Got your 22 Nov. letter. Thanks so much for everything you included. It's good to have my G-Aunt Alma's letters. I just recently sent a letter to her daughter in Redding, but haven't received a reply yet. My Aunt Ann Barnes (mom's sister) and I have been corresponding for the last couple of months, which is fantastic considering the last time I saw her was about 35 years ago. My mom and her kept up with each other, so she knows about my family and $I$. We are both really enjoying the letters we receive from each other. She told me that Alma's daughter, Virginia Butler, tried to get a group of their $1^{\text {st }}$ cousins to start righting to her and she would compile the letters and send them all to each of them. I don't know how that turned out. She also mentioned that they had a reunion in June of 1998. Missed that one, darn it. Hopefully Virginia can tell me of any future reunions.

As before I'll start with the beginning of your letter and answer questions and make comments. As for the web site for finding land features, when you get hooked up to the Internet you will find many helpful sites such as that one. All it takes is a little curiosity, which you have an abundance of or you wouldn't be doing this. Most genealogical web sites will have what are called "links" to other helpful sites. With the exception of two more sites, which I will talk about later, I won't clutter up your mind with more web site addresses. If, when you get hooked up and you want to know which web sites I use, let me know and I'll e-mail you the list.

Cousin Melvin L.U. sounded like an interesting person. Unfortunately he is no longer with us. I used one of those useful web sites I mentioned above and found that he passed away on 6 Jan. 1998 in Spring, Montgomery Co., TX. The web site I used was the Social Security Death Index. It should list everyone who has had a SSN and has died. I would really like to know why he was in Corvallis, - OR when he got married. Considering his profession, I wonder if he was doing something with the University? He probably would have been too old to be stationed at nearby Camp Adair, unless he was an officer. Hamm? As for his question about blacks with the Upchurch name, Strickland's brothers and cousins fought for the North, so I don't think the slaveholders came from my branch of the tree. I don't think I can say the same for my Burton ancestors. G-grandpa William Franklin Burton was in the $1^{\text {st }}$ Kentucky Mounted Infantry and was captured while protecting Atlanta. I his daughter's write-up she makes reference to a slave, but I don't know if he was their slave, or from a neighbors farm. I'll have to do some more investigating when I get to the Burton's.

Well, lunch break is over, so I need to get back to work. I'll pick this up again later.

Back again. I agree with you about FTM. There is no way that I would try to enter all of the Unchurch info that you have into it at this point. If in the future you decide to do it, yourself or hire someone, you can put a call out to people like me and have us e-mail you our FTM files. Then all you would have to do is merge them into one file. The problem you could have is duplicating individuals and having discrepancies. FTM does a pretty good job of walking you through merging.

Thanks for the info about your background. It's good to know a little about whom you are talking to. When were you last in Corvallis? I looked in the phone book and Appleby and Cowan appear to still be living here.
Regarding photos, what you said sounds fine. I can spring for some of the past U.B.'s especially if there is an article accompanying the photos. I'm not sure yet which ones I may want. I'm afraid I can't read your writing for the Upchurch in Vol.2, \#2. How is he related to me? Also, how is Robert A. in Vol. 9, \#2 related to me? I will definitely want the 2 about Patrick, but I'll wait until you let me
know about those other 2 before ordering. I'm also interested in the ones that just have text, but there again I'll wait until you get back to me on those other 2 .

I can't remember if I have sent you any copies of pictures or not. I have been scanning every photo I can find into a computer file for 2 reasons. First, if we were to have a fire at home they would all go up in smoke, so I keep the files on my computer at work. Second, I wanted some way of organizing them and printing them out any time I want. I have a couple that I would like you to see. Perhaps you would like to include them in the U.B. Unfortunately, for one of them, the Strickland U. family with all 10 children, I can't ID everyone. I know the names, I just don't know who is who. I know the oldest son (Melvin L.U.'s dad, Walter), my grandmother and the 2 youngest daughters, but the rest of them are hard for me to ID. Perhaps Alma's daughter or one of the other cousins can help me. It's a great photo taken on their porch with the whole crew lined up and hardly a blemish on it. I also have one taken the same day indoors, but it isn't quite as nice. Just for the sake of curiosity I'll enclose it, but it won't do you much good with the names. Someday I'll figure them out. Another of my favorites is of Strickland. My brother looks a lot like him. I actually used a graphics software called Paint Shop Pro to clean up some of the stains in this one. My pride and joy are 2 tintypes of Strickland at age 17 and his future bride Roxie at age 14. I don't know if they were capable of - creating multiple copies of tintypes, but if not, these are one of a kind photos which makes them even more special. The one of Strickland is in a small frame and has a piece of paper explaining the photo, which I presume, was written by his mother Eunice McSwain Upchurch. She apparently wrote on the

- back of a used piece of paper with writing on it which she crossed out and wrote between the lines to
$\Delta$ explain where the piece of paper came from. The tintype of Roxie only has a written message from my grandma to my mom explaining who they were. They were later married at age 22 and 16.

I got to get back to work for now. I'll print out the photos tomorrow and hopefully get this in the mail tomorrow P.M.

I'm back again. I just don't seem to have time at home to write letters anymore. I printed out the photos before work this morning and put yellow post-its on the backs to explain anything needing explaining.

