Dear Cousin Dianne,

Recently I have spent several days on your letter of 4 JUN 1990 and on your more detailed packet which arrived on 12 JUN 1990 and on AL records in general and in particular, we have the best set of records for AL than for any other state for the antebellum period thanks to a lot of people but especially to you. We will be working to improve this base data for a long time to come but I think we are in excellent shape to go ahead with publishing a "birth record" article in the U^B on the 1830-1850 census as we did in U^B Vol 10 No 4 for GA.

I have prepared a 5 page typed version of the 1830-1850 census which would be the first four pages of our article. A copy is enclosed. This is exactly parallel or similar to the first part of our GA article except that we are more complete on these AL records. After we have these four pages to our satisfaction we can proceed to some text. At that time the words you have submitted will be useful.

For 1830 we have 20 entries all of whom are known
For 1840 we have 17 entries all of whom are known except for the maiden name of #2 (Bethsania —)

For 1850 we have 66 entries all of whom are known except for the maiden names of #24 (Bethsania —) and #53 (Mary —)

We have various reference documents in support of the above which I have rearranged and annotated. Copies of these documents are provided herewith for your use and include AL Cemetery Records, AL Military Records, AL Marriages. Also provided is an annotated arrangement for the 1860 AL census. I propose that we not include this census record in our article for the U to but hold it for later publication. If you can upgrade any of these documents the input would be most welcome

Given the nature of how Upchurch Families moved into and out of and through AL the concept you have prepared of telling where these families were before and after they were noted in AL is an excellent one. To assist in preparing words on this for inclusion in our article I have prepared a one page chart, copy enclosed. I do not propose that we publish this chart but rather use it as a basis for preparing text. Of the 17 Families involved note that several were not found on the 1840 census but were most likely there (#1, 9, 10, 11, 14). Either they were missed

altogether by the census taker or perhaps they
are the census records and we have not
yet found them. For 1850 our data is solid
and even for 1860 it is quite good with
questions only on # 9, 11 and 14. For the pre-1830
we are missing a few details. If we knew
where # 4 was in 1820 we would presumably
have in her household # 7 & 8. In 1820 I think
5, 11 and 14 were in MS. Osborn (# 13) is
a puzzle to me for 1830 & 1840. He was
in 1836 in Upson Co. GA but so far we have
not found him in GA or AL on either
the 1830 or 1840 census.

It is interesting that 4 of the 23 Upchurchs listed
are represented in these 1830-1850 AL records.

I am sure a careful study of the various
reference documents will reveal that additional
Upchurch Family members were in AL in the
1830-1850 era. I have not yet done anything
about this but I think we should include
a reference to these individuals in our text
- probably in a special section.

Again, one reason it took me so long
to get this far is that the data you supplied
kept leading me to solve various problems
on the master outline - a good thing but
time consuming. I am most pleased with our
progress on the AL records and hope to hear
from you again in due course.

Dear Phillip:

Here is what I wrote. I am sorry it has taken so long. There is a lot of information and I am still not happy about the 1860 census. The index has left off a lot of people. I just have not had the time to run all the county census for the known counties and the surrounding ones. By 1860, the county lines were changing and new counties were created from parts of old one.

There is no index for 1870. I will try to get more of it done. The ones for 1870 I have sent to you has some but not all. It takes a lot of time to run hundreds of pages of microfilm. Since I work, I just do not have the time it really takes to do all this detailed work. I love doing it but there are times when I just do not want to see or hear the name Upchurch. I then take rest and then I get back to it. I am also doing other family lines.

This afternoon, I am supposed to go wild flower picking with my friend. She wants me to drive and then stop when she says to stop. I think I am going to talk her into going up to Randolph and Clay counties. I want to go to Louiana (see CSA records) There is a real old cemetery and I keep saying I am going in the winter time because it has grown up so much and I will see if there are any Upchurch graves in it. I also want to copy the information about Louiana. It was a very thriving little town until an Indian put a curse on it. I don't believe in those things but it may make interesting reading in a future article.

You may not like the way I did this. Just change it and add to it.

UPCHURCHES IN ALABAMA

"ALABAMA THE BEAUTIFUL" first became a state in 1819 and not long afterwards, members of the Upchurch Family discovered this land of charm and opportunity. At first, Upchurches moved into West Central and East Central Alabama. Almost directly across the state from each other. The ones that settled in West Central Alabama came too the state about twenty-five years before the East Central Alabama families.

