

\*Rev. Johnson Olive had accepted the pastorate of Swift Creek Baptist Church for the year 1885. Rev. Olive died at his residence in Apex, North Carolina on Saturday, January 24, 1885 and is buried in the Apex Cemetery. At the time of his death, he was pastor of Swift Creek, Cary, Holly Springs, and New Bethel Churches. He never preached at Swift Creek as pastor.

Many of the early pastors served four churches at a time preaching at each one week-end a month. The first full time pastor at Swift Creek Baptist Church was Rev. Paul Pridgen, Jr. in 1954.

As was the custom of the times in the early years, pastors were "called" on an annual basis. The call was for the calendar year. This practice continued at Swift Creek Baptist Church until 1952. Rev. Paul West, Jr. was the last pastor to face an annual call.

Interim pastors who have served since 1979 are Dr. James Heaton, Steve Roy, Joe Zimmerman, Donald McNair, and Gerald Richards.

In 2004, Swift Creek Baptist Church called its first full-time Minister of Children and Youth, Mr. Christopher Dawson. Part time Ministers of Youth since 1979 include Bill Howard, Douglas Lax, Joseph Kennedy, Jr., Melissa Livengood, Patrick Smith, Tim Wiles, David Price, James Upchurch, and Christopher Dawson.

Following the five-and-a-half year tenure of Dr. A. S. Putnam (1923–1929), C. H. Norris served from January 30, 1930, through February 28, 1932. According to the agreement, he preached one Sunday morning and another Sunday evening each month. It was he who asked the church, in September, 1931, to make a decision about when regular business meetings were to be held. The church decided that they would be held "after church on 4<sup>th</sup> Sundays – if there is no 'rule' against it."

Following Norris' departure, J. G. Blalock agreed to preach twice a month until a new pastor was called. Harold Wilson chaired the committee to search for a pastor. The committee consisted of all the deacons, two other men, and two women. It was not until July 7, 1932, that the committee reported that "they had found three men, Bro. Blalock, Bro. McCarter and Br. Andrews either of which would serve as pastor." Blalock was already well-known to the congregation because he had been serving the church as "interim" preacher.

Jesse McCarter was invited to preach on the third Sunday of that month, July 21<sup>st</sup>. Following that service, the church met in conference, with N. G. Duncan as moderator *pro tem*. All three of the above-named ministers were put before the congregation, and Duncan was nominated as well! McCarter was elected on the first ballot and agreed to conduct services on the first and third Sundays of each month. It was during McCarter's pastorate that the church building was burned and the new building erected. Within a year after services were begun in the new building, the relationship between McCarter and the congregation soured. The minutes for the conference of June 14, 1936, report that

The Board of Deacons had previously held a meeting and at this time the chairman reported that they recommended that the pastor be asked to resign for lack of cooperation and criticism. Mr. John Bennett amended the report by asking that appreciation be expressed for the pastor's efforts. Clerk of church to notify pastor. The Board of Deacons were appointed to recommend some one else for pastor.

REASONS FOR IMPORTANCE OF PROBLEM: A major end the of Soft White wheat is in the production of cakes, cookies, pastries and other wheat foods requiring a low protein soft wheat flour. The average protein leve of Soft White wheat in the Western Region has increased steadily to the point where there is a severe shortage of supply of wheat in the protein range of 9 per ent and under. Export markets for this wheat were developed on the basis of 10 protein in a large proportion of the cargoes shipped to Asla, Latin America and e.en to Europe. These markets, which account for nearly 85 percent of the total White wheat sold by producers in the Western Region are being jeopardized by the increasing protein content of the wheat. Foreign buyers are increasingly looking to other countries for soft wheat of lower protein content, the major other supplier of low protein soft White wheat being Australia.

Soft White wheat is a dual or multi-purpose whea in domestic as well as in foreign markets. At protein levels of 9 percent and les it is suited for the low protein products mentioned earlier and at protein levels above 9 percent, it is suitable for needles and all-purpose family flour. Consumer acceptability, therefore, requires all ranges of protein content. The series problem facing the Region is a shortage of flow protein soft white which should constitute not less than 50 percent of the total

content of the about 9 percent

In the death of Mrs. Norris, the William Utley Memorial Association sustains a distinct loss. Three years ago at its organization, Mrs. Norris was present and was unanimously elected the genealogist of the Association. Many years of genealogical investigation amply qualified her for the difficult task. She brought to it not only special ability along these lines but an enthusiasm equaled by few; and surpassed by none. She delighted in tracing old family records; and had gathered a fund of

And we the members of the William Utley Memorial Association hereby place on record, for permanent preservation, our high esteem of Mrs. Norris as a lady of culture and high character whose long and useful life was unselfishly devoted to her family, friends, and all who sought her services which she rendered gracefully and graciously and whose memory we will cherish always as one worthy of our fondest recollections.

Mrs. Norris was the daughter of the late Jessie Norris of Apex; and was born August 3, 1857. She therefore lacked only a few weeks of having reached her 78th birthday. For many years she had been a resident of Raleigh and an active member of the First Baptist Church. Her husband, the late M. T. Norris, preceded her in death by more than 25 years. She leaves three children (daughters), all of Raleigh, Mrs. J. K. Marshall, Mrs. James McKimmon and Mrs. J. L. Primrose.

Mrs. Norris was for many years a member of the Caswell-Nash Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution, had done much work along genealogical lines for the Chapter, and represented it frequently in Washington City. Her funeral was conducted by Dr. E. McNeil Poteat, pastor of the Pullen Memorial Baptist Church of Raleigh.

