 and a very Christmas. Love Uptche & Phil



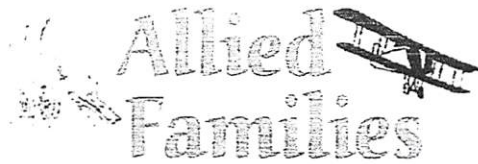

Many of these photos came to me in poor shape and cry out for a photo shop treatment. I'll put that on the list for later.

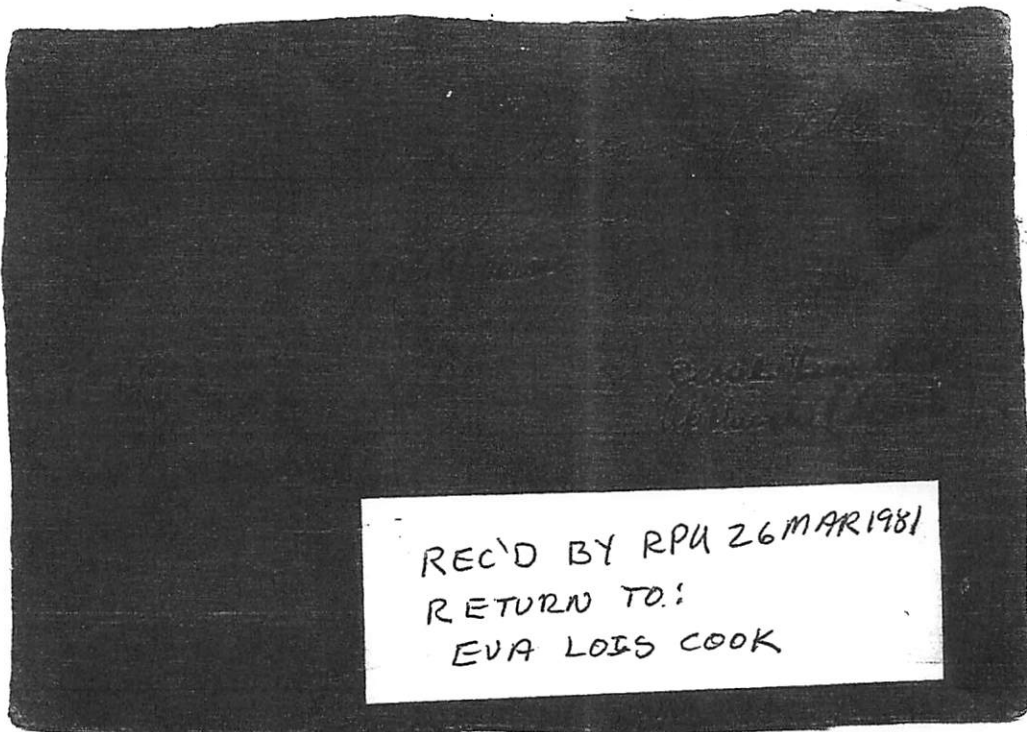

Phil is of the 9th generation of the family started by this immigrant. Since 1980 he has published the UPCHURCH BULLETIN. In 2006 Phil Upchurch accelerated an effort to collect materials to serve as a basis for writing a history of Swift Creek TSP where Upchurches settled starting about 1870. These will be placed in THE UPCHURCH COLLECTION at N.C. State University. Hopefully the History Book can be made available to the public by 2010. Individuals who have something to share about Swift Creek Township are invited to contact Phil via the website [contact form](#) or surface mail at 351 Shetland Valley Ct, Chesterfield, MO 63005 or by phone (636) 530-6022.

Historic Swift Creek TSP occupies an area about eight by eight miles running from Raleigh west to Cary and then South just by Apex on to just below Ten-Ten Road. It lies on both sides of Ten-Ten Road going East to US 401 and then follows 401 North to Raleigh.

In broad outline the History of Swift Creek TSP will include the following Sections:

- Family Trees (outlines) for families having members who owned land, lived or died or were buried in the TSP or who had an impact on the TSP.
- Places, Roads, and streams in Swift Creek TSP including Maps
- Unusual Events in Swift Creek TSP such as murders, rescues, etc.
- The land ownership Patterns in Swift Creek TSP and the People involved.
- Individuals of Special Note.

Further illustrations of the above Sections are as follows:

- Re Places and Roads- Swift Creek TSP is bisected by famous roads known as Rhamkatte, Tryon, Avent Ferry, Yates Mill Pond, Ten-Ten, Lake Wheeler, Holly Springs, Atkins, Hillsborough, and others. In the TSP one finds Historic Yates Mill, Lake Wheeler, Macedonia, and several historic school sites. Churches include Inwood, Ephesus, Macedonia Methodist, Swift Creek Baptist, Myatts Chapel, and Catawba Springs. Cemeteries are numerous.
- Re Land and People- The description of land holdings in Swift Creek TSP will start from the original Land Grants issued in the 1700's. Major land holders included the Pearson's, Stephenson's, Penny's, Campbell's and others. In many cases the transfer of Land Grant holdings can and will be traced from the 1700's to the mid 1900's. Prominent citizens of Raleigh, NC invested in land in Swift Creek TSP and their names and their fortunes are intertwined with residents of the rural setting. In different eras one notes substantial land areas donated to a golf course (RGA), to orchards (Kings Orchard), to a water reservoir (Lake Wheeler), to a dairy (Yates), to farming, to the N.C. State University Field Laboratory, and to Historic Yates Mill Park and the Hemlock Bluffs.

Swift Creek TSP is rich in the history of the blending of the colored and white races details of which deserve attention.

O.L. Stringfield, the founder of the N.C. Symphony was a resident of the TSP as was S. Otto Wilson, the President of The N.C. Farmers Federation. The area is proud of Mrs. Harriet B. Shearon who was a trail blazer for women's rights in the 1920-1950 era.

The above notations provide only a peak at the array of topics that need to be added to and amplified in order to have the best documentation of the lives and times of Swift Creek Township. The author requests participation from any who are interested.

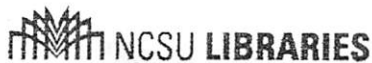
Robert Phillip Upchurch "Phil" has served as an unofficial historian for the Upchurch Family for over thirty years. In the 1970's he became great friends with Etta Belle (Lewter) West and Ada (Olive) Morgan, both long since deceased. They both produced excellent books on the Upchurch Family, now out of print. They cast their mantle of approval over Phil and supported his initiation of the UPCHURCH BULLETIN which he has produced since 1980. Over 55,000 members of the Upchurch Family have been identified and published. For four years Phil also published ENGLANDIA to give emphasis to the origins of the family in England. He contracted with Professor David Ransome of England to consult in this effort. Over the last three decades over \$100,000 has been expended to collect and publish information on the Upchurch Family. A very large number of people have contributed to this venture both in supplying information and in providing finances. All of the materials collected will eventually become a part of the permanent Upchurch Collection at N.C. State University. An endowment now valued in excess of \$35,000 has been established to support, expand and share this collection. A goal of \$100,000 has been established.

While the above shows progress and status much work remains to be done. This website is designed to encourage interested parties to assist with the further development of Upchurch Family History. To this end several sections are presented below which reveal just how an interested individual may help and benefit from interaction.
