


I just noticed in the bulletin of April, 1986, at page 47, you inserted an item concerning Hamilton Davis Upchurch, Sr.

△ It was most unusual that on the same day that Upchurch Bulletin for April, 1991, came, that a distant cousin of mine, Mrs. Eleanor Richardson Howell, requested that I assist her to prove that she was eligible for the D.A.R. membership. It is also rather unusual that one of her cousins has already proved eligibility and became a member but will not share the information.

On Page 77 of the April, 1991, Upchurch Bulletin, Elizabeth Upchurch is mentioned, and I enclose a family chart prepared by Mrs. Howell that shows how she fits into their ancestry. If you have anything that indicates that she can trace her ancestry back to the American Revolution, she would most appreciate it.

On Page 73 of the same Upchurch Bulletin is mentioned the Pleasant Hill Cemetery, exact location unknown. I can assist you there. From Eutaw, the County Seat of Greene County, Alabama, take Alabama Highway #14 West for approximately three (3) miles, turn to the right or Northwest on Greene County Road #181, follow that road approximately seven (7) miles and the Pleasant Hill Church and Cemetery are on the right approximately one-fourth (1/4) mile off the road to the right. This church (Cumberland Presbyterian) has been in existence for probably two hundred (200) years. In February of 1990, a storm passed that way and destroyed all of the ancient oak trees, breaking them up and up-rooting them totally, and the church sustained absolutely no damage.

The old Presbyterian Church has gotten down to about thirty-five (35) to forty (40) members and some of the community leaders were concerned as to what would happen to the cemetery should the church cease to operate. The leaders of the community retained this office to prepare a non-profit corporation to provide perpetual care for the cemetery, which we have done, and at the organizational meeting, over \$5,000.00 was raised and contributions have continually been received since that time and the corporation is set up so that only the income will be used for the upkeep of the cemetery. I wish more churches would go this route because nothing





Dear Cousin Phil:

I have received your letter of February 1, 1996, concerning the research done by Professor David Ransome on our English ancestors and I am glad to make a modest contribution. You certainly should not have to underwrite any of this expense in view of the fact that you are doing all of the work on the family history. If you do not receive sufficient contributions on this matter, please let me know and I will be glad to make another donation.

Several years ago, when my wife and I went to Europe, mostly to tour continental Europe, we stopped over in England for several days and one day we went out to Stratford for the day and when we returned late that afternoon, I asked the young lady who was our guide if she could take us by Runnymede and she answered that indeed she could, but very rarely had she been requested to include Runnymede in her guide work.

I was particularly interested, not only because the Magna Carta is the very cornerstone of our legal system, setting the precedent that a king could be required to live by a constitution, thereby limiting his powers, but two (2) of my ancestors on my mother's side of the family were signers of the Magna Carta. I really expected to see monuments all over the landscape, but true to the British tradition, they do not go in for monuments as we seem to do in this country. They were still raising hay on the fields of Runnymede and there was one small stone pagoda in one corner of the field which had been erected by John F. Kennedy while he was President. Had Runnymede happened in the United States, the entire landscape would be covered by monuments of all shapes, colors and sizes, but the British are famous for understating just about everything.

I think this item is widely known, but really I had not heard of it until we were in London and visited a small park, whose name I do not now remember, and there was a statue of George Washington erected in one corner of the park. Our guide told us that when the statue was first erected by his British admirers, a number of people expressed dissatisfaction with erecting the statue of a traitor on British soil, upon which his admirers then sent back to Virginia and

more closely I might be in a position  
to make a better guess on this matter.

Dear Cousin Robert:

Enclosed is a copy of the January 26, 1996 report of Professor David Ransome on what he learned about the Upchurch families that lived in the area near the Brington Church in Huntingdonshire Parish in England during the period 1580-1630. You will recall that this is the area from which our ancestor Michael Upchurch I departed for America about 1638 as documented by Professor Ransome's first report published in the UB.

I am writing to you and a few others to give an opportunity to participate financially in paying the \$1225.00 bill of Professor Ransome. Please know that you are not obligated to participate. I am prepared to pay whatever portion of the bill necessary to discharge the obligation to Professor Ransome. However, it seems reasonable to give others the chance to share this joy.

The hopes for this research were to identify the parents of our Michael U. I. This has not been accomplished but I feel the Professor has done a creditable job of searching the records (even reading Latin) and preparing a report. This report will be published in full in the UB in due course. I will add notes which will make the report more readable and meaningful for our readers and for others who may take this work a step forward. This work, even with my notations, will not excite the UB readers. However, this is a scholarly work and it deserves to be made a part of the American record for present and future Upchurch generations. This work dove-tails well with work done by Belle West and Associates, but goes beyond what they did.

