"It would appear that I am a member of your clan 15-- that is, unless there is more than one Burwell Uphurch. My Burwell died 1846/7 in Alabama, and it is assumed he is the same who appears earlier in Georgia. We further assume that said Burwell is the son of James (XID 156). You list Burwell U. (ca 1785-1830) (XID-2029), but I am thinking that 1830 was the last record in which you could find him still living? I have never run across any other 'Burwell Uphurch', but perhaps in your many files there may be another."

"I simply do not know what the correct spelling for Burwell / Burrell should be. The name seems to have evolved from "Burwell" towards "Burrell". Burwell is of course a surname by itself so I have wondered from time to time if his mother was a member of that family."

1. Burwell (Burwell) U had one slave b in 1823

2. Nearby Burwell U lived his in-laws the Rileys

3. Adjacent to Burwell U lived a Mary U who headed a household in which was a female over 70 - It is presumed the female was Mary U herself and that she is the same as the elderly female in the home of Burwell U in 1820 [RPU analysis - this Mary U is probably a blood or by marriage aunt to Burwell, her mother or step-mother or his 1st cousin - no good hints - RPU]

ACCORDING TO A BIBLE RECORD THAT WAS PRESERVED IN THE FAMILY OF ENNIS LOFTIN WHO MARRIED ONE OF BURWELL'S DAUGHTERS WE KNOW THAT BURWELL WAS BORN 2 MARCH 1782, PROBABLY IN BRUNSWICK CO., VA. WHERE HE IS NAMED IN THE LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT OF HIS GRANDFATHER JAMES UPCHURCH IN JUNE 1784, APPARENTLY THE ONLY CHILD OF JAMES (THE YOUNGER). THERE HAVE BEEN NO INDICATIONS THAT BURWELL HAD ANY SIBLINGS AND WE DO NOT KNOW THE NAME OF HIS MOTHER.

NOTHING IS KNOWN ABOUT THE GOINGS-ON OF BURWELL'S LIFE FOR THE NEXT SEVENTEEN YEARS OR WHERE THEY TOOK PLACE. PRESUMABLY HIS FAMILY REMAINED IN BRUNSWICK CO., BUT AT SOME POINT HE REMOVED TO FRANKLIN CO., N.C. WHERE, ON 12 MAY 1803 WHEN HE WAS BARELY 21 YEARS OLD, HE SOLD THE BRUNSWICK CO., VA. LAND THAT HAD BEEN BEQUEATHED TO HIM BY HIS GRANDFATHER. TAX LISTS AFTER BURWELL SELLS HIS GREENE Co. LAND IN 1809 AND 1810 IT WOULD SEEM REASONABLE TO GUESS THAT WILKINSON Co., GA. BECAME THE NEXT PLACE OF RESIDENCE. THIS THEORY IS FURTHER REINFORCED BY THE FACT THAT THERE ARE INDICATIONS THAT MEMBERS OF THE RILEY FAMILY LIVED IN TWIGGS Co. WHICH IS ADJACENT TO WILKINSON Co., AND THERE HAS TO HAVE BEEN OPPORTUNITY FOR BURWELL TO HAVE MET AND MARRIED ELEANOR RILEY ABOUT THIS TIME BECAUSE THEIR CHILDREN BEGIN APPEARING AS EARLY AS 1813 WHEN HARRIET WAS BORN ON 7 MARCH. IT MAY NEVER BE KNOWN FOR SURE BECAUSE THE COURTHOUSE IN WILKINSON COUNTY BURNED IN 1828, 1854 AND 1924, AND TWIGGS COUNTY ISN'T IN MUCH BETTER SHAPE FOR EXTANT EARLY RECORDS.

AT ANY RATE, A SUBSEQUENT DAUGHTER, ELIZABETH, WAS BORN CA 1814 AND A SON, MOSES ON 19 APRIL 1816 (GG-GRANDFATHER OF THIS WRITER) -- ALL INDICATED BY CENSUS RECORDS TO HAVE BEEN BORN IN GEORGIA. ALTHOUGH THE REASON FOR CHOOSING THAT PARTICULAR TIME IS NOT KNOWN THE FACT IS THAT BURWELL REMOVED TO GREENE Co., MISS. BY 1817 -- PROBABLY TO THAT PART THAT WAS CUT OFF TO FORM PERRY Co. IN 1820 BECAUSE HE IS A RESIDENT OF THAT COUNTY FROM 1820 TO 1825. ALMOST CERTAINLY, HOWEVER, THE MOVE TO MISSISSIPPI WAS IN CONNECTION WITH THE RILEY FAMILY'S MOVE TO THE SAME LOCATION, INCLUDING BURWELL'S FATHER-IN-LAW, EDWARD RILEY, AND MOST, IF NOT ALL, OF THE RILEY SIB-

A CURIOUS CENSUS CONDUCTED BY THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI IN 1823 WHICH, AMONG OTHER THINGS, INDICATED THE NAMES OF INDIVIDUALS OVER THE AGE OF 70 YEARS DIVULGES THAT AMONG THE RESIDENTS OF PERRY COUNTY IN SAID AGE-GROUP THERE WAS A CERTAIN MARY UPCHURCH. THE 1820 CENSUS RETURNS SHOW A FEMALE "OVER 45" IN THE BURWELL UPCHURCH HOUSEHOLD AND THIS MARY IS ENUMERATED IN 1823 NEXT TO BURWELL'S LISTING. HER IDENTITY, AND RELATIONSHIP TO BURWELL, IS A MYSTERY ALTHOUGH IT IS EXTREMELY TEMPTING TO THINK THAT SHE IS HIS MOTHER. WE CAN'T KNOW FOR SURE. FOR ONE THING, IF SHE IS WHY AREN'T THERE SIBLINGS FOR BURWELL?