I owe much to my teacher and cousin, Irene Johnson Cook, who for several years taught a private school in her old home..the Capt. Etheldred Jones Homeplace. She told us many stories about our forefathers that are indelible on our memory. And she let us play in the old log cabin in the yard as special reward for some achievement. The cabin was still called "Uncle Charles' House." Uncle Charles was a family slave, who had formerly belonged to her grandfather, Barnabas Jones, and whose memory was very dear to the Johnson children. The room seemed to be knee-deep in buttons, buckles, belts, bridle ornaments, and old bullets that were relics of wars.

Cornelia Alice Norris (8/17/1857-6/22/1935) -m.Matthew Tyson "Tice" Norris (12/19/1849-1/16/1915) The account of their wedding (9/3/1876) was in the Raleigh Sentinel 9/5/1876.

"Our cotton merchants were never more hopeful of futures...At Piney Grove Church Sept.3,1876.By Rev. M. Holleman, Mr. M.T.Norris of this city was married to Miss C.A. Norris, daughter of Jesse A. Norris. A sumptuous feast wasset at the home of the bride's father and many handsome presents were received." Cornelia's father purchased property at 421 N. Blount St., Raleigh, for the couple, and they built a large VIctorian home there. Italianate in style, it was purchased by the Heartts in 1928. The Heartts made extensive changes in the appearance of the house, eliminating Italianate features and replacing them with columns across the front. The place is now owned by the State. Matthew Tyson Norris was son of William H. Norris & Mary Yates Norris & grandson of Col. Samuel Pearson Norris(11/21/1787-2/20/1856) & 1st wife Matilda Utley. Matilda Utley was daughter of John "Jack" Utley Jr.& Charity Jones Utley, Wake Co. Thus, the fathers of Cornelia Alice Norris & Matthew Tyson Norris were half-brothers, making Cornelia and her husband half-first cousins, and they were both grandchildren of Samuel Pearson Norris.

McKimmon's obituary in The Raleigh Times said he was president of McKimmon & McKee and one of the best known insurance men in the State. The McKimmon's home was at 519 N. Blount St. His death at 35 was only a short time before the Great Depression, and his widow was left with five children to support. She became a successful businesswoman in her own right, and her children became well known as community leaders in Raleigh.

James McKimmon was the son of James and Lella Hull McKimmon(b.11/15/1850), Athens, GA, and grandson of James McKimmon & Amelia Pomcrait (he came from N. Ireland & she was of French descent, from Baltimore)

An accomplished athlete, she won state golf championships repeatedly over a period of 50 years.

# A return to Apex

## Norris operation opened Monday

#### By MIKE HUGHES Herald Editor

A fleet of trucks and an army of employees converged on south Apex over the weekend, unloading everything from warehouse goods to office supplies, as the Garland C. Norris Co. made its return to the town after a 70-year absence.

The company opened its doors in Apex Monday morning, 18 months after buying a tract of the former Eva Perry estate. The move was complete by Tuesday.

The paper-products business, which began in a Salem Street storefront in 1904, moved to Beryl Road in Raleigh, across from the State Fairgrounds, in 1920.

In January 1989, the company paid \$257,400 for 21 acres of the Perry lands and announced that it would move back to Apex. Mrs. Perry left more than 260 acres to the town upon her death in 1985.

Since buying the property, Garland C. Norris has spent Paving the 3,000-foot road will cost about \$107,000, according to estimates from last year.

King said that although operations got under way in Apex Monday morning, it would take several weeks before the move is complete.

One reason for the move back to Apex was to give the company room to expand. King said that while there are no immediate plans to build onto the warehouse, the building was designed to facilitate expansion in the future.

The warehouse is already about twice as large as the Beryl Road facility.

The company, which employs about 35 people, supplies disposable paper products to other wholesalers throughout North and South Carolina.

King said that the move had been a major undertaking and that, as with other moves, he was surprised to discover how many items had been accumulated in the 70 years in Raleigh.

In going through the old

warehouse recently, King said, he came upon several pictures from the company's days in Apex and, among other things,

found a few bottles from the old Apex Bottling Co., which Garland Norris also had had a financial interest in.



The company built a 67,200square-foot warehouse on 6.8 acres off Perry Road and joined the town in extending a 12-inch water line to the site, work that was completed late last week.

Company officials are still waiting for the town to pave Perry Road, part of last year's selling agreement.

The road hasn't been paved because since early 1989, Apex has been seeking N.C. Department of Transportation funds to complete the project, said Town Manager Steven E. Stewart.

Stewart said that while the town would like to get the paving completed as soon as possible, there is no set paving schedule.

The town of Apex had its beginning with the close of the Civil War. Among its first settlers were J. McC. Ellington, H. C. Olive, Q. I. Hudson, W. F. Utley, W. H. Harward, Brinkley Olive, A. N. Betts and others, AAA who contributed to its life in the beginning and afterwards. It was incorporated by the Legislature of 1871-72, with the late Hon. H. C. Olive as its first mayor. It derived its name from being the highest point on the survey of the Raleigh & Augusta Air Line Railroad.

Until 1905 it was but a small town, where the standard of virtue, intelligence and patriotism was high, but where little progress in material things had been made. In that year, beginning with the organization of a bank and the establishment of a tobacco market, began a new life for the town and surrounding community. Fire later destroying a number of unsightly frame buildings, the first brick structure was soon erected. Again, in June, 1911, nearly all the remaining old frame buildings in the business section were also consumed by fire. Now the principal street of the town (Salem) is lined with handsome pressed-brick-front stores. Business houses have continued to increase in number, until now nearly everything to complete a small city is here represented. This metropolis of western Wake is one of the busiest, most attractive and substantially built towns of its size in North Carolina. Its streets are well laid out and splendidly shaded in the residential sections, while the business part of the town is marked with buildings of beautiful architectural designs and substantial construction.

