Go through the stop light at the shopping center and turn left onto Laurel Hills Rd. Take the first right onto Old Post Rd. You will go into a slight curve and then see Lantern Place intersecting on the right. Park on Old Post Rd. just past the intersection.

There is a high wooded area across the road just before 3601 Old Post Rd. That is the cemetery location. My thanks to Marie Cooke, a Tillie descendant, for locating the cemetery. Marie Cooke says that J.P. Tillie, progenitor of the 2 Tillie children buried here, is buried in an unmarked grave in an unknown location in this cemetery.

This is an abandoned family cemetery, rather overgrown with brush, in an established neighborhood. It is believed there are more graves here than I have accounted for.

Directions from Raleigh, NC: On the south side of Raleigh take Beltline exit # 298, (Hwys 70, 401, and 50) to Tryon where the roads split. Bear left at the light onto Hwy. 70 & 50. Go a short distance to the traffic light at Timber Rd., and turn right on to Timber Rd. which will dead end on the Hwy. 50 (Benson Rd.). Turn right and go about 5- 6 miles on Benson Rd. to Turner Farms Subdivision, and turn left onto Turner Farms Rd. Take your first right onto Simon Drive, and a left to Old Memorial Circle. Parking is not really good, just get off the road as much as possible.

Turner Cemetery is no longer in use, it is sort of an "honored decoration" in a circular road near the front of a subdivision, "Turner Farms", that bears the name of the former property owners.




New cemetery fills need

CARY - Terilyn C. de'Marsi's dreams came to fruition earlier this month when Wake Memorial Park became the final resting place for its first client.

One of at least four public perpetual-care cemeteries in Wake County, Wake Memorial promises to ease a shortage of burial space in the county's western region. De'Marsi, the park's owner, said the privately owned cemetery will help meet a need fed by the area's rapid growth.

Cary's Hillcrest Cemetery has been at capacity for years, and there are 55 people on the waiting list hoping that people who have bought plots will choose to be buried elsewhere and those plots will become available, said Karen Gray, Cary's deputy town clerk. Unable to find spots in the town-owned cemetery, many residents have had to bury loved



ones in Raleigh, which has three cemeteries with available space.

Meticulously landscaped Wake Memorial Park is located at N.C. 55 and Green Hope School Road. It sits on about 50 acres that as recently as four years ago was a

tobacco farm owned by William Upchurch and his family.

"We didn't want to sell for development," Upchurch, 77, said as he stood on the neatly trimmed grass with a large gold monument of praying hands behind him. "We are not opposed to subdivisions, but we wanted something that's needed."

Only 30 acres will be developed initially and about 20,000 plots sold, but there could eventually be as many as 100,000 plots. There will be a mausoleum and two columbaria, and there are plans for a chapel.

Statewide, 71 percent of people in North Carolina choose to be buried; in Wake County, the percentage is lower, with 61 percent taking the option, according to the State Center for Health Statistics. In Wake County, 29 percent of people are cremated, compared with 20 percent statewide.

Other options include cremation or burial outside the state.

Wake Memorial Park is located in a now-bustling area of Cary where several new schools and subdivisions have been built and real estate is at a premium. And while churches are being built in western Wake, few are setting aside land for cemeteries.

When new communities are built, they are sold as places where people can work and live, and possibly stay forever, said Robert Fells of the International Cemetery and Funeral Association in Reston, Va. But he said one factor is often left out. "Take Reston, Virginia," Fells said. "The man who designed it, while he thought of everything, he left out cemeteries. The idea was that everything you need would be right here. When you have a growing population, you will need cemeteries just as much as you need hospitals and fire departments."

While there is still some capacity in the Apex town cemetery, Keith Weatherly, the town's mayor, said a new one in the region is welcome.

Anyone can be buried in the Apex Cemetery, but the price of a plot doubles to \$600 for nonresidents. There are 2,620 plots, with 482 remaining to be sold. The town sells about 100 plots a year.

"We are getting folks that want to be buried in the town cemetery from all over Wake County, and we might be the only public cemetery where there's any room," Weatherly said.

Starting a perpetual-care cemetery is a tough process, said Claud Whitener, the administrator and general counsel for the North Carolina Cemetery Commission, the agency that has reviewed and audited for-profit cemeteries since 1975. The agency doesn't license church cemeteries or family plots on private property.

Whitener said a cemetery must have at least 30 acres of land with no liens and \$50,000 in a trust fund. The owners' finances and criminal history are checked. All the salespeople's criminal histories are checked, and before a license is issued, 5 acres of the cemetery must be prepared and inspected by the commission.

The proposed project must also meet all ordinances and guidelines of the town. With the opening of Wake Memorial, there are now 176 licensed perpetual-care cemeteries in the state, Whitener said.