ANOTHER FACT CONCERNING THE MOVEMENTS OF BURWELL UPCHURCH ABOUT WHICH WE ARE IGNORANT IS WHY HE DECIDED TO REMOVE TO WILCOX CO., ALA. FOR WHATEVER REASON HE CAN BE FOUND ENUMERATED IN THE 1830 CENSUS RETURNS FOR THAT COUNTY AND IT IS KNOWN THAT HIS YOUNGEST SON, JOHN T.R., WAS BORN IN ALABAMA. IN 1831 THAT PORTION OF WILCOX CO. LYING WEST OF THE MIDDLE OF RANGE 4 IN TOWNSHIPS 11 & 12 WAS MADE PART OF CLARKE COUNTY AND SUBSEQUENT, NUMEROUS REFERENCES TO BURWELL MADE IN VARIOUS RECORDS OF THE COUNTY INDICATE THAT THE FAMILY LIVED IN THAT AREA -- THE EXTREME NORTHEAST SECTION OF PRESENT-DAY CLARKE CO. IN MAY 1968 THIS WRITER WAS LED TO AN OLD GRAVE LOCATED IN THE WOODS ON "THE OLD TOMPKINS PLACE" AT ATKINSON, ALA., ABOUT A MILE-AND-A-HALF FROM THE WILCOX CO. LINE. THE WORN, HAND-CARVED SANDSTONE MARKER IS ENGRAVED "E. UPCHURCH, DIED FEB 1831" AND IS WITHOUT QUESTION THE BURIAL SITE FOR BURWELL'S WIFE. AN INDICATION THAT THE FAMILY HAD SOME AFFLUENCY: "AMONG THE LIME HILLS, IN THE BASHI OR LOFTIN NEIGHBORHOOD, THE FIRST FAMILY CARRIAGE WAS INTRODUCED ABOUT 1830. IN THIS MRS. UPCHURCH AND HER TWO DAUGHTERS WERE ACCUSTOMED TO RIDE WHEN GOING TO MAKE VISITS OR TO ATTEND CHURCH." (CLARKE CO., ALA. AND IT'S SURROUNDINGS BY REV. T.H. BALL, PP 192-193)

VARIOUS OF THE LOCAL FAMILIES. ELIZABETH M. LITTLEBERRY CHAMPION, 3 AUGUST 1831; 4941, 4942
HARRIET M. ENNIS LOFTIN, 14 FEBRUARY 1833; MOSES M. LUCINDA DICKSON, 15 FEB 1834 4903, 4904
AND, AFTER HER DEATH, NANCY LARY, 20 SEPTEMBER 1852; BURRELL MILES M. MARGARET 4940 2030, 4938
JAMES CA 1843 AND JOHN TILLMAN RILEY M. SARAH DUDLEY MARY HESTER MARGARET SCOTT 4943, 4944
BRYAN MCGREGOR, 16 DECEMBER 1847. JORDAN, THE PRESUMED OTHER SON, DOES NOT 4945
APPEAR TO HAVE MARRIED. OF THESE CHILDREN THE MOVEMENTS OF THE CHAMPION FAMILY
ARE UNKNOWN AFTER 1850 WHEN THEY WERE RESIDENTS OF CHOCTAW CO., ALA.; THE LOFTINS
WENT BACK TO GEORGIA; MOSES, BURRELL M. AND JORDAN WENT TO GRIMES CO., TEXAS AF-
TER 1850; AND JOHN T.R.'S WIDOW TOOK HER FAMILY, AFTER HE DIED IN 1851, TO RED
RIVER CO., TEXAS.

BURWELL UPCHURCH DOES NOT APPEAR IN CLARKE CO. RECORDS AFTER 1834, PROBABLY
BECAUSE HE IS SUBSEQUENTLY IN EVIDENCE OVER IN SUMTER CO., ALA., APPARENTLY BARE-
LY INSIDE THAT PART THAT WAS CUT OFF TO FORM CHOCTAW CO. IN DECEMBER 1847. HE
DIED THERE, 31 DEC 1847. FORTUNATELY FOR US HIS PROBATE PROCEEDINGS WERE INIT-
IATED IN SUMTER COUNTY BEFORE BEING TRANSFERRED TO CHOCTAW COUNTY BECAUSE THAT
COUNTY HAS LOST IT'S RECORDS. IN MAY 1968 THIS WRITER AND A COUSIN, ROBERT E.L.
UPCHURCH OF BEDIAS, GRIMES CO., TEXAS WERE LED TO THE SITE OF A COMPLETELY OVER-
GROWN AND ABANDONED CEMETERY NEAR YANTLEY IN CHOCTAW CO. VIRTUALLY ALL OF THE
STONES HAD BEEN REMOVED OVER THE YEARS FOR RE-USE, BUT WE LOCATED, BURIED IN THE
LEAVES A FINE, MARBLE HEADSTONE FOR JOHN T.R. UPCHURCH. THE ELDERLY COLORED MAN
WHO GUIDED US THERE AND HAD LIVED NEARBY FOR MOST OF HIS LIFE "REMEMBERED" THAT
THERE USED TO BE AN IDENTICAL, SECOND MARKER WITH THE SAME UPCHURCH NAME ON IT.
HOW TEMPTING TO THINK THAT WE LOCATED THE FINAL RESTING PLACE FOR BURWELL UPCHURCH.

IN JANUARY 1858 A CERTAIN JORDAN UPCHURCH DIED IN GRIMES CO., TEXAS WHERE- 4945
UPON MOSES AND BURRELL MILES UPCHURCH WERE APPOINTED AS ADMINISTRATORS OF THE
ESTATE BY THE COUNTY COURT. THERE WERE ONLY A FEW PERSONAL BELONGINGS AND NO

HEIRS WERE NAMED NOR WAS THE RELATIONSHIP OF MOSES AND BURRELL M. DIVULGED. UN-
FORTUNATELY, JORDAN HAS NOT BEEN FOUND IN THE 1850 CENSUS RETURNS NOR HAS A MARKED
GRAVESITE BEEN LOCATED SO HIS AGE CANNOT BE DETERMINED, BUT HE IS THE MOST LOGICAL
PROSPECT AVAILABLE TO BE THE MISSING SIBLING WHO APPEARS IN THE 1830 CENSUS RECORD.
IT IS INTERESTING TO NOTE THAT IN AUGUST 1842, WHEN BURWELL AND MOST OF HIS CHIL-
DREN WERE RESIDENTS OF SUMTER CO., ALA., A CERTAIN JORDAN UPCHURCH WAS ELECTED TO
THE OFFICE OF CONSTABLE IN LAUDERDALE COUNTY, MISS., ADJACENT TO SUMTER CO.

UPCHURCH FAMILIES

The Upchurch families of Grimes County are descended from Michael Upchurch (born ca. 1620) who emigrated from Essex County, England to Westmoreland County, Virginia in 1650. In Virginia he married Frances, daughter of Roger Delke. Letters to his parents in England describe the hardships of the New World at that time.

To use Biblical terms, Michael begat Richard. Richard begat John and John begat James. In 1784, James Upchurch, then of Brunswick County, Virginia, died. In his will James mentioned his grandson Burwell Upchurch (son of James, Jr.). Burwell (born March 2, 1782) married Ellender Riley (born June 20, 1794). The family moved to Franklin County, North Carolina, thence to Georgia and from there to Alabama where Ellender died in 1831 and Burwell in 1847. By this time the spelling of Burwell had been corrupted to "Burrell." Their children were Elizabeth, Harriett, Moses, Jordan, Burrell Miles and John Tillman Riley.