Apex has a population of about one thousand, and, being located in the centre of one of the best agricultural sections of the State, has a large rural territory from which to draw life and sustenance. It is in the limited "Old Belt" tobacco lands of North Carolina and Virginia, which produce the finest yellow-wrapper tobacco. The tobacco market at Apex is one of its chief industries. It is equipped with two splendid warehouses, three large prizehouses<sup>2</sup>, markets about two million pounds of tobacco annually, and enjoys the distinction of making the highest average price per pound of any market in the State. It is the centre of a fine cotton-production section, the receipts of this staple being from three to five thousand bales of cotton per year.

Public education in Wake County has always found some of its most potent advocates and influences at Apex. Notable among those who have wielded an influence throughout the county in this respect are the late Hon H. C. Olive, State Senator and for many years chairman of the Wake County Board of Education; Hon L. J. Sears, at present, and for many years past, chairman of the same board, and Hon. Percy J. Olive, an ex-representative and a public man who has taken an especial interest in the schools. That these gentlemen are and were but the exponents of the sentiment around them is witnessed by the fact that Apex has one of the finest and best-equipped schools in the county, and that every school in White Oak Township levies a local tax to supplement the general education fund.

Few communities in the State have had more additions to their population within the past five years than has that of which Apex is the centre. Those seeking desirable homes have found here a happy combination of advantages—fine lands, intelligent, virtuous and hospitable neighbors, good markets, good roads, good schools and good churches. No fictitious values have been placed upon the lands; for, with the true idea of progress, the efforts of those who have done most for the community's upbuilding have been directed to keeping the real estate at its true value. Contributing mostly to this and at present forming the most valuable of its citizenship, without disparagement to others, may be mentioned Messrs. W. F. Utley, W. H. Harward, A. B. Hunter, L. S. Olive, Percy J. Olive, Dr. W. Wade Olive, S. W. Stone, J. B. Mason, J. W. Lassiter, W. B. Upchurch, J. H. Sears, A. V. Baucom, A. C. Hughes, C. P. Sellars, W. B. Johnson, A. D. 

H. W. Norris, who followed Marcom, was the exception to the rule of short pastorates. He was given one-year calls for 1880 and 1881. And then, in November, 1881, he was called to serve "indefinitely" (Minutes, November, 1880). At the time he began his work with Inwood he was not a pastor in the Raleigh Association, but was serving elsewhere. In order to secure his services Inwood had to change its meeting time to the first Sunday of the month rather than the fourth. The success of his work is attested both by his long tenure (1880–1887) and by the fact that in January, 1884, the church began holding services twice a month.

After eight years, however, there was considerable dissatisfaction in the church. The indefinite call extended to Norris in November, 1881, came to an end at a church conference on November 13, 1887, when the church took two decisive steps. The first was the decision "to have once a month preaching," retreating from the pattern set four years earlier. The second was to take a ballot on "whether to call Bro. Norris another year which was unfavorable." There is no hint as to why, after eight years of ministry, the congregation was dissatisfied with his work. We might speculate that it had something to do with the long and vigorous resolution of support for the deacon about whom in that year malicious rumors had been circulated in the community.

by the late D.W. Maynard in 1941

pex was all woods, the first house was that of A.D. Upchurch's place [300 S. Salem St., house was moved and is now next to cemetery on West Moore St.]; the next one was William Passmore's, now the Baldwin place [Tingen Road and James Street, house burned]. Mr. John Ellington bought the land for the timber. During the War [Civil] the railroad was graded, starting from Cary. A few years after the war, the track was laid for the station. Mr. Q. I. Hudson was made agent and kept it almost a lifetime. He taught many boys telegraphy, two of whom are outstanding officials of the Seaboard Railroad now. [Mr. E. E. Maynard would have been one, other unknown. Mr. E.E. Maynard's daughter is Nancy Maynard Brown].

After the depot was located, Mr. Ellington built the house now owned by Mr. Bud Beasley. Center and N. Elm now owned by Colleen Newman. Harry Beasley, was born in this house when his grandfather was owner.) The second house was the Norris house [where Apex United Methodist Church CLC stands on S. Elm St.]. The third was also on east side of the railroad, on Chatham Street. This house is now occupied by Mr. Will Edwards at the corner of N. Elm St. and E. Chatham St [now home of Ron and Crystal Ragland]. Mr. Ellington gave the house to his son-in-law, Judge Thompson. The first church, a small building used by the Methodists, was built by Mr. Ellington. The building was on the corner of Moore and Elm Street. It was used for a school building until it burned. The Baptist church was on the site, now the home of A.T. Seymour, Sr. (now owned by Tommy and Robin Seymour, 306 S. Salem St.) and Mr. Roy Walls, Sr. [south of the Seymour's has been torn down; however, the front walkway remains]. The first teachers were Rev. H.W. Norris and Miss Julia Roberts, a sister-in-law of Frank Page. At first we had two schools, a male and female.

Mr. Ellington built some nice store buildings. Then other people came and built. Apex has gone forward to the present day. The first resident physician was Dr. A. J. Thompson. Apex has never succeeded as a manufacturing town. We have had saw mills, cotton mills, planing mills, flour and knitting mills. For several years we had several good tobacco warehouses. Apex gets its name because it is the highest point on the Seaboard [now CSX] Railroad between Hamlet and Norlina. Apex is a real country town, with a good school, good churches and good people.

