Doug is aware of Lannorn's remains and will send me a copy to remain, copy & return.

Doug does not know the lady I talked to when we participated in the Visitation for Lannorn. She knew the Lannorn Family in Alabama.

I discussed my records obtained on the Hartman & Pace Cemetery near Zebulon on my latest trip to Raleigh. Doug knew many of those buried in these two cemeteries. Doug says his Uncle LUNICE HORTON was a chiropractor in NM and would come to NC to visit & enjoyed visiting with his relatives

- ⑥ 18 JAN 2006 Called DSC & had a nice 20 min chat re the son of Gen Braghton working for the Forage Crop Program. Also re reporting feeds forage crop samples & re the Archival Project.
- ⑦ 15 APR 2006 - Called DSC for a chat. Told him about article on R.L. Lounsbury estate giving 30,000 to Auburn. Discussed issue about former Chancellor FOX now in CA. Also DUKE license scandal. Library issue. His book on vegetation identification. He & Edits are well. Told him we would be in NC last half of June
- ⑧ 29 JUN 2006 (THUR)
RPH & SSU visited Doug & Edythe Chamblee from 9:30 - 11:00 AM in their apartment at Springwood in Raleigh. Both are in good spirits. We discussed the status of our interaction with NCSU special collections and in general had a nice chat.

- (14) 27 OCT 2007 Called Doug & thanked him for the time he spent in his home on my recent trip to NC. I asked for a copy of the 1950 article he & I co-authored. He will have a copy for me the next time I come. He recalls our 2 and 6 hour talks and feels several beans have been written recently about how hard it is to get money for molecular research. Our phone chat was most cordial. Doug stresses how political the allocation of research dollars has become. There are 28 Full time Federal group researchers in CA

Returned to Hotel about 1:30 PM to rest & re-arrange cyts arranging to meet Cromble at 3:40 PM at Springwood. Doug had for me the July 1950 special Pasture Edition of Research & Farming which contained an article "Do Roots Hold the Answers?" by W. S. Cromble and R. P. Lythrum. Doug says his booklet showing weed work at NC State started in parage crops is ready for publication.

Doug showed me his photo album mostly picture of General at time of getting degree from Lenoir. Doug & Warren & Dehon - MS, Ray Hayes Ph.D. Also saw picture of Henry Smith.

- (16) 23 NOV 2008 Called Doug & thanked him for the recent visit. Talked with him about making copies of his pictures when become next fall. He is OK with this.

⑩ 27 OCT 2006 (FRI)

RPU & SSU visited Doug & Edythe Chambliss 2:45-4:45 PM. Doug gave me a copy of P. H. Harney's history of the Crop Science Dept & also a copy of a 2002 Review of Crop Science. Doug described some rough spots in his relationship with W. W. Woodhouse, Jr - over Grazing Management & Sand Dunes.

Doug gave me this copy of a poem that came from Edythe's High School Graduation - which he had read to me on a previous visit.

⑫ 23 APR 2007 (MON) - In Raleigh - visited with Doug & Edythe Chambliss 6:30 - 8:00 PM. Nice general chat

⑬ 12 MAY 2007 (SAT) - Called Doug to thank him for visit & to ask if he remembers Billy Crook as a Technician at NC State or Billy had mentored Doug at RPU. Doug barely remembers Billy.

