7. WESLEY FLOWERS MILLS, son of Shadrach Mills and Patsy Wilson, was born ca 1831 in Wake Co., NC, and died 19\_\_\_. He married 29 Jul 1851 Delaney Harwood (b ca 1830, d aft 1898), daughter of John Harwood. They were married by JP Young Booker, in Wake Co., NC - bondsman was Oliver Mills.

In 1853 and 1858, Wesley was involved in a few court cases. For more info see ch. COURT DATES ETCHED IN TIME (May 1853-pg. 517), (Aug 1853-pg. 532), and (May 1858-pg. 503).

Wesley served in the Confederate Army during the Civil War. For info see ch. GRANDSONS OF NAAMAN MILLS: SOLDIERS IN THE CIVIL WAR.

Wesley was a farmer. They resided in Chatham Co, NC (Grove P.O.) on FC/1860; (Pittsboro P.O.) on FC/1870; and (Williams Twp.) on FC/1880. In 1870, Wesley owned real estate valued at \$200 and a personal estate valued at \$400.

In Wesley's compiled military service record from the Civil War, he is described as being 6 feet, 3 3/4 inches tall. On 26 Jun 1901, he applied for a soldier's pension from the State of NC, for wounds that he had received during the Civil War. His application was approved.

WILLIAM THOMAS MCKEE

Dr. McKee was the son of the late Mack McKee and Mrs. Rebecca Jones McKee. Dr. McKee was born on a farm near Apex, North Carolina, May 1st, 1863; he, therefore, was born during the Civil War. His father is said to have been a native of Iredell county; and came to Wake, first, as the driver of the old-fashioned stagecoach; here, he met and married the daughter of Joel Jones. Joel Jones married Tabitha Utley, 26 April 1823. Tabitha Utley is thought to have been the daughter of John Utley Jr., known as Little Jack Utley, and lived just above the head of the Norris Mill Pond now owned by the sons of the late **John Mills.** This would make Tabitha Utley the great granddaughter of William, the founder of the family. Joel Jones was the son of Robert Jones, brother to the late Madison Jones. Joel Jones settled within a few hundred yards of Salem church, lived and died there; and traditions say he cut the path leading from the present home of Mr. Arthur Pierce to Apex. The daughter, Rebecca, became the mother of this sketch. Dr. McKee was the g.g.g.grandson of William Utley, founder of the family in North Carolina. The father of Dr. McKee, was a farmer, lived for many years on the land of the late W. B. Upchurch, father of Mr. George Upchurch, now one of the County Commissioners of Wake County. Dr. McKee worked on his father's farm until 21 years old; but having the ambition to become a physician, he went to the Insane Asylum where he worked, saved his wages until he had enough to enter a medical college, which he did, graduating from the Louisville Medical College in 1891.

Here we have the example of a poor boy whose father was a tenant working his own way to graduation through a standard medical college; and entering upon the practice of medicine when only 28 years old. He located at a place in Chatham county, then called Rialto, and practiced his profession here for five years, then moving to Caryville, Tennessee. However, before this time a very important event had taken place in the life of the young doctor, for in the neighborhood of Rialto, there lived a young lady, Miss Beulah Florence Wynne, born April 13, 1872. This young lady had graduated from Salem Female College the same year Dr. McKee had graduated from the medical college; and on the 19 April 1894, they were married in Durham, by Rev. George Dowell.

Dr. McKee practiced medicine approximately 46 years; first in Chatham county, North Carolina, second at Caryville, Tennessee, and third in Oklahoma, perhaps all the time at Seminole, a great oil center. He was a successful physician, loved his work, having grown up a poor boy, and made his way in the face of adverse conditions, he was therefore better able to sympathize with the poor, needy and suffering. Two or three years before his death, Dr. McKee's health became poor, from some cause his leg became infected which necessitated it being amputated, but until he died he insisted he much regretted his physical inability to answer every call. He died honored, respected and loved in the Sanitorium at Paris, Texas, Feb 1, 1937. He was therefore, 74 years old at the time of his death. He lived a useful, active life, he was the son of honorable, useful parents, whose example for industry, integrity and honor he could emulate.

The father of Naaman Mills was Abraham Mills. I traveled to Northampton Co, NC and discovered the enclosed paper which was thrilling. There were Mills in Northampton Co, NC in 1757 and Abraham Mills was probably born around 1725. His wife was probably the dau of Richard Smith. Also, he probably had another son, John Milton, about the same age as Naaman Mills.

