Chemical Firm Loses \$100 Million Suit

GALVESTON (AP) - Jurors slapped Monsanto Co. with one of the largest damage awards in Texas history after finding that the company negligently exposed an employee to a chemical that his family said led to his death.

The federal court jury awarded \$100 million to the Alvin family of Wilbur Jack Skeen Friday after a 48-day trial. Skeen died Nov. 21, 1980, from leukemia.

"This is not about money. This is about justice," said Tommy Crook, Skeen's son-in-law.

Of the \$100 million award, \$60 million went to Skeen's wife, Sammie Joe Skeen, and \$8 million each to five of the couple's six children. One of the sons was not a party to the suit.

One of the family's attorneys called the award the largest in the state involving an individual.

Skeen had been employed at Monsanto's

Chocolate Bayou facility in Alvin since 1969. He was diagnosed in 1975 as having leukemia, but he continued working at the plant until two days before he died.

The jury determined that St. Louis-based Monsanto was grossly negligent regarding Skeen, who had taken over his job from a man who had also died from the fatal blood cancer.

Monsanto denied all accusations during the trial, contending that plant workers were drilled in safety procedures at a facility designed to keep exposure low to chemicals such as benzene.

"We're outraged over this verdict and over the awards," Monsanto spokesman Dan Bishop said Friday night from St. Louis. "The obvious point is that everyone is exposed to benzene. You're exposed every time you fill up your car with gasoline."

He said evidence showed Skeen had been exposed to 1 part per million of benzene on an average eight-hour day, compared to Occupational Safety and Health Administration limits of 5 ppm.

The family's attorneys, Robert Moore, John O'Quinn and Jeffrey Kilgore, argued that Monsanto knew the harmful effects of benzene, an aromatic hydrocarbon.

During the trial, jurors were shown a 1973 handwritten internal memorandum to Monsanto management from its own industrial hygienist, Jack T. Garrett.

The memo said, in part, that "there is some statistical evidence that benzene exposure is connected with the development of leukemia. If benzene is ever added to the OSHA list (of dangerous substances), it would be catastrophic to Monsanto."

Dear Charlie,

After some delay I have found time to process your letter of 4 AUG 1985 and the census records you sent along for Montgomery/Sorry Counties. I have made some master sheets coordinating all details and, thanks to you, now have a story to tell in a future issue of the UB. This will be done by publishing the census records and ~~to~~ some commentary.

For the 1840 census I am able to link all entries to the Uphurch family.

For the 3 1810 households we can identify & link all members of the Allen U household. For the Harmon U household we can account for 3 of the 6. Harmon is the male 45+, his wife Elizabeth is the female 45+ and the male 16-26 is his son Howell U. It is possible that Howell is and the female 10-16 is his wife and the male <10 is his son. This fits fairly well with Howell's family as it appears on the 1830 census. This accounts for all in Harmon's 1810 household except for the male age 10-16. This individual is of the right age to be the James U age 30-40, head of

Household on the 1850 census. If we assume the individual (James) was the son of Harmon U it fits OK for Harmon as he would have been 57 when the child was born but his wife Elizabeth would have been 57 also - possible but not likely. The James U Family on the 1850 census does not appear on the 1870 Montgomery Co census and we must be alert for him to surface elsewhere.

The B. U family on the 1810 census is a challenge.

B. U does not appear on subsequent Montgomery Co census records and probably moved out of the county. B. U is too old to have been a son of Adams or Howell U but B. U is just right to have been a 3rd son of Harmon U.

For the 1850 family census all are listed up with their names excepted. One is Eva Tree in the name of Mary U, widow of Allen U. I don't know how Eva fits in. Also we do not have maiden names for Elizabeth —, wife of Benjamin U [son of Allen] and for Elizabeth —, wife of William U [son of Allen]

For 1860 I cannot determine the significance of the B. W Kelly family and the David Popler family. Can you enlighten me. [Could it be that David Popler's wife MULLY is really Martha U, sister of William Kelly U? I guess this only because Mully sounds a son William R. Popler - (possibly after her brother ??)]

For 1370 everything fits except for the Arch
Mabery family where we find a Harvey U. 17.
I cannot link any of the 3 members of this
family.

