Henry H. Goodwin Family

1780 - 1857 (son of William Goodwin Sr.)

Henry Goodwin was born in 1780 at Wake County the son of William Goodwin Sr. and Winifred Thrailkill. It

appears according to 1820 and 1840 census that Henry and unknown wife (may have been named Mary) had seven boys and four girls. Henry was married twice. All children were born of the first wife. According to Census data Mrs. Henry Goodwin was born about 1783 and died about 1844 at Chatham County. They were married about 1801 at Chatham County.

Henry was involved in several deeds trying to help his brother Alsey recover from financial difficulty.

Bought Land Deed Book AA page 88 Chatham County, North Carolina January 25th 1826

Alsey Goodwin sold to Henry Goodwin 150 acres for 50 cents being and situate in the County of Chatham and adjoining the Lands of James Goodwin Henry Goodwin and Dempsey Goodwin it being the land whereon the aforesaid Alsey Goodwin now lives and situate in the County of Chatham on Beaver Creek Suppose to contain One hundred and fifty acres be the same More or less.

He the Said Henry Covenants the Said Alsey may redeem upon paying him the sum of Sixteen hundred and eighty Dollars.

Sold Land Deed of Trust Deed Book A-A1 page 8 Chatham County, North Carolina January 26, 1826

Henry Goodwin Obtained a Deed of Trust from Parker Rand at Raleigh, N.C. (George W. Haywood was the lawyer) for \$1,688.00 for the land Alsey Lives on (Tract 1) and the Lot in Raleigh payable on or before October 1, 1826. Henry put the Said property In-trust to George W. Haywood as collateral for the Note. Henry defaulted (Alsey did not reclaim the property from Henry as allow in Deed Book AA page 88) on the Note and the property was sold at Public Auction and purchased by Parker Rand for \$550.00 from Henry Goodwin on November 8, 1826 The Lot in the city of Raleigh was apparently sold in a private sale.

Description:
Lying and bound in the County of Chatham on Beaver Creek, adjoining the land of James Goodwin, Henry Goodwin, and Dempsey Goodwin, it being the Land whereon the said Alsey Goodwin now lives. Containing 150 acres. Also part of a lot of Land in the City of Raleigh designated in the plan of Said City as lot number One Hundred and Thirty sold by John Dunn to Thomas P. Devereux by the Said Devereux to Charley Williams Fowler, and Said Fowler to Said Goodwin (estimated value of lot at \$1800.00)

Alsey Goodwin sold to Henry Goodwin

Sold Deed Book AA page 167

June 13, 1824

Alsey Goodwin sold to Henry Goodwin 142 Acres for \$300.00 (This is the same land Alsey sold to John Richardson five months prior.)

Description:

Beginning at a poplar Jessy Henrys Branch

Thence turning west to a pine Richardson line

thence North one hundred thirty two poles to a stake in Haywood Lawrence Corner

thence along the said line East to an ash in Jessy Henrys Branch

thence up said Branch to the Beginning containing one hundred and forty two acres

Note: This deed was never Recorded in Court but was filed in the County of Chatham, N.C.

Henry was trying to help his brother Alsey during some difficult financial times and this was a method of lending him money. Henry ultimately helped in a different method and this transaction was null and void.

Henry Goodwin sold to Parker Rand

Sold Deed (of Trust) Book A-A1 page 242 Chatham County, North Carolina

November 8, 1826 recorded May 1827

Henry Goodwin Deed In-Trust by Alsey Goodwin obtained a Deed of Trust from Parker Rand in the amount of \$550.00 for 150 acres (Land where Alsey Goodwin now resides)

Witnesseth That Whereas Henry Goodwin of the County of Chatham and State of North Carolina did by a Deed Bearing Date the Twenty fifth day of January last or there about (25th day January 1826) Convey to the Said Geo. W. Haywood in Trust for the purpose Set forth in the Said Deed Together with other property a certain Tract of Land Situate Lying and being in the County of Chatham and State aforesaid and upon which Alsey Goodwin resides which Tract of Land adjoins the lands of James Goodwin, Henry Goodwin and Dempsey Goodwin and is bounded on the North by Henry Goodwin line on the South by Beaver Creek and on the West by Dempsey Goodwin line and laid out on the East by James Goodwin and hac mill The Said Tract lying on Beaver Creek in James Goodwin line and thence north to a post oak corner in Henry Goodwin line Thence west to a pine in Henry and Dempsey Goodwin line Thence South to Beaver Creek thence up Said creek to the beginning containing one hundred and fifty acres be the same more or less - And Whereas I the Said Geo. W. Haywood by virtue of the powers and authority Set forth in the Said Deed of Trust Did On the eight day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty Six offer and explore the Said tract of Land at Public Sale or auction in the County of Chatham on the premises at which time and plan aforesaid Parker Rand became the last

