MOSES and MARY (SIMS) UPCHURCH are buried on what is called the "SIMS UPCHURCH" place in Chatham County, N. C., which is on land originally purchased by MOSES when he left Franklin County, N. C.

According to tradition, MOSES UPCHURCH met his death because of an accident at the age of 102 or 103. He was riding horseback across a small stream and fell from the horse and drowned.

Neither MOSES nor MARY (SIMS) UPCHURCH left a will but there is documentary proof of many of their children as listed below:

1. LEATHA UPCHURCH (b ca 1773-74) in Franklin Co., N. C., m 13 June, 1807 Hezekiah ("Kiah") Massey. She was named "my granddaughter LEATHY UPCHURCH" in the will of her grandfather, Isham Simms, dated 26 March, 1791. (WAKE CO., N. C. WILL Bk. C/185).
2. PARTHENIA UPCHURCH (b 1780) in Franklin Co., N. C., m ——— Smith. Named in a statement of a descendant of SIMS UPCHURCH, dated 29 Oct. 1958).
3. GILLIAM UPCHURCH (b 1782) in Franklin Co., N. C., m Sarah ———. Closely associated with MOSES UPCHURCH in land transactions.
4. MARY UPCHURCH (b 1785) in Franklin Co., N. C., m 5 Feb. 1806 Adam Burn (Bunn) (WAKE CO., N.C. MARRIAGE RECORDS).
5. RUFFIN UPCHURCH (b 1787) in Franklin Co., N. C., m — Williams m 2nd Patsy Goodwin—Affidavit of ORA (UPCHURCH) LEWTER, who knew him personally. He is said to have had 22 children.