I will leave you to make as little or
as much comment on this item as you
see fit. Just wanted you to see
where we are now. It looks very
good

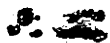

P.S. In summarizing the above I neglected the 3rd page of your letter which you comment on the 1860 census. Martelia U is ^{the} Martitia ^{A.} Pass the widow of James U, son of Allen U. Elizabeth U is widow of John Rodney U, son of Allen U. My conclusion is that although ~~there are~~ there are 2 Elizabeths U's (1725 & 1845) they are one and the same.

Re Hannah Lilly (wife of B. W. Lilly) being an orphan I cannot quite fit her in. She would be too young to be a sister of Howell or Allen. There is a female age 10-16 on the 1810 census in Harmon's home but the Hannah Lilly age (59 in 1860) does not quite fit. There is still a spare female in the household of the widow of Harmon U on the 1830 census but she is shown as 40-50 hence too old to be Hannah Lilly and in fact too old to be the spare female referred above in Harmon household in 1810. There was a spare female in Allen household in 1830 (age 15-20) but she is not old enough to be Hannah Lilly. The female < 10 on 1810 census in home of B. U would fit Hannah Lilly perfectly. If some of my census numbers (ages) are incorrect we might end up with different conclusions re Hannah U.

I came home for a few days and left for Branson, Mo. to take my son and grandson on a fishing trip to celebrate their 11 and 12 year old birthdays. I made some notes that may be of interest, but didn't get a chance to write while I was there.

I doubt that I will be of any help to you. I found some bits and pieces in my books that may be of interest to you and will send them.

I have not attempted to research my Rogers line. In fact, myself nor anyone else that I correspond with has found anything more than census records on our Picklesimer/Rogers line at early dates.

My Rogers connection is Nancy Rogers who married David Picklesimer, Sr. Our Picklesimer family appears to descend from a Henry Picklesimer, Sr. who was in Old Pendleton Co., NC in 1790, but by 1820 our David first appears in the census of Buncombe Co., NC, probably the area that is now Haywood and Cherokee Co.

As far as I know they have no connections to Stanly Co., however there was a John Picklesimer in Montgomery Co. in the early years, about 1810 I believe without looking up my records and we do not know his connection with our family yet, but I believe he may have been related closely, because of the repetition of the name John in our family names.

From my 1860 Census book of Stanly Co. I find the following:
1/1- Palmer, Anna, 45; Rogers, David W. 24; Rogers, J.W.F., 22;
Daniel D. 19; Reuben C. 16; and Madison L. 12.

From the same census the family that appears to be what you sent on yours reads: 927/941- Rodgers, Aaron 35; Nancy 38; Susan R. 16; Sarah A. 14; Jacob J. 12; Abram A. 9; Reuben C. 5; Mathew W. 3; and John 1/12.

The fact that both these families had a Reuben C. which was not all that common a name would make me suspect that they had a close and fairly recent ancestor in common.

From Abandoned Cemeteries I find at the Rogers Burial Ground:
John M.R. Rogers, son of John and Anna Rogers died Sept. 20, 1847, aged 35 years, 8 mo., 12 da.
Daniel D. Rogers born July 3, 1841, died July 19, 1862 age 21 yrs., 16 da.
Margaret E. Frick, his wife born May 25, 1840 age about 28 yrs. (died May 14, 1869, from Bible of L.O. Burris)
Mary R. Rogers, dau of J.H. & R.L. Rogers died June 4, 1862 age 3 yrs., 13 da.

The fact that there were several Hatley names at this cemetery made me stop and check some of my Hatley info. and I find that Edith C. Whitley, 1909-G N. Centennieal St., High Point, NC 27260 has a Rogers ancestor on her pedigree chart. Edith shows Simeon Hatley's wife was Anna M. Rogers. Abandoned Cemeteries has recorded at the Rogers Burial Ground the following: Amey Hatley, wife of Simeon Hatley was born Julyary the 7 day 1802, departed this life November 12 AD 1848. I believe that Edith might be able to clear up why the difference in the spelling of the name on the stone compared to what she has on her pedigree chart. She is not in good health and takes a while to answer letters, but would no doubt be able to help.

According to Edith's pedigree chart Simeon Hatley and Anna Rogers had a daughter, Anna M. Hatley, 18 Feb 1827 - 21 Nov 1905, Stanly Co. who married Temple Irenus Whitley, 20 Jul 1821 - 15 May 1865, Stanly Co.

