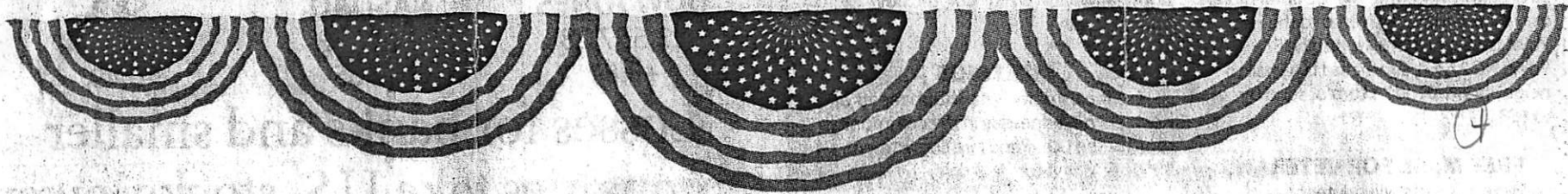
one night to get my medicine re-ordered.

# Jay Wagner edges Bruce Davis in mayoral race

**HIGH POINT** — Jay Wagner appears to have defeated Bruce Davis in the High Point mayor's race Tuesday, but the contest may not officially be over.

Wagner led Davis by 53 votes — 4,609 to 4,556 — with all 42 precincts reporting results.

By state election statute, since the margin is within 1 percent — 49.98 percent to 49.40 percent — Davis has the right to request a recount, pending the outcome of the election canvass next Friday.

The canvass involves consideration of votes that weren't counted on Election Day, which can include provisional and mailed-in ballots. During the canvass, the Board of

Elections makes the vote official.

Davis said Tuesday night that he had not decided whether he will request a recount.

"I know we put it all out there. My team worked very hard," he said. "We knocked on thousands

of doors, passed out thousands of pieces of literature and did everything in our power."

Wagner said Tuesday night he's confident his margin of victory will hold up after the canvass and a possible recount.

"As recounts go, they generally hold up. There might be a few votes that swing one way or another," he said. "Obviously, I'm relieved and I'm happy. We worked really hard. I do empathize with Bruce, because I've lost before."

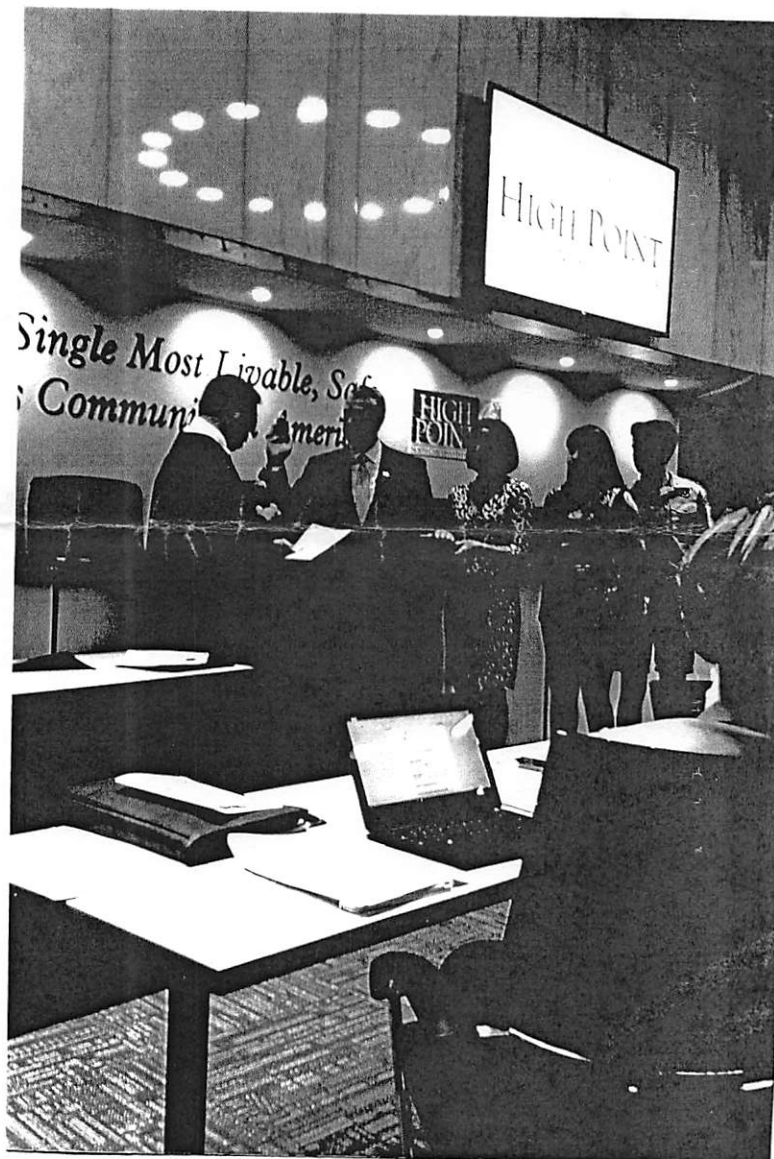
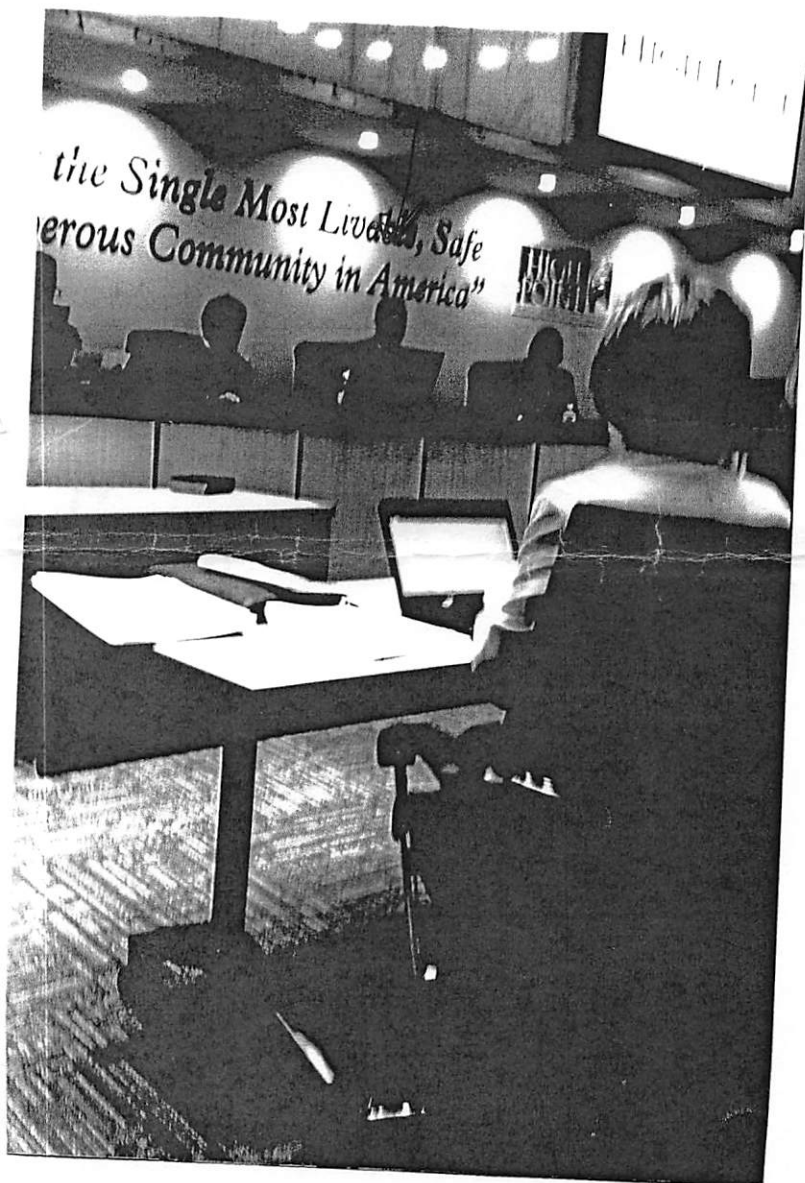
The last city race that was this close came in 2014, when Britt Moore led Latimer Alexander by

