Celebrated remnant of Rome's border defenses, Hadrian's Wall was built to control restive British territories and guard them from the fierce Caledonians. Extending about 70 miles, the stone and earth structure was testimony to the engineering skills of the Roman army.

Emblem of the 20th legion, a charging boar decorates a roof plaque of baked clay. Trained in all the building crafts, Roman soldiers constructed roads, bridges, and aqueducts.



SECOND-CENTURY A.D. TERRA-COTTA ANTEFIX BRITISH MUSEUM, LONDON

Occupied by Rome for about 20 years during the reign of Augustus, the Germans, divided among several tribes, were lost after three Roman legions were slaughtered in Teutoburg Forest in A.D. 9.



OCEANUS ATLANTICUS (ATLANTIC OCEAN)

"He marched on foot and bareheaded over the snows of Caledonia and the sultry plains of the Upper Egypt," wrote 18th-century British historian Edward Gibbon of Hadrian, Rome's traveling emperor. Though born in Rome, he, like Trajan, grew up in Spain.

Land of the Celts, Gaul was systematically romanized following its conquest by Caesar. Roads, aqueducts, and cities replete with baths and theaters were Rome's legacies to French civilization.

Rome made Sicily its 227 B.C. after defeating there the Quashing Mace the Balkans. Rome brought under its sway by 146 ended more than a century of Carthage, thus acquired
