BUCKHORN CITY

The remains of Wesley Upchurch, of near Mounds, were brought here and interred in our cemetery Wednesday.

[RPA COMMENTS: It is quite clear that these references are to WESLEY U and his son James Madison U. The phrase "of near Mounds" makes one think Wesley was living with his son James Madison U at the time he died since the son lived a mile or so north of Mounds Cemetery. Further, one concludes Wesley U had long lived in the Buckhorn Area as he was returned to that area for burial. It is unclear from these reports as to whether Wesley U was buried in the Buckhorn Cem or in a different not far-away cemetery referred to as "OUR" Cem. and as the family Cem.]

JULIA HEDRICK & JESSICA HEDRICK have Typhoid. TISNEY [MARTICIA R. U] will write Barbara. Wesley's son THOMAS U mentions WILS Thomas is cutting corn for GRANT SCANTLING.

and added empty numbers. The results were 2 worksheets 11" x 17" copies of which are provided herewith [A] & [B]. Next I made a worksheet [C] copy enclosed. From this you can see we are dealing with as many as 19 people (Upshurker) - However, further study will show some of them are the same (For example maybe # 3 & #9). There are right away two surprises for me in this list. One is that SION U, a known son of Buckner U, is not represented although we knew he was in Brown Co, IL. The second is that SILAS U, a known son of Buckner U, is represented although we had thought he did not come to Brown Co, IL. Maybe a closer look at the document would reveal the transaction was on behalf of Silas and maybe he was not present. This is just a start on trying to garner genealogical information from these land records. Certain of the full documents might prove especially useful.

My preliminary study of [C] led me to think about some of the Upchurch family members having the same name - so I prepared sheet [D], copy enclosed.

Note that: Richardson U had a nephew named Richardson U and a nephew named Richard U. Richardson U was also called Richard.

Wesley U had a nephew Wesley U

Silas U had a nephew Silas U

There were 2 with the name of James M. U - 1st cousin.

I will take more study to see which of two possible individuals are represented by a given citation.

I fear that my feed-back to you on the land records may cause you to "throw up your hands" at the complexity we have to face. I hope this is not so. Most of these matters can be solved

with more study. We really have been making excellent progress in understanding the Buckner & family and much more is there to be uncovered. It is a matter of someone (or several someone) having the time, interest and opportunity to work on the project. You and I and possibly others can continue to work by mail and phone as we try to make progress on the story of the Buckner & family. This is fine and I am happy to be a participant in such an approach.

Another possibility is to have one or more work sessions in Brown Co, IL to uncover & coordinate information. Do you think there is any merit to this idea? Just 2 or 3 people working together could make a lot of progress. I would

not have to be present for such sessions but if it could be worked out I would find it an enjoyable experience. I don't want to press anyone to take on something that would be a burden.

However, where ever we can find liberalminded people to join in an undertaking good things happen - whether we are talking golf, fishing, or family history.

I have not heard from Vivian (Taylor) Greber. After you and I talked by phone I wrote to her urging her to send me a copy of the John R. Upchurch letter. Maybe you could get a copy for me.

Carol said she had intended to tell me that she would be unavailable in July as that is Tax month when she works & she is preoccupied with the move of her mother Barbara to an apartment. However, she still seems quite unburdened.

I mentioned the letter Virginia GIEKER (not GEEKER) has & Carol said she & Virginia commiserated recently & Virginia is anxious to hear from me. Carol has more letters she will send.

Thanks for the Census Records. If convenient perhaps you might obtain more from the Internet, some of my census records had not been fully processed. I have now combined mine and yours and created the two enclosed extract sheets, one sheet contains what I have for 1830-1870^[A] and the other contains info for 1880^[B]. A copy of these sheets has been placed in the profile of each person named. All the names fit well except for LYON U. My first guess was that this was a garbled version of SION U (and it well may be) - but other info shows Sion U died in 1869 leaving a will - hence should not have been on the 1870 census. A look at the members of the LYON U household for 1870 could solve this puzzle.

We need more study on Jonas Alexander U. I now carry him as a son of Buchner U - but is our evidence for this convincing? Your census extract and mine both show him as born about 1839 in IL. This could be in error and he could have been born in NC. If a son of Buchner this would have to mean Buchner married a 2nd time. We don't know the name

of a 1st or 2nd wife for Buckner. One is tempted to think that Alexander could be a grandson of Buckner but I have not been able to find a fit there either - yet. Maybe time will tell.

