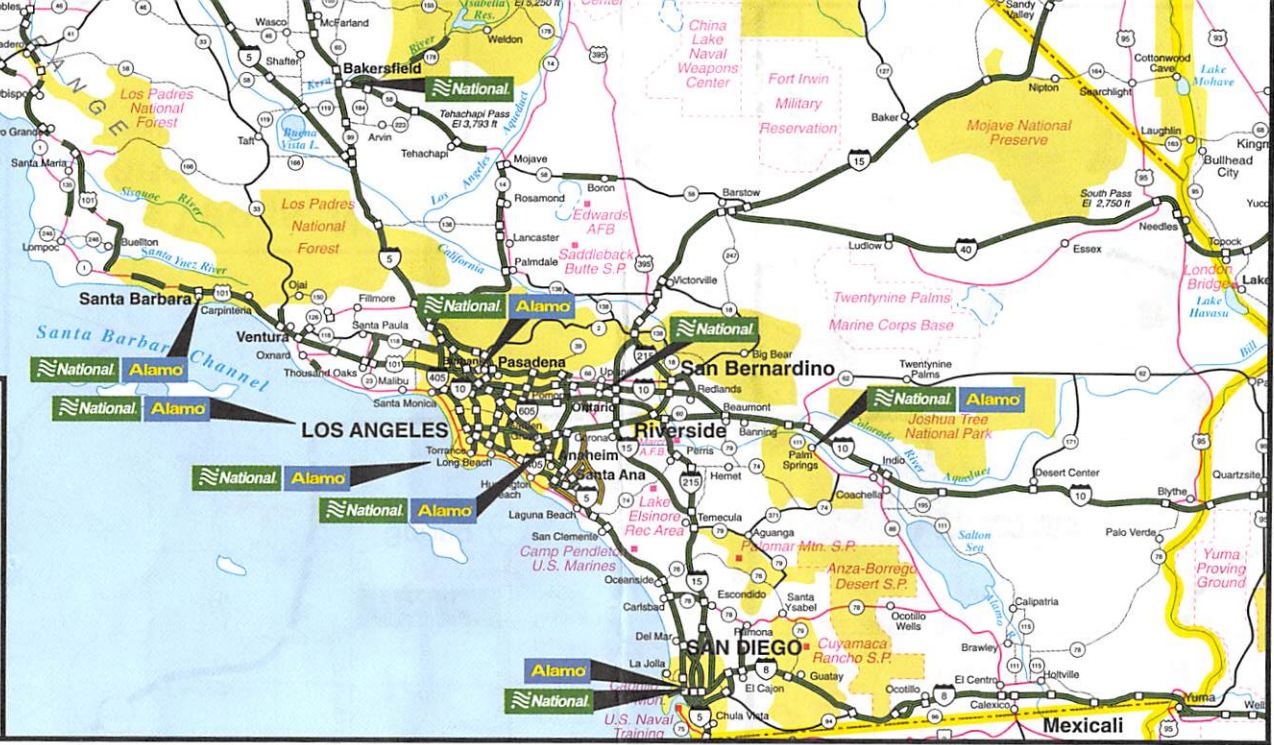

from I-15

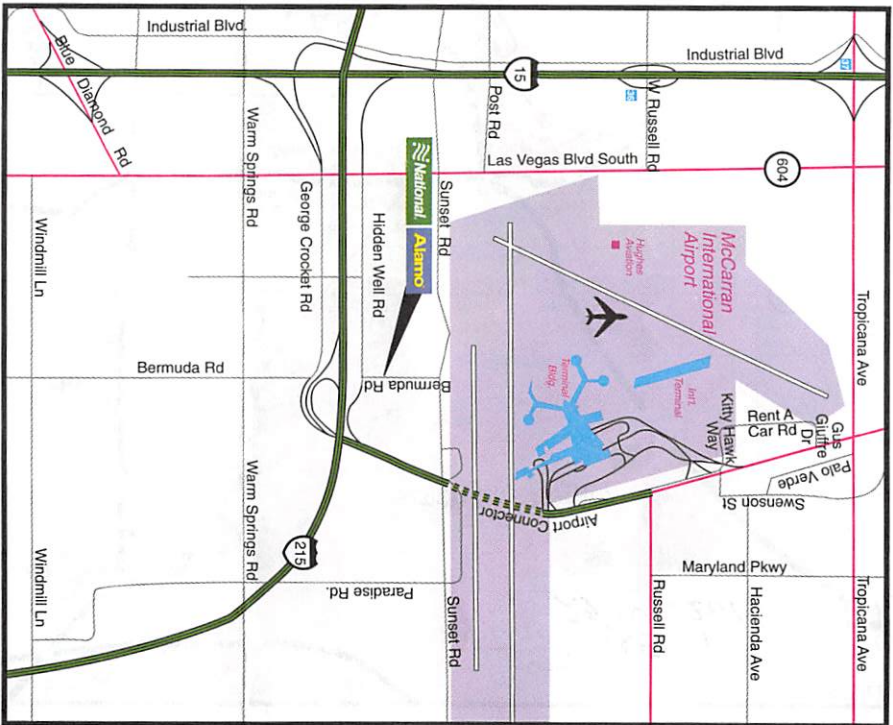
- exit onto Blue Diamond Road