Hello Mr. Upchurch. I feel as though I am late in contacting you. But at least I am contacting you now. Green Berry Upchurch of Wilkes County, NC was my GGG Grand Father. He was born in September 1824. His mother was named "Happy", I believe. I am not sure if it was a nickname or a legal name. I do not know who his father was. I believe that he likely had a wife and a family prior to the Civil War, but I am not sure if - and if so what happened to them. He enlisted in D Company of the 33rd NC in 1863 and fought with them for awhile, almost to the end but was not with them at the surrender at Appomattox, for some reason. He would have been almost 40 when he mustered in. He returned to Wilkes County and married (again?) to Mary Shors(sp?) and I only know of one child bore to them - Charles Richard Upchurch. Mary Shors Upchurch died prior to 1880. In the 1880 census Green Berry is living alone with his young son, Charles, still in Wilkes County and is listed as a widower. At some time between 1880 and 1890 Green Berry Upchurch and his young son moved to near Anson County, NC - where I believe they had some relatives living. But that is only speculation. I am not really sure why they moved that far away from Green Berry's home county. I do believe that the Upchurch's kept in contact with one another (across county and even state lines) and I would love to find the letters that they wrote each other. I find it interesting that in the 1880 Census Green Berry is living with only his five year old son. I wonder who was providing and who was able to care for young Charles. At any rate they ended up east of Charlotte. At least Charles did. It is said that Charles had a very difficult upbringing and I can see why. He married Alice Zena Gadd at a very young age in 1892. He was only 17, and she was only 15! Alice was the youngest daughter of (what I would consider) a Civil War hero - James E. Gadd of the 26th NC - K Company - "The Pee Dee Wild Cats". They were mustered out of Anson County, NC. The 26th, and James Gadd along with them, fought through the Battle of New Bern, then in Virginia at Malvern Hill, then back in NC for the heroic effort at the small Battle of Rawl's Mill, and back to Virginia. Onward after that they drove with the Lee and his legions to Pennsylvania. They fought with bravery on the first day of Gettysburg when they charged the so called "Iron Brigade" of the Union and pushed them back, but with terrible cost. Out of 800 men, 588 were either dead or wounded. And there on that day James E. Gadd was shot twice in the same arm, which was amputated in a field hospital the next day. James was sent back to NG and although crippled, married and had several children, the last of which was Alice Zena Gadd. Charles Richard Upchurch married her when she was just 15 years old and he was 17. They struggled in the Reconstruction Era south and Charles found work where he could. In the 1900 census Charles and Alice are found in Union County, NC with three kids and only in their early 20's. Between 1900 and 1905 they may have moved to Scotland County, NC for a short time, as my G-grandmother is shown elsewhere to have been born in "Laurel Hill, NC". Either way by 1908 they were in Greenville, South Carolina. I remember my grandmother saying to me, "After they started building the cotton mills in Greenville, many people from North Carolina started moving in." In this case she was right. Around this time Green Berry Upchurch died in September 1906 and he was buried at a veterans cemetery. - Anyway Charles and Alice moved into a mill house on Judson Road in Greenville and became part of the "mill village". It must have been quite a lifestyle change for them, having been used to open country and farmland. But they made due with what they had and managed to make a living and ended up having a total of eight children. (Lena Mae Upchurch was my G-Grandmother). Around the time of WWI there were three Boling brothers that built a church directly behind Charles and Alice's home on Judson Road. It was a Church of Christ and it was built on Jamison Street (literally directly behind Charles and Alice). The Upchurch's became involved in this church and two daughters married into the Boling family (from which I descend). Mary Upchurch, the eldest, married Willie O'Dell Boling and Lena Mae Upchurch married Frederick James Boling. Willie O. Boling was in WWI and suffered injuries due to mustard gas. He had respiratory issues the rest of his life, I believe. Frederick James Boling was several years younger than Willie and fell in love with Lena Mae Upchurch a few years after that war.