This entry was discovered 23 Sep 1993 while the author was reading the original Wake Co., NC CPQS minutes at the NC State Archives. Until this document was found, no one had successfully become a member of the Daughters of the American Revolution (D.A.R.) under Naaman Mills' lineage. He is now listed in the D.A.R. PATRIOT INDEX.

Naaman's wife died between 1810 and 1830. It is not known if she was alive when Naaman and his family moved to Wake Co., NC about 1812. Perhaps she may have died about 1811 and this is what triggered Naaman to move away from Edgecombe Co., NC.

Naaman Mills and his wife had at least 10 children and 51 grand children. During 1996, eight generations of Naaman's descendants number well into the thousands - many of them are listed in this book.

JOHN MILLS

John Mills, son of Naaman Mills and \_\_\_\_\_, was born ca 1780 in Northampton Co., NC, and died ca 1867. He is buried at Mills Fam. Cem., Apex, NC - gravesite marked with a concrete gravestone manufactured by the author, which was installed 3 Jun 1995.

On 3 Jan 1822, John was the bondsman of his brother, Matthew's marriage bond. Also in 1822, he was a witness to Matthew's deed, as documented by Wake Co., NC CPQS (Feb 1822-pg. 321): "A deed from Gilliam Upchurch to Matthew Mills was in open court, duly proven by the oath of John Mills, a witness thereto". In 1825, John was a witness to his brother, Nathan's deed, as documented by Wake Co., NC CPQS (Nov 1825-pg. 285): "A deed from Rial Ferrell to Nathan Mills was in open court, duly proven by the oath of John Mills, a witness thereto".

In 1832, John was a witness to his brother, Nathan's deed, as documented by Wake Co., NC CPQS (Aug 1832-pg. 87): "A deed from Rial Ferrell to Nathan Mills was in open court, duly proven by the oath of John Mills, a witness thereto". John was the administrator of his father, Naaman Mills' estate, as documented by Wake Co., NC CPQS (Nov 1836-pg. 511): "Ordered that John Mills be appointed administrator on the estate of Naaman Mills, deceased, who enters into bond in the sum of one hundred dollars, with Seth Jenks and Nathan Mills as securities, and comes into open court and qualified according to law".

John was a farmer. He resided in Wake Co., NC on FC/1830; and Wake Co., NC with his brother, Nathan and family on FC/1850. A "John Mills", age 65, born ca 1795, resided in Wake Co., NC with Lucretia (Mills) Upchurch and family on FC/1860 - he may have given a wrong age to the census taker.

John died intestate (without a will), as documented by Wake Co., NC CPQS (18 Feb 1867-pg. 247): "On motion J.C. Council, J.T. William Jenks, and G.A. Upchurch are appointed a committee to audit and settle the account of E.L. Mills, administrator of John Mills, Sr., and report their proceedings under their hands and seals to the next term of this court". John lived to about age 87.

The author has not found any documentary proof that John Mills ever married, or had any children.