30 votes for the second at-large City Council seat after results were in on election night.

Following the canvass, Alexander edged ahead by 14 votes, due largely to more than 700 mail-in absentee ballots from across Guilford County that were postmarked by Election Day but not tallied until the days following the election.

Wagner, who has held the Ward 4 seat on the City Council since 2012, has been a strong proponent of the city's proposed stadium as a way to spark redevelopment of the downtown area. He said the election outcome showed support among the public for the stadium and other council actions.

"I'm happy with the other races. I think we kind of had a clean sweep, although my race was very, very close," Wagner

said. "I think it really is kind of a mandate. I think we have broken with the past, so I'm excited to lead the council going forward."

Davis, a former member of the Guilford County Board of Commissioners and current chairman of the High Point Convention & Visitors Bureau, campaigned on

his elected experience and leadership ability. He's also a stadium supporter, but has criticized the city's approach in rolling out its financing plan for the project to county leaders.

I have had a great year so far. My health seems to be better. Last year I was in the hospital three (3) different times. I had a flu bug and completely lost my appetite. They finally got it under control and I gradually regained my desire for food.

I had been on Amiodarone for several years for A.Fib. The long use results were that it lowered my heart rate to between 35 and 45 beats a minute. After taking me off of the medicine my heart rate gradually returned to normal 58 to 60 beats a minute. I feel so much better.

I haven't been too many places lately. I went to our family beach house at Topsail Beach that my father, Wayne Horton, bought in 1951. It has always been the place that all of us have loved. When my

girls were small we spent six (6) weeks every summer there. At first it was a parashine, there were very few homes. My children had the use of our part of the island. When I wanted them to come home I sang a ship's captain bell hanging on the front door stoop. What a very special place it is to all of us.

After my parents died we named the house Wayverd Cottage after them - Wayne and Eva Horton.

We are now into the fifth (5th) generation to use the home. I thank God for my father's gift to our family. Of all the things in our family it has been the best thing that my parents left for us.

