534 GORMAN LEONARD AND CLARICE DICKERSON LEONARD

Among the very early settlers in Franklin County was John Leonard and from his lineage

came William Henry Leonard, b. 1838, d.1885. His son, William Peyton Leonard, b.1871, d. 1949, was the father of R. G. Leonard, b.1904, d. 1988.

Gorman was the third child of six children born to William Peyton Leonard and Mary Frances (Molly) House Leonard. He and his brothers farmed the land on which his ancestors had once owned in the Sandy Creek and Goldmine Districts. Family lore has been passed down about their father's apple trees and the apple brandy that was made.

Among the fine characteristics that Gorman possessed was the determination to graduate from Cedar Rock High School, which he did at the age of twenty-two by driving himself to school. His father had kept him out of school to farm and therefore delaying his high school education. His high school graduation class was the last to graduate from Cedar Rock High School in 1926. The school had closed in 1925 but the class attended Edward Best High School for the last year, but the diploma indicates Cedar Rock High School. Gorman and his brother Clyde made plans to enroll and attend business school in Richmond, Virginia, but finances proved to be short and they had to return home and back to the farm without graduation. Among the social events of the day was the gathering of young people in various communities to hold "Barn Dances". At one such event in Bunn, NC he met a young lady, Clarice

Dickerson, b.1910 d.2000. She had been attending college in Boone, which is now Appalachian State University, but had to return home due to the death of her father. Apparently this dance was to become a lifelong event as they were married in 1934. Gorman continued to farm and Clarice finished her college education several years later on August 17, 1951. Educational requirements for teachers dictated that she must have a degree and she completed the final requirements by spending summers in a college classroom. She retired from teaching in the Franklin County School System in the mid 1960's. Many local people still kindly remember their third grade teacher. She was a strong believer in classroom manners and in maintaining order.

During the years Gorman had a small general store located on the farm where he grew tobacco, cotton and corn. The smokehouse was usually full of hams and sausage. His household garden held a plentiful supply of beans, peas, beets and other vegetables for the family. Gorman continued to farm until his retirement in the 1970's. The farm animals were sold and the land was rented to a local farmer and tobacco continued to grow on the

Gorman and Clarice had a family of three sons and one daughter. One son, Ted Gorman, was born in October 1941 but died at six months old in February 1942 and is buried in

the Sandy Creek Baptist Church Cemetery.

As this article is being written there are eight grandchildren and about eighteen great-grandchildren from their lineage. As grandchildren arrived and were old enough to enjoy a trip to the store, Granddaddy Leonard would put them in his truck and drive slowly to the neighborhood store for a "pop and candy bar". All the grandchildren loved their granddaddy and those trips to the store. Grandmother would bake individual pies for the granddaughters which they still remember with fond memories. She loved to cook and her oldest son especially was a happy recipient of her county cooking.

Church attendance was required at the Leonard household and the Gorman Leonard Family faithfully attended Sandy Creek Baptist Church every week, an event that continued throughout the lifetime of Gorman and Clarice Leonard. There are ancestral Leonard's buried in the church cemetery and on nearby lands. The genealogical lineage of these wonderful people will continue to survive as future generations are born. Their ancestors have provided a look into the past in order to show those unborn generations that they have a past worth being proud of.

Gerald was born to Gorman and Clarice Dickerson Leonard. He graduated from Edward Best High School and attended North Carolina State University. He graduated from Dell School of Medical Technology, Asheville, NC and West Georgia College (1973) BS. Medical

Technology. He served two years in the Army and after his discharge married Patricia Crosby of Colquitt County, Ga in 1961. They worked as Laboratory Technologists in Georgia hospitals before making their home in Newnan, Ga. Their four daughters were born in Coweta General Hospital, Newnan, Ga. During the next twentyeight years their daughters attended high school and graduated from Georgia and North Carolina colleges: BSN, Valdosta State University; BA English, North Carolina State University, Elementary Education, University of West Georgia and Speech Therapy, East Carolina University. Gerald and Patricia moved to Franklin County in 1987 and continue to live on the small farm that they had purchased several years before. Patricia continued to work in a hospital laboratory and Gerald taught medical technician students at Halifax Community College before accepting the Laboratory

Manager position at Halifax Memorial Hospital, He was a Laboratory Manager in Georgia before moving to N.C. Their daughters live in several states and there are twelve grandchildern. During their years in Georgia they were active in the American Medical Technologists organization. At various times both served as president and other officers in the Georgia State Society. They served as the G.S.S.A.M.T. Representative on the Ga State Department of Human Resources Board of Laboratory Advisory Council, which made the governing rules for hospital laboratories in Georgia.

