During the summer Sandra on a South American visit to Rio de Janeiro discovered that her Argentina contemporaries "were crazy about anything to wear typical of the United States."

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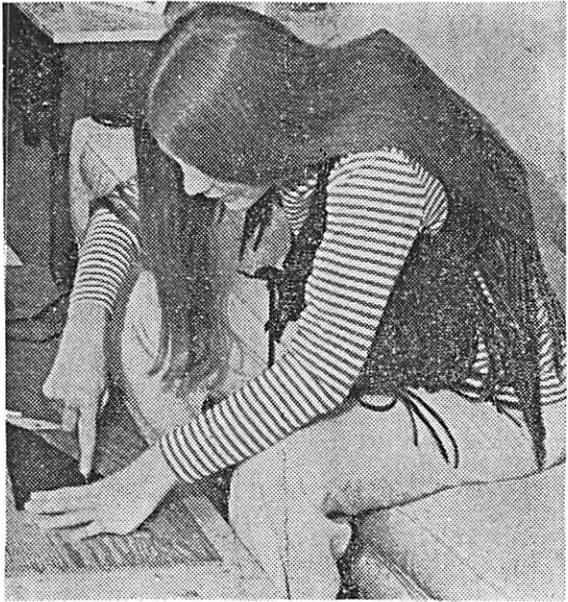

