I am going to offer a preliminary report because help researching a new finding will be
appreciated.
The DNA project has shown us a very clear branching of the Poe family out of Essex County, VA from 1704. One branch is represented by marker $\# 458=16$. This is a group descended from or closely related to Simon Poe SR (1707-1793). Another branch is represented by marker \#458=15. This group does not descend from Simon Poe SR and is not "closely related" but still the same Poe family. These men probably descend from a contemporary (William Poe or Benjamin Poe especially who were active from about 1726 on).

Since they settled in Essex County, though, these two branches clearly had close ties. Now we find that members of both branches came together in Fayette County, AL.
Until the DNA results, the James Poe (born 1797) who married Mary "Polly" McMillan was assumed to be a "JR" son of Major James S. Poe (c. 1740-1727). But Willim Moody Poe, a descendant, shows marker \#458 = 15 putting him in the 'non-Simon" group. And that forced us to take a good look at the records. It turns out that the records make it clear this James Poe is not the JR son of Major James Poe. That son already appears in Chatham County records showing he must be born in the 1760 s . Also, the Arson County, NC census lists both Major James Poe and James Poe JR (when the James under discussion was only three). That 1800 census has Poe spelled Pow.

A recent uncovered "note" from a researher on this line posits that James Poe (b. 1797) came "with his brother" from Wake County, NC. This is an area where, indeed, we find a Benjamin Poe settled. This Benjamin Poe is the on listed in the 1771 Joab Books Muster Roll alongside other men from Culpeper County, VA (where the marker 15 men's line all seem to trace back to). Also, we see other Poe family in Wake County associated with the Hutchens family (there is possibly a Quaker connection with this Hutchens / Poe group).
What made is seem that James Poe (b. 1797) was of the family of Major James Poe is that a son of Major James Poe named Simon Poe married Margeret McMillan.
Clearly, the Poe story is more complex than the records have led us to imagine.
Anyone with research on James Poe (b. 1797) who married Mary "Polly" McMillan or research on the Wake County Poe family -- could you offer what you know?

POE, Benjamin North Carolina S 31307
Allen County, 9 Oct. 1833, in open court, BENJAMIN POE, aged 94 deposes that he entered service Dec. 1775 in N.C. and then moved to Randolph County N.C. In Sept. 1781 served again in the company of horsemen under CAPTAIN T. MARSH (or MASH). In Dec. 1781 again entered service in the company of mounted infantry under CAPTAIN CHARLES GOULDSTON. "Having served this tour he returned to Randolph County, N.C. and found his dwelling house reduced to ashes. Cites JOHN DYSON, LEVI ROARK, clergyman, ROBERT F. PULLIAM, JOHNSON J. COCERILLE, ROBT. H. PARIS, WALTER THOMAS, ISAAC TRACY, LOVEL STINSON (STENSON) as neighborhood witnesses. Covering Jacket: Kentucky--------25, 348 Benjamin Poe, Allen County, Pvt. N.C. line for

3 months. Pvt. of infantry, 9 months Pvt. of Cavalry. Inscribed on Ky. Roll at $\$ 47.50$ per year to begin 4 March 1831. Certificate of pension issued 28 Dec. 1833.
*Note: (Old Stile) refers to the Julian Calendar used by the English at that time. The calendar was converted to Georgian about 1752 and there is about a 5 month difference. The Julian Calendar began with March as it's first month. The Georgian Calendar uses January as the first month.

He and all of his four brothers and his father were well known as lumbermen in the Carolinas for many years.
Surviving are his wife, Mrs. Nannie Gibson Adams of Vaughan; three children, Leary W. Adams, Charlotte newspaperman, Mrs. Robert H. Williams of Cayce, S.C., and Mary Elizabeth Adams of Vaughan; three sisters, Mrs. Joe Massey of Apex, Mrs. Maggie Oldham of Holly Springs, and Mrs. Maude Holleman of Raleigh. $\triangle$
Mr. Adams numbered his cousins and nephews by the hundreds, all among the Adams, Beckwith, Hunter, Olive, Burt, Holland, Horne, Norris, Holleman, Massey and Oldham families of Wake County and Central North Carolina.
Mr. Adams was the fourth of the nine children of the late Col. Adams, commander of the North Carolina Twenty-Sixth at Appomattox, and the late Lucy Ann Beckwith Adams, daughter of Green Beckwith, who before the Civil War had a 5,000-acre plantation between Holly Springs and New Hill.
Mr. Adams suffered a severe fall near his mill early last November and received internal injuries from which he never recovered. He had ven in bed most of the time since mid-November and his condition became grave several weeks ago.
Funeral services will be held at the Holly Springs Baptist Church Friday afternoon at 2 o'clock.

