

Philip E., passed away on December 9, 1998, after a brief illness. Dr. Smith was born in Johnston County, Illinois, on December 25, 1916. He received his Bachelor's degree at Southern Illinois Normal College, his Master's degree from the University of Illinois, and his Doctor of Science degree from the Johns Hopkins University School of Public Health.

He met his beloved wife of 56 years, Vivian, in graduate school, and they shared a mutual love of zoology. Dr. Smith served in the U.S. Army during WWII and later served for 21 years in the Army Reserves, where he retired as a Lt. Colonel.

Dr. Smith devoted almost his entire professional career to the University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center. He taught parasitology in the College of Medicine and later became its Associate Dean.

In 1970, he was appointed Dean of the newly created College of Allied
Health, where he served
for 12 years. When Allied
Health and Public Health

Dean of the combined college. In 1983, he retired as
Dean Emeritus and Regents Professor.

A generation of physicians in Oklahoma was encouraged and guided by Dr. Smith. His unwavering integrity, devotion to students, and professionalism were an inspiration to students and colleagues.

Following his retirement, Dr. Smith enjoyed gardening, dog obedience training, genealogy, and computer skills. He and his wife, Vivian, both served terms as president of the Oklahoma Alliance on Aging. Their partnership in advocating for a higher quality of life for the elderly yielded rich

Dr. and Mrs. Smith were active members of the Friendship Force. They developed enduring friendships with families in Australia, New Zealand, Russia, Holland, Great Britain, Thailand, Kenya, Turkey and Costa Rica where they stayed with host families. In return, they welcomed visitors from other countries into their own home.

After the Smith children were grown, Dr. Smith's

special companions were his golden retrievers. He was an active member of the Golden Retriever Club. me Golden Ketriever Culd.
Dr. Smith is survived by his wife, Vivian, of the home; and his four daughters and their families, Diane, Reed, Charlotte and Emily Hainsworth of Syracuse, NY; Nancy, Steve and Andy Friot of Oklahoma City: Friot of Oklahoma City; Ellen, Ron and Adam Hempling of York, PA; and Sally, David, Lauren and Natalie Ruhl of Oklahoma City. He was a devoted and loving husband, father, and grandfather and will be greatly missed. Services will be held on December 11, 1998, at 4:00 p.m., at First Unitarian Church. 

Dear Dr. Upchurch:

In a recent search on internet I found reference to the Upchurch Bulletin which is published quarterly. Your name and address were given as contact to subscribe to this bulletin. Enclosed you will find a check for \$15.00, the cost for the Bulletin for 1996.

When was the Bulletin first published, i.e., Volume 1, No. 1? Are all back issues still available? Also, what is the cost for back issues, either bound or unbound?

My interest in the Upchurch family stems from the fact that my great grandmother was named Elizabeth UPCHURCH. She married my great grandfather, William NEWBOLD, in Johnson County, Illinois 17 SEP 1842. A sister, Mary, married William's brother, John Robinson NEWBOLD 13 AUG 1842. I have no additional documented information about the Upchurch family. I wish to learn who Elizabeth's parents were, if there were other siblings besides Mary, when they came to Illinois and where they lived prior to coming to Illinois, etc. In other words, it is my hope to extend my knowledge of the family as much as possible.

William and Elizabeth NEWBOLD appear in the Union County, Illinois Federal census for 1860, and they were shown to have eight children. I have been unable to find them in the 1870 census. In the 1880 census (Union County, Illinois) their oldest son, Elisha is shown with his wife, Emma (WOOD), their son, Oliver, and my grandfather, Ottoway, Elisha's brother, living with them. No indication of William and Elizabeth could be found in this census.

The last information I have about William NEWBOLD is that in 1862 he was listed among all males in Union County between the ages of 18-45 who potentially could serve in the Civil War. With eight children it is unlikely that he would have been called for service.

At any rate, my interest in following this line in the Upchurch family is the reason for wishing to subscribe to the Upchurch Bulletin. There are limited library materials on Illinois in the Oklahoma Genealogical Society Library, Oklahoma City, and at age 79, it is not feasible, as much as I'd like it, for me to be returning to Illinois to search through the court houses, cemeteries and libraries.

I look forward to hearing from you about the availability of the back issues of the Upchurch Bulletin.