The Federal census records give much information about families. There are indexes for each period except for the 1870 census. These indexes are very useful but they also leave off names. Sometimes, a family did not make the census itself. Time and resources make it almost impossible to search each county in each state for all the families that do not make the index. If you know that your particular line was in Alabama and is not in cluded in this article, it is not because they were omitted on purpose but because the family did not make the indexes. The indexes also contain errors.

The first Federal census that Alabama participated in as a state was the 1820 census. There are no Upchurches listed in Alabama at that time but there is a Burell Upchurch living in Perry County Mississippi. This may have been the same Burell Upchurch that was the first Upchurch living in Georgia but not on the 1820 Census for Georgia.

Either Burell's or his wife's mother may have been the female age 45 up.

By the 1830 census, there are three families of Upchurches living in Alabama. Burrell Upchurch is living in Wilcox County, Benjamin Upchurch is living in Pickens County and Bartley Upchurch is living in Greene County. The Burrell Upchurch in Wilcox is probably the same Burell Upchurch in Perry County Mississippi in 1820.

Wilcox County is located just south of Dallas County where Selma is located. Camden is the county seat for Wilcox County. The Alabama River flows through Wilcox county.

The ages of the children co-inside with the ages of the Burrell Upchurch in Perry County Mississippi in 1820.

The marriage record for Clark County Alabama (Clark borders Wilcox to the Southwest) shows Elizabeth Upchurch married L. B. Champion on August 4, 1831. Harriette Upchurch married Ennis Loftin on February 14, 1833. Harriet Upchurch is the daughter of Burrell Upchurch and Elizabeth is probably his daughter. Burrell Upchurch was born March 2, 1782 and married Ellender Riley. Ellender Riley was born June 20, 1794. Burrell Upchurch died December 31, 1847 at age 66 and Ellender died February 12, 1831 age 37.

Burrell Upchurch is not listed on the Alabama 1840 Census.

Pickens County is in West Central Alabama bordering Mississippi. It is due west of Tuscaloosa the home of the University of Alabama (Roll Tide!). Carrollton is the county seat. Pickens is also due East of Columbus, Mississippi. Benjamin Upchurch was living in Pickens County in 1830.

Benjamin does not appear again on the Alabama Censuses but he does appear in Mississippi.

Greene County is located in West Central Alabama. It is to the Southeast of Pickens. Clinton is the county seat. The Black Warrior River flows to the East of the county and the Sipsey River flows to the West. Bartley Upchurch and the Upchurches living there for the past one hundred and sixty years have discovered and liked the charms of this land between the rivers.

Penelope Williams daughter of Joel and Penelope Williams married Bartlett Upchurch January 23, 1823.

Either Bartlet's mother or his wife's mother must be living in the same household. Bartlet was born in Wake County N. C. December 19, 1800. He died October 21, 1876 in Greene County Alabama. He is buried at Betheseda Cemetery, Pickens County Alabama. Somehow, Bartlet did not make the 1840 Census index for 1840 and I have not

found him by checking the actual county census for Pickens county. He is on the 1850 Census. Either he was missed by the Census or he had moved to another state. I would believe that he was missed.

The 1840 Census does not have the original three Upchurches but it does list three others. Moses Upchurch is living in Clark County, Able Upchurch is living in Greene County and Synthya (sic) is living in Perry County. Moses may have been the son of Bartley Upchurch.

Clark County is located in the Southwest part of the State about an hour's drive from Mobile. It too, is located between two rivers. The Alabama to the East and the Tombigbee to the West. Moses Upchurch was living in Clark county in 1840.

Perry County is to the North of Dallas County and Dallas County is to the North of Wilcox County. Part of the Talladega National Forrest is in the northern part of the county. Driving West on U. S. Highway 80 from Montgomery to Meridian Mississippi, you will pass through just a part of Perry County that forms a panhandle to the West of Dallas County. Also, driving West on U.S. 80 you will pass through Selma and Demopolis. This is mostly farming land and is known as the "The Black Belt," not for Black People but because of fertile farming land. Perry County has the Cahaba River. Synthya (sic) Upchurch was living in Perry County in 1840.