# Clarence Poe, The Crusader A Personal Recollection 

BY FRANCES A. SMITH

One who never turned his back but marched breast forward,
Never doubted clouds would break,
Never dreamed, though right were worsted, wrong would triumph,
Held we fall to rise, are baffled to fight better,
Sleep to wake.

- Robert Browning, Epilogue to Asolando

Few people living had the privilege of working with Dr. Clarence Poe while he was the active, sagacious editor and board chairman of The Progressive Farmer. I am one.

I remember him with a respect and fondness that approach reverence because he was one of the greatest and most genuine people I have known, a person with resolve, a cause that he believed in to the depths of his soul for as long as he lived.

When I was assistant editor of the Carolinas-Virginia edition of The Progressive Farmer, Dr. Poe was already in his declining years, but his aging was evidenced only in the distinguished graying of his hair, the deepening lines around his eyes and the slight shuffling of his feet when he walked. His vigor and enthusiasm had in no way diminished, and his capacity for work kept younger members of his staff hustling. Though he emerged as a leader while still in his teens, becoming editor of The Progressive Farmer at 18, he was still writing his monthly full-page editorial and taking an active part in the editing of the magazine when those figures had reversed themselves.

Through all of those years, Clarence Poe was more than anything else a crusader, following one passion - to lift the Southern farmer out of the poverty of Reconstruction days when most rural people in the South were shackled by the blight of one-crop farming, time-price usury, uncontrolled erosion, poor schools, poor roads and poor medical care. In an excerpt from one of his essays, Dr. Poe explains the circumstances that drove him forward to become a leader in the remaking of Southern agriculture during the early decades of this century:

I was born in the years of the South's deepest poverty and trials and so shared the struggles and sorrows of humble men and women who knew hardship but also had pride and faith and heroism and honor - unsung heroes who were not great men but lived great lives.... The experience I had when I struggled with my family to help pay off with
five-cent cotton a mortgage on the old home of our ancestors, gave me a lasting sympathy for all other struggling poor people which I think I may sincerely say has ever since been the dominating passion of my life.

In response to this challenge, Clarence Poe at age 16 laid down his hoe in the poor cotton fields of Chatham County and rode a railroad pump cart to Raleigh to join the staff of an eight-page weekly agricultural journal. Within two years he was editor and through his lifetime saw The Progressive Farmer transformed into a full-blown magazine containing often over 100 pages and having a circulation of one and a half million. (In 1966, two years after Clarence Poe's death, The Progressive Farmer spawned a new publication, Southern Living. By then the company was operating under the name Southern Progress Corporation. In February 1985, Time Inc. purchased, for $\$ 480$ million, Southern Progress Corporation, which included The Progressive Farmer, Southern Living and Oxmoor Press, the company's book publishing arm. At that time, the circulation of The Progressive Farmer was 500,000 and the circulation of Southern Living was 2.3 million.)

Through the pages of The Progressive Farmer, Dr. Poe gave voice to his crusades for better farm practices and better lives for farm people. In his own opinion his most valuable crusade was for "Two-Armed Farming," a phrase he used to describe the South's need to add livestock to its age-old tradition of crop farming. Knowing that crops and livestock were almost equally balanced in flourishing farming areas, he

urged that livestock be added to Southern farms to provide a full year of farm production. Other causes championed by Dr. Poe and his magazine included better public schools, cooperative marketing, soil conservation, rural health, rural industries, world peace and rural beautification.

Dr. Poe gave up the opportunity for a formal college education; however, he read most of the classics by age 20 and traveled over the United States, Europe and Asia studying people, their history and their agriculture. He received four honorary doctorates.