- (17) Notes of RPR Visit with Doug and wife Edythe in their home in Springmoor in Raleigh, NC on SUN 3 MAY 2009 2:10 - 4:30 PM. I had a list of items to discuss
- Showed Doug frontpiece of Vol II - Wake Co, NC History Book - re a Chamblee. Doug did not know him
 - Doug gave me a copy of an NCSU - COA Magazine with picture of a Naylor Farm for me & give to Marky
 - We discussed how Doug & I did not have a car early on - He was 28 when he bought his first one
 - Remembered status of Lynchburg Collection with Doug
 - Re COA or Cash came to fund University Reports Doug has awareness that this has been happening at NCSU
 - Discussed my awareness of the bloated superstructure for administration of COA. Doug does not seem much aware of this
 - Described my upcoming Apex Talk to Doug
 - Re Alan McGee - Doug tried to contact his bro Larry who lives at Springmoor - but he is at beach
 - Remembered RPR/SSU Celebrations last Thanksgiving. we sent picture of Doug & Edythe
 - Need some history at NCSU - COA - Doug has completed hopes to get published maybe next year
 - Arlene Shann remained NOV 05 & is very happy - & a Bill Woodward
 - Doug's family - OK - demand.
 - Concept of Tenure. Overall Doug thinks well of it
 - Validity/Future of COA & Land Grant Unversities - Doug seems unable to project the unit future analytically/physically although he and I share benefits from same - He does recognize that major changes have taken place
 - Nature of a Tenured Professorship - discussed - but Doug does not have a broader grasp
 - Know Yourself. Doug says me all super somewhat from this. Discussed my shortcomings. Doug feels they could have been avoided

(18) Notes of RPK Call to OSC 6 FEB 2010

Thus is a followup to my letter of 1 FEB 2010 to Doug. we had a nice 15 minute chat. He was positive about my writing on professional societies saying? Not a gift or a reward. He graded my paper. He did not have any special reaction to the paper other than to say he said society is fortunate to have people who are willing to be leaders of societies.

Doug is now 89

We discussed Chamber Bloch. Doug stayed in his home for a year while Doug graduate studies at Iowa State Univ. Bloch was on Doug's PhD committee.

Doug told me of being mugged at Bagonglan a few weeks ago. He sustained a concussion and was in hospital 3 days but recovered completely.

Re my desire to write about how rural people sustained themselves in my SCTWP History we had a chat. about the Chamber Family in Zeludon. Doug said his family had fruit trees, a garden, hogs, chickens, a sweet potato storage hill, made melons from cane, etc, etc. They ate a lot of corn bread. They used feed such as timothy. Tenant were encouraged to have garden but they would start & then fail. Doug's mother controlled the egg money and son Graham would manage to get 40 or 50 cents from her. It was kept under a rug.

Told Doug we will be there in June. He is ready for more chapters. (Debbie sent a big batch)

- (19) 27 APR 2010 - while I was at an Endowment Committee meeting at the Church, Doug called and talked to SSA. He was not inclined to talk at first but she pressed him and learned that Edythe had passed away in the Hospital after about a two week stay. All of the family was with her the last day. He made a point that their son Gary had not seen his mother in a year (Implications?)

when I got home about 9:00 PM on the 27th I figured it was too late to call Doug.

- (20) 28 APR 2010 - Called Doug a couple of times in the AM but got a recording. Finally reached him about 4:00 PM and had a nice 20 minute chat. He was quite rational and willing to talk. We explained she had returned under nursing & had another spell of this. Her legs swell and developed a leak which led to infection. The doctor had trouble sorting this out and called in various specialists. They were trying various procedures she alternated from one day to the next in being silent or alert and interactive. Her mind was good until the end.

(20) 28 APR 2010 - CONTINUED

on her last full day the whole family was with her. She died at 5:00 AM the next morning alone. The doctors had given no advanced warning of impending death.

She will be buried at Raleigh Memorial Cem on Glenwood Ave in Raleigh. Doug said he paid \$1200⁺ for the grave to be dug.

Doug said Edythe spent 25 years (1955-1980) working on Meals on Wheels in the west part of Raleigh. She headed one team but coordinated six. Doug said she continued to be an avid reader to the end. He lost the minutes 2 stories

#1 soon after they were married they were in bed and she said to him "Douglas - I want you to go to heaven with me" He said he was speechless and did not answer or comment then or until now. He wants the minister to tell this in the presence of her coffin and state that Doug concludes that he will take this on as a project.

#2 while in the hospital the past two weeks Edythe and Doug being alone she said Douglas - I love you and I always have. There has never been a time when I have not loved you. This touched Doug deeply. He said she called him Douglas because his mother always did. Now she did.

