A little further along Penny Rd - before old south you come to the Lynn Strother home on the right and to the Old Strother Home on the left (FAT & George, Lynn, etc.). This later place bought by Milton Dixon (with his wife Marie Taylor) who developed the land between Penny Rd & Lake Wheeler.

From old south to Lake Wheeler was Hunter Land. The Hunters are connected to the Stephens Family.

The Stephenson Place was developed by Lory Buffalo s/o John & Betty Buffalo.

From Penny Rd going N on old south cut to right to pass Albin Home sitting back on North side. Alton dated Albin Albin - her MOT = A Daniel.

Proceeding east on the cut through Farmer Lane (SR7527) comes up from the south. On the north (just to the east) lies the Penny Home right on the road - This Penny related to Harold Nelson. PENNY =

Next to the Penny Home on the west is a house Mark & Bryan bought for \$137,000 in 1987 for Percy in exchange for his 12 1/2 A share in Clyde 50 A csh. Percy's dad lives there now. East of Percy's house lies the Carl Penny Home site (house now gone).

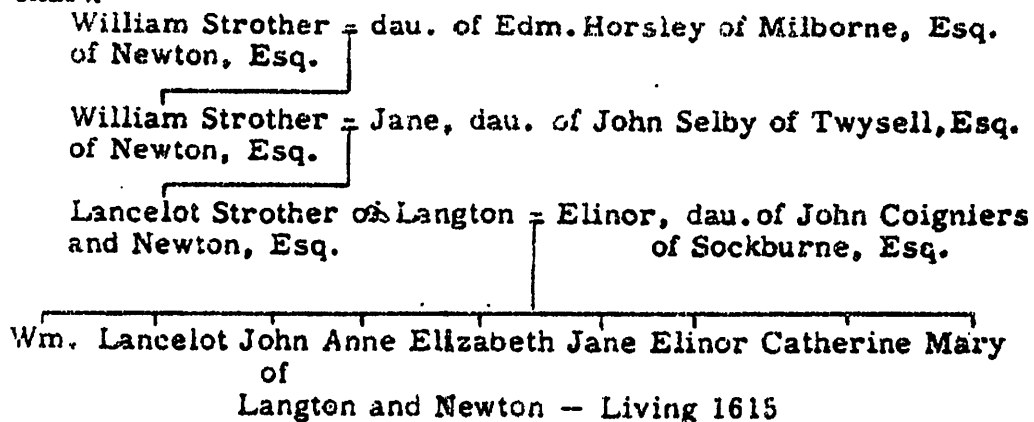

**STROTHER of OLD RAPPAHANNOCK, VIRGINIA and GEORGIA**

William Strother, founder of this family in Virginia, settled in Cittenbourne Parish on the Rappahannock near the present Port Conway. His name first appears in the records of this county on July 12, 1673, when he came to court to record the marks of his cattle. "The Buckners of Virginia", an excellent family history, states, on page 220, that he might have been the William Strother, son of William Strother of Kirknewton, Northumberland, England, Gentleman, who was apprenticed to Robert Corneforthe, boothman, August 18, 1656, enrollment Dec. 3, 1656, admission to the Eastland Co., of Merchant Adventurers Sept. 24, 1664.

This family was an ancient one in Northumberland, and it is regretted that apparently no one has ever attempted to obtain the wills and parish registry records of the family in Northumberland so as to find what became of the above William Strother, Merchant Adventurer, and other contemporary "Williams" in this family.

The Visitation of Northumberland 1615 contains the following chart:



Seal of John Strother of Newton, 1615 - "A man on Horseback, armed."

Strother Arms: "Gules on a bend argent, three eagles displayed azure. Crest - a greyhound sejant or."

This family, through the Conyers family, descends from Edward III.

A Strother family is also found in and around London. (See P. C. C. Wills). Green, in his History of Culpepper, page 83, says that Judge Strother visited the old burial ground of the family on the Island of Thanet, Kent, England, and had "seen the

name in its various transitions from Strasthor to its present spelling."

