This appears to me to have been Elisha Strickland's land earlier & land of Ambrose Upchurch and possibly Shaw Drives appears to have been Sampson Strickland's land. Elisha's executor - son Isaac sold some land to Phillip Pearce in 1802.

Sampson Strickland's daughter - in-law Nancy (widow of Abel) married ^{ancil} Drives in 1806 after her husband's death. I believe Shaw Drives was Nancy's stepson. Abel's land then passed to ^{his son} Strickland's ^{to Kinman}

I also believe William Pinnett (wife Anna Upchurch) was the son of Zachariah Pinnett & Lavinia Massey of Little River District Wake County but no actual proof exists that the Wm. who was their son is this William

- There seems to be little doubt that John Pearce who lived close to his sister Elizabeth (Pearce) Ray in Randolph Co., NC was the John who married the only daughter of Richard U, III who died intestate in FC, NC in 1816. His son-in-law John Pearce + his wife drew lot #1 of 28 Acres (Need to find where John sold this). A clincher is that John Pearce in Randolph Co., NC appointed WILLIAM RHEA in FC, NC to recover his right to a portion of the estate of Richard U, III.
- The records from IN show the wife of John Pearce b 1766 was "CLARISSA" hence CLARA.
- The children of Richard U, III were born from 1774 to 1795 with a daughter born in 1793. Richard U, III md 2nd 14 SEP 1796 (FC, NC). His young sons show up in his name on the 1800 census but no young daughter b 1793. Perhaps she was staying with relatives.??
- In the 1790-1810 era it is unlikely you would find a female with this name CLARA & FAMILIES
- On balance I am inclined to say that the 1808 marriage was for John Pearce b 1787 and Frances U possible D/o Benjamin U - NOT for John Pearce b 1766 and Clara U
