Dear Cousin Phil,

Thank you for including me on the item on my great aunt Tula and her home. I knew the house well when she lived there. As a lad in Cary, I must have cut her grass at least 100 times over the years. You've been to the house, so you know it was something of a showplace in its prime. You also referenced Tula's long stint of service to the Baptist Church in Apex. She taught the same Sunday School class for over 50 years, and was recognized for that with a front page article in the statewide Baptist newsletter/newspaper. You may or may not know that Tula, always a card carrying Baptist, upon her death (if memory serves me correctly), left a large estate to three related entities: Wake Forest University, Bowman Gray School of Medicine, and a Baptist orphanage. I think the orphanage was perhaps the Baptist Orphanage in Thomasville. She left one-third to each. She did not leave anything of consequence—and maybe it was actually nothing—to her church or its long-time pastor Rev. Robbins who, over the years, spent a great deal of time taking Miss Tula wherever she wanted to travel.

Tula seemed to be particularly partial to my father, C.A. Upchurch, Jr. She was closer to him than any other relative, in the years following my grandfather's death in 1955, I think. My dad was known by one and all as Abie or Abe, which is what I called him my entire life; that name must have had something to do with his grandfather Allinder Burtess. I never knew Abe to even mention his granddad, and I didn't even know my great grandfather's name until you gave it to me several years back. Tula was an interesting woman to say the least. She and H. O. owned, operated, and staffed a drug store on Apex's main street. She sold the business shortly after H.O.'s death and invested wisely. She lived a rather quiet, unassuming life and most people--relatives and acquaintances alike--never knew she had anything other than minimal resources.

Hope you have a good and profitable trip to N.C. in May. Glad you had a good visit to Ireland. Becky and I traveled there about 10 years ago, rented a car at the Dublin airport, and drove completely around the periphery of the island, including Northern Ireland. She was, of course, scared to death of my driving—and truth be told, so was I. I found W. B. Yeats gravesite, took a photo of his headstone, and had a picture made for all members of my English faculty at Valdosta State University. That put me in good stead for about a year with a rather contentious bunch of elitist scholars!

Thanks again for keeping me in the loop.

Greetings Phil,

I always appreciate and enjoy hearing from you. Glad to learn the Ireland trip was a good one and that your visit to the Carolinas was productive. I regret we could not get by to see you last month when you were in our vicinity; however, we were tied up with a convention and with family. We have suffered through the same heat wave that has affect the midwest so drastically. Today is perhaps the coolest day we have had since back in May. I hope the weather broke a little toward the lower temp side while your guests were visiting with you recently.

You asked several questions in your note. I'll respond to them as best as I can. Also, I think I would like

to see the names of people Warren Holleman suggested as possible contacts, although I suspect there are few that I know, should you still be willing to share the names with me. For instance, I did not know Mack Upchurch. Also, I do not recall Miss Tula ever having a Cadillac. One of the reasons I say this is because Tula was very much a product of the depression. She was quite thrifty and cultivated the mystique that she was barely able to get by. A Cadillac would never have been her choice of vehicle.

DIOFILE OF AKTULA

My recollection is that the last car she owned was a 1950 Dodge sedan, black in color. I am reasonably sure of this inasmuch as I sort of lusted for the car during my teenage years. She didn't drive it much, mainly to church and the post office. The car was always garaged and she was very possessive of it (that means she would not let me drive it!). I am not sure when she sold it, but I believe she kept the car well into the '70s. I have a vague recollection her driver's license was taken from her about then, but I don't recall her causing or being involved in an accident. Interestingly, at the reading of Tula's will, the Dodge was mentioned and noted it was to be given to her minister, Preacher Robbins. He deserved it, of course, but at the time she died, Tula no longer owned the car.