When Hurricane Hazel passed we had 18 inches of water in the downstairs. With Hurricane Fran (16) inches and Hurricane Floyd (8) inches. We repaired it each time. You have to be tough to own beach property (ha)

Two years ago I had some money from the sale of some property to the state of N.C. to build a new off an on camp on Altitude 95 south of Hefe Point. I invited in a beach house instead at Litchfield Beach, about 20 miles south of Myrtle Beach, SC. I rent it two of the four weeks we are entitled to use it + use it for our family the two weeks in the off season. It has been fun to go to another beach. As you can see we are real beach lovers!



Phil I am so sorry that you have had your health problems. As the old saying goes, getting older is no fun. Keep your chin up as much as you can and remember there are a lot of people in North Carolina that love you and admire you for all of your accomplishments. Thank you for all the time and work you have dedicated for research of the Lynchuck and now allied families.

I have quite a lot of info on the allied families in my family. I am working on sending it to my children, cousins + other family members. I will send a packet to you.

I had a couple of "spells" as we southerners say, in May. I went to an emergency care office near my home. A very nice lady Doctor gave me a chest xray and an ECG. She didn't like the way my ECG looked so she called my heart doctor from her office and got me in to see him the next day. Now keep in mind that I already had a heart doctor but I knew better than to call his office because his first appointment would have been two weeks or more later. Now isn't that typical. Anyway, to make a long story short, after a heart cath they determined that I had two blocked heart arteries. One was 100% blocked and the other 95%. They put in two stents to improve the blood flow. However, the medicine that they put me on makes me feel terrible. I am happy though that they had something that could help me. Most of the Hortons die with heart trouble. I am thankful that I didn't have bypass surgery. It seems that they are doing more stents now than bypasses.

One of my reasons for emailing you was to tell you about my new great granddaughter, McKinley Kennedy Sigmon. My granddaughter, Christen Misiaveg Sigmon is turning out babies like they did in the old days. ha. On October 29<sup>th</sup>. We went to a pretty church, St. Peters Lutheran in Conover, N.C. to see Christen's three little ones baptized. The church is very historical, having been built by the early German settlers about 1825. Christen's husband Joshua Sigmon's ancestor was one of the men that helped establish the church. For that reason Josh wanted the children to be baptized there. It was a very pretty, special, private service on a Saturday afternoon just for the parents, and extended family of both sides. I wish you could have been present. The children were so sweet and looked so pretty in their baptismal finery. Mckinley, the baby girl was baptized in the dress that her mom and her uncle wore when they were babies. The two little boys wore white romper suits and navy and white saddle shoes with knee high socks. Do I sound like a proud great grandmother?

After the baptism the ladies of the church prepared a wonderful luncheon for all of us. It was such a special day.

This year my cousin  <sup>$\Delta$</sup>  Jack Penny died about two months ago. I don't know the exact date because I didn't hear about it until a week or two later. Jack was the son of  <sup>$\square$</sup>  Ollie Richard Penny, a brother of my mother.

I did have one very special thing that I experienced this year. I had expressed a desire last year to get on the Parkway where it comes in from Va. and ride all the way to the other end near Cherokee. So my daughter, Suzanne and her husband Bill planned a wonderful trip for me and gave it to me for Christmas last year.

We entered the Parkway near Galax, Va. the second week in October and traversed the whole thing. We stopped in Blowing Rock the first night. The next morning we went to see the Blowing Rock. I hadn't seen it since I visited it when I was a child with my parents. The view was spectacular. We could see Grandfather Mountain in the distance. The second night we spent in Asheville in a very nice bed and breakfast. We went down into the town square after dark and had a lovely meal at the Bistro restaurant. The next morning we visited Thomas Wolfe's mother's boarding house where Tom grew up. I hadn't realized what a profound influence his mother had on his life. His mother was quite a business woman. His father suffered from ill health for some time before he died. The museum was very interesting.

The next day we spent the night in Cherokee because we caught the Smoky Mountain Railway the next morning at Mt. Pisgah for a beautiful ride beside a pretty mountain river. We had lunch at the noon stop and then took the ride back to Mt. Pisgah.

That night we spent the night at the Lake Lure Lodge at Lake Lure. It is a beautiful lodge. If you want to take your sweet wife to a very romantic spot let me recommend the Lodge. The view overlooking the lake is spectacular.

This next year I want to go to see all of the millions of birds that migrate across Canada to the coast of N.C. to winter in the bays and estuaries where they mate. I have never seen a white snow goose or a white Canada goose. I am so excited to do so.

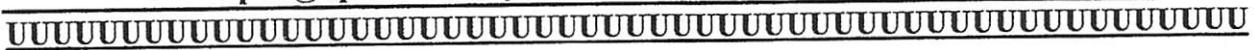

I read with interest the article on your father and note that it is a very nice tribute to him. A copy has been placed in his Biofile. It seems to contain two errors - He was named 10 MAY 1924 and not 1929; Also it refers to him as Wayne W. Horton when it should be W. Wayne Horton (for William Wayne Horton).

The house purchased in 1933 is of interest, where is it? Also do you know the first name or initials of Mr Bennett? Not essential - just would like to know.

I have now made a paper Biofile for George Moses Horton - Very interesting stuff. Your sketch of how your ancestors were involved helps me to sort out some of the HORTON groups. Enclosed is a copy of the Civil War item on COMPANY E. I could not figure out how this fits into your family.

If you locate the 10 page "epistle" your mother wrote about his activities I would be pleased to have a copy. Like you I agonize about the failure of people to write down their experiences.