The town of Apex had its beginning with the close of the Civil War. Among its first settlers were J. McC. Ellington, H. C. Olive, Q. I. Hudson, W. F. Utley, W. H. Harward, Brinkley Olive, A. N. Betts and others, AAA who contributed to its life in the beginning and afterwards. It was incorporated by the Legislature of 1871-'72, with the late Hon. H. C. Olive as its first mayor. It derived its name from being the highest point on the survey of the Raleigh & Augusta Air Line Railroad.

Until 1905 it was but a small town, where the standard of virtue, intelligence and patriotism was high, but where little progress in material things had been made. In that year, beginning with the organization of a bank and the establishment of a tobacco market, began a new life for the town and surrounding community. Fire later destroying a number of unsightly frame buildings, the first brick structure was soon erected. Again, in June, 1911, nearly all the remaining old frame buildings in the business section were also consumed by fire. Now the principal street of the town (Salem) is lined with handsome pressed-brick-front stores. Business houses have continued to increase in number, until now nearly everything to complete a small city is here represented. This metropolis of western Wake is one of the busiest, most attractive and substantially built towns of its size in North Carolina. Its streets are well laid out and splendidly shaded in the residential sections, while the business part of the town is marked with buildings of beautiful architectural designs and substantial construction.

Apex has a population of about one thousand, and, being located in the centre of one of the best agricultural sections of the State, has a large rural territory from which to draw life and sustenance. It is in the limited "Old Belt" tobacco lands of North Carolina and Virginia, which produce the finest yellow-wrapper tobacco. The tobacco market at Apex is one of its chief industries. It is equipped with two splendid warehouses, three large prizehouses<sup>2</sup>, markets about two million pounds of tobacco annually, and enjoys the distinction of making the highest average price per pound of any market in the State. It is the centre of a fine cotton-production section, the receipts of this staple being from three to five thousand bales of cotton per year.

Public education in Wake County has always found some of its most potent advocates and influences at Apex. Notable among those who have wielded an influence throughout the county in this respect are the late Hon H. C. Olive, State Senator and for many years chairman of the Wake County Board of Education; Hon, L. J. Sears, at present, and for many years past, chairman of the same board, and Hon. Percy J. Olive, an ex-representative and a public man who has taken an especial interest in the schools. That these gentlemen are and were but the exponents of the sentiment around them is witnessed by the fact that Apex has one of the finest and best-equipped schools in the county, and that every school in White Oak Township levies a local tax to supplement the general education fund.

Few communities in the State have had more additions to their population within the past five years than has that of which Apex is the centre. Those seeking desirable homes have found here a happy combination of advantages—fine lands, intelligent, virtuous and hospitable neighbors, good markets, good roads, good schools and good churches. No fictitious values have been placed upon the lands; for, with the true idea of progress, the efforts of those who have done most for the community's upbuilding have been directed to keeping the real estate at its true value. Contributing mostly to this and at present forming the most valuable of its citizenship, without disparagement to others, may be mentioned Messrs. W. F. Utley, W. H. Harward, A. B. Hunter, L. S. 

It is never easy to give up a friend, a beloved member of our family or a fellow journeyman in the faith. Even when the life was long and well-lived, it remains difficult. But our task is made somewhat easier by the fact that as we do this, we are supported by faith that is at once larger than life and stronger than death.

Within that confidence we gather here to be comforted, reassured, and fortified. And for that, we turn to the same clear, strong Word of the Scriptures that was the daily companion of Jimmy Norris, a Word whose promises today we claim and whose consolation we embrace.

For the Scriptures point us not so much to answers, as to a Presence that will never abandon us or leave us orphaned; not so much to reasons, as to a Hope that will not disappoint; not so much to understanding, as to a Peace that passes understanding, and to a Love that no matter what will never let us go.

May I share with you this afternoon some of that sense of Presence and Hope and Peace

and Love?

The Eulogy

We gather here today to claim memories which are forever sacred as they are a gift from God. James Lloyd Norris was born on July 27, 1910. A native North Carolinian, Jimmy grew up on a farm near Dunn on which his father farmed. Jimmy left the farm when, as a young man, he went away to college at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill where he studied civil engineering, specializing in hydrographic engineering and bridge building. Following graduation, he went to work for the North Carolina Highway Department where he continued to work throughout his professional career until his retirement in the early '70's as Assist. Chief

Engineer in charge of all bridge construction.

During World War 2, Jimmy served with the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers both here in the states as well as in the European theatre, serving in Italy when the war ended. While here in the states, he helped to solve the drainage problems associated with the expansion at Camp Lejeune. The proposed expansion of Lejeune was being hampered by severe drainage problems. The solutions proposed by the Army's own engineers were prohibitively expensive and excessively complex. Jimmy, being basically a civilian engineer accustomed to working under strict budgetary limitations, drew up a sketch of what he believed would be a simple and inexpensive solution to the problem and presented it to the general in charge of the construction. He was so elated that so simple and inexpensive a solution to the problem was possible that he adopted Jimmy's plan which became the basis for the expansion at the military base! Jimmy was older than most of the troops with whom he served and he became something of a role model and even a "father-figure" for many of them who referred to him as "Pappy."