to Las Vegas Boulevard

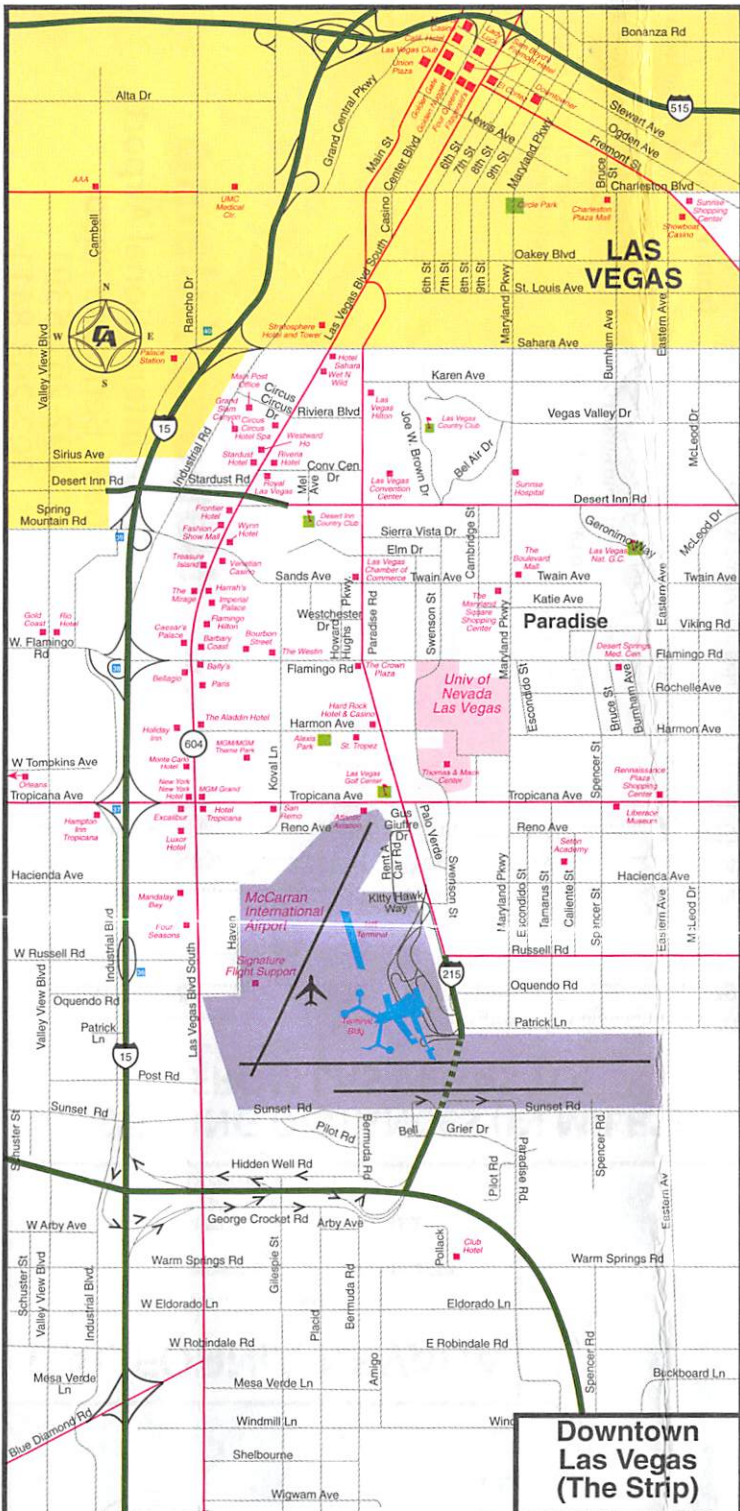
- take Las Vegas Boulevard south to Sunset Road, turn left