In the last letter I received from my Aunt Ann on 11/27/00 she said that she received a letter out of the blue from a $1^{\text {st }}$ cousin of hers, Ernestine Morrison. Apparently her letter was part of the "round robin" of letters started by cousin Virginia as I mentioned in the first paragraph. The cousin is one of Ernest Upchurch's daughters, so she would be a $1^{\text {st }}$ cousin once removed to me. She said that her granddaughter was into genealogy. This rung a bell and after thinking a little about it I realized that I have already had some correspondence with her granddaughter, Laura Marbut. She and her husband have a homepage through the Family Tree Maker web site and she has our mutual lineage from Michael to the present included in it. She wasn't real good about responding to my e-mails, but they had a baby earlier this year, so she has probably been a little busy.
I have enclosed all the land patents listed in the Bureau of Land Management's web site for Arkansas. It was a little time consuming, so I didn't do all states, but if there are any individuals you would like for me to look up, just ask. The web address for the BLM is http://www.glorecords.blm.gov/. These are interesting documents and kind of fun to have.

Well, I can't think of anything else worth mentioning, so I'll let you go.

Nov. 15, 2000

It was good to hear from you. I always feel like a kid at Christmas when I get something in the mail regarding genealogy. I'm very glad to get the info you sent and will have to sit down in front of my computer and add it to my family tree files. I'll address everything in your letter, hopefully in the order it appears.
(First I'd like to address my Family Tree Maker printout, pages $1 \& 2$, that you sent back to me. Almost all that you see in the printouts, with the exception of my Grandparents down to me, was gleaned from the internet. I was just checking the Mormon's Family Search site and I think most of what I got from the older generations was from that site. Unfortunately it's no better than what people have submitted to the Mormons. We certainly can't blame them, they are just gathering what people submit to them. A number of the submittal to the Mormons say Michael was born in Little Gidding, Huntingdon, England. Some say he was married to Francis Delke. So, what I did was put down what made the most sense to me, and I wouldn't be at all surprised if it were all wrong. I assume those who have submitted info were just repeating what they have heard and the wrong info has just been perpetuated. I figure if anyone should know what is right or wrong, it would be you. But, for now I'm just going to leave what I have in my file knowing that it is probably wrong. There will be a lot of happy genealogists if you ever do find out the correct info. I will change Michael's birth date to read "ABT 1620". I'll also add "ABT" to the other two dates you mentioned. I'll also fix the Chatham County misspelling in my file. I use a USGS web site that helps you find locations of features (populated place, cemeteries, etc) and it gives the county, state, and I think the coordinates of the feature. It has come in handy when trying to determine a county.
As far as Michael being associated with the Delve family, according to the "America's First Tax Strike" story I sent you, Roger Delke, Jr. and Michael were at least partners in crime when the old rascals decided they didn't want to pay theist taxes. I don't know if I broke any copyright laws by retyping and passing that story on to you, but you may want to consider that before you pass it on to others or reprint it in anything that you publish.
As for your 10 page master outline for the Patrick Bogan U. line, I assume this is info you already had before I sent you my info, so Ill check it with mine and let you know if I see anything I don't agree with or if I have any questions. You mentioned that you could send additional continuation sections for the Patrick B.U. line, and this is tempting, but where do I stop? I think I will stay fairly close to my straight line from Michael down to me. I'll try to get as many siblings as can be found and also first cousins. If I don't get Patrick's first cousins once removed, I'm not going to get too upset. If I find that I have a hole in my tree (or my head) I'll write to you to see if you can fill it. Thanks for the offer! I have had some distant cousins (not as distant as you) send me their files and I have entered that info in my file. So, if it falls into my lap I'll enter it, but I'm not going to go looking for $2^{\text {nd }}, 3^{\text {rd }}$ or $4^{\text {th }}$ cousins.
Now, on to Strickland's biofile. This is very interesting stuff, especially the items about the horse ranch and the Chapel Hill Church. It appears that you have some letters and other documents from my G-aunt Alma and others. Is there a chance that I could get copies of

\text { these? I would be very willing to pay for the copying and your time. In item no. } 8 \text { you seem }
$$ to have a photo of Strickland on his $21^{\text {st }}$ birthday. I would be very interested in this. Do you have a photo, negative or just a xerox copy? Did it come from Aunt Alma? I have a tintype of him at age 17. It is in a frame with a piece of paper written at that time which states his name, age, the photographer and the location. At present it is the highlight of my collection.

I also have a tintype of his wife Roxie at age 14. I haven't made negatives of any of my photos yet, but I have scanned them into a computer file and can get a reasonably good color copy of them. If you want copies of some of the scanned photos I have for your records just let me know. No charge, I print them out on our color lazes printer at work and nobody cares if I print a few personal things. I will be getting negatives made eventually since my siblings will want copies also, but that could be years from now at the rate I'm going.
Strickland's Biofile:
Item 1 - this is good to know. One of my tasks that I would like to do is map when and where my ancestors, on down to my parents, moved.

Item 2 - you have a letter from Melvin Louis U. Do you know if he is still living? I'm curious about him because in my G-aunt Alma's write-up she says he was married in
$\square\{$ Corvallis, OR. which is where we moved to when we came to Oregon and I still work there. Do you have his address? Around the same time that my son was born there was a notice in the paper of the birth of a boy Upchurch. I never worked up the guts to call them and now they are gone from the area. Could they be Melvin's grandkids?