On the way back home I studied the map your husband gave to me. In the process I realized that the Buckhorn we visited is actually in LEE TSP and Buckhorn TSP lies 1/2 mile south. Now we have to go back and study again references which relate Buckner & family to "BUCKHORN". Did they mean Buckhorn Town in Lee Township - or did they mean Buckhorn Township. I suspect previous reference did not clearly distinguish between the two. We can no doubt get much help on this matter from the old plat books to which you refer. I will anxiously await any details you can get from this source.

You mentioned buying some copies of the UB. Enclosed is a sheet I prepared before coming to the reunion. It shows which Volume/Issue contain details on the Richard U, III Clan. You might want to get the 4 with ***

($\$5/\text{issue} \times 4 \text{ issues} = \20). You can then decide about the ones with ** and *. I added these asterisks for your benefit. The * are primarily for the brothers of Buckner U. Later on you can think about copies of Englandia. I rarely charge for anything I copy & send other than issues of the UB and Englandia. I figure it all balances out as a lot of us exchange copied material. As we exchange letters I will continue to send you more & more detail - you can say when to STOP.

I'll be happy to give hints as to how you might proceed as we go along. You have access to the Internet which I do not so you can be a big help. On my side I have huge Upchurch files collected by me and others over the years which I am happy to share.

Back to the census records. You can see where I am missing details on Brown Co, NC census records as related to Upchurch. If you can use the Internet to fill in some

of these records it would be most helpful. As an added note in this regard. I was surprised to find that my IL Census Records did not contain any details on Upchurch entries for counties which adjoined Brown Co, IL. We know that Buckner's family spilled over into these counties - I should think possibly by 1850 and quite likely by 1860 and most surely by 1870. Will the Internet yield any details on U's in these adjoining counties?

You offered to copy items for me from the Brown County History Book, I have the James Madison U article. If there are more Upchurch articles I would welcome a copy. I am sure there is a lot that would interest me but perhaps I can wait hoping to get a copy of the new or the revised book for my use. I would gladly pay \$50 for a copy - above that it gets painful - but I can stand some pain. I appreciate your offer.

OPPS - I put the PS for your letter of 22 JUN 01 aside in such a way it escaped my attention. Now I have extended the census records and summarized them on a single sheet - copy enclosed "C". From this we learn Richardson 4 was in Brown Co, IL in time for the 1840 census - thus probably the first of the Buchner U family to arrive. LYON U appears again so he must be real - most likely a grandson of Buchner U - but who is the father of Lyon? Jehuie John U appears as a head of household for the first time in 1870 - probably another gr of Buchner. Note that Jonas U = Jonas Alexander U.

You asked about laws preventing you from seeing certain records. I do know there are various federal, state & county laws that regulate public access to certain records - often until they are 50 or 75 years old - For example - the 1940 Federal Census Records are not yet available - 1930 is due soon. It sounds like Brown Co has a money making deal.

Enclosed is a sheet [D] I have prepared on the deaths & land records you sent. I do not

yet know how Joseph & Harold U fit in.
 Also need to figure out if the land deal
 is for James M U to 1846 or James M. U
 to 1852. The land description of "NW, SW, 3
 2S, 2W" I figure to be TSP 2, RANGE 2W
 Section 3. This is illustrated on [E] enclosed.
 The description seems to be incomplete
 as it does not tell you where in the
 640 acre of section 3 the tract lies.

The 1870/1871 letters are great - priceless.
 Enclosed is a copy of my extract sheet [E]. A
 copy of this has been placed in the Biopile
 of each person mentioned. It is hard to
 get all the names or parents straight - I made
 a stab at it, let me know if you have
 a different "take".

 I have prepared a series of extract sheets for the
 Attendance list you sent and a set is provided
 herewith covered by a list of questions - just
 in case you happen to have answers. A copy
 of these extracts has been placed in the Biopile
 of each attendee. The highlighted names are
 new to my records.

Thanks for the writing on the reunion. A copy of this is being placed in my Reunion File

The death certificate for Jonas U & Jonas Alexander U is most welcome.

The Internet download you sent out a mixed blessing (as is often the case). I accept that Jonas Alexander U was born 22 MAR 1839 in Randolph Co, NC and tentatively that he was the son of Bushner U. However, I am not yet ready to accept that Bushner U was md to Mary Pace (although he may have been and she and Bushner may have been the parents of Jonas Alexander U). The Internet download does not give a source. It is a fact that Bushner's father Richard U, III took as his 2nd wife SOOKY PACE (AKA MARY PACE). Also the PACE & UPCHURCH families were closely associated in Franklin Co, NC in the 1780-1820 era.