Grad Park Hi Sch 1932, went to Jr. College (T.I.I) '32 - grad 1934. Entered US Army at Ft Bragg, NC 3 Aug 1935 and retired US Army at Ft. Benning, Ga. 31 Oct 1966 as MSG E-8, to Sitka, AK. 1975 I moved to Jax Beach, FL, 1976 moved to El Cajon, CA with my niece Barbara (Cagle) Ray [mathenia, later] and in 1978 moved back to Jax Beach. And here I am!

* I served in US Army: Ft Bragg, N.C.; Ft ~~Kamehameha~~, Oahu (T.H.)[→]; Ft Moultrie, SC; Ft Monroe, Va, CA School; Key West Barracks, FL; SC. Ft Hancock, NJ; Kodiak, AK, Amchitka Is, AK; Ft H.G. Wright, NY; Camp Drake (Tokyo) Japan; Ft Knox, KY; Camp Drake, Japan; Korea; Ft Knox, KY; ~~Ft~~ Fairbanks, AK; Ft Ord, CA; Ft Benning, GA.

For the major part of my army career I was in Operations (S-3) and Intelligence (S-2, G-2) divisions of Battalions, Regts and Divisions as Assistant, and/or Chief of section or division. In Coast Artillery School (VA) I learned ~~an~~ ^{Coast} artillery electrician, then went to a short course at Sperry Gyroscope in Brooklyn, NY to become AAA arty Director Repairman - to which job I was never assigned! From Key West Barracks, FL, where I was reassigned from 13th Coast Artillery to the 265th CA (Fla N.G - impressed into Federal Service) we (265th C.A.) were sent to Camp Jackson, S.C. (1942?) for intensive training (3 mos) for Desert Warfare (Africa?), then sent to Ft Hancock, NJ. (snow, ice, cold), then to Kodiak, AK for about 9 mos, and watched infantrymen come thru to chase out the Japanese from the Aleutians.

Then the 245th C.A. Regt was reorganized into 3 separate Battalions and shipped out on the Aleutians: to ~~Gold Harbor~~ Adak, Amchitka, and Attu Islands. There we lived in dug-in Quonset huts, where each man had 3 days of emerg. C rations, in case we became snow bound or had a zephyr of 90-130 mph, and couldn't get to the unit mess facility. To the best of my knowledge the last of the Japanese had escaped (or starved/frozen), though tall tales were told of things being pilfered and almost-sightings of enemy. I can still vividly recall the mid-night alerts that first winter (43?) when we manned our posts until 4-5 o'clock AM after radar spotted "possible enemy ships" heading toward Amchitka (radar was not too discerningly definitive then), then released from alert when the "flotilla" resolved itself into a snow storm.

Things became real 'posh' toward the end: Our cigarette ration purchase privilege was upped to about 2-3 cartons/mo, and beer to a case/mo. (Of course deals were made between non-drinkers/smokers and those who did drink/smoke). Cooks could make pretty good Raisin Jack, and my battery had one adept (red-neck) who managed a still in a cave in the cliffs above the Bering Sea/Pacific (for \$30.00 for a fifth). And US Bottled-in-Bond could be occasionally had for \$50.00 a fifth, from crews of supply ships. The Bn Sgt. maj. received a ²⁻³ bottle (from home (FL)) for Xmas '44 through the APO which had a tag around the neck from some postal (APO) clerk, to wit: "Shipping alcoholic beverages thru the mail is against regulations. This was improperly packaged and became undeliverable as it was. Notify your correspondent to be more careful. Merry Christmas."

On V.J Day ^{2 Sept} in '45 I was designated by the Bn S-3 officer to fire a 90 mm. ^{Guru} Battery (of AA) as a salute, the morning we received the word of surrender, so we fired about 50 rounds, then the Bn CO gave the Bn the rest of the day off. Being one of the few days of sunshine during the year and ~~was~~ calm, and warm (at 60°-65°),

Our forward CP got out in time OK.
Sorry to run on like this, cousin Phil. I hope the date is what you had in mind.

