I am so sorry not getting back with you until now, but I AM very interested in assisting anyway I can.

✓ In fact I live only a short distance from the Williams/Upchurch home built abt 1840 across from which is the Williams family cemetery where **John Marshall & Elizabeth Upchurch Williams** are buried.

Lucian Bonaparte Williams, the eldest of the three children is my direct ancestor. Lucian married **Arthelia A.E. R. Scarborough**, daughter of George Washington & Eliza Ellis Scarborough, his first wife. LB was killed October 27, 1864 in the final action at Petersburg, and as best we have determined probably is buried in the Confederate Cemetery in Blandford Church VA in a mass grave of CSA troops. Arthelia then married to Larkin Smith but so far no grave site has been located for her.

LB & Arthelia had two children: **Charles Thomas Williams** (my great grandfather) & **Lavinia Williams** who married **Thomas Jefferson Stephens**. CT married **Fannie Thain** of Johnston County where he was a successful businessman.

△ By 1889, CT & Fannie moved to Dunn in Harnett County where my grandfather **William Lucian Williams** was born. He was their only child, and was twice married - **Maggie Octavia Bullock** (divorced) and in 1920 to my Grandmother **Edna Cathleen Longest**, dtr of John G Longest and Malinda Emmaline Moon of Graham, Alamance County.

My mother **Velma Nadean Williams** one of five children. She married my father **Clyde Wesley Clark**, son of Alexander Austin Clark and Bette Freeman Payne, on March 9, 1944 in Greensboro. I had one sibling **Patricia Jean Clark** born October 6, 1945 and died unmarried on September 13, 2012.

I was born January 30, 1959 in Greensboro & married **Esther Beatrice Myers** on August 29, 1987 in Statesville, Iredell County, NC. We moved to Raleigh in 1992 where our only child Erin was born in 1993.

(The other Children of JM & EU Williams were daughter **Mary Ann Williams** who married **Moses Green Todd**, pastor of Hephzibah Baptist Church in Wendell. They are buried in the old cemetery behind the historical church building, and **Charles Sidney Williams** who married **Anne Debnam** and has numerous children many of whom are buried in Family cemetery.

We will have to see over time just where we should place our emphasis on collaboration. I do hope we will be able to visit when we come next June.

However, what I find most useful are descendancy narratives which I understand neither the owner nor the visitor can create from Ancesry.com. I understand an owner has to transfer their Ancestry.com records to something like Family Tree maker from which the reports can be created and transferred electronically. Does that ring true to you and can you create and share with me electronically outputs that would be of mutual interest?

To give you a progress report --since we were last in contact I have made more extracts from the Debnam book where descendants of Gillium Upchurch were recorded but originally were obscure to me as I did not recognize that they were Upchurch related based on a female descendant of Gillium. THE FAMILY of JOHN MARSHALL WILLIAMS & ELIZABETH UPCHURCH
Mark's Creek Township, Wendell, North Carolina

John Marshall Williams-born c. 1810-12, in Chatham, Wake or maybe even Franklin County. Parents unknown, but believed to have had a brother or nephew named Jefferson Williams (appearing on 1850 census in Wake County's Marks Creek Township) Marshall married c. 1832 to **Elizabeth Upchurch**, born March 1808, Chatham County to Gillium Upchurch & Sarah Smith. Marshall died between July-November 1865 and Elizabeth sometime after the 1900 census, where she is listed at 92 years old. The couple are buried in the Williams Family Cemetery in Knightdale, Wake County, NC.

Elizabeth's sister Harriett Upchurch was born c. June 1812. She never married and lived most of her life with JM & Betsy Williams until her death on January 15, 1882, and is buried beside her sister in the family cemetery.

The Known Descendants of John Marshall Williams & Elizabeth Upchurch

- A. **Lucian Bonaparte Williams**, CSA - born November 13, 1833, born Chatham or Wake County, NC. Married **Arthelia A.R. Scarborough**, daughter of George W. Scarborough and his Eliza Ellis on 28 Nov 1854, Wake County, NC. Killed in Battle of Petersburg on 27 October 1864, site of burial unknown (possibly Confederate Cemetery, Blanford Church in Petersburg, VA). Arthelia married Larkin A Smith on February 4, 1866, in Wake County. Arthelia passed away on November 3, 1888, but her gravesite is not known. Both the Williams and Scarborough family cemeteries have unmarked graves, so either might hold her remains.

1. **Charles Thomas Williams** -born July 20, 1858. On November 3, 1880 he married **Fannie Thain** of Johnston County, daughter of William Thain and Julia Ann Cullum. CT died December 15, 1898, presumably in Dunn, Harnett County, NC. Neither gravesite is known, though Fannie's obit says in the Smithfield Cemetery. Fannie married Benjamin Franklin Bass c. 1907 in Rocky Mount, Edgecombe County, NC. Fannie died in Charlotte, Mecklenburg County, NC on 27 May 1923.
 - a. **William Lucian Williams** - born March 25, 1889, in Dunn, Harnett County, NC. Died March 26, 1936, Greensboro, Guilford County, NC. Married February 12, 1910 to **Maggie Octavia Bullock** - born June 16, 1889 to Jerome Bullock & Mary Ruffin. Divorced in 1920 and she married Needham Cooper Pitt. Maggie died December 28, 1980 in Rocky Mount, Edgecombe County, NC and buried in Pineview Cemetery there.

