All faculty members and research program groups will be encouraged to develop strongly interactive programs with those representing diverse discipline areas in other departments within the College, the Department of Biological Sciences, and other areas of the University. No attempt will be made to list the large number of faculty members outside the department that are currently involved in some significant capacity or those who may be potentially involved. Such a list would be voluminous and may tend to limit potential participation when no restraints should be placed upon seeking cooperative input from all possible sources.

Continued strong cooperative research programs with the USDA/ARS will be encouraged, and even more effective utilization of their expertise will be sought to enhance the department's research and graduate training programs. Active cooperative research participation in the Center for Quantitative Analysis (CQA) Center for Remote Sensing (CRS), the Council for Environmental Studies (CES), as well as various Task Forces will be strongly encouraged.

International Agriculture: This functional area does not presently have the same standing as the traditional troika - Resident Instruction, Extension, and Research. Official recognition of this increasingly important area as reflected by terms of appointment is not yet forthcoming, even though this is the current practice in certain progressive institutions around the country. In actuality, International Agriculture is an integration of the other three areas. A strong objective will be to emphasize the important role this department has in developing national and worldwide leadership in arid land, plant related agriculture. Active participation of departmental faculty in consultative roles as well as appropriate cooperative research, teaching and extension programs in the international arena will be encouraged.

Other Concerns:

Space: The Committee strongly believes that full integration of the Department will be hindered and difficult to accomplish unless the two existing groups are adequately housed in the same facility. Much of the advantages cited for merger will be lost if this problem is not solved. The Committee believes it is imperative and strongly recommends that the College Administration make all possible effort to find a solution to the pressing space and distribution problem. It is concluded that a detailed study will need to be made to fully document the current and future needs. It is recommended that a special committee or a subcommittee of this committee be charged with the responsibility of considering the various alternatives. Such an undertaking will require a major input of time and some expense to complete the required job. In the interim, consideration should be given to the possibility of some regrouping to achieve better integration of certain program or discipline groups within the confines of existing space occupied by the two present departments.

Branch Experiment Station Personnel: The outreach of the department throughout the State in terms of its instructional, extension, and research responsibilities and functions has been discussed by the Committee. It is the general consensus that such programs be continued and strengthened. Special situations and problems relative to permanent

### BAILEY/ROGERS SHORT HISTORY

The William Booker BAILEY and Ruben Capers ROGERS families arrived in Safford, Graham County, AZ around the turn of the century. Both families had been in Sweetwater, Nolan County, TX prior to their arrival in Arizona.

Fannie Luella ROGERS met and married William Booker BAILEY in Sweetwater, Nolan County, in 1896. On 03 Jan 1897, Mary Leona ROGERS was born to Mary Jane and Ruben ROGERS. The first child of Fannie and William was born on 05 Dec 1908 and he was given the name of William Lafayette BAILEY.

It is believed, by birth dates, that these two families then moved to the Safford/Solomon(ville)/San Jose area of Graham County. The last child of Mary Jane and Ruben ROGERS was born on 29 Jul 1900 and was given the name of Franklin William ROGERS. Meantime, Frank's (as I believe he was later called) first cousin, Martin Joseph BAILEY had been born to Fannie and William the month before on 23 Jun 1900.

The 1900 Census shows that the BAILEY's and the ROGERS' lived next door to one another. The ROGERS' were in household 245 and the BAILEY's 246.

It is known that William Booker BAILEY died in 1907. I do not have a precise date of death, nor do I have a location of the burial. In the 1910 Census, Fannie Luella ROGERS BAILEY is shown as the Head of Household and as a washerwoman. It is also known that William Booker's brother, Samuel H. BAILEY was married to Fannie's sister, Florence Virginia ROGERS. Where this marriage took place, or was dissolved is unknown. It was dissolved because after the death of William, Fannie married Samuel (certificate of marriage is in my possession, and at the Graham County Court House). Sam and Fannie had a daughter, Alice Leora, born on 7 Sep 1908. Sadly, Sam flew the coup leaving Fannie to rear her children alone -- or with the support of her parents. In any case, Fannie was left to fend for herself and her children by the death of one husband, and the desertion of another.

