"Florrie" Cameron Is Hoke's Nominee For Mother Of Year

A Raeford woman who was instrumental in establishing "soup kitchens" in the white and Negro schools of Hoke County during the mid 1920s was recently chosen the county's 1963 Mother of the Year by the Education Department of the Woman's Club here.

A→ She is Mrs. Mary Florence Upchurch Cameron, widow of the late Hugh Archibald Cameron.

"Miss Florrie," as she is affectionately called by her close associates as well as the rural population with whom she has worked, will represent Hoke County in the North Carolina Mother of the Year Contest to be held in Raleigh on April 3rd and 4th.

It was in the year of 1924, when she served as president of the County Council Parent-Teacher Association, chairman of the Welfare Department and president of the newly organized Woman's Club that Mrs. Cameron instigated and promoted the idea of serving hot soup to all the hungry school children of the county.

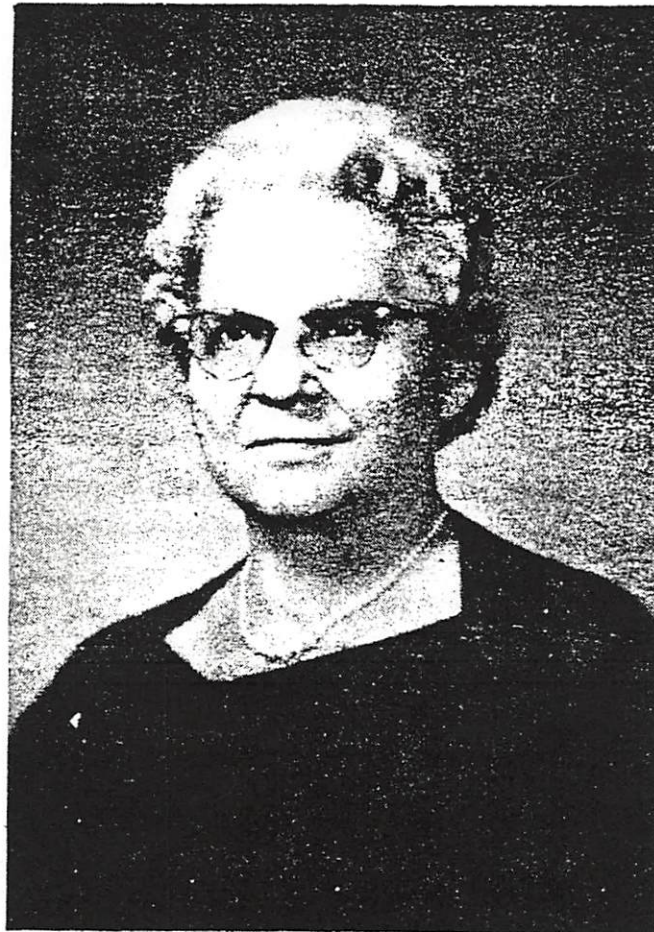
The project took roots and grew rapidly. By 1928 every school child in the county was getting a free bowl of hot soup for lunch.

The improvised "soup kitchens" were a forerunner of the present day school cafeterias. "Miss Florrie" stated that Hoke County was one of the two first counties of the State to introduce "soup kitchens" in their schools.

Under her leadership community canning centers for the schools were organized throughout the county. Thousands of cans of vegetables were canned annually for the use of the schools and welfare clients.

Every summer for more than a decade, Mrs. Cameron hauled a steel drum on the bumper of her car which was loaded with pots, kettles, pans, cans, and all of the utensils needed for her "open air cannery" and traveled to the various communities where canning was to be done.

While "Miss Florrie" supervised the canning projects, she didn't go into a community as a "white collar boss" -- she went with her shirt sleeves rolled up and ready to tackle the job at hand.

county has an "A" grade cafeteria, and the county has a well organized and fully staffed Welfare Department and Health Department and also, a well-equipped Health Center.

Mrs. Cameron beamed happily, "I am happy and grateful to have had a part in this progress."

During the war years "Miss Florrie" served as vice-chairman of the county chapter of the American Red Cross, and for a number of years she led the membership drive for the organization. She sponsored several first aid classes and served as chairman of the Sewing Room. In addition to these she organized two USO units in the county.

Mrs. Cameron has always had a profound respect for and interest in elderly people. She has courageously and affectionately gone beyond the confines of her home and brought happiness and cheer to others of the town and community.

of her husband in November 1949, this Christian mother was secure in a deep and abiding faith that "all things work together for good to them that love the Lord."

A native of Moore County, Mrs. Cameron is the daughter of the late Thomas Benton and Mollie Johnson Upchurch of this town but originally of Wake County. She is a descendant of Joel Lane. She was the oldest child in a family of nine children. Her parents moved to Cumberland County, later Hoke County, in 1898 when she was seven years old. They lived where the town of Raeford, was incorporated a few years later.