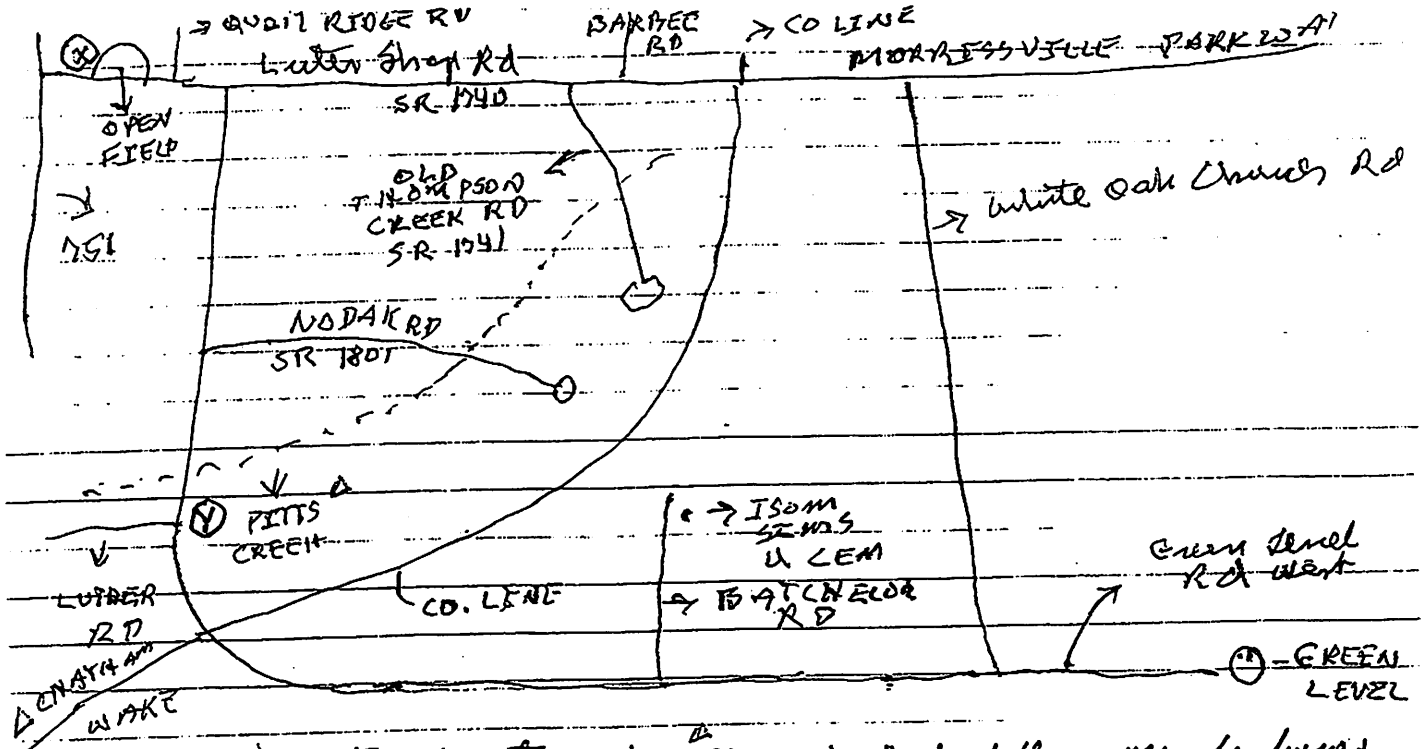

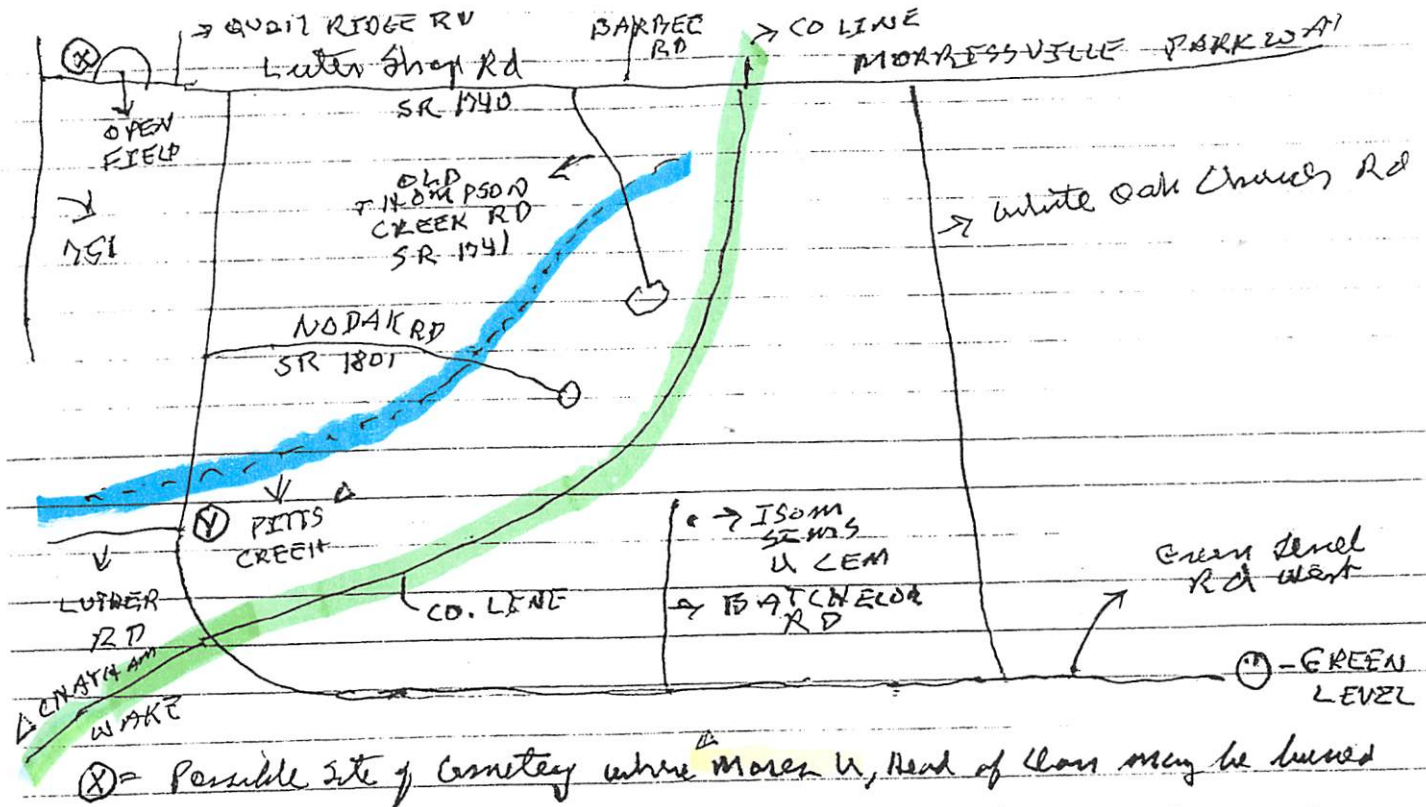

MOSES UPCHURCH

From Revolutionary Pension File no. S 7-776, in the National Archives in Washington, D.C., this writer secured a photostat of the Application of MOSES UPCHURCH. for pension for his service in the War for Independence. In this application, which MOSES dictated to John Lassiter, J. P. of Chatham County, N. C. 23 Nov. 1836. he declared: "I was born in Brunswick County, Va., 13 Feb. 1755. but I have no record of my birth. I removed to Franklin Co., N. C. at the age of two." By this year of 1836, when MOSES was making this statement he was an old man and had a few of his facts confused. It has been shown that RICHARD UPCHURCH, father of MOSES, was first listed for tax in Granville County, N.C., in 1755. Thus, MOSES must have been born in 1753 or before, to have been two years of age when his father took him to Granville County. MOSES had also forgotten that Franklin County was not formed until 1779, from Bute County, which had been formed from Granville in 1764.

No marriage record of MOSES UPCHURCH has been found but papers have been filed with, and accepted by the Daughters of the American Revolution, giving his wife's name as Mary Simms (b 1757. d 1847) and the date of their marriage as 1772. This writer was assisted in proving that Mary Simms was the daughter of Isham Simms, Sr., and Mary, his wife (probably Mary Murry, of Granville Co., N. C.) by the late Jane Sims (Davison) Morris, in her Family History ADAM SYMES AND HIS DESCENDANTS, published in 1928. This proof is set forth in the Simms story which is in PART SIX of this book.

RICHARD, MOSES AND MURRY UPCHURCH 31

MOSES made the following declaration in his Pension Application Papers: "I resided in Franklin Co., N. C. until 1775 when I enlisted in a Company of Light Horse, commanded by Captain Jones, Lt. Medici, and Ensign Armstrong, and mustered at Hunter's Old Tavern in said county. From thence we marched to Duplin Old Court House, from thence to Fayetteville and from thence to Charleston. While there the Battle of