According to my Aunt Cora (BAILEY), Great-Grandma Fannie took in a couple of Spanish/Mexican children named Bustamentos (spelling is not correct). The family was fluent in Spanish. Also, according to Aunt Cora, my Grandmother, Rena Luella BAILEY, was given to running off and staying lost for a spell, without telling anyone where she went or whom she was with. Apparently during one of these escapades, she met my Grandfather, James NAVARRETTE and they married. Where they married, is a mystery, and one I would like to uncover. Where they divorced is another mystery, but I suspect that they may have -- or Grandpa may have -- divorced in Tucson. My step-Grandmother, Luisa Valdez NAVARRETTE, says that James and Rena were never married. However, James and Rena had four children together: Cora June, George James, Benjamin Martin and Rose Mary.

The last, Rose Mary, died 9 days after her birth and is buried in Bowie, Arizona at the Desert Rest Cemetery. I do not know what the legal aspect of common law marriages was in Arizona in the 1920's, but I suspect that they were truly married. Grandpa was a Catholic, Grandma was not, so maybe they were married by a JP somewhere. I know that my father, George James, was born in Dos Cavasas (spelling is approximate). Perhaps they were married down there, or in one of the other nearby small mining towns. Then again, perhaps they were married by a circuit court judge and the record of that could be anywhere! Grandpa NAVARRETTE married Luisa Valdez in the Catholic Church after the desertion by Rena of the family. This is a long and involved story, but apparently Grandma was able to find love a second time, because she married a Julio MONTANO in Albuquerque and had 4 more children (3 boys and a girl). Interestingly enough, Julio looks remarkably like my own Grandfather!

So, there you have it. I believe that Aunt Cora said that William Booker died in San Jose, so he may be buried there - somewhere. Fannie Luella ROGERS BAILEY, Mary Jane YORK ROGERS and Ruben Capers ROGERS are all buried in Phoenix, Arizona. In summary, here are the items for which I am looking:

1. Death certificate or obituary of William Booker BAILEY
2. Marriage certificate of Rena Luella BAILEY and James NAVARRETTE