At this point, I do not visualize a further contract with Professor Ransome, although he seems willing. If a financial backer for such a third assignment appears, the work would be worth undertaking. I do feel his charges are reasonable.

I will welcome any comments you have on the enclosed report and look forward to continued collaboration with you on our mutual interest in our Upchurch heritage.

Dear Cousin Robert

Thank you for your renewal on the UB for 1996 and for your generous contribution to the Upchurch Research Fund as a memorial to your father. The memorial will be documented in the next UB. It is nice if you do remember him. We will owe Professor Ransome \$1,000 for the research he has done for us in England this fall. I am trying to build up the Research Fund to meet this obligation.

I am sorry to learn about your sister's health situation but it is nice to know that she takes interest in her heritage. I have researched my records and cannot locate what I think is adequate support for her membership in the DAR or VDC. However, I am not an expert on such matters. Evenso, I have prepared the enclosed analysis which may be of some help if someone else wants to pick up from

this point on. There are certainly issues remaining to be researched. I have also provided copies of my Profiles on Abel Upchurch, Sr (12 Pages 27 Items), John Upchurch (3 Pages 12 Items), and Tallman Perry Upchurch (1 Page 4 Items).

If you want to take additional steps, one approach would be to turn all of this over to a professional genealogist who for a fee would go deeper into the matter. The way computers work these days the researcher could be located anywhere. I have used a couple of these people in the past but they are no longer active. I have a friend in Arizona who has used such a researcher and if you want me to I will call him and ask about costs, his confidence in the person, etc. It is quite possible you have contacts that would give you a recommendation for a researcher.

If you proved I hope you will share with me your experience as other members of our extended family inquire from time-to-time about this same general subject.

QUESTION: Is There Evidence That Will Qualify The Children Of John Edgar Upchurch, Sr. For Membership In The DAR/SAR Or The Daughters/Sons Of The Confederacy.

The known ancestors of the children of John Edgar Upchurch, Sr. who could bear upon the above question are as follows:

- I. Richard Upchurch, II, b. 1725, d. <1800, married ?
  - A. Abel Upchurch, Sr., b. 1775, d. 1846, married Bethenia \_\_\_\_\_, b. 1779.
    - 1. John Upchurch, b. 1814, d. 1871, married Armenia Jane Hicks, b. 1825, d. 1894.
      - a. Tillman Perry Upchurch, b. 1851 (1854), d. 1919. married Sarah A. Sims, b. 1845, d. 1939.
        - i. John Edgar Upchurch, Sr., b. 1882, d. 1970, married Jane Ella Cockran.

As matters stand there is currently no information available to the writer on any of the above named individuals that would support the membership described in the above question. However, that does not mean that such information does not exist. In general, evidence to support membership requires that a direct ancestor must have served in the Armed Forces or provided support to the cause.

Re: DAR/SAR -

Richard Upchurch, II would have been over 50 years of age at the time of the Revolution and; therefore, may not have seen active service. However, he could have provided support for the cause. He died before 1800 but just when is not known. His wife whose name is unknown or her parents could have provided support to the cause. There is an outside chance her father, name unknown, saw service in the Revolution.

Abel U., Sr., was too young to have served in the Revolution or even to have provided support. It is quite possible his wife's parents or grandparents could have provided support for the cause. Also, her father could have seen service in the Revolution. These names on the distaff side are unknown at this time.

Re: The UDC -

Abel Upchurch, Sr. and probably his wife died before the Civil War and hence cannot provide the needed evidence.

John Upchurch was 47 years old when the Civil War started and hence probably did not serve on active duty, although service towards the end of the war in some of the "last ditch" efforts would not be out of the question. He very well might have provided support for the cause as could his wife, Armenia. The parents of Armenia might have provided support for the cause but her father would likely have been too old for service.

Tillman Perry Upchurch was probably too young for service but this possibility should not be overlooked. Also, he and/or his wife, Sarah, could have given support for the cause. The question of whether or not Sarah's parents gave support to the cause or whether her father saw service should not be overlooked.

Follow-up research on the above matters might provide a basis for membership in the mentioned organizations.

Dear Cousin Phil:

I note in the UPCHURCH BULLETIN, the January of 1993 issue, at pages 21 and 22, you refer to a Laton Upchurch who lived near Union, Alabama, committed suicide around 1860 and was buried in the Pleasant Hills Cemetery in Greene County, Alabama.