Item 3 - Aunt Alma states that her mom Roxie was $1 / 2$ Cherokee. In her write-up that I have she also states this and that Roxie's mom, Mary Ann Hamilton Brigham, and her grandmother, Fanny Hamilton, were Cherokee and walked the Trail of Tears. I have no evidence of this and it just doesn't seem possible that they had Indian blood because all of their ancestors seemed so "white". But, the Cherokees were known as one of the "civilized" tribes and used English names back then, so it could be possible. I haven't given up on that yet. I personally would be very proud to have Cherokee blood in me.
Item 5 - my Aunt Alma mentions Chapel Hill Church, cemetery and school. About a year ago I tried every resource I could find on the internet to locate Chapel Hill with no luck. I finally left a query in the Custer Co., Oklahoma USGenWeb site and bingo! A woman
■ named Vonda McPhearson answered my query. She had done the survey of the cemetery and sent me a listing of all of it's inhabitants. She also said that the Church is still in use. Now I find from you that Strickland actually gave the land for the Church, cemetery and school. As for the deed and will, I'm going to write to Alma's daughter to see if I can get copies (thanks for her address!!). The horse breeding business was new to me also. Good stuff to know.

Item 6 - you have that Flora recalled moving with her father and his brothers to Okla. In the Custer Co., Oklahoma USGenWeb site I found a listing of Custer Co. Pioneers which actually lists the pioneers name, section, township and range. It has David H., Elliott, Patrick G., Strickland A. and Vernon. David Harmon U. had a son named Elliott Vernon, so Elliot and Vernon may be the same person. Strickland's brother-in-law, Melvin Brigham, is also listed. I have a copy of the 1900 Custer Co. census page that Strickland is on and it also
has Melvin Brigham and Eliott (only one "L"?) Upchurch. That web site also has a page with the first 3 editions of the Arapaho Arrow newspaper and in it I found David Harmon

 U. listed as a county commissioner. This was apparently just after Arapaho was founded in 1892. I also know that Strickland's brother Charles Wesley and their mother Eunice U. settled in the Norman, OK area. I have been communicating with a descendent of Charles' named Phyllis Davenport, and we have exchanged info. I also know that their sister, Mary Katherine U. Skinner settled in that area.$\square$ Item 8 - again, I would like a copy of this picture and any others of Patrick's family if that is possible.

Item 9 - I can confirm this. As I stated above, I have a copy of the survey for Chapel Hill Cemetery. I also have a copy of the survey for the Cleveland Co. Mt. Zion Cemetery where Charles W. U., Eunice U. and Mary Kathrine U. Skinner and families are buried. If you want copies, just let me know.

Item 10 - listing of lands held by Upchurch people. I found in the Bureau of Land Management web site that you can look up land patents. So, I tried it for Upchurch's in Arkansas and found listings for each of these individuals. They also have scanned the patents and I was able to download and print them. Here again, I can send you copies of these if you want them, or you can get them yourself if you have access to the internet at http://www.glorecords.blm.gov/. There are many other Upchurch people listed in other states, but none of them are in my direct line.

Item 11 - I have had a little contact with her (Laura Caldwell). She is the closest cousin I have interested in genealogy. She is the G-granddaughter of Ernest U., my grandma Emma's brother. Her married name is Marbut. I found her on the internet and sent an email and got no reply, then sent another and finally got a reply and that was about it. So, I'll have to try again later. I did download her version of the family tree and I entered everything that I didn't have into my tree. I also marked up a hardcopy with things I thought she had wrong. I need to send that to her. They just had a baby earlier this year, so they may be too busy for genealogy. Their web site is at: http://www.familytreemaker.com/users/m/a/r/Jason-David-Marbut/index.html. I also have that Melvin L. Brigham Jr. married Ida Ellen U. She is a descendent (either daughter or granddaughter) of Thomas A. U. (I'm typing this at lunch time at work, so I don't have this info in front of me). I have a picture of Melvin and Ida with their 3 daughters - cute kids.
$\square$ Item 12 - no comment other than WOW that's a lot of kids.
I sympathize with you about the 13 file cabinets. You must be very well organized. I have a file cabinet, a small chest of drawers and numerous boxes full of stuff which needs organizing. It's a slow process. I need to get a safe so I can protect some old pictures and documents that I have. If we ever have a fire, it would all be gone. That's part of the reason I am scanning every picture \& document I can get my hands on and keeping the scanned files on my computer at work for safe keeping.

Going from hand written family trees to Family Tree Maker with all of the info you have will take another lifetime I'm afraid. I'm no expert on FTM, but it sure helps me keep organized. I believe you can use the XID numbers that you have for each individual and there is a lot of flexibility in what you can show when you print your info. I like it, but then

I don't have 13 file cabinets full of stuff. What we need to do is clone you so you have the time to create a WEB site, transfer your info to FTM and keep up with info you receive from others. I forgot about your book - we will need to clone you to make Phil 1 thru 4.

