Albert Vance Medlin Jr., 68, of Brunswick, Ga., died Monday, Oct. 12, after an extended illness. A memorial service to celebrate his life was held Friday, Oct. 16, at Northside Baptist Church in Brunswick, where he was a member.

Born in Wake County on Sept. 16,

1930, he was a native of Zebulon, and the son of the late Albert V. Medlin Sr. and Mamie Lee Medlin. He enlisted in the U.S. Air Force at the age of 18, serving most of his tour in Japan until he was called home upon the death of his mother. Later, he resumed his military career in the Air National Guard, serving twice as the commander of the 224th Air National Guard unit on St. Simons Island and in Brunswick, Ga., retiring in 1990 at the rank of lieutenant colonel.

He attended Campbell University and East Carolina University where he received his bachelor of science degree and a master's in education. He married Patricia Browder of Virginia Beach, Va., on June 1, 1952, and in 1954 they moved to Glynn County, Ga., where he taught in the public school system for a number of years. After this, he went into business for himself and opened Glynn Stationers Office Supply on St. Simons Island and in Brunswick, Ga. He played a principal role in the organization and establishment of Frederica Academy and served as the school's first headmaster. He served on numerous committees in his community.

Surviving in addition to his wife: daughter, Gayle M. Baker and her husband, Jess, of St. Simons Island, Ga.; sons, Albert V. Medlin III and his wife, Dottie, of Brunswick, Ga., Marc A. Medlin and Ellen of St. Simons Island, Ga.; four granddaughters; sister, Edythe M. Tippett of Zebulon; brother and sister-in-law, Dale and Delena Browder of Virginia Beach, Va.; several nieces and nephews.

On November 26, 1814, a marriage bond was issued in Wake County for John Medlin and Polly Thompson, with James Hicks as bondsman.

For the tax year 1815 in Franklin County, William Medlin was listed in Captain Tyrrell's District and listed in Captain Gay's District were Matthew, Willie, and James Medlin.

In 1816, a marriage bond is issued in Franklin County for Lewis Medlin and Welthy Young, with Littleton Medlin as bondsman and N. Long as witness.

On January 28, 1819 in Franklin County, Littleton Medlin and Aldridge Medlin were listed as buyers at the estate sale of Robert Young.

On December 30, 1819 in Chatham County, a marriage bond was issued to Harrison Medlin and Susan Jones, with Harvey Swift as bondsman.

By 1820, Bryant Medlin (Jr.) had migrated west to Anson County, North Carolina.

In the Federal census of 1820, Bryant Medlin (Medley) was listed in Anson County as being between age 26 and 45, with a wife between age 26 and 45, with 6 boys and 3 girls. Two boys were listed between age 10 and 16, one of which could have been Nathaniel Medlin.

On August 22, 1821, a marriage bond was issued in Franklin County for Gray Medlin and Melinda Cooley, with Littleton Medlin as bondsman and Williamson Gatewood as witness.

On September 12, 1821, a marriage bond was issued in Franklin County for Shaw Medlin and Mary Broadway, with Arthur Williams as bondsman and N. Patterson as witness.

Around 1822, Bryant Medlin, Sr. began a long journey from Wayne County, North Carolina searching for his children who had moved west, some he believed as far as Kentucky and Tennessee. He stopped in Stokes County, North Carolina in 1823, too infirm to continue his journey.

Also listed as the head of a Medlin family in North Carolina in the 1830 Federal census were Ave, Burgess, Gilley, Mary, Temperance, Wealthy, and William Medlin in Franklin County; Allen, Hartwell, Cader, Kinchen, Shadrach, Willie, and Winston Medlin in Wake County; Drury and Johnson Medlin in Johnston County; Green Medlin in Nash County; John and Thomas Medlin in Halifax County; Archibald, Charles, and William Medlin in Moore County; Benjamin Medlin in Randolph County; Harrison Medlin in Guilford County; John Medlin was listed in Anson County; and Martha Medlin in Lenoir County.

In August 1832, Shadrach Medlin testified in Wake County Court on behalf of William Wilder who applied for and received a pension for his service as a Revolutionary War soldier.

In 1833, Bryant Medlin applied for and was granted a pension from the Federal government for his military service. According to his pension application, Bryant Medlin (Medling) (Medleng) (Meddlin) (Medley) was born in Dinwiddie County, Virginia around 1748 and his father moved the family to North Carolina around 1753. Bryant Medlin, Sr. died an invalid in 1833 in Stokes County at approximate age 84. His will left his pension and all his property to his wife, Anna Wilder, who is believed to be from Johnston County.

Page 16 On May 22, 1804, a marriage bond was issued in Wake County for Willis Medlin and Abby Ellis, with Jesse Mitchell as bondsman and Woodson Clement as witness.

In August 1804 in Wake County Court, William Medlin was ordered exempt from future poll tax.

In December 1805, the will of Benjamin Medlin of Wake County was probated, naming his wife Charity, his son Thomas, and his daughters Patsey and Fanny.

On September 10, 1806, a marriage bond was issued in Johnston County for Alfred Medlin and Addie Smith, with William Johnson as bondsman and R. Sanders as witness.

William Owen Medlin (Sr.) must have died around 1806 in Johnston County, North Carolina.

On February 23, 1807, in Johnston County Court, the following orphan children of William and Priscilla Medlin were ordered to be bound to apprenticeship to Nathaniel Hood: Winsor Medlin, age 18; Feriby Medlin, age 16; and Polly Medlin, age 14.

On March 11, 1807, Michael Medlin issued his will which was proved in Chatham County Court in August 1807, naming his wife Mary and his son John, who was under twenty one years old.

On June 24, 1808, a marriage bond was issued in Johnston County for Burgess Medlin and Susan Lynch, with Johnson Busbee as bondsman and Keren Sanders as witness.

On November 30, 1808, in Johnston County Court, William Medlin and John Medlin were listed as insolvents, each owing one poll tax for 1807.

On January 10, 1809, a marriage bond was issued in Wake County for Burgess Medlin and Winnifred Goodson, with Cader Medlin as bondsman and S. Turner as witness.

On November 29, 1809, in Johnston County Court, William Medlin was listed as insolvent, owing one poll tax for 1808.

Page 17 On July 13, 1810, a marriage bond was issued in Johnston County to Willie Medlin and Tempy Lunce, with Williamson as bondsman and G. Hill, Jr. as witness.