William Strother, the first of Virginia, is said to have married Dorothy, daughter of his neighbor, Capt. Anthony Savage, but there seems to be no documentary proof of this. Old Rappahannock County was divided into Richmond and Essex in 1692, and William Strother made his will in Richmond County, "sick and weak" Oct. 2, 1700, probated Nov. 4, 1702. He bequeathed his "eldest son, WILLIAM STROTHER, 150 acres of land including plantation I live upon... except that while my wife Dorothy shall live she shall peacefully and quietly possess one half of said plantation, with housing, etc.; upon her death same is to return to son William", to son JAMES 150 acres next to William, the remaining part of my land to be divided between sons ROBERT and BENJAMIN; son JOSEPH to be put to school and to be free at his own disposing at age of 16; to grandson Will Strother 2100 lbs. tcco. to be sent to England and proceeds paid him at age of 10. All rest of my personal estate to my loving wife Dorothy, during time of her widowhood, but if she shall marry, said personal estate is to be equally divided between her and my sons JAMES, JEREMIAH, ROBERT, BENJAMIN and JOSEPH. Wits.: James Phillips, Edward Langdres, Wm. Smith.

Jeremiah Strother, son of William and Dorothy Strother, bought land from J. W. Smith in Westmorland in 1703 and he subsequently became a planter in King George when that county was formed from Westmorland. He later removed to Orange County in that part of the county which fell in Culpepper when it was cut off from Orange. However, he died in Orange County before the separation of the counties. He and some of his distinguished descendants are mentioned in Green's "Culpepper County History", page 83. Jeremiah made his will in Orange June 7, 1740, same probated 1741. He is said to have died at the age of 86, but it is nowhere shown whether this age is taken from a deposition, Bible or Wills. He bequeathed "to wife Eleanor, during her life or widowhood, all my estate real and personal... land to be sold and wife to have use of money during her life or widowhood. After death of wife or day of marriage, son CHRISTOPHER to have all of my estate whatsoever. Sons: JAMES, WILLIAM, FRANCIS, JEREMIAH and LAWRENCE Strother, and daughters CATHERINE and ELIZABETH to have one shilling each. Sons James and William to be exrs. Wits.: John Catlett, Francis Slaughter, Wm. Lightfoot. (W. B. 1, p. 141)

It is very probable that Eleanor his wife may have been a second wife if he died at the age of 86.

A Colonel Richard Taylor, b. March 22, 1744, married Sarah, daughter of a William Strother of this family and died in Kentucky in 1826. He was the father of President ZACHARY TAYLOR, whose daughter, Sarah, was the first wife of President JEFFERSON DAVIS, C. S. A.

Christopher Judd Strother married Ann Kemp. He was the youngest son of Jeremiah Strother who willed him his property. In 1746 he conveyed 350 acres of land in Culpepper Co., Va. On Oct. 6, 1749, he conveyed to Capt. Benjamin Strother the land in King George Co., Va., and Hanover Parish, the land given him by his father Jeremiah Strother. Subsequently he moved to Bute Co., N. C. near Franklin Co. in 1757. Bute County then was composed of Franklin and Warren Counties. In 1799 these counties were divided and Christopher Strother's home was in Franklin County where he lived and became quite prominent. The old Strother place is known now as Maysville Township, about two miles from Louisburg, N. C., in what is known as the King place.

Christopher Strother served as a soldier in the N. C. Militia (Roster No. 440, p. 556) He died in Franklin County, N. C., in 1795. No will being found, the Court ordered "that James Strother be appointed Administrator for the estate of Christopher Strother, deceased.