At a perpetual-care facility, 10 percent of the cost for the plot, vault and marker is set aside in a fund for the cemetery's overall maintenance. A plot at Wake

maintenance. A plot at Wake Memorial could cost \$1,600, with \$160 going to the trust fund managed by the state commission. Rudy Lea, president of Lea Fu-

Rudy Lea, president of Lea Funeral Home in Raleigh, said there is definitely a shortage reasonably priced cemetery space in Wake County. He said that people look for convenience and that, foremost, it's important they are buried where they have lived.

"Another cemetery is nothing but a positive for several reasons," Lea said. "For one, now people will have options, and it's good for competition. One cemetery can't overcharge because they are not monopolizing Wake County."





Cary may get a cemetery

Bigger population creates a demand

Cary had its housing boom. The shopping centers followed. Now it's time to start developing six feet under. A new privately funded and operated cemetery called Wake Memorial Park has received preliminary approvals from town and state officials to open off Green Hope School Road and N.C. 55 near Sears Farm Road.

The development is another sign of Cary's staggering growth in recent decades. The only other option for Cary residents who do not have access to a family or church cemetery is the historic Hill Crest Cemetery, a public cemetery near Kildaire Farm Road. However, all the space in that cemetery, which the town maintains, has been spoken for for more than a decade. There's even a waiting list of 55 people, said Sue Rowland, the town clerk.

"This is just one more thing the town needs to provide for its citizens," said Cary Mayor Glenn Lang.

Site plans for the new cemetery still have to be approved by the town, and the state Cemetery Commission still has to license the operators. If all goes as planned, though, the cemetery will be open for business, either for families to buy plots or for burials, by the first quarter of next year.


Initial plans call for the cemetery to include more than 20,000 plots, a mausoleum and two columbaria, where cremated remains in urns can be placed. The number of plots could reach 100,000.

The cemetery will have ponds, landscaped gardens, walkways, courtyards and an entrance lined with cherry blossom trees. Although about 50 acres are being set aside for the cemetery, initially only 30 acres are going to be developed.

"I want people to feel comfortable about coming out here and having a picnic next to their grandmother's grave," said Terilyn C. deMarsi, a 14-year veteran of the funeral home and cemetery industry. DeMarsi had the idea for the cemetery in 1999 after realizing the town had nothing to offer families who wanted to bury a family member in Carv

in Cary.

DeMarsi declined to say how much will be spent to build the new cemetery, which eventually could include an on-site funeral home. But burial costs will be competitive with other cemeteries throughout the region. Packages, which usually include husband and wife side-by-side spaces, burial vaults and flat



bronze headstones, generally run between \$5,700 and \$8,000.

The cemetery is a lifelong dream for deMarsi, who said she has held management positions at funeral homes and cemeteries throughout the nation.

After she had the idea, she began approaching developers in the area, looking for a partner in the project. Cary developers Mike Hunter and Kyle Ward, owners of WW Partners, which developed Carpenter Village in Morrisville, saw the potential in the plan and teamed up with de-Marsi.

"We felt that this was a needed thing in the community," Hunter said. "And it was a good opportunity for diversification for us."

DeMarsi then began working to get the necessary land, a process that included going door-to-door to more than 200 homes around Cary and Apex trying to find a family who not only was willing to sell but also had enough land to accommodate the cemetery.

Cary resident Bill Upchurch and his family were willing to partner in the project with their land, which up until just three years ago was a tobacco farm, off Green Hope School Road.

"I hope it's something that we'll leave to serve a need for the people in the town of Cary," Upchurch said. "I probably wouldn't have sold the land if it wasn't for this."

Lang said when the property came up for a special use permit last month, it met with no community resistance, a fairly rare occurrence with new developments in Cary. "I think it shows everybody understands the need here," he said.

The state hasn't licensed a cemetery that is open to the public in Wake, Orange, Johnston or Durham counties for more than three decades. However, privately run church and family cemeteries have been built.



Dir. : Take Exit # 287, Interstate # 40, and Harrison Ave (SR 1652), Wake Co., NC, Go north 4/10 mi. through the entrance of Umstead State Park to a paved parking lot, and park over on the right side. The Loblolly Trail runs from the right side of the parking lot. Walk 1/10 mi. on the Loblolly Trail to the cemetery on your right.

There is a rusted fence surrounding the graves and many fallen trees leaning over the cemetery. Most of the grave markers have crumbled or have been rendered unreadable. The cemetery is not endangered because it is located in Umstead Park, but it is seriously deteriorated and could use some maintenance, especially removal of the large trees hanging over the fence. There appears to be at least 7 graves, only 3 are positively marked. This is an abandoned cemetery no longer in use.