Sullivan's Island was fought, but I was not in the engagement. From thence we marched to Savannah. At Purysburg I was mustered into General Sumner's Army. From Savannah I marched back to North Carolina where I was actively engaged in subduing the Tories until my discharge at Halifax Court House on 28 June 1776, after having served a period of at least fourteen and a half months. In 1778 I volunteered my service in a Company of Horse in the County of Wake, commanded by Captain Hunter and served two months. My discharge was signed by Capt. Hunter but I am unable to produce same as it has been lost."

The Court Minutes of Wake County, N. C. show many more land transactions of a number of UPCHURCHES than are listed in Wake County Indexes. Book 1 of the Court Minutes shows that MOSES UPCHURCH presented a deed of March 1780 for property he had bought from Matthew Olive, which was ordered registered. In 1784 at March Court, MOSES and his wife, Mary, presented a Deed of Sale to Henry Buffaloe, which was acknowledged and registered.

In 1787 a small part of Wake County was annexed to Franklin and MOSES UPCHURCH'S property was left lying in Franklin Co., N. C. . . . "That all that part of the County of Wake, lying east of Mockison Swamp, and a line running from the head of the westernmost prong thereof a north course to the Franklin line, be, and the same is hereby added to and made a part of Franklin County." (CORBITT'S FORMATION OF N.C. COUNTIES. Pg. 101)

In the 1790 census of Franklin County, MOSES UPCHURCH listed his family with 1 male over 16, 3 males under 16 and 4 females.

On the 1789 Tax List of Franklin County, N. C. MOSES UPCHURCH and Stephen Pierce declared joint ownership of 632 acres and 1 slave.

In 1794 MOSES bought 100 acres of land in Franklin County for £50 on the "S. side of Mockerson Creek" from Thomas Gay. (Reg. Dec. Court, 1801, FRANKLIN DEED BK. 3/167).

In 1794 MOSES witnessed the deed when RICHARD UPCHURCH sold a tract of land to JAMES UPCHURCH. (FRANKLIN CO. DEED BK. 11/27) ✓

On the U.S. census of Franklin Co., N.C. for 1800 MOSES listed 6 males and 7 females.

