Dear Phillip,

So nice to hear from you and know that you still keep us Patricks in mind, when doing your research. We have moved and have a new phone number 405-607-4824. We have been in our new home and jobs for about a year now and are enjoying both very much. Continue to work on the genealogy, but not as much as I should. You know how you run into dead ends and don't know where to go, I am there.

As for Tilitha Patrick Upchurch, she still remains somewhat of a mystery to me. She kind of appears and disappear throughout the census years. I have her being born abt. 1803 and the census seems to bear this out. My first encounter with her name appears in my g-g-g-grandfather's will dated Feb. 1840 in which he mentions his daughter Tilitha Pittman and his beloved grandson William Upchurch. There is no mention of any other female children. She appears in the 1840 Census as Tilitha Pittman and the 1860 Census as Tilitha Pittman, living with Kinion and Louisa again. In the 1835 will of Nathan Upchurch (1), the children of his late son Nathan(2) are mentioned (Macky Louisa, William, Alvin, Nathan(3)).

The 1850 Census for Wake County, Western Division, page 152A shows a Kinion Jones with his wife Louisa and son William. Also, in this house is a Talitha Jones, William and Alvin Upchurch. I at first thought that this is Tilitha the wife's mother and that they just got her last name wrong. I have flipped flopped on that idea several times. I thought that this was Kinion's mother Talitha Jones. Talitha Jones appears in the 1870 Census in Wake County, age 69yrs. You mentioned finding Tabitha Upchurch in the 1830 Census for Wake County, could you give me the page, I couldn't find her. I believe that Talitha never was a Jones.

I am supposing that Macky Louisa Upchurch is the eldest daughter of Nathan and Tilitha Patrick, since she is mentioned in her grandfather's will as being the child of Nathan. I don't know if Nathan was married to anyone other than Tilitha Patrick, could

have been. There was a female child listed on the 1830 Census for my grandfather William Patrick, age 15-20. Just don't know. Maybe, after Nathan's death some of his kids lived with one of his brothers or sisters. Burtis had a number of young children in his household in the 1830s, don't know if these are all his, don't know anything about him.

Well, as you can see the mystery surrounds Tilitha. Her brother Kincheon is even more mysterious. Well, I will hope you can help me solve this puzzle on the Patrick-Upchurch connection. Keep in touch. I hope your travels to NC are enjoyable.

has been suspected and that she is TALITHA (PATRICK)(JONES)UPCHURCH (Hence TALITHA UPCHURCH) the widow of Nathan Uphurch, II who died in 1829. I figure the three males 0-5 would be the three Uphurch sons Talitha had by Nathan Uphurch, II. Could it be that the two males 5-10 are sons Talitha had by her 1st husband Mr Jones? If so do you have their names (They might be found later as Jones, Uphurch, or Pittman ??). The loose end I see here is: where is Monkey Lewis a presumed female in the Nathan Uphurch, II household, she being born about 1825. Perhaps she is in the name of TALITHA's parents in 1830 ?? [I guess we are comfortable with the idea that Monkey Lewis Uphurch was in fact the daughter of Nathan & Talitha].

Events in our lives have prevented us making a serious family history trip to NC for a couple of years, we now plan to go for 2-4 weeks in late May.

Dear Phillip;

It is always good to talk with you about our related ancestors. I received your letter and the information is always interesting. I have read it over several times and have the following questions and opinions.

Let me pass this idea by you. Lets assume that Tilitha Patrick never married a Jones. Kinion Jones then just married Mackey Louisa Upchurch. He was her husband and not a half-brother to Louisa and a son of Tilitha. Could the Tilitha or Tabitha listed in the 1850 census, be listed as a Jones by mistake of the recorder? Could she have been Louisa's aunt Tabitha Upchurch? We know by my gggrandfather's will dated 1841, that Tilitha was a Pittman and on my gggranduncle's estate she is still Tilitha Pittman (1847) The 1860 census lists her as Pittman and she is living with Kinion and his family still.

Nathan Upchurch II. Could he have married Martha Unknown after he was married to Tilitha and Nathan III be their child and not Tilitha's son? That would explain why Nathan III age 19 was living with Wyatt Holloman in 1850 and not with Tilitha and the other Upchurch children.