I am grateful for all of the details you sent me on your ancestor James Penny and have placed excerpts in the BiFILES of the various individuals mentioned. You have a unique insight into the lives of these ancestors. The story seems to be ever unfolding.

As regards the PENNY connection with YATES MILL, it so happens that I am currently in



the middle of a huge project about land ownership in the Yates mill Area. This starts with my UPCHURCHES but quickly spills over into other families YATES, PENNY, etc, etc. As a part of this I am in contact with living people in the area whose ancestors and/or knowledge goes back far into the past. As time goes on I would like to exchange more with you about the families involved. There are some conflicts in my records which must be resolved.

It is now on the 18th and I have fully processed the materials you sent and the details in your letter. Many entries have been made in my Profile System. Over time as I return to those files more and more relationships will become clear. The Penny & Hartman families are two very numerous & complex units which interest us both along with other families. I hope we can keep collaborating and improving our records.

I can't remember what I have sent you about my family, so here goes again.

I really don't know much about the Mills family. I hope you can fill me in on that line.

Mathu never said much about her Mills line. I don't know why. The only thing that she ever told me was in her later years. She did say that when

John Penny married Blanche Mills, James Penny disowned him for a while until the first grandchild came along and he softened and wanted to be around that child. I did hear that he learned to love Blanche very much in his old age because she was so good to him.

A sad story about Mary & Martha Penny, John's sisters. They both died young, 15 & 16 of typhoid fever. I came across a record where James Penny had had the doctor day after day to treat them. They died within a couple of days of each other. Then there were receipts for the coffin maker. He had a sad life. He buried both wives, two daughters, and one son who died of Typhoid Pneumonia in the hospital in Petersburg, Va., during the Civil War, Jimmie, apparently named for his brother.

On a lighter note - When my son Jerry Wayne was a student at Oak Ridge Military Academy he went on a trip to New Orleans with his school class. While on that trip he met a pretty young girl from Apex. One weekend he went to visit her and in the course of the weekend he had an opportunity to meet her grandmother who was a Penn. Come to find out her father was Jesse Penn, brother of our James Penn. Needless to say, that cooled his ardor for the young lady.

He did remark how much she <sup>the grandmother</sup> looked like "Mama Emma, my mother."

My sister in law has a ten page "epistle" that my brother wrote about all of his activities before he died. Only a few were listed in his obituary. She is at the beach but when we can get together I will make a copy and send it to you.

There have been many accomplishment made by my generation of the Penns of the later generations. I wish I could get them to write some of them up.

Wash Hampton Penn, Jr., of my generation, graduated from Duke, and also Duke Law School. He served a term in the N.C. house for one term. In sum he has been very active in Durham and in other facets of his life.