John Strother, son of Ann and Christopher Strother, married Jane Fussell, who died in 1830 in Hancock County, Ga. He served as a soldier from Orange Co., N.C., during the Revolutionary War (N.C. Revolutionary Accounts, Vol.9, p.113, folio 2) He moved to Hancock Co., Ga., where he died. His estate was appraised July 12, 1796, in Sparta, Ga. His wife survived him 34 years. She made her will April 20, 1830, probated May 3, 1830 (B.K.M. p.545) Her children mentioned in her will were: DAVID AARON, JOHN, GEORGE, JAMES, ANN, m. Joel Moody; ELIZABETH m. Thomas King; MARTHA, b. 1765, m. (1) Amos Thompson and (2) Mark Stroud. (see later); RICHARD, b.1768, m. (2) Mary Black in 1832; JANE.

Martha Strother, daughter of Jane (Fussell) and John Strother, married (1) Amos Thompson, who is said to have joined Cornwallis' Army, and as a British soldier was killed at the Battle of Guilford Court House, March 25, 1781. They had one son, Littlebury Thompson. Mark Stroud is said to have fought in this battle, and marched with the American Army into Virginia, where he met the widow Martha Strother Thompson. Mark Stroud later accompanied his father, John Stroud, in his move to Hancock Co., Georgia, in 1787. Littlebury Thompson was then about 18 years. He married and moved to Mississippi, where he grew wealthy and died just before the outbreak of the Civil War. Mark Stroud, son of John and Sarah Stroud, was born Feb. 27, 1763, died July 2, 1798; Martha Strother was born May 8, 1765, died Sept. 1845.

# Will of James Strother ○

In the name of God amen I James Strother being in sound and perfect mind and memory, (Thanks be to God for the same) but taking into consideration the mortality of the body knowing that it is appointed unto man anew to die do make this my last will and Testament. My soul I recommend to God that gave it my body I leave to be at the discretion of my Executor. The property that it has pleased the Lord to bless me with in this world I give and bequith as following (to wit)

1<sup>st</sup> I leave to my beloved wife Patsy Strother during her life or widowhood. The land and Plantation whereon I now live together with one negro woman Rachel, one negro man Nelson, two Negro Boys named Guilford and Henry and one Negro girl Cynthia. Two horses of her choice, one cart and oxen. All the plantation utensils my still and cask, all the household and kitchen furniture, three cows and calves, three other young cattle her choice and one half of my stock of Hogs and sheep.

▷ 2<sup>nd</sup> I give and bequith to my son Isaac Strother one feather Bed & furniture and one cow and calf or the value thereof.

▷ 3<sup>rd</sup>. I give and bequith to my son Edward H. Strother one feather bed and furniture and one cow and calf

or the value thereof.

- △ 4<sup>th</sup> I give and bequath to my son Furney P. Strother one feather bed and furniture and one cow and calf or the value thereof.
- △ 5<sup>th</sup> I give and bequath to my son George W. Strother one feather bed and furniture and all the residue and rest of my Property remaining at my death to be sold by my Executor and after paying all my just debts to be equally and impartially divided into eight shares according to the number of my children namely
- △ William H. Strother one eighth and the part
- △ I allotted for my daughter Francis Mabry and
- △ I give to her four young children namely Mariah,
- △ Julia Ann, Peter Lawrence, and Patey Joshua and the
- △ part I allotted for my daughter Charlotte Baker I give to her Children she has or may have and
- △ Edward Strother one eighth, one to Geo. E. Strother, one eighth
- △ to Furney P. Strother, and George W. Strother one eighth and I
- △ constitute and appoint my son, William H. Strother Executor to my last will and Testament.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 17<sup>th</sup> day January, A.D. 1843.