Jimmy met Jessie Ruth, who at the time was also employed at the Highway Department,



and in August of 1936 they married. They celebrated 55 years of marriage together this past August. Though they had no children of their own, they gathered about them, through their generosity and love, a large "adopted" family. I have been amazed, since coming here to be your Pastor a year ago, to learn from so many of you about the "fathering" and "mothering" you've received from Jimmy and Jessie Ruth Norris. Two of those, Jerry and Judy Harris, have been like children to Jimmy and Jessie Ruth, Judy, though now living in Plymouth, has stayed right by Jessie Ruth's side during these difficult days. When she found out that Jimmy's time was short, she just packed her bags and came prepared to stay as long as she was needed.

There are more of those kinds of stories, lives touched by the gentle and caring concern of Jimmy Norris, than I could possibly share with you today. But let me share just one more that is, I think, typical. Bill Fleming, who as a young man was living in Asheville for a year, tells that on four or five separate occasions Jimmy, who was with the Highway Department, would look Bill up, when he was in Asheville, and would take him out to lunch or dinner, just because Bill was a member of First Baptist Church and was away from home! He would pick Bill up, and like a son, drive him around the area talking with him, showing him what he was working on there in Asheville. Jimmy, always interested in bridges and their construction, was fascinated with a certain mountain bridge there in Asheville with interesting support construction, and he would take Bill out with him on those days to look at the construction of that bridge. But of course, what he was really doing, was spending some time with a young man from his church who was a long way from home. It's no wonder that Bill says of Jimmy: "To me, he was First Baptist Church!"

And he was! He served on the diaconate throughout his life, serving as chairman in the '60's. He worked on the fund-raising campaign for the Lewis Building and was a member of the building committee — is that why we have all those beautiful open "bridge-type" walkways and hallways in the Lewis Building? And he kept the serve in "servant," doing anything he was asked to do! My most vivid memory of Jimmy is of him pushing disabled people around the grounds of Springmoor in wheelchairs in order to get them some fresh air. Invariably, everytime I went to Springmoor there would be Jimmy, smiling away, pushing someone in a wheelchair: "Hi, Pastor! Who you here to see?" He always regarded serving and working for others to be a privelege, not a chore! He always said Grace before each meal and ended every Grace with the words: "We're thankful for the privelege of work and the joy of service." On hearing that phrase, someone asked him once: "Jimmy, how is work a privelege?" And he said: "Of course work is a privelege, and when the time comes when you can no longer work, you'll realize that it has always been a privelege!"

It was that same willingness to serve others that led him to become a member of the Optomist Club of Raleigh. A past president of the Club, he used his civil engineering expertise to lay out the course for the Tar Heel Regatta, one of the major projects of the Optomists, the proceeds going to area boys and girls homes.

He loved cooking and, among many other things, will be remembered by our men for all

those Men's Breakfasts that he and Vince Stuart whipped up early in the mornings.

And his other great joy was fishing. He loved to fish! He and Jack Moore were notorious for their fishing trips to Swansboro! They even caught some of those fish in their pictures of those trips!

But more than anything else, we'll remember Jimmy as a man of deep faith and authentic piety! An early riser, Jimmy would always pray and read his Bible, wherever he went — even on those fishing trips! How many fishermen do you know who take their Bibles on fishing trips with them? Jimmy did! His love for the Scriptures led him to join the Gideons late in life, and on many Saturday mornings Jimmy could be found out distributing Bibles in motels and other

public facilities.

And he was a man of prayer. Jessie Ruth says that on many occasions she'd walk into his room at Springmoor and only see his head on the other side of the bed — on his knees, praying. Jimmy's faith was never showy or exhibitionist, but it was profoundly authentic. He spoke of God and of prayer and his church as comfortably as most people speak of the weather. Faith for him was not just a "hobby" or a casual interest; it was life and breath.



I was not surprised to learn that Psalm 24 was the most read and underscored and alluded to passage in Jimmy's personal Bible. In many ways, it was the credo of his life:

"The earth is the LORD'S and the fulness thereof, the world and those who dwell therein; for he has founded it upon the seas, and established it upon the rivers.

Who shall ascend the hill of the LORD? And who shall stand in his holy place? He who has clean hands and a pure heart, who does not lift up his soul to what is false, and does not swear deceitfully. He will receive blessing from the LORD, and vindication from the God of his salvation.

Lift up your heads, O gates! and be lifted up, O ancient doors! that the King of glory may come in. Who is the King of glory? The LORD, strong and mighty, the LORD, mighty in battle! Lift up your heads, O gates! and be lifted up, O ancient doors! that the King of glory may come in. Who is the King of glory? The LORD of hosts, he is the King of glory!

James Lloyd Norris was reborn to the King of Glory on February 2, 1992.



#### The Norris House Remembered By Mary Hunter Schaub

The railroad that runs in front of the Norris House site was begun during the Civil War to allow Chatham County coal to be supplied to the Confederacy. After the war, its purposes were revised to the peaceful pursuit of commerce. The first substantial local enterprise to make use of the railroad was the large lumber firm founded by J. McC. Ellington. Around 1840, he built a house near the railway line, at what is now 100 South Elm Street. As he prospered, he joined with other prominent citizens to develop the rural land into what became the town of Apex. In November, 1880, Mr. J. A. Norris moved to Apex from the Fuquay area because he needed reliable rail access for his lumber and turpentine business. He bought the Elm Street house from Mr. Ellington, and added on the distinctive tower-centered front section, making what we remember as the Norris House.

