Dear Phil:

Thank you for your letter o 22 June 1988 in regard to our Morgan-Upchurch family. First, let me say "there is no perfect genealogy" - everyone seems to get different answers on something.

I am enclosing copies of some information I have accumulated that might give you a clue to help in your research. My grandfather, William H. Morgan, brother of Rosina Morgan Upchurch, was born 1844 in Montgomery County, North Carolina. His parents, Willis Morgan and Bethany (Bailey) Delamothe were married in Montgomery Co., N. C. in 1839 - entered into a marriage bond as Bethany was the widow of Henry Delamothe; had two daughters and property of her own. They resided in Montgomery County until about 1846 when they moved to Campbell County, Ga. Thus, Rosina, John T. and William H. were born in Montgomery Co., N. C., and a daughter Mary Etta was born in 1848 in Campbell County, Ga. being the only one of the children born in Georgia.

Campbell County was a very small county, a part formed from Coweta Co., and it remained Campbell County approximately 100 years before becoming Fulton County. The 1901 Dept. of Agriculture publication, Georgia: Historical and Industrial. describes Campbell Co. as having a population in 1830 of 3,323, but the county had only been established in 1828. By 1900 it had grown to 9,518. Palmetto was shown to have 620 persons in its corporate limits, and its entire militia district totaled 1,478 inhabitants. Fairburn, the county seat, had 761 population, but including the Fairburn district, the population was 2,461. The area of the County - 205 square miles or 131,200 acres. Campbell Co. has about 2,500 acres of forest land, mostly pine and oak. The two principal towns were Fairburn and Palmetto.

In 1928 my uncle, my Dad's eldest brother, wrote a Morgan history, see copy enclosed. It does have errors, but I have found it helpful in my research. At this time my grandmother was living and in her mid-eighties but sharp of mind and memory. I'm sure she must have given a lot of the information to my uncle. He was a lawyer and his wife a teacher so both were educated and had been back to North Carolina on occasions. He mentions the Upchurch family but it doesn't quite agree with the information you have, i.e. two sons, Tom and Will, preceded the mother in death. You mention Walter William or William Walter. He was called Walter. There was a son Willis Gay Upchurch who must have been "Will". However, record shows his death in 1958. In 1880, about December, my grandparents moved from Campbell County, Georgia, to Coryell Co., Texas, and lived there until 1915 when they moved to Oklahoma. This would be reasonable that Walter Upchurch moved at the same time or maybe a bit sooner as my grandfather's brother John T. Morgan moved to Coryell Co. before the 1880 census. I don't know when Walter and family moved to Athens but they were there in 1928.

When I was in Atlanta last year I xeroxed pages from "Campbell County Georgia Cemeteries, Book I, Fairburn City Cemetery. I may have sent you a copy. In case I didn't, the following Upchurch graves are mentioned:

Note the wife of Willis Gay Upchurch is shown as Frances Miller Oct. 6, 1874- Jan. 13, 1957. Fran Lomas wrote she was Florence Elizabeth Miller (Oct. 6, 1874 - 13 Jan. 1896) married 26 Aug. 1891. Difference in death dates.

I suppose, to answer your question, we'll never know if Rosina died in Fairburn or Palmetto. My uncle wrote "died near Fairburn" - well it could have been near Palmetto as they are only a stone's throw apart. I am enclosing a copy of the will of Willis Morgan who died in 1862 - he gives to Rosina a negro girl named Ann and Rosina was not to receive any other portion of the estate until the other children received an amount equal to the value of the slave. At this time Rosina was the only child married except Bethany's daughter Elizabeth. Bethany died in June 1867 but left no will. In December of 1867 the children deeded the property to A. S. Whitaker, Trustee. See copy of deed. The land is described as originally being in Coweta, now Campbell Co.

I submitted two articles to The Heritage of Montgomery County, North Carolina, which were printed in their book in 1981. Enclosed copy. Other enclosures: (1) Abstract of J. W. Upchurch will (2) Family sheets and copies of tombstones of Rosina and J. W. Upchurch and Rosina's sister, Mary E. Smith and Abner B.

Of names and addresses I received from you, I selected Miss Florence R. Upchurch of Gastonia, N. C. because I thought the "R" might be Rosina and she lived in N.C. She did answer. She is the daughter of Edward Franklin Upchurch who was son of J. W. and Rosina. She knew nothing of her Grandmother Upchurch's family.