The 1850 census is more meaningful too family researchers as it is the first census to list the names of the people living in each household. Of course, some of the census takers just wrote initials and that can be very disappointing to a researcher.

The 1850 Census shows Upchurches moving into the Eastern part of Alabama. Osborn Upchurch chose to make Chambers County his home.

Chambers County is located in the East Central part of the State. It borders the Chattahoochee River and Georgia to the East. It is South of Randolph County and East of Tallapoosa County. Chambers County is to the North of Lee County. Lee County is the home of Auburn and Auburn University (THE University of Alabama War Eagle!!). Lafayette (pronounce not the French way but La-Fay-ette with the emphasis on the second syllable) is the county seat. The land of Chambers County is rolling hills with many small farms dotting the landscape today. Cattle is raised mostly now instead of cotton that was the main crop in 1850. This gives some idea of the type of land that Osborn attracted Osborn Upchurch.

I have checked your notes and offer these suggestions:

1. The first Upchurch in Georgia was ~~probably~~ probably Burrel Upchurch as he was on the Tax Digest for 1805 in Greene County Georgia. The 1790, 1800, 1810 census for Georgia has been either lost or ~~not~~ destroyed and Burrel is not on the 1820 census. Burrel either moved or died or had another name by 1820.
2. The 1830 census for Charles Upchurch had me puzzled also. Do you think he could have married after the death of his first wife and this female could be wife # 2 and the male his step-son?
3. Kemp Upchurch - 1840. You show a daughter person # 17 as P.H.U. (de. March 1850). I rechecked the 1840 census and find no such female. Where did you get this person? Kemp Upchurch had the

You have added a person that does not exist.

I will help you all I can with your articles on Georgia and Alabama. I will try to get the Census records as soon as I can. I will try to go to Auburn's Library this coming Sunday, January 29, and start on them.

Alabama did not become a state until 1819 so the first census will be 1820.

There is no 1890 Census for any state. There was a fire that destroyed it. I would love to have seen it.

The first Saturday that I can I will go down to the Alabama Archives in Montgomery and get as much on the counties that I can.

I think the best place to begin is with Georgia. If we can complete the Georgia articles first, it would be better because the majority of the Upchurches in Alabama came from Georgia.

We could do it by Clan members and then show the immigration into Alabama from Georgia. After completing Georgia then we could begin with the same Clans in Alabama and show growth through the generations. I will try to get some of the Confederate Records and that way if anyone wants to know about their ancestors that fought in the war in order to join the Daughters or Sons of the Confederate then there would be a record. To join the DSA, you don't have to have a direct ancestor like you do in the DAR. If you had an uncle or cousin, you can still join.

I know this will take a lot of research and I do hope you don't expect to have it finished any time soon.