Do you have any information on a Margaret Yates. I believe she married a Nathan Upchurch? I have seen where Kinion Jones was a bondsman for several Yates.

Some of the names mentioned on my gggranduncle Kincheon Patrick's estate papers were Kimbro Council (administrator), Murray Upchurch, Kinion Jones, Jim Upchurch, Canon Davis, George Yates, William Colton, S. Upchurch. Murray and Silas ? Upchurch were part of a committee that helped Kincheon's widow Mary or Polly Patrick obtain a years support following his death. Some of the info on these papers are very difficult to read.

I am envious of you getting to go to North Carolina. I really look forward to making the trip in late spring or early summer.

Please find enclosed a check for \$25 for copies of any bulletins you might believe I would be interested in. I do want the ones with the maps and the will of Nathan Upchurch II. Any other bulletins would be appreciated.

Once again, that you for your continued support and interest in helping me find more about our relations.

You asked if the Talitha (Talitha) Jones in the Kenian J Jones household on the 1850 census could in fact be nee Talitha U, Aunt of Mockey Lemse U. I don't think so because her Aunt Talitha was on the same census as head of her own household. The 1850 census for the Kenian J Jones household certainly raises a number of questions and provides some "hints". Here are some:

- It seems reasonable to conclude that the William U & the Alvin U are sons of the late Nathan U, II. This being so it is reasonable to assume that Mrs Lemsa Jones is their sister nee Mockey Lemsa U and that she had had and Kenian L. Jones.
- My guess is that the census taker did make an error in listing Talitha (Talitha). My guess is that he was told she was the mother of the head of the household and the census taker assumed she was Mrs Talitha Jones, a widow when in all likelihood she was in 1850 Mrs Talitha Pittman and should have been listed as such.

Talitha had been named earlier to a Mr Jones. Listing her as Mrs Talitha Pittman would be consistent with the idea that the 17 year old Henderson Pittman in the household was her son by Mr Pittman.

- Given these assumptions it would appear Talitha Patrick and in order Jones-Henderson-Pittman.

Your idea that Nathan II, II may have had Talitha (Patrick) Jones & had 3 children by her and then had Martha - - by whom he had Nathan II, III has a good ring to it. Off hand I know of no reason not to look more closely at this.

This whole picture is quite invalid but we do seem to be getting the known facts in mind and to be organizing logical assumptions. I suggest it might be helpful if we start a list of known facts and primary assumptions on which we can agree over time. I think we are making progress - even if slowly

You asked about Margaret Yates. I believe her to be XFD-81 - 2 page, 8 item graphle enclosed. There were many interdictions between the Upchurch & Yates families.


You mentioned that neighbors/friends were cited in Kenneth Patuck's estate papers and possibly in other documents. Some of the Upchurch names you mentioned are immediately known to me. If it is convenient and you want to pursue this matter you can send me a copy of one or more documents and I will research the names and give you a report on what I find. It is very helpful to know the date of the document as this sets the time when one would look for individuals who would have been alive at the time the document was signed. Jim U does not ring a bell. I suspect SILAS U was SIMS U

Our trip to NC is now more or less fixed for the last half of April. We have made a commitment to be there on 21 APR 01 and will build the rest of a proposed 2-week trip around that date. This

will focus almost entirely on family history. Over the next year or so I plan several such 2-week trips. I am already lining up cousins/cooperators for these ventures. The family of Nathan U, I will be given a special priority on these trips so we can have high hopes that I will learn more about the Nathan U, II situation.

Starting yesterday we were supposed to devote 100% of our time dealing with tax matters as we meet with our CPA on 12 FEB 01 and must have all details ready. However, I could not resist processing your letter & one or two others that were very tempting. Now on to the tax project which is always a severe test for our 52 year marriage. Sal and I blame me if we cannot deduct something.

Looking forward to our continued exchange.

It has been awhile since we last talked about our family connections, Patrick and Upchurch. I am still prodding along trying to gather more information. How was your return trip to North Carolina? Hope you had a successful and pleasant trip?