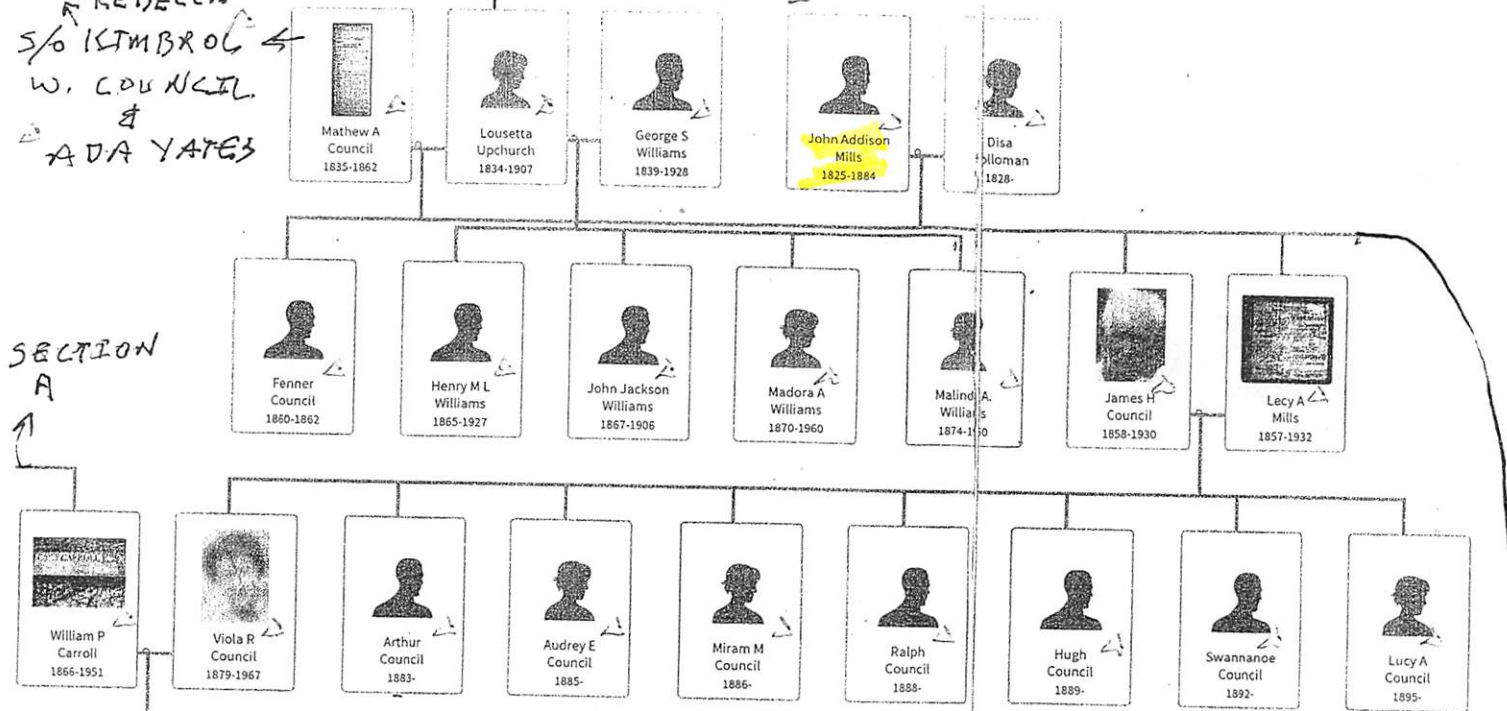

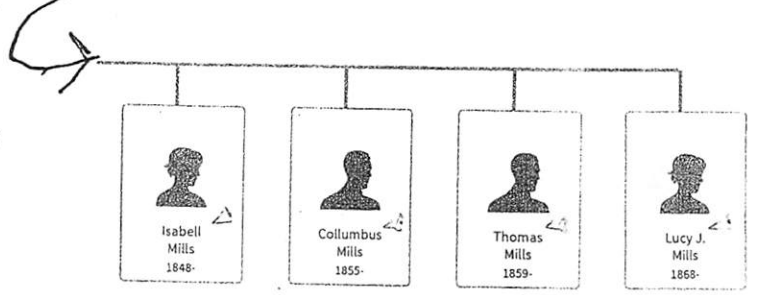

2. JOHN ADDISON MILLS, son of Matthew Mills and Piety Wade, was born 21 Jun 1824 in NC, and died 17 Sep 1884. He married 24 Apr 1844 Diza W.M. Holloman (b 14 May 1828, d 9 Dec 1907). They were married in Wake Co., NC - bondsman was James Woodward. They are buried at a small family cemetery off Rd. 1603, Apex, NC - gravesites marked with upright monument. John was a carpenter and mechanic. They resided in Wake Co., NC (White Oak Twp.) on FC/1850-1880. In 1860, John owned a personal estate valued at \$427. The FC/1880 contained the following info on the Agricultural Schedule regarding John's farm:

1880 - 30 acres of tilled land. 30 acres of woodland and forest. 25 acres of other unimproved land. Value of farm, including land, fences and buildings - \$600. Value of farming implements and machinery - \$40. Value of livestock - \$150. Amount paid for wages for farm labor in 1879, including value of board - \$60. 30 weeks of colored hired labor in 1879 upon farm. Estimated value of all farm productions sold, consumed, or on hand for 1879 - \$300. 2 horses of all ages on hand 1 Jun 1880.

From 1846 to 1852, John was involved in a few court cases. For more info see ch. COURT DATES ETCHED IN TIME (Aug 1846-pg. 579), (Nov 1851-pg. 380), and (Feb 1852-pgs. 401-402).

