Dear Mr. Upchurch

I just wanted to drop you a letter to let you know I'm still alive.

Through the courtesy of Mrs. Lucille Curlee I've been keeping up with you and the **Upchurch Bulletin**.

On a family history note, I want to tell you a little about my visit a couple years ago to the "Laton-Upchurch Cemetery," as it is called in **Abandoned Cemeteries of Stanly County**.

The cemetery is located in a pasture at the confluence of Jacob's Creek and Lake Tillery (Pee Dee River). As a matter of fact, you can see the lake from the cemetery.

I've been in many cemeteries but none like this one. For starters, my impression is it is very old. Except for a few fieldstones, the cemetery is unmarked. And the dozen or so sunken graves are not in straight rows.

According to an interview Mrs. Helen Garner had with a man who had lived on the property years ago, there are Upchurchs and Latons buried in the cemetery. Hence the cemetery's name. This man has since died.

According to Montgomery County censuses, the Upchurchs were arrived in what eventually became Stanly County prior to the Latons. Other than the naming of this cemetery, I have not found any other connection between the Upchurch and Laton families. Could it be that the Latons eventually purchased the Upchurch lands and buried their dead in the Upchurch cemetery?

The apparent age of the cemetery, coupled with the fact that Harmon Upchurch owned land along Jacob's Creek, makes this cemetery the most likely burial place for Harmon that I have seen.

Again, I just wanted to let you know that I'm still breathing. Hope to hear from you some time.

ALLEN UPCHURCH CEMETERY
STANLEY CO, NC.

On September 29, 1979 I visited this cemetery with my parents, Mr. and Mrs. John Upchurch Lilly of Norwood, NC. The cemetery is located on State Road 1744 on the south side about halfway between Porter and State Road 1740. It is about 200 feet from the state road and appears to be a clump of trees and brush in a cultivated field. It is totally neglected. All stones are native slate, home-made, and several are severely damaged. There also appears to be graves without markers, but the site has not been checked carefully. We were able to uncover the following stones:

- △ 1. Allen Upchurch (XID-3564)
Died June 21, 1848
In the 69th year of his age.
- △ 2. John D. Upchurch (XID-4410)
Was born July the 31 AD 1824.
And died March 11, 1857
- △ 3. W. A. Upchurch (no other legible information) (XID-4411)
- 4. 1855 (date is the only thing we could read)
- △ 5. Franklin Upchurch
Was born Nov 23, 1856
Dec. 14 May 1859
Age 2 yr. 5 mo. 2 day

*** There were other stones too weathered to read

The above inscriptions are as accurate as we could read them.

△ Allen Upchurch is believed to be a son of Harmon Upchurch, the first Upchurch to settle in the Stanly Co. area, and John D. Upchurch[△] was a son of Allen[△], as was W. A. Upchurch.[△]