(20) 28 APR 2010 - CONTINUED

I ~~had~~ Doug the story about Herbert Sledge and the 36 inches at the yard story. Also, told him about my upcoming talk at Inwood and that we would hope to see him for a chat enway upcoming visit.

We talked of how fortunate we had both been in having such wonderful sunrises and how fortunate we had been in our lives generally. I also showed that he was the closest I had to having a brother. We shared similar positive relationships about our long relationships.

Doug related that he got married in 1949 right after getting his PhD from Iowa State Univ. They had been married 61 years.

(21) Notes of RPU/SSU Visit to Doug on 30 MAY 2010 - SUN
Page (12) in Note file

Spent 1:30 - 3:30 PM with Doug. He had little to say about Edythe. He mentioned his son Gary & reported his son Gary has a stroke but has recovered. Doug continues to obsess about paper he has essentially ready for publication but no money for print. Also, tells some of same old stories he has told repeatedly. This is a cut from which he will never emerge. It seems quite unlikely he will ever visit us in MD.

(21) 30 MAY 2010 - CONTINUED

Doug worked for NCSU 1943-1949 ~~with~~ out a firm contract. Finally, a few weeks before he got his PhD in 1949 Cornell made it offer in writing. He got out in JUN 1949 one week after he got his PhD. He got his MS in 1947 with Warren Strom & 3 others.

ESA asked if he had ever thought of leaving NC. He said he was offered an Associate Prof at MS one year before getting his PhD. He also invited AL but turned down their offer to stay in NC.

When asked who had been a stellar Prof Doug remembered himself with Eugene Rumphall as a runner up. As to a no-good Prof - NO said this were some in ANIMAL SCIENCE.

When BLL left in JAN 49 (Should be JAN 1950 - RPH) Woodhouse made a move to be "section leader" in Lonnarri place. Calwell had decided to eliminate Section Trade but told none of the policy. Woodhouse wanted Gregory Management Studies & Doug let him have it.

(22) Notes of RPH call to Doug - 22 JUN 2010 -

Told him we had a good trip to NC & enjoyed our visit with him. He said he was prepared to come to the Inwood event on 13 JUN 2010 but a large storm was looming and did deliver a lot of rain. So he elected to stay at home. (I now recall that while at Inwood we did see a big black cloud. I asked about Josh Shelt. He says Josh is at Springwood and seems to be doing fine. We discussed our respective experiences with stress tests.

- (23) 4 JAN 2011. Doug is 90 today. I called him to wish him happy birthday to supplement the card & letter I sent him earlier. We had a nice 15 min chat. He reports that the picture on the front of TB 328 is of John Harris himself - as stated by John.
- (24) Late March 2011 - Doug called to say his son Gary is in the hospital with no hope of recovery. He had recovered well from his stroke a year ago but a few weeks ago had a heart attack. He was doing well in recovery from this and was at home when he fell and broke his hip. The hospitalization led to a further event (stroke?) which at first seemed treatable but in due course extensive brain damage was detected and being in a coma the verdict was that he could not recover. A decision was made to remove life support and Doug seemed resigned to the certainty that Gary would soon die - thus his call to me. I expressed our condolences.
- (25) 14 APR 2011 - Having not acted on my impulse to write Doug about Gary, I called him. He reports that Gary died on 30 MAR 2011 and services were held in Charlotte on 4 APR 2011 - church in the AM & graveside in the PM at the cemetery. Doug attended. Doug said Gary's lawyer friend helped implement Gary's living will which specified that all should leave the room, close the door & let him expire. Guess, Doug said Gary's family stayed with him in the lord room until the end. Doug will send me an obit which he read in part. He remarked for me Gary's great success as a merger lawyer leading a team being much in demand across the U.S.

