Dear Cousin Phil,

I was recently at the Surry County, VA court house meeting with some local land owners in the course of obtaining landing rights for Army helicopters in Surry County. As the Supervisor of the Army Flight Facility at Fort Eustis, one of my duties is public relations with the Surry community, since our primary low level flight training areas are in Surry and Isle of Wight Counties. Many land owners allow us to make use of unique terrain features on their property for helicopter operations. This spirit of cooperation is typical of patriotic, rural Americans, but it never ceases to make me proud when I see it first hand.

Anyway, I thought you might like some high quality terrain maps of Surry for your research library. These maps are hard for non-governmental people to obtain, so I'm sending both 1:24,000 and 1:50,000 plates, already joined together which cover eastern Surry and northern Isle of Wight counties.

I have marked the 1:50,000 map using UB 1-3, pages 89-99. Some of our helicopter landing zones (LZs) in that area are also marked. I think it is interesting to note "Delks Crossroads" on the modern maps, since it lies just southwest of the Delke/Upchurch property and may have been named for the Delke family.

I will send a Surry County phone book and other information from my next trip over there. It might be valuable to know how many of the old English family names are still represented among current residents. Mr. Willie Butler, for example, lives very near the traditional 17th century Butler property and allows us to use one of his confined area fields. He is black and is a likely descendant of Butler family slaves.

I've also enclosed the results of a search of the U.S. A.G. Confederate Soldier Index for the Upchurch surname. I am hoping that the James Upchurch who served in the 3rd GA Infantry was my James S. Upchurch. I plan to check out his military records for clues, especially a link to Carroll Co. I compiled the list to possibly help other Upchurches find their Confederate veterans. There are certainly many familiar names represented, e.g. Isham, Bartris, Green Berry, etc.

As far as my own research is concerned, I have not had much time this year for it. I just ordered microfilms from the Mormon Family Research Center here in town:

"Carroll Co, GA Estates Index"

"Carroll Co, GA Marriage Records"

"U.S. Record and Pension Office Files - Confederate"
and

"Rutherford Co, NC Wills Index."

Since you brought Sherwood Upchurch to my attention, I hope to connect James S.U. to Sherwood U. working from both directions. I also feel very strongly that James S.U. was the son of Elias (1840 NC census lists 2 sons age 15-20) or of Adam (1840 - 2 sons 10-15). I hope your correspondent in Ohio will find the answer. I would like very much to write to her, if you have the address.

I plan to visit Raleigh, and if necessary, Rutherfordton, NC and Carrollton, GA to solve this.

Best wishes for you and your family in the new year, and please stay in touch. Your letters meant a lot to Dad, and they mean a lot to me.

This is just a note to let you know we have moved one notch closer to identifying your b/w. Over the weekend I received some new information from a new correspondent in OH which helps us a lot.

On page 157 of the Val 10th you will note J. S. U who is actually James S. U. We know for sure this is your ancestor. However, he is not a son of Sherwood U. We now have strong circumstantial evidence that this James S. U is a son of Sherwood U (unlikely) but much more likely a grandson of Sherwood U by his son Adam U or Eliza U. Sherwood U was one of the 23 Upchurch Clans and for most of his life was in Rutherford Co, NC. We'll keep working. Your father would have been very excited about this.

Thank you for your letter of 1 FEB 1988 and for
your renewal on this U.B. Your generous donation
to the Upchurch Research Fund is a memorial
to your father in much appreciated. It is
a note of encouragement to me to know that
few fathers enjoyed the Bulletin.

Through additional study of the records I
think I have pushed your line back another
30 years to 1850. Our previous knowledge was
that your GGF, James S U, was on the 1830 census
of Carroll Co, GA age 55 with wife Sarah age 53 and
named children including your GGF, David U.

I now propose that your GGF James S U is on
the 1850 census of Carroll Co, GA. For this to be the
case one has to make some assumptions. The
records I have read as follows: (For 1850 Carroll Co, GA)

J. J. Upchurch 24 M Farmer \$700 Real Estate b GA
Sarah Upchurch 24 F b GA (annual Rent or Wmthly)
Robert Upchurch 4 M b GA
Milly J. U 2 F b GA

It is my assumption that the 1850 census records were hard to read and that J. F. really should be J. S. (James S.). Note that 1830 shows he NC while 1850 shows he GA, a small discrepancy not uncommon in the census records. The age fit and the wife's name fits. The 1850 census adds 2 children not on the 1840 list. I do not have the 1860 and 1870 census for Carroll Co., GA. When we get them they will help us analyze one way or the other. In the meantime I will assume that the J. F. in the 1850 census is indeed your GGF.

The next task is to determine the father of one James S. A. b. ca 1826 (NC or GA). [It is likely he was b. in NC - not many logchurches were built in GA as early as 1826]. To help us we turn to the 1840 census for GA for which I have only the names of heads of household (I do not have the detailed extraction which would show numbers of individuals in each household by age bracket). There are 10 heads of household. I know 6 of them fairly well (Thomas Cuyler, St. Button Jr., Calumet, Charles L, Richard A II and Tuxford II) and can essentially exclude them as the father of James S. A. b. 1826. This leaves as possible candidates: A. H. II, EATON II, KEMP (CAMP) II and HENDERSON II, all of Henry Co., GA for the 1840 census. We have very amounts of detail on these four individuals

but we are not sure of the names of their fathers.
Additional research will no doubt provide
us some breakthroughs. I will be in
Washington, DC in a few days on business
and will have at least a half day to spend
on genealogy in the DAR Library there.
Who knows what I will find.

I do hope your interest in Upchurch
Family History will continue. Should you
have any ideas or do know we can proceed
they will be appreciated. We always hope
to find an old family bible or letter or
whatever that would help us the search.
We still have a number of official records
to collect which could be helpful. The
Chancery are excellent that we shall succeed.

Please let me have any details you
can collect on any of the descendants of
James S. in 1826 whether they are living
or dead. Every little bit helps to complete
the picture. I'll be glad to pose questions
if you so desire.

you.

Dear Cousin James,

Thank you for your letter of 16 JUL 1985 and for your renewal on 07 85. Some older forms are enclosed in case you need any back copies or have a chance to convince someone else to be a subscriber.

The details you sent me most welcome and all have been extracted and placed in the proper files. I have not yet identified the father of James S. U. ca 1825 (NC). However, because of your letter I have spent about 3 hours working over the census records that I do have of GA (mainly 1850 and 1880). My 1880 extract shows James S. U. to be age 55 and his son David C. to be age 25. It seems logical that James S. U. would be on the 1850 census at age 35 and I have not found him. Have you?

Many of the early settlers in GA are of the Clark U. clan and particularly of his son Thomas Guy U. Sr. others are from Culver & Britton U., two sons of Richard U. III (end of clan). We know these descendants pretty well. Still there are other U. descendants not accounted

for including your ancestor James S. H. in 1825 (NC)
I feel there is no excellent chance we will find
the answer to this many connection if we
just keep searching. I will appreciate anything
you can send on the earlier generations and
will never refuse such details in my file.

In the meantime I would like to collect
more details on your more recent generations.
Could you send me details on yourself - married?
Children, Sister, place? and on all of the children
of James Thomas H. ~~I~~. That we we will begin
to work backward