In 1801 MOSES bought 300 acres of land from Phillip. Steven, John and Arter Pierce in Franklin Co., for £100. (FDB 3/164)

In 1803 MOSES sold 170 acres in Franklin County to Thomas Gay for £90. (FDB 12/67)

In 1804 MOSES UPCHURCH sold 400 acres of land in Franklin County for \$600. to JAMES UPCHURCH. (FDB 11/281) ✓

MOSES was apparently making plans to move further south to what appeared to be better tobacco lands, evidenced by the fact that on 25 July 1803, while still living in Franklin Co., he had bought 555 acres of land for £400, from Joel Cook in Chatham Co., N. C. This tract was described thus: "beginning in Joseph Taylor's line . . . to a stake along a line that has been partly run between John Pitts and Joseph Pitts to a white oak on the west side of Pitts Creek . . . to a pine on the west side of the road to Fayetteville to the University, supposed to be another dividing line run by Joseph Pitts . . . to a stake on Person's corner . . . to the county line." This deed was proved at February Court 1805 by NATHAN UPCHURCH, ✓ a brother of MOSES (CHATHAM CO., DEED BK. M/492).

MOSES UPCHURCH added to his acreage when he bought, at auction, on 16 Oct. 1806, 300 acres in Wake County, N.C., for £200/13, "On Davis line to Wm. Seagroves corner . . . Meady Rogers line, thence agreed line between MOSES UPCHURCH and Meady Rogers to red oak on NATHAN UPCHURCH line." ✓

On 10 Jan. 1824, MOSES sold to MURRY UPCHURCH, his son, 160 acres, "On John Clifton's Spring Branch . . . RUFFIN UPCHURCH'S corner." for \$250. (CHAT. CO. DEED BK. AA1/60) Reg. Feb. Sessions 1826.

On 10 Jan. 1824, MOSES sold to RUFFIN UPCHURCH, his son, 150 acres for £100, "on waters of Pitts Creek," in Chatham County, N. C. (CHAT. DEED BK. AA1/34).

On 5 Oct. 1825 MOSES gave a Deed of Gift to SIMS UPCHURCH, his son, "for natural love and affection, land lying on

Pitts Creek, including land and plantation where I now live . . . 232 acres." (CHAT. CO., N. C. DEED BK. AA1/2). Reg. Nov. Sessions 1825.

In the 1830 census of Chatham County, N. C. MOSES UPCHURCH reported four in his family.

On 13 Nov. 1836 MOSES applied for Revolutionary Pension, before the J. P. of Chatham Co., N. C., which was granted. According to a photostatic copy of the papers relative to this case, he was granted \$25.31 per annum, retroactive to 4 March 1831.

In the 1840 census of Chatham Co., N.C. SIMS UPCHURCH reported 11 in his family, including "two up to 90 years" which must have been MOSES and Mary.

In the 1850 census SIMS UPCHURCH reported his own age as "42, 10 children, MOSES UPCHURCH up to 100 years of age, and MOSES' daughter, Calorgy 55 years of age." Mary (Simms) UPCHURCH had died in 1847.

The exact date of MOSES' death is not known. THE BIBLICAL RECORDER, a Baptist newspaper, carried an Obituary notice on 25 Feb. 1853: "MOSES UPCHURCH, Esq. of Chatham County, N. C."

MOSES and MARY (SIMS) UPCHURCH are buried on what is called the "SIMS UPCHURCH" place in Chatham County, N. C., which is on land originally purchased by MOSES when he left Franklin County, N. C.

According to tradition, MOSES UPCHURCH met his death because of an accident at the age of 102 or 103. He was riding horseback across a small stream and fell from the horse and drowned.

That he entered into the service of the United States and served as herein stated, he was born in the County of Brunswick in the State of Virginia on the 13th day of February A.D. 1755 (but has no record of his age) at the age of two years he removed to Franklin County North Carolina where he resided until April 1775 when he enlisted in a company of light Horse commanded by Captain Jones Lieutenant Medici and Ensign Armstrong and mustered at Hunters old Tavern in said County from thence he marched to Duplin old Court House from thence to Fayetteville from thence to Charleston whilst there the battle of Sullivan's Island was fought but he was not in the engagement from thence he marched to Savannah at Purysburg he was mustered in General Sumner's Army from Savannah he was marched back to North Carolina where he was actively engaged in subduing the Tories until his discharge at Halifax Court House North Carolina on the 28th day of June 1776 after having served a period of at least 14 months and half – his discharge was in writing and signed by Captain Armstrong at is now lost or destroyed and he is unable to procure the same.

