He died testate in Wake County in 1808. He married, perhaps in N.C., 1748 Mary - who was born 1732 in N.C. She may have been Mary Tapp as William Tapp of Culpeper Co., Va. names daughter Mary Yates (wife of William) in his will.

William served in the Revolutionary War as a private in McRee's Company from N.C.

## PREFACE

This writer has spent the past twenty years in researching the Yates and related families in the Eastern States of the United States. I have made many trips into Virginia and North Carolina, sometimes twice per calendar year. And, of course, my research has been extensive in Tennessee.

In these many genealogical research trips I have intensively examined records in librarics, courthouses, and cemeteries, and I have consulted with hundreds of individuals in my arcas of research regarding any or all known Yates families. This has required many trips by automobile, living in hotels and motels, and eating meals "on the run." It has been an expensive undertaking. However, I have now recorded my findings into a volume which I fecl is unmatched by anything similarly written on these families and this book is offered to those who purchase it at only the cost of my paying for its publishing!

One of the regrets in my search is that I have been unable to definitely prove the parents of our John Yates (1). However, I have been able to connect and prove many crrors that have appeared in earlier print and have been handed down from our third generations from John Yates. This has been in print by myself and others. There is research that shows a John Yates, b. March 26, 1728-29, of the early Baltimore County, Maryland, families. At this point I do not tic cur John Yates with the one b. 1728-29. However, I enter this matter here to verify that I am acquainted with this research.

Having been born in Tennessec on the land grants of James Yates, Sr., and Thomas Kilgore, Sr., that they each received before Cross Plains, Robertson County, were known as a town and a county, I fecl fully qualified to record both my personal knowledge and my rescarch findings. Fourth and fifth gencrations of these two antecedents now reside on this land.

This book has been written and outlined in genealogical order with the reader in mind. It will became a valuable research tool for practicing genealogists. Also, it will be invaluable to those hundreds of descendants in this family who have a desire to and a need to know about their family heritage. It has been hard work. But it is a "labor of love" and I hope its contents will transcend for centuries to comc. These are the primary purposes for which Yates and Allied Families has been written.

To supplement the gencalogical recordings, many pictures and original court records appear in the book. This, of course, gives the book added attraction to whom I hope will be many hundreds of readers throughout subsequent years.

## CHAPTER 1 - - EARLY YATES AND RELATED FAMILIES IN AMERICA

Individuals by the name of Yates were among the earliest pioneers in this country. Two individuals by this name were living here when the Pilgrims landed at Plymouth. The first Yates, according to the records, to discover America was "Ferdinando Yate, gent," who arrived at Jamestown in the Virginia Colony on the ship "Margaret" in December, 1619. He wrote back to England telling what a beautiful country it was. He returned to England on the ship "Supply" on April 3, 1621. ${ }^{1}$

The next Yates to reach Virginia was Edward Yates, born 1606, a boy of 14, who, with about 50 other young fellows, arrived on the Ship "Duty" in May $1620 .{ }^{2}$

A Leonard Yates was living in Flowerdieu Hundred. A James Yates with a will in Charles County, Maryland, in 1750 , lists five sons, Charles, James, William, Leonard, and John Yates, and daughters, Dorothy Ann Nevit, Margaret, and Elizabeth Yates, and wife, Jaynet. ${ }^{3}$

A tax taken in 1623 of the Virginia Colony shows a "Mr. Yates" living at Elizabeth City. One of these was John Yates, who in 1636 was granted 350 acres of land in Elizabeth City County, Virginia. Their names appear in Virginia Land Grants. ${ }^{4}$

The head of Middlesex County, Virginia, Yates' was Bartholomew Yates (1676-1734) and a graduate of Oxford University, who was Professor of Divinity at William and Mary College. His parents were William and Catherine Yates of Shockley, England. His son, the Rev. William Yates, was President of William and Mary College from 1761-1764. Bishop Meade of Virginia wrote of him half century ago as "One of that family which so abounded in ministers," and Goode, in his Virginia Cousins says of him that the "Rev. William Yates, who married Elizabeth Randolph, and his brother, the Rev. Robert Yates, who married Elizabeth's sister, Mary Randolph, daughters of William Randolph of Turkey Island, were the ancestors of most of the Yates' family in Virginia." 5