I too have just returned from a trip to North Carolina. My family and I went to Raleigh the last part of May and stayed a week. I spent that week researching the cemeteries and local places to gather information. What beautiful country, I thoroughly enjoyed the trip. A recently found 4th cousin, Patrick Beckwith (Patrick and Seagroves) provided the guidance through Wake and Chatham Counties.

We visited the Patrick home place and family cemetery in the White Oak area. Other places we visited were Christian Chapel, New Elam, Buckhorn, Apex, New Hill, Green Level, Cary, Mt. Pisgah, Poplar Springs, Shady Groove, Avents, Holloman's Crossing, New Hope, Pittsboro, Oakwood area and cemetery, Raleigh City Cemetery and Raleigh, plus many more.

I saw and took pictures of several Upchurch gravesites. I found Sherwood and Annie M. Upchurch Lee in Oakwood Cemetery (Alvin Upchurch). According to a file I found in the Archives, William D. Upchurch is buried in Raleigh City Cemetery; however, I could never find his gravesite.

I am continuing to pursue the Upchurch-Patrick connection. I am re-searching my census records and following up on the children of Louisa Macky Upchurch Jones, William D. Upchurch, Alvin N. Upchurch and Nathan (III). I have found several in the 1900 census and will begin working on the 1910 and 1920 census.

I explored a little of the Oakwood district of Raleigh, what a beautiful and historic area. According to my information William D. and Alvin both lived in this area. William lived on Bloodworth Street. I took pictures of several of the homes.

Visiting these areas of Chatham and Wake counties was very meaningful to me in my research of the families. It gave a lot of meaning to the names of the various communities and events.

Have you been able to come-up with any more information on the Patrick-Upchurch connection? I couldn't find anything on Tilitha Patrick-Nathan Upchurch (II) marriage in the Archives. I still continue to believe that the connection exists between these two families and will until proven otherwise. By the way, Gayle Patrick Cohen joined us in Raleigh for one day. I am compiling a great deal of tangible data both on my computer and in hard print.

Well, I will go for now, just wanted to share my excitement and enjoyment of my trip to North Carolina with you. I tried to call you Friday night, I left a message. I enjoy hearing from you.

Re Nathan U, II and his 2 wives and 4 children, my working hypotheses are as follows:

1. The first wife of Nathan U, II was a Martha - -. This was a short lived marriage but produced one child Markey Lewis U b about 1825. Martha and Nathan U, II parted ways (divorced) and Martha went on to marry Wyatt I. Holloman.
2. The second wife of Nathan U, II was Tilitra (Patrick) Jones. Her first marriage was to a Mr Jones and was short lived. It, however, produced a child KENFON (KENFAN) L. JONES - Kinwan and the aforementioned Markey Lewis U were not blood-related but were step-siblings and presumably grew up together and eventually married and produced a son William Jones b about 1849.
3. Tilitra & Nathan U, II had three children:
 - a. William D. U. b 1827
 - b. Alvin N U b 1828
 - c. Nathan U, III b 1830

4. Nathan U, II died 26 SEP 1829 with his fourth & last child, Nathan U, III, being born after the father's death.
5. After Nathan U, II died his widow Tilitra and for the 3rd time to a Mr Pitman and had a son Henderson Pitman.
6. The 1850 census Records the four children of Nathan U, II as follows:
 - a. Nathan U, II age 19 is in the home of his mother Martha - (-) (Upchurch) Holloman and her new husband Wyatt S. Holloman
 - b. Macky Lewis U age 25 is shown as "Lewis" and she and husband Kenian L. Jones (see 2 above) head a household. This household includes a TILITNA JONES age 50 which could well be TILITNA (PATRICK) (JONES) UPCHURCH
 - c. William U age 23 [William D. U] is in the home of his 1/2 sister Macky Lewis (Upchurch) Jones - [see 6 b above]
 - d. Alvin U age 23 [Alvin N. U] is in the home of his 1/2 sister Macky Lewis (Upchurch) Jones - [see 6 b above]

I realize these hypotheses involve many assumptions than one would like. It is just a starting point. Let me know what you think.