It seems that Florence R.'s father, Edward Franklin Upchurch, never spoke of his mother much in her hearing except to tell about how living as he was growing up, was very hard and that his mother had to cope with helping to make a living for them, raising food, animals, and crops, etc. and he related various incidents. That she seemed to do it very well considering the times and circumstances (the South in the aftermath of the Civil War even though the period when he was growing up was from 1873 - 1890-1892) speaks well for her. Florence's mother told her that Rosina never approved of her marriage to Edward Franklin and made her opinions known; therefore her feelings about Rosina were not very favorable. Edward F. left home when he was 18 or 19 and was not married until he was 36 and his wife was 24. He worked for a railroad bridge construction company and traveled extensively all over the south, west and midwest wherever bridges were being built. He met Florence's mother in Iowa, a small town, and they married there. The wife was a "Yankee" in Rosina's eyes and never forgot it, so Florence's mother said. After about 6 months of their marriage he quit the construction company to settle down and had half ownership in and operated a large general store in Iowa. In 1919 they moved to New York state. Florence's father died in 1958. In 1957 Florence moved to North Carolina and her mother came to live with her. Also a younger sister lives in North Carolina.

I enjoyed her letter and appreciated her writing. I could understand very clearly Rosina's version. My grandfather was just like that. Reading more of Georgia's part in the war I found most of the family served in the Confederacy, including J. W. Upchurch, A. B. Smith, my grandfather and the brother, John T. Morgan. Rosina may have received a Confederate pension - if so, it would give you a lot of information. If interested, check that out - may show where she died when they notified the pension bureau of her death to stop the pension.

Sorry - this is much too much in detail. Maybe you have picked up some thought worth while. I'm still stuck on my Morgan research in North Carolina - Montgomery County burned and I can't find proof that Willis's father was Charlie or Charles as my uncle thinks.

A. B. Smith and his wife Mary E. Smith, Thos. W. Wilkerson and his wife, Elizabeth Wilkerson and J. W. Upchurch and his wife Rosina Upchurch all of legal age and legal heirs of the estate of Willis Morgan late of said County and State of the first part and A. S. Whitaker Trustee for his wife Louise M. Whitaker and her children of said county and State of the other part: Witnesseth that the legal heirs of the estate of Willis Morgan deceased as aforesaid and as named above for and in consideration of the sum of four hundred dollars to them to them in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath this day bargained, sold and conveyed unto the said A. S. Whitaker trustee for his wife and her children, their heirs and assigns all of the West half of lot of land number Sixty one (61) except one acre lying in the Southeast corner of said half lot of land and three acres more or less out of South West corner being West of Phillips' Ferry Road leading out of Palmetto West, and bounded by said Road on the East, being in the Seventh district of originally Coweta, now Campbell County, leaving in said described premises ninety seven and one fourth acres more or less, also ten acres of lot number thirty Six of said district and county lying in the North East corner of said lot bounded on the east by lot number Sixty-one and on the North by public Road on the West by road leading from Mrs. Mary Jones' to Palmetto running along said Road to a Stake corner and thence east until it reaches original line of lot of land number sixty-one.

To have and to hold the said described premises to the said A. S. Whitaker Trustee for wife Louise M. Whitaker and her children together with all and singular the rights members and appurtenances thereto appertaining and belonging to their heirs, assigns, executors and administrators in fee simple, said described premises being bought with the proceeds obtained and accruing from Mortgage and Rents of Trust property in the city of Atlanta of which said A. S. Whitaker is trustee for his wife Louise M. Whitaker and her children, said trust property being created and held as aforesaid for their own use and benefit, and the said bargained and described premises the said W. H. Morgan, John T. Morgan. A. B. Smith and his wife Mary E. Smith, Thos. W. Wilkerson and his wife Elizabeth Wilkerson, and J. W. Upchurch and his wife, Rosina Upchurch, all of legal age as aforesaid and heirs of the estate of Willis Morgan deceased as aforesaid, their heirs, assigns, executors and administrators will forever defend the right and title thereof against all other persons whatsoever. In Witness Whereof we and each of us hereunto affix our hands and seals on the day and year above written.

## WILLIAM HARRISON "HARRIS" MORGAN

William Harrison (Harris) Morgan was born May 17, 1844, in Montgomery County, N.C., near where the Yadkin and Uwharrie Rivers join to form the Pee Dee River. He was son of Willis and Bethany Bailey (Delamothe) Morgan. When he was two years old the family moved to Campbell Co., Ga.; where he resided until December 7, 1880, when he moved to Coryell Co., Texas.