He developed great proficiency as a writer and became a skilled and exacting editor requiring of himself and his associates the most accurate reporting, the clearest exposition and the most engaging rhetoric possible. I well remember the great care he took in preparing his monthly editorial. He would pen it in longhand, have it carefully
typed by his secretary, Ruth Reynolds, edit it and have it typed again, edit it and have it typed again - sometimes three or four times. Then, not having computers or other new-fangled mechanical devices common in today's publication offices, he would have it packaged and mailed to Birmingham, location of The Progressive Farmer's main offices and printing presses. However, before the U.S. Mail had time to do its job, Dr. Poe was often on the telephone instructing the Birmingham editors to make certain changes in his copy when it arrived. (Up until press time the editors there were in danger of receiving another call.)

His associates had a keen appreciation and respect for the careful attention Dr. Poe gave to finding the exact word, achieving the best approach and honing his writing until it would fit perfectly into the pocket of his reader's mind. In a tribute to Dr. Poe after his death in 1964, Eugene Butler, president and editor-in-chief of the magazine at that

time, acknowledged his colleague's abilities: as an extraordinary editor:

His editorship was marked by the art of persuasiveness. He was a man of strong convictions, but he had that rare talent of being able to disagree without being disagreeable. In addition to his crusading spirit, he had writing skill that has been the envy of his associates.
Combining this writing skill with keen insight and unfailing vigor, he published seven books, among them $A$ Southerner in . Europe, Where Half the World is Waking Up and, after he was 80 , True Tales of the South at War and My First 80 Years.

But Clarence Poe's voice carried even beyond the pages of The Progressive Farmer and those of his books, being often heard in the service of state and national committees and organizations. He was a member of

President Truman's Committee on Health Needs of the Nation as well as chairman of North Carolina's Hospital and Medical Care Commission. He was first Master of the North Carolina Grange, chairman of a National Advisory Committee on Rural Electrification, president of the American Country Life Association and for many years an elector for the Hall of Fame for Great Americans. He also served on the International Development Advisory Board with Nelson Rockefeller.

Although such pragmatic matters as these occupied much of Clarence Poe's thought and required much of his energy, he was also genuinely interested in great literature and great art. Each year he would publish in a winter issue a listing of classic books that he encouraged his subscribers to read during the long winter nights when chores were - minimal. He strove to use quality paintings and photographs on the covers of The Progressive Farmer and encouraged readers to vote for their favorite covers at the magazine's booth at the North Carolina State Fair. So great was the response to this poll that each fall most of us in the Raleigh office were for several days engaged in tallying the votes.

From around 1915 Dr. Poe was a strong leader in promoting art and art appreciation in North Carolina. As chariman of the executive committee of the North Carolina Art Society, whose foremost object was the establishment of the North Carolina Museum of Art, he was one of a small group chosen to oversee the purchase of the first large acquisition of paintings for the museum. The purchase involved one million dollars from the State with matching funds from the Kress Foundation.

A favorite painting from Dr. Poe's personal collection, Corn Harvest on the in Brandywine, by N.C. Wyeth, hung in The

Progessive Farmer offices during the nine years that I worked there and longer. This painting, a harvest scene dominated by the lush fall foliage of Delaware's Piedmont, was donated to the North Carolina Museum of Art and now hangs in its gallery of 20th-century art.

Dr. Poe's awards were myriad. Three that he was especially proud of were his citation as North Carolina Citizen of the Year in 1955, a State of North Carolina Award for Public Service and á Freedom Foundation of Valley Forge Award to The Progressive Farmer.

Clarence Poe made an indelible impression on me and on others who worked for him, but much more than that, he made an indelible impression on Southern farm people and on Southern agriculture. The devotion and the respect his readers felt for him were evidenced in the hundreds of letters, cards and telegrams sent at his death and in a colorful array of crepe myrtles in summer, many of these planted in his memory across the Southern countryside by farm people. This "flower of a hundred and one days" was a favorite of Dr. Poe's.