As part of following up on your letter I took a closer look at a recording I made in Apex, NC on 25 FEB 1978 - re Martha A. U - see enclosed Biopill for her as nee Martha A. Pope (2 Pg 6 items). I think it is quite likely she was the wife of Nathan U, III. Any comments?

Re the children on the 1860, 1870, 1880 census records for Wake Co, NC, I agree there are still some issues to be resolved. My comments:

- Melinda U b abt 1856 appears on 1860 but not on 1870 or 1880 census. A logical conclusion is that she died between 1860 & 1870. See item ② on enclosed Biopill for Martha A. Pope. Maybe the death date was 30 SEP 1862 not 30 SEP 1882 - Note my comment in ① "both hard to read"
- Re Child #2. I carry this child as William Alonzo U which fits OK with him being listed as Alonzo on the 1880 census and as William on the 1870 census. He has to be the same as the one named John on the 1860 census but just why he was called John in 1860 or appeared as William or Alonzo I have no answer.

You asked about the sister of Nathan U, III
He did have a sister named TABITHA U
b. abt 1791 & 1894 (not TALITHIA). She never
married but had two children - GOLDEN
ALMON U, Sr b. 1815 & 1893 and MARTHA JANE U
b. about 1821. The father of these children
has never been identified.

I have great hope of a 2-week trip
to NC to do family history work sometime
in the first half of 2001. At present we
have obligations through 12 FEB 2000 after
which I can think about what to do
next.

Sorry, that it has been so long since we've talked. I received your letter and information. I have read through it several times and have entered it into my records. A question came-up right away. If Nathan II died about 1829, then one would assume that the birth date for Nathan III may not be correct on the 1850 census. It shows him as being 19. Another question, why would he be living with Martha and Wyatt Holloman, unless Martha was his mother and not my Tilitha Patrick Upchurch. How common was it for people to get divorced in those days.

You mentioned that Nathan II had a sister Talitha Upchurch. What do you know about her?

Regarding Nathan III, there seems to be some confusion with the number and names of his children from the 1860 census through the 1880 census. Did Melisa and John die?

As for the cemeteries. I am not sure where the cemetery is located in Chatham County. A relative that lives in Zebulon is to send me some information, but as yet he has not come through for me. He could answer a lot of questions if he would just follow-up on my inquires to him. He has been ill, so I must be patient with him. The Patrick Cemetery in Wake County, is about 2-3 miles south of Apex on old highway 1. It may be just a family cemetery. The Patricks lived in the Apex, Cary, Buck horn, Swift Creek, White Oak Townships in Wake County, The Patricks in Chatham lived in the Pittsboro area.

Thank you for all the information you have provided. I still would like to have a copy of those wills and the maps that you mentioned. I am kind of at a standstill until I hear from the relative in North Carolina or I get the chance to make a trip out there myself. I did find a lady in North Carolina that contributes to the Wake County genealogy website, that had posted some Records of Estates that listed three entries for a Kinchen Patrick. One was in 1847. She is on an extended vacation and won't be back to her home until March. I would love to get a hold of those estate records.

Well, I will let you go and again I apologize for not getting back to you sooner. Thanks again for your help. Love to know more about the Upchurch relatives.

As a next step I thought it logical for me to send you the profiles of Nathan U (XFD-109) [1 Pg 3 items]; Nathan E. U (XFD-14894) [1 Pg 3 items]; Nathan U, II (XFD-85) [4 Pgs 8 items]; Nathan U, III (XFD-92) [3 Pgs 8 items]; and Nathan U, IV (XFD-3030) [1 Pg 2 items] - all of which are enclosed. Perhaps you would study these and let me have any comments or questions. Naturally, I would like to have any items we can add to these profiles.

One new bit of information has come in since we talked. Note item ⑤ on the profile for NATHAN U, II. We now know he died 26 SEP 1829 in Wake County, NC. We need to locate the microfilm and see if more data is given. It seems quite possible that Nathan U, IV was born after his father Nathan U, II died - or if not then the story would be that Nathan U, II died when his son Nathan U, III was an infant.