In 1864 Wm. Harrison Morgan married Lourena M. Woodley, an orphan, in Campbell Co., Ga. In 1867 he was converted and joined the Methodist Church. In November 1915 he, with two sons and their families moved to Marlow, Okla., where he died April 6, 1927

after a lengthy illness, age 82 yrs. Lourena Morgan, his widow, died December 2, 1938, age 92 yrs. They are buried in Marlow Cemetery.

Children: Thomas Anderson Morgan (1866-1933) married Emma Laurine Percy. Bethaney Ada Morgan (1867-1962) married William L. Bond. Henry Asbery Morgan (1870-1933) married Anna Hodge. James Alston Morgan (1872-1906) married Martha C. Chatham.

Guy Algin Morgan (1874-1928) married Annie Thompson. Lourena Adella Morgan (1876-1910) married William H. Chatham. John Sidney Morgan (1878-1882) died age 4 years. Mittie Popie Morgan (1882-1961) married Robert L. Murphy. William Pruitt Morgan (1884-1955) married Sarah Elizabeth Nevins. Sophronia Gertrude Morgan (1888-1977) married William Preston Irby.

The Morgans were a close-knit family, and after church on Sundays gathered for dinner and visiting. Wm. Harrison, affectionately known to his friends and neighbors as "Uncle Harris" was known as a peace maker. When an argument arose in the community they came to him, he listened, prayed with them and helped to solve their problems.

As Wm. H. Morgan grew into manhood so did the controversy between the North and South. Having a deep love of the South and a firm belief in the rightness of the South's cause, when war came he, at the tender age of 18 yrs., enlisted at Palmetto, Ga. in 1862 as Second Corporal, Co. 1, 2nd Georgia Cavalry, Forrest's Brigade. Later at Murfreesboro he was taken from line of battle and promoted to Orderly Sergeant. In 1863 he was promoted to 2nd Lieutenant under F.M. Harrell, enrolling officer for the Western Army. He was in the

battles of Munfordsville, Ky., Murfreesboro, Tenn., Chickamauga, Missionary Ridge, Ga.; Peachtree Creek, around Atlanta, and others.

He was fortunate that he went through the war never being captured or wounded. He never answered sick call but once, and that was occasioned by starvation. He said that for eight days their rations was only a small biscuit and a small piece of cornbread. He served until the end of the war. There is much more information of his war activities given in the book "Reminiscences of the Boys in Gray 1861-1865" compiled in 1914 by Miss Mamie Yearry of McGregor, Texas.

Wm. Harrison Morgan, a farmer and barterer, accumulated sufficient wealth to live comfortably in his retirement years. At his death, Dr. R. L. Montgomery, physician and editor of The Marlow Review, a weekly newspaper, wrote a two column tribute to Mr. Morgan, which concluded, "No man in this community was more respected; no one more revered for his noble qualities. He has given us an example of honor, courage, and industry that should be an inspiration to the citizenship of this community and a legacy more precious than gold to his posterity. He was a sweet Christian that trusted in God with the simple child-like faith of Stonewall Jackson, who believed that God presided over the destinies of men and nations. He was a dynamo that was ever sending Christian currents through the community. His purity of life, his rectitude of conduct, his shining light has been a benediction to the world. The influence of a good man does not die, it lives through eternity — it is immortal."

## WILLIS MORGAN

Willis Morgan was born 6 January, 1811 in North Carolina. On 11 April, 1839 he entered into a marriage bond with Bethaney Delamothe in Montgomery County, North Carolina, attested to by E. F. Morgan. The marriage contract was proven in Montgomery County Court July Session 1839 by the oath of E. Frank Morgan and ordered to be registered. The Raleigh Register of August 25, 1826, reported the marriage of Henry Delamoth, Esq. to Miss Bailey on 1 August, 1826. Henry Delamothe was a native of France and is listed in Montgomery County as early as 1796 as "Henri De La Mothe." At the time of Bethaney Bailey Delamothe's marriage to Willis Morgan she had a small daughter, Sarah Elizabeth "Lizzie" who was born 25 October, 1838, and after her marriage to Willis Morgan the daughter also took the name of Morgan.

Bethaney Bailey was born 10 December, 1806 in North Carolina. The Morgans are Scotch-Irish descent and most were planters and slaveholders. Willis Morgan and family resided in Montgomery County near where the Yadkin and Uwharrie Rivers come together and form the PeeDee River, until about 1846 when they moved to Campbell Co. (now Fulton Co.), Georgia. The Morgan families were usually large; reportedly Willis had about nine brothers and sisters. His brother, Henry Morgan, was born December 1812 in Montgomery Co., married Elizabeth Dennis April 1845, moved to Georgia, then to Camp Co., Texas where he died 26 July 1902.