Internet details on the ancestors of Wesley U are most welcome but there are increments which need to be debated and resolved. As time goes by I'll be glad to be a participant in such interactions if anyone has an interest in comparing notes.

Now to the Internet download of Upchurch's
manager in IL you gave me at the reunion.
I am well on my way to completing the processing
of these records which are very useful and for
which I am very indebted to you. I have copied
the paper and from the copy have cut out the
names and taped them so that they are grouped
by counties. Then I made a copy of each sheet
for each name involved to be placed in the
biopiles of the respective individuals. While
filing the several hundred sheets involved will
take more time, I have paid particular attention
to the Brown Co, IL Area and can now
relate to you on this aspect. Enclosed are my
regrouped entries for BROWN and 5 other "nearby"
counties covered by a color coded map. On the
sheets I have highlighted managers that I
could not link to the Buckner U family (no
doubt some will be shown to be linked and
some not). Note that for BROWN there are 3 of
the managers I could not link. Surely some of the
highlighted managers (if not all) for ADAMS & MORGAN
relate back to Buckner. When you get to GREENE,
SANGAMON and especially CARROLL the chance
lessens - but maybe they trace back to Buckner.

Carol I have now given a good faith effort at processing the material you sent in your two letters and the marriage records you gave me. In the process our understanding of the Buckner U family has improved and the stage has been set for more progress. There are a number of additional things I want to send you but will defer until later because I don't want to overwhelm you. Please don't let any of this be a burden to you. I am happy to work with you at whatever pace suits you.

There are still a number of things I need to follow-up on or regard the Remon; over time it can all happen.

Please do let me have any questions you have.

Thanks again for all your effort in making the Remon a success. Your work paid off.