Re the 1841 will enclosed is a copy of an extract sheet I have prepared based on your two letters. A copy of this has been placed in the Profile System for each person named and in my Cemetery File. Enclosed are copies of Profile sheets that were already in my

Profile system for Kumbrel (Kumbro?) Council & Alvin Yates. Both of these families are well known to me and there two families (members thereof) & the Upchurch family intermarried. Moses U is the brother of Nathan U, I. I have a huge profile on Moses U & scanned it to see if there was a Patrick reference in it other than the one you have provided. I found none. The Herndon, Rogers & Whitehead families are well known to me but the 3 individuals shown are new to me. It seems quite clear the Patricks, Upchurchs & other families named or associated with the 1841 will lived near to each other and had numerous interactions including some intermarriages.


In due course we need to compare notes more completely about the ^{exact} locations of the cemeteries you mentioned and about other locations of mutual interest in Wake & Chatham Counties.

I have not gone back to my census files yet as regards our mutual interest in the family of Nathan U, II but will try to do that on our next exchange.

Nice to hear from you regarding our mutual relatives, the Upchurch, I am enclosing \$10.00 for a subscription to your Bulletin. I look forward to receiving any information that might help in solving the unknowns about this particular family unit.

△ I don't know much more than I told you in my first letter. In William Patrick's Will dated
△ February 14, 1840, from Chatham County, William Upchurch was listed as a beloved grandson.
△ He was willed some assets if he remained with his grandmother or the family and help with the
△ homestead until he reaches the age of 21. Other members mentioned in the Will were Elizabeth
△ Patrick (wife), sons William, Kinchon and Gillum Patrick (my great great grandfather), Tilitha
△ Pittman, who I believe to be William Upchurch's mother. She is the only female listed in this
△ will. I have a copy of the 1850 census listing a William and Alvin Upchurch, in Wake County,
△ Western Division. They are living with a Kinian Jones, his wife Louisa, and their son William.
△ Also listed in this house was Tilitha Jones, age 50, William Upchurch age 23, Henderson Pittman
△ age 17, Alvin Upchurch age 22, and Jessie Maynard age 25. After that there are several censuses
△ with William Upchurch listed. I am not sure which one is our William Upchurch. I have a copy of
△ an 1870 census in Wake, Raleigh township that lists William (42) and Emily (35) Upchurch and a
△ son Henry or Harry age 10/12. He is listed as a grocer. I then have a census for 1900 Wake,
△ Raleigh for a William and Emily Upchurch, ages 68 and 67. I have a 1870 census Wake County,
△ Raleigh township that lists Alvin Upchurch, age 39, with his family, Mary 26, Corinna age 5,
△ Annie age 3, and Sherwood age 9/12. Alvin was listed as grocer.

William Patrick, Sr. died in 1841 and Elizabeth died in 1844. My great grandfather moved west to Tennessee, Mississippi and eventually to Arkansas. William Patrick, Jr. moved to Wake County, as did Tilitha. Kinchon just kind of disappeared I have no record of him other than the Will and some indentures he made with the Patrick Estate in 1844, after Elizabeth's death. I don't know if he lost the home place or what happened to him. I believe that William and Elizabeth Patrick are buried in Christian Cemetery, Chatham County. There is a Patrick cemetery in Wake County and this is where some of the Patricks are buried. I have been in contact with a Patrick Beckwith in Wake County, who is a descendant of William Patrick, Jr. He is supposed to be getting some information for me.

That's about all I know that could help you in determining which William and Alvin Upchurch are our relatives. I hope this helps some and please let me know if you need anything else. I have a lot of information to share.

dates of the wills, census records, etc - I suggest
she wd (1st) - - Jones and had son KENIAN JONES
(various spellings for first name). Then she wd (2nd)
Nathan U, II and had four children. Then she wd (3rd)
- - Pitman (Pittman?) and had son Henderson
Pitman. Do you agree with this sequence? Can
you add more supporting information?

Now for a bombshell for both of us. My
reading of all the records leads me to conclude

sheets I came across two Profiles that

on the Wake/Chatham border

#2 ALICE WILLIAMS - XID-7499. Could she be
the Alice Williams b 1878 (NC) shown in
your printout as dau of Sarah (Pellier) Williams?