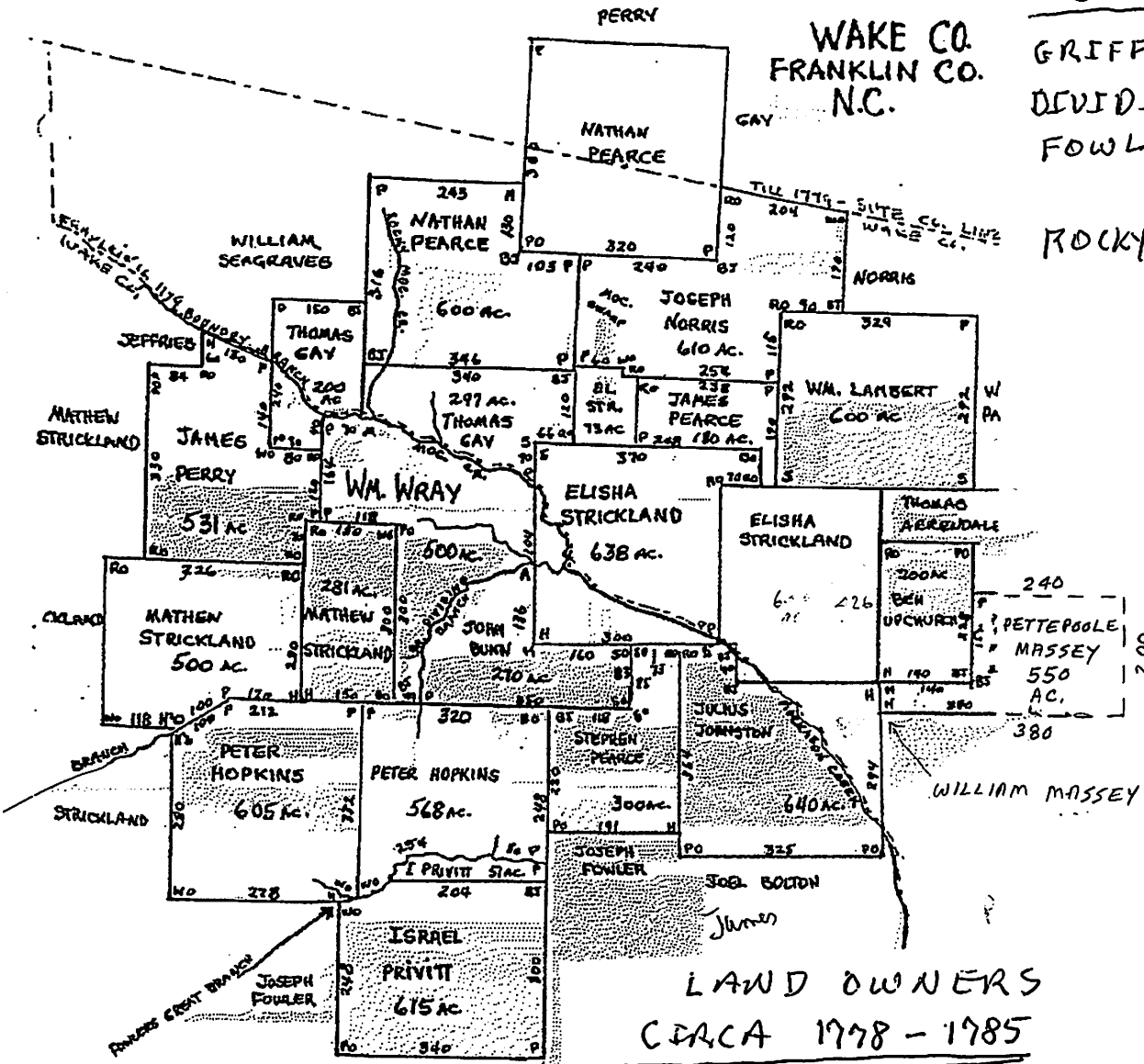

The beautiful flowers at the altar last Sunday in memory of Harold Wilson and Clyde Strother certainly did the trick on bringing those folks to mind. One of the things so unforgettable is how families used to visit each other years ago, and I wish there was more of that today. We would visit the Wilson's on Sunday afternoon, and my little brother, Allan Roy Lineberry and I would have such fun with Harold, Jr. and Margaret; and my sister Carolyn, and Evelyn Wilson, who were about the same age, could always find something to laugh about and mischief to get into. I was proud to get the chance to give Mrs. Frances a big hug on Sunday! And Clyde and George Strother were very instrumental in the formation of my young life. I used to say, "When I grow up, I'll have a husband who will put his arm around me in church and give me a little hug, like Mr. George does Mrs. Clyde all the time."