John lived to age 60.

Matthew Mills, son of Naaman Mills and \_\_\_\_\_, was born 1789 in Edgecombe Co., NC, and died 1854. He had a twin brother, Britain Mills. Matthew married 3 Jan 1822 Piety Wade (b ca 1800, d ca 1854). They were married in Wake Co., NC - bondsman was John Mills. They are buried at Mills Fam. Cem., Apex, NC - gravesites marked with fieldstones.

After owning his land for 32 years, Matthew sold it 26 Oct 1853 to Willie J. Fuller. Matthew died less than one year later, intestate (without a will). 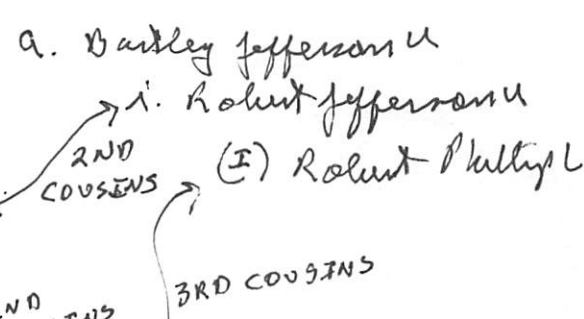

John A. Mills

JOHN A. MILLS was a man of many talents and great charm. His talents were principally character traits: vision, intellect, perseverance, industrious integrity, yet patience and a pleasing, mild manner were predominant in his demeanor.

He was a handsome man and always exceedingly well groomed. His infectious smile made one feel he was at the source of all that was good and was eager to share it - a characteristic he seems to have

gotten from his mother; for in her middle nineties she was always optimistic and smiling.

A story that I should like to preserve for his descendants:

Around the turn of the century when the Raleigh and Cape Fear Railroad was in its early years, it was necessary for the engines to stop along the way to refuel with water and coal. In heavy rains or snow the tracks were slick, and often the engines would have to back to get more speed to pull the grades, or the flagmen would sprinkle sand on the rails to give friction to the wheels so they could grab the tracks or even stop for some minutes to get up more steam. Although there were ten trains per day, five going south and five going north, there were often delayed schedules; and even in that day of relative ease and slower pace, there was much irritation and complaining among the passengers. One fine hot summer day Cousin John (Mr. Mills) sat calmly enduring the cinders and heat of the day, as well as the heat of several drummers (as the traveling salesmen were called in that era), who were exasperated to the point of profane impatience. Finally, one passenger constrained by the pleasant composure of the one gentleman in the seat across the aisle, blubbered, "Why do you sit here so calm, smiling- while all the others in this car are disgusted and impatient?"

Cousin John replied modestly: "My train crew are doing all they can to get you to your destination. So I am amused at the fault-finding and hot tempers on such a hot day. I think we shall be moving very soon now."

Mills' Train, or Mills' Railroad was the usual name for the Raleigh and Southport as it later became, for such a dominant man of intellect and decision was behind this steaming power that opened up the

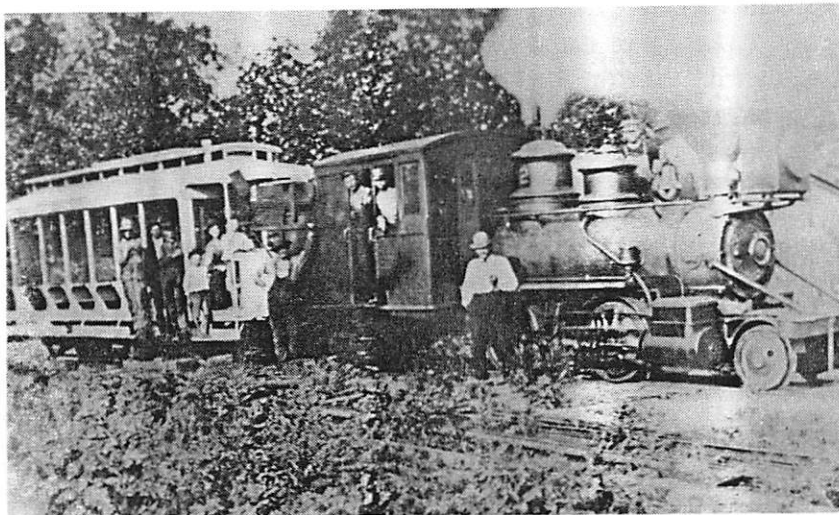

lower section of Southern Wake. Prior to that time it was referred to as the "dark corner of Wake".

