Dear Cousin Ed,

Many thanks for your letter of August 29, 1982. I have now extracted all the details you provided and have them firmly entered in my file and in outline. I have written to the four individuals whose addresses you provided and hope to hear from them.

The names from the Shuloh cemetery north of Weddo, AB do fit into the Fawford U family. The Ann Ballard mentioned by your GF was the wife, not the sister, of Fawford U. It makes sense that Fawford was buried in the Shuloh cemetery. However, I wonder about his wife. The story I got is that she died in MS in 1854 while she and Fawford were moving to Weddo, AB and that he tore up the wagon to make a coffin for her. If this is true it is unlikely that she was carried from MS to Shuloh and to be buried. What do you think? Does your GF have more information or recollections? The people in the cemetery are: J. F. U (former John U son of Fawford U); John W. U - son of former John U; W.H. U (William Herschel U - son of former John U); P.G. U (Patrick Gordon U - son of Patrick Bogart U of the Hermann/Alien U subclan); Eugenia U (wife of P.G. U & daughter of former John U).

I will welcome the additional details on
Nellie Upchurch and on others as you can get them.
For Patrice Lavy U - is her wife's name SUSAN
FITZ RANDOLPH or Susan ~~FITZ~~RANDOLPH? Are
their children Kelly and Ashley boys or girls?

Here is a speculation on some of the people in
the correspondence you and I have had. We are
reasonably certain that Charles U (XID-164; Head of
Clan 2) had a son Thomas Bay U, 57 (XID-207). We think
Charles also had sons Reuben U, Jacob U, and a
daughter Charity U. We think their daughter Charity U
had 3 children as follows:

1. James Monroe U (XID-73)
2. J. Michael U ("Bump") (XID-512)
3. William Green.

We do not know the father of these three sons. We but
estimate them in that Charity U (sister of Charles U) was a 1st
cousin of your ancestor Calvert U (son of Richard U III). The
James Monroe U (XID-73) therefore married his 2nd cousin
Sarah Elizabeth U (XID-134). Also J. Michael U (XID-512)
married Matilda U (XID-2720), the daughter of his 3rd cousin,
Sunford U. I do hope you will check this out
with your GF Jerome Lee U and see if any of it
is missed or corrected as far as her knowledge
goes. We are operating with very limited information
here and every little bit added helps. — Also
any recollections you can get from Jerome Lee U
will be very valuable to future generations.

 - h) Date & place of birth for Bobbie Merle Myers, Jr?
 - i) place of birth of the 2 children of Kellam Jane U?
 - f) Michael See U - where born, died, buried?
 - k) Patricia Tenney - where born, when & where married 1888 & 2nd time; full names of her husbands & their birth dates & places?
 - l) place of birth of the 3 children of Patricia Tenney and the year of birth for 3 (Jeff William Crabbree)?
 - f) Raymond Leon U, Jr - where born, when & where married, full maiden name of Vickrey Littleton and her birth date & place and the birth place of their son?
 - j) Patrick Lany U - his birth place, marriage date and place, birth place of his wife & her 3 children
 - h) For the son of Jessie See U who died at birth - any more details - where born, died, buried, when, did they have names?

Have you ever been to the Eastland Cemetery in Cass Co., TX or to the Elgin Cemetery? I have a feeling that some useful information might be obtained in these cemeteries and in others where Upchurches are buried. I was certainly pleased to get the information you sent from the Shiloh Cemetery north of Waldo, AR.

I am really grateful for the extra effort you have expended in helping to get details on the Upchurches and their relatives. Publishing the Bulletin is a lot of work but it is made easier when other help and of course is especially satisfying when someone, such as yourself, shows an appreciation. (Vol 3rd goes in the mail on Tuesday - right now my wife is stapling them!)