I noticed that Upchurch was one of your family names, so I made some notes on that family. Lucille Curlee, 1211 Heritage Dr., Albemarle, NC 28001 was looking for information from Conway Co., Ar. Since I visit there occasionally I tried to find something to help her. She wrote that she needed information on Isaac Cooper and wife, Mary. Jeremiah Lowder and wife, Priscilla (Shofner). She states taht Priscilla had a sister, Eliza A. who married James Upchurch. Lucille says that Caswell Cooper and all his family except one son moved to Ar. in the fall of 1860. Caswell's wife had died earlier that year. From an old diary she read they stopped in Conway Co. to visit Uncle Isaac Cooper, Cousin Jeremiah Lowder and the Upchurches prior to their arrival in Pope Co., Ar.

In Conway Co. I found the following will. I did make a copy of it and will be glad to send it, if this is of interest to you.

- It read as follows: William Upchurch, Conway Co., Ar., dtd.
- 8 Sep 1880; Probated 24 Jul 1884. Exec: son, Thomas A. Upchurch
- Witnesses: A.A. Saunders and Henry Reid; Heirs, daus. Sarah and Eliza Upchurch; son, Thomas A. Upchurch; grandchildren,
- Sarah, Margaret, Ella and Emaline Cooper, heirs of daughter
- Mary Cooper; granddaughter, George Ann Upchurch, heir of son
- Nathan Upchurch; wife, Elizabeth.

I noticed that your Aaron Rogers died in Searcy Co., Ar. My husband and I visited there in Feb. My Rosenbalm family settled there. We both believe that we saw Rogers buried at Canaan Cem., so. of Marshall, but didn't make notes of them. If you need info. from that area, let me know and I will check it when I make another trip to that area.

From Stanly Co. marriages I found, Susanna R. Rogers married Henry E. Glover, 12 Feb 1865.

I do hope I have been of some help to you and feel free to contact me if you think I can be of additional help by checking records in other areas. I have a Rogers link in Monroe Co., Tn. and my husband and I both have a variety of Rogers in our family trees. My husband has Rogers cousins in Sebastian Co., Ar.

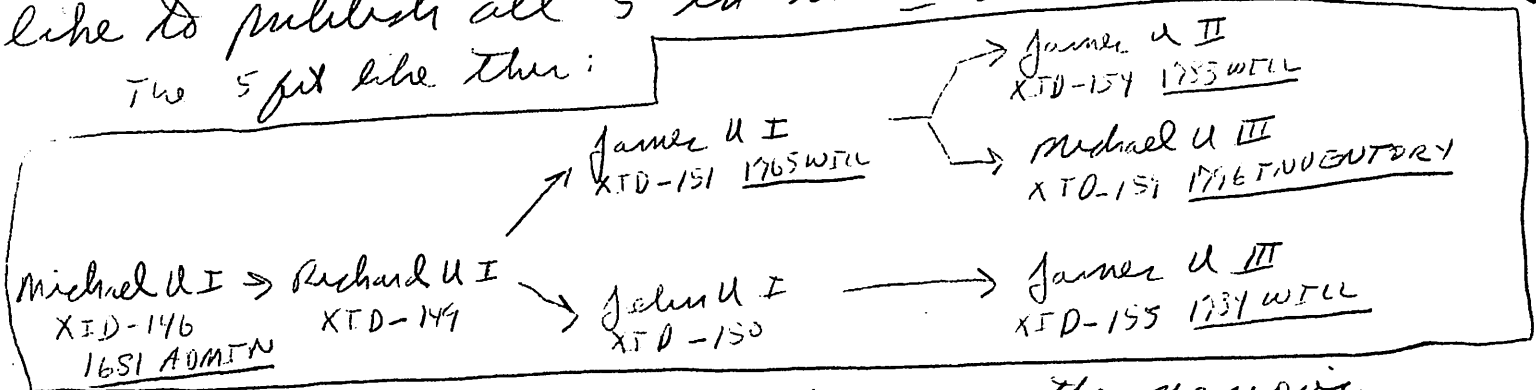

I have called several people in Norwood that are Upchurch descendants. They are all interested in the history and have reunions but know less than we do. They are descended from William Riley Upchurch who was the son of Allen. However, their information only goes back as far as William Riley, but feel they will assist us in going back farther.