"Miss Florrie's" father was in the lumber business, but through the years his interests grew and included farming real estate and industry in several other states as well as North Carolina.

Mrs. Cameron whose work was contributed to the people of the county out of the goodness of her heart, also worked for children through and with the Health Board.

Clinics -- eye, tonsils, baby and general health were organized and held during the depression years under her leadership and help. She was able to get doctors as far away as High Point to come and assist local doctors with the clinics.

She attributes much of the success of the canning project and health clinics to first-rate leaders from every community.

Long before the county welfare department was organized she spent many hours helping to raise funds and materials for welfare cases. She made trips to state institutions helping to care for those who needed institutional care.

"Miss Florrie" served the public welfare needs by personally collecting used clothing for the needy, and in many instances buying a pair of shoes or other items of clothing from her own pocketbook. She saw that both the white and Negro had sufficient food, collecting it from clubs and organizations and filling in from her own supplies.

Mrs. J. L. McLeod, a close friend of Mrs. Cameron and who is her senior by more than two decades, recently recalled this incident which depicts her character:

"One day during the depression Miss Florrie with her children and I visited a rural family who had a small daughter about the size of Miss Florrie's Marie. The only garment that the child had on was a pair of pants. Having learned that she didn't have a dress to wear, when we got ready to leave Miss Florrie called to Marie and said, 'Come here Marie,' she yanked off her daughter's dress, gave it to the little girl and said to her own daughter, 'Marie, you can go home in your petticoat, you have another dress at home!'"

K. A. MacDonald, former Superintendent of Hoke County Schools, said, "It was largely through her efforts that the county was able to get a full-time Welfare Superintendent and a fully organized Welfare Department in 1936 and a fully organized Health Department around 1942."

Today every school in the

Many times she has had birthday dinners for ladies in their 80s and 90s and had invited their friends to join them for a celebration.

With understanding, patience and love, Mrs. Cameron has directed, guided and educated her children, and channelled their efforts and abilities into serviceable and worthwhile citizens. Her three sons, Thomas Upchurch, Hubert Alexander and Donald Bennett are all business men of Raelord. Her daughters, Sarah Marie, now Mrs. Vernon Weaver Brown Jr., resides in Bluefield, West Virginia, and Mary Florence, now Mrs. James Robert Weaver, resides in Fayetteville where she is currently serving as Director of Religious Education at Haymount Methodist Church. A third daughter, Mollie Johnson and her husband, Dr. David Tuttle, were accidentally drowned on September 19, 1954.

Through this double tragedy and the grave illness and death

Mrs. Cameron's parents helped build the first Methodist Church in Raelord which burned a few years ago. Her family have been leaders in church work through the years.

When the new Methodist Church was built "Miss Florrie" according to her former pastor, the Rev. P. O. Lee under whose ministry the new church was built, contributed her time and abilities unselfishly in directing the work connected with pastors and other projects which the church held to raise money for the building fund.

Through the years she has served her church in various capacities from Sunday school teacher to the Board of Stewards.

As the grandmother of twelve her homemaking ability has been an example to all the mothers of the community. Her industry and thrift in gardening, canning, arranging flowers, keeping a friendly and open house, and entertaining have been a marvel to all who know her.

At a time when our nation is preparing to celebrate its Bi-Centennial, we are all much more conscious of our National heritage. Since our family was among the first to settle in this country, I want my children to be aware of some of the stories that were told to me by my mother, that they may be passed on to future generations for their enjoyment. I hope these stories will convey to the reader, a sense of time, place, and atmosphere. They have evoked a nostalgic glow as I think back to how Grandmother and Grandfather lived. I have experienced pleasure in thinking about them and it has occurred to me that my family may also enjoy reading them.

THE OLD HOME PLACE

The old home place, which is located in Wake County, near Fuquay, was part of a land Grant from George III to Captain Etheldred Jones, my great, great grandfather. Captain Jones amassed 16,000 acres by both grant and purchase by deed in the 1760's. Captain Jones married Jane (Elizabeth) Lane, daughter of Barnabas Lane. After his death she was adopted by Joel Lane, now known as the "Father of Raleigh." Captain Jones and Jane's youngest son, Barnabas Jones, was heir to the home place. Barnabas Jones willed his property to his three daughters, Mary Jane, Elizabeth Ann, and Rhoda Ann. Rhoda Ann, the youngest, and my great grandmother, inherited the home place of over 1,100 acres.