(25) Notes of RPU call to Douglas Scales Citamblee - CONTINUED
14 APR 2011

I described to Doug the list of N.C. Agriculturalists associated with the N.C. Dept of Agriculture (+ N.C. State College) as of 1921 to see if he encountered any of them after he enrolled at N.C. State in SEP of 1939. Doug says Roy Lammorn checked on Ag students' grades after the fall 1939 quarter and came to Doug's farm in JAN of 1940 and hired him as a student helper beginning in the summer of 1940. As a Lammorn employee he was sometimes farmed out to Ben Smith who was responsible for testing new forage species such as KY 31 & Alta Fescue and one called Rankin's fescue discovered by W. H. Rankin on a N.C. roadside.

Doug knew of a few of the list - such as S. K. Jackson whom Doug had joined the Potash Institute & would come around and buy coles for all. Doug knew Emma C. Blair & W. D. Lee. The name K. L. Crews as Clerk was unfamiliar to Doug until I explained that was the maiden name of Mrs Kathryn McKinnon whom Doug & I both knew as the Head Secretary for the Agronomy Department for many years.

(26) 25 SEP 2011 - Called Doug and had a nice 30 min chat. His voice not quite as strong as usual but he was alert and his health seems stable.

I asked him about Longleg Pine in the Zeblon Area. He said he knew of none and they would not plant them as they were slow-growing. However, he did recall light wood stumps which they dug up for lightening wood to use to start fires. There were no doubt the remnants of Long-leg pine trees that

did long ago due to trichinella hainent or some
 strange of harnessed trees. Dong recalls no trichinella
 smelt - says the smelt are very delicious.

Dong will soon have published his book on
 use of negative base to identify grasses, legumes, and
 seeds of the Eastern US - for \$350.

He still goes to the office one day a week
 and in mind of the large office he has maintained.
 The Administration gives him staff for computer support
 and other work preferentially as they value his
 free service.

When Dong retired the farmer clamored for
 him to stay on part time. He did two 9-year
 hitches for pay. The last one required a special
 handshake arrangement with the administration.
 re pay which Dong proposed. He served
 as state-wide forage ~~extension~~ agent, taught
 the two year program - all crops, etc as
 the COA was no longer hiring production
 types. He says the downgrading has continued
 - zero state operations for Crest since the last
 two years - no ARS replacements, no plant
 breeding replacements, etc.

Dong looked over the Springmoor resident list to
 see who I might know. Included were Jack &
 Mari Sheets, Bob Cook (of Pauling), Josh Rigney's wife,
 Pat McGee (Tangier woman), A.C. Bargepool (Bad
 Parkman's 2 - cannot understand his words). There
 is no Edythe Tappett listed [Dong had trouble
 remembering who she was]

(26) 25 SEP 2011 - CONTINUED

Doug says many people know him by name because of his dancing with all the ladies. I warned of his getting shafted by a jealous husband. He told me a story. There was a lady who had a named boyfriend even as her husband was alive. She said to Doug "I love you" - "Do you love me". Doug said to be friendly but ~~refused~~ a day of reflection decided he must bring clarity. He went back to her and said "I do not love you, have never loved you and will never love you"

Doug said his father was recognized by his parents as having exceptional mathematical skills. So they sent him to Buies Creek High School & then for advanced work at Pembroke, NY. But did not treat his siblings likewise. Her father, Cleve Chamblee became the year-round bookkeeper for a local warehouse. At another time he followed the tobacco advertisements on with rapid speed calculated in his head pounds x price to get a final \$ figure to put on the tag on each pile

I asked if Doug had meaningful discussions with his parents. He said yes - and especially about how he expected Doug to go to college.

Doug said his father overheard Black Uncle Ezra, a 22 year tenant for his father, tell his children to beat up under their tenant status but to not

forget that they are or gook or white folks and could achieve if they set their minds to it. Doug said his father agreed with that sentiment

Doug says Blacks have control of TV. If there is a doctor in a scene it will be a Black doctor.

Doug at the very beginning mentioned that Gary had died. I said "I know". We did not discuss the twins or our children

I did tell him of my broken ankle and of our upcoming trip to Las Vegas for Sandy's wedding.