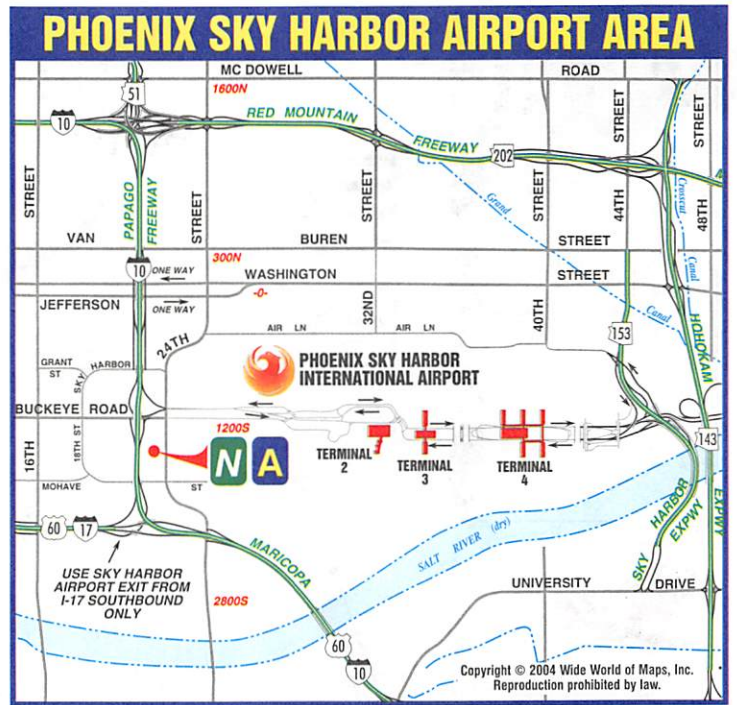
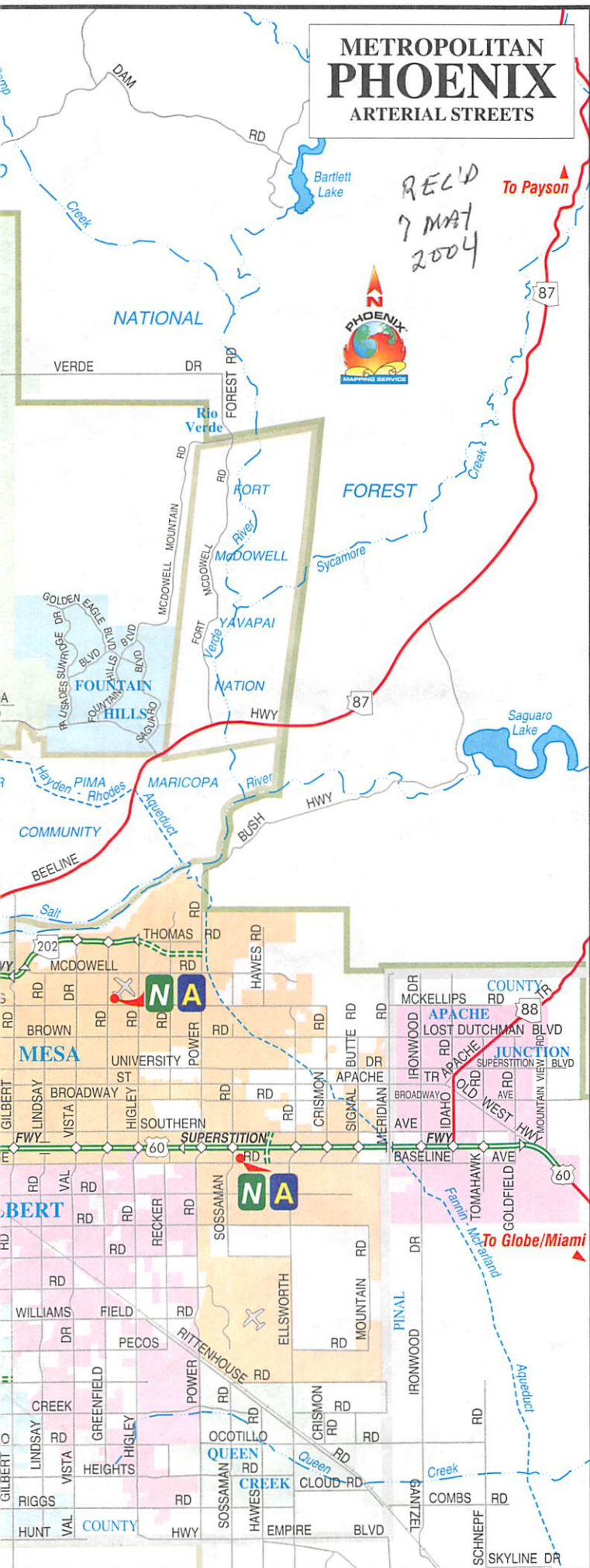