On December 5, 1811, a marriage bond was issued in Franklin County to Joel Medlin and Alsey Stanmire, with Joseph Young as bondsman and G. Hill, Jr. as witness.

In the 1811 tax list for Franklin County, John Medlin is listed along with Christopher Foster, Kinchen Boon, Daniel Foster, Bennet Duke, Green Hill, William Williams, John Perry, Samuel Young, and Simon Jeffreys, Jr.

On June 20, 1813, William Owen Medlin (Jr.) died around Pendleton, South Carolina.

In the War of 1812 with England, James Medlin served in the Fourth Regiment of the Detached Militia from Franklin County called into service at Norfolk in September 1814. Kinchen Medlin was enlisted in the First Company, Artillery, detached from the Wake Regiment. Alexander Medlin and John Medlin were enlisted in the Sixth Company, detached from the Moore Regiment.

**CARPENTER (CHARPENTER), Abigail vs. James CARPENTER (CHARPENTER)**  
 Divorce granted during spring term of court, 1857, and custody of the "infant children" was granted to Pl. A copy of the marriage bond of James CARPENTER and Abigail (*sic*) SUGG, both of Wake Co., dated 9 June 1828, is included in this file. Alfred MEDLIN was bondsman. On 27 March 1857 Alfred MEDLIN deposed that "I am about 57 years old, have resided most of my life (all save about 3 years) in Wake Co. I was present at the marriage of James CARPENTER and Abigail CARPENTER... They were married by Jonathan STEPHENS," a Baptist preacher. Mr. MEDLIN attested that he considered James CARPENTER "a man of great violence, especially toward his wife," and cited several violent incidents. Frances WARREN deposed that she had known Abigail CARPENTER since her birth. She stated that Mr. and Mrs. CARPENTER separated occasionally because of his abusive behavior toward his wife, but that Abigail had previously returned to him each time. A third deponent, Mary FORD, stated that she was about 24 years old and was a daughter of James and Abigail CARPENTER. She too testified to her parents' frequent separations due to her father's abusive behavior. She also stated that she had seen her father beat the younger children in the family. She indicated that he drank heavily and was abusive at those times but also had a violent temper and would beat and injure others even when sober. Robert FORD deposed that he was 32 years old, and he attested to the same statements as other deponents. Jane ROGERS, another daughter of James and Abigail CARPENTER, made essentially the same statements, saying she thought her mother stayed with her father because he would promise to change his behavior and also out of concern for the younger children. Others summoned to give evidence were John SMITH, Noah RHODES, Archibald DRAKE, Wm. THOMPSON, Wm. PUTNEY, and Caroline FANN, (wife of Edward FANN). Fanny WARREN's summons indicated that she was the wife of Bidly or Ridly WARREN.

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On December 5, 1811, a marriage bond was issued in Franklin County to Joel Medlin and Alsey Stanmire, with Joseph Young as bondsman and G. Hill, Jr. as witness.

In the 1811 tax list for Franklin County, John Medlin is listed along with Christopher Foster, Kinchen Boon, Daniel Foster, Bennet Duke, Green Hill, William Williams, John Perry, Samuel Young, and Simon Jeffreys, Jr.

On June 20, 1813, William Owen Medlin (Jr.) died around Pendleton, South Carolina.

In the War of 1812 with England, James Medlin served in the Fourth Regiment of the Detached Militia from Franklin County called into service at Norfolk in September 1814. Kinchen Medlin was enlisted in the First Company, Artillery, detached from the Wake Regiment. Alexander Medlin and John Medlin were enlisted in the Sixth Company, detached from the Moore Regiment.

On November 26, 1814, a marriage bond was issued in Wake County for John Medlin and Polly Thompson, with James Hicks as bondsman.

For the tax year 1815 in Franklin County, William Medlin was listed in Captain Tyrrell's District and listed in Captain Gay's District were Matthew, Willie, and James Medlin.

In 1816, a marriage bond is issued in Franklin County for Lewis Medlin and Welthy Young, with Littleton Medlin as bondsman and N. Long as witness.

On January 28, 1819 in Franklin County, Littleton Medlin and Aldridge Medlin were listed as buyers at the estate sale of Robert Young.

On December 30, 1819 in Chatham County, a marriage bond was issued to Harrison Medlin and Susan Jones, with Harvey Swift as bondsman.

By 1820, Bryant Medlin (Jr.) had migrated west to Anson County, North Carolina.

In the Federal census of 1820, Bryant Medlin (Medley) was listed in Anson County as being between age 26 and 45, with a wife between age 26 and 45, with 6 boys and 3 girls. Two boys were listed between age 10 and 16, one of which could have been Nathaniel Medlin.

On August 22, 1821, a marriage bond was issued in Franklin County for Gray Medlin and Melinda Cooley, with Littleton Medlin as bondsman and Williamson Gatewood as witness.

On September 12, 1821, a marriage bond was issued in Franklin County for Shaw Medlin and Mary Broadway, with Arthur Williams as bondsman and N. Patterson as witness.

Around 1822, Bryant Medlin, Sr. began a long journey from Wayne County, North Carolina searching for his children who had moved west, some he believed as far as Kentucky and Tennessee. He stopped in Stokes County, North Carolina in 1823, too infirm to continue his journey.

Also listed as the head of a Medlin family in North Carolina in the 1830 Federal census were Ave, Burgess, Gilley, Mary, Temperance, Wealthy, and William Medlin in Franklin County; Allen, Hartwell, Cader, Kinchen, Shadrach, Willie, and Winston Medlin in Wake County; Drury and Johnson Medlin in Johnston County; Green Medlin in Nash County; John and Thomas Medlin in Halifax County; Archibald, Charles, and William Medlin in Moore County; Benjamin Medlin in Randolph County; Harrison Medlin in Guilford County; John Medlin was listed in Anson County; and Martha Medlin in Lenoir County.

In August 1832, Shadrach Medlin testified in Wake County Court on behalf of William Wilder who applied for and received a pension for his service as a Revolutionary War soldier.

In 1833, Bryant Medlin applied for and was granted a pension from the Federal government for his military service. According to his pension application, Bryant Medlin (Medling) (Medleng) (Meddlin) (Medley) was born in Dinwiddie County, Virginia around 1748 and his father moved the family to North Carolina around 1753. Bryant Medlin, Sr. died an invalid in 1833 in Stokes County at approximate age 84. His will left his pension and all his property to his wife, Anna Wilder, who is believed to be from Johnston County.