A Thomas Yates in York County, Virginia, leaves a will March 7, 1693, with wife, Elliner, daughter Margaret, and a son, Peter Yates, living in New Kent County, Virginia. A John Yates witnessed the will of John Custis August 21, 1704, New Kent County, Virginia. A John Yates deceased May 16, 1718, leaving a son, John,Jr., New Kent County, Virginia. ${ }^{6}$

John and George Yates are listed with land grants in the Luenburg County, Virginia Old Land Grant book. They were living in what became Bedford County, Virginia, in 1753. The George Yates bought land in Orange County, North Carolina, from William Chambers while living in Bedford County, Virginia. He sold the land in 1761 to John Pryor. The records of early deeds were destroyed. When the Clerk recorded the deed of George Yate in the Court Minutes, he recorded it John Yates in the place of George Yate which has been proven by the deed where George sold the land. 7

Three William Yates' were living in Mecklenburg, Halifax, and Bedford Counties, Virginia. The William Moore Yates in Mecklenburg seems to be the William Yates with a will in Halifax County, Virginia, in 1822. The William Yates was living in Bedford County, Virginia, in 1765 when he and his wife, Ann Thornbury Yates, sold land to a Thomas Cockey and a Joseph, Ensor in Baltimore County, Maryland. He received a gr-
ant in Bedford County, Virginia, in 1771. ${ }^{8}$ The George and William Yates would seem to be from the Maryland Mate family.

Two early John Yates' (Yeats) are found in early grants of Halifax County, Virginia. Years of research indicate that one of the John Yeats of Halifax County dater a part of Pittsylvania County, Virginia, descended from John Yeats of Lower Norfolk County, Virginia. He received several grants in 1636 on both sides of the Elizabeth River near Smithfield and Suffolk. He was a vestryman connected with several Colonial Churches in the Norfolk area, and founded the first free school in Virginia. ${ }^{9}$ The John and Elizabeth Yates, deceased 1726-1731, Richmond County, Virginia, North Farnham Parish, seem to be the ones in early Colonial records of North Carolina by Parker.

Another famous family of the name Yeats was that of those living in Eastern New York. These were descendants of Joseph Yates of Leeds, Yorkshire, England, who settled in Albany soon after the surrender of that province by the Dutch to the English in $1664 .{ }^{10}$

The first Yates' in Pennsylvania appears to have been John and James Yates from Walton in Lancashire, England, who landed in Philadelphia in 1684. A James Yates in 1737, with another pioneer, was probably a grandson of the above James Yates, who made that "Indian Walk" or boundary line run famous in Pennsylvania history, going between "sunrise and sunset on one day and sunrise and noon of the next 86 miles through the woods." 1

In Maryland records it is shown that George Mate, a Deputy Surveyor of that province, made his will proven in 1691 in Anne Arundel County, Maryland, naming wife, Mary, and children, George, John, and Ann. ${ }^{12}$ A John Yates of Dorchester County, Maryland, in 1677 and a Robert Yates, aged 30, were of Charles County in 1686. These Yates' descend from Berkshire, England. ${ }^{13}$

The first Yates' to settle in Massachusetts was John Yates, whom the Duxbury records show had a son, John, born there to his wife, Mary, on August 15, 1650. He removed to Eastham, on Cape Cod, and died. Mary, his wife, was granted Administrator of his estate on June 8, 1651. John Yates, of Eastham, probably a grandson, married Abigail Rogers and very likely founded the long line of Yates' on Cape Cod --Josiah, John, Joseph, and Isaiah Yates. They were soldiers in the Revolutionary War. ${ }^{14}$

The Round Pond Yates' were the earliest Yates' in Maine. These descend from the John Yates of Cape Cod.