A 1959 Raleigh Times article reports the Norris House to be "one of the oldest in this area (and) built of heart pine." Mr. Norris "spent many months getting it ready for his family." His wife died when the ten children were very young. Mr. Norris cared for them with the faithful assistance of Uncle John, an African American servant who was both cook and butler. The banquet-sized dining table regularly accommodated 18 or more, and the fine food and gracious atmosphere caused the Norris House to be known locally as "Hospitality Hall." In those early days, Mr. Norris built two large "summer houses" on the spacious front lawn. These were welcoming shelters for visiting businessmen or friends whose horses were cared for in the lot behind the main house. The picket fence bordering the front lawn was built soon after the Civil War by a Yankee soldier working his way back north. Mr. Norris gave him room and board and a small weekly wage while he constructed the fence. There was a hand-carved gate between posts topped by massive carved knobs.

A 1949 article by Mabel S. Lassiter provides wonderful details on the house. The main section was two stories high, with nine rooms, three halls, and four first-floor porches. In the Victorian tradition, the porches were decorated with delicate

ornamental woodwork. The central tower rose to about a fourstory height, crowned by a shingled cupola. Stairs gave access to the tower's third floor, and then ladders allowed the venturesome to ascend into the cupola where two porticos were enclosed with balustrades. Directly above the symmetrical second story windows, a pair of matching squared dormers flanked the tower. The large center entrance hall was hooded by a gothic arch, and opened into a diagonal hall that extended across the entire house. It was enclosed by "huge beveled doors whose locks still hold the original keys." A breezeway connected the distant kitchen with the servants' quarters. In its prime, the Norris House was lavishly furnished. Many of the pieces were made from black walnut grown on neighboring tracts of land. Attention on one's entry was immediately drawn to the massive walnut newel post supporting the stair railings. A six-inch walnut cornice edged in gilt crowned the top course next to the ceilings, and that decorative design was repeated over the tall, slender windows. These floor-length windows were fitted with interior shutters with movable slats. Miss Maude Norris told Mabel Lassiter, "In those days, there were no screens, so people just walked in and out the (first floor) windows as they would through doors. Too, more light came through windows reaching to the floor surface." The walls were white plastered, and there were eight fireplaces with handmade mantels. Two large brick chimneys extended above the roof level and across about two-thirds of the windowless end walls of the house's front section. Old masters' prints framed in gilt and walnut decorated he walls. There was a profusion of marbletopped tables and old-fashioned hat stands. Among the handmade chairs was a "quaint high-back rocker in constant use for over half a century, constructed with a space to fit the head and the curve of the shoulders." An antique oil lamp with frosted rose glass shade was suspended from the ceiling by slender brass chains.

Not all of these grand relics of the past are gone. A splendid photograph taken by Buddy Holland in the late 1960's shortly before the Norris House was destroyed hangs above the Maynard Pearson House mantel in what is rightly termed "the Norris parlor." That parlor's furniture comes from the Norris House, as do all the dark shutters and two porch balusters. Maude's pedal-operated sewing machine is also on display. A Wheeler and Wilson, a forerunner of the more famous Singer, it was the first sewing machine in this area. Maude was a gifted

needleworker and seamstress. The Maynard Pearson House also has a framed photograph of an elegant dinner party given by Maude Norris. One of the prominent Apex citizens in attendance was Mrs. A. B. Hunter. There is also a framed advertisement from the Garland C. Norris company, with pictures of the founding staff. Garland Norris was one of Maude's brothers. His business operated an office in Apex for many years before moving to Raleigh and then back to Apex. I well recall the colorful designs painted on his big transport trucks—the legend "Golden Tap," with enormous oranges and little children (or elves?) sticking faucet-like taps into the oranges to drain out the juice (Mr. Norris acquired his juice from his Florida operations). Another brother, Herbert, was a respected lawyer and district solicitor, and Julia Montgomery Street, the noted N.C. children's book writer was a niece.

Mr. J. A. Norris died in 1916. Maude and her younger sister Maybelle remained alone together in the Norris House. Maybelle had suffered a birth injury and needed protective care for the rest of her life. Maude considered that responsibility solely hers. She told a family friend, "Maybelle is to stay with me. The Lord and I will take care of her." Long-time Apex residents will remember the inseparable Norris sisters making their regular walks along the main street. As the years passed, the Norris House and the sisters gradually weathered and weakened. My sister Sandra remembers as a child (probably around 1944 when she was about 6) accompanying our grandmother Mrs. O. P. Schaub on a visit to the Norris House for afternoon tea and cookies. Even then, the structure of the house was dangerously decrepit in places. Sandra was an energetic climber, and was drawn to the tempting staircases leading upward toward the great tower. She was deeply disappointed when Miss Maude limited her tour of the house to a walk down a long hall to the back sections, and firmly refused to let her go up any of the stairs. They were entertained in a front parlor. Sandra remembers sitting on a footstool beside Mrs. Schaub's chair. It was like going back a whole century, she recalls in retrospect, and adds that the Norris sisters seemed to belong to that earlier time.

When Mr. Norris constructed the main house, he also had the acre of grounds landscaped by the best gardening expert available. Elms and maples were set to border the front walk. Maude later said that as long as she could remember, there had been a fine planting of blackberry lilies, whose flowers resembled butterfly orchids, and whose seed pods exactly mimicked blackberries. The 1959 article praised Maude's gardening talents in the most glowing terms. Mr. W. L. Blanton, then pastor of Salem Baptist Church, and himself an accomplished gardener, exclaimed over her bountiful vegetable gardens and especially noted

that among her many beautiful flowers, the chrysanthemum appeared to be her favorite. When she was able to pursue gardening, she made countless gifts to friends of flowers and her celebrated homemade relishes and pickles. Mr. Blanton concluded his warm profile, "she is, I believe, the most respected and beloved citizen of our town, and incidentally, our finest gardener."