Jesse owned in excess of 1000 acres of land in Wake and Franklin counties of North Carolina. Most of his property lay along the Moccasin Creek that divided those counties.

In addition, Alfred received 31 more acres in that same area that was his share of what his brother Jesse Walker Bunn would have received from his mother had he been living at the time of the division.

Notes for JESSE WALKER BUNN:

Jesse Walker Bunn served in the War of 1812. His military records indicate that he was only 15 years old when he was enlisted into the 43rd US Infantry in North Carolina by Lieut. Combs for a period of 5 years on April 18, 1814. The records further indicate that he had blue eyes, light hair, and a fair complexion and that he was born in Wake County, NC. While on duty, Jesse was at Camp Federal Point, Camp Greenfield and was confined at Fort Hampton for desertion. Last entry indicates that he was "learning music." This documentation can be found at the Olivia Raney Library, Raleigh, NC on microfilm #233 titled US Army Register of Enlistments 1798-May 17, 1815, Vol. 3, page 93.

△ Jesse Walker Bunn acquired land in Wake County, NC, from John Hopkins on 13 Jan 1818. However he did not live long enough to received land from his father who had left 850 acres (p. 384, Record Book 12, Wake Co., NC) to his wife Levinia that was to be divided among his children at her death. Apparently Jesse Walker Bunn died prior to 1826 since in the division of that land in 1826 after the death of Levinia (p. 69, Record Book 7, Wake Co., NC) his share was divided among his surviving siblings.

## Robert (Robin) Chamblee

### Little River District, Bertie and Wake Counties, North Carolina

Robert was probably born ca. 1738. His first land transaction was in 1759 in Bertie Co, Nc. Robert most likely married Esther Warren, daughter of Benjamin Warren, Sr.. of Bertie County, NC. There is one single reference to Robert and Hester (Esther) Chamblee together in court records. Esther Chamblee is listed as a member of the Poplar Springs Baptist Church in Franklin Co, NC. In 1744, Bertie Co, NC, Benjamin Warren proved his rights and listed his wife, Esther and others: James, Benjamin, Margaret, Mary Patience, William and Esther Warren.

I went back to the site and it was no longer up and running. To make a long story short, after weeks and weeks of searching, I was able to contact her and get the exact location of the small cemetery where ARABELL/ARABELLA UPCHURCH is buried. The directions are as follows: **Follow Harnett Central Road past the high school toward Mathews Mill Pond Road, the cemetery is before the last house on the right. There is a clump of trees not far from the road and the very small cemetery is located there. It is covered with brambles and advises that a woman not go there alone because of snakes, etc.**

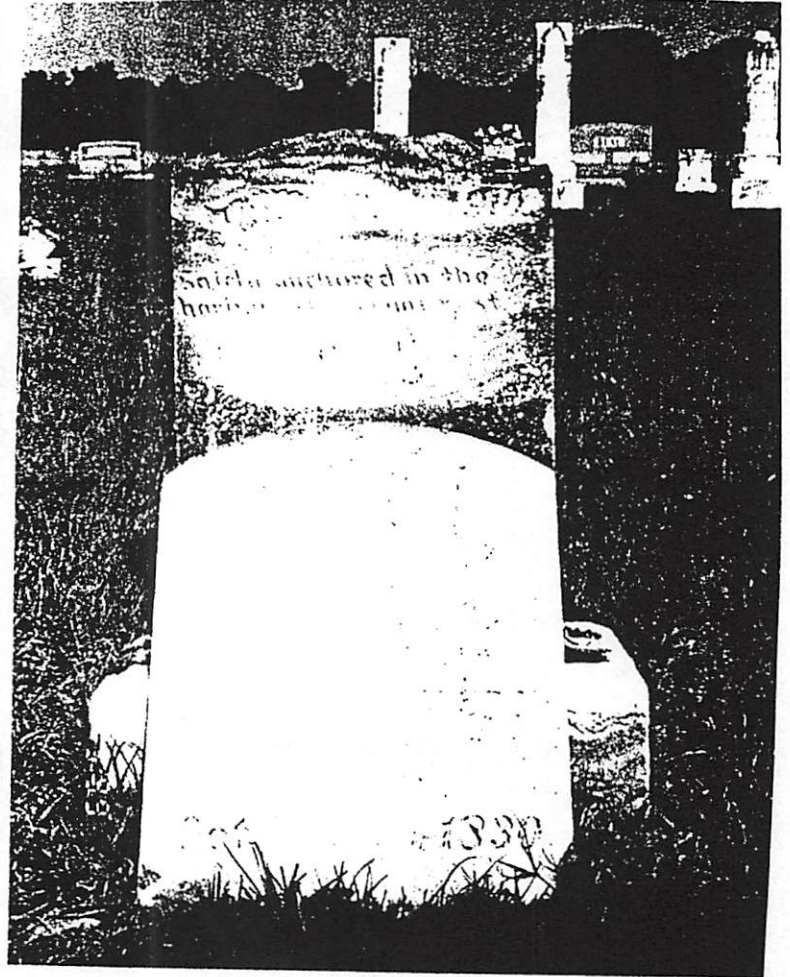

These are the directions to the small family cemetery where Arabella (Medlin) Upchurch, Benjamin's 1st wife & our 2x great grandmother is buried. I need to warn you that the people that found this sight are not "locals" and I have tried to get more exact directions from contacts in and around the area, but they don't seem to be sure, either.

Located on Harnett Central Road  
Angier, NC

This is from an email of June 21, 2007: "We had heard about the cemetery and persevered until we found it. If you follow Harnett Central Road past the high school toward Mathews Mill Pond Road. It is before the last house on the right. There is copse of trees not far from the road and the very small cemetery is located there. My husband crawled in through some brambles and took the pictures. It is harder to find during the summer when vegetation hides it. It is in very poor condition and I don't really recommend a woman going in there and definitely not alone. The Upchurch marker is in two pieces. The one with the main information is lying on the ground"

This information as well as a picture was taken in March, 2003, so I'm not sure what condition the sight would be in today. I tried to get some interest in trying to clear the area to better preserve it, but those I contacted had other more pressing issues to deal with.

If you or anyone you know happens to venture out to locate this sight, please go prepared to do a "rubbing" of the tomb stone and share it with me. Arabella's date of death appears to be 1857 on the picture I have, but she must have died in 1867, as she appears on census records as "A. B. age 30 in 1860 and she had her last child about that same time. I feel sure that she died from childbirth complications. Arabella's mother moved into Benjamin's home after Arabella's death - I am sure to help care for 5 sons. In fact, Tempy Medlin, mother in law of Benjamin's continued to live in his household after Benjamin married his 2nd wife.

