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PRICE REVOLUTIONARY PENSION CLAIMS

The following is taken from microfilm of the National Archives. ADAM PRICE

To the Hon. John C. Calhoun, Secretary of the War Department of the United States.

The Petition & declaration of ADAM PRICE of the Town of Minden in the State of New York, aged sixty eight years and upwards, on oath setteth forth & declares that in June 1776 he enlisted in Captain George Setes(?) company in Col. Gan_____ts Regiment of the New York line of Continental Troops. He continued to serve in said Regiment until he was transferred into Colonel Van Schaicks Regiment of the New York and which was called the first New York Regiment of Continental Troops. And he further on oath declares that he continued to serve in Colonel Van Schancks Regiment until the close (of) the war when he was discharged & his discharge was signed by his Excellency the commander in chief & had a certificate of the badge of merit annexed to it. His discharge he now thinks is lost as he has not seen it for some years.

And he further says that he has never received any pension from Government and he further says that he has no property whatever & is now in such reduced circumstances that he is absolutely in need of assistance from his country for support and he further says that he has been informed & believes that by an act of Congress passed at the present session the Secretary of the War Department can place him on the pension list & he therefore prays that he may be placed there accordingly - and in duty bound will ever pray,

On the fourteenth day of June in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and Twenty, personally appeared in open court in the court of common pleas held in and for the county of Montgomery being a Court of record proceeding according to the course of the common law & having power to fine & imprison, ADAM PRICE aged sixty eight years residing in the said county who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath declare that he served in the revolutionary war in a Company commanded by Christopher P. Yates in the First New York Regiment commanded by Colo. Van Dych, that he made a declaration on the 30th day of April 1818 & was placed on the pension list and that the number of his pension is 1460 and "I do solemnly swear that I was a resident citizen of the United States on the Eighteenth day of March One thousand eight hundred and eighteen, and that I have not since that time by Gift, Sale or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress entitled an act to provide for persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war passed on the 18th day of March 1818. And I have not nor has any person in trust for me any property or securities contracts or debts due to me, nor have I any income other than what is contained to the schedule herein to annexed & by me subscribed. That I have no trade or family and am too infirm to support myself by daily labour."

ANJER PRICE (W 1073) & JANE PRICE

Be it remembered that on this day personally appeared before me Parry M. Humphries, one of the judges of the circuit courts of law in the State of Tennessee, ANJER PRICE of said county and state and made oath That on the 27th day of February 1776 he enlisted as a soldier in Captain Richard Campbell's company of riflemen belonging to the 8th regiment of the Virginia line commanded by Col. Peter Muhlenbery. That at the time of his enlistment he lived in the county of Shenandoah in the State of Virginia and enlisted in said county. After his enlistment he entered the service of his country and about three months thereafter as well as this applicant recollects, he was in a scouting party near Norfolk, Virginia, under Capt. Campbell and received in a skirmish which took place a wound in the thigh, the impression of which he still wears. On the 4th day of October 1777, this applicant fought in the battle of Ger_____ in and on Sunday the 28th day of June following he fought in the battle of Mon____. This _____ continued in service in the 8th regt. from the period of his enlistment till some time in the year 1778 when the 8th regiment was consolidated with the fourth and afterwards was _____ the 4th regiment of the Virginia line, which was placed under the command of Col. John Green of Culpepper county, Virginia. Some time in the year 1779 at Middlebrook, New Jersey, this affiant being at that time a sergeant left the 4th regiment and was sent from that place to Petersburg, Virginia, with several officers, among whom was Col. Richard Parker who was appointed to take command of same _____ drafted for eighteen months. While this affiant was at Petersburg in Virginia, he was appointed a waggon master in the first regiment of new levies commanded by Col. Parker and in that capacity marched with his regiment to the state of Georgia. This affiant with the regiment to which he belonged, left Petersburg the 28th day of June 1779 and arrived at the town of Augusta on the 4th day of August following. From that place this affiant with the regiment to which he belonged was in a _____ to the siege of Savannah. After the _____ raised this affiant still being a waggon master as aforesaid was marched back with his _____ ment to the town of Augusta and _____ day of December 1779 he received his discharge from his Colonel Richard Parker. After the revolutionary war was over this affiant _____ contemplation to settle in the state of Georgia. And in 178_, being in the state of South Carolina, he gave the _____ papers, among which was his discharge, to a relative of his own, named Mary PRICE, who was going to the state of Georgia to _____. The said papers were put in the _____ of the said Mary and _____ afterwards _____. This affiant _____ in the possession of his said relation _____ to go to the state of Georgia to live but s_____ time after _____ he changed his intention and lived in the State of South Carolina for two years and then removed to the county of Russel, Virginia. This affiant never saw his discharge after he gave it to his relation and believes that it is now lost.

This affiant further states that he is now a citizen of the county of Warren in the State of Tennessee. That he has _____ and at the advanced age of sixty two and the reason of the _____ incident to old age he is unable to support himself and his family by manual labor and misfortune has reduced him to poverty and he now stands in need of the assistance of his country for support.

oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress entitled an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval Service of the United States in the Revolutionary War. That the said ANJER PRICE enlisted for the term three years on the 27 day of February 1776 in Shanandoah County State of Virginia in the Company commanded by Captain Richard Campbell of the Regiment commanded by Colonel Peter Wrihtenberg in the line of the State of Virginia on the Cont _____ Establishment, that he continued to Serve in the said corps or in the Service of the United States untill the 22 day of December 1779 when he was discharged from Service in Augusta in the State of Georgia by Colonel Richard Parker. That he received a wound in the thigh some time in the year 1776 near Norfolk in the State of Virginia, that he was in the battles of Germantown and Monmouth. And that he is in reduced circumstances and stands in need of the assistance of his country for support and that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said service, to wit, The deposition of two _____, required by the War Department on his original Declaration of the 18th Augt. 1818. "And I do solemnly Swear that I was a resident citizen of the United States on the 18 day of March 1818 and that I have not since that time by Gift, Sale or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an Act of Congress entitled an act to provide for Certain persons engaged in the land and naval Service of the United States in the Revolutionary War passed on the 18 day of March 1818 and that I have not nor has any person in trust for me any property or securities, contracts or debts due to me nor have I any income other than what is contained in the Schedule _____ annexed and by me subscribed."