In these early years there was a flood of waters overflowing the Cape Fear River at Lillington where Mills' Train crossed, and danger of the railroad bridge being washed away. Mr. Mills, weighing the odds with calculating mind, had loaded box cars banked on the bridge that the weight might hold the bridge down. It worked! The road bridge was washed away, but when the floods subsided the train bridge was standing firm. The cars were pulled away and train passage resumed as before.

John A. Mills was predominantly successful as a businessman, but his force and usefulness in his church activities were also an integral part of his life. He was deacon and church treasurer of the Raleigh Christian Church for many years. He was treasurer of the Southern Christian Convention and trustee of Elon College.

The letter following, which Mr. Mills wrote to the Christian Sun, December 20, 1894, was the forerunner of the dreams and plans for a Children's Home for the Christian Church, which now proudly stands at Elon College, North Carolina.

MR. EDITOR: -- Having been appointed on a committee at the last General Convention of the Christian Church, South, on the advisability of building an Orphan's Home, and having long been in sympathy with such a cause, I wish to make some suggestions through your columns, and ask that those who read this and feel an interest in the movement, give their views on the subject through these columns. I know the move will meet with opposition as does every other movement, but we must work the harder. Everything of value is only acquired by hard, earnest toil, either mental or physical.

The Orphan's Home is a necessity in our church; and nothing can do more for the upbuilding of the Christian Church than this Home. Children will be reared to man-hood and woman-hood, instilled with the principles of the church; and many, in time to come, will be influential in their communities --bright and shining lights for Christ and the Church.

I suggest this plan. That each church of the Christians, South, be earnestly asked to give 50 cts a year per member, for this purpose. If they will do this, it will give us six or seven thousand dollars the first year. This could be used to procure say 200 acres of good, fertile land, and put up sufficient house-room to start on. This same amount could be given year after year to support it, and thus nearly 100 homeless little boys and girls could be cared for. It would be to the world a practical illustration of our principles; and at the same time, cause many a poor child to learn of a Savior whom he or she might never otherwise have known.

I think institutions of this kind should be run by the church, from the fact that the churches are founded on humanity-loving principles, and these should be made the basic elements of church institutions. I know some will say we have a burden on our hands now, in finishing what we have undertaken in Elon College, but, my Bro. or Sister, if any of you have been burdened by what you have done I would like for you to write me and inform me of this fact that I may sympathize with you. No, you are not overburdened; and I know you can do more and never miss it. I think the mothers of our land can build this Home directly or indirectly; for, "she who rocks the cradle rules the world". And when you speak of orphans, you touch her heart; and when her heart is touched, the purse of her husband has to respond.

Only one cent a Sunday from each member will do the work.

This work should be started the first day of Jan., 1895; and I would be glad to hear from every minister as to whether or not he is willing to undertake it; and if not, why?

Of the many representative men of Raleigh, few if any, have won a more prominent position in the railroad and financial world, nor can anyone boast of a more honorable record in these spheres of usefulness, in North Carolina, than John Allison Mills, who, from an humble position in life, by sheer force of character, indomitable energy, and superior executive ability, arose, within a space of a few years, to the proud position of a railroad presidency and a leader in economic, financial and industrial affairs of the State.

Mr. Mills is a native of Wake County and is of Scotch and English ancestry. He was born on his father's farm, near Fuquay Springs, January 9, 1858, and is the son of Wiley J. Mills (deceased) and Charity (Wilburn) Mills, being the eldest of eleven children - six boys and five girls. Three of his brothers and one sister are dead. His living brothers are successfully engaged in the lumber business, one of them (Walter) at Camden, South Carolina, the other (Wayland) at Lakeland, Florida. His living sisters are Mrs. J. L. Rowland, of Willow Springs; Mrs. D. T. Adams, of Holly Springs; Mrs. H. H. Utley, of Benson; and Mrs. D. A. McPhail, of Lakewood, Florida.