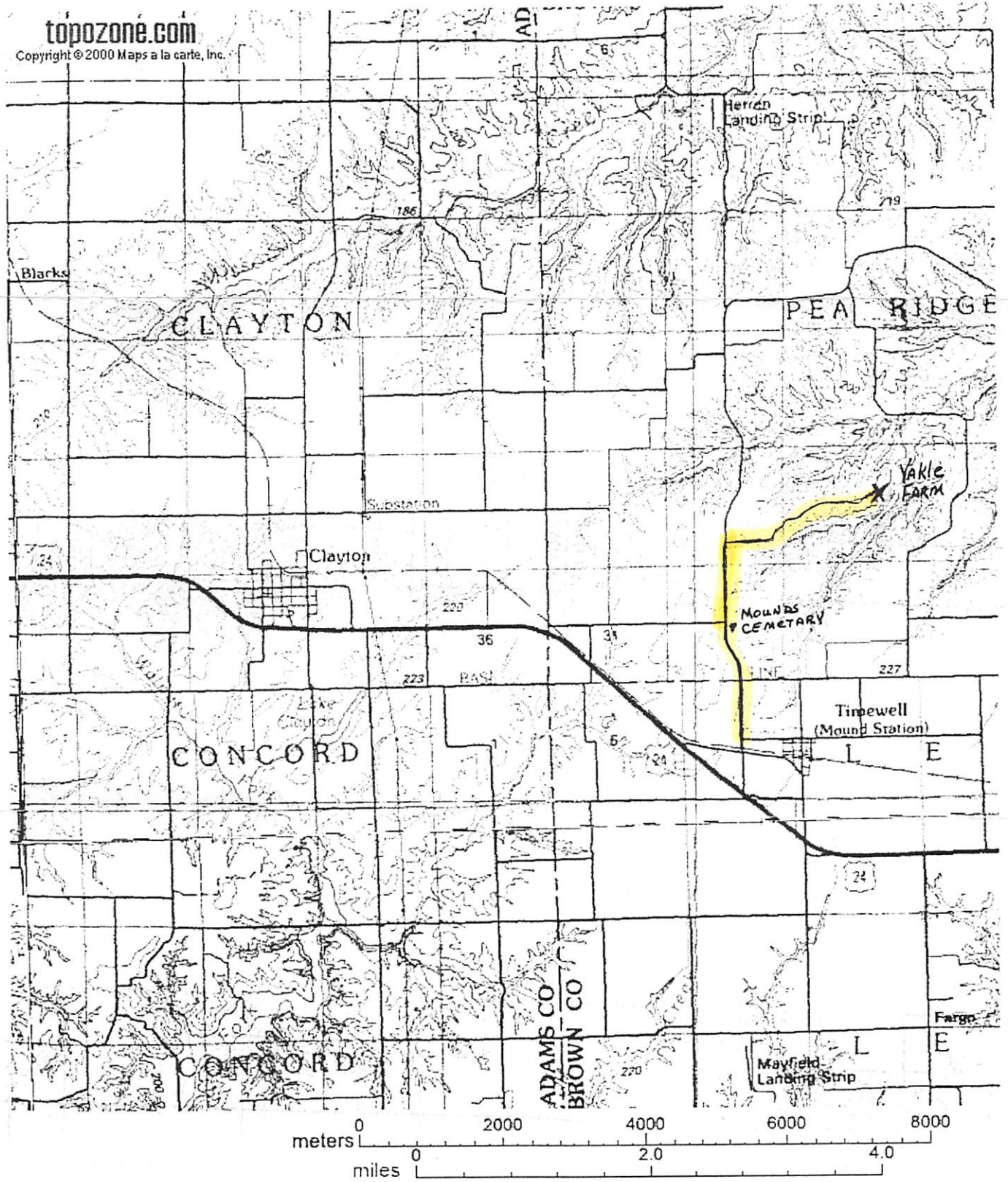

Hi – Cousins!

Thanks for your letter! I was surprised to hear from you so quickly.

It was great of you to come to our reunion and give us so much information—even if we did learn that the logo's on our t-shirts may have been the wrong church. :-) You certainly rekindled my interest in family history and I have been busy searching for clues to help put the pieces of the puzzle together.

In the meantime, I have located a copy of the Cemetery's of Brown County. You can obtain a copy by sending a check for \$35.00 to:

If you wish to call them before placing an order, their phone number is 217-225-3401 but they are only open Monday/Wednesday/Friday from 1:30 – 5:00 PM. The \$35.00 includes shipping charge—if picked up there, the cost is \$30.00. The gentleman I spoke with said they are in the process of having the History of Brown County reprinted. He said the original book in 1974 cost \$30.00, but the cost of the reprint will be considerably more. He did not said how much that might be. My husband said he has seen them sell at auctions for around \$100. They should have printed more of them in 1974!

The gentleman at the Versailles G & H Society also said they have some very old copies of Brown County Plat Books—some are in pieces and are from the late 1800's, but most are the early 1900's. I plan to make them a visit soon, and I hope they have a copy machine so I can get some copies of the little pieces of 1800's plat books. :)

You will find enclosed a print of the Upchurch entries from the Brown County 1850 census. I found it on the Internet and it is quite interesting. Everything matches up quite well to what we already know, but I did learn that Alexander still lived with Buckner at that time and apparently Buckner did not have a wife in 1850 which is what you believed. You will notice that some of the Upchurch's lived in Elkhorn Township. Elkhorn is

south and east of the Buckhorn Cemetery and the terrain is even rougher there. We should have driven farther south Saturday afternoon. I would like to learn exactly where Buckner, Wesley, Richard (son) and James lived and hope to verify that through the old plat books. A better resource might be the Brown County Court House in the land records when I find time to go there. I might also be able to find copies of Wesley and Richardson's death certificates where it is possible they recorded their mother's name.


Maybe you can point me in the right direction to obtain information, because, as I told you, I don't know how to get some of the information needed. I'm kind of an Internet 'junkie' and try to find all that I can without traveling. Any help you can give me in my quest for clues of the past will be appreciated.

Thank you once again for your presentation on the Upchurch Clan. Several family members have expressed an interest in the Upchurch Bulletins. I would also like to buy some of them. Right now, I'm mostly interested in Buckner information. Which volumes would you suggest? Or, what is your charge to copy the information you showed me from your notebook?

If there is anything specific you would like copied from the Brown County History Book, let me know and I will do that for you. I believe you have the article about James Upchurch. I don't know if there are any other articles in that book pertaining specifically to the Upchurch family. There are some nice articles about the customs of this area and I believe there is a section with pictures of the Buckhorn Church, School, etc. I looked at some of the schools in that area, but they did not mention a school teacher named Richard Upchurch even though the census called him a school teacher. (maybe he was having one of 'his days' and only thought he was a school teacher when the census taker was there.)