TO PLOPSI

You asked about when I lived near Apex. My family moved to the Cary area during WW II, probably in about 1942-43. Prior to that we lived in Raleigh on Everette Ave. Following the WW II move, we lived between Cary and Morrisville. When I was about 8 or 9 years old, we moved into Cary proper and lived there until 1955 when we moved back to Raleigh. Even after the move to Raleigh, we saw Tula fairly frequently until my parents moved to Daytona Beach and I went into the Army in 1958. As I mentioned in an earlier note, Tula was very fond of my father, and they stayed in close touch until he died in the mid-1970s.

I do have several memories that pertain to Aunt Tula. They mainly involve personal matters that might prove to be somewhat interesting to a researcher such as yourself. I'll save these for another day and time. In the meantime, I hope you all have a wonderful summer, in spite of the oppressive heat. Finally, I would be remiss if I failed to thank you for your kind invitation to come by your home and visit at some point in time. Becky and I would be honored, and should we ever be close to St. Louis, we will let you know.



Dear Cousin Phil,

This is a very much overdue note. I must apologize for it being so far removed from your last letter of December 13 last. As usual, the months have flown by. I have allowed myself to take on too many volunteer activities; but on the other hand I am thankful that I have the time and energy to devote to my extra curricula passions, such as Rotary and Georgia Retired Educators. My June resolution is to try to develop the same passion for staying in touch with corresponders. Anyway, please permit me to wish you a happy Father's Day as well as a wonderful summer solstice.

There are several points I need to address early on. The first is to thank you for sharing with me the photograph of your family, taken on the 60^{th} and 80^{th} anniversaries, and the identity sheet of all the persons in the picture. I recognized so many names that have been mentioned over the years in the "Letters From the Editor" section of the UPCHURCH BULLETIN. You have a most beautiful helpmate in Sallaine and a family that is clearly comprised of people with exceptional good looks. Indeed, as you recently noted, they all are above average. You clearly have every reason to be proud of one and all.

Thanks too for the mention of me on p. 75 of Vo. 29, No. 2;. It was very kind of you to devote the time, effort, and space. I am honored, and I want you to know I am very appreciative of your thinking of me.

Next, I want to let you know I am grateful for the information you furnished me on my aunt, Frances Marian Dowdee. I made copies and passed them along to Marian's son (Alan Dowdee) and daughter (Jane Dowdee Clontz Pressley).

The final point I must address is that I have enclosed, at long last, the participation sheet for the current calendar year. I am sorry about the delay in getting this done.

Becky and I are both well—a bit overfed but with our health reasonable good. Our daughter, Cheryl, and her family will be arriving soon from Stuttgart for their first visit to our place in about two years. We are very much looking forward to seeing them all again and especially visiting with our three teenage grandchildren. We are making plans to keep everyone busy while in Georgia. They will return to Germany for at least another year. They hope to learn sometime prior to Christmas whether this will be their final year overseas.

I was installed in May as president of the Georgia Retired Educators Association. We have approximately 18,500 members statewide. I spend most of my time traveling to local units (mainly based on Georgia's county structure) speaking on what the association is engaged in that relates to education in our state. Of special interest to our members is legislation being promoted in the General Assembly that has a relationship to the

Teachers Retirement System of Georgia; that is, a relationship to their pensions. It has been quite a struggle over the past several years to safeguard our money and at the same time protect our 3% annual COLA which, interestingly, has been prepaid during our working years. Of late, the economic downturn in our state has seen the Consumer Price Index be below the prepaid COLA percentage, hence the question of whether to pay a COLA at the rate we have always enjoyed. Then there's the question of whether retirees aged less than 65 should have government supported health insurance. There are those in the General Assembly who currently say NO. Lastly, there is an overriding question of whether our defined benefits retirement plan ought to be converted into a contributory benefits plan (government 401K), in order to save the state money. To say the least, I am getting a clinic in state government 101 this year.

We'll not do much traveling for the next 10 months or so. We contemplate traveling to Europe for about three weeks in October. Plans are being formulated now. I think we may take a short river cruise down the Seine from Paris to the Normandy area. I have not been to the D-Day landing sites or to the American cemeteries in that part of France. We will stop in Stuttgart, of course, to see family for a week or so.