Similar to other youths of slender fortune and limited opportunities, who later reach prominence and distinction in spheres of their chosen effort, young Mills had but few educational advantages, his father being an unpretentious farmer, of modest means, unable to give his sons' education greater care than to allow of their

attendance at the public schools, and this was during such seasons only as they could be spared from their routine work on the farm. Thus was spent young John's career until he had arrived at the age of twenty. Wishing then to strike out for himself in the busy world, and to make a name for himself among men, he succeeded in securing employment with Needham H. Norris in the lumber and grist mill business. Here he toiled for five years, determining to familiarize himself with every detail of this industry; for the spirit of the young man was burning with ambition, not only to learn milling as an operative merely, but to so understand it as would enable him to later conduct affairs of this character on his own responsibility. His activities in this vocation were later extended to Moore County, where he was eminently successful in the manufacture of lumber, the first shipment of long-leaf pine bill timber from this section being made by Mr. Mills and going to Philadelphia.

Coming to Raleigh in 1892, he promoted the organization of the Mills Manufacturing Company, for the manufacture of lumber and wagons. While engaged in the management of this concern he became interested in the Raleigh & Cape Fear Railroad and was elected its president. The terminus of the road was intended, originally, to be at Fuquay Springs, but later it was extended to Lillington. This remained its terminus for four years, when, in 1902, the Raleigh & Southport Railroad Company was organized, with Mr. Mills as its president. This road was consolidated with the Raleigh & Cape Fear Railroad and its operation extended to Fayetteville, its present terminus, which it entered on the 9th day of July, 1906,

amidst much rejoicing of the people. The line of this railroad traverses one of the finest long-leaf pine and fruit sections of the State, and in its completion from Raleigh to Fayetteville, Mr. Mills was the leading spirit. In its accomplishment he achieved a distinction in railroad circles and the business world such as few men have attained in North Carolina.

Mr. Mills is now actively interested, as its president, in the construction of the Elkin & Alleghany Railroad, extending from Elkin, in Surry County, to Sparta, in Alleghany County, a line in which the State holds considerable stock.

Mr. Mills is president of the Anchor Trust Company, a director of the Commercial National Bank, the Mechanics Savings Bank, and is on the executive committee and advisory board of the North Carolina Agricultural Society.

On October 21, 1884, he was married to Miss Julia Isabella Johnson of Cardenas, Wake County, daughter of W. W. Johnson and Rhoda Ann (Jones) Johnson, and cousin of Messrs. J. Beale and K. B. Johnson, of Cardenas. Six children have blessed this union, two of whom are dead, viz, Myrtle and Edward Bok. Those now living are John Maple, Walter Hartwick, Eugene and Daniel.

Religiously, Mr. Mills is prominently identified with the Christian Church, and is treasurer of the Southern Convention. Among other positions of honor and trust to which he has been called is that of member of the Board of County Commissioners of Wake, of which last-mentioned body he is chairman. He has recently been called to the presidency of the North Carolina Agricultural Society. He is affiliated with the Masonic fraternity, being a member of William G. Hill

Lodge, No. 218, and is also identified with the Order of Elks.

In the front ranks, always, of those interested in the State's resources and their development, Mr. Mills is a public-spirited, broad-minded citizen. As a friend, he is sincere and faithful, and in every sphere of life a man whom any State may well feel proud to call her son.

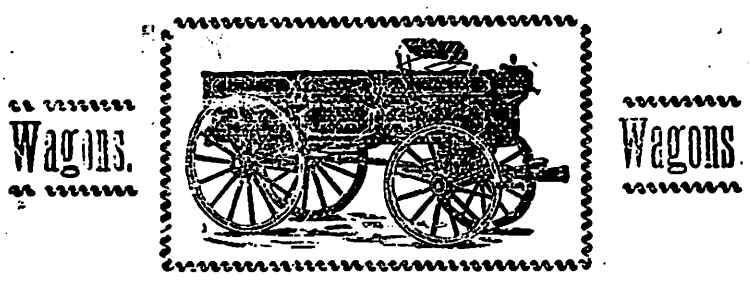

WAM reports on his Baher and related ancestor in MD & GA and refers to their success in the timber business, This led him to comment on our mutual relative JAM who had a similar success with timber in Harnett Co, NC. - His report on JAM is below and on the following page!