The said _____ further states that he is justly indebted in the following sums to wit to the following persons:

C. Sullivan \$13.00; L. W. Marbry \$12.00; M. Bates \$8.00; J. Stublefield \$2.00; Thos. Thaxton By Note \$14.00; J. McFarland By Note \$2.00. Total \$51.00.

"And I the said PRICE do further state that my family is composed of the following persons, viz, My wife, JANE aged 56 and three children, TOWBIN 34 years of age a lunatick has been in a state of perfect insanity for 9 years; POLLY aged 16 & PATSEY aged 13, the two Daughters healthy. My wife in a bad state of health & has been so for more than four years." Said Decla_____ is by occupation a farmer of no perticuler Debility, small of stature & by _____ of the hardships of his youth and the ravages of time upon him he is unable to do but little for his support or the support of his family.

She further declares that she was married to the said ANJER PRICE on the Tenth day of April in the year Seventeen Hundred and Eighty three, that her Husband,

the aforesaid ANJER PRICE died on the Tenth day of December one Thousand Eight hundred and Twenty nine and that "I am still a widow and have never been married to any one since the death of my husband ANJER PRICE and that he drew a pension for many years."

Personally appeared before me Thomas W. Spices an acting Justice of the Peace in and for the county aforesaid, Richard PRICE a resident citizen of said county, aged about eighty three years, and first being legally sworn, deposeth and saith that he was personally acquainted with ANJER PRICE; that he was born in Culpepper County in the State of Virginia on the 7th day of February 1756. That he was married in Shenandoah County, Virginia on the 10th day of April 1783 to JANE PRICE who was born in Branville County, North Carolina on the 3rd day of October 1765. That he saw said ANJER PRICE on his return home from the army of the revolution and saw his discharge. That he died on the 10th day of December in the year 1829 in Warren County in the State of Tennessee. That he drew a pension as well as now recollected about 9 years before his death in Nashville Tennessee. That his widow, the said JANE PRICE (who was his cousin), resides now in Warren County, Tennessee, and has resided there for about the term of 29 years as well as recollected, and previously resided in Shenandoah County, Virginia. And he further states that the reason why he recollects the date of the said ANJER PRICE and JANE PRICE's intermarriage is that he himself was married on the same day. And he also further saith that the said JANE PRICE is the surviving widow of the said ANJER PRICE and that she has not been married since her said husband's death, but still remains a widow.

PRICES IN LIBERTY, LONG AND BRYAN COUNTIES, GEORGIA

The following information is a composite of data compiled by Dorothy H. Price, researching for her husband, Sterling Leroy Price. Sterling Leroy Price's father was Joseph Baker Price, born in Bryan County, Georgia. Joseph Baker Price's father was Lewis Price Jr., the son of Lewis Price Sr. The following information centers around Lewis Price Sr. and his only son, Lewis Price Jr.

Lewis Price Sr. was evidently the progenitor of a large family as there are still many of the name in that area today. They were farmers, preachers, and were interested in politics.

LEWIS PRICE SR - Little is known about him. Records show he sometimes spelled his name "Louis." He is first found in Liberty County, Georgia, as drawing Land Lots (Land Lottery Records of Georgia) in 1827. He is shown as head of a household in the 1830 Liberty County Census, married and with children. The census reveals that he was born about 1795-6 in North Carolina and died about 1860-70, as his wife was shown living in the household of one of her children and he is not listed after the 1860 census.

His parentage is now under research, but an important clue may lead to a JAMES PRICE as being the father. This James Price was found in the household of Fleming Terrell and wife, Anna Price, a known sister of Lewis Sr. James is shown as 77 years old in the 1860 census and born in North Carolina. The name JAMES appears in nearly everyone of the children and grandchildren's family listings.

Lewis Sr. is listed as in the 17th Militia, Liberty County Registrants for 1827; also as Justice of the Peace in Liberty County, June 5, 1855. An early family biography of Lewis Price Sr., as collected by a grandson, lists the following brothers and sisters: (1) Rhoda Price, b. ca. 1810 NC, m. Lemuel DRIGGERS 2 Jan. 1835; (2) Annie Price, b. ca. 1815 NC, m. Fleming TERRELL 3 Oct. 1842; (3) Oliver PRICE, b. 10 Apr. 1816 NC, m. Mary Jane FLOWERS 9 Jan. 1859; (4) Vinnie (Viny) Price, b. ca. 1800 NC, m. John WELLS.

Lewis Price Sr. married a Mary HOPE, born in North Carolina about 1811 (Census shows), and census also indicates that she died about 1840-50, as the 1850 census shows his wife as a Sarah _____. Mary Hope was buried at Delks Old Place in Upper Liberty County, Georgia.

Children of Lewis Sr. by his 2nd wife, Sarah: (8) Sara E. b. ca 1845 (never married); (9) William C. b. ca. 1848, m. Laura _____; (10) Mary b. ca. 1847; (11) Oliver S. b. ca. 1849; (12) Moses b. ca. 1850; (13) Jasper (or Joseph) b. ca. 1852; (14) James L. b. ca. 1844, m. Ardelia ____; (15) Samantha b. ca. 1836?, m. John H. HOWARD (no information found except reported in the early family biography).