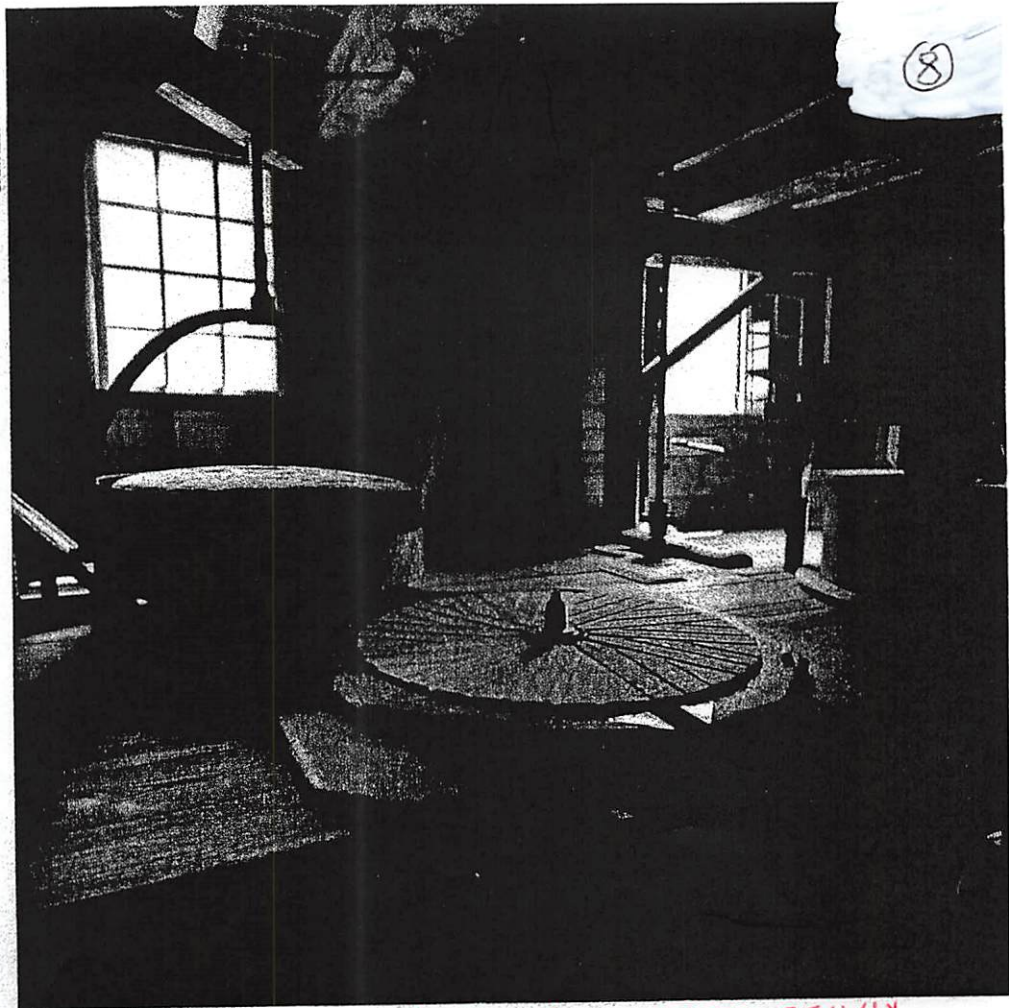

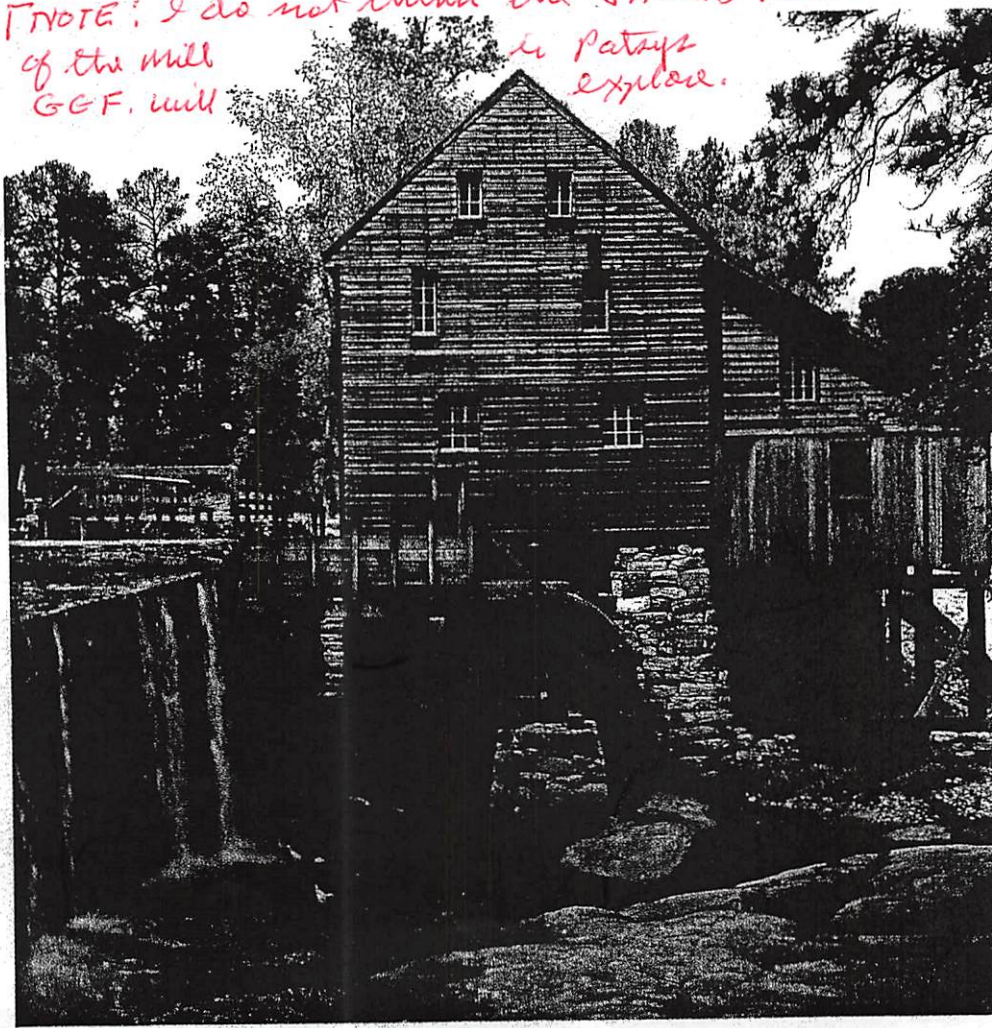

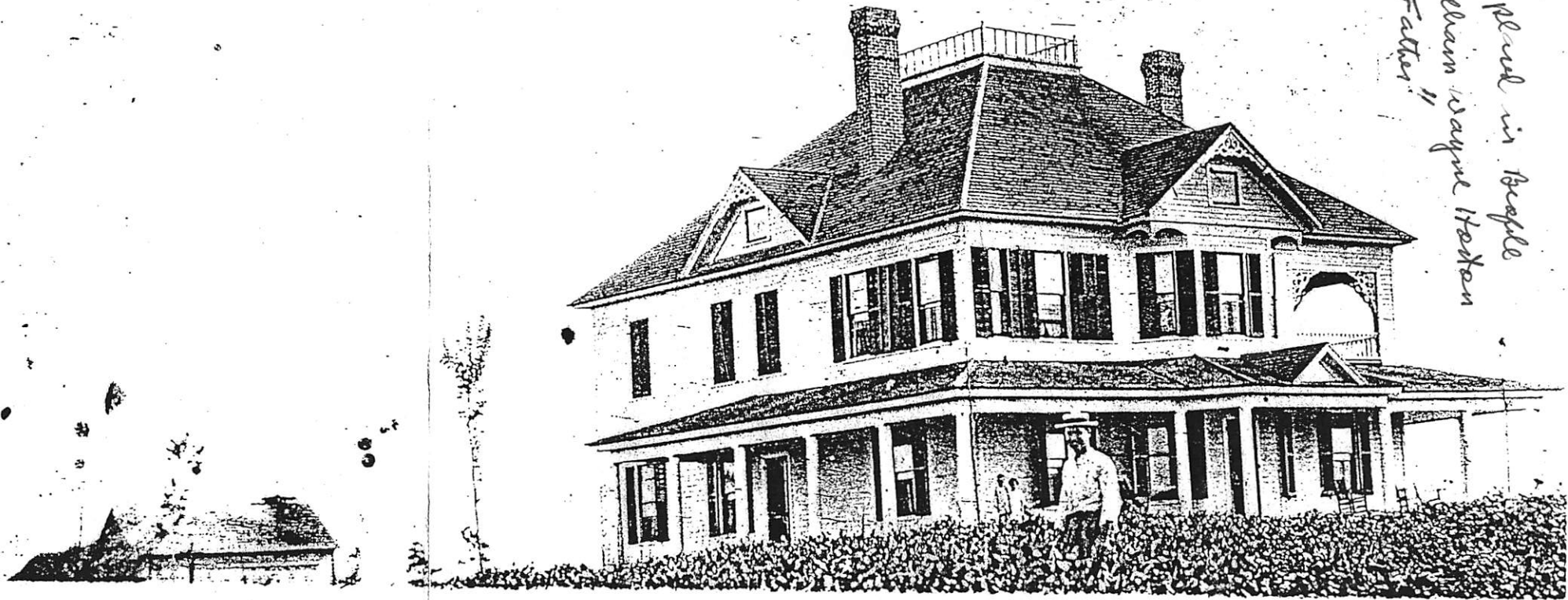

# CITIZEN OF THE YEAR



WAYNE W. HORTON

W. W. Horton, outstanding citizen, businessman and a leader in the fight to bring Urban Renewal to a vote of the people, adopted High Point as his home nearly 30 years ago on the advice of a great-uncle who was a Baptist preacher.

Arriving in High Point in 1935, Horton went into the finance business, with offices in High Point, Winston-Salem and Raleigh. Five years later he disposed of the finance offices, and converted his business to furniture and real estate.

His first furniture store was located at the present site of the new Wachovia bank. In 1950 he moved across Washington Street to his current location on the corner of East Washington and North Wrenn Streets.

Horton now has real estate holdings in High Point and Greensboro, and also owns the 300-acre "Horton Plantation" in Buckhorn Township, Harnett County, near Raleigh in the eastern part of the state, where he was born and reared.

In the early part of his adult life, before moving to High Point, Horton was an official freight agent for the Norfolk and Southern Railroad.

Looking back on his business experience, Horton says, "I've always held strong convictions for the free enterprise system. My experience is that under the free enterprise system a man can accomplish whatever he wishes if he works hard enough at it."

Horton is active in civic affairs. A personal friend of Governor Terry Sanford, he introduced Sanford in High Point during the 1959 campaign. "I'm a registered Democrat," he says, "but I'm an independent man as far as politics is concerned. I always look for the candidate who supports free enterprise and constitutional government, regardless of his party affiliation."

Horton is a member of the Civitan Club, and is a 32nd degree Scottish Right Mason and a Shriner.

In 1929 he married Eva Penny from Wake County, who was also reared on a farm, known as the "Penny Plantation." Mrs. Horton has been active in the furniture business since the beginning. "My wife has been quite an asset to the business as my assistant," says Horton.