Will send you a mailing list of the Upchurch descendents invited to the reunion at another time. I do have a list, but I am at work and the list is at home. Nearly everyone we invited was there—isn't that amazing? I had hoped to have more cooperation with the survey forms, but I don't think they were in a good place to be seen. Heidi did not have many requests for her information either. We probably did not make ourselves very clear in our request. Either that or they are not very interested in the family history.

Since writing this letter, I have made a visit to the County Clerk's office. Is it really the law that individuals are not allowed access to 19th century death records?? I was permitted to look at a list which was not helpful for Buckner/Wesley/Richardson because they were not recorded (maybe). The names on the list were

Knowing that a certified death certificate was \$5.00 (which I

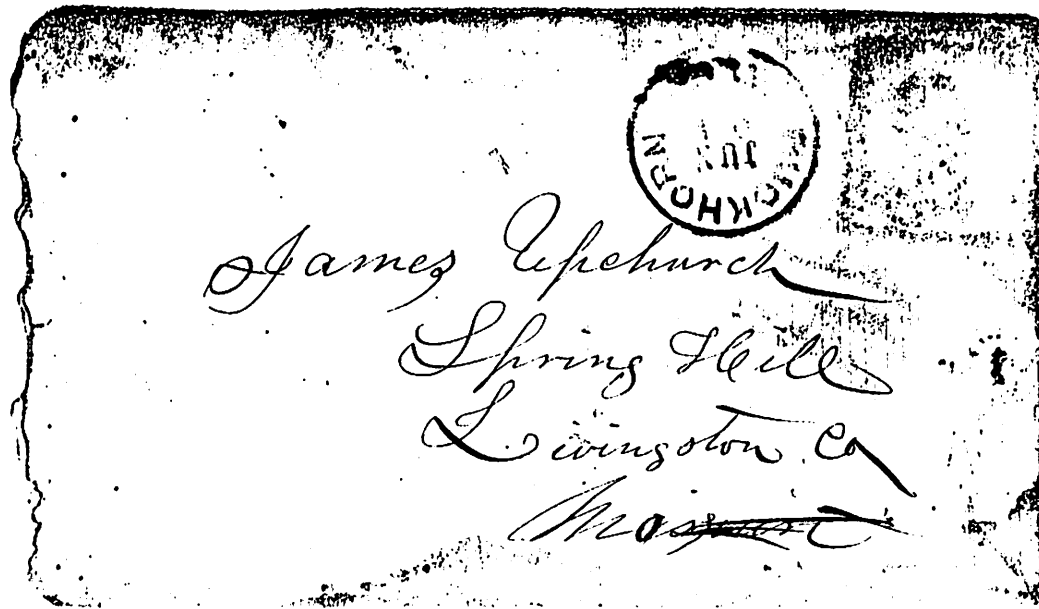
would gladly pay for Wesley, etc.) I asked if I could just look at the ¹⁸⁹¹ Upchurch death certificate but was told it was against the law. She said it was even unlawful for me to view the list unless I paid \$5.00 for a search, but she had waived that.

I thought you might be interested in three letters written to James Upchurch by Wesley and George in 1870-1871. Obviously, the envelope (date of June) was not used to mail either of these letters.

James and Barbara Upchurch lived in Missouri for a couple years. I believe he worked in a mill for a while with a relative (could be relative of Barbara). The relative's first name was Ruben.

The descendents of Wesley Upchurch held a reunion Sunday, June 17, 2001. It was at the home place of James and Barbara (Bradney) Upchurch, now known as the Yakle Farm, north of Timewell, Illinois.

The group was called together at noon when Barbara (Yakle) Elas rang the historic dinner bell, once owned by her grandparents, James and Barbara Upchurch. The group was led in prayer by Sam Painter, grandson of the late Christena (Yakle) Painter. He also paid tribute to two family members who recently passed away. They were his father, Kenneth Painter, and James Edward Upchurch, son of the late Owen Upchurch.

A large collection of family memorabilia was on display and included a musket loader gun and a cane once used by James Upchurch; Barbara Upchurch's basket, a sampler made by Nora Elizabeth Upchurch in the 1800's; the WWII Marine Uniform and medals from the late Robert Yakle; several scrapbooks and many pictures. Heidi Simmons, granddaughter of Mildred (Yakle) Cleaves, displayed an extensive family tree tracing the Upchurch ancestry from Wesley Upchurch through the current generation.

Robert Phillip Upchurch, Editor of the Upchurch Bulletin, was the group's special guest.