The old home, with its early English beams in the ceiling uncovered, and its massive fireplace, still stands, connected to the "Big House" by a breezeway with a latticed brick wall. It is a two story structure, with one large, and two small rooms on the first floor. Bedrooms for the children were on the second floor. The floors were made of wide boards put together with wooden pegs. It has a front porch, and later, in my grandmother's day, a kitchen was built on the side of the house. It still stands, but it has been modernized and made more comfortable with sunroom, bath and central heating. New doors have replaced the handmade doors with the heavy handhewn iron hinges and the latch string that hung on the outside. The "Big House" has also undergone some remodeling by each generation that has lived there. This is a Colonial type home with big columns in the front, six rooms and a large hall downstairs and four rooms upstairs. Near the old house was a log house. "Uncle Charles" as he was known to Barnabas's children and grandchildren, occupied this dwelling and had a special place in their affection. Tradition tells us that he was Polynesian and would not associate with the other slaves on

the plantation. I can remember when we would sit around the fire while he told us stories. This house still stands.

Looney was the cook and what a cook! I can still remember the delicious tea cakes she made. She stayed until Aunt Daisy married, then went to Raleigh to live with Aunt Bella Mills and stayed there until she died.

On a hot summer day, after a long march with his men, he came to the crystal clear spring bubbling with cool water where he and his men quenched their thirst and refreshed their hot brows with cool splashes from the spring. They noticed deer tracks, squirrel and quail, heard the sound of wild turkey calls and saw there were fish in the nearby stream. They climbed a hill, noticed a profusion of berries, Indian trails and arrow heads lying on the ground, indicating good hunting for food. When they reached the summit of the hill, "Capt. Dred" (his nickname) rested his men under the shade of a huge oak and contemplated: "If I ever get out of this damn army I am going to come here and build a home."

In my grandmother's day, water had to be brought from the spring during the day because of the wolves who roamed around at night. One day one of the little girls went to the spring for water and a bear chased her. She ran toward home screaming, "Bear! Bear!" came to a fence and fell over to the other side just as grandfather shot the bear.

Grandmother has 10 children, 40 grandchildren. Fifteen of the grandchildren are still living and of these, I'm the oldest.

REMINISCING ON VISITS TO GRANDMOTHER'S HOME

One summer when Grandmother was critically ill, Mama and all her sisters wanted to be there and there were about fifteen of us children who went with them. We really had a good time. Hardie Mills of Raleigh would go to the cow lot, drive the cow into a little break, put a stick behind her so she couldn't get out, then lie on his back under the cow and milk the milk directly into his mouth while the rest of us looked on in admiration and awe.

Aunt Daisy would cook tea cakes and put them in a yellow bowl that held a peck of tea cakes. She would put them in the milk house, a small house, built on four legs, where we could go by and get all the tea cakes we wanted to eat.

In those years there was an old weather forecast that ~~when~~ geese made a special type of noise when it was going to snow. Grandmother had a flock of geese and they roosted under the house. I can remember Grandfather saying "The geese are talking, it is going to snow", and it would. The feathers from the geese were used for feather beds and pillows.

Homemade quilts were also made for the beds. The ladies would have quilting parties. They would assemble at one home, after lunch and bring their supper. The older children looked after the babies while the ladies quilted. The quilts were made in a frame from scraps of material and a quilt had to be completed at each party because the frames were too large to leave up.

One night while an older child looked after the babies, several boys exchanged the caps on all the babies and placed them in different places on the bed from where the mother had placed them. Later, when the mothers arrived home they found they all had the wrong babies. One can imagine their anguish as the babies couldn't be exchanged until the next day.

Aunt Ethel, Mama's younger sister, was very excitable and nervous. One day at church, when a revival was going on, the preacher said, "All who want to go to heaven stand up". A "Wayward" girl, who had lost the baby, stood up and said, "I'll see my baby in heaven!" Aunt Ethel, who was sitting behind the girl, jumped up and yelled, "Hell's Fire".

Aunt Ethel was organist at Wake Chapel Church for 50 years. She, Uncle Willie, and Cousin Beal formed a quartet which often sang at Wake Chapel. Uncle Willie requested that he sing at his own funeral so they went to Richmond and had some records made of some of the quartet's songs. At Uncle Willie's death a fine victrola was brought from Raleigh and as his body was being carried into the church, his deep bass voice was booming "Shall We Gather At the River". It raised goose pimples on everyone in the church. I have this record in my possession.

CIVIL WAR STORIES

During the Civil War, valuables were hidden to keep the "Yankees" from stealing them. The meat was hidden in a cedar tree near the well; the thick branches of the tree provided an excellent hiding place for the meat. This Cedar still stands. Sage bushes were uprooted and the silver put in the hole, then the sage bushes were replanted. Neither the meat or the silver were ever found by the "Yankees".