### From I-17 Southbound

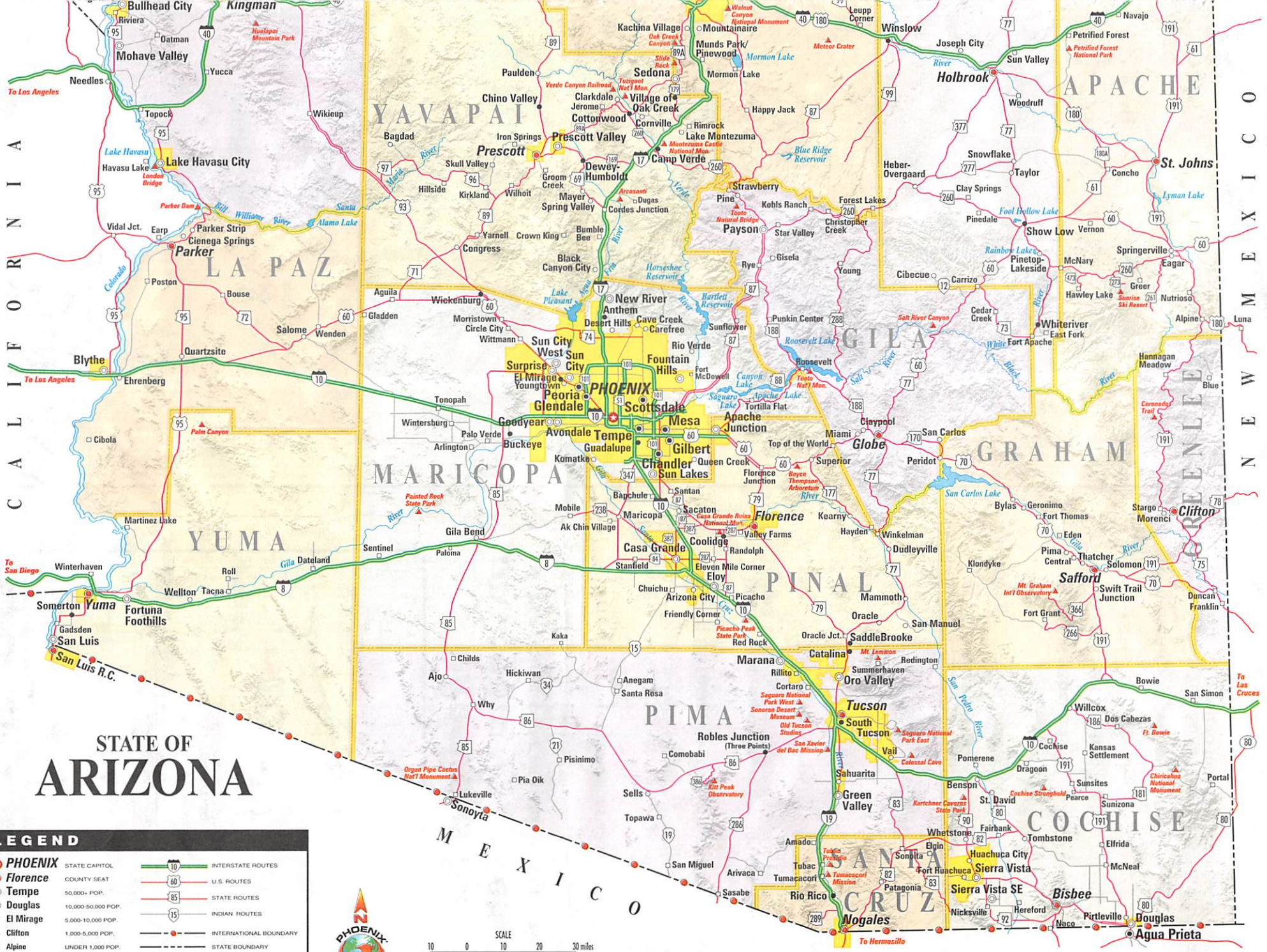
- Follow southbound I-17 exclusively and take exit #194, Sky Harbor Airport Exit.

### From the Airport Terminal Area

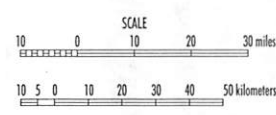
- Follow the West Exit and then "24<sup>th</sup> Street South", this will bring you to the intersection of Buckeye Road and 24<sup>th</sup> Street.
- Turn left (south) onto 24<sup>th</sup> Street.



