Our History

History of Caldwell County



The history of Caldwell County actually begins on a sad note with a large group of people looking for a place to escape religious persecution and somewhere they could call home. The Mormon Saints under the direction of their "prophet" leader Joseph Smith, Jr. had been exiled from Independence, Missouri.

They had fled to Clay County for safety and were at first treated with kindness and respect. However, Clay County citizens offered their county only as a temporary refuge for the Latter-Day Saints. They were anxious for them to move on!! When vigilantes began gathering in large numbers and a county war seemed imminent, Clay's leading citizens met with Mormon leaders and asked them to leave the County.

One of the influential residents in Liberty was one Alexander W. Doniphan, a representative elect of Clay County. He saw a need to protect the innocent women and children so he prepared and introduced into the legislature a bill to organize a county designated specifically for the Mormon saints. (It was named after

Captain Matthew Caldwell, who was General Doniphan's father's respected commander in the Revolution.) [A *Brief History of Caldwell County* compiled by Charlene Ward]

Some of the settlers in the area argued that Mormon settlements would "retard the prosperity of the county, check future emigration of any other class except the Mormons and disturb the peace of our community". As a result of this opposition, the proposed boundaries for Caldwell County were reduced by more than half forming a second county to the north called Daviess. Most of the non-Mormon settlers in Caldwell, about twenty in number, sold their farms and moved out.

The Northern part of Ray county was sparsely inhabited. It was an ideal place for the saints to live in freedom. Even though it was mostly rolling prairie, there were lush grasses, plenty of water and excellent hunting. The land was ideal for the industrious pioneers. They had already been hardened by trials. Their faith in God, and their zeal for the new gospel they had found would strengthen them for the work ahead. The land could be purchased for a small amount of money. Most considered it wasteland. Awaiting the approval by the legislature, some saints moved to the sparsely populated area in Ray County along the Crooked River. A sizeable settlement of Mormons developed in the Rock Ford area.

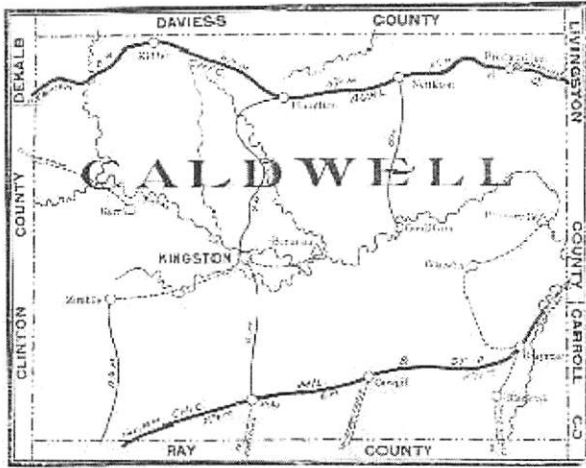
Some came ahead and began the work of preparing a place for the new inhabitants. One of them was Jacob Haun, and his family. he began construction on the famed "Haun's Mill". (The mill was built in 1834.)



On **DECEMBER 26, 1836**, CALDWELL COUNTY WAS BORN!!! A location between Goose Creek and Shoal Creek was selected for the future county seat. They would call it "FAR WEST" as it lay in the western part of the county. In Far West, the saints built some 200 homes, several dry good stores and groceries, half a dozen blacksmith shops, two hotels and a printing office. Residents excavated and laid the foundation for a temple and erected a large school building on the

Town Square for use as a courthouse, town hall and temporary church.

Cooperation and trust replaced the suspicions of the past as relations



between the Mormons and Missourians improved remarkably throughout 1837 and early 1838. [See *Brief History of the Church of Christ of Latter Day Saints*, 1839] The Mormon population in Missouri eventually reached 10,000 and Caldwell County became the largest county in Western Missouri. By the fall of 1838, Far West was the hub of community activity extending throughout Caldwell, encompassing nearly 2,000 farms over approximately 250,000 acres purchased from the Federal Government. The rapid influx of Mormons, however, alarmed the older settlers, especially those who had purchased land or town lots in areas they hoped to develop. The developing Mormon enterprises also threatened to displace established merchants and businesses, especially in their trade with Fort Leavenworth. As 1838 wore on, relations between church members and Missouri citizens began a downward spiral. A clash of cultural attitudes set the stage for trouble. Distorted reports and rumors circulated by both camps. Unlawful assemblies of citizens formed on both sides to protect perceived local interests. Some Missourians proposed to drive the Mormons from the state.