Willis Morgan and wife, Bethaney, deeded to Nelson and Parsons Harris in 1849 "the life estate of Bethaney Morgan, the late widow of Henry Delamothe, deceased, tract in Montgomery Co. East side of PeeDee River, beginning Mouth of Island Creek to Mouth of Uwharrie, up Uwharrie to Mouth of Dutch Mill."

On 14 June 1855, in Coweta County, Ga. Sarah Elizabeth Morgan, daughter of Bethaney Delamothe, was married to Thomas W. Wilkerson. Thomas and Elizabeth Wilkerson moved to Jack County, Texas, and 13 December, 1882 she died at Post Oak, Jack Co., her husband having preceded her in death on 30 March, 1879.

Willis and Bethaney Morgan were the parents of the following: (1) Rosannah Morgan (1840-1915) born in Montgomery Co., N.C., married J.W. Upchurch, died at Fairburn, Campbell Co., Ga. (2) John T. Morgan (1842-1922) born in Montgomery Co., N.C. and died in Callahan Co., Texas. (3) William Harrison Morgan (1844-1927) born in Montgomery Co., N.C., married Lourena M. Woodley in Campbell Co., Ga. and died in Marlow, Stephens Co., Okla. (4) Maryetta Morgan (1848-1894) born Campbell Co., Ga., married Abner Bailey Smith, and died near Fairburn, Ga.

After Willis Morgan's death 19 August 1862, near Palmetto, Campbell Co., Ga., his widow, Bethaney Morgan, continued to manage the plantation. Times were difficult. The North was at war with the South, farmers grew their own cotton and sheep, the cotton and

wool was spun into thread and woven into material by the female members of the family and the slaves. Bethaney Morgan died 7 June, 1867 at the plantation near Palmetto, where she was buried next to her husband in a family plot on the plantation.

Lourena Woodley Morgan, daughter-in-law, of Bethaney and Willis Morgan, often related the kindness of Bethaney Morgan. When General Sherman marched on Atlanta and ordered everything burned, some of his soldiers came to the Morgan home; one officer recognized Mrs. Morgan and asked if she were the widow of Willis Morgan of Montgomery Co., N.C. After learning that she was, he told his men to take rations from the kitchen but to spare this widow her home. Lourena Woodley's mother had died of chills and fever in White Co., Ark., about 1859, and in 1860 her father died after moving his family back to Carroll Co., Ga. Lourena was then sent to live with an aunt who was a neighbor to the Morgan family.

William H. "Harris" Morgan, Bethaney's youngest son, had met and courted Lourena but at age 16 had volunteered for war. On one trip home, Mrs. Morgan told him "Harris, if you love Lou, marry her now, so she can come live with me." They were married in 1864, and Lourena moved in with her mother-in-law until the end of the war. While living with her aunt, Lourena had been forced to work at the looms with the slaves, and it was this gesture of Mrs. Morgan's taking her into her home as a daughter that she never forgot.

A brief history of the Morgan family, so far as known by T.A. Morgan. This from family history.

The Morgans are of Scotch-Irish descent. Two brothers came to North America among the early settlers of the United States, and landed somewhere near Plymouth. They lived in that vicinity and in the colony of Virginia for some time. One of the brothers and family moved to North Carolina and the other brother went to South Carolina.

We are the descendants of the North Carolina branch. My Grandfather Charley Morgan reared the following children; Hardy Morgan, Spence Morgan, Joe Morgan, John Morgan, Henry Morgan, Nancy Morgan, Allie Morgan, Willis Morgan, and I think there was a Richard Morgan and a daughter whose name I do not recall.

Several of the North Carolina branch moved to Georgia, Tennessee and Kentucky. Willis Morgan, Henry Morgan and Nancy (Morgan) Dennis moved to Georgia. John Morgan moved to Kentucky. I think one of the girls married a Stuart and she moved to Tennessee. Henry Morgan later moved to Texas and died in Camp County near Leesburg.

I know but few of the relatives in North Carolina., But Joe Morgan died there. He left a son, Willis Morgan and two daughters, whose names I cannot recall. Henry Morgan left two daughters, Peggy Scoggins, of Atlanta Georgia, she is now dead. The other was Ida Bailey of Hunt County, near Caddo Mills. John Morgan died in Kentucky and left several sons and daughters but I can recall the name of only one- Cameline Grugett.

Willis Morgan died in Campbell County, Ga., and left surviving, his widow, Bethany Morgan and the following children; John Morgan, Rosina (Morgan) Upchurch, Harrison Morgan, and Etta (Morgan) Smith. He also left a step daughter, Lizzie Wilkerson, who went by the name of Morgan.