In New Jersey, there were Yates' families at Cape May in 1762. There were Yates' families in nearly all the 13 Colonies long before the Revolutionary War.

In the Colonial Records of North Carolina by Parker a John Yates appears in Court records November-December, 1696-1701. In Bertie County, North Carolina, a William Yates made a will December 23, 1751, and a James Yates of Carteret County, North Carolina, made his will November 8, $1750 .{ }^{15}$

John, Thomas, James, and William Yates were in Roan County, North Carolina, July 12, 1763. John Yates bought personal things, cows, a feather bed, and furniture from a William Bobbitt February 28, 1769, Roan County, North Carolina. A Henry Yates and a Robbard (Robert) Kilgore are listed in the 1750 Tax of Granville County, North Carolina. A. Henry Yates was transported to Elizabeth City, Virginia 1635.

Following the termination of the French and Indian War in 1760, the concluding Treaty of Paris in 1763, and during the final stages of that war, thousands of the colony of Virginia inhabitants and inhabitants from other nearby colonics migrated into the Carolinas. But the first setters that came to North Carolina came there as early as 1656. And there were settlers in Albermarle County, North Carolina, even before 1656. Forty-two years had elasped between the first settlement and the first town in North Carolina.

In 1707 the first settlement was made in Craven County, North Carolina. A colony of French Huguenot settled in the year 1690 above the falls of the James River. They were not satisfied and moved southward and settled on the Trent and Neuse Rivers, mostly on the Trent in Craven County.

In 1664 part of the colony between Albermarle and Clarendon was formed into a colony which was given the name of Bath. In 1705 both of these were divided into threc precincts, Craven being including in the Arclidale Precinct. ${ }^{1}$

During the first half of the 1700's Scotch-Irish and German settlers began to arrive in the back country from Pennsylvania. The French and Indian War (1754-1763) sounded the doom on French domination in North America. So then settlers could and did roam freely up and down the southeast coast from Virginia, the Carolinas, Gcorgia, and on to Florida. Following this as years passed the other southeastern states were formed.

In 1710 Baron Christopher de Graffenreid established a colony of Swiss emigrants and German Protestant refugees from the Palatinate. He selected a site on the Trent River and called it New Bern. The next year the Tuscarora Indians killed 130 of these pioneer settlers, and then, moving north, attacked Albermarle Sound communities.

Only after two years of bitter warfare were the Indians driven out. Many Highland Scots came to North Carolina after their defeat at Culloden Moor in 1746. Along with settlers from neighboring colonies, they made up the 300,000 North Carolina residents who had spread from the Atlantic seaboard on east to the Appalachians before the outbreak of the Revolutionary War.

These North Carolina colonists were an independence-loving people. Their resisting nulified the dreaded Stamp Act imposed by the crown. In the western countics of North Carolina a group of pioncers known as the "Regulators," rebelled in 1768 against taxes and methods of the English royal officials. They were defeated by Governor William Tyron in a battle along Alamance Creck, May 16, 1771. Yet the struggle continued under such rebel leaders as George Durant, Thomas Pollock, Edward Mosley, Hugh Waddle, and Cornelius Harnett.

In the face of strong opposition from the royal governor, Josiah Martin, North Carolinians organized a provincial congress, August 25, 1774. It developed plans for a temporary government. When the news of the Battle of Lexington came, citizens of Mccklenburg County met at Charlotte. According to local history, on May 20, 1775, they drew up the first declaration of independence in the colonies, the "Mecklenburg Declaration of Independence." This date is on the seal and flag. More certain of proof, however, was a mecting on May 15 of the same year in Charlotte, which adopted more moderate resolutions, the Mecklenburg Resolves.