Dear Phil:

What a delight to receive your letter today, and to have the chance to talk with you by telephone. It will be my pleasure to work with you in whatever way I can to extend the information on the Upchurch family. That sounds conceited because my experience in genealogy is only of two or three years duration, and you have been working for many years.

You asked that I tell you something about me and my family. We could begin by saying I shall be 79 on Christmas Day, 1995, but more logically it would be better to say I was born December 25, 1916 in Johnson County, Illinois near New Burnside. My family (mother, father, two brothers and a sister) moved to Herrin, Illinois when I was three, and Herrin remained my home until I went to graduate school at the University of Illinois in 1940. (Commuted to Southern Illinois State Teachers College 1936-40 and graduated with a B.Ed. degree.) I married a fellow graduate student in zoology in 1942 (after receiving a M.S. degree), just about 2 months before being drafted for service in the army.

After four years in service I had the opportunity to work for a doctorate at the Johns Hopkins University School of Hygiene and Public Health, and received my Sc.D. degree in Hygiene in 1949. (major field - parasitology). I taught in the Department of Zoology from 1949 - 1952 at what was then Oklahoma A. & M. College (now Oklahoma State University) in Stillwater, OK, and then was given the opportunity to teach in my major field at the School of Medicine, University of Oklahoma, in the Department of Preventive Medicine and Public Health. I remained on the faculty from 1952 until I retired in 1983, having served through all the academic ranks, serving as Associate Dean of Student in the School of Medicine and as Associate Dean of the Graduate College, and finally as Dean of the College of Health (which combined the School of Allied Health and the School of Public Health). All the health programs of the University of Oklahoma are in Oklahoma City, but the main campus of the University is at Norman, OK. I retired

at age 66 as Regents' Professor Emeritus and Dean Emeritus. It has been fun ever since!

My wife and I have four daughters, all married and with their own families, and at this stage in our lives the old folks have kicked up their heels and have done much traveling, particularly with the Friendship Force of Oklahoma. Members of the Friendship Force have chapters all over the world so that individuals not only visit foreign countries and live as a member of the host's family for a week, but we also serve as host for similar groups from all over the world. During the past eight years we have visited such countries as England, The Netherlands, Russia, Australia, Thailand, New Zealand, Denmark, Norway and Kenya, Africa. We are contemplating a trip to Turkey in May, 1996. We have hosted three groups from Australia, a couple from Japan, a gentleman from England (County Durham), a lady from Ireland, and two groups from Germany. We have been most fortunate in having wonderful experiences with our hosts and our guests. We feel we've made friends all over the world.

When not traveling, my wife (who has her Ph.D. in zoology from the University of Illinois) and I do volunteer work with the elderly (Oklahoma Alliance on Aging, a statewide education and advocacy group) and we each are responsible for producing a separate monthly newsletter for organizations with whom we work. Needless to say, we both are plugging away with our Macintosh computers. I was terrified by the thought of computers, but decided that other people learned to handle their fear, and it was worth a try. What a bonanza!

So much for that junk. I've already told you more than you wanted to know.

I am sending you as much material as I have on the Upchurch family, and that is meager.

The first batch of material is correspondence with Don Upchurch from Paragould, AR. The letters are in sequence and contain:

(A) My letter to Don making reference to the Drake Cemetery. Instead of a letter from Don he made a telephone call to me and I responded with letter (B). I waited over a month without hearing from Don, and this prompted letter (C). In about a week Don called again and asked if I would take down what he said over the telephone and he would fill me in about the Upchurch family. Letter (D) is my response to Don, asking him to check if the information he provided was correctly recorded. I sent the four sheets (E) in duplicate so he could keep one and return the other to me, but there was not reply. (His impairment was not known to me, and it was obvious why he called me rather than wrote when I visited him at his home - I guess in about October 1993). Letter (F) was an attempt to clarify Don's reference to Franklin and Johnson Counties as perhaps being combined at one time. My next

contact with Don was when I visited him at his home. I later sent a photograph (taken at his home on my visit) of him and his mother, but have not heard from him since.

You will note that Don stated that Elizabeth was the daughter of David UPCHURCH and Mary HUDSPETH. I do not know the basis of this conclusion because as I mentioned earlier, I have no documenting records of any of the Upchurch family except of the marriage of Elizabeth to William NEWBOLD and the marriage of Mary to John NEWBOLD.