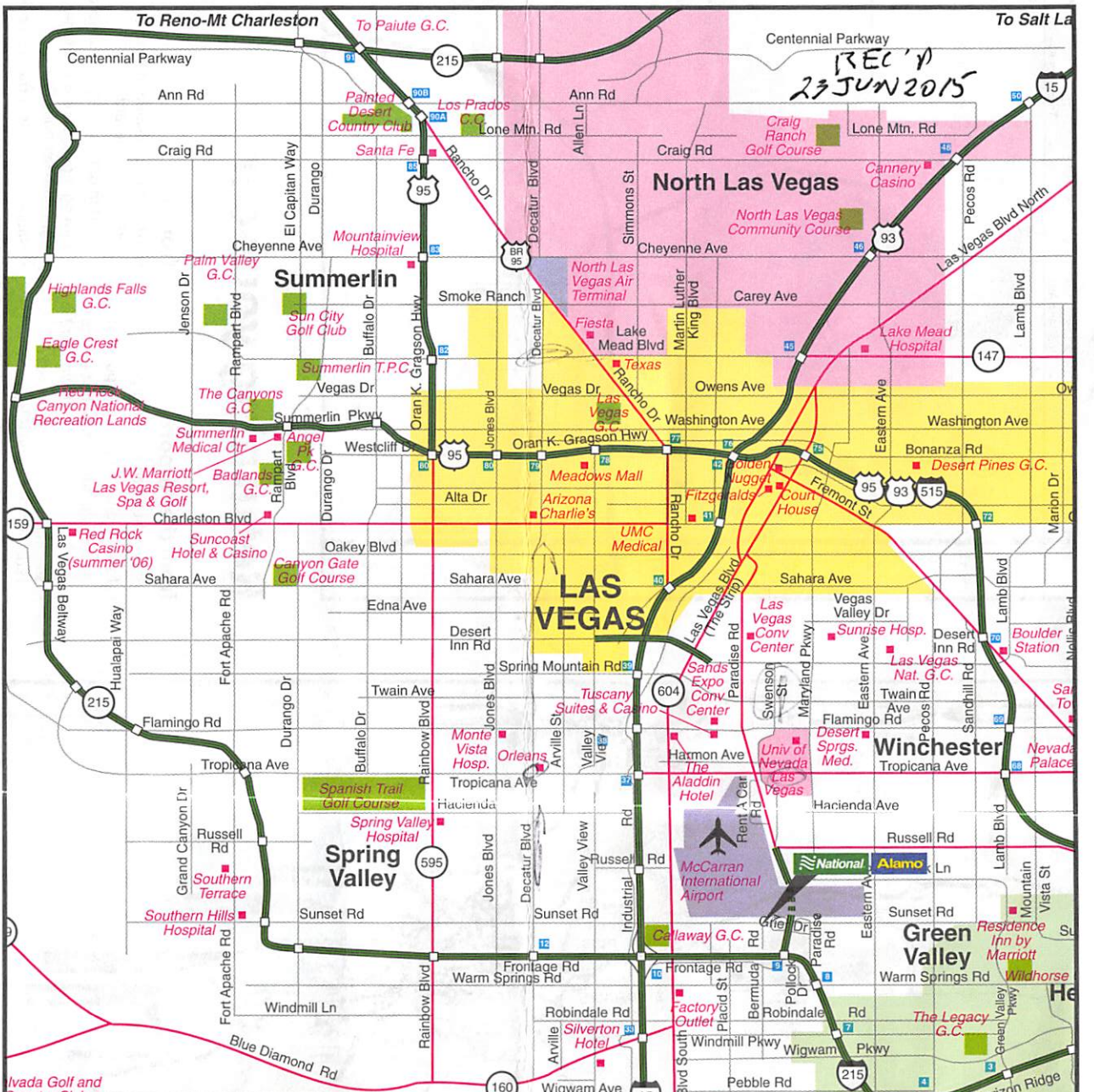

250 PRIVATE WILEY "WILLIE" DAUGHTRIDGE

The Daughtride family settled in Edgecombe-Nash county area, along the border between the two counties some time between mid 1760 and 1780. They were farmers with around four hundred acres.

Wiley Daughtride was born in Nash County on October 04, 1826. Wiley was the first of ten children of John Daughtride and Zilla Cobb. He married Sophie Braswell on November 03, 1847 and they had seven children, five boys and two girls. He was a farmer and his farm is located off West Mount Drive in Rocky Mount, North Carolina near the Langley's Cross Road area. A section of his farm is still being farmed today by the Daughtride family. Wiley enlisted in the Confederate Army in Wake County on March 01, 1863. He was assigned to the 32nd North Carolina Infantry Company H as a private under Daniel's Brigade. He was one of six Daughtride men to serve in the Confederate Army. He fought in many battles including Gettysburg Pennsylvania. At Gettysburg, his company fought on Seminary Ridge until the battle was over. He was captured at the battle of Spotsylvania Court House Virginia on May 10, 1864 at the Mule Shoe between 5:00 pm and 11:00 pm. On May 11, 1864, he was sent to the Confederate prisoner holding area at Belle Plain Virginia. Wiley arrived at Point Lookout Prison Camp Maryland on May 18, 1864 and stayed for seventy eight days. Then he was sent to Elmira Prison Camp in New York on August 06, 1864. The winter of 1864 was the worst in Elmira New York for many years. One night in January and one night in February the temperature fell to 18 degrees below zero. The prison camp was covered with snow from October 10, 1865 until March 15, 1865. On March 15, 1865, an all day heavy cold rain started melting snow and ice and it began flooding the