LEWIS PRICE JR. became a well-known preacher in the Baptist Churches in Liberty, Long and Bryan counties. This compiler has copies of the church minutes in which both Lewis Sr. and Lewis Jr., as well as other family members, are mentioned. Lewis Jr. had a beautiful voice and established choirs and vocal groups in churches where he served. He died March 1, 1894 and was buried at Johnston Station, Liberty Co., GA.

PRICES OF CLAYTON COUNTY, IOWA

The following information was prepared by the former editor of Prices of America, Don Schultz.

PRICES of Clayton County, Iowa, from Memoirs of Clayton County

Alpine Whenin Price was born June 10th, 1855, in a frame building on the new farm named "Alpine Grove" in section eleven, Jefferson township, Clayton county, Iowa, his parents having sold the old homestead "Glen Fruin" in 1854. The four youngest children went with their father, Eliphalet Price, to Colorado Springs, Colo., where Alpine went to school in the winter and with his mule team did freighting and other work in the spring. He had a contract with Uncle Sam (U.S.) to cut and deliver fifteen cords of wood at the United States Singal Station on the very top of Pikes Peak, then in the charge of Sergeantn O'Kief, the signal and telegraph operator. He cut the wood on the south side of the mountain about one mile below the top, as no timber grows near the top of Pikes Peak. He said it was the hardest job of work he ever did. He then went to San Jose, Calif., and attended a commercial school and soon got a good position with his uncle who was doing a large commercial and banking business and is now well-to-do, besides owning a fifty-acre prume and apricot farm.

In selecting a name for this boy, Judge Price said: "For his first name, I will take the name of a beautiful flower which bears the name Alpine, and grows profusely on the sunny side of the Arctic mountains." And he also said: "I will take the first two words of the Declaration of Independence for his middle name. His name shall be Alpine Whenin Price."

Avalo Jersey Price was born on the Glen Fruin farm on January 12th, 1844. He enlisted as a private in Company H of the Twelfth Regiment of Iowa Volunteers. Henry J. Playtor was captain of the company, which was composed principally of young men of Dubuque and Delaware counties. He was in the battle at the taking of Fort Henry and assisted as guard in taking some of the confederates to the army prison in Ohio. Among them was the son of George W. Jones, who for many years was United States senator from Iowa, and a son of Mr. Lewis of the United States Land office at Dubuque, and others who went from Dubuque and joined the confederate army. He was at the battle of Fort Donelson, which was taken, but he was wounded and went home on a furlough, but returned in time to be in the battle of Shiloh, when the Twelfth, Eighth and Fourteenth Iowa regiments fought all day and until sunset, when they surrendered and were taken to Andersonville, where he and his brother Valmah remained about eight months, when paroled. He then came home and assisted in raising the Eighth Iowa Cavalry and received the appointment of major, which position he held until about the close of the war, when, owing to the severe wound received at Shiloh and the hardships of the cavalry service, he resigned and went to the Rocky Mountains and to New Mexico, where he became ill and started for his home in Iowa. On April 8th, 1871, he arrived at St. Vincent hospital in Santa Fe, New Mexico, where he died on April 11th, 1871.

Eliphalet Price was born in Jersey City, New Jersey, on January 31st, 1811, and died at Colorado Springs, Colorado, on Decmeber 10th, 1880. A sketch of his life work and writings are fully set forth in this book by his talented and affectionate friend, Judge Samuel Murdock. Mary Lower Cottle, the wife of Eliphalet Price, was born at

St. Charles, Missouri, on April 30th, 1814, and died at her home in Jefferson township Clayton county, Iowa, November 19th, 1865. She was the mother of two girls and six boys, all living at the time of her death, except her son Valmah.

Eliphalet Inthe Price was born on the "Glen Fruin" farm December 16th, 1851. It was several months after his birth before it was decided what his name should be. The mother of Judge Price resided in New York City and had for many years insisted that one of the boys should be named after her husband, whose name was Eliphalet Price, a life long minister, promulgating the Presbyterian doctrine and abolition, and who had baptized many hundreds of his followers in the Hudson river and along the ocean beach of New Jersey regardless of color, complexion or nationality. It was on a Sunday morning, when Judge Price took down from the shelf over the old fire place the Bible, and after dusting away the smoke dust with a turkey wing, he turned to the first chapter of Genesis, and read aloud to the family these words: "In the beginning God created the heaven and the earth." The Judge stopped and said: "My mother insists that the boy must be named Eliphalet after Father. I now yield to her wish, but all our children must have a middle name. I will put together the first two words of this Bible, which I regard as the greatest historical work that has ever been compiled by man and read by the people of all the civilized nations of the world. His name shall be Eliphalet Inthe Price." He was postmaster of Colorado Springs for eight years. At the expiration of his term he removed to San Jose, in Santa Clara county, California, where he was married to Miss Ida Cauffman, late of Henry county, Iowa, a lady of culture, and a kind and instructive mother of three boys born to them, to-wit: Eliphalet C. Price, born January 13, 1897, Oliver S. Price, born July 26, 1899, and David W. Price, born April 28, 1902. He has a fine home with a thirty-acre prune and apricot orchard.