North Carolina's militia gained a victory over government troops at Moore's Creek Bridge, February 27, 1776. On April 12 of the same year North Carolina's provincial congress directed its delegates to the Continental Congress to vote for independence. North Carolina was the first colony to take this important step toward freedom from English rule. Following the adoption of a state constitution, December 18, 1776, Richard Caswell was elected the first Governor. Thus, North Carolina was one of the original Thirteen Colonies!

It should not be forgotten that like the State of North Carolina, Cassel County was born during the American Revolution and most of the events in the county between 1777 and 1783 reflect that fact. Winning the war was the main objective of the young state and in the county involved. Many young men were either serving in the militia or in the Continental Line.

Cassel County was called upon in March, 1779, to provide a portion of the 1,500 men to be raised immediately for the defense of North Carolina and the neighboring states faced with the British invasion. Caswell's quota was one captain, one ensign, and forty-three privates.

General Charles Cornwallis left Wilmington on April 25, 1781, marching north. He had failed to capture North Carolina as he had South Carolina and Georgia, but thought he might return to complete that task after taking Virginia. This he was unable to do. He surrendered to General George Washington at Yorktown on October 19, 1781.

The Reverend Hugh McAden, a native of Pennsylvania and a graduate of the College of Princeton, New Jersey, came south on a missionary journey in 1755. On July 29th he crossed the Dan River into North Carolina and preached at one Brandon's in the morning and in the afternoon about twelve miles further he arrived at the home of Solomon Debow on Fico Creek.

Reverend McAden afterwards moved into Dublin County, North Carolina, where he remained until 1768. Then he came back to Orange County and settled on Hico Creek where he became pastor of the Red House and other churches until his death January 20, 1781. He is buried in the Red House Church Cemetery.

Reverend Hugh McAden died a short while before the British troops under General Charles Cornwallis invaded the area, and his grave is said by tradition to have been opened by Cornwallis' troops in searh of gold and other valuables. British troops are also credited with the destruction of Reverend McAden's journals, books, and other records and with damage to the church and family property.

We have established proof that numerous of our families migrated to and settled in Caswell County in North Carolina. Land records, deeds, marriage records, wills, and other related court records with reference to our Yates family ancestors currently repose in the county courthouse at Cassel County.

Also, the Halifax County, Virginia, courthouse abounds with early court records of our Yates' ancestors. This is based on the geographical fact that Halifax and adjoining Virginia counties are so nearly approximate to the North Carolina state line. Of course, this would also include Pittsylvania County and the other adjoining Virginia counties.

It seemed to me from time to time as I traveled over the rolling hills and valleys of
the counties that I have mentioned in both Virginia and North Carolina that I could just " simply feel the presence of someone or more present. I felt as though I had been there before on early in my life. I felt as though I was in the presence of my early Yates ancestors. I was riding and walking on the ground where they had been!!"

Also the book Roster of Soldiers from North Carolina in the American Revolution, published by the Gen. Publishing Co. of Baltimore in 1984 verifies this information on pages 85, 91, 193, 194, 225, 232, 357, and 709"

\section*{Mill History}

Yates Mill served Wake County as a waterpowered mill for more than 200 years. Of the 70 gristmills that once served Wake County, Yates Mill is the only one still in operating condition.

The water-powered gristmill was an important economic and social center for residents of Wake County from colonial times through the early 1900s. Gristmills provided the important service of grinding corn and wheat into meal and flour.

In rural areas of North Carolina, before towns or
 crossroad-stores developed, gristmills served as public gathering places for scattered rural populations. Millponds were popular locations for fishing, swimming and picnicking. Yates Millpond is again a popular gathering place, as it once was in the past.

\section*{1750-1802, Samuel Pearson}

Samuel Pearson, the mill's founder, is thought to have first acquired property in the Wake County area around 1750, when he purchased land from John Monk. The earliest known document related to Pearson's activity around Steep Hill Creek and the land that now surrounds the mill dates to 1756. This document, a request for a land survey, appears to include the land where Samuel's home stood. After this 1756 request, Samuel Pearson officially received the related land grant in 1761. In March 1763, Pearson submitted an entry, claiming ownership of the land where he built the mill. No subsequent documents were issued regarding this piece of land because the British land office ceased operation after the Earl of Granville's death later that year. The start of the American Revolution several years later further delayed the issuance of new land. Action was not taken until 1778, when the new State of North Carolina issued Pearson a survey for the same land he claimed in 1763. This survey is the first known document on file that specifically mentions the mill as already standing.

