Kentucky Land Warrants:

In 1815 the Kentucky State Legislature passed an act relative to land distribution, and the records written in fulfillment of this statute are now known as Kentucky Land Warrants, 1816-1873. These grants consist of forty-three books and 25,621 grants. The act of the General Assembly governing this group of grants opened for sale, at \$20.00 per 100 acres, all the vacant lands to anyone in Kentucky, except an alien. The method followed was similar to that originally employed by Virginia, the purchaser securing receipt from the State Treasurer which was in turn converted into a land office warrant, authorizing the owner to locate and survey a certain acreage. When this had been completed and returned to the land office it was registered and a land patent was issued to the owner within about six months. This law, however, did not apply to lands west of the Tennessee River.

Grants west of Tennessee River → [SHADRACK u b 1884]

Following the acceptance of the treaty drawn by Andrew Jackson and Isaac Shelby with the Chickasaw Indians in 1818 and approved by Congress in 1819, the United States became the possessor of all lands lying between the Tennessee and Mississippi rivers in what is now both Kentucky and Tennessee. The Kentucky portion, oddly enough, became known as the Jackson Purchase and embraces McCracken, Ballard, Carlisle, Hickman, Fulton, Graves, Marshall and Calloway counties. These lands were opened up for settlement in 1820, the General Assembly appointing a surveyor to lay off this great boundary into sections and townships--a very fortunate provision. The records of this group have thus come to be known as Grants West of the Tennessee River, and are to be found in eleven volumes from 1822 to 1858. They comprise 8,713 grants.

Grants South of Walker's Line

A small group of grants known as the Grants South of Walker's Line were issued from 1825 to 1923. They are located as their title suggests, "South of Walker's Line," and north of the parallel 36 degrees and 30 minutes, a line which was accurately established in 1819 by Robert Alexander and Luke Munsell, following legislative appointment. Dr. Walker in running his line for the southern boundary of Kentucky in 1779-80 failed to establish the true parallel of 36 degrees and 30 minutes, his line falling variously from six to ten miles north of the true parallel. Since the old Walker line had been established as the southern boundary of Kentucky and covers a considerable distance, it will be seen that the lands indicated in these grants were really in Tennessee. To settle the matter an agreement was reached in 1820 by the Commissioners selected by the states of Kentucky and Tennessee, in furtherance of which Kentucky was given the right to issue grants for all of the territory lying north of parallel 36 degrees and 30 minutes and east of the Tennessee River.

Their oldest son TF Jr moved to Henry Co, TN prior to 1824 and encouraged Upchurches. In 1826 TF, Sr moved to Henry Co, TN to be near TF Jr & brought his younger children and DANIEL FRAZIER. After TF Jr died (< 5 SEP 1836) and before the 1840 census TF Sr moved to Gibson Co, TN where he died in 1844.

them and provide food. He was widely known for
his hospitality and this probably caused him to
neglect his farm. He was a prominent
member of the Baptist church at Pilot, NC
but some members preferred that he not
pray or he prayed too long. The church land
was given by the Stallings family.

The land near the Upland Cemetery
at Pilot, NC was land that came from
John Pearce, father-in-law of ANN.

Gill as a life estate and Virginia's children Walter C., James E., Bertie E. Sylvanus Z. and Alie A. are each entitled to 1/5 of the value of the land subject to the life estate of their mother. Walter C. and James E. are over 21 years of age and the other 3 children are minors, Bertie E. being 20 years old, Sylvanus Z. being 18 years old, and Alie A. being 15 years old, all of them living with their mother the petitioner Virginia N. Gill. The land was the property of Mrs. Clara A. Strickland and is described as "All that tract of land lying in Little River Township in the County of Wake and in Dunn Township in the County of Franklin

on the waters of Moccasin (sic) Creek, bounded on the North by the lands of Ambrose Upchurch and Benjamin Pearce; on the East by the lands of Joseph Glover and Henry Haywood's heirs; on the South by the lands of Noah Strickland, G.M. Bell and J.R. Edwards and on the West by the lands of Nannie A. Hunter, Lemon Chamblee, Thomas Wiggs and W.H. Chamblee, Jr." A large portion of the land is uncleared and yields a very small income, and it is greatly to the interest of all parties concerned that the land shall be divided before the life estate of the petitioner Virginia N. Gill shall terminate, so that the petitioners who are remaindermen may each own his land in severalty, with the right to improve the same and to render it more productive.

This document concerns a deed made 5 MAR 1870 in Franklin Co, NC. From it one may conclude that at his death in 1863 Berkely II, Sr designated 7 heirs to receive equal share ($8\frac{1}{2}$ acre each) of a 60 acre tract. In the 1870 deed three heirs (children of Berkely II, Sr) transfer their $25\frac{5}{8}$ acres ($8\frac{1}{2} \times 3$) to William Tunell, husband of Aiena II, a sibling of the three heirs. The three are Ambrose II [Ambrose Amos II], Martha Alford [Martha M. II] and Ursuly II [Ersula II]. 