At various times during the mid 1850's, Jordan, Burrell

Miles and Moses moved from Alabama and settled at Pankey in north Grimes County about four miles west of Bedias. At about the same time the McGilberry family, to whom the Upchurches were related, moved to Grimes County and settled around Singleton and Shiro.

Jordan Upchurch died in Grimes County in 1858 without issue so far as is known. Burrell Miles (1821-1884) married Margaret James (1824-1891). Their children were Elizabeth C., Burrell, Jesse Miles, Mary S., Margaret M., Theodosia Matilda, Emily, Fannie and Martha.

Moses (1816-1886) married (1st) Lucinda Dickson and their children were James Monroe and Oliver Hazard Perry. (2nd) Nancy Lary and their children were Celia S., Riley Judson, Texana O., Milton Ernest, Robert E. Lee, Martha Paralee, John Bunion, Ionia E., Arminta Lamira and Joseph Clyde.

Robert E. Lee Upchurch (1861-1922) married (1st) Willie Harrison (1867-1890), a member of a pioneer north Grimes County family. They had no children. He married (2nd) Fannie Verna Davis (1890-) in 1918. Her parents were Samuel Alexander Davis and Nancy Stone Owens.

The Davis family had originally come from Wales and after a long stay in South Carolina and then in Alabama, moved to north Grimes County in the early 1870's because of the deplorable conditions in Alabama after the Civil War. They settled about four miles south of Bedias.

Robert E. Lee Upchurch and Fannie Verna Davis had one child, Robert E. Lee Upchurch, II (1922-). Bob Upchurch, as the father was known, had many business interests. For many years he operated a store at Pankey, but when the railroad came to Bedias in 1903, he closed that business and organized a private bank in Bedias, which operated on the premises of a mercantile establishment. In 1907 a state charter was obtained and since then the bank has been known as the First State Bank of Bedias. R.E.L. Upchurch (as he signed his name) was president. When he died in 1922 his wife, Fannie Upchurch, assumed the

presidency of the bank and has held that office for the 59 years since that time, probably the longest tenure for a woman in such office in United States history. However, she is probably better known in the area as a landowner and cattlemaster. She graduated from the University of Texas in 1910 with a degree in mathematics.

On April 19, 1952, R.E.L. Upchurch (Robert Lee) married Mary Kathryn Dyer of Navasota. She is the daughter of Lois Pleasant Dyer and Mary Louise Pierce Dyer, both families being long-time residents of Grimes County. Their children are Mary Candice, born May 22, 1953 and married to William Floyd Conrad of the Tabor Community, Brazos County, Texas; Kathryn Lois Upchurch, born February 11, 1955, and Robert E. Lee Upchurch III, born April 11, 1963.

As of this date (1981) R.E.L. Upchurch, II and his wife, Mary Kathryn Dyer Upchurch, reside in Bedias, as do his mother, Fannie Upchurch, and the Conrads. Kathryn lives in Houston, Texas, and Robert is a student at Texas A & M University.

Burwell UPCHURCH(1) has the distinction of being the first known UPCHURCH to ever reside in Mississippi. Even though he stayed in Mississippi less than ten years, it was another fifteen years before another UPCHURCH came to the state. The name Burwell was found spelled as Burrell in many records; however, Burwell will be considered the correct spelling for this man.

Burwell UPCHURCH was first found in the Mississippi Territory in Greene County in 1817. At this time he owned one slave.⁴¹ Burwell's residency in Mississippi at this time enabled him to see the territory become a state on 10 December 1817.⁴² Burwell remained in Greene County for two years. In 1819 he owned 640 acres and three slaves.⁴³ Even though Burwell was found in Perry County on the 1820 Mississippi census, it is believed that he never moved and really lived in the part of Greene County that became part of Perry in the same year.⁴⁴ While in Perry County, Burwell owned two slaves in 1821, three slaves in 1822, and in 1823 he owned 320 acres and three slaves.⁴⁵ An 1823 state census of persons over seventy showed a Mary UPCHURCH. The connection of this Mary to Burwell is unknown. There is speculation that she might be his mother.⁴⁶ In 1825 Burwell owned 480 acres, four dearborn used as pleasurable carriages, and four slaves.⁴⁷ This latter record was the last evidence of Burwell in Mississippi. Further records from these two counties are gone forever as a fire destroyed the records of Greene County in 1875 and those of Perry in 1887.⁴⁸

(17) - CONTINUED

It seems that Burwell UPCHURCH(1) might have been the restless sort of person from all the places he lived during his lifetime. He was born 2 March 1782 in Brunswick County, Virginia, the son of James UPCHURCH Jr. By 1803 he was living in Franklin County, North Carolina. From 1805 to 1810 he was found in Greene County, Georgia. In 1810 Burwell also paid taxes on land in Wilkinson County, Georgia. It is believed that shortly after this he married Eleanor (Ellender) RILEY, the daughter of Edward RILEY, whose family resided in Twiggs County, Georgia, the neighboring county to Wilkinson. Burwell was then found in Greene County, Mississippi from 1817 to 1819 and in Perry County, Mississippi from 1820 to 1825. It is interesting to note that the RILEY family had also moved to Mississippi during this time span. By 1829 Burwell and family were in Wilcox County, Alabama. Eleanor RILEY UPCHURCH died in February 1831 and was buried at Atkinson, Alabama. Also, in 1831 part of Wilcox County, Alabama became Clarke County and Burwell was then found in the latter county until 1834. Burwell then resided in Sumter County, Alabama which became part of Choctaw County. Burwell died in Choctaw County on 31 December 1847.⁴⁹

There were six children born to Burwell UPCHURCH(1) and Eleanor RILEY: Harriet UPCHURCH(2); Elizabeth UPCHURCH(3); Moses UPCHURCH(4); Jordan UPCHURCH(5); Burrell Miles UPCHURCH(6); and John Tillman Riley UPCHURCH. All but the last of these children resided in Mississippi at some time. Harriet UPCHURCH(2) was born 7 March 1813 in Georgia and married Ennis LOFTIN on 14 February 1833.⁵⁰ She died 15 June 1890.⁵¹ Elizabeth UPCHURCH(3) was born about 1814 in Georgia and married Littleberry CHAMPION on 3 August 1831. Moses UPCHURCH(4)

was born 19 April 1816 in Georgia and married Lucinda DICKSON on 15 February 1834. He then married Nancy LARY on 20 September 1852.⁵⁴ Moses died on 24 June 1886 and was buried at Bedias, Grimes County, Texas.⁵⁵ Burrell Miles UPCHURCH(6) was born 5 January 1821 in Perry County, Mississippi and married Margaret JAMES about 1843.⁵⁶ Burrell Miles died 26 August 1884 and was buried at the Baptist Cemetery in Bedias, Grimes County, Texas.⁵⁷ John Tillman Riley UPCHURCH was born 19 February 1829, probably in Wilcox County, Alabama. On 16 December 1847 he married a woman with a very long name, Sarah Dudley Mary Hester Margaret Scott Bryan McGREGOR.⁵⁸ John Tillman Riley died 11 January 1851 and was buried near Yantley, Choctaw County, Alabama.⁵⁹