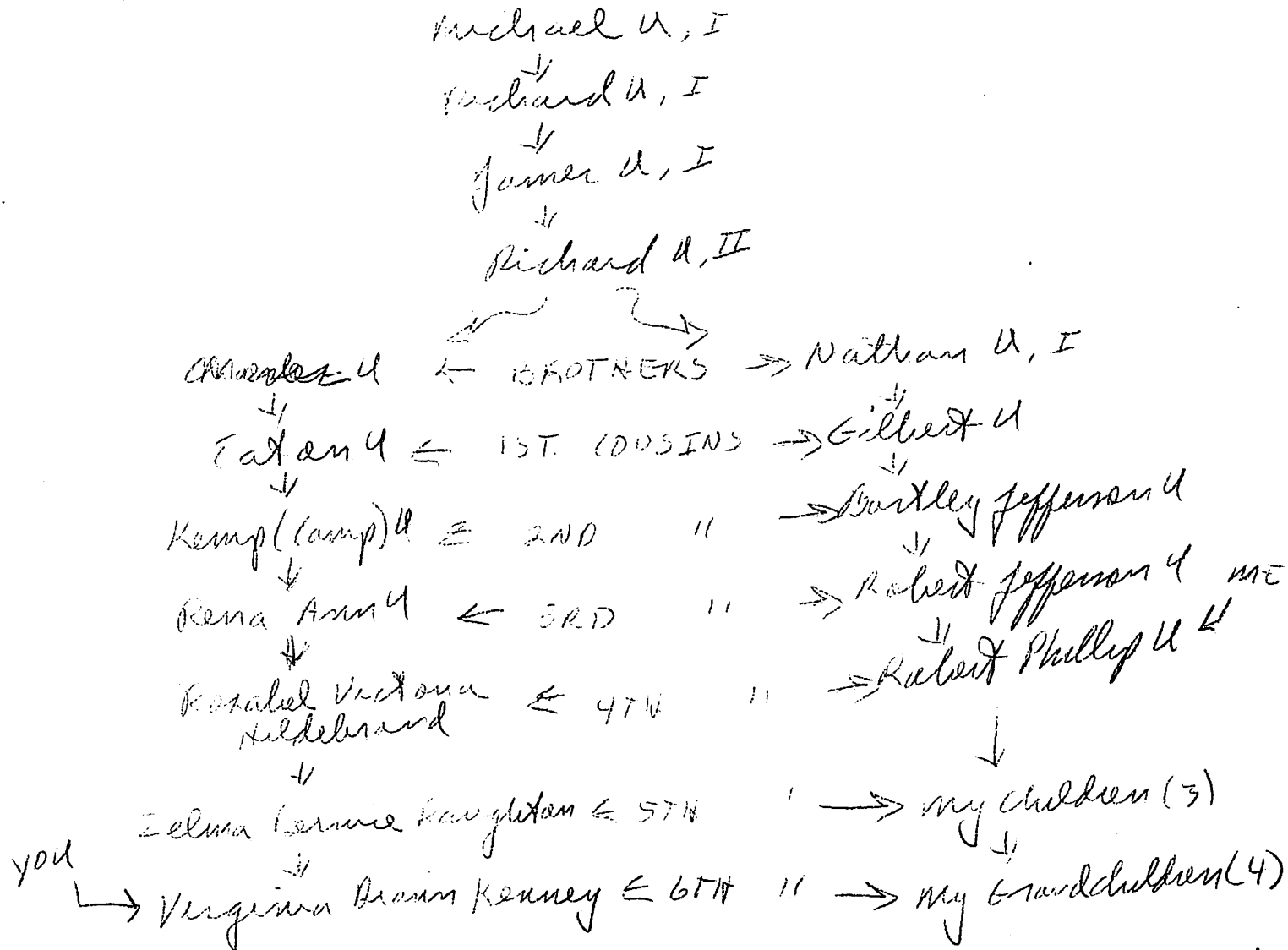
If you are in the position now or in the future to obtain any of these needed records, I would be most grateful. Every census record we get allows us to identify more family members. Often a new