\section*{1802-1819, Simon Pearson}

Samuel Pearson owned the mill until his death in 1802. In his will, he divided his land among his four sons, and intended the proceeds of the sale of his personal property to go to his six daughters. His son, Simon Pearson, received 340 acres of land that included the old mill. Because of debts owed to the State Bank of North Carolina, Simon Pearson was forced to sell his land, including the mill, in a sheriff's sale in 1819.

\section*{1819-1853, William Boylan}

The sheriff sold the property for \(\$ 3,031\) to William Boylan, a prominent Raleigh businessman and director of the State Bank. Boylan established Raleigh's first newspaper, The Raleigh Minerva, by the close of the 19th century; he later also established the Raleigh Advertiser. He also served on the commission to build a new state capital. In order for the mill to continue as a successful business, Boylan made constant changes to the mill building and its operation. Architectural evidence shows that major renovations were likely made to the structure between 1820 and 1850. This most likely came in response to a flood in the early 1800s, which probably destroyed the original mill; however, despite that setback, Boylan had a sawmill operating at the mill by the 1840 s.

\section*{1853-1863, John Primrose, James Dodd, Thomas Briggs, James Penny}

Mr. Boylan owned the mill for 37 years. He sold it to John Primrose, Thomas H. Briggs and James Penny on June 30, 1853. In 1859, James Dodd bought Primrose's share of the mill. Thomas H . Briggs was a prosperous Raleigh businessman who started a building materials business that continues today as Briggs Hardware. Briggs was Raleigh's most influential postCivil War businessman. Having wisely converted his Confederate currency into silver before the war's conclusion, Briggs was one of the few North Carolinians with money to invest during Reconstruction.

\section*{1863-1902, Phares and Roxanna Yates}

On March 2, 1863, Penny, Dodd and Briggs sold the mill and 94 surrounding acres to Phares Yates. James Penny's possible involvement in the murder of Hinton Franklin may have prompted the sale. Local legend says Franklin was a northern sympathizer whom Penny reportedly killed for not paying a \(\$ 700\) mill debt. Franklin's widow supposedly told Union troops that were occupying the Raleigh area in 1865 that her husband's death was a result of his political beliefs. Allegedly, the troops tried to burn the mill by setting fire to the entrance porch. Charred wooden beams from the mill's underside are possible evidence of the attempted burn. Court records show that Penny was tried for murder in December 1866 but was found not guilty. Upon his death in 1902, Phares Yates left his real estate and the mill on Steep Hill Creek to his son, Robert E. Lee (R.E.L.) Yates, a math professor at North Carolina State College. R.E.L. Yates left the land and the mill to his wife, Minnie Johns Yates, when he passed away on December 28, 1937.

\section*{1937-1947, Minnie John Yates}

Ten years later, Minnie Yates and her son


Wilbur sold the mill to the Trojan Sales Company, a subsidiary of A.E. Finley Associates. The title was later transferred to the North Carolina Equipment Company, another subsidiary of A.E. Finley Associates. A.E. Finley built a retreat lodge for use by his family and employees on the millpond. The mill continued operation until the 1950s, when it closed for lack of business.

\section*{1963-present, North Carolina State University (NCSU)}

North Carolina State University obtained title to the mill and the pond in 1963. The property was part of a 1,000-acre tract that was purchased for use by North Carolina State University Field Laboratory's experimental farms and demonstration fields. Shortly after the University obtained the property, John Daniel Lea - the miller who had worked at the mill since 1898 - operated the mill for the last time as a demonstration.