I can shed some light on this matter; my father told me when I was a child that Laton Upchurch was serving as Tax Collector of Greene County or some other office and when his office was audited on a routine basis, the auditor stated that a substantial amount of money was unaccounted for and indicated that an indictment might be forthcoming. Laton Upchurch apparently could not face a possible disgrace and took his own life. At that time, additional auditors came to make a further determination as to what money was missing and the amount and this second audit disclosed the fact that the books balanced to the penny.

I cannot vouch for these facts; they were told to me by my father when I was a child and I have no way to corroborate these facts. I am merely passing them on as a matter of interest. Some day, maybe someone will research this and determine conclusively whether this is a correct account.

I have searched the Pleasant Hill Cemetery for the several Upchurch headstones, but the old headstones are extremely hard to read and some are impossible to read, so I have not been able to locate the one for Laton Upchurch.

I just thought I would share this bit of information with you and, while I cannot vouch for its accuracy, it is interesting nevertheless.



# Place where antebellum times seem to have been but yesterday

Greene County, set against Alabama's border with Mississippi, was settled by the white man in the late 18th century. But Hernando DeSoto and other explorers encountered Choctaw and Chickasaw Indians there much earlier, and the Indians had been living there long before that. In fact, the hillocks seen throughout the region may be Indian mounds from 1100 A.D.

The rivers that border the county — the Warrior, Tombigbee and Sipsey — gave life to the area. Cotton was loaded in steamboats and taken to Mobile. Supplies, dry goods and luxuries were brought back up stream.

More than 15,000 people lived in Greene County when plantations dotted the landscape and a "golden era" brought prosperity and elegance to its residents.

When cotton no longer was king in Alabama, Greene County farmers turned to timber and beef for their livelihood and agriculture still is an economic base today.

In the county seat of Eutaw, the past and the future mix pleasantly. Many historic sites, including almost 50 antebellum buildings still can be seen there. A number of them are homes built in the raised cottage style.

The Greene County Courthouse that exists today was built in the late 1800s on the foundations of the original courthouse, which burned in 1868. The courthouse sits in the center of the town square. On three corners of the square are small buildings now used by various government agencies.

Not far away is the First Presbyterian Church, built in 1851, which still has its original whale oil lamps and chandeliers. The lighting fixtures still look the same, but they have been wired for electricity.

Only one of the homes in Eutaw is usually open to the public, but others can be seen on a walking/driving tour. Brochures for the tour are available at the Historical Society Office on Main Street.

A word of warning — if you get a map from the historical society, be sure it isn't the one used recently for a homes tour in the city. That map, drawn in 1918, shows street names that don't exist anymore, leading to a lot of confusion for visitors who aren't familiar with the town.

Get the right map and you're in for an enjoyable walk through tree-lined streets to see houses that typify a number of different lifestyles and periods of the city's history.

Coming into Eutaw on Alabama 14, you'll pass through the Mesopotamia area of the city. Mesopotamia was settled in the late 1700s and early 1800s by Scotch-Irish Presbyterians. It grew into a village with shops, churches and a stagecoach inn. Mesopotamia now is part of the city of Eutaw. The stagecoach inn has been moved to Northeast Green county and is a private residence.

In 1820, the census said Old Springfield had more than 1,500 citizens. This city, populated by cotton planters, had two hotels and several stores. As Eutaw began to grow, Old Springfield started to decline. Today, piles of oyster shells mark the place where a warehouse and gin once stood in Springfield on the banks of the Warrior River.

When you get through seeing Eutaw, there also are a lot of historic places to see throughout Greene County. The Historical Society has a guide to these sites as well.

## MORE TO SEE AND DO

**Greentrack.** The greyhounds race from the first week in January through the third week in December. There is an admission charge and no one under 18 is admitted. There also is a parking charge.

**Forkland,** about 14 miles south of Eutaw. The mansions here aren't open to the public but can be viewed on a drive-through tour. Also in Forkland is the board and batten St. John's-in-the-Prairies Episcopal Church, built in 1859. Services are held once a month at St. John's, which was designed by John Upchurch, founder of the American Institute of Architects and designer of the Trinity Episcopal Church in New York.

## HOW TO GET THERE

To get to Eutaw, take I-59/I-20 West South to Alabama 14. Take Alabama 14 to Eutaw. It is about 88 miles from Birmingham to Eutaw.