Thanks for including Virginia Erickson's address. Hopefully she has kept up with her mother's family tree work. I'll have to see about visiting her some day since Redding is right on the I-5 corridor between Oregon and the San Francisco Bay Area where our people are. I cannot believe my Mom never mention to me that her aunt Alma lived so close. It would have been nice to meet her.
$\square$-Thanks also for laying out how you and I are related. It's nice to know who I'm talking to. My sister and I didn't get to go to Oklahoma yet. Things just didn't work out. I'm hoping to do it in the Spring. My sister moved up here to Oregon in the summer and one thing lead to another. Before you know it it's late fall. She hasn't got a job yet, so when she does that could interfere with our plans. We will just have to wait and see what happens. I have been in contact with an aunt, some first cousins and a distant cousin, and they are all excited to see us. I've also laid out all the places we need to stop at - cemeteries, courthouses, etc. So, if we ever get to do it, it should be fun.
You asked for a few lines about myself. Well here goes. I was born in Pittsburg, CA and at the age of 3 months my family moved to Concord, CA. My brother, sister and I grew up in the same house and only just recently sold it after the passing of our mother. After graduating from Mt. Diablo High School, I went on to Diablo Valley College in Pleasant Hill, CA and earned my AA degree in Engineering Technology in 1975. I then attended California State University, Chico and earned my BS degree in Industrial Technology in 1978. While at Chico State I met my future wife, Kathy Burklo. After College I got a job with Varian Associates in Palo Alto, CA as a draftsman. In August 1978 Kathy and I were married in her hometown of Soquel, CA and made our home in Sunnyvale, CA. (near Palo Alto). In a little over a year we decided that the craziness of the San Francisco Bay Area was not what we wanted. Also, Kathy wanted to finish her degree in Art, so we moved north to Corvallis, OR, the home of Oregon State University. Corvallis is a small college town that fit our needs for living comfortably and starting a family. Just before moving I was fortunate enough to get a job as a draftsman in Corvallis at the headquarters of a worldwide engineering firm named CH2M Hill. Within a year my company purchased a CAD (computer aided drafting) system and I was selected as on of the first four draftsmen to learn how to run it. Twenty-one years later I am still with CH2M Hill and still using CAD, but more in a supervisory position, leading the drafting effort for larger projects. In 1982 we had our first child, a daughter named Taylor Lee, and in 1984 we had a son named Elijah James. We are now living in nearby Albany, OR. Taylor is looking at colleges and Eli is working his way through high school. I have only a couple of hobbies at present. I dove headfirst into genealogy about 2 years ago and love it. I have been playing softball on a company sponsored city league team for 21 years and starting to feel my age. I also enjoy collecting antiques, although my collection is rather small. Through most of my adult life I have been in possession of a 1957 Chevrolet 4-door sedan which was purchased new by my parents. It is in a bit of disrepair, but my hope is to someday have the time (and money) to get it back to it's original condition. So that's me in a nutshell.

I just got a letter from my Aunt Ann today $(11 / 15 / 00)$ and it had some interesting info in it. Apparently in Oct. 1998 my G-aunt Alma's daughter, Virginia, started what she called a round robin of letters to help her cousins to communicate and share info. Aunt Ann
$\qquad$ included the starting letter which contained addresses of many of her first cousins. I plan on writing to some of them especially Virginia very soon. She also included a Jan. 1999 let from Virginia which talked about a family reunion in Clinton, OK set for June 26, 1999. It's good to know that they are still getting together. I would have liked to have been there. Well make contact with them
I will go through the info you sent and compare it to what I have. I know that I have recently found some info on some first cousins of mine, so I'll let you know about that and anything else I find. I did start marking up your 4 page outline for Emma, but I have found that there is some info I don't know but expect to learn sometime in the near future. So I'll hang onto it until I can fill in some more blanks. Sorry this letter is so long and it took so long to write. I haven't had time to work on it at home, so I've been typing like crazy at break time and lunch time at work for the last few days. So, for now Ill say goodbye.

I cant imagine who sent you that page from GenForum with my query about Patrick Upchurch and Eunice McSwain. No one has answered it yet, but I have found what I was asking for on my own.
Just to remind you, my great-great-grandfather was Patrick Bogan U. (generation 10 in the enclosed printout) and my G-grandfather was Strickland Asbury U. and I was looking for any info on his siblings. First I found a cousin, Phyllis Davenport, who is a GGgranddaughter of Charles Wesley U. She filled me in on some of her ancestors, but I need to get a little more from her. Then I found Mary Katherine U. Skinner through the Mormon family Search web site with the help of a photo with her name written by her on the back with her married name. After that I found a Family Tree Maker home page belonging to Jason and Laura Marbut (Laura is a $2^{\text {nd }}$ cousin once removed) which had a wealth of information. They somehow had all of Strickland's siblings listed. I spent a long time merging their info into my Family Tree Maker file. I also have printouts from other distant cousins, which I need to merge into my file. As you know, this can become a full time job. Too bad I can't get someone to pay me, ha!
The printout I have enclosed is from my Family Tree Maker file. I'm sure there are errors from Patrick back to the first Upchurch I list in the printout. I haven't had time to compile all of the info that I have found on the internet for those older generations, so I'm sure that whatever I have is a little off. From Patrick down to my kids should be in pretty good shape. I feel like I need to hurry because I do want to get onto different families who married into the Upchurch line and eventually onto my Burton side. This will probably be a life long effort/hobby! This is probably asking a lot of you, but if you find any glaring errors, can you let me know so I can fix my file? I would greatly appreciate it. From Patrick back I didn't plan on going very far off the "trunk" of our tree, ie. no inlaws of distant cousins. If I have the info I'll enter it, but I'm not going to make a special effort to get every Upchurch that ever lived. Again, as you know there isn't enough time in the day for that.

Dear Phil,
My wife and \(I\) are back from our trip to England. Just to remind you, my wife went to do research on a church in Ramsgate for her PhD dissertation and I tagged along. I had written and called you back in July or August asking for pointers in case I had some free time to go to Unchurch places of interest. You must have sent my e-mail address on to David Ransome because I soon heard from him, and I thank you for that. David offered to show me the letters at Cambridge, but unfortunately our schedules didn't allow that. I wasn't near Cambridge when he was available and he was out of the area when I was near Cambridge. Thanks to the magic of the internet and the inter-library loan system that my wife has access to through Oregon State University, I was able to get the microfilm that David compiled on the Ferrar Papers and was able to view and print the four letters prior to taking our trip.