At Christmas time, Mr. George Strother and his brothers, Len and Percy, along with other elders of the church, would have little bags of goodies for each child ~ each person in the church: an orange, an apple, little candies and lollipops. On March 1, 1796 in Johnston County Court, Bryant Medlin (Jr.) and John Medlin were each listed as delinquent for a poll tax in Johnston County.

On August 30, 1796 in Johnston County Court, William Medlin was included on a list of insolvents for 1795.

On August 30, 1797 in Johnston County Court, John Medlin was included on list of insolvents for the year 1796.

On October 12, 1797 in Franklin County, Matthew Medlin purchased land from John Strother, witnessed by Bradley Medlin. Bradley Medlin also purchased land in Franklin County in 1797 from Drury Perry.

In March 1798 in Wake County Court, Drury Medlin proved three deeds from Jacob Williams to Thomas Busby.

In 1798, in Franklin County, Bradley Medlin and James Medlin are listed as landowners in Captain Norris's District and Shadrach Medlin is listed as landowner in Captain Upchurch's District, with each of them owing one white poll tax.

On June 24, 1799, John Medlin of Wake County purchased from James Cone 200 acres on Turkey Creek in Nash County adjoining Jacob Brantley, Morgain and Mary Jones, witnessed by Jesse Hammons, Guilford Cone and William Perry.

On February 6, 1799 in Wake County, William Medlin was listed as owing a note to the estate of Robert Johnston. On April 15, 1799 in Wake County, Drury Medlin, Micajah Medlin, and Thomas Busby were listed as buyers at the estate sale of Robert Johnston.

In 1800, in the Federal census of North Carolina, Bryant Medlin, Sr. and Bryant Medlin, Jr. were both listed as heads of families in Wayne County, which had been formed from Dobbs County in 1779.

Also listed as the head of a family in North Carolina in the 1800 census were William (Owen) Medlin (Sr.) in Johnston County; Joseph, Shadrach, Bradley, Britain, James, Jemima, Josiah, and Matthew Medlin in Franklin County; Cade, Drury, Francis, and William Medlin in Wake County; John Medlin in Halifax County; Nicholas Medlin in Robeson County; Joel, John, and Hugh Medlin in Moore County; John Medlin in Montgomery County; Michael Medlin in Chatham County; and Thomas Medlin in Lenoir County.

On October 15, 1801 in Franklin County, Bradley Medlin was listed as a buyer at the estate sale of William and Theodrick Ferrell, orphans sold by Jeremiah Perry, guardian.

On December 24, 1801 in Johnston County, Benjamin Medlin was listed as a buyer at the estate sale of Robert Horton.

In 1802, William Owen Medlin (Jr.) had moved to Anderson County, Tennessee in Medlin's Company where he was too old for a poll tax.

On November 22, 1803, a marriage bond was issued in Wake County for Royal Medlin and Judah Hicks, with Willis Hicks and Moses Bledsoe as bondsmen and Simon Turner as witness.

The beautiful flowers at the altar last Sunday in memory of Harold Wilson and Clyde Strother certainly did the trick on bringing those folks to mind. One of the things so unforgettable is how families used to visit each other years ago, and I wish there was more of that today. We would visit the Wilson's on Sunday afternoon, and my little brother, Allan Roy Lineberry and I would have such fun with Harold, Jr. and Margaret; and my sister Carolyn, and Evelyn Wilson, who were about the same age, could always find something to laugh about and mischief to get into. I was proud to get the chance to give Mrs. Frances a big hug on Sunday! And Clyde and George Strother were very instrumental in the formation of my young life. I used to say, "When I grow up, I'll have a husband who will put his arm around me in church and give me a little hug, like Mr. George does Mrs. Clyde all the time."