In the year 1778 he volunteered his services in a Company of horse in the County of Wake commanded by Captain Hunter and was actively engaged in subduing the Tories in the Counties of Wake and Chatham until he was discharged at Wake Court house after having served at least two months his discharge was written and signed by Captain Hunter but the same is now lost or destroyed and he is unable to procure the same.

He has no documentary evidence and knows of no person whose testimony he can procure to testify to his services.

He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a Pension or an annuity except the present and declares that his name is not on the pension roll of the agency of any State or Territory in the union.

On this the 4th day of February 1845, Personally appeared before us George Williams & Sims Upchurch both acting Justices of the peace & members of the Court of Pleas & Quarter Sessions in and for the said County of Chatham, Moses Upchurch, a resident of the aforesaid County & State, aged 89 years who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the act of Congress passed June 7th 1832.

That he was a resident of Wake County N. C. in the War of the Revolution. And that he served the United States as follows in said war, To wit: that he volunteered in the Cavalry under Captain Jones of the said County & State in April 1776 – that Medecay [sic, Cosmo Medici or Medicie] was Lieutenant & James Armstrong Ensign that he was marched for Wilmington North Carolina but was halted at Duplin old Court House & was marched South through Fayetteville, crossed the Pedee River at Long Bluff & Santee at Nelson's ferry entered Charleston on the 28th day of June in the same year on the very day of the Battle of Sullivans Island was Fought – that he was stationed there (at Charleston) some time – that during the time he was at Charleston his Captain James Jones went home & that the command fell to Lieutenant Medici and that he was marched to Savannah Georgia & remained at that

place some time – then the Army was ordered back to Charleston South Carolina – that he was left at the said place Savannah to take care of his brother Charles & another soldier by the name of Blalock who were sick – that when they got well he & the said Blalock & his brother came on to Charleston where they learned that the Army was gone to Halifax N. C. -- that they saw their Lieutenant Medici at Charleston & he gave him a furlough to go by home & directed him to meet him at Halifax to whence the Army had gone.

This declarant states that from the time he entered the service till he arrived at home (which was in November) after he entered the service was about eight months, that he went to Halifax as he was ordered & saw his Lieutenant Medici & got another furlough to come on and to return again he thinks in June afterwards & that he did return to Halifax & obtained a discharge from the service. That when he was stationed at Charleston South Carolina Jethro Sumner was Colonel.

Don't know if something happened to him or he moved out of North Carolina or what. You mentioned other surnames that were associated with the Upchurchs and Patricks in Wake County. On the Will and these indentures there was a Kimbro Council, Alvis Yates, Moses Upchurch, Leslie Herdon, A. Lassiter Rogers and Thom Whitehead. Kimbro Council, to me, had an interest in the real estate and was the executor of the estate. Do any of these men ring a bell? My great great grandfather left North Carolina and went first into Tennessee and then to Mississippi before going to Arkansas.

The list contains Lodwick Alford. Charles Upchurch and Julius Johnston next to one another.

Two names away is Richard Upchurch Jr. and he is on the page with Benjamin Upchurch,

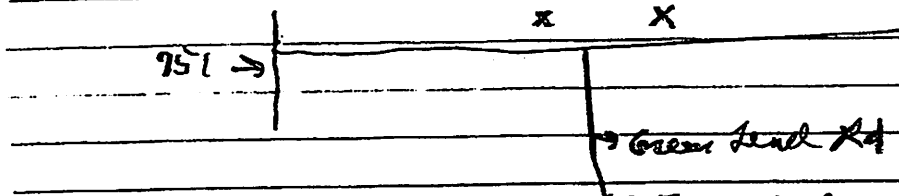

WAKE COUNTY CIVIL ACTION PAPERS CONCERNING LAND - PART I

Abstracted by Diane L. Richard PG 8

Few early deed records survive for Wake County. When combined with the cessation of land grants from 1763-1778, we find a dearth of early Wake County land records. One interesting set of records that do survive (though not in their entirety) are Civil Action Papers (CAPs) Concerning Land. These are a subset of the CAPs series at the North Carolina State Archives in Raleigh. These are extant court papers where there was an issue concerning land. The originals can be found in C.R.099.325.93 (1773-1793). The surviving paperwork up to the year 1800 will eventually be abstracted and included in *Wake Treasures*.