I'm writing you for two reasons, to tell you how our trip went and to ask a question about what to do about what I found in Little Gidding. First, the trip. We had a great time in the old country. My wife's research went well, and I won't bore you with all the details. We found the church in Ramsgate that she is researching which was designed, built and paid for by Augustus Welty Pugin in the mid-1800's. He's the architect who designed the interior of the Houses of Parliament in London when it was rebuilt. Her research took us to London, Ramsgate and Oxford. We saw some of the typical tourist sites, Houses of Parliament, Tower of London, etc. We also went to Cambridge and Ely for some R\&R. From Ely I took a Sunday morning drive to Brington and then on to Little Gidding. Since you have been there I won't go into what I saw. I was impressed by both churches and was a little surprised by how small both communities are.

In Brington I drove around the village to see what I could see and found the church without a problem. The door was unlocked so I went in and soaked it all up. After looking around the exterior I drove around the village again and took some pictures, then hit the road for Little Gidding. When I got to Little Gidding I walked from the parking lot to the church and tried the door, which was locked. Within a couple of minutes a gentleman whose name I did not get, came from the Ferrar house and asked if I wanted to see the inside of the church. I of course said yes and he let me in and I told him that I was an Upchurch descendant. He was familiar with the name and asked that I come up to the house when I was done. I signed the guest book, took pictures and looked around. I went up to the Ferrar house and was greeted by a couple of ladies and was offered food and drink. All I needed was water (it had cooled off by then, but we had been having weather in the high 80 's to low 90 's and I was still a little dried out). The gentleman joined us and I told them all about why we were in England and what I was doing in Little Gidding. They Xeroxed a couple of things for me, one being a piece of paper about Michael U. which I think they had because they have an Unchurch room in the bed \& breakfast portion of the house (I think you already know about that). Unfortunately it still had the version in which Michael came from Little Gidding. They also had a copy of the Belle West book and some issues of the Upchurch Bulletin. I told them what I could remember about

David Ransome's research and what was in the Upchurch Bulletin regarding Michael coming from Brington. I don't know if what I told them was believed or if it was overwhelming or if it burst their balloon or what. What I do know is that since we know the connection between Michael and Little Gidding isn't what it was thought to be, we should try to set things straight, otherwise the wrong story will keep perpetuating itself. Would you be willing to send the correct info to the Ferrar House? It would probably only take a letter of introduction and a copy of the England sections of volume 15, \#4 and volume 16, \#1 of the Upchurch Bulletin. I think it would have more clout if it came from you instead of me. If this is something you don't want to tackle, let me know and I can send the info to set them straight. One other thing, they were not aware of the window in the church that was replaced with the endowment from one of our cousins.

To continue with my story, they were very kind people. We were talking about our travels in England and they gave me a spare copy of Bill Bryson's book, Notes From a Small Island. Here I am a total stranger and they're giving me things. If you haven't read it, l'd recommend it. It's about his travels through England and it's hilarious. One of the ladies was an Upchurch, but I was a little overwhelmed by everything and I needed to get back to Ely by noon, so my addled brain didn't think to question her about her ancestry. They also pulled out a couple of phone books, both having about a dozen Upchurches in them. I think one was for Huntingdon, but I don't know where the other one was from. They also Xeroxed a copy of a report from I think they said a former pastor/priest/minister of the church who had written about Upchurch people of the past that he knew of. Unfortunately I didn't notice until I left that one edge of the notes is chopped off, but I think it's still readable, although his handwriting isn't very readable. I haven't had time to really study it so I don't know how it might help you or David Ransome, but l'll send it along also. That's about all I can recall of my encounter with the Little Giddingites.

One other thing on the same line that l'd like to ask you about. There is a web site that I have used extensively in the past called GENFORUM. There are other genealogical web sites that I have used, but I have found that many people use this site. It's address is http://genforum.genealogy.com/. It's for sharing info and asking questions about ones family. In the Upchurch page I have done a search on "Little Gidding" and found a few postings that have Michael coming from Little Gidding. I also searched on "Brington" and there were no postings, which means the findings of David Ransome are not getting out to the masses. Can I assume that you feel comfortable enough with David's findings in the Ferrar Papers and his other research for me to add a posting to GENFORUM that tells the Brington story? I'd like to do a condensed version with references to the various UB's that have the correct info in them. I know from the UB that you don't consider yourself a "computer person", so I can do this or if you would prefer, you can write something up and send it to me and \(I\) can post it in GENFORUM. I feel that if we don't set people straight wherever we can, whether it's the Ferrar House or web sites such as GENFORUM, the Little Gidding story will continue on for all time.

The four guest rooms in Ferrar House are named after four families who werre connected with the Ferrars.

There is a large family of Upchurches living in the United States who are all descended from one, Michael Upchurch. Very little is known about his early life. His family lived in the Little Gidding area and were associated with the Ferrars.

Michael emigrated to Virginia, probably in 1649 or 1650 , perhaps through the influence of John Ferrar who corresponded regularly with members of the Colony. John's nephew, Richard Collett, was already in Virginia, having gone there sometime before 1642 . There are records of Michael Upchurch in the area where Richard Collett seems to have settled.

There are three letters in the Ferrar Papers from Mkichael to his family and friends at Little Gidding. One of them, dated May 4th 1652 to his father is addressed to Little Gidding. In this letter he says " I sent to Mr. Farrer 81b of principal good tobacco for his owne drinking (!) and a half dozen of Indian Pipes and a box full of tobacco seeds and I sent to Mrs Virginia Farrer [John Ferrar's daughter] a muskrat skin two musk codds an Indian basket two woodpeckers crownes wch were redder than any scarlet and with all I sent a paire of flying hart's homes and a pair of burds hornes and pease of mine several sorts and beans of all colors wheate and Indian corne of all sorts and I sent some heavy earth and a peece of fullers earth and as concerning the Indians makeing of bowes and arrows they make there bowes of Locust and theire arrow heads bee of glass or else from turkicock spurs or tipps of deeres hornes and they do gett glasse from the English and make tryangle just as this mark is and they did not cut it with diamonds only with a conce knife or pipple stone and as concerning mettles I am ignorat there is a diverse sorts of mettle stones but I cannot gett any because the Indians are at war one with the other but I shall promise some against the next yeare. however I know not how to make Mrs Farrer amends for all her manifold favores bestowed upon mee howsoever I shall remaine very thankful for her kindness".