and highest bidder for the Same at the price of five hundred and fifty Dollars (\$550.00) That being the last highest and greatest Sum bid for The aforesaid premises Now Therefore I the aforesaid Geo. W. Haywood as Trustee for in consideration of the sum of Five Hundred and Fifty dollars to me in hand paid at and before the signing sealing and delivering of these presents The receipt Whereof is herby acknowledged hath given granted bargained and Sold and by these present doth give grant bargain and by these present doth give grant bargain and sell by virtue of the process and authorities Vested in me by the Said Deed of trust unto the Said Parker Rand his heirs and assigns forever The aforesaid described Tract of Land and premises with all the hereditament and appurtenances as Thereunto belonging as in anywise appertaining with Revision and Revisions Remainder and Remainders Rents

issues and profits thereof together with all the Estate Rights Title Interest Claim or demanded of whatsoever description Whither at Law or in Equity of the Said Geo. W. Haywood To the aforesaid Tract of Land unto the Said Parker Rand his heirs and assigns forever To his and their own proper use benefit and behoof for Such Estate and under Such limitations and conditions or the Said Henry Goodwin held at that times and The said Geo. W. Haywood covenants for himself and his heirs and assigns That he has in any manner since the Said property was conveyed in Trust or before sold disposed of or cannibalized it in any manner or form the Said property was conveyed anyway whatsoever and the Said Geo. W. Haywood does by these presents forever Warrant the title conveyed to as trustee agent himself his heirs and assigns. But will not Warrant or defend the Title to the Said premises against the claim or claims if any other person or persons whatsoever as Witness my hand and Seal This Eight day of November 1826.

Lucy Tudor was the second wife and married Henry on June 27, 1847 at Cumberland County. Lucy Tudor Goodwin was born in 1815. Lucy filed a petition for dower rights in 1858. Some members of this family were identified in this petition.

The Petition of: Lucy Goodwin (against) Wiley, Elmira, Sarah Ann Goodwin, Bennet G. Goodwin and wife Betsey, Richard Ausley and wife Julia Ann, Elbert Ausley and wife Sarah, Elizabeth Ann, and Margaret Goodwin "Humbly complaining your petitioner, Lucy Goodwin would respectively show unto your Worship, that beginning in May last, her husband Henry Goodwin, late of the County of Chatham, departed this life without leaving your Petitioner unprovided for. That the Relicturem, Sarah Ann, is a minor and appearing in this suit by her next friend Richard Ausley. Your petitioner would show the said husband died seized and possessed of a tract of land in Chatham County containing 70 acres more or less adjoining the lands of Lomey (Lorenzo)

Goodwin, Michael Thraikill {nothing} out of which your petitioner Lucy Goodwin would show that she is by law entitled to her dower and {Mends}."

Lucy was living in the household of Robert and Caroline Goodwin in the 1860 Census. She married a second time to Alexander Hobby on October 28, 1860 in Chatham County.

I have not been able to positively identify all the children of this family. Bennet G. Goodwin, James H. Goodwin, William H. Goodwin Margaret and Elizabeth Ann Goodwin were identified by name in a petition by Lucy for Dower rights to Henry's estate. Arel was named in the account book of the Upchurch store, as being Henry's son. Other children named in

the estate papers as burying property sold in settling Henry's Estate were Lorenzo Goodwin, Margaret Goodwin, Hinton Goodwin, Patsy Goodwin, and Robert J. Goodwin. All of Henry's children were born at Chatham County.

*(1) Bennet G. Goodwin was born about 1804. He married Betsey Jones. (2) James H. Goodwin was born about 1807. He died before 1850 in Chatham County. He married Sydney (Siddy) Holland. (3) Arel Goodwin (untraced) was born about 1809. He was recorded in **Upchurch's Store account book in 1829** as being the son of Henry. I have not found any other data on Arel. (4) Martha Patsy Goodwin was born about 1811. She married Ruffin Upchurch. (5) Mary*

(Polly) Goodwin was born about 1813. She married Thomas Lawrence on July 1, 1839. (6) Lorenzo S. Goodwin was born about 1815. He died October 6, 1894 at Chatham County. He married Lucretia Mooring. (7) William H. Goodwin was born on June 3rd 1817. He died about 1849 at Chatham County. He married Mary Ann Cotten. (8) Margaret (Peggy) Goodwin was born about 1820. (9) J. Hinton Goodwin was born about 1823. He married Willebeth (Willep) Hicks. (10) Robert J. Goodwin was born in 1827. He died before 1900 at Chatham County. He married Caroline Bynum. (11) Elizabeth Ann Goodwin (untraced) was born in 1830. She was still living in Henry's household in the 1850 Census for Chatham County.

Henry Goodwin died on May 17, 1857, in Chatham County, North Carolina.