You may not want the attached, but if William NEWBOLD and Elizabeth UPCHURCH NEWBOLD are considered the reference point for succeeding generations, the family group records may be of interest to you. I say this because one of the sheets you sent me was of my first cousin, Verna NEWBOLD HOLMES, the daughter of James, brother of my mother, Lesba NEWBOLD SMITH. The enclosed sheets document the children of my mother's other brothers and sisters, who are my first cousins, the same as Verna.

The Johnson County Early Marriages 1878-1885 (Volume II) indicates in the marriage of Ottoway NEWBOLD to Amanda WISE, that Ottoway's parents were William NEWBOLD(s) and Elizabeth UPCHURCH. The 1860 Census of Union County lists among William and Elizabeth's children the name of Anthony, who is the correct age of Ottoway, and is part of the basis of stating that the name of Anthony instead of Ottoway was a census taker's error. The enclosed 1900 census lists the family of Ottoway NEWBOLD with his wife, Amanda, and seven of their 10 children. Number 3 child, Lesba, is my mother. The three children born after the census were Charles, Earl and Belva.

By the way, if any of these enclosures are of no interest to you, don't feel obligated to keep them. They are copies of documents I have on my computer or in my files.

This surely is enough for one mailing. I look forward to receiving the back issues of the UPCHURCH BULLETIN.

In that your name is Upchurch, and a number of graves in the cemetery bear the names of Upchurch, I thought you might be of assistance to me in tracking an ancestor with this name.

My name is Philip E. Smith. My maternal grandparents lived in Johnson County, and were Ottoway T. "Doc" Newbold and Amanda Katherine Wise 0+0 Newbold. Ottoway's father was William Newbold; his wife was Elizabeth DIATO Upchurch. William was born in 1828, the third son (fourth child) of William M. 0+ A Newbold and Alice (Alcy) Wise Newbold. William (Jr)?'s parents are buried in the △+△ Newbold Cemetery in Johnson County. William (Jr)? died after 1860. I have no information about Elizabeth Upchurch, other than William and Elizabeth were D+Q+Q married 17 September 1842 in Johnson County. There may have been a number of their children, but the only names I have are Elijah Newbold, Ottoway Newbold 0+0+0 and James Huey Newbold. The family may have lived in Williamson, Johnson or Union County. - IFLISHA

Mrs. Dee Reed Fozzard from Carterville, IL stated that William Newbold raised his family (about 1860) on a farm he rented in the bottoms near Willard's Landing in Union County, Illinois, but has no record of family members or any other activity of the family.

Attached are pages from a little booklet published in 1992 that states, "Printed by authority of the State of Illinois, April 1992."

There are 23 maps showing county boundaries from 1790 (cover) to 1905 (No. 23), the present configuration.

I've made you copies of a scattering of maps to show the development of Johnson, Franklin and Williamson Counties. You will note that Johnson County was never a part of Franklin County, although Williamson County was part of Franklin County for a number of years.

Is it possible that David Upchurch and Mary Hudspeth Upchurch, having been reported as dying in Franklin County (Johnson County), actually died in what is now Williamson County and were buried in Drake Cemetery which is also in Williamson County?

This may be the case of their sons, David and William, (brothers of my great grandmother, Elizabeth). David, who married Kathryn (Kitty) in 1832, and William, who married Edney in 1829 - both married in Franklin County. Although 20 years later David died in New Burnside, Johnson County, the distance from Drake Cemetery in Williamson County is a very few miles from New Burnside, Johnson County as you well know.

Does the above make sense, or do you have something that specifically states that Johnson County was once part of Franklin County?

I was not aware of this booklet of maps until Dee Reed Fozzard of Carterville sent it to me with other materials she had prepared while searching for my Smith ancestors (Williamson County) and the Newbold line (Johnson County). I came across it again yesterday and wanted to see when Franklin, Williamson and Johnson Counties were given their present boundaries.

I want to thank you again for all the material you made available to me, and the above information is not meant to be critical of you or your work. As more and more people search in a given area, the details become clearer and we all benefit. Maybe as similar maps become available it will be possible to establish Stewart County being in Kentucky or Tenessee at the time of William's birth in 1809, and David's in 1811. At present there is a Stewart County in Tennessee, but not one in Kentucky.