The Hortons have two children, both of whom live in High Point. They have a son, Jr. Charles W. Horton, who has practiced dentistry in High Point for the past ten years, and a daughter, Mrs. Patsy Horton Kennedy.

Horton was educated in the Harnett County public schools. He did his high school work under private tutoring. He studied law for three years at the American Law School in Chicago, Illinois. Horton stays well-informed on state laws, and makes a practice of keeping up to date on the state statutes.

Horton is "very much disturbed over the socialistic trend in this country today. I fear for myself and my family under the present trend."

He is supporting the legal battle against Urban Renewal because "under that program politicians are trying to confiscate property and offer only one-third to one-half of the fair value of the property. Even compensation equal to the fair value of the property would be inadequate, because I am counting on my property to provide security for my wife and myself in our old age."

On his father's side Horton is English, and a relative of Wilkins P. Horton, Democratic lieutenant governor in the 1950's. On his mother's side, Horton is of Dutch-Irish ancestry. He is descended from the original settlers who came up the Cape Fear River from Wilmington to settle in the upper part of Harnett County.

A charter member of Emerywood Baptist Church, Horton has held the office of deacon in the church since the post was originated. He was also head of the church's finance committee for several years, and is also a trustee of the church.

**COMPANY E**

On August 23, 1861 this battery, known as the "Wilmington Light Artillery," was mustered into State service at Camp Boylan, near Raleigh, for the war and designated Company E, 10th Regiment N. C. State Troops (1st Regiment N. C. Artillery). Seven days later, on August 30, it was transferred to Confederate States service. The official designation was used infrequently, and the battery was more often referred to as "Moore's Battery," being commanded by Captain Alexander D. Moore. Later when 1st Lieutenant John O. Miller was promoted to Captain, when Moore resigned to accept the colonelcy of the 66th Regiment N. C. Troops, August 3, 1863, the battery became known as "Miller's Battery."