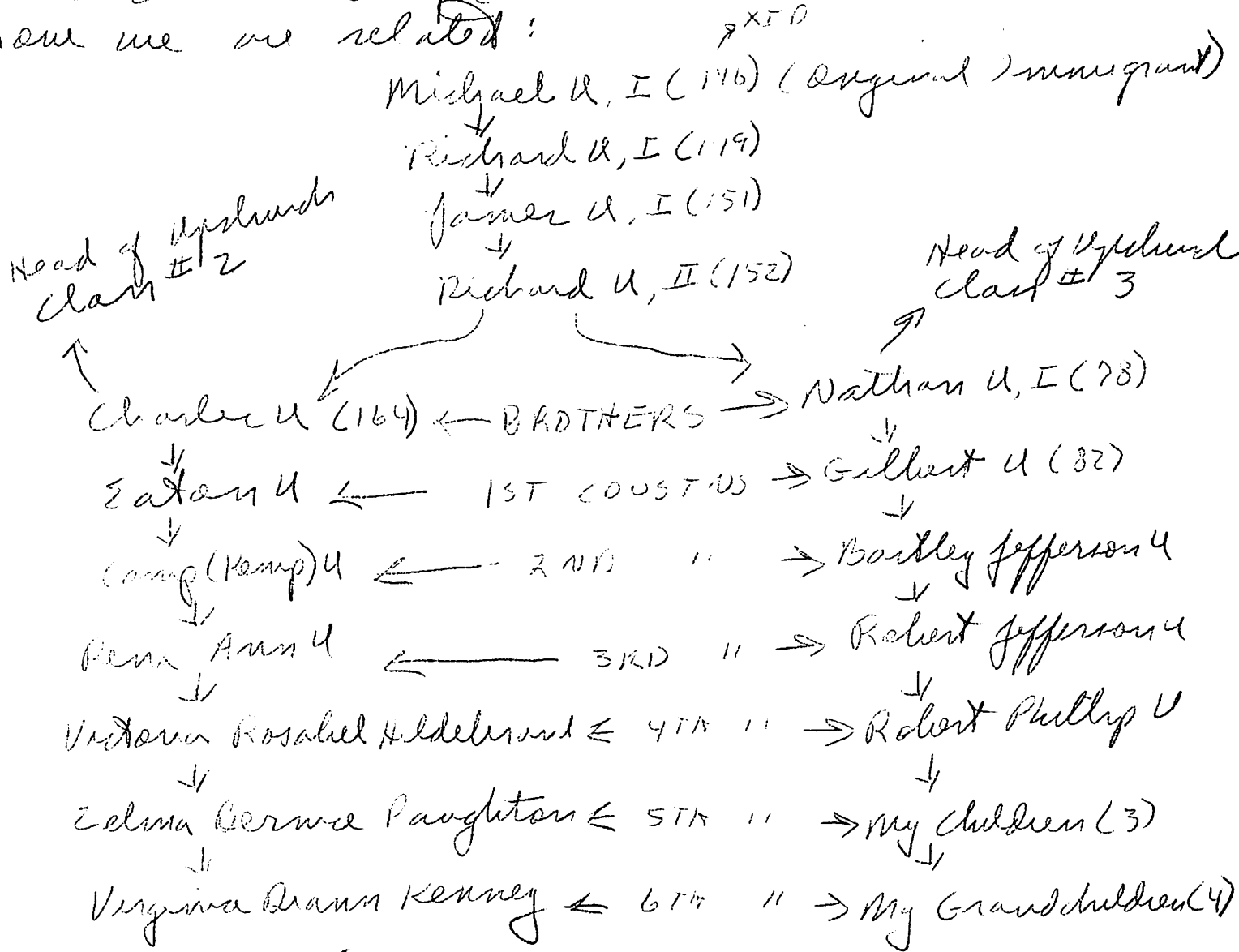
Dear Cousin Dianne

I took off 2 SEP so as to have four full days to "catch up" on genealogy. I have spent two full days + just another one all your past letter and reworking my files on the Charles U clan and improving my records on the subclans - Charles U/Thomas Gay U, Sr; Charles U/Charity U; Charles U/Kentard U and Charles U/Eaten U. The records you have provided give me a tremendous boost in sorting out the GA & AL Upshur's. I especially appreciate the 1900 & 1910 census records for AL. If you ever get the chance a set on GA would be extremely useful.

I think I have commented on all the points raised in your letter. If not please let me know. Can you tell me how Rena Yarbrough fits into the picture? As she descended from an Upshur? It would really be nice to locate the Bible you refer to. As regards Indian blood in the family - we have some well documented in the Oklahoma Upshur's (Harmon U clan) - but rather, from the

Enter I believe in NC, VA, GA, AL, MS. It would be nice to have specifics if they exist.

I for our theory on Eden being the son of Charles U holds up (and I think it will) here is how we are related:



So, your Grandmother and I are 4th cousins, you and my Grandchildren are 6th cousins, while you and I are 4th cousins third removed. You are an 11th generation descendant of Michael U, I.

Note that Charles U (164) and Nathan U, I (78) head Upchurch clans as do all other 5th generation descendants of Michael U, I.

The biggest problem I have at the moment on the Charles W/ Eaton W subclass was to do with the A. H. W Family on the 1840 Henry Co, GA census [1 male 30-40, 3 females - 1 < 5, 1 5-10 & ~~1~~]. I hope you can help with this puzzle. Bear in mind that there is also a Henderson W on the 1840 Henry Co, GA census so "A. H. W" and "Henderson W" are not the same.

Tentatively, I accept that the W W Family on the 1850 Henry Co, GA census is headed by Henderson W and that he is the same as the Henderson W on the 1840 census of Henry Co, GA and that he is the son of Eaton W. Further I accept that the Camp W (Camp W) on the 1850 Henry Co, GA census is the same as the Kemp (Camp) W on the 1840 census of Henry Co, GA and that this person is also a son of Eaton W.