Now, The Progressive Farmer continues to aid farm people as in the past. And now these farmers face new crises, some in great peril of losing their farms. Some find that prices paid for crops will not pay for the high technology and big machinery needed to grow and harvest them. Land is being swallowed up by developers and government subsidies are down. If Dr. Poe were living, he would help find answers; he would offer encouragement; he would instill hope. In considering the responsibility he and his staff faced in publishing The Progressive Farmer for Southern farm people, he said, "We must fight to carry into their lives all the progress and comfort, all the richness and beauty and health and hope it is possible for us to stimulate."

## An Institution Passes of botitine al enchevza

Herbert M. Poe, an institution in Apex retail business, died last Thursday at the age of 90 .

FOr 64 years he ran the Poo Brothers' Store along with his brother Ralph. fol 16.44 the Western Auto moved hits the Poe store.

Herbert was born on August 9, 1886 in Chatham County. He was one of six children in a farming family, and he broght austere, hardworklugg sense of values from the farm to his business. The central pillar of his life was his strongly held religious beliefs. He was as member of the Apex Baptist church for 70 years - Longer than many men live.
whoe-Bmothers gat ts mute on Peary 1, 1935 after A. 8. Hunter had sold his remaining shares in the business in 1933. Herbert came to the A.B: Hunter store in September 1910. By 1912 be wat a partner in the business, and the mamie was changed to A .6 . Hunter and Company. At that time the business was largely focused on farm supplies and hardware.
The ladies department and dress materials area was introduced offer Herbert's arrival. Ralph Poo carne to the store in 1920 and became a partner in 1923.
Mr. H. Vemori Poe a professor of electrical engineering at Clemson University, said of his father's business, 'Pd like to have a nickel for every carload of flour or tin we handled: Most of all he just enjoyed meeting and greeting people."

Mrs. Inez Ray of Raleigh, the coordinator of curriculum materials at the School of Education at NC State, shad her father believed that if a man was frugal and worked hard, then he would be blessed materially.

At one time of another all the children worked in the store, and Mrs. Ray said more than anything she disliked matching buttons.
She remembered when the store was sold . "Daddy and Uncle Ralph just couldd't sell out the goods. They were from a different time and didn't know how to merchandise, so they brought in an outside concern to handle it. Well, they cut prices by $25 \%$ and then $33 \%$, and I remember Daddy saying It just wesn't fair to the man who paid more for the goods before the price cut. But that's just the way he was,"

Vernon sad the worst thing for his father was when he lost Hive drivers lloense. "He just couldn't stop fast enough to suit the wither," he added. W. Curtis Poe, associated with the Jefferson Standard Life insurance Co, in Raleigh, said he remembered his father as fiercely independent.
Also surviving Mr. Poe is this daughter Mrs. Lucille Hartman of Riverside, Conn., a brother Ralph Poe of Apex, 12 grandchildren and one great-grandchild.

The funeral was held at the Apex Funeral Home on Sunday with burial in the church cemetery.

Recently the children of the late Mr. and Mrs. Herbert Poe enjoyed a reunion in Raleigh. Inez Poe Ray, husband, Marl and Karen of Raleigh, Lucille Poe Hartman of Riverside, Conn., Vernon and Hazel Poe of Clemson, S. James Clovis Adams, who was called Clovis, was for more than 50 years a sawmill operator and lumber manufacturer in the Carolinas. He was associated in this business with his brothers, and from 1930 until his death in 1944 he and his brother C. V. Adams were engaged in the lumber business in Warren County, NC.

The following obituary was published March 24, 1944 (probably in The Raleigh News \& Observer) and there was also an obituary published the same day in the Warrenton Record.:

Vaughan.--James Clovis Adams, 71, sawmill operator and lumber manufacturer in the Carolinas for more than 50 years, last surviving son of the late Lt.-Col. James T. Adams of Holly Springs, died here Wednesday morning at 8:30 o'clock after a critical illness of four months. He and all of his four brothers and his father were well known as lumbermen in the Carolinas for many years.
Surviving are his wife, Mrs. Nannie Gibson Adams of Vaughan; three children, Leary W. Adams, Charlotte newspaperman, Mrs. Robert H. Williams of Cayce, S.C., and Mary Elizabeth Adams of Vaughan; three sisters, Mrs, Joe Massey of Apex, Mrs. Maggie Oldham of Holly Springs, and Mrs. Maude Holleman of Raleigh.
Mr. Adams numbered his cousins and nephews by the hundreds, all among the Adams, Beckwith, Hunter, Olive, Burt, Holland, Horne, Norris, Holleman, Massey and Oldham families of Wake County and Central North Carolina.
Mr . Adams was the fourth of the nine children of the late Col. Adams, commander of the North Carolina Twenty-Sixth at Appomattox, and the late Lucy Ann Beckwith Adams, daughter of Green Beckwith, who before the Civil War had a 5,000-acre plantation between Holly Springs and New Hill.
Mr. Adams suffered a severe fall near his mill early last November and received internal injuries from which he never recovered. He had cen in bed most of the time since mid-November and his condition became grave several weeks ago.
Funeral services will be held at the Holly Springs Baptist Church Friday afternoon at $20^{\prime}$ clock.

Martin Luther was born on November 10, 1483 in Eisleban, Saxony, Germany. He was educated at the University of Erfurt, later becoming an Augustian monk, teaching philosophy and theology at the University of Wittenberg. On October 31, 1517, sometimes called the " 4 th of July of Protestantism," Martin Luther nailed his ninety-five theses to the door of the Cathedral of Wittenburg, Germany. These theses condemned various practices and teaching of the Roman church. After several years of stormy disputes with the Pope and other church leaders, Martin Luther was finally excommunicated from the fellowship of the Roman Catholic church in 1520.

## The History of Ebenezer United Methodist Church

Ebenezer United Methodist Church was organized in the home of Mary Minter Farrar widow of Captain Edward Farrar. Soon after a log building was built where circuit riders held monthly meetings. Later a framed building was built. This structure was replaced sometime between the beginning of the Civil War and 1895. This is the sanctuary in which members and visitors worship today. The pews and the pulpit were handmade by Dallas Matthews, a member of the church. In 1914 two Sunday School rooms were added. In 1948, the annex was added along with the bathroom and kitchen facilities. In 1954, Ebenezer was joined with Merritt's Chapel to create the Ebenezer-Merritt's Charge, and a gas heating system was installed in the church and annex. The church was moved to its present location on June 26,1973 and a new annex constructed. The first service at the new location was held on November 18, 1973. The picnic and storage shelter was built in 1975 in memory of Truby Thrailkill.

Next time you are at Ebenezer Beach, take a look at the monument erected in 1996 to mark the site of the original church building. The construction of Jordan Lake required Ebenezer move to its current location, but the monument reminds us of the rich history of our church.

"Visible Tokens"

Based Upon Acts 2:1-4, 38-42
Dietrich Bonhoeffer was in prison in Berlin in 1943 when the day of Pentecost (Whitsunday in Europe) arrived. He began a letter to his family that Sunday which he finished on Monday. In it he said this:

Well, Whitsuntide is here and we are still separated; but it is in a special way a feast of fellowship. When the bells rang this morning, I longed to go to church, but instead I did as John did on the island of Patmos, and had such a splendid service of my own, that I did not feel lonely at all, for you were all with me, every one of you...

It is now Whitmonday, and I was just sitting down to a dinner of turnips and potatoes when your parcel that Rudiger brought as a Whitmonday present arrived quite unexpectedly. I really cannot tell you what happiness such things give one. However certain I am of the spiritual bond between all of you and myself, the spirit always seemed to want some visible token of this union of love and remembrance, and then material things become the vehicle of spiritual realities. I think this is analogous to the need felt in all religions for the visible appearance of the sacrament.

I think so, too. And I am overwhelmed by these simple profound words from one of God's saints. A little gift in prison, a table spread in church: visible tokens of the union of love and remembrance that we have in Jesus Christ. On the day of Pentecost, the Holy Spirit manifested himself visibly and audibly to the church. The same spirit manifests himself to us, too, when we receive his tokens of presence. May the bread and wine be the vehicle for the spiritual truth God would share with each of us.

Let us remember these things as we gather at Ebenezer UMC around the Table of Our Lord-as He "re/members" us-bringing us together with God, with Christ, and with each other. As always, let us remember who we are and Whose we are!