After a brief tour at Ft Hancock, N.J. I went to Ft H.G. Wright, NY, just out of New London, Conn, then to Cp Drake, Japan where I was chief clerk for G-2 1st Cav Div. Then to Ft Knot where I was " " for 5-3 of a training Bn. Then in 1949, back to 1st Cav Div, Japan as asst chief of Div G-2, and in June '50 became Chief Clerk G-2 1st Cav Div and shipped to Korea, then in '51 returned to Ft Knot, Ky, with the Operations Sgt at The Armored School. In '60 I shipped to Fairbanks AK as 1st Sgt of an Armor Co. In '63 I was reassigned to an Armored Brigade, then to Ft Benning, Ga where I retired Oct 31, 1966.

I really loved the tour in Oahu, HI. and would have loved to retire, but cost of living had escalated too much from when I was there '37-'40. I think AK has the most beautiful land/scenery of the U.S. Even the -50° in Fairbanks, and playing soldier in the wilds on maneuvers far from Fairbanks at -75° was enjoyable in a manner of speaking.

While in Korea, the cold seemed to me much harsher than that in AK, but the tour there was under different circumstances (war). Another war story:- Once in our early drive to the Yalu River (Nov '50), we were really moving North fast - so fast the Division Command Post (1st Cav Div), to keep up with the Troops, had to be split in half, leaving part of CP behind. The Forward CP moved into position a few miles from the Yalu R in late afternoon. When we had established communications with the Regiments, we discovered the Div Forward CP was a few thousand yards ahead of all the Troops. About 2 AM I was ordered back to regular CP, leaving a skeleton force there. The ~~next~~ morning later and the first big after daybreak the Chinese cam across the Yalu, Retrograde began.

Sure was surprised to hear from you so soon after the Address Change. I didn't really expect a letter from you about this at all; but I am glad to hear from you regardless.

To answer your concern: my health is just fine (everything considered wrong with me). Last week I spent 2½ hours with a physician going over med. records, and have an appointment next week to continue! No, I didn't come here because of any present health problems. I have been considering coming here for several years. I just got enough of contending with bills for ~~doctors~~, dentists, dermatologists; all kinds of damn Doctors bills; hospitals; apartment rents, telephone bills, ad infinitum; taking care of my apartment, trying to cook and have a proper diet etc, etc. Know what I mean?

As you probably don't know, the Regular Army and Army Air Corps (later the US Air Force, I'm sure you know) enlisted and Warrant, contributed the big sum of 35 cents a month to the Soldiers Home (don't believe they do anymore); a few ~~few~~ dollars from

Summary Courts Martial fines also. A few years ago the Home was running low on funds and Congress passed a law levying a 25% of the gross pay of every Home resident. But enough of that. If you're interested, the next time you zip up to the Capitol, I'd love to have you drop up NW, meet you and perhaps show you around (I can see the Capitol dome from the Golf course). North Capitol Street passes by one gate, but the

to Upshur St. Main Gate is at end of Upshur Street (Didn't our family spell their name that way sometime?)

Since I only came here 17 July, I still don't really know my way around the Home too well, but I have the rest of my life to do that, don't I? I do plan to try to see if there are any Upchurches buried in the Cemetery here.

There are towns for the members (Home) several times a week for shopping (local towns and military bases) horse racing, festivals, etc, and I think I'll go on one to the Pentagon next week.

I sure would like to have been on the jaunt to Okinawa with you. I really liked it there 1937-40. I flew into there from Japan about 1947 or 48, and got bumped and had to take a troop ship to Calif. I didn't hear anything about the Arizona Memorial; don't know if it existed, but think not. I used to think I'd like retirement there. But too expensive now.

I have enclosed a not to scale map of the Home for your information; on the back I have sketched a 9x-5 plan of our rooms (bathrooms and toilets are down the halls). The two buildings, Scott and Sheridan, are the quarters (2^d-7th floors) for the men - the left section of Sheridan, Lady Sheridan, for the women.