had four brothers in the Revolutionary War. He was married to Miss Margaret Irvin, a native of South Carolina, where she died in 1857. Eight children were the fruits of this union—seven sons and one daughter, of whom our subject is the oldest. Jonathan Thrailkill was reared in South Carolina, and was there married, in 1849, to Miss Martha Posey, a native of that State. They emigrated to Georgia in 1851, and here Mr. Thrailkill lost his wife in 1854. In 1856 he married Mrs. Ophelia (McClendon) Bacon, who died in 1861. To his first marriage were born four children, three now living: Frances A. (at home), Margaret E. (wife of James England) and John D. To his second union three children were born, two now living: Sterling D. and James H. Cicero T. N. is dead. In 1862 Mr. Thrailkill moved to Columbia County, Ark., settled on 240 acres, and here he has since resided. He has forty acres under cultivation, and is an honest, industrious citizen. He is a member of the Masonic fraternity, having joined that society in 1864, and is a member of Lamertine Lodge, a Master Mason. He is a member of the Christian Church, and his first wife was a member of the Baptist Church. His politics he adheres to the Democratic party. His fine farm is situated two and a half miles northeast of Waldo, which is his post-office address.

John J. Upchurch, farmer, Waldo, Ark. It is a fact unnecessary of denial that a person is better fitted to follow the occupation with which he became familiar in early life than to engage in some undertaking learned in later years. This truth is borne out by Mr. Upchurch, who, from a boy, has known all the details of farm life. His father, Lausford Upchurch, was also a farmer, and came to this county from Georgia in 1854. He was a native of North Carolina, born in 1810, and died at the home of his son, John J., in this county, on December 10, 1882. He was constable in Georgia for many years, and also filled that position in this county. His wife was Miss Mary Ann Bellard, who was born about 1820, and died about 1854, while on her way to Arkansas. They had eleven children—three sons and eight daughters. The paternal grandfather, Clayborne Upchurch, was born in North Carolina, and was of French descent. John J. Upchurch, the subject of this sketch, and the eighth of the above mentioned children, attained his growth and received his education in this county, and has been a resident of the same farm since seven years of age. He was married in 1868 to Miss Amanda Stringer, a native of Columbia County (what was then Nevada County), born in 1849, and their union has been blessed by the

birth of seven children—three sons and four daughters: Willius H., Sophronia E. (wife of P. G. Upchurch), John W., Thomas E., Mattie L., Cora B. and Emma G. Mr. Upchurch is the owner of 248 acres of land, and has fifty acres under cultivation. He is a member of the Wheel, and in politics is Democratic, casting his first vote for Horace Greeley. He and Mrs. Upchurch are members of the Christian Church. Mr. and Mrs. Upchurch have reared their seven children, and have never paid out \$25 on doctor bills. They are all strong and healthy.

J. H. Wallace, M. D., is a physician of acknowledged merit throughout this section of the country, and he is especially well known in Columbia County, for he has been a resident of the same since 1830. He was born in Jefferson, Jackson County, Ga., in 1830, and is the eldest child born to Isaiah C. and Mary (Venable) Wallace, natives of South Carolina and Virginia, respectively. The father was a Methodist minister, which calling he followed for many years, and in 1860 came to Arkansas, and was soon after chosen as a representative of Columbia County in the State Legislature, and since the war filled the same position one term. During the war he served for some time in the Confederate army as captain of a company of cavalry, but after a short time resigned, and came home and there died at the age of sixty years in 1872. He and his wife were the parents of eight children, three of whom are now living: J. H., Narcissus (now Mrs. Dose, of Atlanta, Ark.), and Jefferson (an attorney-at-law). Mrs. Wallace died in 1870. The paternal grandfather, Levi Wallace, was a lieutenant in the Revolutionary War, serving the full time, and was a participant in the battle of Cowpens, and was also in a number of other engagements. The maternal grandfather, Abraham Venable, was well known in the county in Virginia in which he resided, and was a successful agriculturist. Dr. Wallace received his education at White Sulphur Springs, Ga., and at the age of twenty three entered the Medical University of that State, an institution he attended two terms, graduating in the spring of 1856. He then entered the Jefferson School of Medicine of Philadelphia, graduating in 1857, after which he came home and entered upon his practice, moving in 1860 to Columbia County, taking up his residence near his present home. He was married in 1858 to Miss Samantha Story, of Georgia, a daughter of James Story, and to them a family of eight children were born: Isaiah (a farmer), Brooks (deceased), T. Jefferson, Mary (wife of R. McCloud), Minnie, Fannie (wife of Joe Jean), and William.