Jordan UPCHURCH(5) was born sometime between 1816 and 1821, probably in Mississippi.⁶⁰ Jordan returned to Mississippi as a young adult. On 5 September 1842, he posted a bond in Lauderdale County, Mississippi, having been elected Constable of Beat 5. He also gave an oath "to support the Constitution of the United States and of the State of Mississippi and that he will discharge the duties of the office of Constable."⁶¹ It is interesting to note two items. In 1842, Jordan's father was in Sumter County, Alabama with only the Alabama-Mississippi state line lying between father and son. Also, the family of Benjamin UPCHURCH(7) had moved to Lauderdale County, Mississippi by 1840.⁶² No other record was found for Jordan UPCHURCH(5) until January 1858 in Grimes County, Texas. Then Moses UPCHURCH(4) and Burrell Miles UPCHURCH(6), Jordan's brothers, were appointed administrators of Jordan's estate.⁶³

An outline of the descendants of Burwell UPCHURCH(1) is enclosed with this chapter. These descendants are not discussed in detail in this chapter as most of them did not actually reside in Mississippi. For more information of these UPCHURCH members, consult the footnotes for additional sources.

A Possible Mother
for
Burwell UPCHURCH

It is a given fact that Burwell UPCHURCH (1782-1847) was the son of a certain James UPCHURCH (Jr.) who was specified as being the son of Burwell's grandfather, James UPCHURCH (Sr.) who died in Brunswick Co., VA -- the Last Will and Testament for whom was dated 24 June 1784 and subsequently proved 26 July 1784 in that county -- because the said parties are identified as such in the said LWT. What has been lacking, however, is any indication in re the identity of Burwell's mother. What follows will be an effort by this writer to present a possible candidate, and to outline the available circumstantial evidence that can be interpreted in a way that supports the theory.

The individual who could appear to qualify if the evidence is viewed in a "favorable" manner is a certain Mary UPCHURCH who first came to light when this writer was examining one of the various censuses undertaken by the State officials of Mississippi for their own, local purposes -- that of 1823. One provision of this exercise was to enumerate all individuals who were "over the age of 70", and it is in this context that Mary's name was listed next to Burwell's in Perry County (It is unclear whether she was in an adjacent habitation of her own, or a member of Burwell's household, but listed separately because of her age. Possibly significant, however, is the fact that the returns for the federal census of 1820, same county, indicate that Burwell's household included a white female "over 45"). A subsequent analysis by Robert Phillip UPCHURCH, based on his vast collection of UPCHURCH family data and deduced family-connections there-from, determined that Mary would not have been a blood-aunt (No such daughter was named in the LWT of James UPCHURCH (Sr.)), nor was it likely she was the wife of one of his uncles -- their names being known. R.P.U. further informed me that she could not have been a first-cousin because Burwell's uncles were simply too young to have produced a daughter of Mary's age. This writer acknowledges the possibility she might have been a second or third cousin, but for the purposes of this article we will consider that idea to be a bit far-fetched (For one thing the other branches of the family seem to have been relatively far-removed, geographically speaking.). There is also the possibility that she could have been a step-mother, but for a reason to be presented later this writer is discounting that idea, too.

At a later date R.P.U. brought to the attention of this writer the existence of an 1850 federal census return for Talbot County, GA -- one for a household that included William BARNES (75 yrs), Rebecca BARNES (69 yrs), Mary UPCHURCH (100 yrs), and various additional individuals who can be identified by other means as having been family of William and Rebecca. Except for one, serendipitous turn of events this item might have remained just another unconnected bit of UPCHURCH trivia, but with the discovery that the early records for Stone Creek Baptist Church, located near present-day Dry Branch in the very northern part of Twiggs County, were available on microfilm via inter-library loan, and the subsequent examination of the same in connection with a research project involving the family of Burwell's wife, a presentable (in the personal opinion of this writer) scenario can be formulated that ties together several strands -- including Burwell UPCHURCH, his wife and her family, the above-mentioned BARNESes, and individuals

who can have been Burwell's parents if the evidence is viewed with an open mind.

The following were received into membership at Stone Creek Church on the dates indicated:

It needs to be said here that Burwell UPCHURCH's wife has been identified as having been Eleanor ("Ellender") RILEY, daughter of Edward RILEY and Mary Elizabeth WOOD(S), and since Burwell's oldest known child was born 7 March 1813, it would seem likely that they had probably not been married very long by Jan 1812. Interestingly, Burwell is not named as having ever joined this church (Nor is his father-in-law; it being fairly certain that the above Elizabeth RILEY is Ellender's mother considering that one of their other daughters also joined.). A Letter of Dismission was issued to "Sr Elender Upchurch" (Sister E.U.) on 21 November 1815 -- clearly indicating that Burwell was getting ready for the move to Mississippi because they were in evidence there by 1817. Unfortunately, no other dates of dismissal are extant, so it cannot be determined just when the BARNESes and Mary UPCHURCH left, but these records were extracted and compiled at some point, and the nature of the information included leads this writer to think that process occurred sometime in the 1840's. James UPCHURCH was indicated to be "dead", while Mary had been "dismissed" -- the implication being that James died while still a member of Stone Creek Church (and is thus likely buried in the original cemetery about two miles from the present-day location of the church, which was moved to a new site in the 1850's, and is said to be completely abandoned with very few tombstones remaining).

But the writer digresses! The point is that Mary UPCHURCH, along with William and Rebecca BARNES, not-to-mention Burwell UPCHURCH (If Ellender was there, then so was he.) were all in one, defined location at the same time.

At this point, before finally knitting everything together, it becomes necessary to digress once again in re another matter: that of James UPCHURCH.

The reader will recall that the LWT of James UPCHURCH (Sr.) who died in Brunswick Co., VA, in 1784 was mentioned in the first paragraph above. In a very curious provision said James *loaned* a tract of land and a slave to his son James UPCHURCH (Jr.), said property to be *given* to his grandson Burwell UPCHURCH "after the Death of my son James Upchurch". This stipulation has undoubtedly perplexed and confused every researcher who has attempted to explain the arrangement -- a variety of reasons having been put forward, none of which have seemed very satisfactory (at least in the opinion of this writer).