It was only as I studied your recent letter that I realized you are not a descendant of Nathan U, II but rather a descendant of his brother-in-law GILAM PATRICK b. 1806 (NC). Even so it seems that we have much interest in common and can benefit from continued interaction. I have huge amounts of information about the Wake/Chatham border area. My ancestor Nathan U, I and his brother Moses U arrived in this area about 1802 from the southern tip of Franklin Co, NC where their father arrived in 1755 from VA. Moses settled just over the line in Chatham Co & Nathan U, I settled at Green Level just inside Wake Co. I have published a map in the U.S. showing the exact location of the 1000 acres owned by Nathan U, I when he died in 1835. It embraced Green Level.

We seem to have made some positive steps but have some loose ends. I'll look forward to hearing from you and to getting a few more issues resolved.

Dear Phillip;

So nice to visit with you the other evening and to receive your valuable information. I agree with you that we do indeed have mutual family. I greatly appreciate your help in solving some of the questions I have about our Upchurch relatives. As I mentioned I have only been at this process for about 14 months, but I have thoroughly enjoyed the adventure and the new relatives and acquaintances I have encountered. I am beginning to amass a large quantity of important genealogy information. I look forward to our continued communication over these matters. We talked briefly about a lot of subjects in our phone conversation and I would like to re-visit them with you now in writing.

Tilitha Patrick Upchurch

I re-visited the will of William Patrick, dated February 14, 1840 to determine the spelling of Tilitha Pittman as mentioned in the will. The spelling is as indicated. In the will she is already a Pittman. I would love to know when she and Nathan married and to obtain a record of that event. One would have to assume that Nathan died after 1830, if that is the date of Nathan's (iii) birth. I have a census record on her in 1840 Wake County, listing her as Tilitha Pittman, with one male child 5-10yrs and one female child 5-10yrs. The male child could have been Henderson Pittman or Nathan Upchurch???. The female child couldn't have been Macky Louisa Upchurch, if she was born in 1825, correct? As I stated the other evening, the only reason I assumed that Kinion Jones was a son of Tilitha, was on the 1850 and 1860 censuses she was living with this Jones family. I should have thought maybe that Louisa could have been her daughter. On the 1860 census she is only 45, 5 years younger than on the 1850 census. On the 1870 Wake County Census, she is listed as Tilitha Jones, age 69. I have not found her after that census. Don't know when she died or where she might be buried. There is a Patrick Cemetery south of Apex, but I don't know everyone that is buried there. I know her brother's family, William Patrick, is buried there. I believe that my ggg parents are buried in Christian Cemetery, Chatham County.

William and Alvin Upchurch

Glad to find out anything about these two men. Was either of them involved in the civil war? Do you have any idea when William married? The reason I ask is because I found a listing in the 1860 Wake County Census for a Emily Upchurch, age 25, she was living with two other Upchurch women, Caroline (22) and Edith (14). I don't know if William fulfilled his obligations set forth in the Will. The 1840 Census lists my ggg mother Elizabeth (Betsy) with one male 10-16, two males 21 to 30, one male 70-80 and one female 70-80. The last two is being William and she. The one teen male could have been William D. Upchurch. Looking at the census records it seems odd that William D. would go from grocer to bar keeper to landlord. It is good to resolve some of these issues and see his lineage fall in place. Alvin has been a little more difficult to trace. I have the 1850 and 1870 census records on him and his family. I will use the information you sent me to further research the census records. Would love to have anything you might have on these two Upchurchs, in hopes of tracing forward going ancestors for contact.

Nathan Upchurch III

I have no information on him except what you have shared with me. If he were Nathan and Tilitha's son, where would he have been on the 1850 census? I don't have a listing for a Nathan Upchurch on my index. I may have to go back through and double check the census rolls. If he were a descendant of Tilitha and Nathan then I would be most interested in finding all I can about him.

Nathan I and II

Tell me more about them, where they came from, what they did and when did they die and where might they be buried? This information might help in tracing the Patricks, too.