The battery remained at Raleigh for want of guns until October 1861 when it was supplied with six brass field pieces and sent to Wilmington. From Wilmington it was ordered to Coosawhatchie, South Carolina, where it remained from November 1861 through March 16, 1862 when it was ordered back to Wilmington. From Wilmington it was ordered to Kinston where it arrived on April 20-21, 1862. It remained in eastern and northeastern North Carolina as an unattached artillery company until assigned to Major General Robert Ransom's Division July 18, 1863. Within the divisional organization the battery was attached to Major Edgar F. Moseley's Battalion of Artillery. When Ransom's Division was ordered to the Army of Northern Virginia, the artillery remained within the Department of North Carolina and Southeastern Virginia. In December 1863 the battery was reported at Weldon, North Carolina, equipped with eight pieces of artillery.

In June 1864 the artillery battalions within the Department of North Carolina and Southeastern Virginia were placed under the chief of artillery of the department when not attached to a brigade, division, or corps. Company E, 10th Regiment

N. C. State Troops (1st Regiment N. C. Artillery), now known as "Miller's Battery," equipped with four 10-pounder Parrotts, remained in Moseley's Battalion of Artillery. The battalion, serving in the lines at Petersburg and between that city and Richmond, alternated between direct attachment to a parent unit and control by departmental headquarters. When Major Moseley was killed on December 16, 1864, Major Joseph G. Blount was promoted to command the battalion which became known as "Blount's Battalion of Artillery."

When Lee evacuated Petersburg on April 2, 1865 "Miller's Battery" joined the retreating army and was surrendered by General Lee at Appomattox Court House, Virginia, April 9, 1865.

The information contained in the following roster of the battery was compiled principally from the company muster rolls, which covered from the muster in date through December 1863 and May-June 1864. No rolls were found for the period from January through April 1864, or for the period after June 1864. Although there are no Roll of Honor records for this company, useful information was obtained from receipt rolls, hospital records, prisoner of war records, and other primary records, supplemented by State pension applications, records of the United Daughters of the Confederacy, and post war rosters and histories.

"Among the places where the horse races were run were "Varina" + "Malvern Hill" and the place called up "Ware". The usual distance for these early races seems to have been a quarter of a mile, and they were run by saddle horses"

I read that Thomas Cocks was quite involved in gambling large amounts (over

of tobacco on these acres. It makes me speculate as to whether he had to sell Malvern Hill to William Humphreys at one time. William sold Malvern Hill to his son-in-law James Powell (Pawell) before he died.

In another article it stated that the home had never gone out of the Coker family, but that is not accurate because the records do indicate that it was indeed owned by William Humphreys.

I hope to make a trip up to Virginia to see the area not only because of my family connection but to see where the battle of Malvern Hill was fought between Lee & McClellan during the Civil War.

My first Ingham / Ingham ancestor was married to Jane Eyre, daughter of Joseph Eyre. Jane was a granddaughter of William Humphreys. He left her several items listed in his will. His estate was executed by "Thomas Coker, my good and trusted friend."

## Apex home 84 years

### Conversations with our past

A bicentennial series

△ Betty Baker was born in Apex, and still lives in the home her husband Raymond built three years after they were married.

That was 65 years ago - but Betty Baker at 84 is still active and alert and keeps her house in tip-top shape. It is a home that is full of memories for Baker - and well it should be.

In that white frame house on Ellington Street, Baker gave birth to her eight children. And although they have since left home, and her husband passed away several years ago, the home is still very much a family place - indeed, as Mrs. Baker says, "Some of the children come home every Sunday. Sometimes even two or three of them. I'm never lonely."

The big upright piano and the large fireplace in the living room help conjure up images of a large family, going about the business of their daily lives. And, as Baker points out, the home was much more important in the days when she was raising a family.

"I think people enjoyed staying at home more, partly because we didn't really know anything else. The children played a lot in the home," she explained.

Baker's children, and their places of residence are: W. C. Baker, Oxford; Eloise Carr, Moncure; Lucille McKinney, Raleigh; Wade Baker, Apex; Bryant Baker, Tabor City; Mary Edith Keith, Raleigh; Betty Rae Oxidine, Monroe; and Fred Baker, Durham.

"We were always having company for dinner," she added, noting that children always visited with their parents.

"We didn't have babysitters then. But it wasn't much of a problem. The children played and enjoyed themselves and mothers and fathers visited."

Actually, Baker pointed out, her children grew up not much

differently than she herself.

Baker attended the public school in Apex, continuing through the seventh grade. She and her brothers and sisters walked to school each day, carrying their lunches, which they would eat gathered around the big stove with friends.

Each student had a day when he or she was responsible for chores at the school - boys would cut wood to keep the fire going; girls would sweep the floor.

Baker said she though received a good education at the two-room school. And she added that the discipline problem that often plagues modern schools was nonexistent then.

"The schools were good, and we had order in the school," she said. "I don't think the teachers had much problem with discipline in those days."

What has happened to cause that change?

"I think parents are more lenient with children, and don't have firm discipline in the home," Baker answered.