Dear Ms. Bass:

Thank you for your recent communication in which you provided me your name and address. My request was made because I was using America On Line on a trial basis, while trying to establish whether or not the University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center system was going to be available to me as a retired professor. Obviously they finally decided after 32 years of service, I could be granted an ID number and get on line. (see new e-mail address above, which is yet to become functional). I knew the Scdsmith had a limited use, and our contact would be lost.

The Upchurch Bulletin is news to me, and it sounds great. Will you provide information and the address?

I tried to get the three books on the Upchurch family from the library. Finally, a copy of the title page and the index of each was forwarded to me on inter-library loan. Since you've examined two of them, I am enclosing the title page, Table of Contents, and the part of the index that enumerated specifically the Upchurch line of "Those Mississippi Upchurches." Getting only the title page and the index was a great disappointment to me, and it means that I shall keep trying to see each of the books in its entirety at some later date.

My knowledge of the Upchurch family is limited to the fact that my great grandfather and great grandmother (William NEWBOLD and Elizabeth UPCHURCH Newbold) were married 17 Sep 1842 (see Johnson County Illinois Marriages 1834-1877) enclosed. Also, #178 on same sheet, John NEWBOLD, William's brother, married Mary UPCHURCH, Elizabeth's sister. Since the first census listing all family members was 1850, and I am not sure where Elizabeth came from, my searches have not been productive yet. An 1840 census would have shown by name only the head of family.

In the 1860 census of Union County, IL William and Elizabeth are shown with about eight children. The 1870 census do not list any of them at all. The

1880 census shows Elisha NEWBOLD with his wife Emma (WOOD) and their son, Oliver. It also shows that Ottoway, his brother (and my grandfather) was living in Elisha's household.

I have been unable to find anything further about William and Elizabeth since the 1860 census, except a reference that in 1862 a roll was compiled of all men ages from about 18-45 in Union County, IL who were eligible for service in the Civil War. William NEWBOLD's name was included in this list.

Don Upchurch, 803 Vance, Paragould, AR 72450 telephone (501) 236-1025, says he has a complete line of his Upchurches, at least extending into southern Illinois, that includes my Elizabeth. I have been unable as yet to follow the trail he provided. I once visited him at his home on my way to Illinois, and he is the source of the titles of the books sent to you on e-mail. I am not sure how much documentation he has on his work for I was with him only about an hour. Don apparently was born without arms and he uses his mouth (with pencil) to write, turn pages, etc. He uses his feet to pick up things, and perhaps he types or writes with them also. Before I met him I wondered why he never answered my letters, but rather we would talk on the telephone at length. He is married, with children, and he seems to have adjusted well to his physical limitations. Since my visit was late in the evening (night), there was no way to make copies of his material, and in fact, I did not ask him to let me take his material away from his home to be copied. Had he suggested it, I'd have jumped at the chance. There are a number of graves of deceased Upchurches in the Drake Cemetery in southern Williamson County, IL.

Since Union County, IL is bordered on the west by the Mississippi river, and Missouri is directly across the river, there may have been some migrations from Illinois to Missouri.

Plese keep in touch, and as documents becomes available perhaps we can exchange materials that may help both of us.

By way of biography I'm enclosed a pedigree sheet. As you will see I shall be 79 next month, and I've gotten into genealogy perhaps two years ago at the request of my four daughters who are asking who their ancestors were!

Dear Mr. Upchurch:

You are being sent a letter because your name is Upchurch, and because you live in southern Illinois. If you are interested in your early ancestors we may be able to be of help to each other.

I am attempting to trace my ancestors on the Upchurch side. My great grandmother, Elizabeth Upchurch, married my great grandfather, William Newbold on 17 September 1842 in Johnson County, Illinois. I do know that she had a sister, Mary Upchurch, who married William's brother, John, on 13 August 1842. Other than that I do not know who her parents were, or whether she had other sisters and brothers.

From what has been determined, the Upchurch family member who came to Virginia from England in about 1638 was named Michael. It is commonly believed that all present Upchurches in the United States were descended from Michael. Some of his descendents migrated to North Carolina, and then some fanned out to Georgia, Mississippi, Tennessee, Illinois, Missouri, Texas, etc. In southern Illinois lived in Saline, Johnson, Franklin, Williamson and perhaps other counties.