The key to that family in both MD and GA, is their connection to wood and saw milling. In MD, they timbered, milled, and helped in the ship building business. Also, in the working of the waters with fishing, crabbing, etc. In GA, their skills were used to clear massive amounts of timber. Bartley Jefferson Upchurch had a first cousin, Wiley Joseph Mills, whose son was John Allison Mills. He took the massive acres of woods in the Harnett Co., NC area, and made his fortune. JOHN ALLISON MILLS Of the many representative men of Raleigh, few if any have won a more prominent position in the railroad and financial world, nor can anyone boast of a more honorable record in these spheres of usefulness in North Carolina than John Allison Mills, who from an humble position in life, by sheer force of character, indomitable energy and superior executive ability, arose within the space of a few years to the proud position of a railroad presidency and a leader in the economic financial and industrial affairs of the State. Mr Mills is a native of Wake County and is of Scotch and English ancestry.

He was born on his father's farm near Fuquay Springs January 9, 1858 and is the son of Wiley J. Mills deceased and Charity Wilburn Mills, being the eldest of eleven children, six boys and five girls. Three of his brothers and one sister are dead. His living brothers are successfully engaged in the lumber business, one of them, Walter at Camden South Carolina, the other Wayland at Lakewood Florida. His living sisters are Mrs. JL Rowland of Willow Springs, Mrs. DT Adams of Holly Springs, Mrs. Dr. Hubbard Uteley of Benson and Mrs. McPhail of Lakewood Florida.

Similar to other youths of slender fortune and limited opportunities who later reach prominence and distinction in spheres of their chosen effort, young Mills had but few educational advantages, his father being an unpretentious farmer of modest means, unable to give his sons education greater care than to allow of their attendance at the public schools, and this was during such seasons only as they could be spared from their routine work on the farm. Thus was spent young John's career until he had arrived at the age of twenty, Wishing then to strike out for himself in the busy world and to make a name among men he succeeded in securing employment with NM Morris in the lumber and grist mill business. Here he toiled for five years, determining to familiarize himself with every detail of this industry, for the spirit of the young man was burning with

ambition, not only to learn milling as an operative merely, but to so understand it as would enable him to later conduct affairs of this character on his own responsibility.

His activities in this vocation were later extended to Moore County, where he was eminently successful in the manufacture of lumber, the first shipment of long leaf pine bill timber from this section being made by Mr. Mills and going to Philadelphia. Coming to Raleigh in 1892, he promoted the organization of the Mills Manufacturing Company for the manufacture of lumber and wagons. While engaged in the management of this concern he became interested in the Raleigh & Cape Fear Railroad and was elected its president. The terminus of the road was intended originally to be at Fuquay Springs, but later it was extended to Lillington. This remained its terminus for four years, when in 1902, the Raleigh & Southport Railroad Company was organized with Mr. Mills as its president. This road was consolidated with the Raleigh & Cape Fear Railroad and its operation extended to Fayetteville, its present terminus which it entered on the 9th day of July 1906 amidst much rejoicing of the people.

The line of this road traverses one of the finest long leaf pine and fruit sections of the State and in its completion from Raleigh to Fayetteville, Mr. Mills was the leading spirit. In its accomplishment, he achieved a distinction in railroad circles and the business world such as few men have attained in North Carolina. Mr. Mills is now actively interested as its president in the construction of the Elkin & Alleghany Railroad, extending from Elkin in Surry County to Sparta in Alleghany County, a line in which the State holds considerable stock. Mr. Mills is president of the Anchor Trust Company, a director of the Commercial National Bank, the Mechanics Savings Bank, and is on the executive committee and advisory board of the North Carolina Agricultural Society.

On October 21 1884 he was married to Miss Julia Isabella Johnson of Cardenas, Wake County, daughter of W.W. and Rhoda Ann Jones Johnson, and cousin of Messrs JB and KB Johnson of Cardenas. Six children have blessed this union, two of whom are dead, viz Myrtle and Edward Bok. Those now living are John Maple, Walter Hartwick, Eugene and Daniel. Religiously, Mr. Mills is prominently identified with the Christian Church and is treasurer of the Southern Christian Convention.

Among other positions of honor and trust, to which he has been called, is that of member of the board of trustees of Elon College, and of the Board of County Commissioners of Wake, of which last mentioned body, he is chairman. He has recently been called to the presidency of the North Carolina Agricultural Society. He is affiliated with the Masonic fraternity, being a member of William G. Hill Lodge No. 218, and is also identified with the Order of Elks. In the front rank, always of those interested in the State's resources and their development, Mr. Mills is a public spirited broad minded citizen. As a friend, he is sincere and faithful, and in every sphere of life, a man whom any State may well feel proud to call her son.