Gerald and Patricia retired about the year 2000. As retirement began to decide their next avenue of "adventure", genealogy came to the forefront. A single book, "Aldermans in America", had the most influence on them. As Gerald began to help Patricia with her Alderman ancestors it was suggested that he began researching his Franklin County lineage. The records were mostly located in the local courthouse. So began the kindling of a "blazing fire." They now have a common interest in genealogy which began in 1999 and still demands a constant search for new information. Patricia's ancestors lived in England, Scotland, Connecticut, New Jersey, North Carolina and South Carolina before settling in South Georgia. Gerald's Leonard ancestors came from Middle Europe, England, Virginia to Franklin County, North Carolina, but have been unable to determine where the Dickerson lineage began and how they arrived in Franklin County. Gerald's genealogy research has been mostly confined to the county as the Leonard families simply did not leave as they must have thought there was a fence around the county

William Peyton (Willie P.) Leonard, son of William Henry Leonard, grandson of Larkin Leonard, great grandson of Frederick Leonard, was born 3 Dec 1871 and died 4 Dec 1949. married Mary Frances (Mollie) House (b. 24 Mar 1881, d. 25 Jul 1934) on 20 Dec 1899 in her father's house. She was the daughter of Thomas J. House and Sarah (Sallie) Brewer. His only sibling, Henry Lee Leonard, was born in 1869 and died about 1898-99, married Mary Susan (Mollie) House (b. 29 Oct 1877, d. 11 Aug 1955) on 16 Jan 1896 at the home of her father, William E. "Tobe" House. The Leonard brothers both married a Mollie House who were first cousin to each other, their fathers being brothers. Mollie Leonard (Henry Lee) remarried after Henry Lee's death to Dallas Benton. She was thereafter known as Mrs Mollie Benton. Grandfather "Willie Leonard" and Grandmother "Mollie" had seven children, the last was a baby girl, unnamed, died at one day old and was buried in the House-Wood Cemetery on Leonard Road. The six children lived to adulthood, married, had families and all lived on now Leonard Road. The children: (1) Lola Pearl Leonard, b.1 Oct 1900, d. 2 Jan 1979, married Robert Eirven Stallings, b. 14 Aug 1902, d.24 Oct 1975, on 7 Aug 1937. A daughter from a previous marriage, Audrey Alice Stallings, b. 27 Sep 1926, came to live with Robert and Lola. There was no issue. (2) Clyde Wheeles

Leonard, b. 3 Mar 1902, d. 29 Oct 1991, married Iva O'Neal West, b. 19 Aug 1908, d. 3 Aug 1965, on 2 Mar 1929. Children: Stanley Leonard, b. 20 Sep 1940, d. 19 Jul 1999; Joseph Hampton, b. 26 May 1947, d. 5 May 2000; William Rex, b. 2 Dec 1951. One of the things that my grandfather (Willie P.) was noted for was his Dinner Bell. Everybody was farming and needed to know when dinner time came. He rang it for dinner each day at 11:30 AM and rang it again for time to go back to work at 1 PM exactly. It could be heard all over the neighborhood with its distinctive peal. Another memory is that of Sunday afternoons at Grandfather's house. About every other Sunday we would go to Grandfather Leonard and the other Sunday we would go to Bunn to visit my mother's relatives and my Grandmother Dickerson. But back to Grandfather Leonard, when we arrived at his house the children would go out to play and the men would gather in the sitting room by the fireplace around granddaddy and the ladies would usually gather in the kitchen. There was usually talk of crops, etc, and that was important to him, as he still owned all the land and extracted one fourth share in the proceeds of the