We often have the pleasure of welcoming members of the Upchurch family. One of them was staying here when we were deciding on the names for the guestrooms.

Wooohoooo... guess what I found!!!!
While searching and looking for information on Michael Upchurch, I, I've run across something pretty interesting. We still need to do more investigating to prove it all, so I thought I'd enlist your keen observation powers!

In the endorsement of Ferrar for the first letter written by Michael in 1650, it is noted that he lives neere Cussell Creek nor far from Warrisqueke by Mother Bennett's plantation [Isle of Wight County]. That particular location has not been identified as far as I can tell reading all the Upchurch Bulletins. I think though I may have found where he was talking about.

There was a widow Alice Bennett whose plantation was known as Warrascoyack. In April 1644, she bought 150 acres of land between Castle Creek and Cypress Swamp. Another reference is made to her in 1644 as Robert Lawrence buys land located on the eastermost side of Lawnes creek adjoining the land of widow Bennett.

Alice, as best I can determine, was the widow of Robert Bennett, son of Edward Bennett. Edward, of London, obtained a patent from the Virginia Company to establish Bennett's Plantation in 1622. There's a plethora of data on these folks!

I pulled a bunch of info on these folks trying to determine if I was on the right track. There are several references of a Castle Creek that appears to meet or merge with Quarter Spring. Both those names are listed in numerous descriptions of land transactions. It looks like this would have been in the northeastern part of Isle of Wight County, near Hog Island in Surrey County. Reference is also made to it being near the town of Smithville, Virginia.

Doesn't this sound plausible? I do feel I've made a good find to solve the confusion about Cassel Creek! If you look at the handwriting where it's written, it actually looks like it could be Castle or Castile.

I hope your Thanksgiving celebration went well for your family. Ours was wonderful. We rendezvoused with my wife's family in Bend, Oregon where her sister lives and had a great time.

I have a couple of things I would like to run by you. The first is in regards to the enclosed titled Our English Ancestors. Cousin Mae Cox asked me to write up something for her Upchurch-Davenport book about Michael Upchurch, our English ancestor's, and Little Gidding vs. Brington. She didn't use it as I had written it, but that's fine since I needed to write it out anyway to put out on the internet. I had brought that up with you via U.S. postage some time back and you asked me to go ahead and get something out on the internet to help curb the belief that Michael came from Little Gidding. Unfortunately I have not done that yet, which is why I'm writing to you. I am hoping that you can spend a few minutes to read what I have written and edit it where needed. If you can write any corrections in the border and return it to me I would be very thankful. I would rather not add to the confusion by putting false information on the internet.

The second thing I want to bring to your attention is the enclosed e-mail from Mae Cox. For the second edition of her Unchurch book she is removing her Davenport relatives and making it strictly an Upchurch book. She is trying to add more detail to this edition, therefore she is doing a little more research than she did for the first edition. She started looking at the place where Michael lived when he wrote his letters, Cassel Creek. If memory serves, Dr. Ransome thought that Cussell Creek may have actually been Gussell Creek which could have been a phonetic way of spelling Goose Hill Creek. That all sounds plausible until you look at what Mae has found. Ill let you read her e-mail instead of repeating it all here. We are both wondering if you have ever heard anything about a Castle Creek? I have tried the USGS web site and found nothing on Cussell, Gussell, Goose Hill or Castle Creek in Isle of Wight County or Curry County. There are some variations of Castle Creek, like Rock Castle Creek, in other counties. This tells me that either it didn't exist with those spellings or it no longer exists due to modern construction eliminating it, a name change or who knows what. We are also wondering if this is something that can go in the Upchurch Bulletin asking cousins, especially those in Virginia, if they know of a Castle Creek in Surra County. I don't have all of the past UB's, but in the ones I have I don't recall seeing anything about the exact location of Michael's farm. If Castle Creek, or whatever it is called now, can be located it would get those who are interested one step closer to finding Michael's homestead.

\section*{Our English Ancestors}

For many years, and even up to the present, many in the Upchurch Family thought that Michael, our first Upchurch ancestor to immigrate to America, arrived in Virginia in 1649 from the small village of Little Gidding, Huntingdonshire, England. This belief was based on two letters from Michael which were published in the 1972 book Upchurch Family by Belle Lewter West. The two letters were found in a collection called the Ferrar Papers which are housed at Magdalene College in Cambridge, England. In 1991 Professor David R. Ransome, while studying the Ferrar Papers, discovered a total of 4 letters from Michael.

Ransome's translation and interpretation of the letters was published in the Upchurch Bulletin in 1994. With this report from Ransome and commentary from the editor of the Upchurch Bulletin, Prof. Robert Phillip Upchurch, we now have a new and clearer view of where Michael came from, when he arrived and how life was for him and other colonist of the time.