The outstanding researcher in Upchurch genealogy at present is Robert Phillip Upchurch, P.O. Box 387, Wentzville, MO. 63385 He is editor of the UPCHURCH BULLETIN started in 1980 and published four times each year. Many lines of the family have good documentation, but the branch that lived in southern Illinois has many gaps, some of which I hope to fill in. I am most interested in this line because my Upchurch ancestors lived in southern Illinois in the early 1800s.

Do you have any knowledge about the Upchurch family which you would be willing to share? You may know things personally, or you may know someone within you own family line who may have information which will help to establish the family connection. I would be glad to share any information I obtain that may have a bearing on your own ancestors, if you are interested. Enclosed is a self addressed, stamped envelope which you may use if you reply, even if you do not have any information on the earlier Upchurch families.

Thank you for any consideration you may give to this request.

Dear Phil (Cousin Phil, that is):

I could give you a litany of events that have delayed my writing to you since receiving your last letter, but it would sound as if I were complaining. Suffice it to say there has intervened a lingering illness and finally death of the last remaining member of the prior generation to my family in Illinois. This was the man who was most helpful in taking me to various cemeteries in southern Illinois where many of my relatives are buried; a back problem involving an orthopedic physician and physical therapists; a case of shingles; and more recently, a blood clot behind the retina of my left eye with a diagnosis of macular degeneration. Otherwise I seem to be carrying my 79 years fairly well, and except for the inconvenience, things must go forward. I'm enclosing a short article by Frank C. Laubach written about reaching eighty.

It is true that the problem of tracing the earliest Upchurches is not exactly my central interest, at least until it is possible for me to resolve my immediate narrowly focused problem of Elizabeth Upchurch Newbold and her family, and the line to her subclan ancestor. Nevertheless, I understand your desire for a more global view, particularly since you are the repository of most of the information currently in existence, probably in the world, of the burgeoning Upchurch family. For that reason it will be my pleasure to help in a small way with the current cost of the material recently received from Professor David Ransome, and enclosed you will find a check for \$200.00 toward that cost.

In response to the approximately 39 letters sent to Upchurches in southern Illinois, there have been about three responses. I shall forward copies of these to you at a later date. There is one, however that you should have now, and it is enclosed. This is the correspondence from June Pagano of Energy, Illinois, which is contiguous with Herrin, my former hometown. I asked her permission to make a copy of the booklet, "From England to Illinois" for both you and myself, and this is your personal copy. June Pagano stated her brother, James, was the one who compiled the material for the booklet. It is possible you have been in touch with him and perhaps most of the material is from you. There may be details of the extended family that are not in your possession. I believe the only information in June Pagano's material that may be of specific interest to me is the statement that David Philip Upchurch had a known brother, William, and both were the sons of David and Mary Hudspeth Upchurch. I believe you projected that William

TItere re folissen co, IL Eeneslogrand Society placed in IL file 1 Upchurch, in this generation, (i.e., sons of David and Mary) was a more likely parent of Elizabeth than was David and Mary Hudspeth Upchurch. I have written to a lady in Harrisburg, the county seat of Saline County, Illinois asking if she was willing to undertake a search for a copy of the will of William Upchurch who died in southwestern Saline county before 15 January 1861, as mentioned by Donald Eugene Upchurch and/or Mary Afton Irwin.

There is little question that the reservations you had about the material taken by me by phone from Don Upchurch are valid. I could not get it confirmed even though I sent Don the same material I sent you and asked if I had recorded the information correctly that he dictated to me over the telephone.

The age of Elizabeth as recorded by me (age 30) was based upon the 1860 census This 1860 census of Union County, IL, shows Elizabeth to have been born in KY. The census shows her age as 20 (even though her oldest son, Elisha, is shown as 16 in the same census. Elizabeth's age (20) couldn't be true, and if put at 30 she is within a couple of years of the age of William, shown as 32. According to the Newbold write-up in the History and Families of Johnson County, William's birth year is 1828. (Copy is enclosed for you as mentioned below.) If this is true, and he married Elizabeth in 1842, he would, indeed be 14-15 years old! I do not question the marriage date since it is a recorded document. I am only going on the information taken from the Johnson County history, re: his birth year, which I am unable to document from any other source. In the 1850 census (Johnson County, IL) William M. Newbold and wife Alsey (Alice), parents of my William who married Elizabeth Upchurch, are listed with the last three of their children at home. Their ages on the census appear to be essentially correct with relation to the birth dates given in the History and Families of Johnson County.

