

1. Thomas Gay U., Sr. was born in NC in 1797 and md. Patricia Barnes of NC. In 1840 a colony of Upchurches lived in Henry Co., GA. The oldest member was Charles U., a son of Richard U. of Franklin Co., NC. Charles was father or Uncle of Thomas Gay T., Sr. According to Henry Co., GA 1840 Census Thomas Gay U. Sr. was living there age 53, farmer with wife Patricia, age 44. In 1840 their children were:

"I am the great great Grandson of Gay U. who was from NC and who came to Henry Co., GA about 1825. Charles U., American Revolutionary Soldier from NC, received a bounty warrenty of land in Henry Co., GA. He was the older member of the Upchurch Clan which settled in GA after the American Revolution. My Greatgrandfather, Willis J. U. was a Confederate Soldier".

"We have not been able to determine Gay U's father. Thus we have not been able to establish a direct relationship with the NC Upchurches."

(Sr.) and his 3 or 4 sons moved to Clay Co., Ala before my day of course. My father's name was Willis Gay Upchurch and one brother named Joe Upchurch, the other one we called him Uncle Pany, I imagine this was a nickname."

(NOTE: It is strange that Love says his father was Willis Gay U. when there is presumed to be another son of Thomas Gay U., Jr. - RPU).

"Only by a process of elimination do I think that we shall find the parents of Eaton, Keaton and Gay (Thomas Gay U., Sr.). Everything points to them being brothers."

"The question of a Gay #1 and #2 was a misreading of the census on microfilm at the Archives. My brother had read it 1820 instead of 1830. Henry was not a county in 1820."

In a 16 APR 1963 Ltr. Martha Lucy U. indicates "I think that Thomas Gay U. Sr. was the son of Charles b. in VA in 1755, but so far I have not been able to prove it. Thomas Gay U. Sr. first went to Greene Co., GA and from there he drew a land lot in Henry Co., GA. Later the section of Henry Co. in which he lived became Fayette Co., GA. Between 1840 and 1850 he moved to Carroll Co., GA. There he had a large farm and was a Justice of the Peace. Later he moved to Alabama where he died. He died 4 miles west of Ashland, AL. He is on the 1850 census of Carroll Co., GA with his family as follows:

NOTE: In the 1780-1800 era couples usually had a child every two years. Charles had children in 1789, 1792, 1796, 1798 & 1800 (roughly). This leaves no birth in 1784, 1787, 1791, and 1794 - it is likely that children were conceived to be born in these four years but died as infants - making a total of 10. There could have been births in 1800 & 1802 with early deaths, making 12. The wife would have been age 42 in 1802 = NO MORE

○ COMMENTARY ON THE CENSUS RECORDS FOR CHARLES II
HEAD OF UPHURST CLAN NO. 2 & HIS CHILDREN - RPU 27MAR2013

① We start with what we believe about Charles & his wife whose name we do not know. Charles is believed to have been born 11 FEB 1755 probably in NC shortly after his father arrived from VA. We calculate the most of Charles was born about 1760 and died 1825±5. Charles died in 1842 (Henry Co, GA) ALL THE CENSUS RECORDS ARE CONSISTENT WITH THESE DATES.

② Birth dates for four children are reported as follows and they seem to be factual - more or less

- EATON b 1780
- THOMAS GAY II, SR b 1797
- KEATON b 1790
- CHARITY b 1798

Additionally I have posited a daughter SUSAN and she fits into the census records as born about 1782.

③ Accounting for the children.

In 1790 we see census slots for Eaton, Keaton and Susan plus an unnamed daughter born about 1786.

Census slots for these four appear in 1800.

Slots for two additional children appear on the 1800 Census:

Child #6 0-10 is Gay b 1797 and age 3 in 1800

Child #7 0-10 b 1790-1800 presents a quandry - The

census shows this to be a male and if so

he never appears again - could have died young - or we may yet find him. MORE LIKELY

#7 is a FEMALE which would fit for Charity b 1797 and for whom no census slot is otherwise provided.

In 1820 there are two "children" in the house - both females ages 16-25 (born 1795-1804) - one of them is presumably Charity b 1797. The second female's age does not match with any previous census record of a daughter of Charles. She could be a daughter-in-law, a niece, or other relative.

EULOGY TO THOMAS GAY UPCHURCH, SR.

In Memory of Father Upchurch

Father Upchurch was born in Wake County, North Carolina, November 28, 1797. Joined the Baptist church and was baptised October 18, 1829. Was ordained deacon at Bethlehem church in Fayette County, Georgia, in 1831. He was happily married to Miss P. C. Barnes, January 7, 1824, with whom he lived most happily until his death. He had born to him six sons and five daughters. Three sons and two daughters preceded him to the better land. Few men have blessed the world with so exemplary a life as father Upchurch. As a husband he was a model of constancy, affection, and kindness. As a father he was wise, firm, and loving. As a neighbor, the elbow touch of a ready helping hand and co-operative sympathy were constantly felt. He was truly a peacemaker, and one of the few men who literally carried out the apostolic injunction, "If it be possible, as much as lieth in you, live peaceably with all men."

He never had a personal difficulty. He was never a party to a lawsuit. Though a member of the church for 56 years, he never was but once kept from his regular church meeting to attend to his own secular business. His life was full of sunshine and brightened the entire community in which he lived. In father Upchurch was exemplified the beautiful scripture "Mark the perfect man and behold the upright for the end of that man is peace." In answer to his son J. E.'s, "I'm going home, I'm going home in a few hours." It is recorded in the Lord's book that when Lazarus died he was carried by angels to Abraham's bosom. And we confidently believe that when father Upchurch died and his pure spirit was released from its clay prison that the angels carried it up shouting to heaven's

Charles II, Head of Upchurch Class No 2 had 3 sons (Thomas Gay II, Sr, Reuben II, Eathan II) and two daughters (Susan II, Charity S. II). It is likely that all 5 children were born in Franklin Co., NC or possibly just across the County line in Wake Co., NC. Some of the children married and possibly had issue in NC prior to the time in the early 1800's when Charles and all five of his children moved to GA. They may not have all moved at the same time or to the same place in GA. Charles also had others close relatives who moved from NC to GA in the early 1800's. Joe Cephas U & William Benny U probably moved to Fairburn, GA about 1870 (one document says 1867). It is unclear as to whether they came from Bowden, GA or Clay Co, AL. Joe Cephas U spent most of his life in Fairburn, GA. Ben knew him well but does not recall him talking about the Upchurch Family. Benjamin Franklin U was a Salesman. The family of Martha Foy U also lived around Fairburn, GA.

Ben went to Ashland, AL and talked to some Upchurch Family members. LOVE U near there but Ben did not talk to him.

Thomas Gay U, Sr moved to about 40 miles west of Atlanta, GA and was then in Bowden Co, GA was formed about 1850. He left Bowden Co, GA and moved to Ashland, Clay Co, AL after 1860 as did his son Willis J. U. It is unclear how many children of Willis J. Upchurch moved to Clay Co, AL with him. For example