Every one except the family will likely contend that she was a daughter. However, she was a daughter of a French Doctor - Dr. Dilamoth. When she married the license was issued in the name of Lizzie Dilamoth. She was the wife of Thomas W. Wilkerson. Lizzie Wilkerson and Thomas Wilkerson died and were buried in Jack County, Texas at Post Oak.

John Morgan died at Baird, Texas and I think buried near Clyde, Texas. John Morgan was survived by the following children: Willis Morgan, Salt Creek, New Mexico, Charley Morgan, Clyde Morgan, Nobia (Morgan) Haley, Ames, Texas, Walter Morgan, Clyde, Texas, Reece Morgan, Ames, Texas, Rosina (Morgan) Upchurch died near Fairburn, Ga., and is buried there. She is survived by the following: John Upchurch, Molly (Upchurch) Kilpatrick, Alonzo Upchurch, <sup>→ L. WILLIAM WALTER U. ↗</sup> Walter Upchurch, who is now living near Athens, Texas, Will Upchurch and Tom Upchurch died prior to the death of their mother, Ed Upchurch and Robert Upchurch.

The family of Rosina Upchurch (nee Morgan) except Walter, are living in Fulton or Campbell County Ga., or they are buried there. Etta (Morgan) Smith died near Fairburn, Ga., She is survived by the following children; Sidney Smith, near Lewaine, Ark., Jinny (Smith) Camp, died prior to the death of her mother. She was the wife of Dr. Bill Camp. She is buried in Fairburn, Ga. Ed Smith who has since died, and I believe he was buried in Fairburn, Ga., Nevie Cawthorn and Gertrude Suttles are now living in Atlanta, Ga. Belle Brownie, Rosie--- and Dora are all buried near East Point. William Harrison Morgan died April 6, 1927 in Marlow, Oklahoma. He is buried in Marlow. William Harrison Morgan was born May 17, 1844 near where the Addkin and Huara Rivers come together and form the pedee River, in what was at that time, Montgomery County, North Carolina. He with his parents, Willis Morgan and Bethany Morgan moved to Campbell County, Ga., in 1846. William Harrison Morgan with his family moved to Coryell County, Texas, arriving there December 7, 1880. They settled on a farm on Owl Creek in the southeastern part of Coryell County.

He moved to Marlow, Oklahoma in November 1915. William Harrison Morgan's survivors were; Thomas A. Morgan, Marlow, Oklahoma, W.P. Morgan, Marlow Okla. Girtie (Morgan) Irby, Near Marlow, Okla., on route 5. Ada (Morgan) Bond Gatesville, Texas, H.A. Morgan, Moffat, Texas, Guy Morgan, Gatesville, Texas. Guy Morgan died January 5th 1928 and was buried at Gatesville, Texas. Mittie (Morgan) Murphy, who lives on a route out of Gatesville, Near Straws Mill, Texas. There was a son, John Sidney Morgan who died November 22, 1882 Near The Grove, Texas and is buried in the Flint Creek cemetery. Lourina Della (Morgan) Chatham died in Gatesville, Texas and is buried there. *J. Alston Morgan died and is buried in the Gatesville Cemetery June 1906*

**ADDITIONAL INFORMATION**

Bethany Bailey Delamothe had two daughters while married to Henry Delamothe. Nancy born 28 November 1835 North Carolina, and Sarah Elizabeth born 25 Oct. 1838. Henry Delamothe died 1838 - his will dated 10 Sept. 1838 names Elizabeth - so she was probably born 25 Aug. 1838.

No further information on the first daughter, Nancy, but Sarah Elizabeth took the name of Morgan after her mother's marriage to Willis G. Morgan. On 14 June 1855 Sarah Elizabeth Morgan was married to Thomas W. Wilkerson in Campbell Co., Ga. They moved to Jack County, Texas in late 1800's - both died there. There is a belated response to your letter of 9 JAN 87. Just yesterday and today have I found time to extract the details in your letter. Quite a few profiles have now been created on the individuals of concern to you. This will trigger a response if I encounter some data of special interest to you.

Enclosed herewith is a copy of my 3 page outline for folkso Wilson Upchurch, his children and grand-children. Not shown on the left such as 42A, 13A, etc indicate a continuation of the outline for later generations. Let me know if you need copies of these combination sheets.