Please don't get too excited - I won't keep this writing spree up after this letter. I just thought of something I should record, in case someone later would like to know how we live and interact with each other. You mentioned in your letter of 22 Dec 91 that Ed Cagle had written you a year before he died. That was news to me, because I'm unaware he had done so, or even knew you.

However, in case he didn't tell you: he donated his body to U. of Mich. for experimentation, and his ^(the) remains were to be returned (ashes) to Ms Anne Coble. She is very dear to us (Upchurches), even though she and Cagle never married. (She was the wife of a dear friend of Cagle's, Mr Coble - an airplane pilot who was killed in a crash. The Co. settlement was set up so that if she remarried, the money would stop. She and Cagle became very close friends and decided to live together. They had decided (when the death duties were about to run out, that they would soon get married). But then his fatal heart attack stopped that! Don't know if any remains were left.

Also - I don't believe I wrote this to you. Someone else may have; if so, disregard.

Ed. Cagle's mother, my sister Doris Ethel (Upchurch) Cagle, died at Jacksonville (actually at Orange Park Fla. Comm Hosp.). Her daughter Hilda, husband Lee Carpenter, Edward Cagle, and I took her ashes on a boat, went out the St. Johns River past the 3 mile limit in the Atlantic and scattered her ashes as per her request.

Dear Cousin Charles,

Delighted to have your letter of 28 DEC 91 and the details on your nephew Ed and your sister Sonja. The details have been placed in their Biopiler. A copy of the letter I had from Ed is enclosed. His sister Barbara placed me in contact with him and she subscribed to the U.B. on his behalf. I knew about the ashes of Sonja being spread but did not have the details you provided. I am always appreciative of information to be added to the Biopiler.

Thanks for your interest in my personal situation. The details are mostly told in the JAN 1987 issue of the U.B. a copy of which is enclosed. You need not return this. In the five years since a number of things have happened. In the spring of 1988 after five years as Associate Dean in the University of Arizona College of Agriculture (with the special responsibility for Instruction - hence also Director of Instruction) I changed positions and became for the College - Director of Development, Director of

Alumn, Director of Arboretum Affairs and Director of the Desert Legume Program. (Actually the change was forced because I was too aggressive as Director of Instruction - had an unfair five year review - but landed on my feet with a more interesting job - anyway the Dean (my boss) still believes in me). As Director of Development I raise money for the College - for scholarships, research, etc. - meet a lot of nice people, have a good entertainment budget. One fly in the ointment is that I have a new female Associate Director of Development who is too aggressive and is after my job.

As Director of Alumn Affairs I promote interactions with our 16,000 alumnii. - produce a quarterly newsletter, manage some big affairs at homecoming, etc. Again a lot of nice folks. I have a top notch assistant who handles much of these details.

As Director of Arboretum Affairs I oversee the Boyce Thompson Southwestern Arboretum which is about 90 miles away - it has about 16 employees, a budget of about 1,000,000/year. The Director of the Arboretum is very competent and he and I work together well.

The Desert Legume Program is my personal academic research area. LEGUMES are a special

group of plants some of which exist under desert (arid, semiarid lands) conditions. They have never been collected/studied and I am doing just that. We have about 1,000 species in hand collected from the deserts of the world and have a goal of \$4,000 species. This program involves about \$200,000/yr and about 6 people, one of whom handles the day to day aspect of the work. I am in the process of collecting money to set up an endowment to support this work long term.

On the farm front we have continued to buy land in Montgomery Co, MD and are up to five farms totaling 700 acres. I will keep buying to get up to an economic unit of 1500 acres. I will retire no later than 1 JUL 95 and move to Missouri and become a "gentleman farmer" - and have more time for genealogy -

Charles, don't worry about how often we exchange letters - I correspond with lots of people and just "let it happen". There are all kinds of personalities involved and I find the correspondence venture serves a variety of purposes. Basically, I think it is good for people to reach out to each other.

book.


I am glad that you are in a location where