Realto Exzeque Price was born in a log cabin on the "Black Spring" farm in Section 11 in Jefferson township, Clayton county, Iowa, on August 1st, 1840. He passed his early life in the common school and at the Upper Iowa University at Fayette during the college year of 1857 and 1858, and on the farm. In May, 1860, he entered the law office of Murdock & Hunt, at Elkader, where he remained two years. The next nine months he worked in the law office of Odell & Updegraff, at McGregor, on a salary of eight dollars a month and board. In January, 1863, he was admitted to the bar, and at the same time entered into a partnership with B. F. Hunt in the practice of law at Elkader, which partnership continued for six years and was dissolved, Mr. Hunt having been elected Circuit Judge, retiring from the firm. Marvin Cook, who had practiced law for about one year in Elkader, then became a partner under the firm name of Price & Book, which continued from November 1st, 1869 to January 1st, 1873, when Mr. Cook was elected County Clerk. Since then Mr. Price practiced law alone until his son, Valmah Tupelo Price, had finished a four year course in the collegiate department and a two year course in the law department of the University of the State of Iowa, receiving a diploma in each department. He then went into partnership with his father August 1st, 1891, under the firm name of R. E. & V. T. Price, which partnership still continues. In politics R. E. Price was a Republican, but did not have any desire for office but preferred to follow his vocation and help other deserving candidates to office. However, at the time of incorporating the town of Elkader, he did accept the office of councilman and served twenty-two years and three months faithfully working with other councilmen in getting the town incorporated, and devoted much time personally in overseeing the work of putting in the construction of the waterworks and in compelling the C. M. & St. Paul Railroad Co. to extend their railroad four and one-half miles from Stulta in Pony Hollow to Elkader, by legal proceedings before the railroad commissioners of Iowa and many other services rendered the town and county, and all that he received was twenty-two and 50/100 dollars (\$22.50). He is a stockholder in the First National Bank, has been director for thirty-two years, vice-president for eighteen years, and has been president since January 12th, 1904, twelve years. Realto Exzeque Price was married to Miss Sarah Filetta Stewart,

in Elkader, Iowa, on October 16th, 1866. To them were born three sons, Valmah Tupelo Price, born at Elkader, Clayton county, Iowa, October 11th, 1867, James R. Price, born at Elkader, Clayton county, Iowa, February 17th, 1872, and died at the same place on May 22nd, 1877; Stewart Realto Price, born at Elkader, Clayton county, Iowa, October 22nd, 1879. Valmah Tupelo Price, son of Realto Exzeque and Sarah Filetta Stewart, was married to Miss Nelly Peery, a daughter of Judge Stephen and Mrs. Emma Peery, May 31st, 1894, at San Diego, Cal. To them were born three children, Filetta Winifred Price, born at San Diego, Cal., June 11, 1895, and died at Elkader, Iowa, March 21, 1890 [?]; Herbert Peery Price was born at Elkader, Iowa, July 17th, 1901; Valmah Tupelo Price, Jr., was born at Elkader, Iowa, July 2nd, 1910. All the rest of the Price family were born in the old log cabin on the farm named "Glen Fruin," being the east half of Section 14 in Jefferson township, Clayton county, Iowa, except Alpine.

Trevereous Glorian Price was born on the "Glen Fruin" farm on June 27th, 1846. In 1863 he enlisted as a private in Company A, 4th Regiment Iowa Infantry Volunteers, and served until the close of the war. After being mustered out he studied law and was admitted to the bar in 1868. He received an appointment as Railroad Postal Clerk on the road between Dubuque, Iowa and St. Paul, Minn., which he held for about four years, when he was elected and appointed postmaster at Elkader, which position he held four years, and then moved to Burlington, Kit Carson county, Colo., where he was elected Clerk of Kit Carson county, and held the office four years. He was elected a member of the legislature of Colorado from Kit Carson county, and served one term, and is now serving his second term as Mayor of the town of Burlington, Colorado. He has been a resident of Burlington for twenty-nine years. He was married to Mary Hawn who died in Elkader, Clayton county, Iowa on August 18th, 1879, leaving one son, named Avalo Price, who resides in Denver, Colo. Miss Illyria Ann Price was born on the "Glen Fruin" farm July 7th, 1848, and kept house for her father in Colorado Springs until her death on June 3rd, 1873. Miss Mary Ellen Price was born on the "Glen Fruin" farm on March 16th, 1850. Ellen was an invalid all her life and died on March 14, 1914.

Valmah Valentine Price was born on the "Glen Fruin" farm September 15th, 1842. He enlisted as a private in Company H, of the Twelfth Regiment Iowa Infantry Volunteers, and under the command of Captain Henry J. Playtor was ordered to Kentucky, and on arrival there went into battle and captured Fort Henry and a number of prisoners, and then into battle at Fort Donelson, which was captured and many confederates taken. He was in the battle of Shiloh in company with the Twelfth, Eighth and Fourteenth regiments, who fought gallantly all day and at sunset surrendered, and were taken to that loathsome death hole at Andersonville, an everlasting disgrace to the chivalry and autocrats of the confederacy. They were exchanged in about eight months. Valmah again enlisted in Company H of the Twelfth Iowa Regiment Infantry Volunteers and while acting orderly sergeant of the company at the battle of Tupelo in Mississippi on the 15th day of July, 1864, he was badly wounded and thrown into a freight car and taken to Mobile, where he died on July 28th, 1864. A patriotic Union lady at Mobile took charge of the bodies of the Iowa soldiers and had them buried in a cemetery and a stone placed at the head of their graves. This information was received by R. E. Price from a sealed letter addressed to him and postmarked at Mobile and containing a printed slip cut from a newspaper.

PRICES FROM VIRGINIA TO NORTH AND SOUTH CAROLINA

I began researching my husband's family a little more than a year ago but have learned a great deal about this Price family. I will share with your readers information which may help some researchers of the Halifax, Henry, and Lee County, Virginia Price families.