I don't know what your travel plans are; however, please know that when you and Sallaine are in the vicinity of Atlanta we would very much like to provide you both with a place to stay that you can call a home away from home. We are not too far from the Burwell Community in Carroll County, GA, which was home to several Upchurches, as well as Carroll County itself. Then, in the southern part of the state in Valdosta and Clayttville are some Upchurches whose family came from Kentucky. Finally, there are a few Upchurches in nearby Athens, some of whom appear to have been successful business people. I personally know almost none of these people, except for the south Georgia folks, but we can certainly make arrangements to drop in on them!

I just realized this missive is too long and that I have taken up too much of your time, so I'll close for now. Besides, my '49 Hudson needs my attention. Right now I am attempting to wire a three-pole voltage regulator with six wires, two of which just miraculously appear through the firewall. Since I don't know where they are coming from, I don't know where to hook them to the voltage regulator. I could certainly use a NC State electrical engineer.

I hope you and yours have a great and productive summer. I will end this where I began: with an apology for my tardiness with regard to correspondence.





At the end of our teaching last year, we spent an additional two weeks traveling to some of the places you undoubtedly visited, namely, Xian, Chengdu, Juzaighou (spelling?) in the mountains of northwestern Sichuan, Guilan, Hong Kong, and a few smaller places in between. It was just the two of us. This year, following the summer term, we will fly to southwestern China and spend a few days in and around the cities of Kunming and Lijiang, then we will drop by Shanghai and Qingdao on our way back to Beijing and our flight home.

Becky and I hope you continue to get stronger and are able to resume a full level of activity which, for you, must be going full speed each and every day. I say that only because I know you have many, many irons in the fire. In your last letter to me, you included information that your grandfather, Bartley Jefferson U and my great grandfather, Allinder Burtess U were cousins and were together during the Civil War. I know absolutely nothing about my GGF, other than the information you have provided, so I am anxiously awaiting your report in a forthcoming *UB* of your trip to the battle sites. Speaking of battle sites, my daughter Cheryl and her family just moved to Stafford, VA, a little north of Fredricksburg. Her husband is a naval officer, and the family just returned from a two-year stint in Iceland. Becky and I had the pleasure of visiting with them in Iceland on two occasions. If you and Sallaine have not traveled there, the island is a marvelous place for tourists. A bit pricey, it is nevertheless a beautiful place, clean and pristine. Tourism there is increasing and practically everyone speaks English. But I digress. . .

Because Cheryl is now in the midst of the area where so many Civil War battles took place, I am looking forward to combining visits to her home with nosing around the battlefields in Virginia and Maryland. I am therefore anxiously awaiting your report of your GFs activities. You will be my absentee guide for the appropriate Civil War sites.

You asked me if I have ever seen the gravestone of Allinder Burtess at Mt. Pisgah Baptist Church in Chatham County; no I haven't. I would very much like to. I went back to Wake County for a two-day visit a few months back. Went by Montlawn Cemetery and the one at Cary. We would like to go back in the near future and spend several days in the Raleigh area. When that happens I intend to look up ABs gravesite, but first I will have to find out where in Chatham County the Mt. Pigsah cemetery is located.

I have not had relatives, at least any I know, in the Raleigh area for many years. Consequently, I have only passed through the city a couple of times over the past 30 years. My Upchurch grandparents' home is still standing. It is about a half block from the governor's mansion on the edge of that wonderful Victorian district whose name escapes me now. A rather small home by today's standards, my grandparent's homeplace sits on a small lot which, when I drove by the place in my recent trip to Raleigh, brought back several memories. My grandfather, Carey Almon Sr., was an interesting person to say the least. He was first and foremost a wonderfully gifted preacher, one well read and very bright. He had many interests in life; however, few of them provided him with much in the way of monetary compensation. For cash he seemed to rely on his wife, Frances, who worked many years for the NC State Department of Education as a secretary. She always called him Mr. Upchurch, even when discussion him among close family members. My aunt, Marian U. Dowdee, told me a few months back that even growing up, her mother always referred to my GF as Mr. Upchurch. Anyway, as head of the anti-saloon league or some such organization in Raleigh, he rather routinely made persimmon beer in a barrel on the back porch of the Raleigh home, a welcome