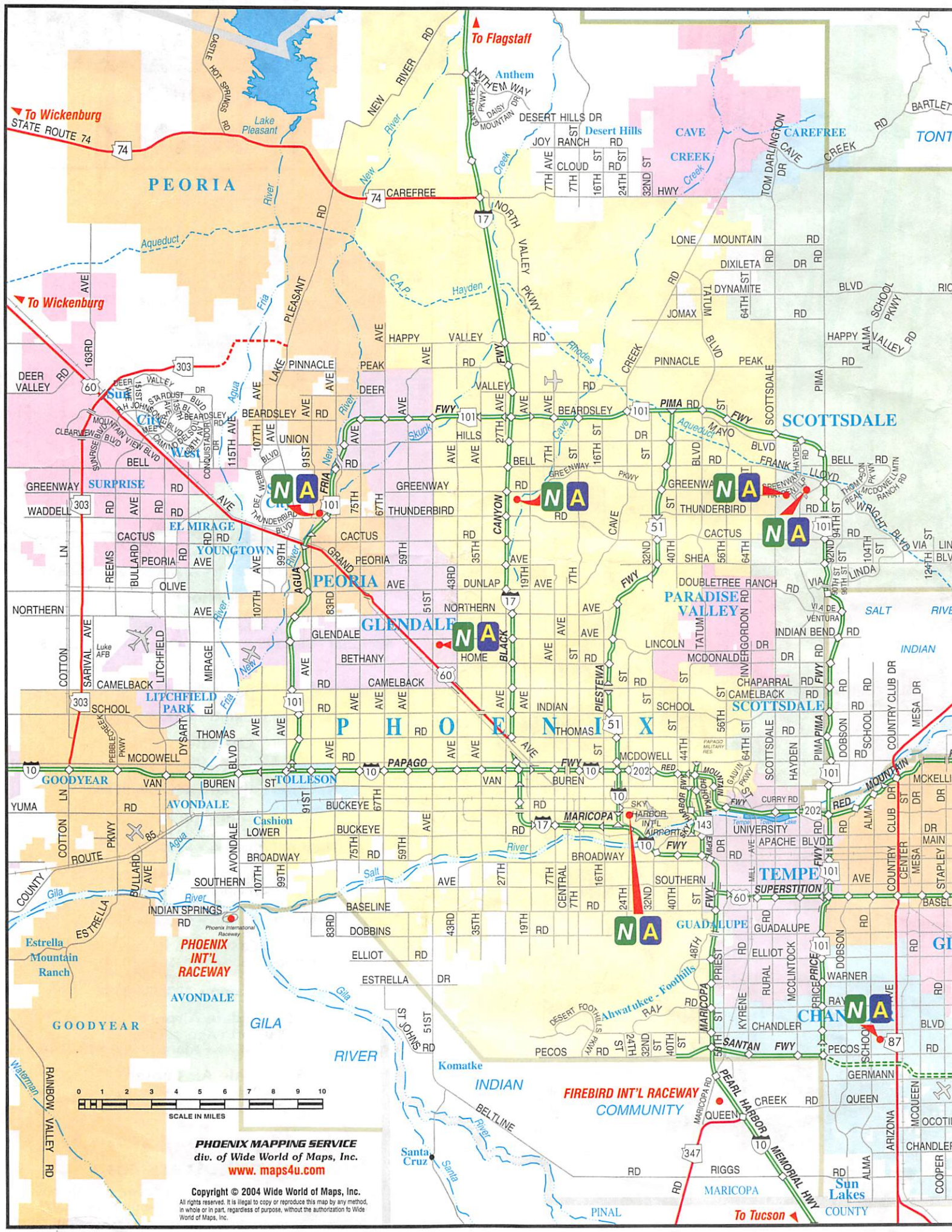