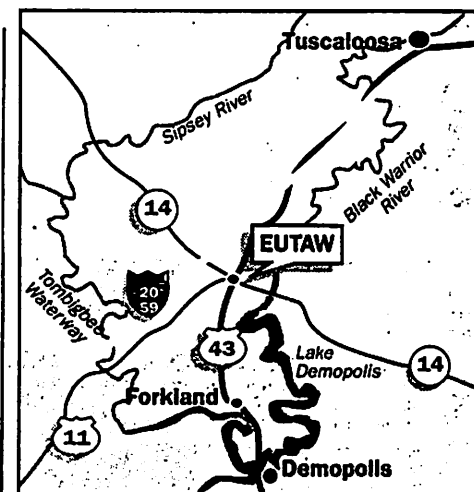

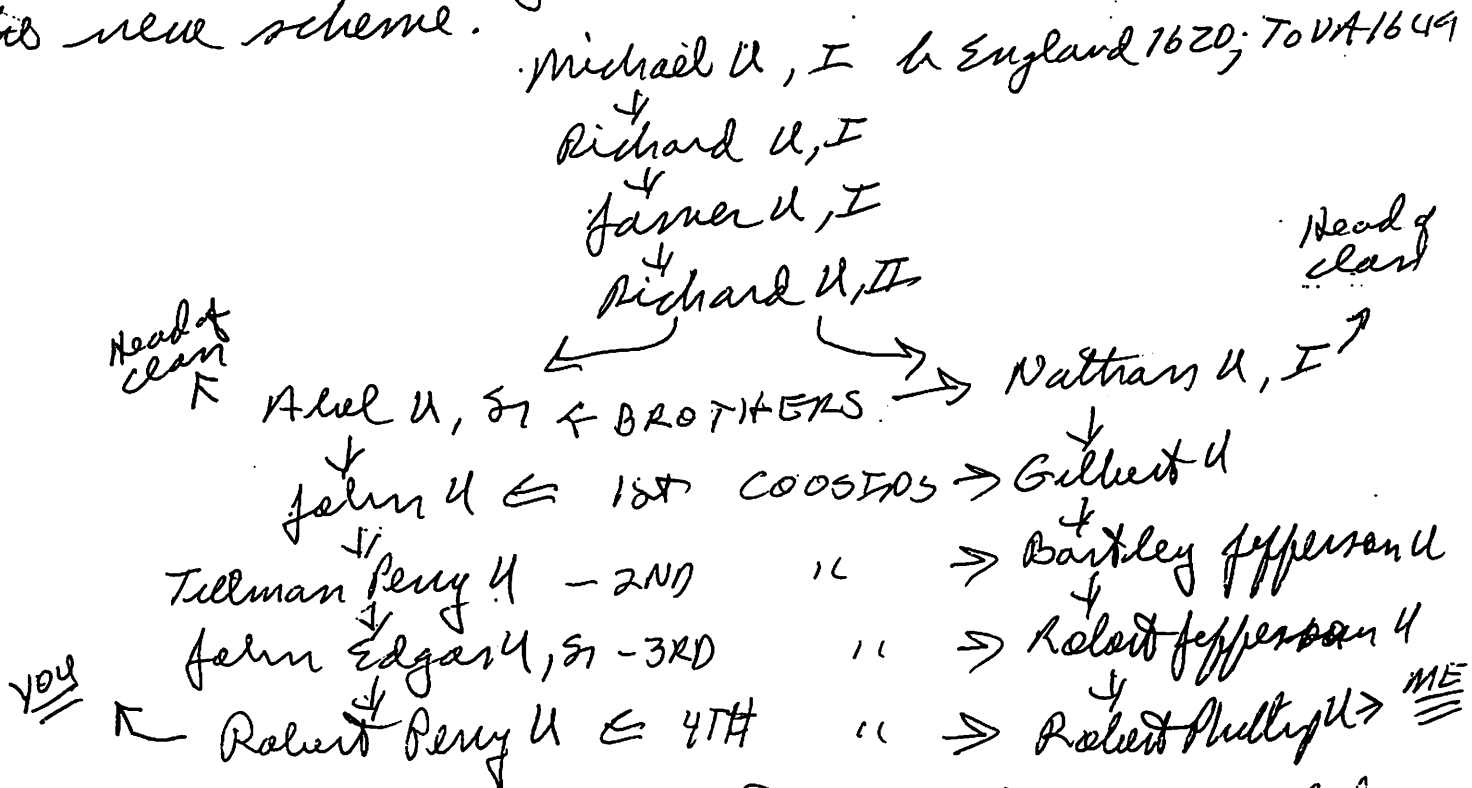