For purposes of discussion I propose that A. H. W on the 1840 census of Henry Co, GA is also a son of Eaton W. Note that the 1820 census of Henry Co, GA for the Eaton W household provides space for 3 males that fit ages later revealed for Camp (Kemp) W, Henderson W & A. H. W. (Will we ever know the name of the third son noted in Eaton's home in 1820?). A slight problem with A. H. W arises in that he does not appear on the 1830 GA census as a Head of a Household and there is no space for him in the Eaton W household in 1830. The three slots for males in the Eaton W household in 1830 would be taken up by Eaton, Camp (Kemp) and Henderson. These two sons married after the 1830 census was taken. A. H. W was somewhat older and could have been on his own and

named or not - but in any case where is he?
In 1840 everywhere, in OK in Eaton, (Camp Kemp),
Henderson and A.H. are all heads of households
in Henry Co, GA. The puzzle reappears on the
1850 census in that A.H.U. and his family are
nowhere to be found. Of course A.H.U. could have
died but in that case I would have expected
his widow to be present at age 30-40 (maybe she
remarried) and his dau (from the 1840 census) would
have been ages 10-15 and 15-20.

To add to the possible confusion there is
the Henderson U who was the first Upchurch
settler in TX and who resided in GA sometime
in the period 1820-1840. See the recent U B who
covered this. There is an outside chance that the
Henderson U of TX could be the A.H.U. or the Henderson
U we find on the 1840 census of Henry Co, GA (But I
think not)

Let me know what you think about all this

I have added a little to the 1833 court docket
in which Eaton U was involved and am returning
a copy herewith. As best I can figure Eaton U,
Clairmont and F.A. Mason [James F. Mason?] have some
responsibility for the estate of a late relative presumed
to have died in 1833 and whose name I make
out to be HABARD U (rather than HAKLAND U). The clerical
name I have to there is for H.M.U. bca 1833(GA) so
of Camp(Kemp) U & jr of Eaton U. For the H.M.U. I

know the H or represents "HARBER" or "HARVARD" and will now add "HARBARD". My guess is that H. M. d. b. 1833 was named after a relative and that when we settle on a spelling of HARBARD or whatever the name will be the same for the one born 1833 and the one who died in 1833. It is tempting to speculate that this spelling of HARBARD (or whatever) will also apply to the "H" in A. H. U. who is on the 1840 census. In that case we are talking about three relatives with the name H = HARBARD. It seems we need another fact or two even to speculate.

Since finishing your material yesterday I have spent 24 hours on a different part of the family, while taking a shower this AM an idea struck me about the A.H.U. on the 1840 census in GA. Let's call this Theory X. Claborn U (XID-70), Head of the Richard U, III/Claborn U sublan, and his family were censused on the GA records before 1850. He had a son Lucinda U (XID-1227) b. 1816 (Franklin Co, NC) who was 29 JAN 1834 (1832?) in Hancock Co, GA Abner Frank U b. ca 1806 (XID-1236). I have never figured out the father of this Abner Frank U and could only assign an XID number because he was an U of known lineage. Now my Theory X is that Abner Frank U is one and the same as the A.H.U. on the 1840 GA census. It all makes sense. A.H.U. did not appear on the 1850 census or later but Abner Frank U did appear and with two daughters in 1850 of the right age to have been the two daughters that were shown as ages 0-5 & 5-10 in the household of A.H.U. in 1840. This means that Abner Frank U is the son of Eaten U. We are still without an explanation as to the location of Abner Frank U in 1830. WHAT DO YOU THINK?? Phil Upchurch

Yesterday I was delighted to receive your letter of 13 MAY 1988 expressing your interest in the Upshur family. To the best of my knowledge the next book is no longer available. I do have a personal copy and I knew the late mother well and visited in her home on several times.

As you will see from the enclosed material I am keenly interested in the entire Upshur family and all their descendants. My GGF was a brother of the Charles U to whom you refer. To the best of my knowledge there is no proof that Thomas Gay U, Sr was the son of Charles U. However, quite a few people have studied and researched the issue and there is enough circumstantial evidence to proceed on the basis that they are father and son. My records all reflect this conclusion although we must be

Alert always for new information.

I am anxious to continue our correspondence on the Uphams family. My outline for TUE Charles U / Thomas Guy U, Sr. is substantial in extension although most of the details as on the male offspring of T G U Sr. The females get lost easily and that is why your interest is so important.