I doubt that any person who ever saw the Norris House will ever forget its imposing dignity. Even when it declined into deserted semi-ruin, it remained an impressive structure, a very special Apex landmark. Those of us who remember it will never pass by its vacated space without envisioning what the Norris House must have been in its days of inhabited grandeur, and feeling the keenest regret that all efforts to preserve it so that it might be restored were swept aside. When a landmark that has been an integral part of the historical fabric of a town is untimely demolished, it leaves an aching void. The poet Edwin Markham captured that emotion in his poignant eulogy for Abraham Lincoln: "As when a kingly cedar green with boughs/ Goes down with a great shout upon the hills,/And leaves a lonesome place against the sky." For those of us Apex residents who remember the Norris House, there is a lonesome place at 100 South Elm Street.

Were it not for the generosity of the Norris Family and Miss Ann Lydia Olive, granddaughter of Henry Calvin Olive, Apex's first mayor, and a very close friend of the Norris Family, the prized artifacts from the Norris Home would not be on display today. All citizens should regret the loss of such a fine specimen of the past.

In the death of Mrs. Norris, the William Utley Memorial Association sustains a distinct loss. Three years ago at its organization, Mrs. Norris was present and was unanimously elected the genealogist of the Association. Many years of genealogical investigation amply qualified her for the difficult task. She brought to it not only special ability along these lines but an enthusiasm equaled by few; and surpassed by none. She delighted in tracing old family records; and had gathered a fund of

information on the early settlers of Wake and adjoining counties that perhaps no predecessor had approached. In such painstaking investigations she found great pleasure. This type of historical investigation calls for unlimited patience, perseverance, and devotion to the ends in view. Industry is absoulutely essential for sources of information are all to often meager, and many and various kinds of records have to be searched, and information to be relied upon, must be obtained from many sources. All these essential qualifications Mrs. Norris possessed to a marked degree. For many years this type of investigation had been a hobby of hers. And the information she had gathered and distributed had enriched the minds of many relative to their ancestors, the places they came from and the family connections.

We deeply appreciate her services and the contributions she so unselfishly made in the most altruistic manner. And we the members of the William Utley Memorial Association hereby place on record, for permanent preservation, our high esteem of Mrs. Norris as a lady of culture and high character whose long and useful life was unselfishly devoted to her family, friends, and all who sought her services which she rendered gracefully and graciously and whose memory we will cherish always as one worthy of our fondest recollections.

Mrs. Norris was the daughter of the late Jessie Norris of Apex; and was born August 3, 1857. She therefore lacked only a few weeks of having reached her 78th birthday. For many years she had been a resident of Raleigh and an active member of the First Baptist Church. Her husband, the late M. T. Norris, preceded her in death by more than 25 years. She leaves three children (daughters), all of Raleigh, Mrs. J. K. Marshall, Mrs. James McKimmon and Mrs. J. L. Primrose.

Mrs. Norris was for many years a member of the Caswell-Nash Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution, had done much work along genealogical lines for the Chapter, and represented it frequently in Washington City. Her funeral was conducted by Dr. E. McNeil Poteat, pastor of the Pullen Memorial Baptist Church of Raleigh.

Cornelia Alice Norris (8/17/1857-6/22/1935) -m.Matthew Tyson "Tice" Norris(12/19/1849-1/16/1915) The account of their wedding (9/3/1876) was in the Raleigh Sentinel 9/5/1876.

"Our cotton merchants were never more hopeful of futures...At Piney Grove Church Sept.3,1876.By Rev. M. Holleman, Mr. M.T.Norris of this city was married to Miss C.A. Norris, daughter of Jesse A. Norris: A sumptuous feast wasset at the home of the bride's father and many handsome presents were received." Cornelia's father purchased property at 421 N. Blount St., Raleigh, for the couple, and they built a large VIctorian home there. Italianate in style, it was purchased by the Heartts in 1928. The Heartts made extensive changes in the appearance of the house, eliminating Italianate features and replacing them with columns across the front. The place is now owned by the State. Matthew Tyson Norris was son of William H. Norris & Mary Yates Norris & grandson of Col. Samuel Pearson Norris(11/21/1787-2/20/1856) & 1st wife Matilda Utley. Matilda Utley was daughter of John "Jack" Utley Jr.& Charity Jones Utley, Wake Co. Thus, the fathers of Cornelia Alice Norris & Matthew Tyson Norris were half-brothers, making Cornelia and her husband half-first cousins, and they were both grandchildren of Samuel Pearson Norris.

McKimmon's obituary in The Raleigh Times said he was president of McKimmon & McKee and one of the best known insurance men in the State. The McKimmon's home was at 519 N. Blount St. His death at 35 was only a short time before the Great Depression, and his widow was left with five children to support. She became a successful businesswoman in her own right, and her children became well known as community leaders in Raleigh.

James McKimmon was the son of James and Lella Hull McKimmon(b.11/15/1850), Athens, GA, and grandson of James McKimmon & Amelia Pomcrait (he came from N. Ireland & she was of French descent, from Baltimore)

She studied at Peace College and Women's College, UNC, and became one of the State's first 100 women attorneys. In 1934 she began working for the NC Dept. of Revenue and in 1939 se became the second woman attorney to work for the State. She was hired as a law clerk in the Attorney General's office and she later became president and co-owner of Lawyers Title Insurance Co. An accomplished athlete, she won state golf championships repeatedly over a period of 50 years.