I don't have any more details re Miller & I being a doctor. From your information it seems to be not. This information of mine came from Martha Lucy W, a gd of JWA & Emma. Lucy was an outstanding woman in several fields and did much original research on the Upchurch family. I never met her but have seen letters she wrote to others. Unfortunately her records seem to have been destroyed.

There is a son of Ray Connor U (see outline) who lives here in Tucson - Jerry U. I have met him and he is nice but not really interested in genealogy. He is from Fairburn, GA and has two sisters there. I have written them but without a response.

During the period 1980-1985 I had a fair amount of correspondence with Mrs. Therese Rosina Upchurch, 1217 Kenilworth Dr, Gardner NC 28052 Phone 867-0240. I have not heard from her since the fall of 1985. She was b. 26 MAR 1910 so that may be a factor. Initially she provided quite a list but finally stopped responding and I did not press. You might try her. She seemed quite literate but short on resources.

My best correspondent, and still active, in the J.W.U. family is Robert Clard Upchurch, Jr, 4125 Somerset Lane, Kent, WA 98032 Phone 852-3469. He has a fair amount of interest but I don't know how much knowledge he has.

I am not a descendant of J.W.U. He was my grandfather and cousin.

If you want to go into more depth on any issue or individuals, past or present, please let me know. It seems likely that your relatives and my relatives probably intermarried in some other case since they lived in the same area in NC & GA over a long period of time. You never know when the next cross link

Thank you for your reply of 2 January 1987 to my letter of 28 December 1986 in regard to the Jethro Upchurch family, and in particular to his wife, Rosina Morgan Upchurch. As you surmised, my interest is in the Morgan family. Wish I had an Upchurch line more closely related as your Upchurch Bulletin sounds great.

Are you descended from Jethro W. and Rosina? I am enclosing some evidence and proof I have accumulated over the years - really hadn't done much on the Upchurch family as no contacts I have made seem to know much about them. Mrs. Fran Lomas of San Angelo, Texas placed a query in "Stalkin Kin", a quarterly published in her area of Texas. In reply to my letter she gave certain information on the Jethro Wilson Upchurch family together with your name and address. Mrs. Lomas listed 8 children for J. W. and Rosina as did J. W.'s will. Due to the dates of birth shown for the children it is believed there possibly were others who may have died young. As soon as I can go to the Dallas Library I plan to check the 1900 and 1910 census records of Georgia - the 1900 in particular will show the number of children born and the number living when the census was taken.

As with many family records there seems to be errors in our stories. What source was given that Willis Morgan, father of Rosina, was a doctor. All census records show him as "farmer". I know he had a plantation and many slaves, but this is the first statement I have heard that he was an M.D. My grandmother was a sister-in-law of Rosina. My grandmother was 91+ years young when he died in 1938. She lived with us 12 years after my grandfather's death. She was a civil war bride, lived in or near Palmetto, with a guardian, Elizabeth and Wm. M. Richardson, who were neighbors of Willis Morgan and Bethany Bailey Morgan. In 1864 she married Wm. H. Morgan and at that time went to live with her mother-in-law, Bethany Morgan, as my grandfather was serving in the confederacy and was away from home much of the time. After the war ended they operated a grocery store in old Campbell Co., near Palmetto. Grandma knew the family as her own and told us much about the Morgan family but no mention was ever made that Willis was a doctor.

In 1972 my husband and I went to Georgia and visited a descendant of Maryetta Morgan Smith and Abner B. Smith - Maryetta was the youngest of Willis's children and Rosina was the eldest. Maryetta's grandson, Edward Burdette (now deceased) lived in East Point, just out of Atlanta, and we visited a day with him and his wife. Edward and Pauline took us back to the old Morgan plantation grounds and we walked down to the old cemetery where Willis and Bethany are buried. Later he drove us to the Fairburn Cemetery and showed us where various family members are buried. We took pictures but it was a very cloudy day and the pictures didn't turn out as we wanted. See xerox of pictures taken. My proof that Rosina and J. W. are buried in Fairburn.

Rosina Morgan may have lived on the Morgan plantation during the war with her mother, but she did not inherit the property. See will of Willis Morgan. The deed records show that in 1867 (Deed Bk. G, p. 146) W. H. Morgan and John T. Morgan, A. B. Smith and his wife, Mary E. Smith, Thos. W. Wilkerson and his wife, Elizabeth Wilkerson, and J. W. Upchurch and his wife, Rosina Upchurch, all of legal age, and legal heirs of Willis Morgan, late of said county and state, deceased, of the first part and A. S. Whitaker, Trustee for his wife, Louisa M. Whitaker and her children, of the second part . . . deeded land west of Phillip's Ferry Road . . . being in the 7th District of originally Coweta now Campbell Co. . . . also mentions land being near Palmetto.