One morning, during the War, some enemy soldiers rode up on horseback and asked Grandpa if he had any money. He told them that he had a little but refused to give it to the soldiers. They threatened to hang him if he didn't give the money to them. Grandpa said, "You'll just have to hang me then, for I won't give it to you". The soldiers put a rope around his neck and were leading him to a tree when Grandmother came running out of the house, wringing her hands and crying, "Who would want to blame a man for wanting to protect his family from starving. One soldier said, "I don't", repeated by another and another. Evidently they were only bluffing, because they removed the rope and rode off.

Grandfather Johnson was born in a beautiful old home in Harnett County. He had a brother named Greene, who had a beautiful horse he loved very much. One day, when Greene was 16, the "Yankees" stole his horse. As they were riding off, Greene shot, hitting one soldier; however, he didn't think he had killed him since he didn't fall from the horse. In revenge, the "Yankees" threatened to burn the home place and gave the family 15 minutes to save anything they could. One of the girls took Grandpa's watch and buried it by the chimney. The house was burned but the watch was not damaged and is still keeping perfect time today. It is owned by Mama's nephew (Brother Archie's son) who now lives in Raleigh. His name, Dr. Bernice Johnson.

THE PREACHER'S ROOM

Years ago Grandma had a room that she called the "Preacher's Room". Preachers would come and stay all summer or as long as someone would feed them. One summer a preacher came and stayed on and on until he had eaten all the chickens, and the ladies of the church were beginning to wonder what they would give him to eat. They were discussing this one day when some boys heard their remarks, and decided to help the ladies by getting rid of the preacher. They took a hollow cow horn, filled it with feathers, asafetida, and every other foul smelling thing they could find. They took it to the church, bored a hole in the floor under the pulpit. That night, when the preacher started his sermon, they set fire to the ingredients in the horn, blew from the other end, and as the smoke drifted up into the pulpit the preacher began coughing and sneezing. He asked, "Is there a dog in the church?" "No", chorused the congregation. "Look to the Lord and be dismissed", he cried, and quit the premises forever.

A CHRISTMAS TRAGEDY

One Christmas all the family was preparing for a big Christmas. Uncle John Lewis, Grandpa's brother, ran a country store. They had closed the store on Christmas Eve and had gone home to begin Christmas celebrations. A little Negro boy came to the door and wanted to buy a nickel's worth of candy. Beal, who was fourteen, couldn't refuse and went to the store to get it for him. He struck a match and accidentally dropped it into a keg of gun powder. The ensuing explosion blew out two sides of the store and threw Beal some distance. When the family came upon the scene, they saw a bundle of what looked like rags, but when they heard a groan, found it was Beal. All the skin had been burned from his body. They carried him into the house, where he lay for many weeks near death. The odor was so bad the buzzards sat on the fence day by day, waiting for him to die. Gradually he began to mend and after many months was completely healed. The strange thing was, that when I first remembered him there wasn't a scar on his body and he lived to be a very old man.

NO LAUGHING MATTER

Grandfather loved huckleberries. One morning, when the huckleberries were ripe he took two big pails to pick berries. He filled both pails and there were still so many huckleberries he hated to leave. He was wearing a white shirt with big full sleeves, buttoned at the cuff so he decided to fill the sleeves with berries. On the way home he stubbed his toe and fell down. Imagine how he looked with crushed berry juice running down his arms! As he reached home he began calling, "Rhoda Ann, look what I have done". Grandma began laughing and he said sternly, "This is no laughing matter". Thereafter, whenever someone in the family went too far with teasing and etc. the catchword was "This is no laughing matter"; everyone would laugh and the air was cleared.

When Aunt Daisy was dying, in Raleigh, Mama was there. Mama was sitting by a grandfather clock, near Aunt Daisy's bedroom door. Just as the nurse came to the door and said, "Mrs. Upchurch, she is gone", the clock stopped. Sometime later it was started up again and is still running. Vivian has it now.

When we lived at Carthage we received a telegram saying Grandma wasn't expected to live. ^{→ [MAY ANN JOHNSON]} Mama wanted to go so we left Carthage at 1:00 in the afternoon, in a two horse buggy which had a small seat near the floor. ^{→ [CLYDE EMMETT U, SR]} Clyde and I took turns sitting on it. We had just had a long rainy season and when we came to the upper Cape Fear River, the water was very high. The horses didn't want to cross but Papa made them go anyway, and when we got to the middle of the river he could see that we were drifting down stream. ^{→ [THOMAS BENTON U, SR]} Papa used the whip, the horses lunged and found footing on solid ground. There was a large home on the hill just above the river. Papa went to the door, knocked, and asked the man who answered the door if we could spend the night. The man said, "No, we have gone to bed". Papa said, "If you don't let us in I will knock this door down. My wife and children are wet and freezing to death". The man then let us in and built a big fire where we could dry our clothes. This was the first of January and Maud was born the last day of February (February 29th - Leap Year). ^{→ [MAUDE HYACINTH U]}