(27) 25 DEC 2011 - Notes of APU call to DOUG

I'm joking I told Doug I was calling Cousin Ed with them a very Christmas and ran out of them so called Doug. He humorously chastized me saying he had adopted me as his brother and he should come first. His voice seemed weak but otherwise he also seems good. He said he will tomorrow write a check for \$100 to the collection and wants his check cashed in 2011. I gave him Susan's League's address. He had trouble getting it down right.

Doug wanted to tell me about some of his early history. He finished High school in 1937 and stayed home 2+ years (3 summers) because his FAT could not

two in college. In the meantime there was a drought year and a tobacco barn burned. He entered NCSU as a freshman in the fall of 1939 while still 18. He was in ROTC but not for 4 years - only 2. He was rejected for military service because of a dermatitis septum which often led to ear problems when he had a cold. These effects were transitory as was a heart murmur. He had an operation for the nose problem. As a senior he volunteered for Infantry Service and was put "on call" but at the same time going to Fort Bragg for short training periods. This all dug out until he was dismissed abruptly in AUG 1945.

Doug says Sennam got him started in paper crops. Sennam needed help and went to the student office & got grades of students. Then he came to Doug's Dormitory Room & offered him a job. Doug was pleased that he was in due course given responsibility and was given support for his thesis. Both he & I prepared through or 3 degrees on a monkey see - monkey do basis.

Doug did rail a little about having to do all of the work on Woodhouse's store. He worked with statistics on this & sent the records to Woodhouse at Cornell.

Doug said when an undergraduate his father would send him \$6 each Monday - not letting him have it before the weekend to prevent ill advised expenditures.

We discussed the 5 windows over the portico on 1911 Blvd but could not resolve into occupiers all of the slots. I told Doug of the Book Plating Luncheon in next May and invited him to come. He said he would.

I had a nice chat with Doug this am. He is failing noticeably--has vertigo. I offered to pick him up for the Book Plating Event and he said that might be best. I proposed the prospect of a breakfast involving you two, Doug, the twins and the two of us. I explained your desire to see Marie and Gayle. He seemed willing but obviously would leave arrangements to others.

Marie has had to take on duties of departed Deans at Meredith without extra compensation and is still working. She has just sold her house and moved to Durham (205 Swift Creek Crossing, 27713). Her Cell is (919) 604-2644.

Gayle lives in the Greensboro area. Her home phone is (336) 852-4422. Doug says her room mate (???) will answer and vet callers before letting Gayle speak. If Gayle does not want to come to Raleigh for a visit it might be that you and Rob will pass close by her place and could have a chat.

I suggest you call Marie/Gayle and see if you can tee up a meeting. Given the passage of time you will need to dissipate some fog. After you get the lay of the land we can consider time and place if it looks like we have a go.

FYI Doug is now 91. If he should pass away I would plan go to the memorial service if feasible. You might wish to engage the twins in such a way that they know I am following their Dad's well being closely.

(29) 22 MAY 2012 - 10:30 AM - After not being able to reach Doug over several days I called Squawmoor (919) 848-7000 & they said he had been temporarily moved to the Nursing Facility. They transferred me but no answer after 20 mins I took the central no again & said he could be signed out. To get signed to his quarters again call (919) 848-7119

(30) 1 JUN 2012 - Doug attended the Book Plateing Event for the Upchurch Collection held in the D. H. Hill Library at NCSU from 11:30 AM - 1:30 PM. Here are my recollections as of 21 JUN 2012

While I gave Tom & Joyce a tour of local Upchurch sites Doug was picked up by Bob, Deb, & Sallaine. They also returned him to Springwood. There was some concern by the Springwood care givers in that his BP became elevated as he was excited about our event and another at Springwood he was expected to attend & could not.

At the event I sat with Doug part of the time and noted that his ability to grasp ideas and respond has been compromised - he probably had a stroke leading to his falls and to his troubles at nursing at Springwood.