In the first letter from Michael to John Ferrar of Little Gidding, Huntingdonshire, England, Michael's parent's names were not mentioned, but Ferrar did write an endorsement to go with the letter that states "his father Richard Upchurch at Brienton by Old Weston in Huntingtonshire." From this letter and other records from the 1600's that Ransome has thoroughly studied, both he and Upchurch have made the logical assumption that Michael and his parents were actually residents of Brington in Huntingdonshire, a mere 5 miles from Little Gidding, prior to Michael's emigration to America in 1638. Ransome also warns us that Ferrar may have been wrong about the name of Michael's father. Richard may have actually been William. In later reports from Ransome published in the Upchurch Bulletin it would appear that he is leaning more towards Richard being Michael's father. Furthermore, Ransome's research has uncovered more than one possible Richard, and he reluctantly states "that there is at present no way of deciding definitively the question of Richard Upchurch's ancestry." Ransome goes on to say that two of the choices are from the Godmanchester Upchurches or from the Great Gransden Upchurches, although he may have come from another group of Upchurches yet to be found.

Sadly, what this means is that the family tree appearing in Belle West's book dating back to about 1450 and showing six generations of ancestors prior to Michael, is possibly not correct as proven by Ransome's extensive research on the Upchurch family's behalf. It is hoped that sometime in the future the final piece of the puzzle of our English ancestry will turn up.

I hope this finds you and your family all doing well. Ill just get right down to business. I can't seem to find your last letter to me or maybe we communicated so long ago that I'm confused about when your last letter was. I have one from you from Dec. 2005 but I thought there was a more recent one. The point is that I was thinking you had given me instructions on how to continue to receive the UB and I have procrastinated and haven't done whatever it was you had told me, or maybe I'm imagining the whole thing. Perhaps I even owe you money for Vol. 27, No. 1 which I have received. Shame on me if I do. I have enclosed a check for \(\$ 20\) to pay for Vol. 27, No. 1 if I haven't paid you and Vol. 27, No. 2. Dear Wardens of the Ferrar House,
My name is Kevin Burton and I am a descendent of Michael Upchurch who left England in the mid 1600's. My wife and I were in England, visiting from Oregon, USA, so that she could do research on AWN Pugin and his church, St. Augustine's, in Ramsgate. We also took time out from her research to just be tourists and we thoroughly enjoyed ourselves!

I visited Little Gidding on the morning of Sunday, Sept. 11, 2005, driving from where we were staying in Ely. Upon arriving I walked to the church and a gentleman was kind enough to come from the house and unlock the door so that I may look around. I told him that I was an Upchurch descendent and he asked that I stop by the house before leaving. After exploring the church I walk over to the house and was greeted by two very kind ladies. The gentleman also joined us. Unfortunately I did not get any of their names. We had a nice chat about the Upchurch family and they provided me with copies of a couple of Upchurch items. They also showed me a copy of Belle West's book, The Upchurch Family, and some of Prof. Robert Phillip (Phil) Upchurch's publications, the Upchurch Bulletin. In our discussion I told them that the popular belief that my ancestor, Michael Upchurch, left for Virginia from Little Gidding in 1649 or 1650 was not correct, and that new research found that he had lived in nearby Brington before leaving for America. Actually, the "new" research was brought to Phil Upchurch's attention in 1994, but the word has not been spread very well. I have asked Prof. Upchurch to write to the Ferrar House about this, but due to his schedule he requested that I take up this task. I have enclosed articles from the Upchurch Bulletin (UB) that I think will explain everything, but I will give you the condensed version in the next couple of paragraphs.

Back in the early 1990's, Prof. David Ransome of Woodbridge, Suffolk was studying the Ferrar Papers at Magdalene College in Cambridge. While researching Michael Upchurch, who had written to the Ferrar's in 1650-51, he discovered a business card left by Phil Upchurch of the U.S. Dr. Ransome contacted Phil and asked if he had any knowledge of Michael Upchurch's ancestry and if he was interested in any information that he had (see UB vol. 15, \#2). Phil replied that he was very interested, and from there a relationship was established that continues today. Phil, as publisher of the Upchurch Bulletin, hired David to research the ancestors of Michael Upchurch in England.

From the four letters from Michael Upchurch found in the Ferrar Papers and other extensive research, Dr. Ransome submitted a translation and interpretation of the letters to Dr. Upchurch for publication in the Upchurch Bulletin (see UB vol. 15, \#4). Many other reports from Dr. Ransome have traced the Upchurch family in England. I have enclosed copies of the Ransome reports that were published in the Upchurch Bulletin that are pertinent to Little Gidding.

I'm not sure that the folks that I met at the Ferrar House were completely convinced that my story was correct. Considering that I was a stranger to them and contradicting what has been believed to be fact, I can't fault them for having
some doubt. But I feel that it is important to get the Upchurch-Little Gidding relationship straightened out for future visits to the Ferrar House by Unchurch family members. I realize that this could possibly result in a name change of the Unchurch Room in the Ferrar House. I have enclosed an article regarding a sum of money left by an Upchurch family member which was used to replace a window in the Church at Little Gidding (see UB vol. 23, \#2, page 67). Perhaps this is a deed worthy of keeping the name of the Unchurch Room as is. Besides that, even if Michael did not come from Little Gidding, his correspondence to the Ferrar family seems to have been of some help in the Ferrar's interest in the Virginia Colony.

I will be very anxious to hear back from you on this matter. If you would prefer using e-mail, my address is below. I wish that I would of had more time while visiting Little Gidding and the surrounding area, but the short time that I was there will be time not soon forgotten.

Thanks for your constructive comments on the recent UB issue and for your words of encouragement.

I have made the correction for the \(1628 / 1638\) error in my master copy. We proof and reread, etc but errors always seem to somehow creep in. Family historians must learn never to be comfortable with any given document but to have your own record subject to regular update. My Master Outlines and Biofiles are kept in this manner. They are designed to be traded and updated. Over time I have worked with hundreds of Cooperators in this manner but there should have been thousands--but then I would have been overwhelmed!