crops. However, he designated the share of his land that each child would receive. Family homes for each of the six children had been built by them on their share. Later, just 3 years prior to his death in 1949, he divided the land into six fairly equal parts, each getting the share that they had built upon. Each share was duly recorded at the Franklin County Courthouse and a deed issued. We children, on rainy or cold days would gather in the back room (parlor) and my cousins, Drucilla, Audrey and Janet, would keep up with the rest of us. I remember fondly that we popped popcorn and made softball size molasses balls. Also for entertainment was a player piano with the paper piano rolls that contained many songs. It was said that Willie P. had a large Apple Orchard from which he made huge quantities of apple cider. In a fit of anger he cut down all but 6 apple trees. It seems that my father and his older brother had fashioned a bucket from a small snuff box and string, and after removing the bung from a barrel of apple brandy they would get about a half ounce of Brandy which they would drink, I don't know how often they performed this trick. Whether this is absolutely true or not we will never know. I remember finding a sizeable cider press in the barn that had been well used!! Willie P. was always looking for a way to make extra money. He had a prized boar that he rented to other farmers and it seems that he was the community money lender. Finally, one last story that my aunts told to me as being the truth but was totally false. My great-grandmother, Saraphna Collins, was supposedly a boat bride from Spain. Not true! In fact Her parents, James T. and Mariah Cope Collins, lived nearby in Franklin County. Family lore has been proven wrong by research.

If there is such thing as a connoisseur of smells, that person would love Tamara Leonard's house.

The Falls resident has a roomful of herbs and spices, most of which were grown on her parents' farm nearby, that she mixes together to make potpourri and crafts.

Leonard will bring the same potent smells to the Community House in Wake Forest this weekend as part of the Third Annual Crafts Carnival. Unlike the other exhibitors who will be upstairs, she will utilize the room downstairs that in the summer is used as a snack bar for swimmers in the Holding Park pool.

The carnival will begin Saturday morning at 10 a.m. and conclude for the day at 6 p.m. Sunday's show hours are noon to 6 p.m. A \$2 admission is charged but coupons for \$1 off are available in an advertisement in this week's

newspaper.

Leonard said her family became interested in herbs and spices when she had a few herb plants in a window seal of her home. The plants were dying so her mother, Barbara, took them a quarter-mile up the road to her yard and planted them. The plants prospered and multiplied ... and multiplied.

The Leonards now have about 200 varieties of plants on about three acres of farmland near the Neuse River. In the spring, Tamara, Barbara, and her husband, Nelson, use a tobacco bedding machine to plant the seeds.

Like the quickly growing plants,

the Leonards' interest in herbs and spices was fostered by reading various books. Tamara now has 150 of them. And from there, they started harvesting the plants and using them in crafts like wreaths, decorations for straw hats, and potpourri.

"It's just a major hobby," the younger Leonard said. "Hopefully, one day it'll become profitable."

Among the crafts the Leonards make with the herbs and spices are wreaths and decorations for straw hats. One of the wreaths in Tamara's house, that also serves as the home of Country Cottage Creations, is made with Sweet Annie (technically known as Artemesia Annuia) as the base with Cock Combs and purple Salvia Spikes added for color and a unique aroma.

They also have mixtures of different herbs and spices like "Bubblin' Hot Apple Pie," which, of course, smells like apple pie, and "Remembrances," which should provide a refreshing aroma 50 years, Tamara said. Included in it are frankincense, myrrh (two of the three gifts provided by the Wise Men to the infant Christ), pine combs, rose pedals, orange peels, cloves, etc. Some of the ingredients contribute to the aroma blend while others serve as "fixtures" to help preserve the smell.

In addition to the Leonards, 21 other artists and crafters will show their goods during the carnival, four of which will demonstrate their skill.

Those four are Robert Alewine, a potter; Turner Ray, who makes reproductions of Pennsylvania Rifles and accessories; Louise Sandusky, Swedish needlework; and Lloyd Williams, woodworking and caning. All are from Wake Forest.