\section*{1989, Yates Mill Associates forms and begins mill restoration}

After the mill shut down for business, it began to fall into disrepair. In 1989, the nonprofit group Yates Mill Associates (YMA) formed to preserve and restore the mill. In 1996, after stabilizing the mill building, YMA approached Wake County with a proposal to turn Yates Mill into a county park. Park planning between NC State, YMA, Wake County and the North Carolina Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services began, and the Wake County Board of Commissioners approved the park's master plan in 1997.

\section*{1996, Park planning begins}


In 2001 N.C. State leased 157 acres to Wake
County. In addition, Wake County bought 16 acres upstream and signed a memorandum of understanding with the N.C. Department of Agriculture for the development of hiking trails on 400 acres of land upstream from the pond. Shortly after park planning began, Hurricane Fran breached the dam, drained the millpond and caused the shed to collapse in the fall of 1996. The mill and its pond were badly damaged, but not beyond repair. Restoration of the mill and its grinding machinery was finally finished in 2005.

\section*{1999, Development of the 174-acre historic and environmental park begins}

Construction of the visitor center for the park began in summer 2003, and was completed in April 2006. Historic Yates Mill County Park opened to the public May 20, 2006. Tours of Yates Mill are available to the public March through November, and corn-grinding demonstrations are offered the third weekend of each month during that time.

COLORADO COUNTY FEUD. The Colorado County Feud, a series of gun battles between members of the Townsend family of Columbus, started during the 1898 Colorado County sheriff's race. The election pitted incumbent sheriff Sam Reese against his one time deputy, Larkin Hope. Former state senator Mark Townsend, who directed a political machine that had backed the winning candidate in each of the last nine sheriff's elections, dropped his backing of Reese and endorsed Hope. The move seemingly assured Hope of victory. But on August 3, 1898, Hope was killed by an
unknown assailant in downtown Columbus. Immediately, suspicion centered on Jim Coleman, a close friend of Sam Reese's sons, Walter and Herbert. Townsend picked a new candidate, Will Burford, and, with feeling running high against the Reeses, Burford won the election. Less than a year later, on March 16, 1899, Sam Reese was killed in a gun battle on the street near where Hope died. Will Clements, Marion Hope, and Mark Townsend were among those shooting. Stray bullets killed Charles Boehme, a bystander, and wounded a boy named Johnny Williams. Even though the best evidence suggests that Reese had provoked the fight in which he was killed, his sons vowed to get revenge. In five more gunfights-on May 17, 1899, January 15, 1900, July 31, 1900, June 30, 1906, and May 17, 1907-five more men were killed and several others wounded. The dead included Reese's brother Dick, Burford's son Arthur, Will Clements's brother Hiram, and Jim Coleman. Also dead was another innocent bystander, Dick Gant. No one was ever convicted of any of the murders. Those accused included Mark Townsend, Jim Townsend, Step Yates, Will Clements, Walter Reese, Joe Lessing, Frank Burford, and Marion Hope. The Townsends, Reeses, Burfords, Clementses, Hopes, and Lessings were all related to each other, either directly or through marriage.
The feud had a direct effect on the economic wellbeing of Columbus. Boehme, a farmer, had been in town buying supplies when shooting erupted and he was killed. His death persuaded many area farmers to buy their supplies elsewhere. The peaceful citizens of Columbus, trying to end the feuding, asked the city council to reestablish the office of city marshal, which had been abolished some years earlier. For financial reasons, they refused. On August 7, 1906, the citizenry voted to abolish the corporation of the city of Columbus and turn the administration of the town over to the county. The town remained unincorporated for twenty years.
Many of the other participants in the feud died violent, early deaths. Marion Hope was killed in an accident in Gonzales County in 1911. That same year, Will Clements was shot from ambush in Matagorda County by a man with whom he had had an altercation a few days earlier. Jim Townsend was also killed in 1911, in a gun battle with a saloon keeper in Louise. Herbert Reese was killed in 1912, when a gun he was cleaning in his Columbus home accidentally discharged. \section*{Hi, Phil,}

Thank you so much for the package of info you sent me a little while ago. I'm very impressed with the depth and breadth of your research. I hope one day to approach for my particular lines the level of what you've done for yours.

