

△ TWIN BAKER HOUSES (NC/FL-PLACES)

- ① 26 JUN 2013 - RPM now moving details from MAY 2012 trip to FL, NC attempt to sort out Two Baker House built on the same plan. Called Simon Rogers for help. One is called the BILLY BAKER HOUSE (see more notes made on this house already processed). Simon says the other is the JOHN BAKER house at Baker Crossroads just north of Norris Creek at Walcott road. He calls John "One Legged John" as he lost a leg in the Civil War - ran a store at Baker Crossroads. Simon gives the following heritage

She has a horse operation and an attendant.

We drove by the spot shown on the Berry U. (Little Berry U) place on the 1890 map but could not make sense of it.

Took our leave of Simon & Staley. Staley had worked as a carpenter at Wake Forest College