Baker said she and her classmates - and she estimates that over 200 students were enrolled in the school while she attended - studied English, math, Latin, spelling, history and geography. She explained that they did not progress to a new class each year, as students do today, but rather progressed to more difficult textbooks.

Baker can still remember several of her teachers - Miss Minnie Franklin, Mr. Howard Champion, Mr. C. B. Brooks and Mr. Burton Howard. She said many of the teachers boarded in the homes of local residents when she was growing up.

What did Baker and her contemporaries do for entertainment? Quilting bees, with dances afterward were infre-

quent but special occasions for Apex townspeople.

And the church - in Baker's case - the Apex Baptist Church - was an important social as well as religious center. Baker belonged to the "Sunbeam Society" which sponsored Sunday School parties and church programs, as a young woman, and she still attends that same church, even though it has been moved from its original site.

"I've been a member of that church for 72 years," Baker said. "I still go regularly. I love my pastor and the members of my church."

When Baker was a young woman, she was courted as were all her contemporaries at her home, where sweethearts would visit with the family, then mount their horses and ride home. It was in that way that she and her husband courted and married in 1909. Their wedding took place in her family's home with "attendants just like you have now."

What did they do for their honeymoon? "We went to his home (in Holly Springs) and spent the night, and the next day we came back and set up housekeeping. And the next day he went to work. And we worked all our years," Baker answered.

There was lots of work for Raymond Baker, too - for in 1910 a fire swept through Apex destroying the wooden downtown buildings. As a carpenter and brick mason, he and his brother/partner had the chance to construct many of the buildings and homes that still stand on Salem Street.

Baker said progress "began to come to Apex" after the 1910 fire - and it brought with it such innovations as the automobile. The Bakers bought their first car in 1918 - a Ford, complete with curtains that had to be hooked to

enclose the cabin.

"The children loved it," Baker smiled. "We'd take those children and wrap them up and go to my father's house (near Fuquay-Varina) 'bout every Sunday."

Driving conditions are much improved since those early days, Baker explained. "Around where my father lived, roads were sandy, and the car would slip around," she said.

"As a matter of fact," she added, "I've seen a lot of improvement in everything."

Baker said she believes Apex has come a long way since she was born 84 years ago. It has grown from a town of 500 people to one of 2500.

"It gives people employment, nice places to live, nice churches and schools," she said. "I always like to see advancement."

That advancement has brought with it problems, Baker noted - problems like leniency in child rearing and increasing crime - but she believes the problems are not as serious as some think.

"There's more crime, but there's a lot more people and we can understand that," she explained. "I think we still have a lot of good people who are interested in the welfare of other people."

Baker is optimistic about the future of Apex. "I think the future is real bright. All the buildings look real pretty, and we feel real proud of them. I'm looking forward to a great improvement in our town."

Baker's confidence in the future of Apex is perhaps understandable. She has invested her life in that of the town; has nursed it back to health after the "great fire", and has seen it on its way to modernity. It is citizens like Baker who have brought the progress she celebrates to the town of Apex.

The document you gave me provided a  
lot of useful information. In the process  
of extracting and filing the details from  
your document I encountered Biopics that  
provided more detail. Included are copies  
of three such Biopics - Wade Johnson Baker, Sr.;  
Milton Elwood McKinney; and Edward Nelson Carr.

Enclosed is a copy of the complete master  
outline for the Rachel U Line in the  
Moses U/Murray U subclass. This includes  
Rachel, her children and grandchildren.

The descendants (if any) if known) of the grandchildren are included in continuation sections as indicated by the numbers on the left hand side of the page. All of the continuation sections appear after the pink sheet.

I will welcome any corrections or additions to the compendium which is growing nicely. As you are aware I collect full names (full maiden name of females), dates of births/ marriages/ death and place of birth/ marriage/ death/ burial. For place I like to include town/ county/ state and, when available, the name of cemetery. We rarely get all the "stuff" but it is nice to try.

I wonder if more can be learned about the Scoble entries. I note that the family name Ellington is fairly common in Wake Co, NC. Do you have any idea how the mix-up occurred for the family as they were moved from the Farm Cemetery to the Apex cemetery? I have settled on the dates 1814 - 1887 for your ancestor James Penny. Does this still seem right to you?


Do you know the parents of your farmer Penny 1814-1887? I cannot fit him into the other older Penny Families I have for Central NC.

I was quite pleased that the James Penny (1814-1887) farm was located where the Apex Funeral Home now stands. Furthermore, it seems that the east-west road at this intersection was the old Highway 64. One has to work hard to get and keep one's bearing.

I can't wait to get back to NC to continue gathering more details on Upchurch roots. The Apex area is one of the spots that is worthy of a lot of attention.

You and I no doubt can continue to be a lot of help to each other. Please let me know of your questions or of any special way we should proceed.

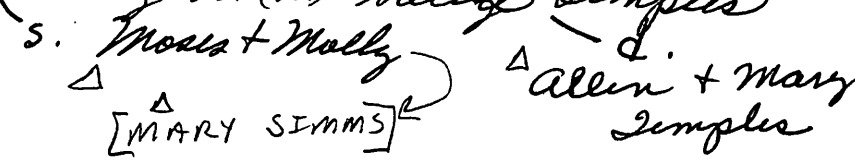