The Jordans (pre-1850) are an elusive bunch. My direct ancestor, Calvin Jordan, 1807-1858 is my brick wall. There exists in the NC Archives a partial family Bible that lists his mother as Mary Jordan, d. 1846. She appears to be the older female in Calvin's household in both the 1830 and 1840 census records for Wake Co. There is a marriage license for a Mary Stevens to Henry Jordan in Johnston Co in 1797, which is not outside the realm of possibility, but further research doesn't make a firm connection. My thinking is trending toward an illegitimacy issue. There is a will for a Henry Jordan d. 1820 who left Polly Jordan \(\$ 1.00\). When I do get to the Archives, I'm slowly reviewing tax lists for Wake and Johnston Co to see if I can establish some connections, but so far, it's turned up nothing!

My dad did a DNA test with inconclusive results, so this may just be one of those brick walls that remains standing. I'm fortunate that many of my other lines extend farther back.

I am reviewing the Jordan research you sent because if I ever break down the wall, the earlier Jordan research will already be there to take the line on back!

My research on my line of Jordans from Calvin on is fairly detailed and extensive. I have some original family letters from the late 1850 s that have helped me untangle the threads of the 11 children that Calvin had. Calvin's children settled from NC to Florida, Arkansas, and Kentucky. The story would make a great Lifetime movie. Researching my direct ancestors here in Wake Co has been a pleasure. The family stayed fairly put, had many mentions in newspapers, and were active in community and church affairss. The details that I have unearthed have helped me imagine them as real people with real lives, not just dates and places.

My Yates line research goes back to William Yates d. 1808 in Wake Co. There is a land grant for William Yeats entered in 1783 and dated 1785 for land in Wake. There is controversy about where he came from. One related Yates family researcher was/is living in KY, but I haven't been able to track them down to make contact directly. One of William Yates' sons was William Yates, Jr, who had Eli, who had Carlos, my g-g-grandfather. I have a lot of info on William Yates Sr and Jr and their descendants, not complete, but adequate. It's the going farther in the past that has been problematic.

Thank you again for all you sent. It's gratifying to know that there are active researchers out there who share common interests. Please let me know when you'll be coming this way!

Thanks for letting me know about Ollie Yates' passing. I added him to my Yates tree under his parents. Ollie is of the Matthew Yates line (son of Rev War Soldier William "of Wake" Yates. I have attached the descendant line from Matthew Yates to Ollie.

Basil Manley Yates purchased 191 acres from his father William H Yates in 1840 (Wake Deed book 20 Page 132) adjacent to the Nathan Mills cemetery to the west. This property ran from the lower end of Batchelor Rd south across Green Level West Rd and Castleberry Rd to White Oak Creek. The property went to his children and includes the Yates-Batchelor house (torn down recently), the Williams house (stone wall and turret) and Mal Johnson houses on Green Level Road West (both still standing) and the Yates/Castleberry house (big American Four Square) at the end of Castleberry road. Ollie Yates' family grew up in this house, if I'm not mistaken. Basil Yates' house was on the parcel adjacent to the Mills cemetery and is gone.

Also of note... the William H Yates house is still standing on the west side of White Oak Church Road, though is in danger, I fear.

These upgraded Biofiles reveal the power of the Biofile System in general. As a highlight I will cite entry 2 for OWY,Sr. which details my February 2, 1980 visit with Paul Mills in his home a few yards south of the Mills Cemetery.This reveals that this Yates family lived cheek by jowl near the Naaman Mills Family and near the Nathan Upchurch, I Family at Green Level and the Moses Upchurch Family that lived just west in Chatham. I'll bet Kim has this all knitted together in her records.```