△ The marriage records of Coweta County show license issued J. W. Upchurch and Rosena Morgan March 17, 1859. This probably accounts for your record showing them married in Palmetto while I show Coweta County.

△ + △ + △ Bethany Bailey was first married to Henry Delamothe - one child, Elizabeth, was born about 1838. Willis Morgan and Bethany were married 1839 and Elizabeth took the name of Morgan. She married Thos. W. Wilkerson.

I am enclosing a family sheet for Willis and Bethaney (Bethany). It was started in 1972 and information has been added from time to time. Am in the process of making new family sheets but want to prove more little items before recording them.

The enclosed picture taken in 1910 was at my grandfather's home and his brother John T., and sister, Rosina, are visiting. Thought some Upchurch subscriber might like to see Rosina.

I correspond with W. R. (Ralph) Burdette of Mableton, Ga. - he is a cousin of the Edward Burdette we visited in 1972. Ralph is now 80 or 81 and in failing health but of sound mind. He and wife visited us a few years ago and are interested in the Morgan family. With what I have furnished him he has been able to visit the area of the Morgan plantation. He wrote that a modern home, light brick, has recently been constructed where the old Morgan home once stood. Some Smith descendant is interested in clearing the old cemetery where Willis and wife are buried - the cemetery is now overgrown with pine trees, vines and weeds. I am quite interested in this project and hope it can be accomplished.

I would like the name and address of a descendant of J. W. and Rosina Upchurch who might have some Morgan records they will share in exchange for information I have.

Sorry for such a lengthy letter but hope I have helped someone. In particular I would like the proof that Willis was an M.D. Rosina was born in North Carolina - I think Montgomery Co. Willis and family moved from Montgomery Co., N. C. to Georgia when my grandfather was about 8 years old (about 1846) and Maryetta was the only child born in Georgia.

Thank you for your cooperation.