Battles ensued, leaving many Mormons dead and wounded eventually leading to Governor Lilburn Boggs issuing an extermination order "to exterminate the Mormons, not excepting the women and children, and burn their houses and otherwise destroy their property". [History of Caldwell and Livingston Counties, entered as an act of Congress 1885, in the office of the librarian of Congress at Washington] The Mormons left peacefully in the bitter cold and winter of 1838 and early 1839, leaving Far West a virtual ghost town. "Beyond the memories, all that physically remains of Far West today are four cornerstones of the envisioned Lord's house or temple at the heart of the former community." The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints (the Mormons) purchased the site and own it today. Markers and cornerstones have been erected there recording its regrettable history.



Caldwell County has had five courthouses, the first being in Far West. In 1843, the county seat was moved to Kingston, which was nearer the center of the population. Thanks to the generosity of two men, James Ramsey and William Hill, who donated 160 acres between them for county purposes.

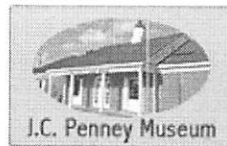

PREFACE

In presenting to the public a history of the Mirabile Cemetery, we strive to fulfill a growing need for such a record. Represented in these records are the names of numerous families, many of whom were the pioneers of Mirabile Township and nearby areas of Caldwell County, Missouri.

We have taken the inscriptions directly from the headstones and monuments when possible. Besides the headstones, we've taken records from the funeral homes still in the area, family members and cemetery records of burial. We regret that our record is not entirely complete and if we've missed a member of your family it was not intentional. We hope that the missing names and dates will be properly accounted for in the near future.

Since a lot of the markers are of the less durable marble, the inscriptions are becoming increasingly difficult to read so we think that this will be an acceptable means of preserving these old inscriptions.

We present this volume as a permanent record for lot owners, for members of families whose loved ones rest here and for historians and genealogists to whom we believe these records and this information will be of interest and value.

We wish to extend our sincere thanks and to express our thorough appreciation to all the people who helped in the preparation of this record.

HISTORY OF THE MIRABILE CEMETERY

The earliest deed we've found was dated September 29, 1857, when Wm. E. and Jane C. Marquam, Proprietors of the town of Mirabile sold to Geo. Smith, John McBride, Simon Stockton and Wm. E. Marquam, Trustees of the Presbyterian Church at Mirabile (Old School), a parcel of land for a church and also $\frac{1}{4}$ acre of land for a graveyard at the site where our cemetery is today. However, one stone of a baby, Loran D. L. Guthrie, shows his death date as being April 2, 1857. The other two earliest now legibly marked graves appears to be that of Nancy Early who died in February 1858 and Elizabeth Ross who died in June 1858.

At first Trustees of the Presbyterian Church had charge of the Cemetery and later a Cemetery Committee was formed where members were not always on the Church Board. The Presbyterian Church merged with the already combined Methodist and Baptist Church to form the Mirabile Community Church in December 1920. Early known trustees will be listed in the land transactions. Other people known to serve on the Cemetery Committee were: Gertrude Sloan, Pearl Corbett, Lee White and R. C. Sturgis.

On October 29, 1961, a group of people met at the Church and decided that the formation of a non-profit corporation would be the proper agency to organize and administer the burial grounds. A charter of incorporation for a body to be known as "The Mirabile Cemetery Association" was applied for. After all legal steps in the transaction had been complied with, on the 9th day of January 1962, a Decree of Court, signed by the Honorable Warren E. Hearnes, Secretary of State, granted the desired certificate of Incorporation.

Additional parcels of land purchased were as follows:

In November 1886, $\frac{1}{2}$ Acre was purchased from W. H. and Elizabeth A. Crawford. Trustees of the Church at that time were Geo. Wilkinson, Daniel Fort and H. VanOlinda.

In March 1891 a small parcel of land was sold by H. W. and N. A. Allen to W. H. Stillwell, A. J. Sloan and J. N. Matchett, Trustees of the Presbyterian Church.

On May 28, 1897, Wm. H. & Elizabeth Crawford sold all of Lot 1 in Block 9 on Jones addition to Thomas Wilkin, C. T. Bebout and W. H. Stillwell, Trustees of the Mirabile Cemetery.

R. F. & Ida Elliott and F. L. & Pearl Bowman sold a parcel of land to Thomas Wilkins, W. H. Stillwell and C. T. Bebout as Trustees on the 14th of May 1898.

The Elliotts and Bowmans also sold on April 25, 1902 another strip of land to W. H. Stillwell, Thomas Wilkins and Wm. White, Trustees.

Trustees of the Mirabile Community Church, Harry Hootman and Roy White bought of Wm. R. Hedges on December 3, 1940 -- .45 Acre. (This was part of the Trout Land)

On April 5, 1962 the Mirabile Cemetery Association bought a strip of land from Faye Bozarth.

At the time of this printing, very few lots are available and the Association is trying to purchase some adjoining land to be cleared, surveyed and plotted for future lot sales.