I am listing my Price families just the oposite of other researchers as I have not documented the first ones in Halifax County but have some opinions which may be the correct ancestor.

The newest member of our family is not a Price at all, but our only grandson is Douglas LaDean Cunningham, Jr. born on December 22, 1985 to our daughter Brenda Kay Price Cunningham (born July 19, 1962 in Charlotte, NC) and her husband Douglas LaDean Cunningham (born May 5, 1958 in Belmont, NC) son of Ray Douglas and Mary Lillian "Susie" (Green) Cunningham of Gastonia, NC. They married November 15, 1980 in Charlotte, NC.

Next is our son, Samuel Edward Price, III (born October 1, 1966 in Charlotte, NC) who is not married at the present time.

My husband is Samuel Edward Price, Jr. (born November 17, 1934 in Columbia, SC). My name is Betty Lou Kuykendall Price (born November 17, 1934 in Charlotte, NC) daughter of Riley William and Lula Ellen (Wilson) Kuykendall of Mecklenburg County, NC. My husband and I married April 7, 1954 in York, SC (York being a popular place for marriages in this vicinity during the 50's.

My husband is the son of Samuel Edward Price, Sr. (born April 11, 1907 in Jonesville (Lee County) Virginia) and Jesse Lanilta (Cooper) Price (born October 19, 1910 in Columbia, SC) daughter of Ronnie (no middle name) Cooper and Sallie Elnora (Rogers) Cooper of Columbia (Richland County) SC. They were married September 23, 1933 in York, SC. The 1920 South Carolina York County census lists Samuel Price, age 12, son of Mary Price living in Rock Hill at 64 Arcade Mill Village. This document was used in order to obtain Social Security Benefits for him. He was raised by his mother in the textile industry where his talent as a loom fixer earned him high regards from his employers down through the years. It was not until early in his married life that he was reunited with his father who had remained in Jonesville. Sam and Lanilta had only the one child.

As a means of keeping these three Prices distinguished from each other, the III is called "Eddie", the Jr. is called "Edward" and the Sr. is called "Sam". However, in formal situations they have been called "anything".

"Sam" is the son of Samuel Harding (or Harden) Price, Jr. (born in January 1870 in Jonesville (Lee County) Virginia) and Mary Pruderce (Oaks) Price (born 20 March 1870 in Jonesville Virginia) daughter of Albert and Rebecca (Senn??) Oaks of Lee

Virginia) daughter of Albert and Rebecca (Senn?? cannot read the census taker's writing in 1870 Lee Co. Va) Rebecca, age 6 months was living with her mother Rebecca and her grandmother Prudence Senn???, her father having apparently died) Oaks of Lee County, Virginia. They were married 7 December 1889 in Hancock County Tennessee which is just across the line from where they lived in Wallens Creek near Jonesville, VA. The only document containing their marriage record is in a "day book" kept by William W. Sage of Stickleyville, Lee County Virginia. The day book was published by LOVELADY CHAPTER NSDAR of Pennington Gap, Va. Hancock County records were destroyed by fire in 1930.

The children of Samuel and Mary were all born in Jonesville, Va and are:

Samuel Harden Price, Jr. left his family in 1908 when his youngest child was one year old and went to Knoxville, Tennessee where he lived for a while. Later he went to Spartanburg, South Carolina after retiring from the railroad. A newspaper article at his death headlined "Mountainview Resident Dies at Age 103". This age we know now was incorrect. His son Frank, with whom he had lived prior to living at Mountainview gauged his father's age from a bible owned by his father's sister who was believed to have been born 10 years after her brother. However, the 1870 Lee County Va census records the following: Samuel H Price (Sr) age 24; Ruth (his wife) age 23 and Samuel (their son) age 7/12 months. This clearly establishes his birthdate at January 1870. Therefore he was almost 91 years old when he died. It is claimed by his family that he was a full blooded German. I have not been able to document this statement. It is believed that his wife Mary was a full blooded Blackfoot Indian. Again, I have not documented this statement.

The father of the above Samuel was Samuel Harding (Harden) Price, Sr. (born 1844/5 in Henry Co. Va); and the mother was Ruth Y. Noe (born 1846) daughter of William and Julianna (?) Noe of Lee Co. Va. Again due to fire destroying early records, I have not been able to locate where this marriage is recorded. It is assumed to have been preformed about 1868/9. Ruth died 27 February 1898 in Jonesville, Va as recorded in the William Gage day book. Harden, as he was called remarried on 4 July 1904 Lee Co. Va to Mary L. C. (Sword) Oxford, widow of W. M. Oxford and daughter of John and Mary Sword. (no children were born of the second marriage.)

The children of "Harden" and Ruth were all born in Lee County, VA (Wallens Creek/Penington Gap) and are as follows:

(Their children: Edgar A. (b. 1900) only child of mother Alice, raised by maternal grand parents. Alice remarried Nath Edwards. Next, Charles Bernarr, John Milton, and Paul B.) It is interesting to the writer to have learned that the son of Charles B., Charles and his wife Peggy (Pruitt) Price are living in the old home place, a log cabin which is now over 2 hundred years old. It has been kept in an excellent condition by the children and grandchildren of Harden. Children of Charles and Peggy are Charles Scott, and Alan Dale.)

The death certificate of Samuel Harding (Harden) Price shows his place of birth as Lee County, Va however, census records indicate that he was born in Henry Co., VA. He served during the Civil War as a Pvt (2d) Co. F, 64 Reg't Virginia Infantry. He is buried in the Penley cemetary near his home on Wallens Creek Va with his 2nd wife and her family. I have not been able to learn the correct spelling of Harding/Harden. The family believes he was named after President Harding, but documents have used the "Harden" spelling also.