My records show that the R A U or the 1850 census was Rhoda A U b. about 1835 (GA) and that she wd — Barber. This is all I have. Could you tell me why you think 1855 is the correct birthdate and what is the correct one. (1855 fits nicely into the sequence of births for the several children of T. G. U. Sr.) Also do you have good records showing the name as Rena A U rather than Rhoda A U? Do you have any comments on my Ed a — Barber? I suspect your records are more correct than mine and I am anxious to have anything you can supply.

Another dau of T G U, Sr. was Mary Elizabeth b. 24 MAR 1857. She wd 2nd HILLARY BRAND. It could be that their husbands name was garbled in the records and that it should be — HILDEBRAND. Any comments?

Could you give me your full maiden name and your birth date and place and details on the people connecting you back to R. A. U, dau of T. G. U, Sr. I would also welcome any charts or outlines you may have prepared on R. A. U and her descendants.

I do hope we can continue to exchange ideas. It would be very helpful if you could subscribe to the Upchurch Bulletin as so much of what we know about the family is included there. My files on the Upchurch family are very extensive and I do like to share with people. There is still much to be done on the family and it is always a joy to exchange information with a new found cousin.

□ I hope I may call you Phillip as Mr. Upchurch seems so formal for someone that is of the same "family".

This is my connection to the Upchurch Family. How I know my great grandmother was an Upchurch is because my mother told me. It is just something that is common knowledge but I think there is a Bible somewhere with Rena's children and ~~her~~ ages in it. Some of my records come from census records. The reason I believe that my Rena is the R.A on the 1850 census with Thomas Gay is that I have looked and that is the only place that lists a female R. A. and I know that she was born in Georgia and that she was an Upchurch. Carroll county Georgia is just across the state line from Randolph county Alabama. Also, Thomas Gay was living just a few houses from Rena on the 1860 census in Alabama. She named her eldest son Thomas. In other records that appear in Georgia, the name Cemp or Kemp Upchurch appears. There are other cousins of my mother that know the name Upchurch. No one that I know has heard the name of Rena's father but then everyone that knew her is dead. There are some that knew LaFayette that are still living as he lived much longer than Rena. My mother saw her grandfather only once but had a visit that lasted a week and she remembered and told me many things that he told her.

□ You asked how I am connect and I have enclosed some of the many charts that I have. I have not spent much time on the Upchurch and a lot of the information I have gattered was when I came across the line while working on my others. I made contact with my mother's cousin, Rena Yarbour, and she asked for information and I started to get involved more in the Upchurch line. The Upchurch line goes faster than my other lines because the name is not too common. Rena Yarbour was the one who gave me the birth dates of everyone except my grandmother. She got the names and dates from the Bible. I have not seen the Bible. The family that had the Bible seems to have misplaced it when the owner died, at least they say they do not have it any longer. No death dates were recorded only births.

□ The courthouse for Randolph County Alabama burned in 1896 and many of the marriage records that I need were lost. I am sure that is where Rena and LaFayette were married.

□ I have never heard the name Rhoda Upchurch. Where did you get the name?
□ I am not familiar with Barner.

□ The name Hand is very numerous in this part of the State, but I have never heard the name Elizabeth in connection with the Upchurches. I

found a marriage record in Carroll County Georgia where an Elizabeth Upchurch married R. H. Hand December 23, 1849. Is she Gay's daughter?

I am very interested in your Upchurch Bulletin and plan to start to purchase the back issues. I would like to know more about your Michael Enterprises and how it came about and more about you.

I am currently employed by Walker-Williams Lumber Company in Hatchechubbee, Alabama. It is about 35 miles from Opelika. Opelika is a neighbor to Auburn, Alabama where Auburn University is located. Their city limits join. I have taken some classes at Auburn but my undergraduate degree is from Georgia State University in Atlanta, Ga. and my graduate degree is from Troy State University here in Alabama. I majored in Accounting at Georgia State and Personnel Management at Troy and I use both in my current job. I do not have children. I have only one brother and he does not have children. I was born here in Opelika but have lived in Dallas, Texas and Georgia. My husband's name is Donald Raye Greene. He was born in Quitman, Georgia but moved to Opelika when he was a baby. I have been through Tucson but it needs some of our trees. I have a first cousin, Lavalle Birmingham, living in Scottsdale and she is also descended from Rena Upchurch.