Grandma didn't die then, but later, at her death, Mama had just gone to bed, around ten o'clock. She hadn't gone to sleep when her bedroom door opened and Grandma seemed to come floating in with Grandpa

on one side and Grandpa's sister, Aunt Mary, on the other side. She threw back her head and said, "I'm just as happy as can be." Tho' no message had been received, Mama got ready and went to Grandma's house and when she got there found that Grandma had died at the exact time of her vision. A telegram had been sent to Mama but it was received after Mama had left to make the trip.

Aunt Mary, of Mama's Vision, was a mid wife. She would ride by horseback, over three counties, delivering babies and never lost a mother. She nursed Mama when I was born.

This story including a picture of the two homes is described in a Ltr 24 OCT 2006 Alan Marshall McGee, Jr. to RPU See - his Profile for details. An extract follows.

The homes appear to have been built about 1900 and possibly before. They were the homes of brothers WJH & FBH, Sr.

I. Moses U - Head of clan

WJH moved to GA in the early 1900's and the home was purchased by MARY FLORENCE U, a daughter of FBH, Sr. "FLORIE"

Florie and 3 JUN 1914 HUGH ARCHIE CAMERON and the WJH home remained in Florie's family. Florie bequeathed the home to her dau FLORENCE LOUISE CAMERON who 1986 and JAMES ROBERT WEAVER, SR. This couple lived in the WJH home at the time it burned in 2003. Their son JRW, Jr. "Jimmy" lived with them. The telling of the 2003 fire revolves around these three individuals. Some details cited:

GREGORY THOMPSON - lived next door

LUKE MCNEILL - Raeford, NC Minister - quoted - He played with the five children in the family (I show 6 Cameron children - RPU) → "an out of both parties"

JOHN HARRELL, a "tenant" of the Weavers - appears to have been a house servant. He said the residents included Jimmy who was upstairs asleep. The article

quotes Jimmy & his girl friend CANDACE GROOMER

[Jimmy & Candace, at some point, had a child, and after the 2003 fire they named - RPU] → JAMES ROBERT GROOMER

CAMERON LEE BROWN (Nephew of Florence Louise Cameron) & wife

CATHERINE VAUGHN ANGLE are quoted. CAM is employed by UPCHURCH MILLING CO. CAM lived with his mother SARAH MARIE CAMERON from the 2nd Grade (about 1966) until he went to college.

We know your father James Bernad U was the son of James U and the grandson of Benjamin U but we cannot figure out who was the father of Benjamin U. On the 1850 census of Cumberland Co, NC (Harnett County was a part of Columbus Co then) there was Benjamin U age 20, John U age 17 and William U age 18. These three young men were in separate nearby households but none of the households were headed by an Upchurch. We think these three young men were brothers and that they had been placed under guardianships in the community. Sooner or later we hope to identify their parents.

I do hope you will send whatever information you can. We need the help of everyone to be able to see how the whole Upchurch family fits together.

You will find enclosed 2 copies of the only known photo of my grandfather James Bernard Upchurch and his sister Maude Upchurch Cooper. I don't know the date of the photo, only can guess early 1900's, as you know from your records he died in 1926. He had been sick for a while with what was diagnosed as TB at the time. In later years as my mother developed asthma and emphysema, she never smoked but worked in the tobacco fields as a child, she stated that her symptoms were like she remembered her father's to be. Since know one else in the house developed TB it is possible they had the same thing. Back then if anyone in the neighborhood had an ailment, others were said to have the same thing. The photo seems to have been taken when he was healthy. Have you had any contact with the descendants of Maude. I would like to give them a copy of the photo if they are interested. My contact with that part of the line is nonexistent.

James Bernard worked as a store clerk in a drug according to his son, Reid. Since he had been sick and unable to work for a long time they were poor. Mama told me they did not realize how poor they were because no one else had much either. After "Bun" died, my grandmother Ophelia did not have means to take care of the 5 children. James Redoluphs "Dol" and Florence Ann (Johnson) Mitchell, (her parents) went in the wagon to their home and loaded all to go and live with them. They moved from the town of Buies Creek to the country of Buies Creek. Since grandpa Dol was a farmer there was now plenty of food. She told me even though times were hard they never went hungry and always felt loved and wanted by their grandparents. They helped with the farm when they could. Ophelia helped cook for the farm hands.