At Christmas time, Mr. George Strother and his brothers, Len and Percy, along with other elders of the church, would have little bags of goodies for each child ~ each person in the church: an orange, an apple, little candies and lollipops. Every time I smell oranges, it brings that happy time to me all over again. We would go and visit Mr. Percy and Mrs. Mynette Strother; they had wonderful grapevines, and they invited us to share. Mr. Percy would take us children out to see his mules. My dad was so fond of Mr. Percy that he had planned to name me after him, had I been a son rather than a daughter. And we loved to visit Miss Constance Strother and her brother, Len, who was Church Clerk for as long as I could remember. Miss Constance had some special magic magnetic Scottie dogs she would let us play with; when you put a piece of paper between the magnets, you could make one Scottie follow the other (upside down) all over the paper! She was my mother's Sunday School teacher for years, and many of the ladies of the church would come to our house for Sunday School class meetings. It was up to me to serve them refreshments.

Leon Strother by way of contrast, was a long-time member of Inwood. He had been baptized in Yates Mill Pond on August 30, 1903. From time to time he represented the church at the meetings of the Raleigh Baptist Association. Once he was elected to be church clerk; but declined to serve in that capacity (Minutes of Church Conference, 4/22/11 and 5/27/11). In December, 1915, he became secretary of the Sunday School. His name does not appear again in church conference minutes until he was elected to the office of deacon. Thereafter, however, he figured prominently in representing the church at denominational meetings and in working with the Sunday School.

Foster was scheming to get George's assets so executed a preemptive strike & got George to sign the house over to him while he was still alive.

All of George's relatives & friends knew George wanted his assets to go to Inwood Church. The will to this effect never surfaced. The one sentence will Robert J. Foster convinced to sign was an underhanded move.

Somewhat, the legitimate heirs of George Cowan Strother were not granted standing in the court as the Trustees of Inwood Church declined to intervene. Robert J. Foster was also an Inwood Trustee. It appears RJP got his hands on assets before the will came about.

The beautiful flowers at the altar last Sunday in memory of **Harold Wilson** and **Clyde Strother** certainly did the trick on bringing those folks to mind. One of the things so unforgettable is how families used to visit each other years ago, and I wish there was more of that today. We would visit the Wilson's on Sunday afternoon, and my little brother, **Allan Roy Lineberry** and I would have such fun with **Harold, Jr. and Margaret**; and my sister **Carolyn**, and **Evelyn Wilson**, who were about the same age, could always find something to laugh about and mischief to get into. I was proud to get the chance to give **Mrs. Frances** a big hug on Sunday! And **Clyde and George Strother** were very instrumental in the formation of my young life. I used to say, "When I grow up, I'll have a husband who will put his arm around me in church and give me a little hug, like Mr. George does Mrs. Clyde all the time."

At Christmas time, **Mr. George Strother** and his brothers, **Len** and **Percy**, along with other elders of the church, would have little bags of goodies for each child ~ each person in the church: an orange, an apple, little candies and lollipops. Every time I smell oranges, it brings that happy time to me all over again. We would go and visit **Mr. Percy and Mrs. Mynette Strother**; they had wonderful grapevines, and they invited us to share. **Mr. Percy** would take us children out to see his mules. My dad was so fond of **Mr. Percy** that he had planned to name me after him, had I been a son rather than a daughter. And we loved to visit **Miss Constance Strother** and her brother, **Len**, who was Church Clerk for as long as I could remember. Miss Constance had some special magic magnetic Scottie dogs she would let us play with; when you put a piece of paper between the magnets, you could make one Scottie follow the other (upside down) all over the paper! She was my mother's Sunday School teacher for years, and many of the ladies of the church would come to our house for Sunday School class meetings. It was up to me to serve them refreshments.

