Returned home on the 22nd after 16 great days in NC. Am now doing follow up work re the 50 people with whom I visited. It was great to visit with you. Phil,

Thanks for the copy of the 1864 survey to allocate the lands of John Pearce, II, which arrived with your letter yesterday.

I was able to overlay it on Google Earth, and doing so taught me enough to try the same approach with the plat map compiled in 1989 by twins Janet Wray Thomason and Janice Wray McCord from 1778-1785 surveys. It was published in the Nail-Ray book in 1997, p. 494. The result of this effort is attached, and I added a placemark for "The Ancient Pearce Cemetery" we visited a short time ago. As you can see, the cemetery is near the NE corner of the northern of two parcels owned by Nathan Pearce.

Hi David---

Your thoughts on advancing the map overlays to a Land Grant setting ran exactly as mine. I showed my associate Jay Buck your overlay on Land Grants. The lines did not come through clearly but the idea is there. I suspect we must give special attention to keeping the scales the same when we do these overlays. I also have in mind overlays as relates to streams and Geologic survey maps. This technique has special power but a key will be how to preserve our digital versions and even more how to share them with our large batch of contacts (now 600+).

Note that many of the property lines on the 1864 survey run North/South and East/West which lends hope that some of these straight lines will actually trace back to Land Grant lines.

Right now we are concentrating on doing the first simple overlay to publish in Upchurch Bulletin to issue soon. That version will be posted on our website. We will continue posting other overlays there to solve the need for wider availability until we reach the limits of what our Weebly crafted website can accommodate.

In the next week or ten days we should have closure on the Upchurch Bulletin and will then have our good example of one version of an overlay widely available.

Hi Dave and Janet---

This is sort of a PS to my earlier email but only to you two. I write to call attention to the diagonal line running through the northern Nathan Pearce Land Grant. Perhaps you have an explanation for this line. My proposal, for investigation, is that this was the original boundary between Granville and Johnston County when these two were formed in 1746. Subsequently, when Bute County was formed, the area to the north of this line became Bute County. Then in 1771 when Wake was formed from Johnston the area south of the line fell into Wake County. Subsequently, the Wake /Franklin border was changed and the land between the line and Moccasin Creek was transferred from Wake to Franklin. I report all of this from memory and verification is needed. These are some changes that most people do not want to be bother with. However, they are of special importance to those of us who have a keen interest in the Dunn Township area from 1740-1800.

Any thoughts you have will be appreciated.

You're right, Phil. The diagonal line through the northern Nathan Pearce land grant is the old Bute county line. The placement of the overlay on Google Earth imagery was determined (after scaling) by the old county line and Moccasin Creek.

The version of the overlay I used was the 1997 revision of a more cluttered 1989 mosaic based on the original surveys. The original land grant map drawn by the Wray twins and supporting surveys are attached.

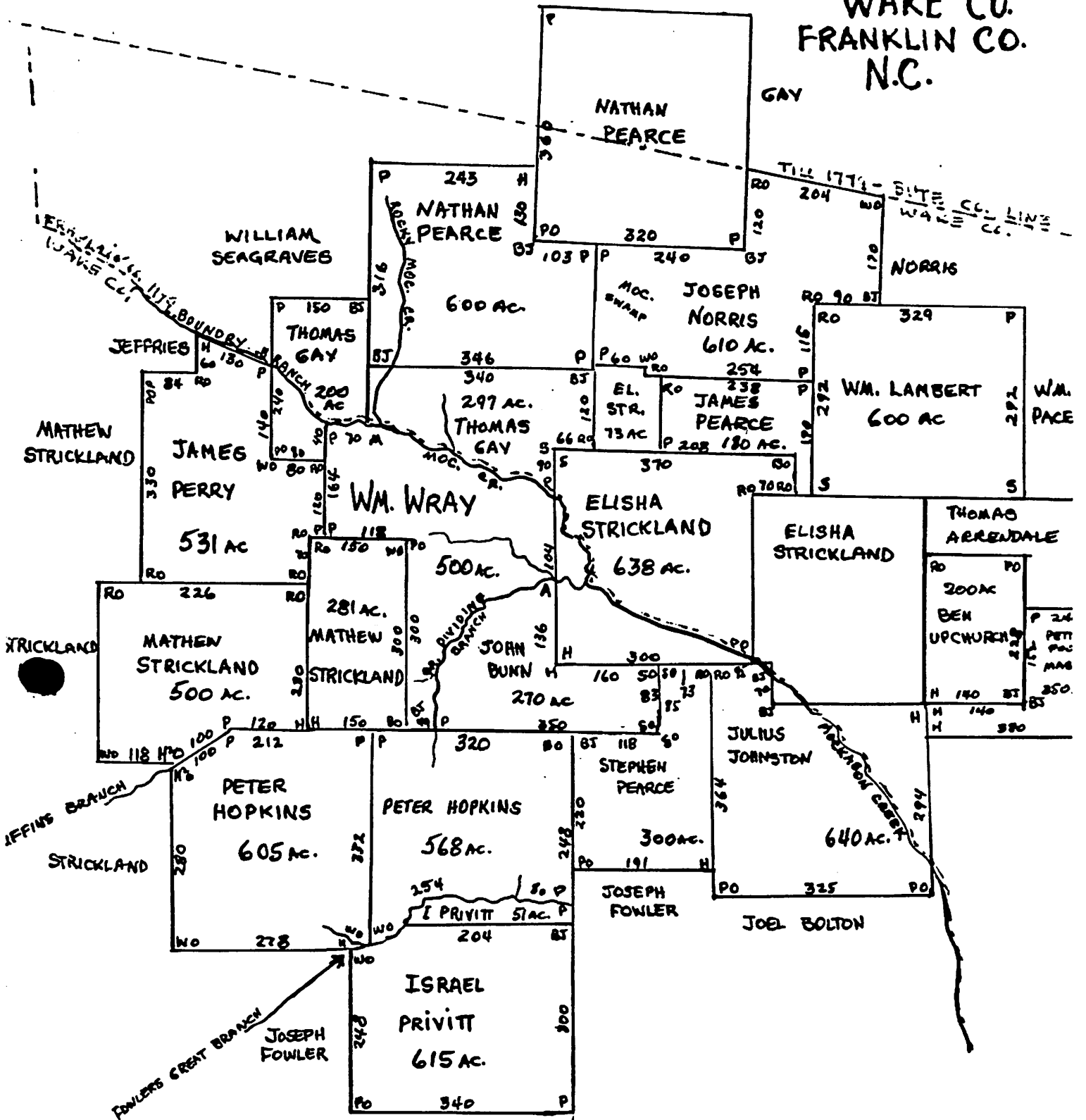