Dear Cousin Dianne,

It was great to talk upchurch genealogy with you last night and I look forward to our exchange and hope we can sort out your line. When we do it will be a breakthrough for many people.

Your letter of 21 MA 1888 is greatly appreciated and I hope you will continue to send me details on all of the descendants of Rena Ann U as it will be needed.

Enclosed herewith is a copy of my one page seven item profile on Rhoda A. U (XFD-2076), daughter of Thomas Gay U, Sr. I am reluctant to say that Rhoda A. U = Rena Ann U for several reasons. There is a five year age difference, Rhoda and a — Barnes and Martha Fry U and Augusta Fee U (both now deceased) must have had some reason to assign the name Rhoda to the R. A. U on the 1850 census although I do not know the source of their information. Another way to

Therefore there would be to find on the 1860 census of GA a name headed by a — BARNES with a wife R A Barner or Rhoda Barner age 25.

I enclosed herewith is a copy of my 8 page extraction of the Upland on the 1850 census in GA. so far as I know this includes all the Upland who were in GA at that time except for females whose U name was lost when they married. The assignment of an XFO number on the right means I know how that individual fits into the U family. The slanted entries on the left show the class/subclass if known. (Class Heads are 5th Generation descendants of Michael U, I they lived at about the time of the Revolution) I have entered the full names, if known, in brackets.

The Camp U family on the 1850 Henry Co, GA census is of special interest. My theory is that the K. A. U age 10 F in that name is really your R A. U (Kena Ann U) I know you will pursue this idea. I think the H M U is Harber U whom we find on the 1880 census of Lincoln Parish in LA. I believe that Harber U had a son Charles Camp U, Sr and a gr Charles Camp U, Jr (see enclosed profiles on these two individuals). The C. C. U on the 1850 GA census may be Charles Camp U also but an Uncle of the Charles Camp U, Sr mentioned above.

At this stage I think we should presume that the names KEMP, LEMP and CAMP are the same but that the official version was probably CAMP with KEMP and LEMP being misspellings. Let me know what you think about this.

See my enclosed profile on KEMP U (CAMP U) drawn from the 1840 census of GA. of the 11 H. Heads of Households in GA in 1840 note that I can account for 6. Kemp (Camp) U is one of the 5 that I cannot account for in terms of linkage to earlier upchurch generations. They all came from NC. As of 1790-1810 there were about five counties in NC containing different groups of U's from which GA U people could have come. I assume that the Kemp U on the 1840 GA list is the same as the CAMP U age 42 (hence b 1808) on the 1850 GA list.

My guess is that H U age 46 (Buxley 654) on the 1850 GA census is a brother to Camp U age 42 on the same census.

I am looking forward to your work and hope we can settle on a line for Penn Ann U. Hope you will find the U interesting and that you will order the rest of the copies.

Dear Phillip:

I will try to answer your letter and it will take several days. I will attempt to answer as many of your questions as I can.

Last Friday, September 16, I took a day of vacation and went to McDonough, Ga., the county seat of Henry County. The book I wanted that had the marriage of Kemp and Sarah Upchurch has been lost and the Xerox copy they have is not complete. I will have to go back to the Archives and try to see if I can read the last name of Sarah. I know that the last two letters are ch. At first I thought it was Finch but it may be Welch.

Georgia's marriage records are not as good as Alabama's. From sometime in the 1930's, Alabama started to list the bride and grooms birth date, birth place and parents name. Enclosed are some of the ones that I copied. I must say I was not very interested in the ones that are still in Georgia as my line moved on to Alabama and then on to other places.

Rena Ann Upchurch

1. She must have been born in Henry County Georgia because her parents were married there and were still living there in 1850.

2. No one knows the exact date in 1879 when she died. The cousins that did have the Bible say they can not find it. She died in Clay County in a community called Mellow Valley. She is buried in an unmarked grave at County Line Baptist Church at Mellow Valley.

3. I do not know if she was married in 1859. I just guessed 1859 as her first child was born in 1860. She was not married in Clay County because I have searched the records there. She must have been married in Randolph County and Randolph County's courthouse burn in 1896. I sure was not happy to learn that fact. I need a lot of those records.

4. LaFayette Hildebrand, her husband, was born in Dekalb County, Georgia. His father was William Hildebrand and his mother was Sarah Rapshur. Sarah Rapshur was his second wife. 