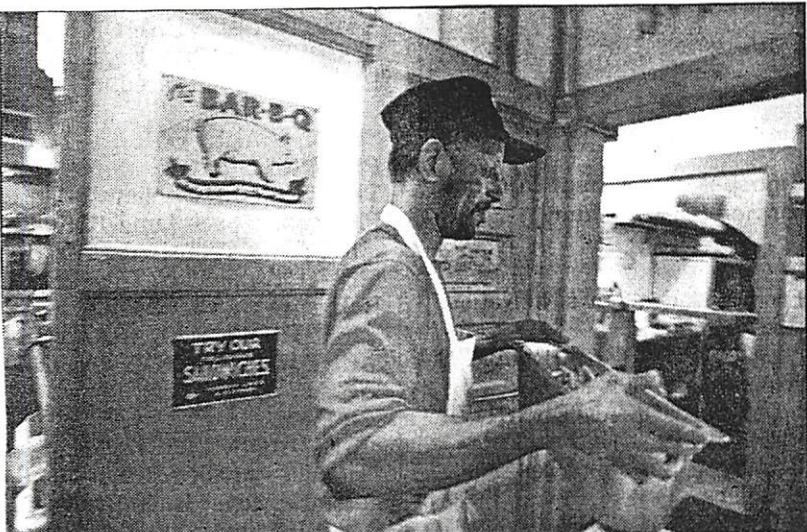
**T**ony Moore is the man who would be Clyde. Moore is the owner of Clyde Cooper's Barbecue, the legendary downtown Raleigh restaurant that has served pig-eaters since the 1930s. Many people, especially newcomers, don't know Moore is the owner. They see the name "Clyde Cooper" on the front and side of the building and assume a fellow by that name runs the joint.

He did, for a long time. Clyde Cooper bought the restaurant in 1937 and operated it for 44 years. A son-in-law ran it for another seven years, although Cooper kept ownership. Only when Moore bought it in 1988 did the restaurant pass into hands other than Clyde's.

The name stayed behind, however. The words "Clyde Cooper" can still be found on the windows, walls and menus of the restaurant. It's listed that way in the phone book. It still comes off

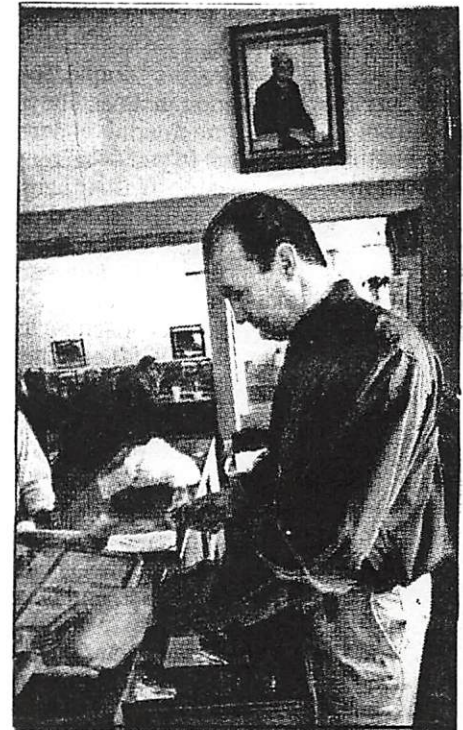

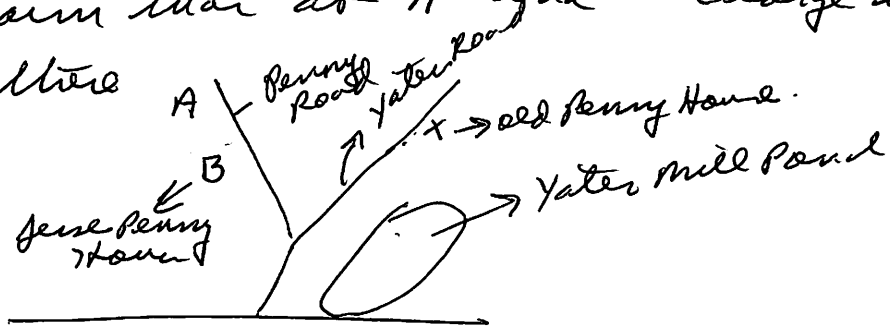