On the surface, it would seem fairly straight-forward to assume, then, that James (Jr.) must have died by the time that Burwell, on 12 May 1803, sold the parcel of land that came to him from his grandfather (At the time he had just reached his twenty-first birthday, and was a resident of Franklin County, NC. The federal census returns for 1800 indicate there were two UPCHURCH households in that county headed by a "James", but it is

uncertain, although tempting -- perhaps even obvious -- to conclude, that one or the other is the father of Burwell.). But DID he die? For the purpose of this study it will be assumed that he did not, and that some legal maneuver was found for Burwell to have sufficient control over the land in order to sell it after attaining his majority.

Two years later Burwell can be found in the annual Tax List of 1805 for Greene County, GA., and paid taxes there every year through 1810. Significantly, a James UPCHURCH was also there from 1806 through 1810. In October 1809 Burwell sold a tract of Greene County land and in September 1810 he conveyed another parcel, while paying taxes on acreage located in Wilkinson County. Since Twiggs County was cut out of Wilkinson, it seems highly likely that the general area wherein was located Stone Creek Church was his destination (early records for these counties are no longer extant, so confirmation is difficult to achieve) -- and this writer has no problem surmising that James and Mary UPCHURCH were with him, thus explaining their presence and the timing of their church membership (The writer will choose to ignore the fact that there was a six-month difference in the respective dates of reception into the church for James and Mary, and assume there was an explanation.). On another note, it would seem very reasonable that it was here where Burwell encountered the Riley family and his future wife.

The final element of the situation is the BARNES family, and how one of them could have been associated with the aforementioned provision in the LWT that denied James (Jr.) his heirship. Along with all of the other threads that enter this picture from seemingly different directions a pattern is formed that can be interpreted in a way that explains everything. (Whether the picture presented here was the true one, or close to it -- or can ever be proved -- is another matter, of course.). The route whereby the BARNESes arrived at Stone Creek Church is not known with any certainty, but it is surely significant that they joined the church in the same time-period. Perhaps it was purely coincidence -- and maybe he was another individual with the same name -- but among the annual tax lists for Greene County there was a certain William BARNES listed every year beginning in 1805 who remained there through 1809. It is interesting to note that William and Rebecca were received into Stone Creek Church in 1810 -- and very intriguing to remember that Burwell and/or James UPCHURCH were in Greene County during that same time-period (It must be reported, however, that while Burwell's land was associated with the Oconee River, that of William BARNES was on the Ogeechee River -- the opposite side of the county, and possibly even in present-day Taliaferro County -- so they were not near-neighbors.).

The fact that Mary UPCHURCH was enumerated in the household of William BARNES implies that she must have had a connection, and one of the usual -- the one postulated here -- is that she was the mother of either William or Rebecca.

William could only have been Burwell's half-brother, but Rebecca might have been a full-sister except that this would mean that she had been deliberately omitted from the LWT of Burwell's grandfather. The other option -- supported by the fact that she was born 16 October 1779 (from a published record), thus older than Burwell -- is that she was a HALF-sister -- Mary's child from a prior marriage, as would William have to have been because he, too, was older (born 4 September 1774) -- and this scenario would seem to explain everything.

Since it was not at all unusual for someone to marry a widow(er) in those days, it would not be unreasonable to think that James (Jr.) might have done so. In this scenario

Mary had at least the one child, whether William or Rebecca -- probably there were others, too, considering her age -- and for the purposes of this effort we will assume that James (Sr.) did not want her or her child(ren) to eventually inherit his property in the event that Burwell did not survive (He was only two years old when his grandfather found himself in his final days -- his LWT was written only a month before being proved, so he "knew" -- and we will think it must have been clear there would probably not be full-siblings for Burwell because no provisions were made for any.). The thought that perhaps James (Sr.) had "bad feelings" for James (Jr.) is a possibility, but why was he then named as one of the executors?

For the further interest of the reader it will be mentioned now that Burwell's household of 1830 (Wilcox County, AL) did not include an older female, but that of William BARNES (Twiggs County, GA) did -- as it did also in 1840 (Talbot County, GA) and, of course, in 1850. For some reason Mary returned to Georgia after 1823 and before 1830. Burwell's wife died in early 1831, so perhaps she had become ill and Mary didn't want to (or couldn't) deal with it (by then Burwell's oldest were teenagers and would've been able to manage the household), and went to live with the BARNESes. This writer sees no problem for a 75ish woman travelling a few hundred miles, even in those days (She couldn't have been all that "frail" to have lived to be 100.), since Burwell seems to have been sufficiently well-off (He had one of the first carriages where they lived.) in order to have afforded her some of the better transportation available for the times, and the BARNES family had resources, too, judging by the extent of their slave-holding.

Operating on the above assumption in re Mary this writer spent some time going through the records of Brunswick County, VA, looking for qualified widows who could have married Burwell's father, but found no obvious candidates. It could have been, however, that she was from an adjacent county.

Additionally, there is the possibility of tracing the BARNES descendants down to present-day families -- hoping to find someone who "knows" something (This procedure seems to fail more often than not, in the experience of this writer, but may be one of the very few avenues of attack.). William BARNES died in Talbot County, GA, where his probate indicates there was an extensive array of descendants -- some of whom surely must have left adequate tracks for for such a project.

This is a portion of a 5 Page Narrative Juanita prepared re her Upchurch heritage. She uses the spelling BURRELL rather than BURWELL U as the former was used in later generations in her part of the family

Burrell was an only child and is our great-great-grandfather. Burrell had moved to Franklin county, N.C. where he was living when he sold the land he inherited from his grandfather James III. He was about twenty-one years at this time. It is not known whether James IV was dead at this time or why Burrell was able to sell the land. After selling the land, Burrell moved to Georgia. The annual tax lists doe Greene county, GA for years 1805-1810 shows that Burrell paid taxes on land in Greene county, GA. A James Upchurch was there in the years 1806-1810. In Oct. 1809, Burrell sold a tract of land in Greene co. In Sept. 1810 he conveyed another tract of land in Greene co. east of the Oconee River while paying taxes on land in Wilkerson county, east of Macon. Twiggs county was cut out of Wilkerson county, so it may have been in the general area of Stone Creek Baptist Church. The church was in Twiggs county.

