Hi, I have received your welcome letter and also the book "The History of Fentress County Tennessee" for which I am very thankful to you for entrusting as a loan to me.

I had no idea that the book would be so huge and the amount of research that had gone into making of it.

I'm afraid that I have been guilty of spending a lot of time reading it.

I have found some of the answers to my problems in research in the Upchurch-Dishman and Bathshares families in the book that I didn't expect to ever find.

I will read and reread the History.

and will return it to you by mail.

I didn't find any reference to the Queen family, that didn't surprise me too much as I think they were in Overton and Morgan County before it became

Fentress County. I will continue in my search for my Grandfather and his parents as I go along. His name was Elijah Buck Queen. I have noticed that there are a lot of E.B's (initials) used in the families of the Dishmans and Upchurch

families (in the book that you sent me).

I have always thought that the name "Buck" in my Grand Father's name was passed down from another family connection, I don't know if I am right in this line of thinking or not. I have not found any proof of that yet.

yes, I'm very aware that we will find both good and good in the families that we research.

But, I'm not seeking heros, just trying to find who my people were. I believe that each person has his or her own life to live, and that it takes us all to make a family. I do not know of any thing of great interest in the lives of my Father John Edwin Queen or myself. We both are and was just good citizens that have worked hard to support our families. I guess that we just lived the ordinary way most people do.

My Father did drive a freight wagon with a mule train from Springfield Mo. to Forsyth Mo. (Taney Co) he delivered dry goods to Merchants, one of the Merchants at Forsyth had a Daughter that later on became my Mother. He also worked to help build a dam across the White River in Taney Co. Mo. that created a famous lake (Lake Taney como) as well as being the source of a huge Electric Generating station at the dam.

Later, he was a railroad employee.

He lost the sight of his right eye in a railroad.

accident and he never returned to work on the Railroad after that. He did various types of work after that Mostly Plumbing work. He had a huge garden too.

I quit school early to work and to keep the family going as was the custom then, as well as my older Brothers did. I went to work for the SLSF railroad on my 21<sup>st</sup> Birthday. I had gotten married at the age of 19 and in those days 21 was the earliest age that a person could get a job on the railroad (or most places)

I operated a Diesel Engine for a few years.

Had a job related back injury that was pretty bad.

Had no Military Service on account of the injury.

Then I came to California in 1943, worked at the Handy Iron Works until the war ended.

at that time the Westinghouse Electric Corp. took over Handy's Iron Works and I worked for Westinghouse for 31 years. as a Senior Storekeeper.

I had my left hand badly injured at work.

It was so bad that I just retired from work.

I've had 6 operations on it, and was informed by my Doctor yesterday 8-13-90 - that I should have another operation on my hand. I haven't seen the hand Specialist about that yet, until I get another opinion from my family Doctor.

So, that is not a great outline on my Father and myself. I expect that a lot of men have a lot worse outline than that though.

I can sure understand the pain and discomfort that you have been having with your foot and I sure do hope that it is better now. I've never had gout, but I know what pain is. and I sure wish that you didn't have to have it.

I sure do like to hear about your farm. and I know how exciting that it is for you. I do hope that you have great success with it. I was raised in the south west part of Missouri and the land is not the same as where your farm is. also then no one knew really how to take good care of their land. nor did they irrigate their crops. But I think that the worst thing was that they did not diversify their crops enough. I have never lived on a farm, but most people around here think that I have, because I raise plants for the local gardeners every year in my small green house. and I plant tomatoes in my backyard where ever the sun can shine on them. My tomatoes that I picked today weighed about 2 pounds each. I usually keep my neighbors well supplied with them. I sure would like to see the garden that your son has on the farm.

I'll bet when you get your farm to your liking and with your knowledge, that it will be a showplace. and a place to be proud of.

Will stop for this time

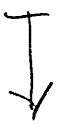

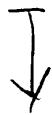