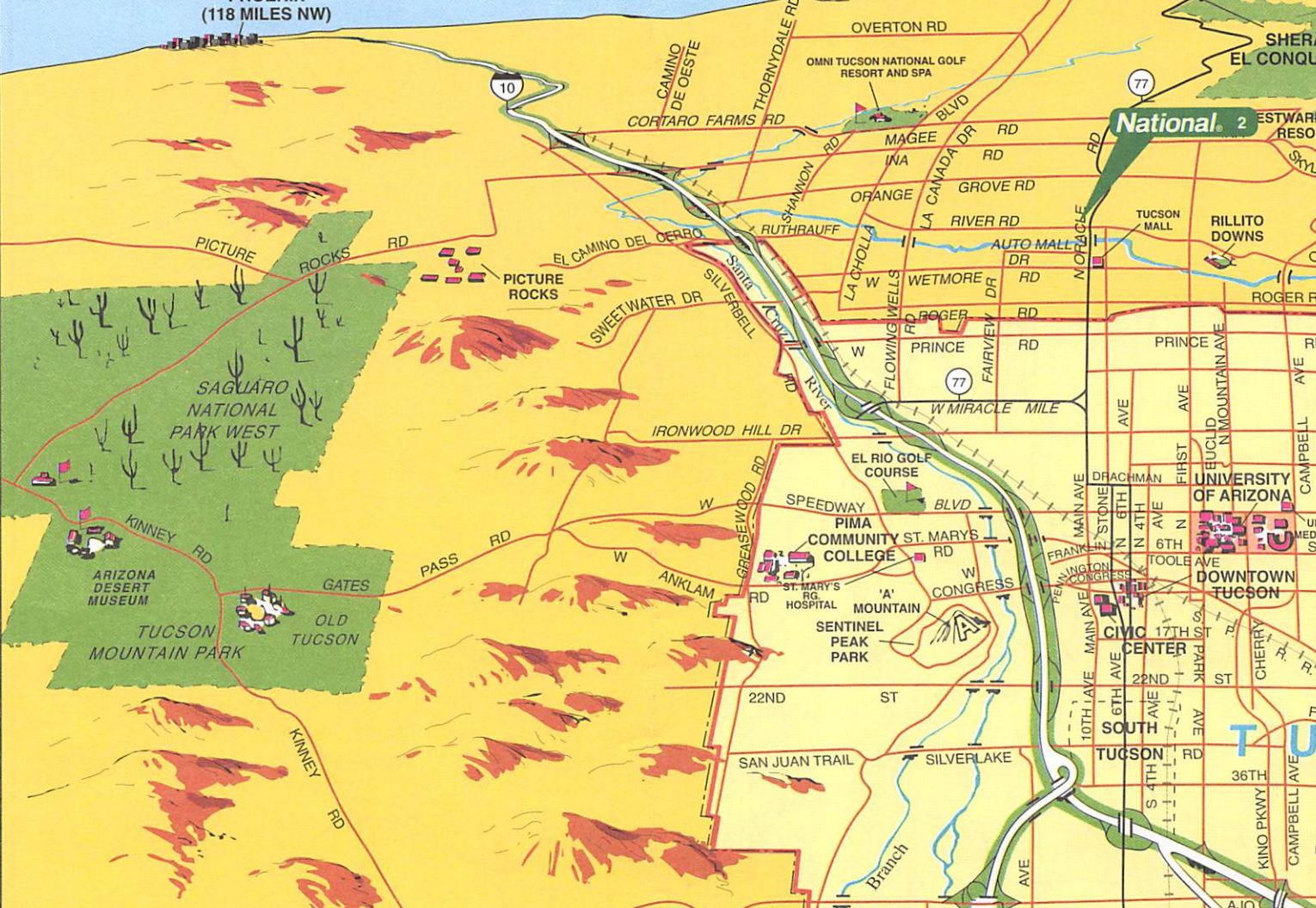