Others participating in the carnival from Wake Forest are Willa and Dick Duggins, speciality items; Charlotte McCamy, pottery and glass earrings; Jean McCamy, handbuilt stoneware figures and wall hangings; Linda Voorhees, paintings and drawings; Tuyet Clark, egg rolls; and The Corner, sandwiches, drinks, and snacks.

Visiting crafters and artists will include Sandra Cannella, jewelry (Raleigh), Barb Freed, symbolic jewelry (Durham), Mona Hearne,

And, Rebecca Sexton, handpainted shirts (Greensboro), Harold Simons, scrimshaw artists, pen and ink drawings (Winston-Salem), Kim Warner, porch swings (Hillsville, Va.), Nessa Warner, weaver, Irish spun wool jackets, vests, scarves and caps (Hillsville, Va.), Lucy Weir, handwoven cotton blouses, skirts, belts (Winston-Salem), and Brenda Willis, handwoven rugs and placements (Oxford).

Area's first hazardous materic mock accident termed success By Jimmy Allen

His face streaked with a red, blood-like fluid, Sergeant A.C. Hall laid in a grassy field across from the new Wake Forest Post Office and moved his legs nervously as if in pain.

"Somebody help me," Hall said.
Within ten seconds, Northern
Wake rescuer Tamara Leonard ran
up to Hall and started checking his
vital signs. But Hall had a more
pressing matter.

He told his rescurer to get a law enforcement officer because the car he was thrown out of in a wreck a few minutes earlier contains

classified papers.

"Find it and guard it with your life," Hall said, wincing so much he was digging holes in the ground with his feet. "If anything happens to it, I'll be court marshalled."

Leonard yelled to another rescuer to get in touch with a law officer and then continued with first aid.


Hall was not actually hurt, and he is not a staff sergeant in the Army. Instead, he is a Wake Forest fireman who was portraying a person injured in a mock accident.

Between 125-150 participated in the training on Holding Avenue designed to give firemen, rescuers, law officers and special teams more experience in handling accidents involving hazardous materials and to test the interaction among the different agencies.

Hall was one of nine people pretending to be injured Sunday in a wreck between a car and a tractortrailer carrying what was later determined to be two toxic materials - hydraulic oil and ethylenediamine. Seven of the victims were treated soon after rescuers' arrival, but the driver and co-driver of the truck about a 100 yards away had to wait until men wearing outfits resembling a colorful beekeeper's suit from Wendell's Hazardous Materials Team carried them away on gurneys.

Wake Forest Fire Chief Jimmy Keith said this was the first active training with hazardous materials for the local department.

"The main thing we learned was how far we need to stay back," Keith said. When they arrived, two firemen wearing pear to cover their entire body walked to the back to find papers "identifying the chemicals being released.

The command post — with Johnny Habuda from the rescue squad, Joel Keith from Wake Forest police, and Clifton Keith from the fire department — checked with environmental management officials to determine the proper procedure to take until the hazardous materials team's arrival. They also called town administrator Jerry Walters and Mayor Jimmy Ray, who is the only person who can declare an evacuation in the city limits, Keith said.

Besides Wake Forest and Wendell, volunteers from Rolesville, Youngsville, Stony Hill, Falls and Six Forks responded. Franklinton firemen were enroute when the exercise was halted because of heat.

Three people participating sustained heat exhaustion, and one of those, Wake Forest junior fireman Jeff Leonard was taken to Wake Medical Center as a precautionary measure, Keith said. He was released about an hour later.

Keith, who said the planning for the mock disaster began in June, thanked Jack Rogers for use of his tractor-trailer, and Mike Kinton and Wake Tire for use of a wrecked car and wrecker. Rogers and Kinton were also two of the "injured."

Two other mock accidents have been held in Wake Forest the past few years, but none of them involved hazardous materials.

"For the first one, I think it went real well," Keith said.

Previously designated evaluators of the accident handling — from initial response to the rescue of the truck driver and his decontamination to the clean-up — were to gather this week to compare findings and then report back to each agency involved.
