Unfortunately, we are still unable to learn much about the work of the women of the church. Throughout this period it was only men who participated actively in the church conferences, and it was only men who held church office. From the beginning women did serve as "missions collectors"—Sarah Murray, Marie Smith, Mary Laurence, Lena Upchurch, and Lizzie Taylor were named in the early years of the 20th century. In 1902 two women, Anna Yates and Lena Upchurch, were appointed to serve along with B. B. Wilson "to raise money and see to improving the church." And women apparently were the musicians for the church—Constance Strother was elected Sunday School pianist in January, 1925. So far as we have been able to discover, the first time a woman was elected to any church office was March 23, 1918, when "Mrs. E. L. Shearon [was] elected treasurer of the church building fund. She reported \$16.00 as a nucleus." This is the earliest record of a woman "reporting"—or speaking at all, for that matter—in church conference. This was two years before the ratification of the 18th amendment to the Constitution of the United States giving women the right to vote! And more history was made when, on October 28, 1928, Mrs. G. C. Strother (nee Clyde Perry) was the first woman whom Inwood elected a delegate to a meeting of the Association.

Both Mr. and Mrs. George Strother were frequent delegates to the Association and held elective offices in the Sunday School. For many years Mrs. Strother was pianist for the adult Sunday School. In 1932 she served on a committee considering the withdrawal of fellowship from a female member of the congregation. Mr. Strother was church treasurer, and at times from his own funds he supplemented the church offering so that the minister's salary could be paid. In 1934 he was named to the committee appointed to nominate a new deacon. He was particularly active on the building committee following the fire in 1934. In 1938 he replaced R. E. L. Greene as Superintendent of the Sunday School.

Manuh says there was a spring in this part of the Uplchurch Tract which was used to keep hutter cool. Manuh has seen the concrete remnants. He said Uncle Gether reported that it took two people to operate the churn. There was a path across the field to the BJH home as that is where Miley Perry got his mail. Beyond Percy's 25 Acres there lay 25 Acres on either side of the road. This was land that went to Clyde then came the 50 Acre home place which eventually went to Frances. Next came 17 Acres for Lena & Lena got the 60 Acre Pace Tract.

of the 75 (73.5A) Tract given to Alton - the front 25A was given to Aunt Bessie but Manuh wonders if she ever got rent. Manuh recalls that Lena would collect money from her siblings for clothes for Aunt Bessie. When Bessie was in a rest home the cost was not equally shared.

Proceeding east on the cut through Farmer Lane (SR7527) comes up from the south. On the North (just to the east) lies the Penny House right on the Road - This Penny related to Harold Nelson. PENNY =

Next to the Penny House on the west is a house Mark & Bryan bought for \$137,000 in 1987 for Percy in exchange for his 12 1/2 A share in Clyde 50 A. con. Percy's dau lives there now. eldest of Percy's house lies the Carl Perry Remerite (House now gone).

Of course there were others who served in leadership positions—long-time members and newcomers. Marie Taylor Dixon, Carol Medlin Hardee, Idalia Bennett, Mrs. G. C. Strother, and Elizabeth Lassiter served as organists and pianists. Dozens of others participated in the music program of the church. Seventeen persons other than those named served as deacons. Scores were on committees, and scores taught in the Sunday School, worked in the Training Union, participated in the activities of the W.M.U. And there were untold numbers who participated without holding office.

The beautiful flowers at the altar last Sunday in memory of **Harold Wilson** and **Clyde Strother** certainly did the trick on bringing those folks to mind. One of the things so unforgettable is how families used to visit each other years ago, and I wish there was more of that today. We would visit the Wilson's on Sunday afternoon, and my little brother, **Allan Roy Lineberry** and I would have such fun with **Harold, Jr. and Margaret**; and my sister **Carolyn**, and **Evelyn Wilson**, who were about the same age, could always find something to laugh about and mischief to get into. I was proud to get the chance to give **Mrs. Frances** a big hug on Sunday! And **Clyde and George Strother** were very instrumental in the formation of my young life. I used to say, "When I grow up, I'll have a husband who will put his arm around me in church and give me a little hug, like Mr. George does Mrs. Clyde all the time."

At Christmas time, **Mr. George Strother** and his brothers, **Len** and **Percy**, along with other elders of the church, would have little bags of goodies for each child ~ each person in the church: an orange, an apple, little candies and lollipops. Every time I smell oranges, it brings that happy time to me all over again. We would go and visit **Mr. Percy and Mrs. Mynette Strother**; they had wonderful grapevines, and they invited us to share. Mr. Percy would take us children out to see his mules. My dad was so fond of Mr. Percy that he had planned to name me after him, had I been a son rather than a daughter. And we loved to visit **Miss Constance Strother** and her brother, **Len**, who was Church Clerk for as long as I could remember. Miss Constance had some special magic magnetic Scottie dogs she would let us play with; when you put a piece of paper between the magnets, you could make one Scottie follow the other (upside down) all over the paper! She was my mother's Sunday School teacher for years, and many of the ladies of the church would come to our house for Sunday School class meetings. It was up to me to serve them refreshments.
