

▲ TWIN BAKER HOUSES (NC/FL-PLACES)

- ① 26 JUN 2013 - RPH now memory detail from MAY 2012 try
 to FL NC attempt to sent out two Baker houses
 built on the same plan. Called Simon Rogers for help
 one is called the BILLY BAKER HOUSE (see more
 notes made on this house already processed). Simon
 says the other is the JOHN BAKER house at
 Baker Crossroads just north of Norie Creek at
 Halifax road. He calls John "the legged John" as he
 lost a leg in the Civil War - ran a store at
 Baker's Crossroads. Simon gives the following heritage

- ② Notes of TIVR 24 MAY 2012 went with Mary Farris.

We picked up cousin STALEY DRIVER at his home
 to be with us on the AM tour. We visited the
 DENTON CEM where Monk thinks CYNTHIA DENTON
 his ancestor may be buried. Visited several older
 homes in the area. The most impressive was the
 Billy Baker Home. It is on the same plan as
 the house at Baker's Crossroads which we also
 visited. It is owned by a lady lawyer whom
 Simon knows. She is MARY FARRIS (919) 496-3600
 whom we met. She had a client but asked us
 to come back at 3:00 PM (which we did not do)
 She has a horse operation and an attorney.
 We drove by the spot shown on the
 Berry u. (Little Berry u) place on the 1870 map
 but could not make sense of it.

I took note of a lot of nice homes
 mostly occupied by non-local who
 worked in Raleigh or such places.

Took our lead of Simon & Staley. Staley had
 worked as a carpenter at Wake Forest College