In your letter of 24 December 1995 to me you mentioned that Mary Afton Irwin stated that William had a son born in Illinois about 1830. If this was Harrison Upchurch who married Louisa Trammel in 1855, it would suggest that Elizabeth and Mary Upchurch were older sisters and certainly Elizabeth would have been born earlier than 1830. (This is based partly on the fact that Elizabeth and Mary were married in 1842; Harrison in 1855.) Ms.Irwin also stated that William was married the second time in 1841 in Gallatin County, Illinois. Believe me, there is much to be clarified..

You asked about the <u>History and Families of Johnson County</u>, which is for sale by the Johnson County Genealogical-Historical Society. It was published by Turner Publishing Company, P.O. Box 3101, Paducah, KY 42002-3101. It shows a copyright of 1990. I am enclosing a list of publications that the Society has for sale, and they do still have copies of the above named publication. There are 368 pages in the book, which is labeled Volume I. Presumably there will be a future Volume II. In the index there is a single reference to Upchurch, and this is under the Newbold family and refers to Elizabeth and her sister Mary Upchurch. Of course there may be other descendants of Upchurch women in the volume that I would not know. Enclosed is a copy of the first page and page 289 of this

publication. I am willing to loan you my copy for examination so you could judge whether or not you feel it is worth \$64.50. Say the word and I'll mail it to you.

You may have been contacted by a Larry Upchurch who lives in Yukon, Oklahoma, which is a suburb of Oklahoma City. He called me one day, identified himself, and said he had picked up my name from the America On Line internet. We arranged to meet at my house recently, and I loaned him some early volumes of your Upchurch Bulletin. He expressed an interest in subscribing to the Bulletin and he was given your name and address. Except that his name is Upchurch, he knows very little about his recent ancestors except that they came to Texas from Mississippi.

If this letter is ever to get into the mail, my rambling must stop for now. Best wishes.

When you are 80 everybody wants to help you upstairs and carry your baggage. If you forget a name, or fail to meet an appointment, or do not address an envelope, you can explain that you are 80. If you spill your soup on your shirt or forget to shave on one side of your face, or have on shoes that do not match or take another man's hat, or carry a letter around for a week without reading - you are 80.

So you can relax without misgivings, for you have a perfect alibi for everything. Nobody expects much from you. If you act silly it is your second childhood. Everybody looks for symptoms of softening of the brain.

It is a great deal better than being 65 or 70. Then they retire you and expect you to take a cottage in Florida and become a limping, discontented has-been.

But if you survive to 80, everybody is surprised that you are alive, surprised that you can walk, surprised that you can talk above a whisper, surprised that you show signs of lucid intervals.

Thought I'd bring you up to date on my search for Elizabeth Upchurch Newbold's antecedents.

I'd like to do some mental calisthenics - sort of think out loud - and put it down on paper rather than talk to myself.

Following the leads you provided me from Don Upchurch' correspondence, I 11 + 12 - have obtained a copy of page 6 from "Abstracts of Wills, Saline County 1847-- 1911" which was published by the Saline County Historical Society. It records that △ in Book 1, page 74 there was a will recorded for William Upchurch. In the abstract △ it records a son undoubtedly by his present marriage, Willis Allen Upchurch, and a △+△+△ son, Harrison Upchurch and daughter Polly Newbolls and daughter Elizabeth - Newbolls, who must be children of a previous marriage.. A copy of this page is a enclosed for your records.(A) By other documents we know Polly as Mary, who Δ + Δ married John Newbold. It is my impression that the nickname Polly was frequently used for the legal name, Mary. Is this true?

I ordered a copy of the will itself to see if more material could be found within the document. I tried to translate it, but there were words, etc., which I could not decipher. A copy of the will (B) and the attempted translation (C) is enclosed for your records. What was determined was that William Upchurch's will was written and attested to by two witnesses on January 15, 1861 (page 1), and on the 1st of March (presumably 1861) proof of the will was given in open court, and it referred to William Upchurch, deceased (page 2). The designation of the children are given the same as in the abstract from the Saline County Historical Society.