Please, if you find that Tempy Medlin/Medling is buried at the Neills Creek Cemetery, please, please take down the info and pass it on to me.

On November 26, 1814, a marriage bond was issued in Wake County for John Medlin and Polly Thompson, with James Hicks as bondsman.

For the tax year 1815 in Franklin County, William Medlin was listed in Captain Tyrrell's District and listed in Captain Gay's District were Matthew, Willie, and James Medlin.

In 1816, a marriage bond is issued in Franklin County for Lewis Medlin and Welthy Young, with Littleton Medlin as bondsman and N. Long as witness.

On January 28, 1819 in Franklin County, Littleton Medlin and Aldridge Medlin were listed as buyers at the estate sale of Robert Young.

On December 30, 1819 in Chatham County, a marriage bond was issued to Harrison Medlin and Susan Jones, with Harvey Swift as bondsman.

By 1820, Bryant Medlin (Jr.) had migrated west to Anson County, North Carolina.

In the Federal census of 1820, Bryant Medlin (Medley) was listed in Anson County as being between age 26 and 45, with a wife between age 26 and 45, with 6 boys and 3 girls. Two boys were listed between age 10 and 16, one of which could have been Nathaniel Medlin.

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On August 22, 1821, a marriage bond was issued in Franklin County for Gray Medlin and Melinda Cooley, with Littleton Medlin as bondsman and Williamson Gatewood as witness.

On September 12, 1821, a marriage bond was issued in Franklin County for Shaw Medlin and Mary Broadway, with Arthur Williams as bondsman and N. Patterson as witness.

Around 1822, Bryant Medlin, Sr. began a long journey from Wayne County, North Carolina searching for his children who had moved west, some he believed as far as Kentucky and Tennessee. He stopped in Stokes County, North Carolina in 1823, too infirm to continue his journey.

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Also listed as the head of a Medlin family in North Carolina in the 1830 Federal census were Ave, Burgess, Gilley, Mary, Temperance, Wealthy, and William Medlin in Franklin County; Allen, Hartwell, Cader, Kinchen, Shadrach, Willie, and Winston Medlin in Wake County; Drury and Johnson Medlin in Johnston County; Green Medlin in Nash County; John and Thomas Medlin in Halifax County; Archibald, Charles, and William Medlin in Moore County; Benjamin Medlin in Randolph County; Harrison Medlin in Guilford County; John Medlin was listed in Anson County; and Martha Medlin in Lenoir County.

In August 1832, Shadrach Medlin testified in Wake County Court on behalf of William Wilder who applied for and received a pension for his service as a Revolutionary War soldier.

In 1833, Bryant Medlin applied for and was granted a pension from the Federal government for his military service. According to his pension application, Bryant Medlin (Medling) (Medleng) (Meddlin) (Medley) was born in Dinwiddie County, Virginia around 1748 and his father moved the family to North Carolina around 1753. Bryant Medlin, Sr. died an invalid in 1833 in Stokes County at approximate age 84. His will left his pension and all his property to his wife, Anna Wilder, who is believed to be from Johnston County.

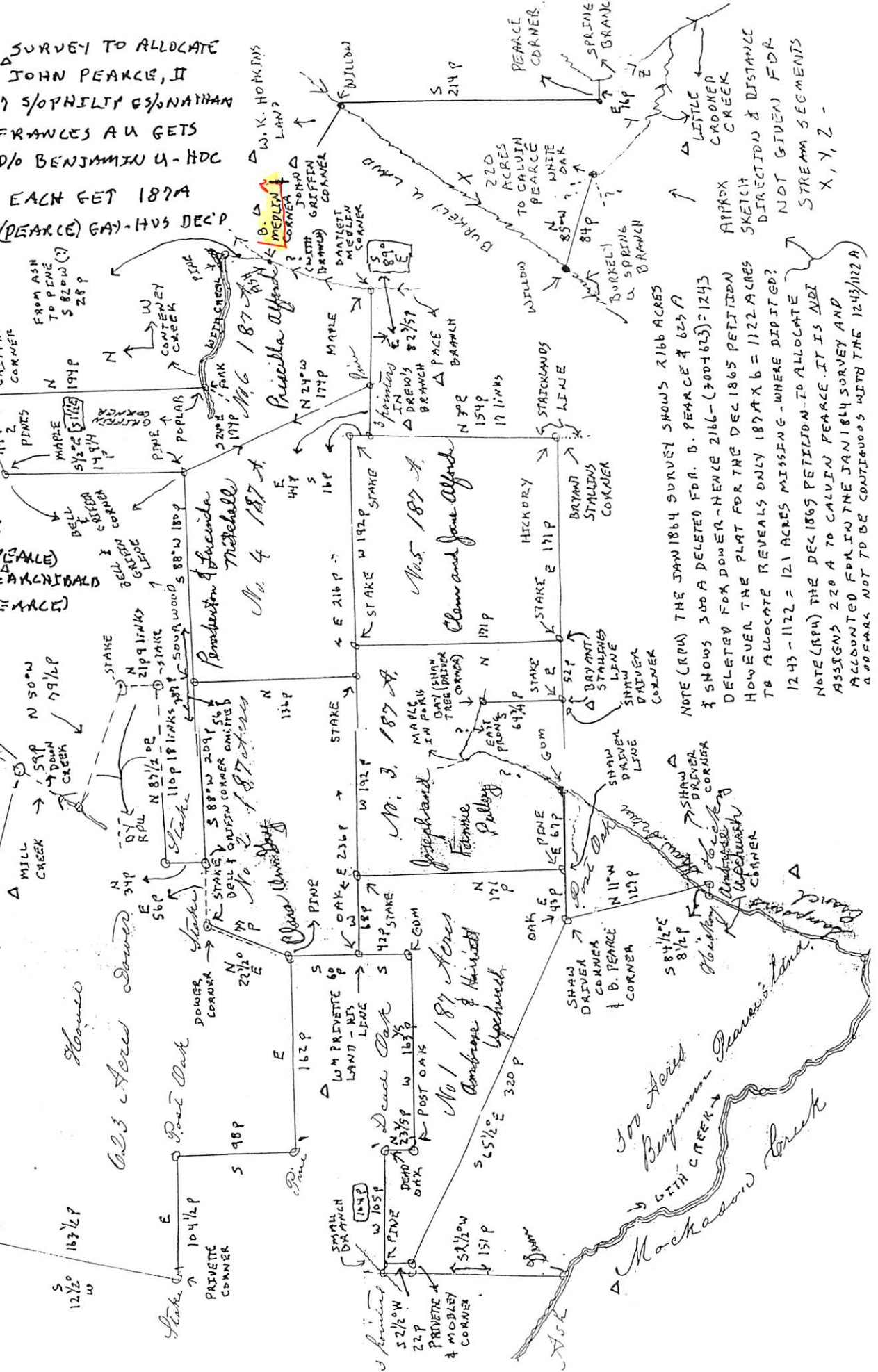
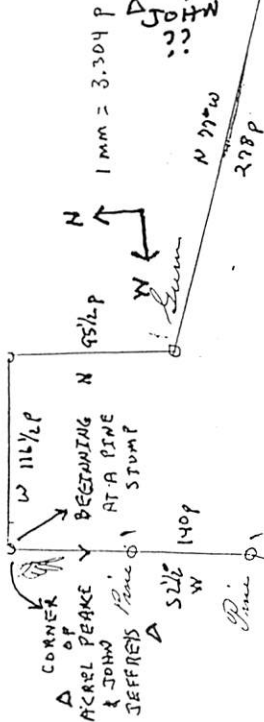