From the History of Fuquay-Varina, NC Wikipedia page:

The Fuquay Mineral Spring's popularity grew around the start of the 20th century, especially in the 1890s as local businessman John A. Mills developed the idea to offer "Moonlight Excursions" to the springs. He fitted flat rail cars with seats and offered nighttime train trips to southern Wake County from Raleigh. As more guests came to the springs to "take the waters", a group of small hotels sprung up in town, along with restaurants, barbecue stands, and a dance pavilion with a player piano. The town became a tourist destination and was the site of special celebrations on Fourth of July and Easter Mondays. During these events, residents of Raleigh would take the train down to watch the accompanying baseball games and participate in the dances and celebrations. Hotels like the Ben Wiley Hotel catered to the out-of-towners and became as much a center of town life as the springs. In 1902, Sippihaw was renamed "Fuquay Springs" in honor of its founding family and was officially incorporated in 1909. Take care, Cousin Billy

14. HILLIARD JACKSON MILLS, son of Shadrack Mills and Patsy Wilson, was born 1 Jul 1845 in Wake Co., NC, and died 25 May 1920. He married 29 Jun 1873 Mary Hellen Yates (b 14 Sep 1839, d 6 Nov 1909), daughter of Anderson Yates and Julie Hellen Smith. They were married by JP A.C. Council, in Green Level, NC. They are buried at Rock Springs Church Cem., Apex, NC.

Hilliard served in the Confederate Army during the Civil War. For more info see ch GRANDSONS OF NAAMAN MILLS: SOLDIERS IN THE CIVIL WAR.

Hilliard was a farmer. He resided in Chatham Co., NC (Grove P.O.) with his father on FC/1860; and Wake Co., NC (White Oak Twp.) with his cousin, Elijah L. Mills and family on FC/1870. Hilliard and his family resided in Wake Co., NC (White Oak Twp.) on FC/1880-1920. The FC/1880 contained the following info on the Agricultural Schedule regarding Hilliard's farm:

1880 - 40 acres of tilled land. 12 acres of woodland and forest. Value of farm, including land, fences and buildings - \$400. Value of farming implements and machinery - \$50. Value of livestock - \$150. Cost of fertilizers purchased in 1879 - \$22. Amount paid for wages for farm labor in 1879, including value of board - \$55. 18 weeks of white hired labor in 1879 upon farm. Estimated value of all farm productions sold, consumed, or on hand for 1879 - \$400. 1 mules and asses of all ages on hand 1 Jun 1880.

In Hilliard's compiled military service record from the Civil War, he is described as being 5 feet, 6 inches tall. On 10 May 1902, he applied for a soldier's pension from the State of NC, for wounds that he received during the Civil War. His application was approved.

After Mary Hellen's death, Hilliard m 2ndly 10 Nov 1910 Kiddie Holt (b ca 1838, d 19\_\_). Hilliard left a will. He lived to age 74.

This is the birthday party for Isham Sims Upchurch (b 31 Dec 1824, d 5 Apr 1916). I have a brief sketch that I wrote about this photo, and will include it below. Taken 31 Dec 1899.

#### A TRIPLE CELEBRATION

December 31, 1899 was a very special day to have this photograph taken. It was New Year's Eve, the last day of the 19th Century, and it was also the 75th birthday of Isham Sims Upchurch. Isham is pictured sitting in a chair, with his daughters and their husbands standing behind him. Isham's wife, Adelia Beavers Upchurch had passed away 24 Sep 1893 and is buried in the Upchurch Cemetery near the Chatham & Wake County line. Isham had fought for the Confederacy during the Civil War, in the 16th North Carolina, Company G. He was released from the prison at Point Lookout, MD on 21 June 1865. He and his wife, Adelia had 13 children. Sidney died at age 10, and Mary at age 8. On 3 Feb 1903, Isham married for a second time, at age 79 to Rosanna Taylor (age 53), who died 10 Dec 1911. Isham Upchurch died 5 Apr 1916 at age 91. Isham's daughter, Josephine Frances Upchurch lived to age 102, as did her son, Fred Broadwell. The Upchurch and Mills families had intermarried many times, from the early 1800s to the present day.