A William and Rebecca Barnes and a Mary Upchurch lived in Greene county on the west side of the Ogeechee River. Stone Creek Baptist Church records show the following were received into membership on dates indicated:

It is unknown when Ellender Riley and Burrell Upchurch were married. Their child, Harriet was born 7 Mar 1813.

Stone Creek Baptist Church issued a letter of dismissal on Nov. 21, 1815 to Ellender Upchurch. This may have been the the time Burrell was getting ready to move to MS. Records indicate he was in Perry county, MS in 1817.

It is interesting to note that Mary Upchurch who lived with the Barnes moved with Burrell and Ellender to MS and on to AL. After Ellender Upchurch died, Mary Upchurch returned to Twiggs county, AL to live with the Barnes. Mary Upchurch died at the age of 100. There was some connection between the Barnes, Mary Upchurch and Burrell Upchurch.

Records show that Burrell and family were in Clark county AL in 1829, likely in the vicinity of present day Bashi in the northern part of Clark county. In an article "Clark County and Surroundings AL", by Rev. T.H. Ball writes, "Among the Lime Hills in Bashi or Loftin neighborhood the first family carriage was introduced in 1830. In this, Mrs. Upchurch and her two daughters were accustomed to ride when going to make visits or attend church."

Ellender Upchurch dies 2 Feb 1831. A grave with a headstone marked with E. Upchurch is located in the woods on the old Tompink Place now owned by Mrs. Sullivan Sheehan, at Atkinson, AL, about a mile and a half from the Wilcox county line. It is assumed to be Ellender's grave.

Burrell bought and sold land in Wilcox, Marengo, Sumter, and Chactaw counties. Records have not been found that show he owned land in Clark county. One must take into account that the large, older counties were divided to make new, smaller counties. Burrell was a mover, going from NC to GA, to MS, and to AL. His children were movers also, some going to TX and back east, some to GA. Burrell's children that moved to TX settled in Grimes county. Burrell died 31 Dec 1847.

② On 30 SEP 2002 RPA processed a packet of information held^① for 5-15 years under the name of Robert E. Lee U, II. Included in the packet were four letters penned by R E L U, II dated 15 DEC 1966, 31 OCT 1967, 14 FEB 1969 & 25 OCT 1969 - the first 3 to Ray NMN White, Jr and the 4th to Mrs Albert L. Fisher - a researcher for hire in Decatur, GA.

A scan of the 4 letters reveal that most of the questions & answers have long ago been resolved in my record system or are not relevant. Hence the letters will not be extended line by line. Most of the emphasis in the 4 letters concerns BORWELL U and his children. The letters are therefore being placed in the Biopile of Borwell U Entry date 30 SEP 2002 under cover of this sheet. This sheet is also being crossfiled under Ray NMN White, Jr, Robert E. Lee U, II, Albert L. Fisher (MRS)

December 19, 1966

Dear Mr. White:

I was glad to get the census data that I received from you today. Maybe we are about to "get somewhere".

I have talked with Mr. W. E. Barkley, a gentleman of about 80 who has lived almost all of his life within a mile of the Moses and Miles Upchurch homesteads (they adjoin). I asked him if he had ever known Will Upchurch (1866-1943). He said he had. I then (very warily) asked him if he had known Will's father, James. He said he had not. But then he added, "I have always been told that your father (R.E.L.) had two half brothers-- James, Jim they called him, and Oliver" !!!! Therefore, this places your "James" as the son of Moses. After searching my mind further, I seem to recall that when I met Mack Upchurch, the father of the man you visited, he told me that his grandfather and my father were half brothers. Anyhow, based on Mr. Barkley's statement, which was given without prompting of any kind, I am willing to accept James as the son of Moses.

Nancy had several sisters who lived near Bedias. One was named Lucindia and she was married to a man named McGilberry. I called one of her grand-sons and he said that his grand-parents came from Alabama to Texas in '54, but he didn't know where in Alabama they came from, but would try to find out.

In my talk with Mr. Barkley, he stated that during World War I, he was in Ennis, Texas for induction. A man by the name of Upchurch was called. He said he paid particular attention to this man because he was the spitting image of my uncle Joe. Mr. Barkley said he asked him if he were related to the Grimes County Upchurches. He said he didn't know but that his father was near by and they could ask him. The father said that he didn't know any of the Grimes County bunch, but that he had had two uncles named Moses and Miles that had settled in Grimes County. He said this man also mentioned having an uncle in Red River County. It seems that the Ellis County Upchurch lived at Ferris. Based on the information furnished by Mr. Barkley, my uncle Milton and this man corresponded for quite a while.

Mr. Barkley knew nothing further about the children of James except that he thought Virgil moved to Marlin. He was very interested, though, in your White relatives as he thought possibly you were the grand-son of Arch White and he is related some how to the Whites.

As to the matter of Moses having been born in Tennessee, I lend it no particular credence. My wife is a member of the Mormon Church and is, as are most Mormons, very interested in genealogy. One day about two years ago she went to see R. A. Isbell, son of Martha Paralee Upchurch. He was 85 at the time and has since passed on. He gave her the names of the children of Moses and Nancy and the names of a good many of the children's children. He said that Moses was born in Tennessee, but I now think he simply had a lapse of memory as I had never heard Tennessee before, and the overwhelming weight of evidence is that he was born in Georgia and came to Texas from Alabama. Anyhow, I am going to correct my information to show the birthplace as Georgia.

I asked Mr. Barkley if he had ever heard of Moses being a musician. "Oh, yes", he said. "He was a great song leader and was known as Professor Upchurch". I have myself heard people talk about my father and my uncles being singers.

I was in the Court House in Anderson today and made a cursory search of the records. I found the marriage license of James and Elizabeth issued on 11/29/56. I examined the death certificate of J. W. (1866-1953) and it states that he was born to James and Elizabeth on 2.10.66 in Madison County, Texas.

I turned up one thing that might or might not be significant. Moses bought his land from a man named Alfred Williams by deed dated 4.10.57. This deed was notarized in Wake County, N. C. Alfred Williams acquired the land from his father, Jesse J. Williams, by deed dated 5.5.49. The acknowledgment on this instrument is as follows: State of Alabama §

County of Maringo § I, Jesse J. Williams of Choctaw County, Alabama.

Do you suppose your "James" was named after these people? I believe you stated that some of your connection contended that the original James was James W. rather than James M. Perhaps an error has been made in transcribing the census record with a "W" being mistaken for an "M". Seems a natural error. If you can check the census records for Madison County, Texas for 1870 you might clear this up. Too, Lucretia could have been a Williams. Perhaps it was a family name.