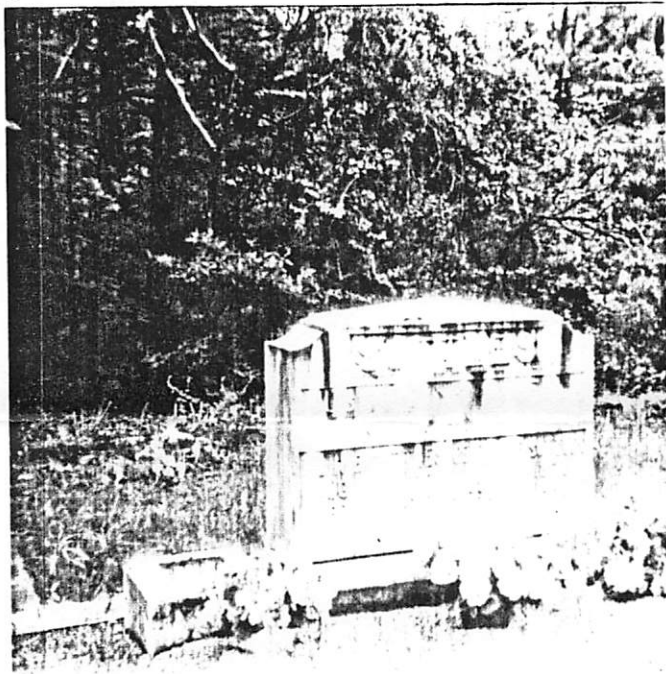

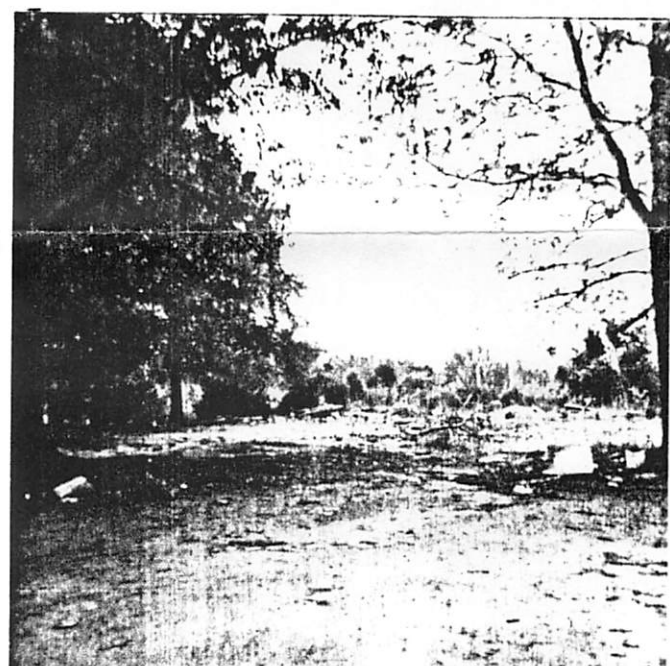

Dear Mrs Martin,

I have spent most of today extracting the details provided in and with your letter of 3 JUL 1987. Our common interest comes about because Rosina Morgan and Jethro Wilson U. The details you sent have helped me to improve the outline on J.W. U considerably. Also other sources have appeared as well so that the outline is getting better all the time. I agree with you that J.W. U has only 8 children and the J.A. U b 1853 is not one of them. There is, of course, the J.A. U b 3 FEB 1866 who is a son.

I have discovered that another son William Walter U (sometimes called Walter William U) is on the 1910 census of Coryell Co, TX. I understand some of your heritage is there. Just a coincidence I suppose.

I would appreciate it if we could compare notes on the movements of Jethro and Rosina. Perhaps you can correct or confirm my under-

standing or name some confusion. I understand Rosina was probably born in Montgomery Co, NC. Jethro was born in GA but I am not sure which county. They married in Coweta Co, GA. I show their first child as b 6 JAN 1861 in Fairburn, GA and the next three ( 1962, 3 FEB 1866 and 16 AUG 1868) in GA but I am not sure where. Then they moved to Clay Co, AL with births 11 MAY 1871, 11 NOV 1875, 22 JUN 1876 and 1878. I assume the last four were all born in Clay Co, AL. Other close relatives of Jethro also moved to Clay Co, AL. I think we are agreed that Rosina's father owned a plantation at Palmetto, GA which is a few miles SW of Fairburn but both still living in Fulton Co, GA. I understand Rosina went back to Palmetto during the civil war. Perhaps Jethro came back to her there and they stayed on the plantation until they moved to Clay Co, AL in time for the birth on 11 MAY 1871. This would mean the 3 FEB 1866 and 16 AUG 1868 births were on the plantation at Palmetto. However, it could be that Jethro had land up or near Fairburn or that he stayed on land of his father or other family members. My records show that Rosina & Jethro died at Palmetto. I am thus in keeping with your information. Certainly we know that they are buried at Fairburn.

Then indicates they probably would lead to the Fulton Co, GA area from Clay Co, AL in their old age. Of course their bodies could have been brought back to Fairburn from Clay Co, AL for burial but I think it more likely that they actually moved back. The 1890 census of Clay Co, AL and Fulton Co, GA might be informative but I do not have them (yet). Any light you can shed on this would be appreciated.

Perhaps you know details about Roscoe parents & their plantation in the period 1840-1900 including who lived at home & the inheritance, etc.

If my updated outline for father & Roscoe would be helpful to you please let me know. There are still quite a few missing details but every few weeks something happens to improve it.

Perhaps by now you have sensed some other aspect of family history that would be of mutual interest. I will always be a pleasure to correspond. Let me know if I can help.

Thank you for your letter of 20 June 1987 regarding the above family together with enclosures.

As requested I am enclosing my lineage chart and some family group sheets which will make a clearer picture of my descent. I am not, at this time, persuing further the Upchurch family; perhaps at a later date time will permit me to research some in Alabama to fill in some gaps. I appreciate your entering my family in your records for a possible clue to my Morgan line.

In late March, my daughter and I flew to Atlanta and visited the Georgia State Archives. We had a ball and found a wealth of information on my Grandmother Morgan's ancestors. I checked a little on the Upchurch family but found very little. There was a Campbell County Georgia Cemeteries Book which included an index of the Fairburn Cemetery - see enclosed. → Put in Cemetery File - R.M.  
The typist transposed the date of death of Rosina (showed 1951 instead of 1915) - I called the attention of the librarian to it and she had me complete a form correcting it - this was placed in the Upchurch family file.

The family sheet I prepared from an abstract of the will of Jethro Wilson Upchurch correspondence with Fran Lomas of San Angelo, Texas, and cemetery records differs some from your outline. I came up with 8 children while you have 9. You show J. A. Upchurch b. 7 August 1858, died 7 Oct. 1923. Does he really belong to this family? Jethro and Rosina married 17 March 1859 which is about 7 months after the birth of this child. I took the J. A. Upchurch in the will abstract to be Joseph Alonzo born 1866 and died 1932.

Thanks again for your cooperation and if I can furnish you more information please let me know.