A friend of mine was doing research on the history of Norwood Methodist Church and found the following:

To let you know what I have found and for you to let me know what you want copies of I am writing this. Also, to ask you for any more information you might have on the Rodgers, Abram and Susan Ritchie Rogers, as I have been unable to find them. Do you know any of their children's names?

The John Rodgers, born about 1770, died 1847, and his wife Sarah Biles, daughter of Thomas Biles, had children: Susannah (born 1801) married Adam Ritchie 1st and Simion Hatley 2nd; Judith (born 1803) married Martin Harkey; Tobitha (born 1803) married Noah Thompson; Frances (born 1802) married William Hatley (twin brother of Simion); Anna married Simion Hatley (his first wife); Purity (born 1808) -m- Guilford Hatley; John M. I have done a limited amount of work on the Upchurch family and have or can get quite detailed information from William Riley Upchurch on. We know very little about the Upchurchs before that, and if you have any information I would be most interested.

My Grandmother was Jessie Ada Upchurch, the daughter of Osborn Howell Upchurch and the granddaughter of William Riley Upchurch. She married Will Lilly, my grand father. My fathers name is John Upchurch Lilly.

Since I don't know how much you already know, I will give most of the highlights of what I have. William Riley Upchurch was born in 1825, ^{1824-RPUJ} the son of Howell Upchurch (born about 1780-90) and Rebecca Upchurch. His grand parents names were probably Thomas and Hannah but I have very limited information. William Riley had sisters named Celia, Nancy, Martha and Sarah. He married first Sarah Randall and had two children by that marriage: (1) Osborn Howell Upchurch born in 1848 and Lucy Ann Upchurch born in 1850. Sarah Randall Upchurch died in 1852 and Wm. Riley married second the widow Sarah L. McSwain who had a son Thomas McSwain.

Montgomery Co. were almost totally destroyed

by fire in the late 1840's. This had made

- tracing the family histories quite a chore.
- Although I live in Plymouth I am on the

- consequently visit Raleigh frequently. The
- State Archives and Library are very well
- organized in a new building with all existing
- county records indexed and most on
- microfilm. There is still a lot of hard

Thanks for your letter of January 17, 1984 and for the details on the cemeteries.

Of the several cemeteries mentioned I assume the one that your GGF bought in 1871 was the Hughes Sprung Cem in which R.M. & Mary L.U. are buried - Right? R.M.U. = Romulus Madison U and Mary L.U. = nee Mary Lucretia Pepman. See U B Val 4 No 1 Pgs 5 & 7. I did not have dates so complete so this is mostly new information for me. I would have assumed that the Hughes Sprung Cem was more or less "in town" but you indicate it was a family cemetery. I have not yet found any basis for connecting R.M.U. & Mary to the others in the cem. Perhaps it was just a convenient place to be buried??

As for the Courtland Cem, I recognize the name as belonging to the Richard U III / Clarence U Subolan (see U B Val 2 No 1). I have had a fair amount of interaction with Mrs Raggio Upchurch of Abilene, TX who is listed as a contact for the Courtland Cem.

Charlie, I really appreciate your sending me the details on the cemetery. If you can see any other special relationships from this material please let me know.

Perhaps there will be a luncheon trip for me to your part of Texas one day and we can steal a few minutes to meet in person.

Your letter of 10/20/83 arrived some time ago and I am just now finding time to respond.

At the present time I have not been able to find a reference which would qualify your wife for the DAR. My records show Harrell U (XFD-326) was b. ca 1790 and d. 1846 (Stanley Co, NC). He was not around to participate in the Revolution so we have to look up one more generation to his father Harman U (XFD-167). Harman U was b. 1740 and d. 1800. He would have been age 36-41 during the period 1776-1781 when the Revolution was under way. He was a little old for direct military service and yet he could have been an active soldier - or have rendered other service which also qualifies one for DAR membership. I have 3 entries in my file (3 pages) on Harman U and will be glad to send these to you if you so desire. He was b. in Brunswick Co, VA but moved to Montgomery Co, NC (his area later became Stanley Co, NC) and he died there. Our records on Harman U

no father incomplete and no need now send
 on him and on his son Howell U. Perhaps