Mama had a bit of artist in her but no one else seem to share her talent even in the next generation. There are 3 pastel chalk pictures she did when she was about 12-13 years old that survived. Guess the rest were not kept. I have one, my sister has one and a Bayles cousin that my mother was very close to has the 3rd. For a young child they are wonderful, however she was not allowed to pursue "this useless pastime." Many years later my father encouraged her to try again. She took lessons in oil painting. Family members now share her paintings. Several years before her death, she put the name of who was to inherit her work on the back of each picture. Of course my sister and I had 1st choice. Mama's oil paintings are proudly displayed.

On medical history:

Mama was diagnosed with Diabetes in her 50's. About the same time, her oldest sister Lucille and cousin Una Earl (daughter of Charles Herbert) both discovered they also had it. They thought it must have come from the Upchurch side since Una Earl had it too. Do you know of any other family members with diabetes. Would be interesting to know if their theory was correct.

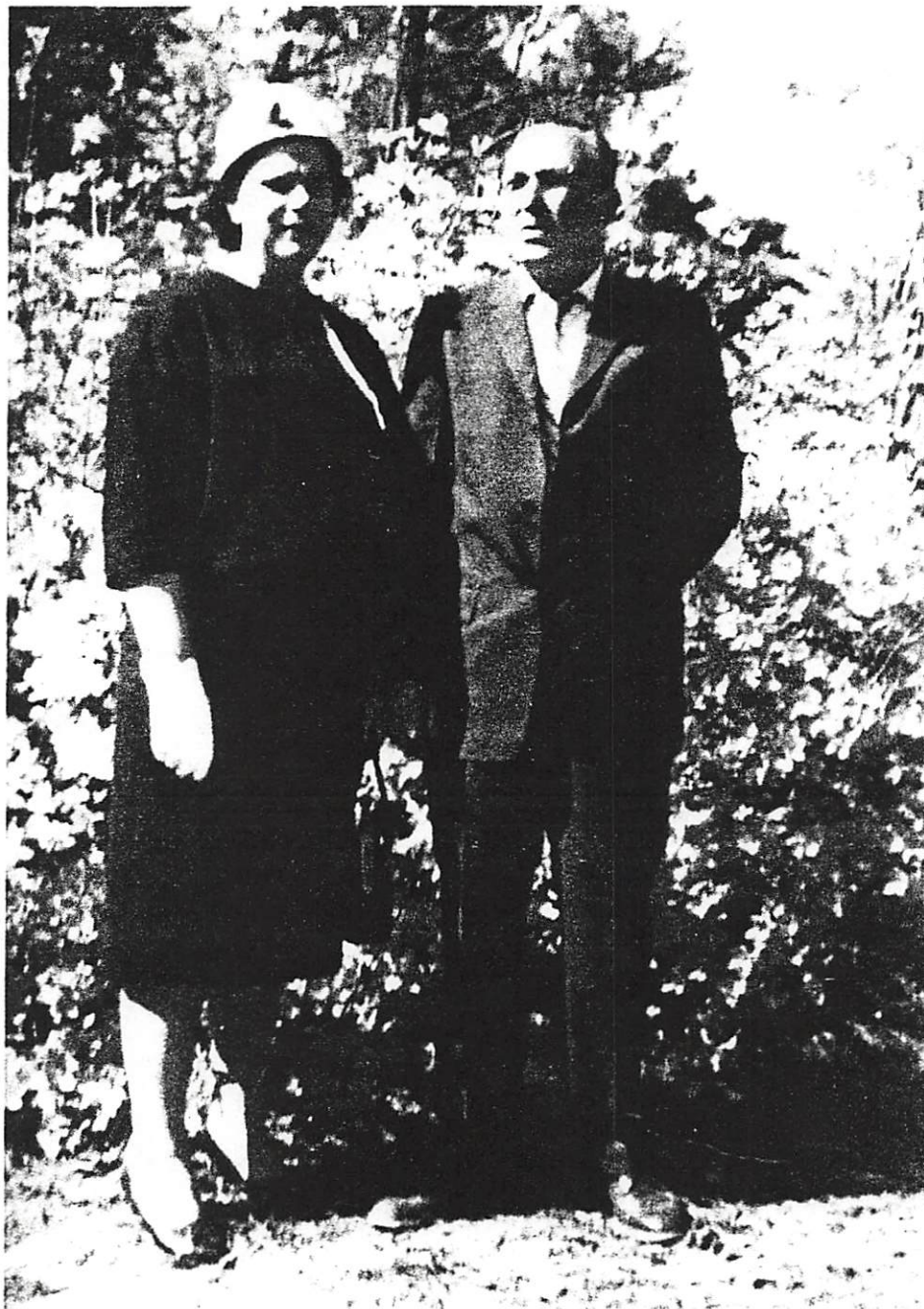

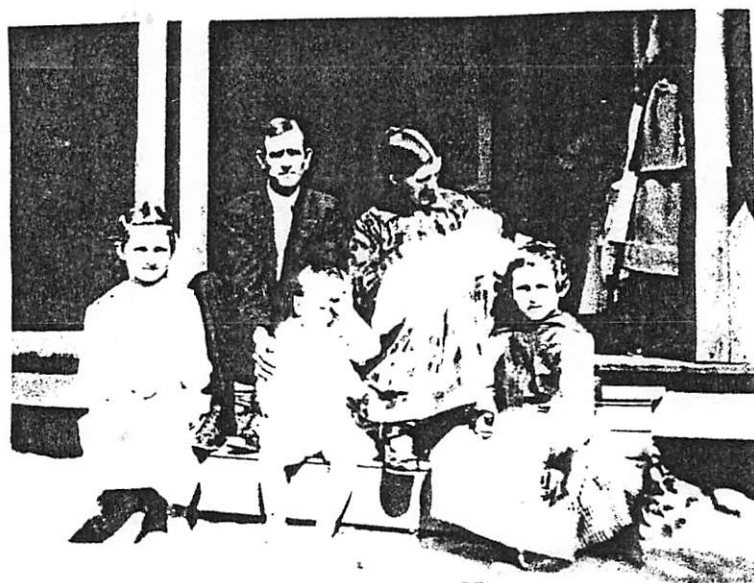

Dear Mary:

In a telephone conversation with Sam one night last week he told me he had turned over to you the lineage data which I had mailed to him, together with everything he had in his files and that you had indicated a willingness to do a bit of research regarding the Upchurch family.

I am enclosing, herewith, a copy of a letter which I have just received from the Research Division of Colonial Williamsburg at Williamsburg, Virginia. I was particularly interested in the so called Rebellion of 1674 in which one Michael Upchurch took part. It will be interesting to find out whether this was the original Michael Upchurch or his son. Since the original died in 1681 it could very easily be either.

I have been trying to get a record of all of the children of Uncle Cal and Uncle Alvin. I wrote Dr. Edgar Upchurch, with whom I stayed on one occasion, in an effort to get a record of his sisters Fannie, ~~Eugene~~ and Pennie, but have not received a reply.

Eugene → EUGENIA

Our only daughter, Carol, is getting married on June 21st this year. After that Eloise and I will probably pick a time to make a trip to North Carolina and Virginia to see what we can find. Could we talk you and Walter into going with us? We could go by Springfield and pick you up and make it in a leisurely week or ten days.