Harden was the son of George W. Price and Martha A. (Weaver) Price, her parents are not known at this time. George and his brother John M. Price left Halifax County where they were born and came to Henry County where he married presumedly Martha in about 1843. They later moved to Jonesville, (Lee Co.) Va where George and his brother John owned a parcel of land in 1871, Deed Book 16, page 245.

The only child of George and Martha was born in Henry County, VA as follows:

3. It is possible they had a brother named Daniel, born 1818 of Lee Co. Va however, the children of Daniel were born in Patrick Co. VA and Tenn. Daniel was on the 1850 Lee County Va census . His children are buried in the Penley cemetary where Harden is buried. Daniel married Eleanor Price per the marriage record of his son Marion. No other information is known of his wife.

(Their children: Servilda (b. 1831 Tenn); Samuel W. (b. 1835 Patrick Co. VA); Francis Marion (b. 1837 Patrick Co. VA); and Catharine b. 1849) Samuel W. married Nancy Hall (b. 1842 Lee Co. Va) Frances Marion married 1st Evaline Hall; 2nd Mary E. Sword (b.1856 daughter of John W and Nancy Sword on 25 April 1880 Lee Co. VA) (There is a possibility that these children are buried in the Penley Cemetary because of their Sword connection rather than their Price connection, the writer does not know for sure.)

I have recorded the descendants of this Daniel and his wife Eleanor if anyone is interested in this line or if they can establish that Daniel is a brother to George and John. I would love to hear from his descendants.

At this point now, I can only state that on the 1820 Halifax County, VA census where George was born in 1820 that there was only the following Prices: Samuel Price (five sons under 5 years of age; one son age 10-16 Samuel age 26-45; he had no daughters but there are two females 26 - 45 years.

Next was Williamson Price shown with one male 16-26, one male 26-45, and one male over 45; one female 16-26 and one female over 45.

Last was John Price shown with 2 males 16-26; one female 16-26.

Therefore it is my opinion that since Samuel was the only one of the three with children under 10 that he must be the father of George who was born in 1820.

A deed for 120 acres of land recorded in Halifax Co. Va 15 October 1824 shows that Stokely and Nancy Hoyden sold this property to Samuel Price. A deed dated 1 May 1827 shows that Samuel and his wife Sarah H. (Sally H) sold this property to Frances Robertson.

Thinking that Williamson Price was the oldest I checked further on him to learn that he left a will probated 25 Aug 1823 in Halifax Co. Va. His wife was Susannah Booker and their children were William M.; Fanny M. (md Francis Scott Jr. 7 June 1805 Halifax Co. VA); and Susannah N. (married ? Holland). Williamson was a Pvt in the Rev. War.

I have since learned that Williamson was the son of William Price, Sr. born 1720 who was a Capt in the Rev. War. William died abt 1792/3, Will probated 7 Jan 1793 in Halifax Co. Va. 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

OUR PRICE FAMILY

Robert Pinkney (Bob) Price was born on November 2, 1859, to Fieldon and Delia Jane Garrison Price in South Carolina. He married Martha Ann Bateman on Easter Sunday of 1890. She was born December 15, 1874, to the home of Lee and Lassie Bateman in the Nantahalie community of North Carolina. In spite of pleadings of family and friends that Texas was known as the "jaws of hell," Bob, Martha, and their first six children left their mountain home in North Carolina in 1901. They traveled by train to the Oklahoma Territory, where they stayed almost two years and added another child to the family.

When they moved to Wilbarger County in 1903, they farmed the Nowlin place in the Talmage community for a few years and then bought land one mile south of Rayland. Bob and Martha lived on this farm the rest of their lives. The last six children were natives of Wilbarger County (TX), and twelve of the thirteen children grew to adulthood here.

The Price children of this family are:

Claude H. (March 27, 1891 - December 15, 1949) married Stella Capps in 1912. Their only child, Mary Blanche Carpenter, still owns their home place.

H. Grady (August 26, 1892 - August 2, 1958) married Nannie Ross in 1913. They had four children--Morgan, Paul, Isabelle and Ray, who lives on the home place.

Nannie (February 26, 1894 - March 13, 1966) married Charles A. Powell in 1909. Their children were Katherine, Virginia, Charles, Jr., and Billie Jo.

Pearl (September 19, 1896) married Fred Caldwell in 1916. She lives in Montrose, Colorado with their daughter DeLou Wetlaufer. Their other two children are Luther (Bud) and Martha Jo.

Delia (September 6, 1898 - May 28, 1982) survived three husbands: Grand German, Jim Bomar, and Ernest Harrison. She and Grand had two sons--Robert Dewey and Duncan, who died at 18 months of age.

Joe V. (February 28, 1901 - September 1, 1980) married Velma Thomas in 1933. Their children are Norvin and Linda.

Robert L. (Bob) (February 27, 1903 - January 22, 1965) married Robbie Lee Adams in 1923. They had five children: Marjorie, Jimmie,

Bonnie Wayne, Delores, and Bobby (Butch).

At present there are 15 (one deceased) sixth generation descendants of R. P. and Martha Price.

PRICE REVOLUTIONARY CLAIMS

The following is taken from microfilm of the National Archives.