On March 1, 1796 in Johnston County Court, Bryant Medlin (Jr.) and John Medlin were each listed as delinquent for a poll tax in Johnston County.

On August 30, 1796 in Johnston County Court, William Medlin was included on a list of insolvents for 1795.

On August 30, 1797 in Johnston County Court, John Medlin was included on list of insolvents for the year 1796.

On October 12, 1797 in Franklin County, Matthew Medlin purchased land from John Strother, witnessed by Bradley Medlin. Bradley Medlin also purchased land in Franklin County in 1797 from Drury Perry.

In March 1798 in Wake County Court, Drury Medlin proved three deeds from Jacob Williams to Thomas Busby.

In 1798, in Franklin County, Bradley Medlin and James Medlin are listed as landowners in Captain Norris's District and Shadrach Medlin is listed as landowner in Captain Upchurch's District, with each of them owing one white poll tax.

On June 24, 1799, John Medlin of Wake County purchased from James Cone 200 acres on Turkey Creek in Nash County adjoining Jacob Brantley, Morgain and Mary Jones, witnessed by Jesse Hammons, Guilford Cone and William Perry.

On February 6, 1799 in Wake County, William Medlin was listed as owing a note to the estate of Robert Johnston. On April 15, 1799 in Wake County, Drury Medlin, Micajah Medlin, and Thomas Busby were listed as buyers at the estate sale of Robert Johnston.

In 1800, in the Federal census of North Carolina, Bryant Medlin, Sr. and Bryant Medlin, Jr. were both listed as heads of families in Wayne County, which had been formed from Dobbs County in 1779.

Also listed as the head of a family in North Carolina in the 1800 census were William (Owen) Medlin (Sr.) in Johnston County; Joseph, Shadrach, Bradley, Britain, James, Jemima, Josiah, and Matthew Medlin in Franklin County; Cade, Drury, Francis, and William Medlin in Wake County; John Medlin in Halifax County; Nicholas Medlin in Robeson County; Joel, John, and Hugh Medlin in Moore County; John Medlin in Montgomery County; Michael Medlin in Chatham County; and Thomas Medlin in Lenoir County.

On October 15, 1801 in Franklin County, Bradley Medlin was listed as a buyer at the estate sale of William and Theodrick Ferrell, orphans sold by Jeremiah Perry, guardian.

On December 24, 1801 in Johnston County, Benjamin Medlin was listed as a buyer at the estate sale of Robert Horton.

In 1802, William Owen Medlin (Jr.) had moved to Anderson County, Tennessee in Medlin's Company where he was too old for a poll tax.

On November 22, 1803, a marriage bond was issued in Wake County for Royal Medlin and Judah Hicks, with Willis Hicks and Moses Bledsoe as bondsmen and Simon Turner as witness.

Page 16 On May 22, 1804, a marriage bond was issued in Wake County for Willis Medlin and Abby Ellis, with Jesse Mitchell as bondsman and Woodson Clement as witness.

In August 1804 in Wake County Court, William Medlin was ordered exempt from future poll tax.

In December 1805, the will of Benjamin Medlin of Wake County was probated, naming his wife Charity, his son Thomas, and his daughters Patsey and Fanny.

On September 10, 1806, a marriage bond was issued in Johnston County for Alfred Medlin and Addie Smith, with William Johnson as bondsman and R. Sanders as witness.

William Owen Medlin (Sr.) must have died around 1806 in Johnston County, North Carolina.

On February 23, 1807, in Johnston County Court, the following orphan children of William and Priscilla Medlin were ordered to be bound to apprenticeship to Nathaniel Hood: Winsor Medlin, age 18; Feriby Medlin, age 16; and Polly Medlin, age 14.

On March 11, 1807, Michael Medlin issued his will which was proved in Chatham County Court in August 1807, naming his wife Mary and his son John, who was under twenty one years old.

On June 24, 1808, a marriage bond was issued in Johnston County for Burgess Medlin and Susan Lynch, with Johnson Busbee as bondsman and Keren Sanders as witness.

On November 30, 1808, in Johnston County Court, William Medlin and John Medlin were listed as insolvents, each owing one poll tax for 1807.

On January 10, 1809, a marriage bond was issued in Wake County for Burgess Medlin and Winnifred Goodson, with Cader Medlin as bondsman and S. Turner as witness.

On November 29, 1809, in Johnston County Court, William Medlin was listed as insolvent, owing one poll tax for 1808.

Page 17 On July 13, 1810, a marriage bond was issued in Johnston County to Willie Medlin and Tempy Lunce, with Williamson as bondsman and G. Hill, Jr. as witness.

On December 5, 1811, a marriage bond was issued in Franklin County to Joel Medlin and Alsey Stanmire, with Joseph Young as bondsman and G. Hill, Jr. as witness.

In the 1811 tax list for Franklin County, John Medlin is listed along with Christopher Foster, Kinchen Boon, Daniel Foster, Bennet Duke, Green Hill, William Williams, John Perry, Samuel Young, and Simon Jeffreys, Jr.