Two things are pointed out: (a) Other accounts (Don Upchurch in a letter to you dated 5 Jun 1982 and Mary Afton Irwin in a letter sent to you 11 Aug 1980) △+ △ say William Upchurch died before 15 Jan 1861. His will indicates that this date is the date the will was signed and witnesses. Also, the will was brought to court on 1 Mar (1861?) and the statement is made that William was deceased at that time. To me this means that William died after 15 Jan 61 and before 1 Mar 61, and probably in February 1861. (b) The will clearly states that William's son by his second wife is Willis Allen Upchurch, not William.

A copy of the U.S. Census Records for Saline County, IL for 1860 (while William Upchurch was alive) shows him to be age 72 from South Caroline (?), his $\triangle + \triangle$ wife Sarah, age 63, also from South Carolina (?), and a son, Willis, age 19. A copy of this 1860 census record is enclosed for your records. (**D**).

A copy of the U. S. Census Records for Saline County, IL for 1850 is enclosed for your records. (E). It shows William Upchurch to be 62 and I believe from North Carolina, his wife, Sarah, age 51, from the same state, and two young A + A + A men named Jamie (?) Shaw and Jessie Shaw (presumably Sarah's children from an △+۵ earlier marriage before she married William Upchurch), and a son, Willis Upchurch, age 9.

A copy of the Census for 1830 in Franklin County, which included Williamson County (until 1839), and is adjacent to Gallatin County which was later divided into Saline and Gallatin Counties, and touches Johnson County, shows a William Upchurch as age "40-50". On the 1830 census is also shown one $\square + \square + \square + \square + \square$ male 5 - 10, one female 5 - 10, and one female, 15 - 20. If William were 42 in 1830, his age would be consistent with the 1850 census showing him to be 62 and the 1860 census showing him as 72. Copies of the 1830 census and a work sheet are enclosed for your records. (F) & (G).

This 1830 census possibly says two things: (a) The female shown as "15-20" $\Delta + \Omega + \Delta$ is his wife and a second daughter has not yet been born, although there could have been an 1830 birth, and this would fit in with the original assumption that △+△ Elizabeth was born in 1830. If this is true, William, at 35-40 at the time of his marriage surely married a child bride who would have been 10-15 years old at her marriage. By age 15-20 she had already borne him two children who at this census △ were at least 5-10 years old, or (b) A second possibility is that William's first wife △ was dead by 1830, and this is William's family with one son and two daughters. I am inclined to believe that William's first wife was dead, and that the 1830 census reflects him and his three children who are named in his will 31 years later.

In the 1830 census the young male shown could be Harrison, who is ۵+۵ mentioned in William's will, and the two females could have been Mary (Polly) A and Elizabeth, also shown in William's will. Since both Mary and Elizabeth were - married in 1842, Whichever female was the youngest, would have been between - 17 to 22 when she married. The other daughter would have married at an age between 27 and 32.

If one wished to speculate, Mary could have married John Newbold who △+△+□ daughter. I'm hopeful John Newbold and Mary can be tracked down. I already A+A+A have been told by a descendent of John and Mary's that one of John and Mary カナA LA Newbold's daughters (Mary Elizabeth) married a Samuel Taylor. It is stated she A+A (Mary Elizabeth Newbold) was born in 1841, which is most unlikely since Mary △ Upchurch and John Newbold didn't marry until 1842.

If the younger sister was Elizabeth (born about 1820 - 1825) she would have ALD $\triangle + \triangle + \triangle$ been between 17 and 22 years old when she married William Newbold. Elizabeth

 $\triangle + \triangle$ Upchurch Newbold and William Newbold's oldest son, Elisha, is shown on the 1860 census as 16. This means he was born @1844. On the 1860 census it states $\triangle + \triangle$ Elizabeth's age to be 20, which is obviously incorrect. She may have been married $\triangle + \triangle$ at age 20, but that wasn't her age at the time of the census. If she were between 5 and 10 on the 1830 census, she would have been 35-40 years of age at the time of the 1860 census, and 19 - 24 years old when Elisha was born. And William DYA Newbold's age! Did he marry an older woman who fudged her age so it would not be an embarrassment to her younger husband?