## Ingredients

## Crust

$1 / 2$ cup butter, melted
2 cups Lorna Doone Shortbread Cookies, Sinely
ground
1 ounce white chocolate. grated
1/1 cup sugar

## Filling

2 pounds cream cheese, softened
I $1 / 1$ cups sugar
pinch sall
4 eggs
3 ounces white chocolate. grated

## Topping

2 cups sour creall
$1 / 4$ cup sugar
1 teaspoon vanilla
1 ounce white chocolate, shaved

## For crust:

Combine all ingredients in small bowl and press evenly into 10 -inch springform pan.

## For filling:

Preheat oven to 350 degrees.
Combine cream cheese and sugar, beating mixer until fluffy. Add salt and mix well. Add eggs, one at a time, beating with mixer on slowest speed. Add white chocolate and pour into crust. Bake 40-45 minutes. Remove from oven and let cool 10 minutes.

For topping: Combine sour cream, sugar, and vanilla in small bowl. Spread on cake. Place cake back in oven 10 minutes and then refrigerate immediately. Top with white chocolate shavings before serving.

James Clovis Adams, who was called Clovis, was for more than 50 years a sawmill operator and lumber manufacturer in the Carolinas. He was associated in this business with his brothers, and from 1930 until his death in 1944 he and his brother C. V. Adams were engaged in the lumber business in Warren County, NC.

The following obituary was published March 24, 1944 (probably in The Raleigh News \& Observer) and there was also an obituary published the same day in the Warrenton Record.:

Vaughan.--James Clovis Adams, 71, sawmill operator and lumber manufacturer in the Carolinas for more than 50 years, last surviving son of the late Lt--Col. James T. Adams of Holly Springs, died here Wednesday morning at 8:30 o'clock after a critical illness of four months. He and all of his four brothers and his father were well known as lumbermen in the Carolinas for many years.
Surviving are his wife, Mrs. Nannie Gibson Adams of Vaughan; three children, Leary W. Adams, Charlotte newspaperman, Mrs. Robert H. Williams of Cayce, S.C., and Mary Elizabeth Adams of Vaughan; three sisters, Mrs. Joe Massey of Apex, Mrs. Maggie Oldham of Holly Springs, and Mrs. Maude Holleman of Raleigh.
Mr. Adams numbered his cousins and nephews by the hundreds, all among the Adams, Beckwith, Hunter, Olive, Burt, Holland, Horne, Norris, Holleman, Massey and Oldham families of Wake County and Central North Carolina.
Mr. Adams was the fourth of the nine children of the late Col. Adams, commander of the North Carolina Twenty-Sixth at Appomattox, and the late Lucy Ann Beckwith Adams, daughter of Green Beckwith, who before the Civil War had a 5,000-acre plantation between Holly Springs and New Hill.
Mr. Adams suffered a severe fall near his mill early last November and received internal injuries from which he never recovered. He had ,een in bed most of the time since mid-November and his condition became grave several weeks ago.
Funeral services will be held at the Holly Springs Baptist Church Friday afternoon at 2 o'clock.

The Poe Family
Simon Poe, With other members of the family, came to Chatham County from Virginia as early as 1759 and settled near George's Creek. In the early years of the Revolution. Benjamin and Jessie Poe, came from Culpepper County. It was in the home of Simon's son, Stephen, that Chatham Court was held until the first courthouse was built. Stephen was elected to represent Chatham in the Colonial Assembly of 1774, but died before taking his seat.

## Dr. Clarence Poe

Clarence Hamilton Poe (1881-1965), born near Gulf to William Baxter and Susan Dismukes Poe, became assistant editor of The Progressive Farmer at the age of 16 , and two years later he was made editor. In 1903 he purchased the magazine, and for the rest of his life used it as an instrument to promote improved farming and better living conditions throughout the south. In the thirties he launched a nationwide campaign for good health. The North Carolina Medical Care Commission was a direct result of his report to Governor Broughton and the General Assembly on the findings of a commission which he headed to investigate health needs of the state. He served on the American Commission on Hospital Care (1944-46) and in 1951 was appointed by President Truman to a committee on health needs of the nation. Dr. Poe married Alice Aycock, daughter of Governor Charles B. Aycock.