Susan Nutter asked all to introduce themselves. When it came Doug's turn he began to give a detailed report on his long tour at NCSU. He went into most detail such as when he was asked to teach a new course of 250 students with short preparations and did with no one being concerned about his teaching percentage. He seemed not to have a stopping point and I and others began to give Susan signals to step in. She did by asking "when did you get to know Phil". This broke his hold on the group - all a signal of his deterioration - very sad. RPH

2 JUN 2012 - SATURDAY

Had a Chamblee breakfast at Buzze on Creedmoor. Ad - as guests of the Reche. Marie brought her father Dang. Present Ben & Keli, RPA 455d. This was our first contact with Marie since 1985. Gage lives in Greensboro & could not attend.

Re Health of Dang. He appears to have had a stroke - is frail, has lost weight, speaks in a slow very quiet voice and is easily disoriented. And yet when I asked about who lived in his home while he was in Peru he went through papers & found the name. Ben let Marie know I want to know if anything happens to him.

(32) 19 NOV 2012 - Attempts to reach Dang

a. Called the main number of Springwood (919) - 848-7000. I was referred to a site which referred me to another site which was "The 2nd Floor"

b. Talked to the "The 2nd Floor" (919) 848-7123. They confirmed that Dang is still in the HEALTH CENTER and offered to transfer me to his private number there - see -

c. 10:40 am. Dang's private number (919) 848-7667 rang and rang - no answer. I will call later

d. 2:00 pm - Reached Dang & had a 15 min chat. It is hard to understand him. The stroke influenced his brain some but his speech more. He was back in his apt for 6 weeks but had a relapse. He has a demented roommate. Has pride in Gage's daughter (grandson). Both Gage & Marie graduated from Meredith. Marie is the Dean. Dang implies he will be "released" from the Health Center but I could not understand where he will go. It appears he no longer has his Apt & Marie has his stuff

I brought up the Bell Tower & we had a nice chat about that. I asked if he knew C. B. Williams and he said yes that C. B. was head of Agronomy when he (Doug) first came to N. C. State.

Although Doug's voice was fairly strong and clear and he was responsive to my comments & questions he did not seem vibrant enough to initiate questions on his own and in the end seemed ready to truncate the conversation. He was a little word of hearing. He did ask about our next trip to NC & I said DEC. He wants to get together

I reached Doug after a couple of tries. It appears that with the TV on he may not hear/pick up the phone. A care giver seems to be close by.

His hearing was good and his speech was not slurred although he formed his words slowly. I elected to focus on his time in Peru and on this his memory was quite good and as I prompted him he would come up with answers. When I recalled that he learned Spanish he stressed that he learned to speak it perfectly and was thus a much valued member of the team. While Doug engaged in conversation he did not venture any subjects of his own or give any special recognition of our long comradeship. In later discussion Salline & I concluded that people of his age & circumstance do nothing but cope and do not focus on external circumstances even with close family.

I mentioned we would be in NC next December and said I hoped we could have a chat. He said he would look forward to it. He is allowed out if Marie goes.

Josh Reilly was Chief of Party - Schepfeld later was their charge was to duplicate N.C. State University (as opposed to an Ag College??). Doug was in charge of a Committee re building the Institution. Bill Gilbert was the first to go & he & Jerry lived in the jungle. They had a child born there.

Doug extended his tour to a total of 3 1/2 years. After return to NC he still went down for weekly trips once a month which he really did not want to do. He got a bonus of 20%

Doug served as an Agreement not as a Foreign Corp expert although per Perm grant improvement was a large priority

The headquarters was in Lima but there were several remote sites including Tingo Maria

I viewed Doug as to have much good the Perm program did. He said it did not succeed in all respects but did some good.

Over time NCSU sent 70 Professors. At any one time 50 Peruvian students attended NCSU

Doug said he did get some letters from his contacts in Perm after his tour.

Doug stressed that the military was in charge whether up front or behind the scenes.

It is clear that Doug now relives the Perm experience in a positive light but I do not feel he is in a position to give an appraisal

Dene's father owned a large amount of land in the immediate area. Doug's father bought an extra 100 acres down the road but it only had a 50' road frontage. This is the parcel Doug sold. They later divorced and she & her mother lived in halves of a duplex in Zeluden. Oleta's daughter now owns the place. The area is a piedmont overlain by coastal deposits.