I can appreciate the fact that you are busy because this has become a problem for me in retirement. I have always been busy but somehow everything seemed to fall into place. The problem with retirement is that I thought I could do all the good things I had been dreaming about. Not so. The end result is that I have had to put some good projects on the back burner. After nearly two years all this is pretty well sorted out. I am now concentrating on several projects in Family History and on Land.

The US continues to move along nicely and lots of information continues to arrive. Englandia is now launched and I think will do well. Your encouraging words are appreciated. The third project is the Upchurch book I have long thought of writing, it has been started and is entitled "Upchurch Ancestors - Seven American Generations". I hope to finish this before the end of the year - we'll see.

The Farming Effort is picking up steam. I have decided to gradually get into direct management as opposed to letting operation farm on share.

I have just bought a 278 acre tract which I will manage myself. This includes splitting off 120 acres that is more or less wooded and offering this as 10-12 acre building sites. The rest I will farm. To do this I have hired a part-time farm worker "Thomas Cobb" and have bought a 145 HP John Deere Tractor with a disk and rotary mower. Bobbie Elizabeth Upchurch Hill, of Little Rock, died Thursday, Dec. 8, 2005, at her home.

She was born on Feb. 8, 1942, in Edenburg, Texas, to William (Bill) and MattyLu Harvey Upchurch.

She was preceded in death by her beloved husband of 42 years, Major (Ret.) Edward John Hill, her father William Upchurch and a sister, Billie Lou Upchurch Goheen. She was a devoted mother, wife, and daughter and will be missed by all who knew her. Bobbie traveled extensively during her lifetime and had plenty of stories to tell. She was a wonderful cook, welcoming hostess and had a great sense of adventure. Bobbie was a member of Trinity United Methodist Church in Little Rock.

Bobbie moved with her family at age 7 to Albuquerque, N.M. After graduating high school, she attended the University of New Mexico and graduated from the Albuquerque Business College and the Judy Clark Modeling School. She married Edward J. Hill in 1962 and became a devoted military wife. After Ed's retirement, they moved to Camden where they were members of the First United Methodist Church of Camden.

While in Camden, she was active with the local PTA, the Child Protection Committee, served as education chair for the Arkansas Gifted and Talented Educators, served the County United Way as vice president, and was an active board member of Arkansas Common Cause. Bobbie was

very active with the League of Women Voters (LWV) at the local, state and national levels where she served as president of the Arkansas LWV, as second vice-president of the LWV of the United States and as a trustee of the National LWV Education Fund. Through her work with the LWV US, she worked with the State Department as a member of the United States' Information

Agency's Speakers Bureau. In 1993, she traveled to Panama to help media and civic groups produce the country's first televised presidential debates and worked with non-partisan groups interested in improving voter participation in the 1994 elections. She also went to Mexico to teach non-governmental organizations and elected officials how to strengthen their democratic institutions and participated in seminars in Croatia, Hungary, and Russia to teach mobilization strategies and coalition building. On behalf of the LWV of Arkansas, Bobbie challenged the constitutionality of a section of the Arkansas Term Limitation Amendment adopted in 1992, which limited the terms of individuals elected to the U.S. House of Representatives and U.S. Senate. The case went to the United States Supreme Court in 1994 and that section of the amendment was ruled unconstitutional. In 1995, Bobbie led the LWV U.S. contingent to the United Nation's Fourth World Conference on Women in Beijing and traveled to Russia to speak with women on how to form and organize political parties, campaign and raise funds, and build up grassroots organizations.

Bobbie and Ed moved to Little Rock in 1996 to start an American Leak Detection franchise to serve the state of Arkansas. In 1997, they received the Rookie of the Year Award from the ALD Corporate Office and in 1999, received the award for Franchise of the Year from the International Franchise Association.

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She is survived by her three children, son, Matthew L. Hill and wife, Kellye, and daughter Morgan Elise; son, Andrew W. Hill and wife, Carolina, and son, Henry Edward all of Little Rock; daughter Elizabeth Hill Smith and husband, Dr. Stephen A. Smith, and sons, Stephen A. Smith, Jr. and Taylor C.