④

I found that Miles bought his first land on 9.19.53. I had always thought they came to Texas together. If so, why did Moses wait 4 years to buy land? Of course, there could be all sorts of explanations one of which could be that they didn't come together, and that Moses arrived after Miles did.

I turned up one other curious thing. By deed dated 10.21.57, one Jordan Upchurch conveyed a tract of land. He was not joined by a wife, so I assume he was single. He would had to have been at least 21 unless his disabilities of coverture had been removed--an unlikely circumstance--so who was he? And how did he fit in? I didn't have time to trace title to the land into Jordan. Perhaps that would provide a clue. I found, however, that my uncle, Milton Ernest, named one of his sons Walter Jordan. After this relative?

The only other thing I learned was that Oliver, who is listed variously as Oliver, O. P. and O. H. P. was married twice. To Mary A. Sealy (last name illegible) on 11.18.66 and to Nettie McDaniel on 12/31/90. I don't know which of these marriages produced the Moses who is the father of the "Buck" you met.

The trouble with tracing family history is that we become interested too late. I know people who were living 30 years ago who could have provided all the answers we are looking for. But they are now gone. The only children of Moses and Nancy that


I knew were Milton Ernest and Martha Paralee. Aunt Texana lived until 1945 but they resided at Santa Anna, Texas and I never met her; however, I do know one of her daughters real well, and she might know something. Uncle John Bunion moved to West Texas and all contact has been lost with them. The Milton Wheelers moved to Odem, Texas years ago and haven't been heard from since.

My father, (R. E. L.) was born in 1861. He married Miss Willie Harrison in 1890 and she died in the same year. He was single until 1918 when he married my mother who was 30 years his junior. I was born in 1922 when he was 61 years old. So you see, all of my Upchurch uncles and aunts and most of my first cousins have passed on. My father died when I was an infant and I never knew him.

I will continue to make inquiries and to check the Court House records of surrounding counties and Grimes County in an effort to turn up something useful, and if you find anything of interest, I will appreciate having it.

P. S.: I talked with the great-granddaughter of Miles that I mentioned in my first letter and asked her if she ever heard that my father had a half brother other than Oliver. She said, "Yes, Grandma always called him Jim."

Dear Roy:

No doubt about it! I have to hand it to you! I don't see how in the world you covered so many courthouses and gathered so much poop in so little time. I thought I was pretty well experienced in going through records, but I can't hold a candle to you.

I'm glad you didn't go out of your way to make Perry County, Miss. The effort would have been disappointing. In the Miss. section at the library there is a book showing what records are available at the various courthouses in that State, and, according to the book, Perry County had a fire in the 1880's and everything they had was lost.

I am inclined to agree that Sumter County may hold the key to Burwell/Berwell/Burrell. On one of my forays in Houston library (I'm sure I told you about this), I found in Sumter County Records, p. 86 that Moses patented Section 6, Range 3 W., Township 16 in 1836 and Burwell patented an adjoining tract. I think there would be no doubt that this would be our Moses. Uncle B. M. who in 1836 was 15 would have been, it seems to me, too young to be involved in a real estate transaction. It also seems to me to be unlikely that these two Upchurches, Moses and Burwell, since they patented adjoining tracts, were not at the very least well acquainted. More than likely this Burwell was old "Barrels" of Perry County. Moreover, the aforementioned reference, p. 67, states that Burwell was on the Sumter County poll list for March 3, 1834. If the polling place was named, I didn't make a note of it. Of course, ^{am} he would have had to have been a resident to be on the poll list. I'm glad to learn that Sumter County has so much data available. Two of my other lines were pioneer residents of that County, and I have found library references on Sumter County to be rather sparse. I have looked thru the 1840 census of Sumter County but didn't see any Upchurches. Hope you have better luck.

I have given a great deal of thought to the matter of the names Burwell, Berwell, Burrell. If you pronounce Burwell/Berwell as having two syllables with accent on the first, you very easily come up with Burrell. If you assume that these old boys were unlettered (if not illiterate), then it is easy to understand why the recorder put the name down as it sounded to him which would account for the variations in spelling. I believe that in the end Burwell will turn out to be Moses' father. In one of Mrs. Tidd's letters she states, "On the summary I sent you will be found the name Burwell in Greene Co., Ga. in 1809 or 1810. Yesterday I found out that he was the son of James Upchurch of Brunswick Co., Va., and the grandson of James Upchurch in whose will he was named 24 June 1784."

Another of her letters poses a curious possibility: "Oliver Upchurch married Amanda Gay 14 December 1857." She doesn't say where. Our Oliver in 1857 would be 19--of marriageable age. His marriages that we know of were in '66, '81 & '90. In '66 he was 28--rather late for a first marriage if he were predisposed toward that estate. Do you suppose the ole coot could have snuk another in on us? However, a marriage to Amanda would not have been possible or at least very improbable ~~remote~~ if he came to Texas with Moses in the early 50's. But actually we don't know that he did. We just know that he was here in 1860. His initials were O. H. P., and I have long wondered what the "H" & "P" stood for. Buck Upch says that Oliver was in the Civil War as he remembers seeing a picture of him in his uniform. Perhaps a copy of his military record would give this information.

Mrs. Tidd further states, "Another name that comes up is Burwell. Burwell Perry (a possibility of the "P" in O.H. P.?) was a witness to the will of Thomas Gay 1784
Burwell Bell sold land to Wm C. Upchurch
Burwell Bell bought land from Buckner Upchurch
Burwell Upchurch sold land in Greene Co., Ga. in 1809."


If the Burwell of Green Co., ~~Ala.~~ Ga., ~~was~~ the Barrel/s of Perry Co., Miss. and the Burwell of various locations in Ala. is "ours" then, according to Mrs. Tidd, his father was James of Brunswick Co., Va. Referring to the "gun sheets" from WKU via Mrs. Sullivan, I find the James Mrs. Tidd mentions as being from Brunswick Co. But she confuses me thoroughly when she states that he (Burwell) was the grandson of James in whose will he was named 24 June 1784. Of course this could be a case of James Sr. & James Jr., but the time element doesn't fit. I hope she means he is a grandson of John, Surry Co., Va. 1721. I wish she would respond to your letter. I believe she could be of real help.

Incidentally, I want to compliment you on your letter to Mrs. Tidd. It was a ~~particularly well written letter~~ particularly well written letter. I know good writing when I see it!

I certainly appreciate your taking the time to check Wilcox Co. for ~~Larys~~ Larys. Since the name "Daniel" appears so many times, I think these must be Grandmother Nancy's folks. Grandmother Nancy had a sister, Patricia, who married a Hale. ~~W~~ She had a son, Daniel, who ~~like~~ died about 10 years ago at age 90 odd. Daniel Hale was probably named ~~from~~ Daniel Lary. There is a story in the family about Daniel Hale's father. He left the house late one evening to drive up the milk cows and hasn't been heard from since. Took French leave, I guess.

