The family grew up on a farm in northern Wake County near the Rodgers Store Post Office. Artifacts of an Indian civilization were found on the farm dating back over one thousand years.

Four of Buckner's children (George, Robert, Willis and Mary) married children of the Penny family. The area around Rodgers Store Post Office must have been a small farming community in the period just after the Civil War.

The 1850 Census reveals that Buckner Ray (known as Buck) was a farmer who owned real estate valued at \$1,500. The 1860 Census shows the value of his real estate had increased to \$2,000 and his personal property had an estimated value of \$5,000. The 1870 Census indicates that the value of his real estate had declined by fifty percent to \$1,000 and the value of his personal property had declined by seventy percent to \$1,500. This decline in assets was probably due to the Civil War. Buckner Ray was 43 when the Civil War began. Buckner enlisted in the Confederate Army on December 4, 1864 at age 46 and he served as a 2nd Lieutenant in Company K of the 6th North Carolina Senior Reserves (Seventy Sixth Regiment).

Senior Reserves in North Carolina were composed of men between 45 and 50 years of age. The Fourth, Fifth and Sixth Reserves were formed into the Second Brigade under the command of Colonel John F. Hoke, with headquarters in Salisbury. At the beginning of the war, Hoke was Adjutant-General of North Carolina. At the end of 1864, Buckner Ray's Brigade was stationed at Salisbury (approximately 100 miles west of Raleigh, the State Capital). This Brigade guarded prisoners, railroad bridges, and arrested deserters. The services performed were indispensable and relieved other troops for service in the field. On some occasions there were fights with deserters who were armed and, when banded together, made themselves a terror to certain neighborhoods. It appears that the only time Buckner Ray's Brigade came in contact with the enemy was when Stoneman made his raid at Salisbury to release Union prisoners. On March 4, 1865, Buckner Ray's Brigade was no longer needed to guard the prisoners at Salisbury and was ordered to High Point (40 miles northeast of Salisbury) and then placed in the Seventh Congressional District to arrest deserters. The regimental headquarters was at Asheboro. On March 16th the regiment was ordered to Greensboro. Upon the surrender of Confederate General Johnston, some members of the Senior Reserves were officially released from service, but the majority returned home without ceremony.

According to family tradition, Jane Caroline Ray is a true heroine. During the later stages of the Civil War, armed soldiers ordered Caroline to leave her home on Old Creedmoor Road. Their aim was to ransack the home in search of food and valuables and then burn it to the ground. Caroline risked her life by refusing to leave her home, and her courage saved the family farmhouse from destruction. The soldiers met their match in this strong willed woman and left to plunder other property. It is not certain if these were Union soldiers or desperate Confederate deserters fleeing advancing Union forces. This event probably occurred in early 1865 when Buckner was serving in the Confederate Senior Reserves. At that time, Buckner and Caroline had eight children at home ranging in age from 3 to 17, and Caroline (age 42) was expecting their final child, Charles Buckner Ray, who was born in May of 1865.

Buckner Ray acquired six tracts of land totaling 605 acres during a twenty-two year period from 1840 to 1862 in Wake County, North Carolina as summarized below. The total amount he paid for these 605 acres was \$743 (\$1.23/acre).

The 1851 deed conveying the 225 acre estate to Buckner Ray from his father-in-law, Mark Grady, contained a provision that the property would be divided into eight equal parts and conveyed to the wife and seven children of Mark Grady. The 1851 deed to the 225 acre estate also conveyed nine Negro slaves to Buckner Ray. The names of the slaves were: Washington, Lewis, Granville, Davis, Annica, June, Doctor, Mary and child.

Buckner Ray sold six tracts of land totaling 1,552³/₈ acres during a twenty-four year period from 1842 to 1866 in Wake County, North Carolina as summarized below. The total sales price for these 1,552³/₈ acres was \$2,973 (\$1.92/acre).