Please send me a copy of Nathan's will and the map and anything else you think might be beneficial to me in my quest of the families. I would be interested in bio information on these individuals or any side notes on the communities in which they lived. I look forward to a trip to Wake and Chatham Counties. Please let me reimburse you for any expense in replicating this information. Thanks Again

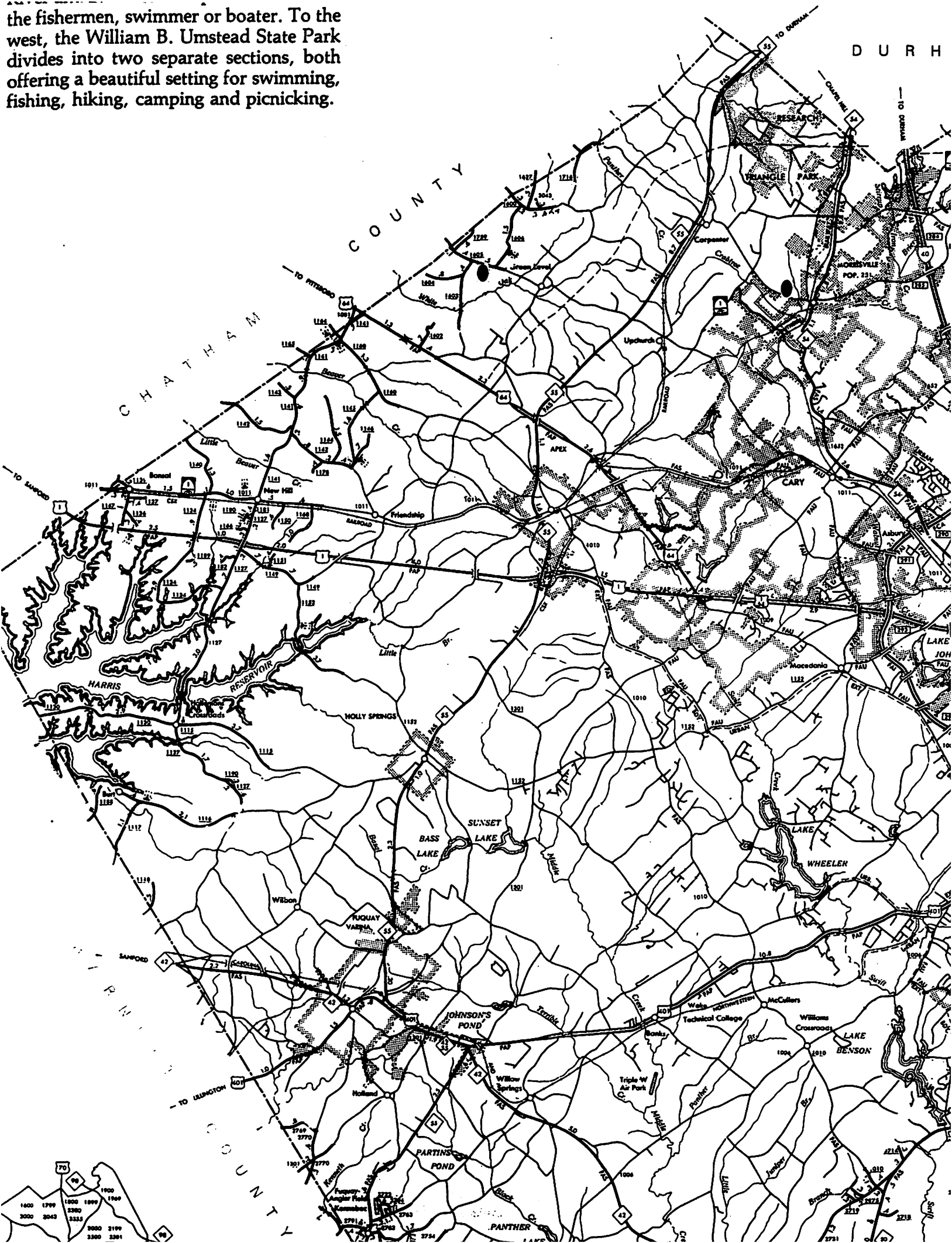

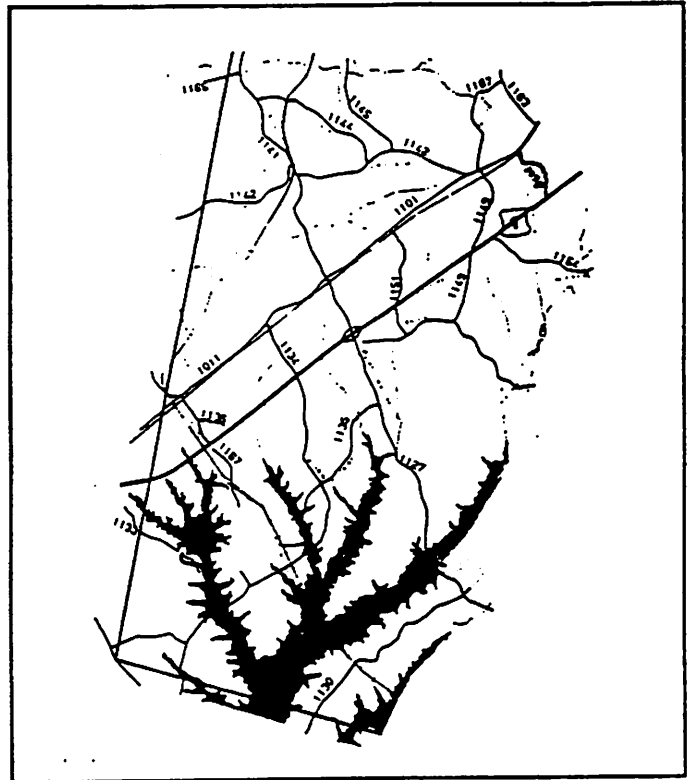

This township is in the very southwest corner of Wake County, joining S and W with Chatham Co. and two