On June 20, 1813, William Owen Medlin (Jr.) died around Pendleton, South Carolina.

In the War of 1812 with England, James Medlin served in the Fourth Regiment of the Detached Militia from Franklin County called into service at Norfolk in September 1814. Kinchen Medlin was enlisted in the First Company, Artillery, detached from the Wake Regiment. Alexander Medlin and John Medlin were enlisted in the Sixth Company, detached from the Moore Regiment.

Page 12 On May 30, 1786, William (Owen) Medlin is listed as a witness to the sale of land in Johnston County from William Edwards to Arthur Jernigan on north side of the Neuse River, on south side of Little Creek, and on north side of Moccasin Swamp.

In 1787, the first official state population census was taken in North Carolina and only four Medlins were listed as the head of a family. On March 16, 1787, in Johnston County, Bryan(t) Medlin (Jr.) and William (Owen) Medlin (Sr.) are listed in Captain Joseph Boon's Company and Mary Medlin is listed in Captain Whitley's Company. John Medlin was listed in Northampton County in the 1787 census. Many North Carolina families, including several Medlin households, were obviously omitted from this first census taking.

In 1789, Bryant Medlin (Jr.) is included on a tax list in Johnston County.

On November 30, 1789, Nicholas Medlin is listed as a witness to the sale of two adjoining tracts of land on Moccasin (Moccason) Swamp in Johnston County, one near Turkey Branch, from Joseph Bunn, Jr. to Joseph Edwards.

Page 13 In 1790, in the first Federal census of the United States of America, twenty Medlins were listed as head of a family in North Carolina. Bryant Medlin (Jr.) and Shadrach Medlin were listed in Nash County. Joseph, Bradley, James, Matthew, Nancy, and William Medlin (Medlong) were listed in Franklin County. Nicholas Medlin was listed in Wayne County. Also listed in the 1790 census were Benjamin Medlin in Wake County; John Medlin in Halifax County; Richard Medlin, Michael Medlin, and Michael Medlin, Jr. in Northampton County; Joel, John, and Rebecca Medlin in Moore County; John Medlin in Chatham County; William (Owen) Medlin (Jr.) and Duke Medlin in Wilkes County.

In March 1791 in Franklin County Court, Shadrach Medlin was listed as a witness to the nuncupative will of Arthur Howell.

On May 6, 1791 in Northampton County, Nicholas Medlin (Medling) is listed as a buyer at the estate sale of William Sturdivant, recorded in June 1791 court.

In August 1791, Bryant Medlin (Jr.) and William Medlin are included on a tax list in Johnston County as insolvent for the year 1790.

In December 1791 in Franklin County Court, Joseph Medlin was listed as a buyer of the estate of William Taunt.

On August 6, 1792 in Moore County, Joel Medlin enters 50 acres between Stephen Gilmore and on north side and north of Lower Little River.

On September 12, 1792 in Franklin County, the estate of Henry Medlin was inventoried by Nanney Medlin, administratrix, listing only two items: currency and 1 iron pot.

Page 14 On February 21, 1793, a marriage bond was issued in Johnston County for Drury Medlin and Sarah Johnson, with Isaac Jones as bondsman and R. Sanders as witness.

In 1793, William Medlin was included in a list of taxables in Wake County in Captain King's District.

On March 18, 1794 in Wake County, William Medlin was listed as a witness to the sale of slaves by Ann King to Richard King.

On September 22, 1779, Timothy Ryal Medlin was issued a land grant by the State of North Carolina for 200 acres on Buck Branch in Franklin County.

On October 29, 1779, Timothy Ryal Medlin sold to John Gay 100 acres in Franklin County adjoining land that had been previously owned by Edward Haithcock, Frances Bradley, and Nathaniel Carter.

In 1779, William Owen Medlin (Jr.) was included on a tax list in Wilkes County.

Page 11

In 1780, Bryan(t) Medlin, Sr., Bryan(t) Medlin, Jr., Benjamin Medlin, Nicholas Medlin, and William (Owen) Medlin, Sr. were listed as taxpayers in Dobbs County. Bryant Medlin, Sr., Bryant Medlin, Jr., and Benjamin Medlin were living in 1780 in Captain John Granger's district of Dobbs County, which included the townships of Contentnea Neck, Vance, and Sandhill, on the north side of the Neuse River, above Kinston, in what became Lenoir County in 1791.

As best as can be determined from inconsistent census data, Bryant Medlin, Jr. must have been born around 1764, probably in Bute (Franklin) County, North Carolina.

In 1781, Timothy Ryal Medlin purchased land from Abraham Rogers in Franklin County.

On September 13, 1782 in Franklin County, Martin Hall sold to Alexius Mador Foster 340 acres on Crooked Creek joining Shadrach Medlin, William Taunt, John Dent, Jesse Horn, and Giles Driver.

On December 25, 1782, Timothy Ryal Medlin sold to Frances Bradley the 100 acres in Franklin County previously owned by Edward Haithcock.

In 1782, William Owen Medlin (Jr.) was included in a tax list in Wilkes County.

On March 30, 1784, Bryant Medlin (Jr.) bought 150 acres of land from Benjamin Sellers on the north side of Bawdy Swamp in Johnston County, adjacent to Colonel Williams, John Whitley, Joseph Edwards, and Richard Warren, the sale of which was witnessed by Benjamin Medlin and Benjamin Williams, Jr.

On September 14, 1784, Bryant Medlin sold 150 acres on the north side of Bawdy Swamp in Johnston County to Richard Warren, witnessed by Benjamin Medlin. Both of these deeds were admitted into Johnston County Court records on December 2, 1784, with Needham Bryant, William Avera, and Richard Warren present as justices.

In 1784, Bryan(t) Medlin (Jr.) and Nicholas Medlin were listed as taxpayers in Johnston County in Captain Joseph Boon's Company.

On September 9, 1784, in Moore County, Joel Medlin entered 100 acres on south side of Lower Little River bordering Robert Smith.

Between 1785 and 1787 in Moore County, Thomas Woods and Fereby Medlin were issued a marriage license, with John Medlin posting security.

On May 31, 1785, Bryan(t) Medlin is listed in Johnston County Court as insolvent.

In 1786, William (Owen) Medlin (Sr.) appears on a Johnston County tax list.