When you were here last week we had gone to Bryan to keep an orthodontist appointment. We had been home about 15 minutes when my mother called and said you had just left her place, so we just barely missed you I'm sure. I went on down and got the material you left and stayed up until after 3:00 A.M. going thru it, and I have continued to review this matter hoping for a startling revelation but no such luck.

Dear Roy:

Yes, it appears that the two older boys, OHP & James may have come over with BM. If so, I'd bet that Moses and Nancy & dear Delia all came with the McGilberry family in '58.

I caught on to the signature deal several months ago. In fact I tried to set up a proof based on signature comparison. I have in my line one James Jenkins who died in Granville Co., N. C. in 1790 leaving a will. I obtained xerox of the original bearing Jenkins' signature. Then I found that one John Lynch died testate in Granville Co. in 1755 and appointed James Jenkins one of his executors and referred to him in the will as his son-in-law. If I could prove they (the two Jenkinses) were one and the same, I would then know the maiden of my James' wife. So I sent off for copies of all of the Lynch estate papers. Turned out that the Jenkins appointed executor refused to serve and resigned, so he never signed anything. A big disappointment. In a South Carolina case, I obtained several signatures for comparison. They had similarities and also dis-similarities, so I could never make up my mind whether they were all signatures of the same person.

My off-hand recollection is that when I went through the microfilm deed and will records for Franklin Co., N. C. I found no conveyances into or out of Burwell. But they might have something in Brunswick Co., Va. I do think the idea well worth pursuing.

I have promised my kids that when school is out, I will take them to Williamsburg. We went there in '64 en route to New York and the girls fell in love with the place. The older one will graduate from high school in a couple of years and wants to go to the College of William and Mary there. She has no chance whatever of getting in. Last year out of 3000 applications from out of state women they accepted 129. Never-the-less, they want to look the place over again. If the trip materializes, it will give me an opportunity ^{for} some forays into the countryside in Va. & N. C.

Several weeks ago, while in the library in Houston, I got into conversation with one of the librarians. In the course of our talk she said she went to Salt Lake about once a year to use their library. I asked her that if she had a choice of going to the old eastern states and examining the original records or going to Salt Lake which she would elect. She said she would choose Salt Lake without hesitation because the scope of their facilities was so vast (500 microfilm readers). By way of example she said one of their best loved patrons in Houston saved her money for years to make a trip to Ireland. In Ireland she was told she should have gone to Salt Lake since they (in S.I.) had everything ^{that was} available in Ireland and the material was organized. In Ireland it wasn't. She said the Church (she implied she was Mormon) was prohibited by contract in Delaware, South Carolina and Georgia from selling any microfilm records from those states, but that the Church got around this prohibition by establishing branch libraries around over the country. The most astounding bit of poop she related was that by April of this year the Saints will have all of their microfilm records computerized. It seems you punch in the name and all pertinent information available on the person you wish researched, and there come out everything on him in their entire microfilm records. Isn't that fantastic?

You mentioned the system they have in Dallas for census records, and were so kind to offer to check names for me. If you ever have a spare moment, I would like to impose on you to look for a name: Elizabeth M. Owens. She was born in S. C. in 1792 and died and is buried in Pickens Co., Ala. She died in 1882. I have found her in the 1850 - 60 - 70 censuses of Pickens Co., but have never been able to locate her in 1880, and I am interested in seeing who she was living with at that time. In 1870 she was living alone next door to John T. Bonner/ & family. Bonner's first wife (died 1852) was EMO's daughter. This ole girl was a great, great grandmother of mine.

Dear Mrs. Fisher:

I am attempting to trace my ancestor, Burwell Upchurch, thru Georgia. I will tell you everything I know about him, not for the purpose of burdening you with a lot of miscellaneous detail but in hopes that you may see in these data some clue that will point the way to answers for my questions.

To begin with his name was consistently spelled "Burwell", but later variations arose: Berwell, Burrell, Burl and others. Apparently he was literate since I have never found an instance where he signed by mark.

Burwell was born in Brunswick County, Virginia about 1780-81, the son of James Upchurch, Jr. He was mentioned in the will of his grandfather, James Upchurch, Sr. This will was proved in Brunswick Co. court 25 May 1784 (Brunswick Co. Will Book 2, Page 348). Among the provisions of the will, "I land unto my son James Upchurch all my land that lies After the death of my son James Upchurch I give unto my grandson Burwell Upchurch all the lands just before lent to my son James Upchurch. . .". "I lend to my son James Upchurch one Negro Boy named Hall during his natural life. I give unto my grandson Burwell Upchurch after death of my son James Upchurch Negro boy named Hall . . .".

By deed dated 12 May 1803 Burwell sold the land left him by his grandfather. The deed recited that he, Burwell, was a resident of Franklin County, North Carolina. I have guessed that the land was sold soon after he became 21.

The next record I have of Burwell is in Greene County, Georgia where he sold land in 1809 and 1810 (copy of deeds enclosed). I have looked at the Greene County Deed Indexes on microfilm, and there is no record in the indexes of his having bought land there. There is only the record of the sale. I don't know whether or not the tracts sold were contiguous or even if the land sold was all he owned.

I do know that he was in Georgia as late as 1816. My grandfather, Moses Upchurch (son of Burwell), was born in that year, and in the census records he always said he was born in Georgia. Burwell's first child was born in Georgia about 1813. In the 1880 census Moses Upch stated that his mother was born in Georgia. If so, it seems probable that she and Burwell married in Georgia.

In the 1820 census Burwell was in Perry Co., Miss.; in 1830 in Wilcox Co., Ala.; in 1840 unlocated. He died in Sumter Co., Ala. in 1847 where administration was taken out on his estate. His wife is believed to have died in 1831, and I believe her name was Elizabeth.

There were several Upchurch families in Georgia in the early 1800's, and they all came from the North Carolina counties adjoining Virginia. Most likely they were all related in one way or another. Burwell was probably related to them too, but I don't know how. He had no brothers and his two uncles never went to Georgia. Presumably his father died before the land in Virginia was sold. So far as is now known only one Upchurch emigrated to America (ca. 1650), and we're all supposed to be his descendents.

My request of you is to try to determine when Burwell arrived in Georgia, when he left and where he was during his stay there. And also look for a record of his marriage.

I am enclosing my check for \$64 for two day's research, and I will appreciate it if you will, when that time is spent, report what, if anything, you have been able to find.


