face of the earth





As 1984 draws to a close and we are in the midst of the Thanksgiving season, we want you to know you are among our greatest blessings. Once again we say thank you for all you have meant + are meaning to our lives. We want to share our past year with you and trust when we hear from you, you will do the same for us. We cherish your friendship + care very much what happens to you and yours. It was a very eventful year for us beginning with my announcement that I would complete 10 yrs. as Executive Director of United Community Ministries (U.C.M.) on September 1, 1984, + more importantly perhaps, would be retiring. A newspaper acct. of the death of Capt. Burt Upchurch

"On last Saturday afternoon at 1:30 o'clock occurred the death of that beloved gentleman, at his home in the west end of town -

Capt. ~~\_\_\_\_\_~~ Upchurch was born July 31, 1838 and was married to Miss Emma T. Hanson on Jan. 15, 1868. From this union were born four sons and three daughters, all of whom are now living with the exception of one son.

The deceased was a gallant soldier during the Civil War, entering the service as a private in May 1864, and as a reward for services was promoted to the rank of Captain,

He was wounded three times. His wife died July 5, 1885, and he moved with his children to Carrollton<sup>(Ac)</sup> in November 1886 to enter upon the discharge of his duties as clerk of the circuit court, to which office he had been elected by a people who loved him. In this capacity he served the people up to the time of his death and served them well. No word of complaint rests against him; his name will ever be honored and revered, and the hearts of all who knew him will be saddened at the mention of his name. Could we, by the adding of words, assuage the grief or mitigate the heartaches of his bereaved children we would endeavor to do so, but this grief is too deep and too poignant. We can only say that we know from his life that he was a noble Christian man and that he is now enjoying sweet rest from the labor and pains of earth life.

On Monday morning at 10:00 o'clock

loving hands tenderly lowered his remains beside her he loved so well. He sleeps well, and on beyond the dark stream which marks the confines of life, he lives a redeemed spirit waiting and watching for those who linger behind. God grant that the reunion in the last day will bring to him a meeting with all his loved ones.

The funeral services were conducted by the Rev. J. B. Small in the presence of a vast concourse of friends of Bethesda Presbyterian Church, 16 miles southeast of Carrollton".