You will note that the timing of many of these is in 1778. This would have been the first time that one could file for a land grant in about fifteen years. During those years, many moved to Wake County, made improvements on land, bought and sold land, and yet no land grants were issued. So, as soon as the land grant process was re-instituted by the State of NC, there were a lot of land grant entries made, and this caused a lot of caveats² to also be filed.

Hi Phil:

Please see my replies below in "RED" to your questions.

Hi Marianne---

As a start could you let me have a brief sketch as to how you trace back to Henry Webb Buffaloe?
(Henry Webb Buffaloe is my 2nd great-grandfather.)

Let me tell you where I am on several by the name of Henry Buffaloe as a start. I have good records on the following four:

1. Henry Buffaloe, I b 1745.
2. Henry Buffaloe, II b 1790, S/O I.
3. Henry Buffaloe, III b about 1812, nephew of II. (This is my 2nd great-grandfather. He is the S/O William Embrey Buffaloe, brother of Henry Jr (1790) His first wife was Viola Upchurch, D/O James W. Upchurch. Their marriage is noted in the Upchurch Bible. I do not know what happened to her.
4. Henry Buffaloe, IV S/O William D. Buffaloe by 2nd wife), a GGS/O II.

I have two by the name of Henry Buffaloe about whom I have a question as follows:

5. In 1937 the WPA recorded slave stories. One owner was Henry Buffaloe. Do you know which Henry Buffaloe that was? (I believe I have something on this and will keep looking, but I believe it is your no.4 Henry)

6. About 1784 Moses Upchurch and wife sold land to Henry Buffaloe. This was recorded on Page 300 or 306 of the Wake County court minutes for the March 1784, Court term. I do not know the acreage or the exact location of this tract. However from what I know of Moses Upchurch the tract would have been within five miles of Moccasin Creek which divides Wake and Franklin Counties. I assume this was Henry Buffaloe, I. Can you shed any more light on this? I am with you on this one. Henry #1. He owned 900 acres in the St. Matthews township just north of Raleigh at his death. He died without a will and it took about 2 years to settle it. It was a huge court battle. I will look, but I believe I have the file on this.

GABRIEL RAY and his wife MILEY, of
FRANKLIN COUNTY, N. C. sell lands to SYLVANUS
PUMPHREY, of NASH COUNTY, N. C., a tract begin-
ning at the line of JACOB BAS on the lower side
of BARLOW'S BRANCH, by line to ROBT BRANW.
Dated December 2, 1786. Signed by GABRIEL RAY
and MILEY RAY (both by their mark).

GABRIEL RAY and wife MILEY to FRANKS
WILLS, 140 acres on the PETER HILL branch, wit-
nessed by WILLIAM GARNER and GRAY ANDREWS, March
10, 1789. JOHN WILLS witnessed.

THOMAS RAY, of FRANKLIN COUNTY, N. CARO-
LINA, to THOMAS GAY, a tract of land beginning on
the corner of PHILIP PIERCE, running South to
ISAAC STRICKLAND'S corner and to THOMAS GAY cor-

WILLIAMSON RICHARDS, of FRANKLIN COUNTY,
N. C. on November 1, 1800, sold land to DANIEL
RAY near the FRANKLIN COUNTY line, containing 118
acres more or less. Signed WILLIAMSON RICHARDS.
Deed was witnessed by JEREMIAH BEE.

DANIEL RAY executed a deed to JAMES RAY
in FRANKLIN COUNTY, N. C., same being part of the
said DANIEL RAY'S tract where he now lives (Jan.
10, 1828) beginning at SANDFORD'S line, then
with WILLIAMSON RICHARDS'S line, fifty acres more
or less. Signed DANIEL RAY (by his mark); wit-
nessed by I. PATE and NATHAN PERKIN.

ELISHA STRICKLAND of WAKE COUNTY sold to
THOMAS RAY, of FRANKLIN COUNTY, N. C. 42 acres on
the line of JAMES PIERCE; and his corner, to the
line of THOMAS GAY. November 18, 1794. Signed by
ELISHA STRICKLAND. Witnesses were PHILIP PIERCE
and ISAAC STRICKLAND.