CHARLES CULLY PRICE (R 8463); New York

State of New York)
Chautauqua County)

On this 12th day of October A.D. 1832 personally ap-

peared before the Judges of the court of Common pleas, now sitting, CHARLES CULLY PRICE a resident of the town of Ellry in the county and State aforesaid, aged about Seventy two years, who being first duly sworn, according to law, doth on his oath make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the act of Congress, passed June 7th, 1832. That at the commencement of the revolution he was living with one Henry CARNEY at or near New Town in the State of Pennsylvania, that he was an indented apprentice to said Harvey learning the trade of a black smith, that just before the Hessions were taken at Trenton, Gen. Washington, Gen. Mercer, and Gen. Sullivan quartered at the house of the deponents master (Harvey) that this deponent was a poor boy and never had any education, but he recollects that he was about sixteen years old at the time the Hessions were taken at Trenton, December 1776. That his master was a strong whig and readily consented that this deponent at the request of this deponent might go to the taking of the Hessions at Trenton. That he accordingly went under the command of one Lieut. Mercer, and was at the taking of the Hessions, as a soldier, on the 25th of Dec. 1776.

That he enlisted in the Army of the United States in the year 1776 or 77, being about one week after the Hessions were taken at Trenton, that the officers name who enlisted him was Hugh DOBBINS, who was a sergeant, that he was enlisted by the name of CHARLES CULLY, the officer declining to write his name at length on account of the length of the name, and that while this deponent served in the army he was known by the name of CHARLES CULLY only, though his real name was and is CHARLES CULLY PRICE. That he enlisted at the Wall Mill in the now county of Orange and State of New York, under the said Sergeant DOBBINS, that he immediately joined the Army at Fishkill, that his Captain's name was GRAHAM, his Lieut. name was MILLER and his Colonels name was WEISENFIL. And the Gen. name was McDOUGALL. That in the Spring of 1777 the regiment went from Fishkill to Danbury in Connecticut to oppose the British there. That this deponent served as a waiter of Lieut. Col. WEISENFALL and while the regiment was about at Danbury this deponent was sent by the Lieut. Col. to his house in Gorhen(?) for blankets, and on that account he did not march to Danbury. That soon after the regiment returned he joined his company again under the said Capt. GRAHAM at Fishkill that he remained and did duty as a soldier at Fishkill aforesaid for about four years. That during said time he was stationed at the barracks at Fishkill but they made a number of excursions, That he recollects one they made to Livingston Manor in pursuit of Tories, and one they made to Huntington in New Jersey; that when they went to Huntington they took their baggage waggons with them; that after he had served about four years, at the request of the forage Master this deponent and a party of one or two hundred soldiers marched from Fishkill aforesaid to within about twenty miles of New York at a place near Kings bridge to take 3 or 400 bushels of wheat which was stored there in two barns for the British. That the party to which this deponent belonged were overtaken by a party of British soldiers and were fired upon by them, where a skirmish took place and a number were wounded, and among them this deponent was wounded with a musket ball which went through the calf of his leg, and this deponent was then and there made a prisoner. That he was taken to the city of New York and confined in the first place in a sugar house, that afterwards he was taken to the provost where he found Lieut Mercer under whom he had served at Trenton. That from the Provost he was sent to a prison ship where he remained until the close of the war. That when the peace took place this deponent was released from the prison ship; that he never had a discharge; that he did not join the army after his release from the prison ship; that after the peace he had no permanent place of abode but worked at sundry places until 1788 when he was moved at She__ town in the State of New York, and then he immediately moved to Ballstown, Saratoga Co., where he lived for 3 years, then he went to Greenfield and staid 3 years, then he went back to Ballstown and staid 4 years, then he went to Cherry valley and staid __ years, then he moved to Ellery, Chautauqua Co., where he has resided for about thirteen years and where he still resides. He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or an annuity, ex-

cept the present, and he declares that his name is not on the Pension Roll of any agency in any State.

Charles C. (x) Price

The court asked the following questions and they were answered as follows-

1. He says he does not know what year he was born, but believes it was about the year 1760, and that he believes he was born in the city of London.
2. He says he has no record of his age.
3. He says he was living near New Town, Pa. immediately before he enlisted. That from there he went to the W _____ New York & enlisted. That when he was about 9 or 10 years old he was taken aboard of a British ship called the (Robust or Robert?), that he was aboard of said ship about a year & a half, that said ship came to New York. That one of the Lieutenants sent his linen ashore to be washed and this deponent & four others did not return to the ship, but went into the country. That soon after he went to work for Henry HARVEY near New Town and remained with him 3 or 4 years. That he enlisted in about one week after the taking of the Hessians at Trenton. That he remained at Fishkill 3 or 4 years. That he was a prisoner 2 or 3 years in the city of New York. That after the peace he worked at sundry places, living at New Lebanon about 3 years. That in 1788 he was married and since then he has lived at Ballstown, Greenfield, Cherry Valley & Ellery, all of which towns are in New York. That he was about 16 when he enlisted.
4. He says he enlisted and for himself.
5. Col. Courtland was his Colonel and he recollects that Gen. Putnam went the grand rounds and visited the regiment at Fishkill a number of times. That he frequently saw Gen. Washington, Sullivan & Baron Steuben.
6. He says he never had any discharge.
7. He says he is well acquainted with the Rev. Ebenezer Herrington of Ellery & Capt. Elias Clark of the same town.

ABIGAIL PRICE, being duly sworn says that she is sixty one years old and that she is the widow of the above named CHARLES CULLY PRICE, the above applicant for a pension that the said CHARLES C. PRICE, died at the town of Ellery on the 22nd day of November last. She does further swear that she was lawfully married to the said PRICE at Ellery aforesaid on the 26th of October 1819. That the said PRICE was then a widower having had two wives before. That since 1819 she has lived with the said PRICE until his death, and that during the time aforesaid she has frequently heard her husband speak of his services during the revolutionary war. That she has heard his aforesaid declaration read, and that she recollects that she has heard him speak frequently of his services as set forth in the above declaration. She further says that she has frequently seen the scar in the calf of his leg, and that he always told this deponent that he was wounded by the British during the Revolutionary war. She has also frequently heard him speak of the battle at Trenton, and also of his being made a prisoner by the British, and that he remained a prisoner for some time. She further says that she believes the said CHARLES is of the age he represents, namely 72 years. That she is in indigent circumstances.