B. MARY ANN Williams, the daughter of John Marshall Williams & Elizabeth Upchurch, was born July 18, 1838 in Mark's Creek Township, Wake County, NC.. On June 13, 1859, she married Rev. **Moses Green Todd**, pastor of Hephzibah Baptist Church from 1863-65. Rev. Todd was born December 12, 1832 in Wake County, NC to James Todd & Chamblee. M.G. conducted a private school in Eagle Rock during the years following the Civil War. He also served in the NC State House from 1876-77. Mary Ann died February 6, 1906, and M.G. lived until December 4, 1918. Both are buried in the cemetery at Hephzibah Baptist Church, Wendell, at Wake County, NC.

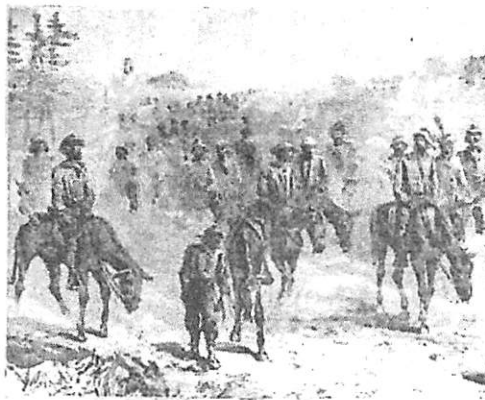

C. **CHARLES SIDNEY WILLIAMS (1841 - 1929)** , son of John Marshall Williams & Elizabeth Upchurch was born on April 6, 1841, in Mark's Creek Township. Wake County, NC. On January 14, 1868, he married **ANNIE E. DEBNAM** born February 14, 1844, daughter of Bartholomew & Narcissa Debnam. Charles died January 17, 1929 at his home near Knightdale, NC; he was followed shortly by Annie who died May 17 the same year.

**North Carolina Standard - Raleigh
December 7, 1864**

"Orderly **Lucien B. Williams**, Company I, Georgia Cavalry, who died on the 27th October, of a wound in the head received in a late fight between Weldon and Petersburg, was born in the 13th November, 1833(?).

Devoted to the South, he enlisted and though devoted to religion, he felt it was not consistent with his profession as a Christian to fight the battles of his country. He was

never known to desert his post or flinch in the hour of danger.

As a kind and generous neighbor, his place can never be filled; as a patriotic citizen his country has sustained an irreparable loss. He leaves a devoted wife and two interesting children and a large circle of friends to mourn their loss..."

Confederate records in the National Archives in Washington, DC indicate that a "L.B. Williams" enlisted for three years' service in the Confederate armed forces in Goldsboro on May 15, 1862. He entered with the rank of private. He was signed up by Captain John T. Kennedy of Co. I, 1st Battalion of the Georgia Partisan Rangers (62nd Georgia Cavalry). The 62nd Georgia Cavalry was composed of seven Georgia companies and three North Carolina companies.

Late in the war, on July 11, 1864, this regiment was broken up and the North Carolina troops joined with five companies of the 7th Confederate Regiment (from N.C.) and Company C of the 12th N.C. Battalion to form the 16th Battalion of the North Carolina Cavalry. L.B. Williams rose to the rank of 1st Sergeant and was assigned to Company I, 16th Battalion, of the North Carolina Cavalry. On July 11, 1864, he was transferred to Company I, 62 Regiment, of the Georgia Cavalry. The records indicate that he was present or accounted for through October 1864. He died between Petersburg and Weldon on October 27, 1864 from a wound to the head.

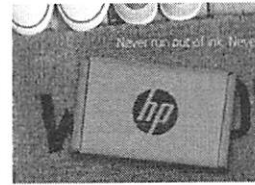

Dear Cousin Wes -

I'm extracting and processing data for the Moser U/Gilburn U Subclan. I have reached the point where I can send you an interim report. Still much more needs to be done. I have been devoting most evenings 6:30-8:00 PM in processing batches of material for this Subclan using data you provided and parts of the Debnam book that I did not know were relevant until you and I connected.

I still have about 200 Profile sheets to process for the descendants of Corinna Williams and Charles Williams Robertson so will send my report to you without this material as it is likely not central to your interests.

The enclosed packet provides sheets before the red sheet that portray the Moser U/ Gallium U. family down through the 9th generation of this family in America. This takes this family down to and including the greatgrandchildren of Gallium. The descendants (if any/known) of the GGC are presented in continuation sections "C5" as shown on the left hand side of the pages. They appear after the red sheet. At this time I have provided C5 sheets only for the grandchildren of Elizabeth. Note that [C] = one correspondent.

On the front sheet of the packet I have provided a sheet to show possible/likely birthdates of children of Sarah (Smith) Upchurch. I often find such a proforma presentation helpful. I have highlighted and that your data added. For the first four children we have a good start on this family. We have much to learn on the others.

I will welcome any additions or correction for this Master Outline. At some point parts of it should be added to the Moser U Family tree generated by Alfred Farmer.

There is the larger story about Gillion U & Sarah Smith, your ancestor, that we need to sort out. As you know Moses U & Nathan U, I (my ancestor) moved their entire family from Dunn Township in Franklin County, NC to the Wake/Chatham border about 1803. Gillion, a 21 year old single male made the move and for a time prospered at the new location.

I have often wondered if members of the Moses & Nathan U families somehow ended back to their Franklin County roots. Now we know that some did. But what in particular caused Gillion & some of his children to move to Wake Creek Township. Perhaps it is because a sister of Gillion named William Smith. I have more details to add to the story and you do as well.

I need to go back over your inputs to pick up some items I missed.

I'll send you an Allied Family Members form in my next email. Hope you will join