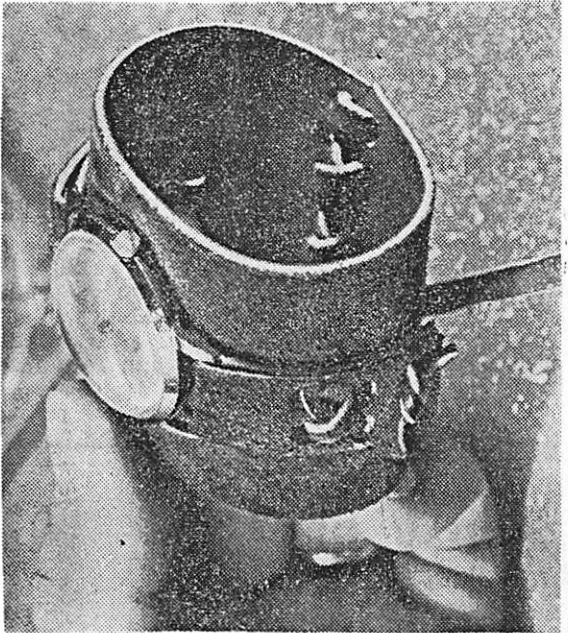

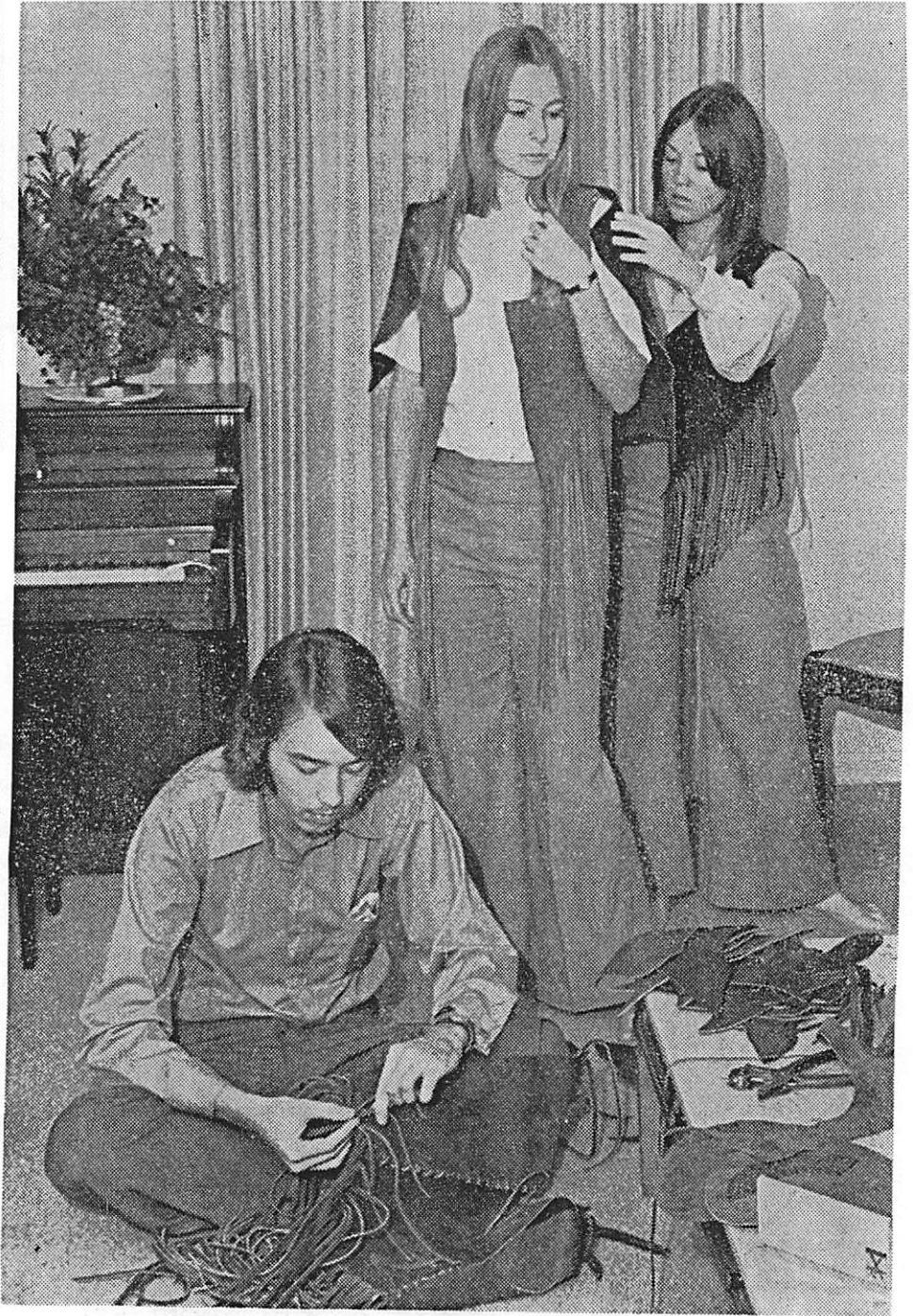

Dear Che Che

After some delay I was able to follow-up on our phone conversation of 22 AUG 88 re the prospects for excavations at the Bartley Jefferson Uplunch homeplace. On 27 AUG 88 I called Stone Cloggett in Raleigh in the State Archeology Department and had quite a discussion with him. His position is that he encourages people to be interested in exploration. That is his job and his "thing". If an individual or a group comes in for a visit he will give advice on how to proceed. However, his time is quite limited because he has to take care of the whole state. He is in no position to give specific directions and he can only visit a few sites. He described to me the priority system they are in deciding how to spend their limited time and resources.

From her conversation I could tell that the Bartley Upchurch site would be very low on their list and would probably not even make it to the list when you consider the thousands sites throughout N.C.

Although probing the Bartley Upchurch site might be satisfying to those of us who know and love that spot, I do not think it would uncover anything of real historic importance. The descendants have probably carted away all of the good stuff. I know I am pleased to have the picture of BSU & her couple that are hung on the wall of the home. Other items are spread about here and there. It would be nice to have a list of these.

In order to prepare yourself for some excavation work at some future date you might wish to volunteer your time to a team in your vicinity that is doing work. This would let you learn through experience what people look for and how they do it.

I am sorry not to be so encouraging about the home place - but there are many other ways we can probe the past.

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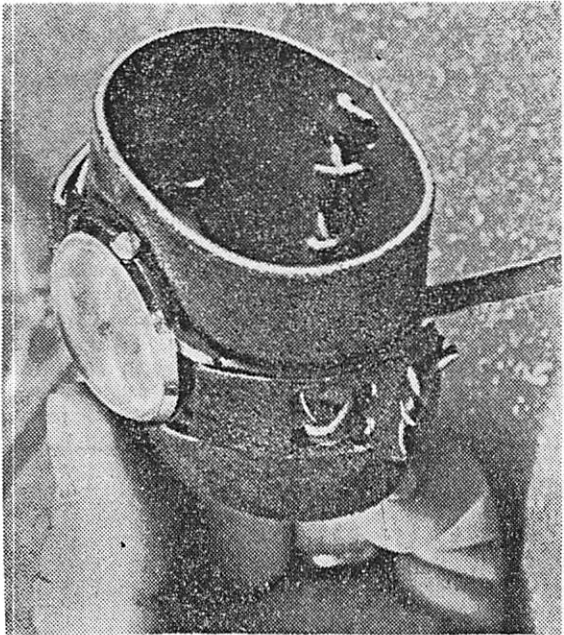