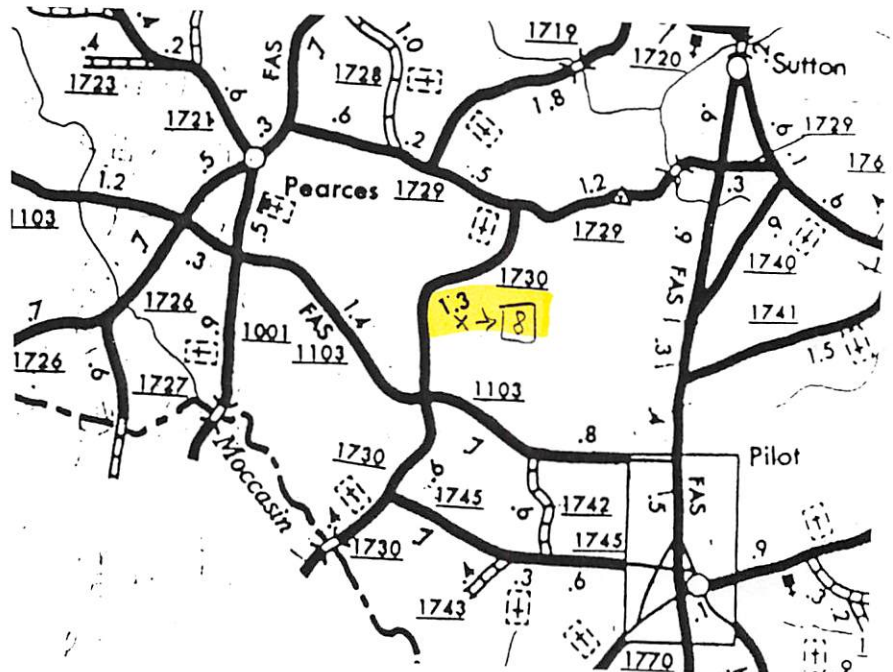

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In March 1798 in Wake County Court, Drury Medlin proved three deeds from Jacob Williams to Thomas Busby.

In 1798, in Franklin County, Bradley Medlin and James Medlin are listed as landowners in Captain Norris's District and Shadrach Medlin is listed as landowner in Captain Upchurch's District, with each of them owing one white poll tax.

Page 12 On May 30, 1786, William (Owen) Medlin is listed as a witness to the sale of land in Johnston County from William Edwards to Arthur Jernigan on north side of the Neuse River, on south side of Little Creek, and on north side of Moccasin Swamp.

In 1787, the first official state population census was taken in North Carolina and only four Medlins were listed as the head of a family. On March 16, 1787, in Johnston County, Bryant(t) Medlin (Jr.) and William (Owen) Medlin (Sr.) are listed in Captain Joseph Boon's Company and Mary Medlin is listed in Captain Whitley's Company. John Medlin was listed in Northampton County in the 1787 census. Many North Carolina families, including several Medlin households, were obviously omitted from this first census taking.

In 1789, Bryant Medlin (Jr.) is included on a tax list in Johnston County.

On November 30, 1789, Nicholas Medlin is listed as a witness to the sale of two adjoining tracts of land on Moccasin (Moccason) Swamp in Johnston County, one near Turkey Branch, from Joseph Bunn, Jr. to Joseph Edwards.

Page 13 In 1790, in the first Federal census of the United States of America, twenty Medlins were listed as head of a family in North Carolina. Bryant Medlin (Jr.) and Shadrach Medlin were listed in Nash County. Joseph, Bradley, James, Matthew, Nancy, and William Medlin (Medlong) were listed in Franklin County. Nicholas Medlin was listed in Wayne County. Also listed in the 1790 census were Benjamin Medlin in Wake County; John Medlin in Halifax County; Richard Medlin, Michael Medlin, and Michael Medlin, Jr. in Northampton County; Joel, John, and Rebecca Medlin in Moore County; John Medlin in Chatham County; William (Owen) Medlin (Jr.) and Duke Medlin in Wilkes County.

In March 1791 in Franklin County Court, Shadrach Medlin was listed as a witness to the nuncupative will of Arthur Howell.

On May 6, 1791 in Northampton County, Nicholas Medlin (Medling) is listed as a buyer at the estate sale of William Sturdivant, recorded in June 1791 court.

In August 1791, Bryant Medlin (Jr.) and William Medlin are included on a tax list in Johnston County as insolvent for the year 1790.

In December 1791 in Franklin County Court, Joseph Medlin was listed as a buyer of the estate of William Taunt.

On August 6, 1792 in Moore County, Joel Medlin enters 50 acres between Stephen Gilmore and on north side and north of Lower Little River.

On September 12, 1792 in Franklin County, the estate of Henry Medlin was inventoried by Nanney Medlin, administratrix, listing only two items: currency and 1 iron pot.

Page 14 On February 21, 1793, a marriage bond was issued in Johnston County for Drury Medlin and Sarah Johnson, with Isaac Jones as bondsman and R. Sanders as witness.

In 1793, William Medlin was included in a list of taxables in Wake County in Captain King's District.

On March 18, 1794 in Wake County, William Medlin was listed as a witness to the sale of slaves by Ann King to Richard King.

On September 2, 1778, Shadrack Medlin was a witness to the sale of land by Willis Tant to William Fish in Bute County on the north side of Crooked Creek, adjoining Fish on the Mill Branch and to head of William Pace's Spring Branch.

In 1778, in Captain Ferrell's District in Bute County, Henry Tyler Medlin, Shadrach Medlin, Bradley Medlin, and Ryal Medlin took oaths of allegiance to the State of North Carolina to defend the independent government against King George III. This oath of allegiance qualified these Medlin (Medlen) patriots from Bute County to vote in elections.

The Earl of Bute had become very unpopular in the colony and his name created dishonor. In 1779, the North Carolina Legislature abolished Bute County and the area formerly known as Bute County was divided into Franklin and Warren Counties.

On January 29, 1779, Franklin County came into existence as the southern half of previous Bute County. This new county was named in honor of Benjamin Franklin, the very popular patriot statesman of Pennsylvania.

Henry Tyler Medlin, Shadrach Medlin, and Bradley Medlin were three Patriot soldiers from Franklin (formerly Bute/Granville) County, North Carolina that served in the Revolutionary War against Great Britain. After enlisting at Granville Court House, Henry and Shadrach Medlin served together in Captain Edward Yarborough's Company in the Revolutionary War.

In the pension application for Shadrach Medlin, aged 70, in Wake County Court on October 4, 1820, his wife Cloah is listed as age 67 and his granddaughter Rebecca is listed as being age 12 or 13.

