Made up of images of the pages of twelve Kentucky reference works published by the Genealogical Publishing Company, and accessed by a single electronic index, this CD combines many of the most important books ever published on Kentucky. Probably no other resource available can match the range of sources on this CD, which is available at only a fraction of the cost of the original books.

Among the many valuable reference works included on this CD you'll find the two most comprehensive collections of marriage records—Kentucky Marriages, 1797–1865, by G. Glenn Clift, and Kentucky Marriage Records, excerpted from The Register of the Kentucky Historical Society. Also included are two important miscellanies of Kentucky court records containing wills and abstracts of estates and administrations, as well as a volume devoted solely to wills and inventories. This is a detailed guide to genealogical sources and resources in West Virginia. It doesn't tell you how to go about genealogical research in West Virginia, but rather what records to look for, what records are available, and where they can be found.

Proceeding from the large to the small, it identifies records on the state level, the regional level, and then the county level (county-by-county), providing details of vital records, Bible records, church records, cemetery records, newspapers, naturalizations, military records, county and regional records, census records (including special schedules, indexes, and census substitutes), land records, maps, and city directories. Also included is a detailed bibliography of West Virginia genealogical sources—again statewide, regional, and countywide.

The main focus of the book, however, is on the holdings of the various institutions whose resources and facilities support the special needs of the genealogist. County-by-county, it lists the names, addresses, and hours of business of libraries, archives, societies, courthouses, and other record repositories; describes their manuscript and record collections; highlights their special holdings; and provides details regarding queries, searches, and restrictions on the use of their records.



Carol McGinnis

This is the most comprehensive listing of Virginia sources and resources ever compiled. After four years of painstaking research in libraries and archives, four years of field work, correspondence, and written surveys, Carol McGinnis has produced an encyclopedic inventory of the records and printed materials available to persons researching their Virginia ancestors. Her achievement is breathtaking! We



all know the problems encountered in Virginia research, in particular the difficulties of searching through the scattered records of shires, counties, and independent cities, to say nothing of the problem of coming to grips with the immense body of published materials on Virginia genealogy. But this new work cuts those problems down to size: it organizes, categorizes, and describes the resources available for the state as a whole, for all ninety-five counties, and for all forty-one independent cities.

Dealing with the whole complex realm of Virginia genealogy, McGinnis focuses on the types of records available, where they may be found, and what they contain, devoting entire chapters to such subjects as Virginia land, people, and history; immigration and migration; vital records; bible and church records; census records; land and court records; manuscripts and records abroad; ethnic Virginia; slavery and African-Americans; counties and their records; independent cities and their records; genealogical collections; and genealogical societies. In addition, exceeding even the most testing requirements, the work contains charts depicting 1) vital records registration programs, 1896-1912; 2) colonial era parish records; 3) federal census records for Virginia counties; 4) federal census records for Virginia cities; 5) Virginia counties at a glance; and 6) Virginia cities at a glance.