If you have any data that Sam picked up in England or the address of any source from which I might obtain information I would like to have it. To date the data that I have indicates that our great great grandfather was probably named Burton, his father was Nathaniel. Nathaniel had four brothers, Moses, Bertice (Burton), Jubel and Charles. I think with a little research we can establish a direct line back to Michael the First who was born in 1616 and died in 1681. Since I have this much information I think it would be fun to work it out.

Dear Mary:

Haven't heard yet from you relative to the data I had asked Sam to get up for me, and, which he said he had asked you to prepare, i. e., births, marriages, deaths, etc., of Uncle Jack Upchurch's, your grandfather, family. I have uncovered a considerable amount of additional material here in the State Archives and History Department, but haven't yet had the time to copy it. One interesting thing, which I haven't been able as yet to check, is that our great-great grandfather appears to have been named Abel, and he came to Alabama with our great grandfather Bartley. I have found evidence of him in the Greene County census of 1830 together with his will, which named Grandfather Bartley executor. When I tie Abel into the North Carolina family I'll have it back to the early 1600's. Be sure to let me have your line from Uncle Jack on down as soon as possible.

I've had several letters from Cousin Calvin Edgar Upchurch, of Union City, Tenn. He is a practicing Dentist and must now be in his early 80's. He mentioned going to school with your father and how close he felt to him during his early days. He is the only son of Uncle Cal. who was your grandfather's and my grandfather Burton's brother. I have also received a good bit of information concerning Uncle Al's children, altho' I don't think it is yet complete.

I have started building a cottage up on Lake Martin, above Wetumpka. It should be completed in about eight weeks. We are hoping that it will be close enough to enable you and Walter to spend a little time with us when you are down here, since we can't seem to get you to Montgomery. Our place will be just around the next point from Glenn Ireland, a friend of Anne and Sam's.