He lived in Wilson County in 1832 when he applied for a pension and he moved to Madison County, Tennessee in 1839 where he died on August 18, 1843.

Bryant Medlin (Sr.) enlisted in Kinston, in Dobbs County (later Lenoir County), as a Volunteer in the N.C. Militia for three different periods totaling 15 months between 1775 and 1781 in the American Revolutionary War. Beginning with Captain John Garland's Company, Bryant Medlin drew musician's pay as both drummer and piper. This Medlin Patriot soldier fought in the Battle of Moore's Creek Bridge, North Carolina and the Battle of Stono at Charleston, South Carolina.

John Medlin, private from Moore County, enlisted in Moore County and served under the company commanded by Captain John McRae, according to his widow's application for pension. Nancy McKenzie Medlin, living in Scotts Hill, Tennessee, last filed for a pension on August 18, 1853 in Henderson County, Tennessee. She stated that she was married prior to 1794 to John Medlin in Moore County by Thomas Medlin, justice of the peace. Her several applications were all denied for lack of existence of proof of a service record in North Carolina.

On November 22, 1769, William Owen Medlin sold 177 acres of land in Bute County on the south side of Crooked Creek to James Alford, witnessed by Jacob Hartsfield and Shaw Driver. This is the same land adjacent to Sam Wright, Franklin Wright, and W. Wright bought from Julius Johnson who had purchased the land from Julius Alford.

In 1769, Bryan(t) Medlin (Sr.) was included in a tax list in Dobbs County, North Carolina. Dobbs County was formed in 1759 from Johnston County and by 1799 became Wayne, Greene, and Lenoir Counties.

In 1771, Ryal Medlin, Henry Tyler Medlin, William (Owen) Medlin (Sr.), and Shadrach Medlin were listed as taxpayers in Bell's District in Bute County.

On February 13, 1771 in Bute County Court, a deed from William Owen Medlin (Sr.) to James Alford was proved to and witnessed by Jacob Hartsfield. In that same court, Henry Medlin was ordered to help James Perry keep the road from Cedar Creek to St. Johns Chapel.

In 1771, William Owen Medlin (Jr.) was listed as a taxpayer in Surry County, North Carolina and again there in 1775 and 1777.

In 1772, Nicholas Medlin, Sr. (Medlock) of Granville County, North Carolina was listed as a debtor to a British merchant.

On November 30, 1773 in the part of Cumberland County that became Moore County, Alexander Patterson is issued a land grant on the upper side of Lower Little River, opposite Joel Medlin (Medley).

On June 8, 1774, in Wake County Court, William Medlin (Medling) was ordered to work on a new road beginning at Hillsborough Road at Tingnal Jones's cut path across Crabb Tree Creek up the ridge between Middle Branch and Indian Branch to Horns Roling path to the county line near Hearn's.

On July 25, 1774, Joel Medlin (Madlen) was granted 100 acres joining John Patterson on the River in the part of Cumberland County that later became Moore County.

On March 7, 1775, in Wake County Court, Timothy R. Medlin (Medling) was a defendant in a suit won by Richard Simmons.

On September 7, 1775, in Wake County Court, Henry Medlin and Absolom Griffin appeared and were appointed to procession two tracts of land of Dennis Bradley, totaling 425 acres. At that same court, William Wilder appeared to procession the lands of William Wilder, Michael Curtis, and Jacob Delk.

Before the Revolutionary War began, Committees of Safety were organized in the colonies to plan their independence from Great Britain. Jethro Sumner organized the Bute County Committee of Safety of which Osborne Jeffreys was a member. On April 4, 1776, the Provincial Congress met in Halifax, North Carolina and the Halifax Resolves were drawn up, eventually leading to the Declaration of Independence.

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On February 9, 1748, Richard Medlin, Jr. is listed as a chain carrier with William Cade on a survey of land deeded on April 30, 1753 to Lodowick Alford for 600 acres on north side of Little Creek in Granville County and Johnston County.

On July 19, 1750 in Chowan County Court in Edenton, Timothy Ryal (Royal) Medlin, orphan aged 15 years, was ordered bound to apprenticeship until age 21 under James Flood.

On October 6, 1750, the will of James Douglas was witnessed in Bertie County by Joseph Medlin.

Around 1750, part of the Richard Medlin <sup>[SR]</sup> family must have migrated northwesterly and returned back into Virginia for a few years before returning southwesterly to North Carolina again. This cycle of crossing the border must have been repeated more than once as the Medlins slowly migrated westerly.

On October 8, 1754, Joseph Medlin and John Medlin (misspelled Meldey) were included on a muster roll of the North Carolina Militia Regiment in Granville County, North Carolina, under the command of Colonel William Eaton. Joseph Medlin was enlisted in Captain Osborn Jeffreys' Company along with his neighbors William Maynard, Julius Alford, James Bolton, and William Cade. John Medlin was enlisted in Captain Benjamin Simm's Company along with neighbor Lodowick Alford. The house built in 1770 by Osborne Jeffreys, the first sheriff of Franklin County in 1779, is still a current well-known landmark in the southern part of modern Franklin County, between Crooked Creek and Little River, just above the Wake County line.

On May 2, 1760, Joseph Medlin of Johnston County deeded to Timothy Ryal Medlin (Timothy Royal Medford) a feather bed for love and affection. Johnston County was formed in 1746 from Craven County.

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On June 7, 1762, Patrick Medlin was listed as a sworn chain carrier on a survey of land in Orange County on both sides of Wolf Island Creek deeded on December 24, 1762 to Mark London. Orange County was formed in 1752 from Johnston, Granville and Bladen Counties.

On January 15, 1763, in Johnston County, Joshua Mize sold 100 acres on the north side of the Little River to Timothy Ryal Medlin, witnessed by Joel Medlin (Medford) and William Anderson Fowler.

On January 15, 1763, in Granville County, William Owen (Oen) Medlin (Sr.) witnessed a deed of William Wilder of Johnston County to Nathaniel Carter.

William Owen Medlin, (Sr.) migrated over a large territory in eastern North Carolina and Virginia. William Owen Medlin (Sr.) and his wife, Rebecca Wilson, were believed to have had four sons: William Owen Medlin (Jr.) born around 1745, Bryant Medlin, Sr. born around 1748, Shadrach Medlin born in 1749, and James Wilson Medlin, born around 1750.