In the early days, families either cleaned and mowed their own lots or were asked to pay \$1.00 a lot for upkeep. Times have changed, but the constant desire of everyone to keep the Cemetery in good order has led to generous donations and gifts and a constantly growing fund has been created and it will, eventually, be able to support the maintenance expense.

TO DECORATE, TO REMEMBER

Decoration Day, the 30th day of May 1868, was designated as the day for placing flowers on the graves of comrades who died in the Civil War. Now we have Memorial Day to commemorate the veterans of all wars ---veterans who fought and died to keep our nation united. It falls on the last Monday in May.

I REMEMBER DECORATION DAY By Faye Witherow

When I was a child on a farm near Mirabile, one of the most important days of the year was Decoration Day, most generally known now as Memorial Day, and it was always observed on May 30th. Only one other day held as much importance and that was Christmas Day.

The first thing Mother and I did early in the morning of the big day was to gather our flowers which were the red "pineys" inside the garden gate, the white old-fashioned roses on the back yard fence, and the yellow "flags" growing rampant in various places in the front and back yards. Near the wood lot was a patch of asparagus from which we gathered the fine "greenery" that we needed for filler in the bouquets which we were preparing to take to the Mirabile Cemetery later in the day. In those days we had never heard of eating asparagus, and I regret that, as it grew

luxuriantly there on the farm, and now that it is one of my favorite vegetables, I have trouble raising it. Mother and I had been hoarding the very few tin cans which came our way, as most of our fruit and vegetables were home canned.

After we had picked what we hoped would be enough flowers and asparagus foliage, we made as many bouquets as possible and put them in the tin cans, which had been covered with crepe paper and tin foil which had been carefully saved for this very purpose,

The men as well as the women and children observed Decoration Day, and regardless of how busy they were with farm work, all work stopped on that day. We had an early dinner as the noon meal on the farm was called in those days, boxed our bouquets and put them in the car to be taken to the cemetery to decorate the graves of our beloved dead, with a surplus for use on other graves. The bouquets that were left after decorating the graves of our relatives were taken to the church and together with flowers brought by other families were arranged on the altar rail, in the window sills, and the overflow was taken to the back of the church.

For some time special music had been planned for the two o'clock service at the church. Shortly before two the choir took its place, followed by the pastor or in some cases, by a visiting speaker from another town, interspersed by music from the choir, the mothers in the congregation had the children line up, each with a bouquet for the march to the cemetery which was a short distance northwest of the church. The veterans led the march to the cemetery, followed by the children. Some years before, I can remember there was a Mirabile band and it led the march. I heard of one instance where a little boy stepped on the heel of the boy ahead of him, causing the boy in the lead to drop his bouquet and start a fight, right in the middle of the parade. I did not witness this, as it happened before I was old enough to take part in the activities, but many of the older people remembered it and enjoyed telling it from year to year.

One thing I do distinctly remember is a bad sunburn I suffered one Decoration Day. My Mother always insisted that I wear half-hands made of oilcloth with the oilcloth side turned in, together with a sunbonnet when I went outdoors. That was in the days when little girls were admired for their fair skin and pink cheeks. Of course on Decoration Day, I was too dressed up for half-hands and a sunbonnet, so my skin being tender as it was, burned badly and I suffered with it for days. Most of the women and girls had a new dress for the day and I remember so well the year my mother had a new beige crepe-de-chine dress with wide embroidery above the hem, and while putting our flowers in the car she spilled water on the front of the dress which caused it to shrink, much to her chagrin.

When the children reached the cemetery, they placed their bouquets on the graves of veterans which had been marked with a flag early in the morning by some of the men in the community.

After the flowers had all been placed, people visited graves over the cemetery, neighbor visiting with neighbor, then all departed for home, looking forward to next May 30th when they would again honor their dead.

SOME INTERESTING FACTS ARE

The Cemetery is located 2 blocks North and 2 blocks West of the Church and now contains approximately 4.25 Acres of land.

Another small cemetery is located in the South part of Mirabile, on the "Moffit" place.

- We have listed 832 names of people buried at Mirabile
- One man recorded was colored
- 84 graves that are listed are unmarked
- 68 War Veterans are listed

The Corbits, Hayworths and Slones changed their names to Corbett, Haworth and Sloan. Some stones with each spelling will be noted.

In an advertisement in the Mirabile Mercury newspaper dated Nov. 8, 1895 it states that: "B. F. Brazeltons Furniture Store carried a full line of coffins and funeral supplies.

The burial records from July 1910 to Jan 1924 showed that Mirabile had its own undertaker ---J. T. (Temp) Ballinger. Since no earlier records were found, we're not sure if he was there earlier than that.