### CAPTAIN SAMUEL PEARSON

According to the DAR Blue Book, which gives the lineage of members, Samuel Pearson was a Captain in the North Carolina Line in the American Revolution and was born 1721 in Maryland and died 1802 in Wake County, N. C. He married Mary Simons who was born 1734 and died 1822.

He settled (1740-1750?) in the part of Johnston County which became Wake County, about six or eight miles south of Raleigh on Steephill Creek. He reared a large family and owned a great deal of land. He had a mill on Steephill Creek (mentioned in his Will as his "old mill") which is still standing and is one of the landmarks of the area. Pearsons lost the mill in 1822 and it has changed hands many times since then and is what we now call the mill at Yates Pond.

I also Will that the remainder of my Personal estate be Sold at publick Sale by my Executors giving Nine or Twelve Months Credit, and the money so arising to be equally divided amongst my Six Daughters (to wit) Esther, Charity, Patience, Rachel, Fereby, & Peace.

My Will and desire further is, that my Wife Mary Pearson Enjoy the use of my Negro Pompey and her choice of two Horses during her Widowhood, Notwithstanding the devise of said Negroes & horses to the use of my Six Daughters aforesaid; and at the death or intermarriage of my said Wife, the said Negro Pompey and Horses to be sold as aforesaid for the uses of my said Six Daughters as aforesaid.

Lastly, I do hereby also Constitute and appoint my two Sons Simon Pearson and Preston Pearson to be my executors of this my last Will and Testament, revoking & disannuling all other Wills or Testaments whatsoever, Acknowledgeing this & none other to be my last Will & Testame. In Witness whereof I the Testator have hereunto set my hand & Affixed my Seal, this 30th day of July 1800.



NORRIS, Joseph Private

Resided in Wake County where he enlisted at age 28, 28 May 1861, for the war. Wounded at Seven Pines, Virginia, 31 May 1862. Detailed as a nurse in the Medical Department and was captured in the hospital at Gettysburg, Pennsylvania, 5 July 1863. Confined at Point Lookout, Maryland, until paroled and transferred to City Point, Virginia, where he was received 6 March 1864, for exchange. Captured at Farmville, Virginia, 6 April 1865, and confined at Newport News, Virginia, until released on 26 June 1865, after taking the Oath of Allegiance.

The company, known as "Cedar Forks Rifles," was from Wake and Chatham Counties and enlisted in Wake County on 28 May 1861. It went into the camp of instruction near Company Shops (Burlington), Alamance County, 1 June 1861, and was assigned to this regiment [Sixth Regiment] as Company L After joining the regiment, the company functioned as a part of the regiment, and its history for the war period is recorded as a part of the regimental history. The information contained in the following roster of the company was compiled principally from company muster rolls for 20 June 1861, through February 1864, and 15 September through December 1864. No company muster rolls were found for the period prior to 20 June 1861; for March through 14 September 1864; or for the period after December 1864. In addition to the company muster rolls, Roll of Honor records, receipt rolls, hospital records, prisoner of war records, and other primary records, supplemented by state pension applications, United Daughters of the Confederacy records, and postwar rosters and histories, all provided useful information.







# Flash flood collapses mill at Perry's Pond

By AMY LOWERY Record Staff Writer

Flood waters washed away a Franklin County landmark Sunday.

The mill house at Perry's Mill Pond, located off S.R. 1001 near Pearces, was damaged when torrents of rain poured down.

According to Benny Perry, the mill's owner, the rain caused the pond water to rise, and when it came over the bridge, it washed out the earthen ends of the dam. The middle portion of the mill, however, held firmly. The water

crested around 2 a.m., and the mill col- overall good condition before Sunday's lapsed.

Perry said the area had been subjected to a flash flood, and a hard rain poured down from 7 p.m. to midnight, soaking the area with 10 to 12 inches.

In recent years, the mill house has been used for storage, and antique items in it were damaged during Sunday's rain.

Perry said he'd never had any problems before with damage to the mill during rain. He said it had always "held firmly." He added that the mill was in

downpour.

He said the log cabin located on the property was not damaged nor was the miniature museum within it.

According to Perry, damage hasn't been accessed. He added that he could not say when or how much of the mill could be rebuilt, but that he will go along "day by day." Perry said he will try to reconstruct some of it, but presently it's in "a state of disrepair."

The North Carolina Department of Archives and History designated the mill as a historic landmark and a popular site in 1976. The mill is also listed with "Old Mills of the United States."

Perry said schools use the area for the background in their yearbook pictures, and weddings are held there. In addition, he said people still fish a lot in the pond.

The mill's history dates back to 1778, when Joseph Norris built a gristmill on the banks of Little Crooked Creek. Norris created a rock dam, forming a pond for the mill. The stream was renamed Norris Creek for the mill's owner, and since then the water has come to be known as Perry's Mill Pond.

She was 63 years a zealous and consistent member of the Baptist Church. The history of her life is briefly told, she lived the life of a Christian, and her end was the reward of the righteous."

Mabel Bridges' father, according to a letter from Mrs. Vann Stringfield, was William Bridges. Also there is a reference to the

Wake County, NC, census for 1850, page 378.

There were 12 children, according to a letter dated Feb. 6, 1955, from Ione Parker of St. Augustine, Fla. (She was the daughter of Kate Holland and the granddaughter of Alfred Holland). Mrs. Parker listed the names of 5 children. The same 5 names, plus an additional 5 names, appear in records compiled by Irma Ragan Holland (she was the second wife of Claude Franklin Holland) and by Herbert Benoy (he was the gt.-grandson of James Theophilus and Lucy Ann Beckwith Adams). We do not have the names of the other 2 children.
