I was so excited to find your website! I had already decided to push through my natural reticence and send you an e-mail, and here you are reaching out to me! My church (The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints) encourages its members to "find" their ancestors, and much research had already been done on my parents' ancestral lines, but none of it by me. It was time for me to do my part, but I was reluctant because I knew how time-intensive it would be (I am in awe of your $40+$ years of dedication to the work). A light went on! Surely Family History was a worthy thing to do of a Sunday! I knew my dad was stuck on one particular line, so I logged onto FamilySearch.org on Sunday, with grand ideas of succeeding where others had failed. There she was -- Adah M Unchurch. Her name "spoke" to me. Linked sources included 1850, 1860 and 1880 censuses, and the death certificate for Winfield Scott (also my dad has a facsimile of John Scott's Last Will and Testament mentioning his wife Adah). But because I am a complete novice and hadn't done my homework, I didn't know how to use the website to its full potential and soon got frustrated -- so I exited the website and went to the internet to see what I could find. After googling several search terms, I noticed repeated references to the "Unchurch Bulletin" and finally figured (duh!) I should check it out. When I read that most if not all Upchurches in America are most likely descendants of 1638 immigrant Michael Unchurch I thought, How cool is that! My missing Ada is surely soon to be found! But, alas! I could only find two references, viz.: Upchurch Bulletin Vol. 5 No. 2, April 1984 page 71, Item K. "Margaret U., b. ca 1844, md. 22 JUL 1859 William C. Scott, (son of Ada U.), b. 1830"; and Unchurch Bulletin Vol. 11 No. 3, July 1990 p. 111, under Missing Links (ML20) Item A. "Ada U., b. 1806 (Wake Co., NC), d., md. John Scott, Jr., b 1796, d. (By age should be a daw or gd of Nathan U.I or Moses U. but no unfilled slot appears available. Other possibilities: 1. She is a widow of an Unchurch male. 2. She came from the John U. III Clan. 3. She came from a fourth clan.)"
So ... has anything new turned up in the intervening years? My connection to the Unchurch line: My parents are Homer Thomas Scott and Marceline Hunter Scott, my paternal grandfather is Lewis [Louis] Lorenzo Scott, his father is James Alexander Scott, his parents are John Scott and Adah M Upchurch.
(Sorry, there are altogether too many exclamation marks in this e-mail, but I was pretty excited.)

Also, about my father (Homer), he was living in Jourdanton, Atascosa, Texas in 1940. Homer's dad died when he was 14(?) so Homer was living with his brother, Berkley Rutherford, and is listed on the 1940 census as part of Berkley's household, as "brother-in-law." So l'm not sure where you found the information on Homer Sarge ...?
I have listed the link to the 1940 census below. I have also attached a file that I hope you can open that is a screenshot of my family tree back to John and Adah. (Not sure where the " M " in Ada's name comes from.)
Incidentally, you will notice that there are members of the Byrd family in my tree too, which I noticed when I was noodling around that there appear to be a lot of Byrds (Birds) and Upchurches living in the same county at that period of time. I halfway remember seeing other marriages between these two families as I was surfing the internet, but I can't remember where.

JOHN SCOTT, SR. Born abt. 1768 Died betw. 1850-60
Wake County, North Carolina,
Our earliest known Scott in America is found in the Western Township of Wake County, North Carolina.
John Scott, Sr. appears on the 1850 census with his wife, Rachel and children, Catherine, 43, and Joseph, 16. John was 82 and Rachel was 85. He was a farmer with real estate valued at $\$ 350.1820$ Tax rolls for Wake County shows John, Sr. paid takex for John Scott, Jr. The 1800 census for Wake County show John Scott with a male child under ten years of age. This would make John, Jr. the oldest child. Marriage records of Wake County show John Scott married Rachel Baucom on 24 January 1791. The 1830 and 40 tax rolls showed he paid taxes on 215 acres valued at $\$ 325$ and owned 2 slaves. He did not appear on the 1860 census, so he probably died during that ten years.