townships - White Oak on the N/NE; Holly Springs on the E, the bounds being 95% water. This starts at Big Branch on US1 and flows SW into White Oak Ck. At SR1127 it goes SE for .9 mi to Cary Creek, thereon flowing SW to Chatham Co. Along Chatham W and then N, the line comes to Beaver Creek by which it begins the northerly bounds with White Oak Twp. At SR1163 the line turns SE to the RR's right-of-way, by which it goes .4 mi SW to SR1170 and thereon SE to US1 (no access). But the boundary itself is on US1 for ca .4 mi NE to the start at Big Branch.

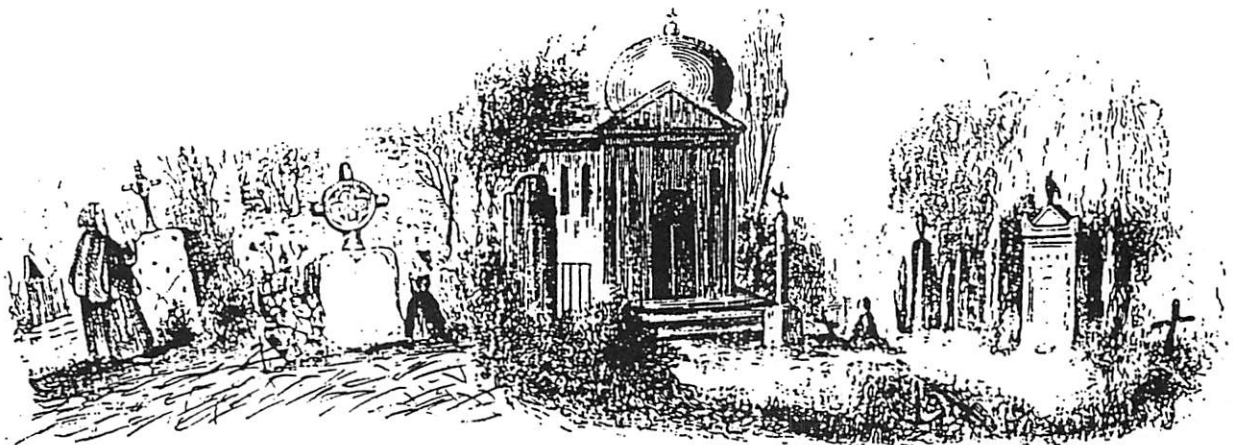
