AUNT LENA

She seemed. She became the matriarch of the family. Doris recalls that Frances (Berry) Wilson got a picture painted by Aunt Lena. After Aunt Lena died the structure of the household changed. Aunt Lena named Uncle Rex's son Charles Rex & but Aunt Ruth was unhappy with the "Charles" part and had it changed.

ADDED COMMENTS FROM DORIS:

Aunt Lena - we cracked hickory nuts & one made jello & put the nuts in it. Set it in the front hall on a table to gel. She also made "tea cakes" & wrapped them in a towel to keep fresh.

Uncle Rex said Lena and her sisters never married because their father "PA" felt no man was good enough for them.

When Aunt Lena died the family encouraged Uncle Rex & Aunt Ruth to move in and take care of his older siblings.

Patt recalled Aunt Lena reported that her GF Gilbert & would have made a fine lawyer & wrote wills, deeds, etc [I doubt this - RPH], Aunt Lena was the oldest child, did the cooking & had everyone respect. Aunt Lena & her sisters regularly went to church or did Uncle Frank but not the rest of the boys.





The Women's Group had various names at different times. Some men called it a "Geseping Society"

Original meeting about 1903-1905. MAY ADAMS and her Mother were Secretary and Treasurer. Members: The Upchurch Women [Lena U, Pat U, Mandie U - possibly Aunt Ellie & Aunt Benie] The Yates Family, The Penny Family, Mr A. F. Taylor, Sr. Later key participants: Jennie Scott Taylor; Hamett Shearon Mrs H. P. Greene (who held meetings in her home)

This very sketchy history of the "Women's Auxiliary" of Inwood Church shows it had a very tenuous existence. It would almost die & then have a rebirth. In several eras the men were not sympathetic. Herman P. Greene being an exception

An additional 3 pages are made a part of the Document

- one = a picture of the church built ca 1935-1936 and -
- the other = picture & names of 11 females - presumably post WW II who must have been members of the "Women's Group". [Picture is Inwood History Book - phoned earlier]

A BRILLIANT MARRIAGE - BALLENTINE-YATES

On Wednesday afternoon, November 2nd, your correspondent found himself beside a bonny little girl, en route for the splendid residence of Phares Yates, Esq. of Swift Creek Township, Wake County. Either the balmy afternoon, the instinct which taught him it was a wedding occasion, or a pair of laughing eyes beside him, made the road mighty smooth the distance mighty short, for ere he knew it, fifteen miles had been traveled, his destination reached, to find already assembled a large crowd of friends to witness the marriage of Prof. J. Erastus Ballentine to Miss Lillie, the beautiful and accomplished daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Phares Yates.

Miss Mary Banks, one of Wake's fairest daughters, was organist, and as the first sweet solemn strain of the wedding march fell upon the still-sweet amid the hush that always pervades an altar like it. While "the bride and groom tarry" the following couples, viz: Mr. K. B. Johnson with Miss Anna Yates, Mr. Emmet Yates with Miss Molly Barnes, Mr. Needham Bryan with Miss Lena Upchurch entering to witness the beautiful marriage ceremony, which made a loving trusting couple one, by Dr. Hall, a Baptist Minister of Raleigh. The bride who is always pretty, looked indescribably sweet in her beautiful bridal costume while the pretty young ladies in their faultless evening dresses, the brilliantly illumined parlor, combined to make it just the prettiest marriage scene the writer has ever witnessed.

The congratulations were profuse and the bridal presents were numerous. And after this subsided the entire party repaired to the large dining room and without a dissenting voice paid their respects to the feast which could best be described in these words: It was in perfect harmony with the appearance of the bride, and her mother had supervised it. The evening was the most perfect of a lifetime, and was whirled away as only young people know best how to; but like other evenings, its pleasure had an end.

"One by one the roses fell." One by one sweet voices died away into musical pulsations, one by one and two by two this happy party went away, one by one lamps went out; darkness succeeded light, silence followed music and the Yates mansion was wrapped in slumber, and this happy event was a thing of the past.

Thursday morning dawned in all the beauty of the day which preceded it, and the happy couple with a few friends proceeded to the home of the groom where an elegant reception awaited them. Seldom has a couple embarked on a life voyage under more favorable circumstances, a calmer sea, a brighter sky, a more gentle breeze. The home to which they have gone is perfect in detail, surrounded by every creature comfort, and adorned with everything that ample means and refined taste could suggest made by one who was guided in all of its arrangements by a heart that loved and will be presided over by her for whom it was made with dignity and all Christian graces, which have been so characteristic of the young bride's life. A vote of thanks is due Mr. George McCullers and Misses Mary Banks and Florence Stephenson for the splendid music with which they delighted all.





She lived in the Alton Perry House in the 1920's & 1930's Her step-father, Henry Fletcher, was Sexton at Imwood (Custodian) and was in this role when the church burned in the 1930's. She knew B.J. & Wiley Perry but was not able to tell much about them. Clydia worked many years in the School Lunch Program and was a Supervisor - Gets Retirement & Social Security.

Clydia says Wiley Perry always had a large garden - carrots, turnips, etc. - he took them to town for sale.

Clydia in 1947 bought $\frac{1}{2}$ acre from Mr Atkiss for \$50 and had a few room house built for \$400. The only child of Mr Atkiss was Margaret Atkiss who m John Henry Johnson. Margaret & Lena¹¹ are said to be the most beautiful of all.

Frances mentions yet again that at one point Aunt ^LTera D. was engaged to ^L Jim Edwards of the Edwards Shoe Store in Raleigh also, that Aunt ^LTera D. was engaged to a Mr Stephens of the Stephensons music store in Raleigh. Aunt Bessie (and probably Aunt ^LTera) spent time - over night - mehndi, etc., at the home of William George U in Raleigh. It was this Stephensons that gave ^L and Bessie the ring that Clyde Penny lost in the ice cream mix at pink state.

We discussed the Scotts, Taylors, Yates, Greens, etc. I posted that the Scotts, + Taylors were aloof and considered themselves above the Rhamphite levels. Frances agrees but says the Upplander were also aloof and only had time for the upper class Scotts, Yates, Greens, etc.

Aunt Bessie said she and Anna Yates stood up for each other - meaning they were maids of honor at each other's weddings.