entire camp with several feet of water. Wiley Daughtride died in the Elmira Prison Camp on April 17, 1865 of pneumonia. He is buried in the Woodlawn National Cemetery Confederate section, grave stone number 1358. Wiley was a prisoner of the Union army three hundred forty three days.

Grandpa turned painful history into good deed

In his letter published Feb. 4, R.W. Price of Eden, while being critical of one more Civil War TV series featuring the "infamous" prison camp" Andersonville, asked about three prison camps in the North. Well, I've heard of Elmira. I was born there April 9, 1924, on the 59th anniversary of Gen. Lee's surrender to Gen. Grant at Appomatox Courthouse. And while I am not particularly proud of the fact that my hometown was site of an "infamous" prison camp during the Civil War, I am proud of something my grandfather did in more recent years as a result of this prison camp.

For many years until his death in 1960, my grandfather was historian in Chemung County, N.Y., in which Elmira is located. During this time he received numerous requests from families in the South seeking information about ancestors they believed had died while imprisoned at Elmira.

After researching available records, my grandfather would visit that section of the vast Woodlawn Cemetery where Confederate soldiers were buried and take a picture of the headstone of the soldier in question. He would then send the picture and a letter in response to each inquiry, documenting as much information about the soldier as possible. And this is something of which I am very proud.

I might mention that Mark Twain is also buried in that cemetery. His wife, Olivia Langdon, was an Elmira native,

and that couple spent many summers near Elmira during the 1870s and 1880s where Mark Twain reportedly wrote *The Adventures of Tom Sawyer*.