JOHN SCOTT, JR. Born abt. 1796 in Wake County, North Carolina
John, Jr. was a farmer as was his father. The 1850 cnesus shows him as married to Adah with children, Sidney 23, ( a school teacher), Charles 18, William 16, Ellen 13, James 6, and Winfield 4. The family owned real estate valued at $\$ 540$. He had increased those holdings by the 1860 census to $\$ 1250$ and personal property valued at $\$ 5690$. The 1840 and 50 tax rolls show he owned 270 acres valued at $\$ 540$. Hi still lived in Wake County in the White Oak township at age 74 with wife Adah also (74?) His daughter, Ellen, was 40 and still at home. His son, Winfield was now working the farm.

JAMES ALEXANDER SCOTT BORN IN Wake County, North Carolina and died abl. 1924.

Somewhere between 1860 and 1870, James moved to Corinth, Alcorn County, Mississippi. There he met and married Mary Ann Byrd, daughter of John Howard Byrd and Nancy Lewallen. Robert, Mattie, John R., Vera Alma, Dora Jeanette and Lewis Lorenzo were all born in Alcorn county. James moved to Texas around Waco about 1885, where their last child, Grover Cleveland was born. He and Mary Ann later moved to Memphis, Hall, County. It is told that he sold lunches on Courthouse square in Memphis. James died about 1924 and Mary Ann in 1939: They are both buried in Memphis. Th

Wake County, North Carolina,
Our earliest known Scott in America is found in the Western Township of Wake County, North Carolina.
John Scott, Sr. appears on the 1850 census with his wife, Rachel and children, Catherine, 43, and Joseph, 16. John was 82 and Rachel was 85 . He was a farmer with real estate valued at $\$ 350.1820$ Tax rolls for Wake County shows John, Sr. paid taker for John Scott, Jr. The 1800 census for Wake County show John Scott with a male child under ten years of age. This would make John, Jr. held Marriage records of Wake County show John Scott married Rachel Baucom on 24 January 1791. The 1830 and 40 tax rolls showed he paid taxes on 215 acres valued at $\$ 325$ and owned 2 slaves. He did not appear on the 1860 census, so he probably died during that ten years.

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JAMES ALEXANDER SCOTT BORN IN Wake County, North Carolina and died abl. 1924.

    Remember me? Three years later ... here I am, knocking on your door again, hoping you'll allow me to take up where I left off. In the packet you sent to me in March of 2015 with the biofile on my ancestor Ada Unchurch Scott, you asked several questions, some of which I shall attempt to answer.
    "2) Re HOMER SARGE / HOMER SCOTT -- comes from 1940 census. Is this your [father] Homer Scott?"
    Answer: No. Homer Scott was living in Jourdanton, Atascosa, Texas in 1940. Homer's dad died when he was about 14, so Homer was living with his brother-in-law, Berkeley Rutherford, and is listed on the 1940 census as part of Berkley's household. as "brother-in-law."
    "4) Attached COTTRELLS tree shows added children Winfield b 1846 and Mary b 1848. Are those valid?" Answer: Yes.
    "5) Item 1 on my Ada U biofile shows James (Alexander) Scott and Minerva Lassiter, but you show he and Mary Ann Byrd. Did he marry twice?"
    Answer: James Alexander Scott was married to Mary Ann Byrd. James's younger brother, Winfield Scott, was married to Minerva Lassiter. Actually, page 1 of your biofile shows James married to Minerva, but page 2 shows Winfield married to Minerva, so probably just a transcription error.
    I have attached to this email your requested copy of the will of John Scott Jr. in which he mentions his wife Adah, as well as a couple of other relevant documents, which I am also mailing physical copies of to you at: Phil Unchurch, 51 Village View Drive Apt 3207, Chesterfield MO 63017.
    Attachment Ada Upchurch-A is some brief unofficial family history notes written by my father. Attachments Ada Upchurch-B1 through B3 is a photocopy of John Scott Jr.'s "Last Will and Testament." Attachments Ada Upchurch-C1 through C3 is a transcription of that document (transcribed by my cousin Tom Moore, with a couple of handwritten clarifications by myself). By the way, you and I also had another email conversation going, in which there might be some relevant bits of information.