Obituary for Kenneth Upchurch

Kenneth Seckinger Upchurch of Decatur, Georgia (and more recently of Athens, Georgia) died on October 27, 2011 at the age of 91. Kenneth was born November 27, 1919, Thanksgiving Day that year, in Springfield, Effingham County, Georgia. He was the youngest child of the late Southwood and Theresia Seckinger Upchurch, and was also preceded in death by his four siblings: Mary Davis Thompson, William Walton Upchurch, South Woodbridge Upchurch, and **Helen Poppell**. His second wife, Joyce Reeves Hunt Upchurch, died in 2001. Kenneth was a descendant of the Salzburger, the Austrian immigrant group who settled at New Ebenezer outside of Savannah in 1734. Kenneth grew up in Springfield and finished high school in Savannah, Georgia. His communications installation job with Western Electric during World War II excused him from active military duty. After WWII, he began his career with Southern Bell Telephone Company in Savannah, the forerunner of AT&T, was promoted to management, and moved to Atlanta in 1955. He made his home in Decatur and retired from Southern Bell in 1976 due to medical reasons. He married Sarah Evelyn Cook in July 1942 and they had three daughters, who survive him: Sarah Ann Blake (Jerry) of Lilburn, GA, **Mary Helen Morris** (Howard) of Beaufort, SC, and Christine Neal (Philip) of Greensboro, GA. He is also survived by nine grandchildren, eleven great grandchildren and one great great grandchild. In 1964, he married Joyce Reeves Hunt. Her two children, Melvin Hunt (Karen) of Watkinsville, GA and Laura Hunt Formby (Steve) of Marietta, GA, also survive him. In 2002, Kenneth moved from Decatur to Iris Place Retirement Community in Athens. His declining health required the subsequent move to Family Life Enrichment Center, High Shoals, Georgia, in November 2010. A private service was held with interment in Floral Hills Memory Gardens, Tucker, Georgia. In lieu of flowers, memorials may be made to a charity of choice.

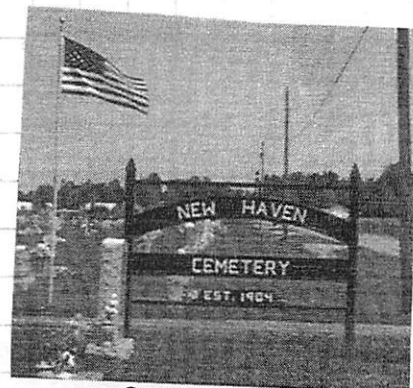

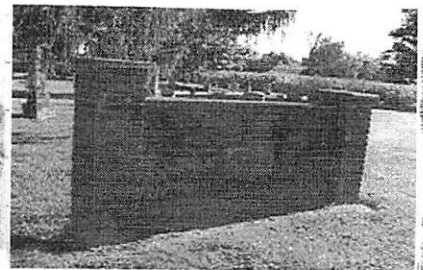

Thank you for your letter of 31 MAR 1997. It is just
great that you and Ben are continuing your
efforts to collect family information.

I appreciate what you sent me about your
memories of your Aunt and Uncle. They are
highlighted on the enclosed copy of the Master Outline
for Miller J. A and his 14 children by Tim Miller.
I don't know if there were more than 14.

Catherine was the oldest sister of your father.

The Uncle Bill you refer to would have been William Henry U. you can see we have got a lot on him.

I assume the "Aunt Janie" who visited with you was M. JANE U (XID-2085) you can see we have very little on her. If she is the one you remember it means she lived at least until about 1918 at which time she would have been 63 years old. I don't have a record of her being married or having children.

you did not mention your Uncle Charles (XIN-2086) but you can see he died in 1908 before you were born.

The Uncle John you visited in AL had one child and one grandchild according to our records. I enclose Continuation Sheet 71A so you can see the descendants of your first cousin with Gayle (XIN-4607)

The Aunt you visited when you went to see your Uncle John in AL about 1918 could have been your Aunt Victoria, your Aunt Georgia, your Aunt Emma or your Aunt Mable.

Perhaps these modest outline records will refresh your memory about some of your relatives.

Your Grandfather Miller J. U had 6 children by his first wife, the youngest being your father who was born in 1860. Apparently his 1st wife died in 1860. Miller J. U then went off to the Civil War leaving his six small children with his parents. After the Civil War Miller J. U married again and he and his parents moved to Clay Co, AL. He had 8 children by his second wife, presumably all born in AL. I assume Clay Co, AL is where you visited your Uncle John. What seems a puzzle to me is how some of the

Children, such as your father, ended up back in GA. I wonder if some of the children of the first wife of Willis J. H. simply stayed in GA with relatives (Aunts or Uncles) and never moved to AL. Of course they could have gone to GA with their father in the late 1860's and then returned as young adults on their own in the 1870's or 1880's. At some point a closer study of the records will probably give us some more facts bearing upon this matter. There is no person living today who would remember such things - but someone might remember something passed down by word of mouth.

At anytime I will welcome any comments, question or information you may have about our shared family heritage.