That he enlisted in the army of the United States about eighteen months before the surrender of Lord _____ at Little Yorktown in Virginia with Major S _____ in the state of South Carolina belonging to the regiment commanded by Genl. Hampton and that after _____ of the United States as aforesaid about _____ months and attached to the company of Captain David D _____ Company of _____ and after remaining with him about Three months chiefly employed in _____ and supplying the army with provisions he was taken sick and was discharged by the said Captain David Dickson which discharge _____. That he was then young and does not now remember many of the _____ occurred during his enlistment but that at the time of his enlistment he resided in South Carolina upon King Creek about eight miles from the place where the celebrated battle of Kings Mountain was fought. That he was at the taking of the fort occupied by the British and town under the command of Major Mansfield upon Congaree River. Dear Madam:

Reference is made to your letter in which you request the Revolutionary War record of Daniel Price, of Russell County, Virginia. You are furnished below the record of the only soldier named Daniel Price found in the Revolutionary War records of this office. The data therein were obtained from the papers on file in pension claim S. 14227, based upon his service in the Revolution. The date and place of soldier's birth and names of his parents are not given.

While residing on Kings Creek in South Carolina, he enlisted, served under Major Wade Hampton in the South Carolina troops, and after nine months was attached to Captain David Dickson's company in the Commissary Department, was at the taking of the fort on Congaree River and was discharged July 5, 1781, after having served three months.

He was allowed pension on his application executed September 4, 1832, at which time he was aged about seventy-one years and a resident of Russell County, Virginia.

Daniel Price died May 17, 1854, place not stated, and was survived by heirs but the only name given was that of Daniel Price, who in 1855 was residing in Russell County, Virginia, his relationship was not stated and no reference was made to soldier's wife.

In 1836, Richard Price, Senior, and Jane Price made affidavit in Warren County, Tennessee, in behalf of the soldier, Daniel Price, and appeared before one Elisha N. Price, Justice of the Peace for said Warren County; their relationship to the soldier was not stated...

Daniel WATERBERY and served in New York Four Months and was then discharged.

In August 1776, I enlisted in said Fairfield into Capt. Eliphaht SHARP Company under Col. Jonathan Dem ____, Gen. LETTERMAN and marched to New York, was in the battle when New York was _____ by our troops and served three months and was discharged near Kings bridge.

On the first of March 1777, I enlisted in said Fairfield into Capt. Daniel LACY Company, was in the Battle when Danbury was ____ and saw(?) Genl. WOOSTER when he was killed and saw Gen. _____ when his horse was shot under him and served one year as guarding & picketing the sea coast, and was discharged at said Fairfield.

In the fall of the year 1778, I enlisted in said Fairfield into Capt. Jabez HILL's Company and marched to Kings bridge, State New York, and was then discharged having served four months.

In the Spring of the year 1779, I enlisted in said Fairfield into Capt. Thomas NASH Company, was in the battle when Fairfield and Norwalk was _____, was discharged in said Fairfield, having served Six Months in guarding and picketing the Sea Coast. Never had any written discharge nor many documentary evidence of my service.

Was born in said Town of Fairfield, April 6, 1753 and lived in said Fairfield until the year 1785, and then removed into said Norwalk where I have lived ever since and now live there and my age is Recorded on said Norwalk Town Records.

rents. My great grandfather's name was REECE PRICE. He lived in or near Alma, Arkan-
sas at the time of the Civil War. He never got home from the Civil War, although he
had been home on a furlough shortly before the end of the War, so I understand. He
was a Private in the Confederate Army from Crawford & Franklin County, Arkansas; and
the Captain's name was Thomas W. MARLAR, so I have learned.

From what I have heard, my great grandfather, Reece PRICE, was on his way home
after the War ended, and became ill somewhere in Texas with dysentery. He advised
his neighbor to go on home and tell his (Reece's) family that he would be home as soon
as he was able to travel; but, he never returned home. Evidently, he died in Texas
and was buried???

His wife, my great grandmother, must have died about the time the Civil War end-
ed. My grandmother and her brothers and sisters were left orphans and were raised by
various neighbors, it seems. My grandmother, Mattie M. PRICE, must have been about 2
years of age at the end of the War.

According to the 1860 Census, REECE PRICE was 36 yrs. of age; his wife, Narcesse, was 20 yrs. of age; and one child, Minnie E., was 11 yrs. of age (evidently a child by a previous marriage). The 1860 Census also shows a son, James I. PRICE, 1 yr. old. Reece was born in Arkansas and Narcesse was born in Tennessee (1860 Census). According to the 1870 Census, there were 3 more children born to Reece & Narcesse PRICE. Mollie C. born 1863; Mattie M. (my grandmother) born 1864; & Reece, Jr. born 1865. Perhaps Narcesse died in childbirth when Reece, Jr. was born, but I really don't know! I would like to have any information about my great grandparents. Any help will be appreciated.

I have never been able to do anything with this because I was never able to find the name JANE PRICE on anything in the North Carolina Archives. CATHERINE married DAVID FAIN either in Georgia or Tennessee about 1800. The Fain Family Genealogy is well documented from this couple forward, but I can't seem to get anything on the PRICE connection. The only reference to the name is in a letter that was written in 1873 by the son of David & Catherine for an inquiry from W. D. FAIN who was working on Fain genealogy at that time.
