Discussed with Monk the prospects of holding a meeting to discuss progress on developing a history of Hamblatt & Swift Creek Township, Wake Co, NC. He thinks I should check with Debbea Lope at Mill Park to get her ideas.

Re Uncle Moir land Monk says it was about 2005 when Joseph Lee sold the land to N.C. State Univ for about \$3 million. In earlier years Joseph ran cattle on the area. He lived in Raleigh but would come out often and Monk knew him.

Monk & I discussed the fact that there were at least two tenant houses on the B. P. U land on Old River Road. This led us to discuss the prospect that Uncle Miss^A could have been the father of the mulatto WOODROW ATWATER^B who died probably in the 1970's Monk knew Woodrow and half jokingly called him "Cousin". Both Monk & I remember Woodrow as a tall, light skinned man with a neat mustache.

Based on Monk & RPH comparing notes by phone on 3 FEB 2006 there is no question but that Woodrow is the mulatto I remember seeing at our old place about 1940 when he came to see a black lady who lived there. He was a handsome looking man. Monk said Uncle Getty teased Uncle Miss^A, telling him to buy clothes for his "son". Uncle Miss protested. Still my memory is that it was said Uncle Miss had a child by a black woman.







I related to Mark the story France Holt told me about Holt offering to build Aunt Maud a nice house in exchange for her land. Monk had thought that it was Harold D. Wilson, Sr who floated this deal but Monk conceded that the France Holt version could well be right. In any case the proposed deal caused Uncle Getha to contact Uncle Rex in Norfolk and to persuade him to move into the home to avoid the deal. My take is that Uncle Getha wanted always been angling to get the land for Frank, Jr and this is what happened in the end. Monk says he was always told that the land was somehow supposed to go to Uncle Rex's son Allen (maybe as a follow on to the return of Uncle Rex to the home - RPL)

Mark and I once again lamented the fact that the 6 unnamed children of BTM lined out their leas in the name of their father and let it fall down around them. One could hardly blame the girls as they had not been prepared to work outside the home and opportunities were quite limited considering the Depression and all [But the opportunity was not zero!!]. The boys were the biggest disappointment. Encapsulating at strange one might guess they were raised spoiled and elected not to break out of the mold.

Re Uncle Wiz - FH said he had to go to Dix Hill from Rex as Aunt Maude could not take care of him. She never met Tena until Uncle Wiz at Dix Hill and he seemed well cared for. However, Tena was upset when Dix Hill did an unauthorized autopsy and left him head mangled. He was buried when in Dix Hill

It would appear Aunt Maude could not stay in the home alone after Uncle Wiz went to the hospital in early 1959 - hence to Uncle Frank's.

After Maude could not get along with Aunt Edna, Bonnie took her to Milwaukee, but after a fall she had to go to a care facility on welfare - first at Sertagnon and then ocean from Rex at Hill Haven. Tena visited (FH driving) and complained about care at both places.

In 1955 Francis Holt & family paid uncle ^Δ Gette \$1700 for land, what did he do with it.

FH remembers the roof on the ^Δ B.I.U home broken badly. They replaced only some parts of the roof.

At one point Holt Tally offered to build a house for Aunt Maud, etc in exchange for the B.I.U home but Uncle Gette blocked this.

FH and I discussed in some detail possible reasons the 6 unnamed children of B.I.U lived in their father's home and let it fall down. We could come up with no satisfactory reason. Of course the Depression was a problem, Father did not have good opportunities to make money etc, etc. Ma Perry (Aunt Perry) said Gette, ^Δ his ^Δ wife & ^Δ children were lazy. That is a good bet for Gette but his dad had a garden, hogs, chickens & helped with grocerer - worked at golf course & at Yater Chicken Farm. - He first did not earn much, we agree ^Δ Frank Jr took advantage of the situation but while his children benefitted they should not be made to feel guilty.