treat which he relished greatly once the fermentation had taken place. To help provide food during the growing season, he had a plot of ground about one-half mile of the house where he had a garden. He tended it with the help of a borrowed mule. The garden seemed to have provided him with a reason to leave the house for many hours of the day; I think it was his escape. Also, he would also bring home some oddball things from time to time. One of my favorite things, when I was a youngster, was a stagecoach. I have no idea where he got it, but it gave me many hours of enjoyment playing and dreaming about the old west. I fought off many robbers and Indians during the period when he parked the stagecoach in his driveway. He was greatly missed after his death in 1954, in part because he was so unpredictable. He could always be counted on to provide something or say something that would become a topic of conversation for the rest of us. Except for his spiritual life, he was not one who seemed to live according to a plan.

I am sharing the information you sent to me on my nearest relatives with Aunt Marian and Cheryl. We will update and add whatever we can to your information. It may take a month or so to get things together. If you would like, I will try to get together copies of pertinent materials on my father for your files; but I do not want to burden you with those kinds of things unless you are willing to receive them. On second thought, you probably have enough information on him as it is.

You also asked for biographical information on me. I am happy to provide you with a little of it at this time. I'll try not to repeat the info I know you already have.

- 1. Graduated from Cary High School, Cary NC, in 1956. Enrolled at NC State College after graduation with a major in textile chemistry. Organic Chemistry helped me to decide to choose another major.
- 2. Enlisted in the Army, serving between December 1957 and December 1960.
- 3. Upon separation from the service, went to Daytona Beach, FL to work at NASCAR. Graduated from Daytona Community College in 1962.
- 4. Married Rebecca Ruth Tull in 1962.
- 5. Left Daytona Beach for Tallahassee, FL. Enrolled in Florida State University. Graduated with BA in History in 1964.
- 6. Earned master's degree from FSU in Geography, 1965.
- 7. Moved to Boone, NC to teach geography/geology at Appalachian State Teachers College, 1965-67. Rank of Instructor.
- 8. Left Boone for University of Tennessee, Knoxville, in order to teach geography /geology 1967-69. Rank of instructor. While at UT completed course work on doctorate.
- Returned to Appalachian State University (name was changed in 1968) in Boone as Assistant Professor to teach geography, 1969-71. Completed doctoral dissertation and was graduated from UT with Ph.D. degree in geography in 1971.
- 10. Employed as Head, Department of Geography, West Georgia College, (Now State University of West Georgia) Carrollton, GA in 1971. Stayed in that position until 1981. (One of my faculty members was a bright, young assistant professor by the name of Newton Leroy Gingrich, who went on to become the Speaker of the House of Representatives). Was promoted to professor.
- 11. During academic year 1979-80 was awarded an American Council on Education Fellowship in Academic Administration. The year was served as assistant to the president of Florida State University.
- 12. Left WGC for Valdosta State University, Valdosta, GA, serving as Dean, College of Arts and Sciences from 1981-94.
- 13. Departed VSU for North Georgia College & State University, Dahlonega, GA, and the position of Vice President for Academic Affairs, 1994-99. Retired from the University System of Georgia in 1999 as emeritus vice president.
- 14. Active in the Dahlonega Rotary Club, the Dahlonega Methodist Church, and other community organizations.
- 15. Hobbies include traveling, philately, and working on old cars, especially his 1949 and 54 Hudsons, and other vintage cars.
- 16. Most thankful for my family: especially spouse Becky, daughters Cheryl and Margaret, and grandchildren.