There are many, many gaps yet to be filled, although I am quite convinced that Elizabeth's father was William, based on the will which names both Elizabeth ロナロナロ and Polly (Mary) as Newbolls.

William's second wife, Sarah, is on the 1850 census of Saline County Illinois D+D with a 9 year old child. Presumably William and Sarah were married at least by 1840. If the 1830 census shows him to be a widower, there would be ample time $\Box + \Box$ for him to have married Sarah and have a 9 year old child by 1950.

I recognize that a search must be made of the 1840 census, for Mary, 0+0 □+□ Elizabeth, and Harrison could be living with William, for the daughters did not marry until 1842. Unfortunately the copy of the 1840 census in the Oklahoma Genealogical Society's file is so pale and washed out that I am unable to read it, 口 and of course they could have lived in Franklin, Williamson, Saline, Gallatin, or Johnson Counties, or none of the above. Perhaps he went back to Tennessee to marry Sarah. The search goes on!

If William is Elizabeth's father, and it surely seems as if he is, then the next stage is to try to determine whether this William is the brother of David Phillip Upchurch, or whether he is the brother of David Phillips's father. If it could be established that "my" William and David Phillip are the sons of David and Mary Hudspeth Upchurch, the line up of subclans and clan would be a lot clearer.

As mentioned at the beginning, I'm talking to my self, and I shall continue to search for clarification and better connections with the limited resources that are available in Oklahoma.



Dear Mr. & Mrs. Upchurch:

Thank you very much for your recent answer to my earlier request for information about Upchurch families in southern Illinois.

My great grandmother, Elizabeth Upchurch, married William Newbold in 1842 in Johnson County. They lived in Union County with several of their children as shown on the 1860 census. They were not found on census records in 1870 or 1880.

It has been determined that Elizabeth's father was William Upchurch, born @1788 in North Carolina, and who died in southwestern Saline County in @ January 1861. The name of William Upchurch's first wife is unknown, nor is the date of her death. His will named his two daughters, Elizabeth Newboles (Newbold) and Mary (Polly) Newboles (Newbold), and a son, Harrison. The sisters married two Newbold brothers, William and John R.

William Upchurch subsequently married a widow, Sarah Shaw, who had several children. William and Sarah had one child of their own, Willis Allen Upchurch.

Unfortunately, I could find no connection to the names of the Upchurches you supplied, perhaps because so little is known about William, my great great grandfather and his parents and/or brothers or sisters.

It is interesting to hear about Galatia. When I graduated from Southern Illinois State Teachers College (now SIU) in Carbondale in June 1940, I accepted a position in Galatia High School to teach General Science and Biology. Arrangements were made to live in a private residence during my teaching career. Shortly after accepting the position, the University of Illinois offered me a teaching assistantship in Zoology to work on a Master's degree. I returned to Galatia and spoke either to the principal or the President of the School Board to see if they would be willing to release me from my commitment so I could continue my education. I told them of a classmate, a major in Zoology at SIU, who had not yet taken a teaching position. Since it was still early in the year to

be selecting faculty, a release was graciously given to me and the young man whose name was given to them was hired to replace me on the high school faculty. As you can imagine, I have always been grateful for the administration's decision to release me, and for the opportunity to go to graduate school (ultimately obtained my doctorate at Johns Hopkins University School of Hygiene and Public Health in Baltimore after serving in World War II).

Who knows, if the above had not happened I might still be living in Galatia instead of Oklahoma City!

Thank you again for sending me the extensive material about the Upchurches.

They had saved the SASE which was enclosed in my letter, and sent information which you may be interested in. There was no cover letter; what is enclosed is exactly what was sent to me. I could find no reference to my William UPCHURCH, father of my great grandmother Elizabeth Upchurch NEWBOLD. Although their family line was in Gallatin County, and my William was in Saline County (which are adjacent and at one time were combined, I believe) no connections were found.

Perhaps these notes will extend the information on the southern Illinois Upchurch line, and will benefit others interested in this area.

The highlight of this year is probably the fact that my wife and I attended the graduation exercises of our oldest grandchild (grandson) who completed his undergraduate work Magna Cum Laude at Hamilton College in Clinton, New York.