With regard to the production aspects I feel we have advanced over time but there are a variety of constraints. Technology keeps changing and Sallaine and I struggle to stay in the game. The latest issue was produced on a new Brother combined copier/printer and I now realize we used a setting which used too much ink. We are gradually learning about it's bells and whistles. Some of the articles are used as sent, or as available in my system or are reduced to fit available space. This means any given issue will be less polished than desired. In the present case I increased the page count from 40 to 60 to get as much as possible in. While I regret not having more polished issues and hope to do better what I have done so far has involved many thousands of hours and a couple of hundred thousand dollars of my own money. My pleas to have others pitch in with me on time or money have met with minimal success. There are a few exceptions which I really appreciate.

Thanks for your comments on the photos. In the past many were used as provided with us having little control over quality. Years ago we used a process called screen printing to enhance the quality of photos but it did not seem to help all that much.

With your interest I wish you were close by so we could confer on a more personal basis. With input from you and a few others like you we could have made a lot more progress and turned out a more polished product. Having said that I look back on 40 years of family history work with joy and satisfaction with hopes of a few more years to come.

Phil, greetings. Kevin Burton here. I just wanted to make a couple of comments on the latest UB which I received a couple of days ago. I'm going to get right to the point with my comments below:
- An error was found on page 43. You say that Michael was born in 1624 and came to America at age 14 in 1628. I think you meant 1638 .
- This is constructive criticism and I hope you will take it in the spirit it is given. I find page 43 much easier on the eyes than all of the other pages in the UB. I think you are using bold text on most of the other pages. Besides being easier on the eyes, not using bold text saves space which will allow you to print the info on pages 25 \& 37 in the same larger font size as on other pages, making those pages easier to read for those of our cousins with failing eyesight. I suppose that it may also save paper and ink.
- I am very glad to see that you have now started using digital photos in the UB. They are much clearer than in past UB's.

Thank you for all of the effort you have put into the UB all of these years.

Someone with a knowledge of Colonial history could help clarify that matter. I can't recall how Mae came up with the name of the Captain. That sounds like a very interesting lead. Page 232. 2 Nov. 1661. Edward Upchurch, he moving, made Mr. John Peed and Peleg Dunstan to pay some sums of tob. by him indebted.. Wit.: John Ashton, Henry Tillary.
I have never seen an Edward Upchurch in any research that I have done. Could he be a relative of Michael's, perhaps a brother or cousin who followed him to Virginia? I suppose he could even be an uncle or a nephew. Do you have any idea who this Edward is?

Phil, good to hear from you. How's the transition to the computer world going? I don't have much to contribute, but here's a couple of things:


I just recently found out that my aunt Anna Elizabeth Dennis Barnes passed away in June of 2005. She was born in Temple, OK on Nov. 23, 1920 and the last I heard she was living in Broken Arrow, OK. Her parents were John and Emma Mae Upchurch Dennis and her lineage was Emma Mae, Strickland Asbury, Patrick Bogan, Allen, Harmon, James, John, Richard \& Michael. My sister and I visited her in April of 2001 and we found her to be a very active, spry woman, still driving and active in Meals on Wheels. I didn't really know her very well, but my Mom and Anna were very close.

In Sept. my wife and I took a 3 week road trip around the U.S., going no further east than Chicago. One of the stops on our path was a Strickland Upchurch family reunion in Clinton, OK. There were only 8 Upchurch descendants in attendance along with some spouses. We all had a wonderful visit, drove by the "home place" and attended services at the Chapel Hill Methodist Church thaf 'Strickland and his wife, Roxie, and others had founded. We also visited the Chapel Hill Cemetery where Strickland, Roxie and other Upchurch family members are buried, including Strickland's brother, the Rev. David Harmon U. and his descendants.

As we headed towards Eureka Springs, AR, I convinced my wife that I needed to visit the Cleveland, AR area to get another picture of my GG-Grandfather's headstone. In April of 2001 my sister and I went on a genealogical road trip and while looking for Strickland's sister, Priscilla Upchurch Brents in the Lowder Cemetery near Cleveland, AR, we were very surprised to run across Patrick Bogan Upchurch's headstone. At the time we didn't know that he was buried there. It was dusk (and somewhat creepy in this run down cemetery on a dirt road in the woods in the Arkansas Ozarks) and I didn't have my camera flash attachment so as a result I have never been happy with the photos that I got. And, by the way, we couldn't find Priscilla's headstone. Fast forward to Sept. 2007 and there we were with a digital camera and plenty of daylight taking a picture of Patrick's headstone. The cemetery is still run down with many of the sandstone markers just stumps or not readable or just gone, which is why we couldn't find Priscilla's marker in 2001. This time, while wandering around, my wife found a somewhat new headstone for Priscilla and
\(\triangle_{\text {Pleasant Brents not far from her father, Patrick's grave. Someone had apparently added a new headstone }}\) for the couple sometime after 2001. On our way back to the highway I consulted a map that I had showing where Patrick's land had been and found that the dirt road we were on cut right through his property and in fact we were sitting right on it, perhaps close to where Patrick and Eunice raised their family. I didn't have an epiphany, nor did shivers run up and down my spine. It was just kind of nice to be there and see what my ancestors saw more than a hundred years ago.

Well Phil, that's it. I haven't done much of anything regarding genealogy for awhile. If you can use any of this for the UB feel free to edit it however you want. Have you sent this same e-mail to Mae Cox? She has become quit an Upchurch researcher and is coming close to finishing her Upchurch book. Her address is mae@coxok.com.
